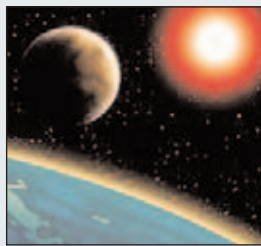

## Shimla, Manali, Dalhousie wrapped in snow

SHIMLA, JAN 9

All tourist resort including Shimla, Narkanda, Kufri, Manali and Dalhousie were wrapped in thick blanket of snow as snow, hail thunderstorms and rainfall lashed most places of Himachal Pradesh completely paralysing normal life in the state.

This Capital Town is snowing since Saturday night frequently and 15 centimetre Snowfall was recorded till 0830hrs. In Mount Jakhu and others places 20 to 25 cm Snowfall is received in the town.

Tourists resort Kufri Fagu, Mashobra and Narkanda recorded heavy snowfall of this season.

Met Office recorded 30 cm snow at Kufri, Narkanda 12.50cm Khirki 15 cm (one foot in last two days) Kotgarh 2.5 cm Kotkhai five cm and Doda Kwar 7.50 cm, Fagu three cm and Khara Pathar ten cm (total one ft).

Haripurdhara in Siramaur 60 cm or one feet Snowfall, Shilai and Rajgarh had first Snowfall in Sirmaur district with 2.50 cm snow.

Tourist resort Chail in Solan had 12.50 cm snowfall.

## Modi reviews COVID-19 situation in country

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday chaired a meeting to review the COVID-19 situation in the country through a video conference. Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Union Health Minister Dr Mansukh Mandaviya, Home secretary Ajay Kumar Bhalla, Cabinet Secretary Rajiv Gauba and other officials were present at the meeting. This meeting comes as the country reported more than 1.5 lakh new COVID-19 cases on Sunday and the case tally of the Omicron variant of the virus reached 3,623 in the country. India reported 1,59,632 new COVID-19 cases in the last 24 hours, taking the daily positivity rate in the country to 10.21 per cent said the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare

### India logs over 1.5 lakh cases for second day

NEW DELHI: India has reported over 1.5 lakh daily cases for the second consecutive day, taking the total number of active cases to 5,90,611, the Union Ministry of Health said on Sunday. The country has registered 1,59,632 new Covid-19 cases and 327 deaths, taking the total tally to 4,83,790. The daily positivity rate stood at 10.21 per cent.

## No plan to impose lockdown in Delhi yet: Kejriwal

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Sunday said there is no plan to impose a lockdown as of now in the city, and that there will be no need for it if people wear masks.

He said that on Sunday, the city is likely to report 22,000 COVID-19 cases in 24 hours.

He appealed to the public to wear masks and not panic.

Rising COVID-19 cases are a matter of concern but there is no need to panic. Very few people are getting hospitalised. Wearing mask is very important. There will be no lockdown if you continue to wear mask. There is no plan to impose lockdown as of now, Kejriwal said in a virtual press conference.

The CM said that he along with Lieutenant Governor Anil Bajjal and the Centre are keeping a close eye on the Covid situation.

Our attempt is to impose minimum restrictions so livelihoods are not affected, Kejriwal said. Comparing the



current third wave with the second Covid wave in April-May last year, the CM said that on May 7, 2021 there were 20,000 cases reported with 341 deaths but on Saturday Delhi witnessed same number of cases with only seven deaths.

He, however, said that there should not be even a single death. On May 7 last year nearly 20,000 Covid beds were occupied while till yesterday there were only 1500 hospital beds occupied despite having reported same number of cases. "I am telling you this data to show that very less people are requiring to go to hospital in this infection and you do not need to panic.

## Pak-based Twitter handles running campaign to spread communal negativities across country

After Delhi Police identified 46-Pakistan-based Twitter handles which were engaged in spreading a fake video of Cabinet meeting discussing a matter against the Sikh community, DCP of IFSO special cell KPS Malhotra on Sunday advised the citizens not to trust such information as it instigates communal violence in India.

Speaking to a news agency, KPS Malhotra said, "46 Twitter account handles came into cognizance when a



superimposed video with voiceovers was shared on changes made in Indian Army from an anti-community angle. After investigation, we discovered that those accounts were operated from Pakistan."

"They were running a campaign to spread communal negativities in India. I would advise the citizens not to trust such Twitter handles which discuss government policies," he said. The IFSO DCP further informed that the blocking of these Twitter handles have been started and there are more such links coming out of the in-

vestigation in the case. "This is a fact that many such campaigns are being run in India for spreading misinformation. This is only started to create discontentment between two communities, so I would request people not to trust such information," he added. According to Delhi Police, a fake or morphed video has been shared on Twitter by some handles. In reality, the said video was of the meeting of the cabinet committee which took place on December 9, 2021, after the demise of CDS General Bipin Rawat.

## Over 400 Parliament staff test positive for covid

Ahead of the Budget Session of the Parliament, more than 400 Parliament staff members were tested positive for COVID-19, according to official sources. The officials told a news agency that 402 staff members were tested positive out of the 1,409 staff of Parliament for the virus from January 4 to 8 after which their samples were sent for genome sequencing to confirm the variant.

"Close to 402 staffs were tested positive for COVID-19 from January 4-8 and all samples have been sent to genome sequencing for Omicron variant confirmation," an official

told a news agency. According to an internal message from the staff of Parliament, the staff are advised to follow the precautions as per the guidelines of the government. "There is a consolidated list of 200 Lok Sabha and 69 from Rajya Sabha and 133 allied staff who have tested positive, but we all need to take proper precautions," an internal message read.

The above list does not include who were tested for COVID outside the Parliament premises. Several employees of both the Houses of the Parliament were put in isolation after they came into contact with their infected colleagues during work. Various officials of the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha are also in isolation.

## Five days week & 50 pc attendance in offices, new COVID curbs in HP

To contain sudden spike in Covid-19 cases and increasing threat of Omicron variant, Himachal Pradesh government today issued further curbs on the attendance in the offices to 50 per cent and directed departments to follow five days a week norm, a notification issued by the Chief Secretary cum Chairman of State Executive Committee (SEC) Mr Ram Subhag Singh said.

It would be implemented in countenance with similar notification of January 5 and 8 that all the offices of Government Departments, Public sector unit, local bodies, Autonomous Bodies including the H.P. Secretariat would remain closed on Saturdays & Sundays (5 working days a week) and these offices would operate with the 50 per cent attendance on working days.

Notification would not be applicable to those offices which are imparting emergency or essential services such as health, police, fire, banks, electricity, water & sanitation, public transport, telecom, Excise, Budget and



related incident services, activities among others.

HODs controlling officers should issue booster order accordingly.

Himachal Pradesh High Court would issue separate orders with respect to the High Court and all other judicial offices.

Beside this, all social and religious gatherings will be completely banned in the state. Other gatherings, congregations like academic, sports, entertainment, cultural political are permitted up to 50 per cent of the capacity, subject to maximum of 100 persons in indoor built up or covered areas and in open spaces or outdoor areas permitted up to 50 pc of the capacity. Prior intimation of gatherings will have to be given to the District or Sub Divisional Administration and local administration can impose additional conditions upon the organizers.

## December 26 to be marked as Veer Baal Diwas: Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday announced that December 26 would henceforth be marked as Veer Baal Diwas. The announcement was made on the Parkash Purab of Guru Gobind Singh and has since been lauded by many including Central ministers.

Taking to Twitter, the PM dubbed it a "fitting tribute to the courage of the Sahibzades and their



quest for justice". The day will pay homage to the four songs of the 10th Sikh Guru who were executed by the Mughals.

"Veer Baal Diwas' will be on the same day Sahibzada Zorawar Singh Ji and Sahibzada Fateh Singh Ji attained martyrdom after being sealed alive in a wall. These two greats preferred death instead of deviating from the noble principles of Dharma," Prime Minister Modi added.

The announcement has been met

with approval from several quarters, with Home Minister Amit Shah taking to Twitter to add that he "heartily welcomed" the move. "The incomparable sacrifice and patriotism of 4 Sahibzadas and Mata Gujri to protect the country and religion is the heritage of the country. Today on the birth anniversary of Guru Gobind Singh Ji, I heartily welcome the decision of Narendra Modi ji to celebrate the martyrdom day of Sahibzadas on 26th December as 'Veer Bal Diwas'," he tweeted.

Vij informed that out of these 980 posts, 270 posts are of General Category, 472 posts of SC Category, 80 posts of BC-A Category, 25 posts of BC-B Category, 133 posts of EWS Category. 199 new Corona cases found

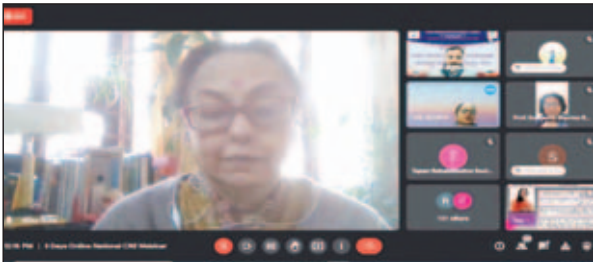

So far 40712 positive cases were reported in the district, out of which 39548 patients recovered. He said that 199 new positive cases of corona have been found in the district on Saturday, while 7 persons have recovered and one person died. So far 556 corona positive patients have died in the district. There are 608 active cases of corona virus active in the district. The DC said that all citizens should follow the rules of lockdown, stay at home and not create panic.

For a minute, put aside the fact that he is a World No.1 tennis player and then assess the context. Here is a world roiling with pandemic. In two years nearly 54,97,410 died. According to a report in The Lancet, globally between March 1, 2020 and April 30, 2021 an estimated 11,34,000 children experienced the death of primary caregivers including at least one parent or custodial grandparent. About 15,62,000 children experienced the death of at least one primary or secondary caregiver. Despite all of this, with vaccines and travel bans and a new year, hope of normalcy was once again blooming when a fresh virus surge had the atlas shivered. In such a situation, here is a person who is an antivaxxer; an anti-vaxxer with no mean social influence.

So Djokovic has never exhorted his fans to reject vaccines. But celebrity does not work by exhortation, only suggestion. Djokovic said he is "opposed to vaccination". Those who keep track of Djokovic-science would know that he also said toxic food and polluted water can be cleansed "through the power of gratitude". As for power of suggestion, when the world was on pause he organised a charity tournament in Croatia and Serbia, which turned out to be a virus spreader. He too eventually tested positive, though his wife Jelena suggested 5G is responsible for the pandemic. With vaccines, Djokovic did not stop at taking a personal stand. Thereafter, he prepared to participate in a sporting tournament --- which in its last edition had 8,12,000 people attending --- in another country, one with stringent vaccine regulations, without so much as planning to get vaccinated as per stipulated norms. Why? Because he is a phenomenal tennis player with 80 plus titles and all of that. But say someone has a double doctorate or is a Nobel laureate or a farmer tasked with feeding a nation, should those be reasons to exempt him or her from rules put in place to check spread of a deadly virus? Or do we know for sure that the coronavirus is a tennis fan?

The incident has lived up issues about Australia's treatment of refugees raking in detention for years. Serbians have taken this as an affront to the nation. Could the Australian government have avoided this debacle? Perhaps yes. Does the Professional Tennis Players Association make sense when it says "with the utmost respect for all personal views on vaccinations, vaccinated athletes and unvaccinated athletes (with an approved medical exemption) should both be afforded the freedom to compete".

A team of international researchers has shed light on the fact that the rhythms of activity in all biological organisms, both plants, and animals, are closely linked to the gravitational tides created by orbital mechanics of the Sun-Earth-Moon system.

The findings by Cristiano de Mello Gallep at the University of Campinas (UNICAMP) in the state of Sao Paulo, Brazil, and Daniel Robert at the University of Bristol in the United Kingdom are published in the Journal of Experimental Botany.

"All matter on Earth, both live and inert, experiences the effects of the gravitational forces of the Sun and Moon expressed in the form of tides. The periodic oscillations exhibit two daily cycles and are modulated monthly and annually by the motions of these two celestial bodies. All organisms on the planet have evolved in this context. What we sought to show in the article is that gravitational tides are a perceptible and potent force that has always shaped the rhythmic activities of these organisms," Gallep told.

The study is both an extensive review of the literature and a meta-analysis of the data from three previously published cases in which gravitational causality was not fully explored: the swim-

ming activity of isopods, small shell-less crustaceans whose appearance on Earth dates from at least 300 million years ago; reproductive effort in coral; and growth modulation in sunflower seedlings inferred from autoluminescence.

In the latter case, the researchers analyzed the results of their own investigations as well as data from the literature.

"The data shows that in the absence of other rhythmic influences such as lighting or temperature, local gravitational tides are sufficient to

organize the cyclical behaviour of these organisms. This evidence questions the validity of so-called free-run experiments, in which several environmental factors are controlled but gravitational oscillations are not taken into consideration. These oscillations continue to exist, and may modulate the behaviour of living organisms," Gallep said. Many of the rhythmic patterns displayed by organisms are well-known and have been widely studied. They include circadian rhythms, which are linked to the day-night or light-dark cy-

cle. However, some rhythmic cycles are maintained even when the factor light is isolated, under laboratory conditions, and the contributions of other environmental factors have been investigated and demonstrated, although their effects are comparatively weak in many cases.

The study in question considered, among others, the persistence of tidal cycles in the behavioural patterns of coastal organisms such as crustaceans, when they are removed from their natural habitats. "These animals modulate their behaviour in

tune with the ebb and flow of the tides, in a cycle of approximately 12.4 hours that derives from lunisolar dynamics, even when they're moved to a laboratory with stable and controlled aquatic conditions," Gallep said.

"The pattern persists for several days, matching lunisolar tidal timing at the site where the organisms were collected in nature."

Although the combined gravitational effect of the Sun and Moon corresponds to only a millionth of Earth's gravity, it is sufficient not just to cause large-scale tidal fluctu-

tations in oceans, rivers and lakes, but also to move the tectonic plates. The Large Hadron Collider (LHC), operated by the European Organization for Nuclear Research (CERN), with a circumference of 27 kilometres, is vertically displaced by one millimetre by this gravitational fluctuation, and its scientists must adjust their experimental calculations accordingly.

Gallep first noted these periodicities in experiments involving the autoluminescence associated with seed germination, conducted in Limeira (Sao Paulo state).

"I observed that changes in the signal collected appeared every 12 or 24 hours, but differed in each germination test.

When I looked for support in the literature, I found studies pointing to a possible correlation with gravitational tides. We explored this phenomenon in subsequent tests on various types of seed, and also added results obtained in the laboratory by collaborators in Prague, Czech Republic, in Leiden, Netherlands, and in Hamamatsu, Japan," he said.

Gravitational cycles do not only affect the simplest organisms. Scientific studies have found that humans kept in the dark tend to establish a cyclical fluctuation lasting 24.4-24.8 hours, in harmony with the lunar cycle.

Children with chronic health conditions should  
receive more help with online learning

According to a recent study, online learning poses additional challenges to children with chronic medical conditions or special education needs, and these patients could benefit from more support from pediatric clinicians to be academically successful.

The findings published in the JAMA Pediatrics are co-written by researchers at Kennedy Krieger Institute and Johns Hopkins Medicine. Clinicians should address school-related challenges or issues like any other medical need in pediatric care, said Lisa Jacobson, PhD, NCSP, ABPP, co-director of Kennedy Krieger's Center for Innovation and Leadership in Special Education (CILSE) and director of research for the Institute's department of neuropsychology.

This includes gathering a child's full health history and details of school performance, as well as noting any signs of school challenges the patient faces. Clinicians can reach out to neuropsychology teams, educators or social workers to help their patients with chronic illnesses keep up academically with their peers.

These recommendations are based on research with pediatric oncology patients, who suffered unique obstacles with online learning in the COVID-19 pandemic; in fact, more than half, or 57 per cent, of parents of children with cancer reported difficulties with learning online during this time.

Prior to the pandemic, parents of children with cancer also reported challenges to securing special education services because of several factors, including a lack of familiarity with available resources as well as ways to secure them. But these challenges



are not unique to pediatric cancer patients; children with other chronic conditions, including long COVID, or special education needs face the same obstacles, Dr Jacobson said.

However, these same families often have regular interactions with pediatric specialists throughout their child's treatment or care. By increasing the awareness of the positive role that pediatric specialists can play in their patients' education, these clinicians could provide assistance on school-related issues, she said, adding that not doing so could contribute to lifelong negative health impacts.

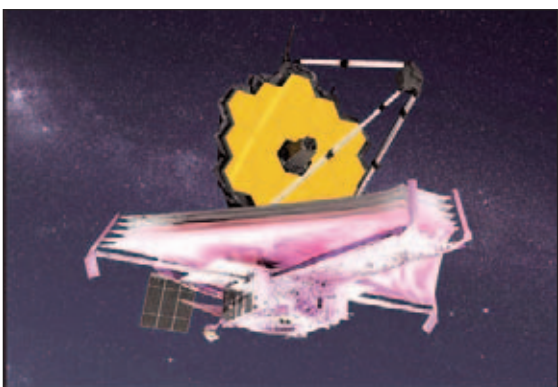
NASA's Webb Telescope reaches major  
milestone as 'Mirror Unfolds'

NASA's James Webb Space Telescope team fully deployed its 21-foot, gold-coated primary mirror, successfully completing the final stage of all major spacecraft deployments to prepare for science operations.

According to a press release by NASA, a joint effort with the European Space Agency (ESA) and Canadian Space Agency, the Webb mission will explore every phase of cosmic history - from within our solar system to the most distant observable galaxies in the early universe.

"Today, NASA achieved another engineering milestone decades in the making. While the journey is not complete, I join the Webb team in breathing a little easier and imagining the future breakthroughs bound to inspire the world," said NASA Administrator Bill Nelson.

"The James Webb Space Telescope is an unprecedented mission that is on the precipice of seeing the light from the first galaxies and discovering the mysteries of our universe. Each feat already achieved and future accomplishment is a testament



to the thousands of innovators who poured their life's passion into this mission," he added. Earlier, the two wings of Webb's primary mirror had been folded to fit inside the nose cone of an ArianeSpace Ariane 5 rocket prior to launch.

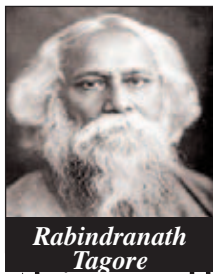
After more than a week of other critical spacecraft deployments, the Webb team began remotely unfolding the hexagonal segments of the primary mirror, the largest ever launched into space. This was a multi-day process, with the first side deployed January 7 and the second January 8, according to NASA press release. Further, the world's largest and most com-

plex space science telescope will now begin moving its 18 primary mirror segments to align the telescope optics. The ground team will command 126 actuators on the backsides of the segments to flex each mirror - an alignment that will take months to complete. Then the team will calibrate the science instruments prior to delivering Webb's first images this summer. "I am so proud of the team - spanning continents and decades - that delivered this first-of-its kind achievement," said Thomas Zurbuchen, associate administrator for the Science Mission Directorate in NASA Headquarters in Washington.

Vaccinated women pass COVID-19 antibodies to infants by breastfeeding

A new study by the University of Massachusetts Amherst found that women vaccinated against COVID-19 transfer SARS-CoV-2 antibodies to their breastfed infants, potentially giving their babies passive immunity against the coronavirus.

The research has been published in the 'Obstetrics and Gynecology Journal'. "This research is the first to detect SARS-CoV-2 antibodies in stool samples from infants of vaccinated mothers," said lead author Vignesh Narayanaswamy, a PhD candidate in the breast milk research lab of senior author Kathleen Arcaro, professor of environmental toxicology in the Department of Veterinary and Animal Sciences.

"This is really important because women want to know whether their babies have these antibodies, and our



study shows that antibodies are being transferred via breast milk. Providing this compelling evidence is the motivation for women to continue breastfeeding after they receive the vaccine," he added.

Narayanaswamy noted another important takeaway: the antibodies were detected in infants regardless of age - from 1.5 months old to 23 months old.

30 lactating women from across the U.S. - most of them healthcare workers - were enrolled in the study. They received the COVID-19 mRNA vaccine between January and April 2021. The women provided breast milk samples before they were vaccinated, across two to three weeks after their first vaccine dose and across three weeks after the second dose. They also gave samples of their blood, spotted on cards, 19 days af-

ter the first dose and 21 days after the second dose. Infant stool samples were collected 21 days after the mothers' second vaccination. Pre-pandemic samples of breast milk, dried blood spots, and infant stools were used as controls for the study.

The samples were tested for a receptor-binding domain (RBD)-specific immunoglobulin (Ig)A and IgG antibodies. In the breast milk samples, anti-RBD IgG antibodies were found to neutralize the protein spike of SARS-CoV-2, as well as four variants. A significant increase in cytokine levels also revealed the immune response in breast milk samples. Anti-RBD IgG and anti-RBD IgA antibodies were detected in 33 per cent and 30 per cent of infant stool samples, respectively. The levels of antibodies correlated with the vaccine side ef-

fects the mother experienced. "Women who did feel sick from the vaccine was associated with greater antibodies in the infant stool," Arcaro said.

"So you might have felt badly, but that was a benefit for your infant," she added. The study, Arcaro said, received no specific funding and was partially driven by the participants themselves, who were familiar with Arcaro's wide-ranging breast milk research, including the New Moms Wellness Study and BRCA gene-mutation research that Narayanaswamy focused on.

While lactating and pregnant women were urged to be vaccinated, no pregnant or breastfeeding women were included in the vaccine trials, Arcaro noted. Findings showed that "even if you had COVID, there is a benefit for women to get the vaccine."

# Omicron's severity less but health infrastructure could collapse if virus spread : Dr. HK Bali

In view of the rising Omicron cases – a panel discussion of eminent doctors was held to demystify myths around the highly transmissible Omicron variant at Radisson Red, here.

The panel discussion moderated by Dr. H K Bali, Chairman Cardiac Sciences, Paras Group of Hospitals; was attended by Dr. A K Mandal, Pulmonologist and presently Director Pulmonology, Sleep & Critical Care, Fortis Hospital; Dr. Ashish Bhalla, Professor (Internal Medicine) PGI; Dr. Raman Abrol, Consultant Endoscopic and ENT Surgeon, Abrol ENT Institute & Research centre; Dr Ravul Jindal, Director, Vascular Surgery, Fortis Hospital; and Dr Nimisha Batra, Consultant Radiologist, DN Imaging & Diagnostic Centre. SimphiHealth, a health portal, organised the panel discussion.

Expressing grave concern on the Omicron variant which is fuelling the third wave at a much faster speed than what the Delta variant did last year, Dr. H K Bali said, "The sudden surge of Omicron cases in tricity & in the country is a matter of concern.



Even though Omicron is causing less severe disease, the rapid caseload on hospitals could collapse health infrastructure if not dealt with immediately."

Sharing his view on Omicron severity, Dr. A.K. Mandal, Pulmonologist said, "Though the infection has mild symptoms with fewer hospitalisations, caution is required as the virus is highly contagious. Most hospitals are not prepared to tackle the crisis. It's all rhetoric that they are prepared for the battle but actually they are not. As a significant number of HCWs' are already infected and more are likely to get infected, we should ramp up our health

infrastructure."

Shedding light on the Omicron threat, Dr. Ashish Bhalla highlighted that pandemics usually have a life span of 2 and a half to 3 years and they end when a milder, more infective variant replaces a virulent one. "This mild variant then stays within the community. Viruses never die and cannot be eradicated. However, immunity can reduce the severity of disease. Occasionally, a mutated, more virulent variant may resurface and cause outbreaks again. Maybe omicron might be the beginning of the end," said Dr. Bhalla.

Dr Nimisha Batra, suggested

strict adherence to COVID appropriate behavior and urged people who haven't got vaccinated to get their vaccination done. "The road ahead needs to be paved with greater vaccinations at the very least. To keep the virus at bay one doesn't need special training. Simple practices like wearing an N95 mask and maintaining physical distance will help in containing the spread of the virus."

Dr Ravul Jindal said, "We can't be complacent about the severity of Omicron as it is just the beginning. Yes, the effect of the new variant is mild but it is dangerous as it's spreading like wildfire. People who are not vaccinated and have comorbidities are more vulnerable to the virus."

Dr. Raman Abrol, added, "The Omicron variant has over two and a half dozen mutations in the spike protein region. This fact confers Omicron with two properties that render it worse than Delta. One, very high viral loads are seen in infected people which causes the virus to potentially spread to other people faster. And two, it seems to be infecting people with vaccine induced immunity."

Skipper Latham's century helps hosts seize advantage

CHRISTCHURCH : Skipper Tom Latham scored a remarkable century as New Zealand dominated Day 1 of the ongoing second Test against Bangladesh here at the Hagley Oval, Christchurch on Sunday. At stumps, New Zealand's score read 349/1 with Latham (186\*) and Devon Conway (99\*) currently present at the crease. Sent into bat, New Zealand got off to a remarkable start as openers Latham and Will Young put the Bangladesh bowlers on backfoot by registering boundaries quite easily. Both batters played out the first session, ensuring that the hosts do not lose any wickets. Both batters went past their 50-run mark, and ended up forming a 148-run opening stand. Bangladesh finally got the wicket in the 38th over as Shoriful Islam had Young (54) dismissed. However, Latham marched on and he brought up his 12th Test century in the 45th over of the innings. Devon Conway next came out to the middle and he also registered his half-century and this gave further advantage to the hosts. Latham continued on from where he left off, bringing up his 150 and Bangladesh's backs were against the wall, as New Zealand's score read 270/1 after the end of the 71st over.

Conway becomes first player to score 1st innings 50+ score in first 5 Tests

CHRISTCHURCH: New Zealand batter Devon Conway became the first player to achieve a 50+ score in his first five Tests on Sunday. Conway achieved this feat during the ongoing second Test match against Bangladesh at the Hagley Oval, Christchurch on Sunday. Making his Test debut against England in June 2021 at Lords, Conway played a breakthrough knock of 200 runs. This was followed 80 against England at Edgbaston. Maintaining his fiery form, the Kiwi batter went on to score 54 against India at the World Test Championship (WTC) and then 122 against Bangladesh in the first Test at Mount Maunganui. Coming to the second Test, Bangladesh opted to bowl against New Zealand and Conway is currently unbeaten at 94 runs during the third session of the match.

Avishka Fernando likely to miss ODI series against Zimbabwe after testing COVID positive

COLOMBO : Sri Lanka batter Avishka Fernando is likely to be ruled out of the ODI series against Zimbabwe after testing positive for COVID-19. Reportedly, Sri Lanka's likely squad were expected to enter the bio-secure bubble on Sunday, but Fernando - whose positive test arrived before the bubble was formed - will not join the rest of the team. Early return of the previously banned trio - Kusal Mendis, Niroshan Dickwella, and Danushka Gunathilaka may fill the void of Fernando's absence. Fernando had been in good form, having struck 100 off 64, and 63 off 41 in the last two matches of the Lankan Premier League. Sri Lanka and Zimbabwe will be locking horns for ODI series, starting from January 16. All three matches will be played in Pallekele, with the second and third games on January 18 and January 21.

Jurgen Klopp to take charge of Liverpool's FA Cup tie with Shrewsbury after recovering from COVID

LIVERPOOL: Jurgen Klopp will take charge of Liverpool's FA Cup third-round tie with Shrewsbury Town on Sunday, the Premier League confirmed on Sunday. JALANDHAR: Harbhajan Singh had a very successful career as a cricketer playing 103 Tests, 236 ODIs and 28 T20Is for the country picking up 417 wickets in Tests and 294 wickets overall in limited-overs cricket. Despite playing an important role in the 2007 T20 World Cup and the 2011 50-over World Cup triumphs, the wily off-spinner and other stars did not get a chance to play another 50-over World Cup for their country. They include 2011 WC 'Player of the series' Yuvraj Singh, leading wicket-taker Zaheer Khan, opener Virender Sehwag and Gautam Gambhir. "It would have been nice to play another world cup together with all my colleagues like Yuvraj and Virender Sehwag. When I took 400 Test wickets, I was only 31 and in 2011 also, I was 31. At 31, I was doing really well and I was fitter than many who actually were playing the game. After that, things did not go our way. I don't know what happened and who was behind it but whatever happened it's gone. There is no point talking about it. But yes would have been nice to play another world cup with Viru, Yuvi and maybe Gautam Gambhir as well. We guys were fit enough to be the part of the 2015 World Cup team which did not happen. That is something which was not in our hands and all I have to say is whatever opportunities we have got, whatever we have done for Indian cricket. I always want to be grateful for that and love all the opportunities we have got by the BCCI. I am going to be grateful for that and people have said a lot about that 2012, 2013, 2014 period why those guys did not play who won the world cup for India which I do not have the answer. You guys don't have the answer. I don't know who can give the answer but you must ask the BCCI. At that time, the BCCI that why these guys did not play together after winning the 2011 World Cup. We were not in our late 30s, we were in our starting 30s. I was 31, Viru was like 31-32, Yuvi was 29-30 and we never got to play another world cup which is quite strange actually," explained Harbhajan Singh while talking to a news agency. The 'Turbanator' played a pivotal role in many Indian victories. The 2001 Test series win against the then mighty Australians under the leadership of Steve Waugh as well as the 2007 T20 World Cup and 2011 50-over World Cup. But without a doubt for Harbhajan, it was the 2011 World Cup that stands out for him. "It will be very difficult for me to pick one special moment. Obviously, if it has to be picking one, then nothing like winning the 2011 World Cup at home but yes keeping that in mind how special it was I don't want to forget what made me that cricketer Harbhajan Singh was that series against Australia where I took 32 wickets and I became the first Indian to take that hat-trick. That series gave me a lot of confidence because that series happened for me and I could perform the way I did and that made me know who I am and because of that I played the 2007 World Cup. Obviously, that was a very special moment not just for us but a very proud moment for all the Indians. Everybody was happy that we won the T20 world cup and winning the 2011 World Cup was a very special one.
