

SC notice to Centre, EC on PIL against freebies by political parties during polls

AGENCY NEW DELHI, JAN 25

The Supreme Court on Tuesday issued a notice to the Centre and Election Commission of India seeking direction to seize election symbols and deregister political parties that promised to distribute irrational freebies from public funds.

A Bench of Chief Justice of

India NV Ramana, Justices AS Bopanna and Hima Kohli agreed to hear the plea and observed that it's a serious issue that may influence the electorate and affect the fairness of polls.

"It's a serious issue no doubt. Freebie budget is going beyond regular budget. Even though it is not a corrupt practice but it creates a uneven level playing field,"
the Bench said while posting
the matter for hearing after
four weeks. During the hearing, petitioner Ashwini Upadhyay's counsel Vikas Singh
argued that the money of citizens of this country is at stake
here. "There are States which
have a debt burden of 3 lakh
per person and then freebies

are being offered. Election

Commission framed guidelines without any teeth. Every party is doing it, I don't want to name," senior advocate Singh said. To this, the CJI asked if every party has indulged in freebies, why the petitioner has mentioned only two political parties in the plea. "If every party is doing this why you mentioned only two parties in your petition?

Saying frequent elections the country's Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday urged the people, academics, experts and intellectuals to discuss the idea of 'One nation, One election". Modi made the observation while interacting with BJP workers from Gujarat when he expressed concern over low voter turnout in successive elections. "In the 1951 general elections, only 45 per cent eligible population exercised their franchise. In 2019, the turnout was 67 per cent. Everyone ... should spare a thought about the low voting percentage in the elections,' he said. Citing low voter turnout in urban areas, he said: "People in these areas

talk about elections on social media but the percentage of polling remains low. Such a situation should change in a vibrant democratic country." On the occasion of National Voters Day, Modi urged booth level workers to ensure 75 per cent polling in any election by encouraging people to vote.

"For us, election is a festival of democracy. We should not fight elections only to come to power but fulfill the expectation of the people," he said. The Prime Minister lauded the Election Commission. "From 1950 till today, it has increased its dignity by conducting free and fair elections. India is among those countries where the EC can ... transfer officials. In many democratic countries, the election panel does not have such power."


14 Haryana cops to get police medal

5 crore join EPF Sep 2017-Nov 2021

NEW DELHI, JAN 25 (UNI) As many as 4.88 crore new subscribers joined the Employees Provident Fund (EPF) scheme between September 2017 and November 2021, giving a peak into the level of formal sector employment in the country. According to the National Statistical Office (NSO), 5.93 crore new subscribers joined the Employees State Insurance (ESI) scheme during the same period. The NSO noted that the numbers released by it give different perspectives on the levels of employment in the formal sector and does not measure employment at a holistic level. While EPF is a mandatory savings scheme under the Employees Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952, ESI is an integrated social security scheme tailored to provide socio-economic protection to the workers in the organized sector and their dependents in contingencies such as sickness, maternity and death or disablement due to an employment injury or occupational hazard. EPF is managed under the aegis of the Employees Provident Fund Organization (EPFO).

Govt imposes curbs on export of human hair

NEW DELHI: The government on Tuesday imposed restrictions on the export of human hair, a move, according to the hair industry, would help in checking alleged smuggling of the product from India.

Hair exports were earlier allowed without any restriction. But now an exporter would have to seek permission or licence from the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) under the Commerce Ministry.

"The export policy of human hair, unworked, whether or not washed or scoured; waste of human hair or any other form of raw

human hair...has been put under restricted category, with immediate effect," Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) Santosh Kumar Sarangi said in a notification.

Welcoming the move, member of Human Hair and Hair Products Manufacturers and Exporters Association of India Sunil Eamani said that it was their long-pending demand.

Time and again, he has alleged that this labour intensive industry was facing a peculiar challenge of smuggling of raw human hair to countries like Myanmar and China, which is hurting local industries and exports.



EDITORIAL Claiming Cleo

ach of the three recent attempts by Narendra Modi and his government to correct 'imbal-✓ances' in history has been challenged on the grounds of creating new asymmetries. While unveiling the hologram of Subhas Chandra Bose at the India Gate, the prime minister alleged that the contributions of several luminaries — including those of Bose? — towards the freedom struggle have not been given due recognition. He has, apparently, righted the wrong. This comes after the Centre rejected Bengal's tableau, which would have focused on Bose on his 125th birth anniversary, for the Republic Day celebrations. The hypocrisy has only sharpened allegations of political opportunism and pettiness against Mr Modi's regime. It is pertinent to mention that the ideals being pursued by the Bharatiya Janata Party are very much antithetical to the ones - secularism, pluralism, harmonious religious co-existence — held high by Bose. Equally mischievous is the argument, in defence of the Centre's decision to relocate the Amar Jawan Jyoti to the National War Memorial, that the immortal flame was an embodiment of colonial legacy since it honoured — quite correctly — Indians who served in the British Indian army. This cherrypicking of sacrifice of Indian soldiers is a regressive reading of history. Finally, the government's rationale for removing "Abide With Me" — Mahatma Gandhi's favourite hymn - from the tunes in the Beating Retreat ceremony has been revealing too: few Indians, it said, relate to the hymn. The claim that a nation born out of blood cannot comprehend the song's plea for

healing is an insult to national intelligence. These attempts at 'correction' are not disjointed; they fit neatly with Mr Modi's ambition of curating the nation's history in a mould that is favourable to the BJP's troubling, divisive ideological template. Hearteningly, the war over history is not a one-sided conflict. There is spirited opposition to the rewriting of India's inclusive history as well as to the BJP's attempt to co-opt icons: the Bengal chief minister has led the political charge against this conjuring of an ahistorical tradition. In fact, the political tussle would, hopefully, be an occasion for citizens to foster a greater engagement with bona fide historical narratives. Indeed, this learning could even be a 'duty'. something that Mr Modi waxes eloquent on. An informed public, knowledgeable about history's trajectories and the real ideological inclinations of public figures being poached by the sangh parivar, could be sufficient insurance against Mr Modi the history

'Good Governance in our Federation requires Centre and states to work together'

There are recent reports in the media about serious concerns of several State Governments on Government of India's proposed move to amend the IAS service rules to meet the shortage of IAS officers at various levels at the centre. Under current dispensation officers opt for central deputation from the states voluntarily. Centre than makes a selection from these officers for posts, vacant or likely to be vacant in near future. While doing so it considers suitability of the officer based on his past experience. Once the selection is finalized, orders are issued requesting state government to relieve the officer concerned. Each state has a certain quota beyond which its officers are not accepted by the centre.

In the last decade, there has been a gradual decline in number of officers who opt for central deputation. While in the 60s there were a number of IAS officers even at undersecretary level, it is increasingly getting difficult for the central government to get adequate officers at even joint Secretary Level.

Generally, of the total cadre strength of the states, about 25% -30% used to be on central deputation. Currently less than 10% are working in various central ministries. According to certain reports these numbers in states like UP, Bihar, Odisha and Tamil Nadu and Kerala are between 8% to 15%. There used to be a charm for officers in going to central deputation. This was considered a recognition of officer's ability. The selec-

tion process was tough. Part of the reason for this non-availability of officers for central deputation is inadequate recruitment in certain years more than decade and a half back. But an important reason is also comparatively better service conditions in

Any change in rules must however ensure that the shortages of officers in centre and states are balanced. If there is a shortage of officers in the state, the centre should recognize this and in the beginning of the year work out an arrangement with the state. There is a corresponding responsibility on the states too. The proposed change in rules clearly cannot be faulted on the above grounds. It aims at correcting an aberration. While fixing the cadre strength of states about 40% posts of senior duty are earmarked for central deputation. So there is an inbuilt provision in recruitment and posts sanction for states to keep certain number of posts for meeting needs of the centre. Considering that recruitments in past were not adequate, the proposed change in rule provides for shortage to be shared equitably between the centre and states. Also since vacancies need to be filled in time, there is a suggestion of time limit in which states must respond and relieve the officer selected.

There are however several concerns of the states which need to be addressed. It has to be clearly understood that in the discussion with the states when they give list of officers which they wish to offer for central deputation, it will be the proposal of the states alone.

It will look at its own requirements in the state and then offer names for central deputation equitably sharing the shortages in recruitment in the past, In preparation of list of officers to be offered for central deputation Centre will have no role.

The centre if it wishes to have an officer would suggest to the state. If the two agree, the officer would be put on central deputation. If the state does not wish to suggest his name for deputation, the centre would respect their views even though they have the power under cadre rules to do so.Past experience has shown that such an exercise of power by the centre is counterproductive. It does not result in good cadre management. The centre has to realize that improving working conditions for officers of Deputy Secretary and Director Level is critical to the success of cadre management. If a large number of officers show their willingness and opt for central deputation, the states will have pressure to offer names. If there are few takers, the state would be forcing people to opt for going to Delhi. Many of the officers at this level have problems of education for their children, transport and higher cost of living in Delhi. These issues would need to be sorted out. A deputation allowance for the period for deputation in Delhi could be an option. Education could be assured by ensuring admission in schools like Sanskriti and other reputed institutions who could tie up on this issue with DOPT.

The states also have to look at this issue not in an adversarial but positive manner where needs of both, Centre and the State have to be matched and met.

The proposed amendment is just suggesting a mechanism for meeting the shortages and sharing it where necessary. The centre should dispel fears of states about misuse of central

The centre will have shortages at the level of DS and Director for coming years .It should look at meeting some of these gaps from senior public sector officers. Many of them are highly qualified and can meet the needs of the secretarial work for a couple of years.

'Slushy' magma ocean led to formation of the Moon's crust

arth's natural sateld lite Moon, has al-√ways been a subject of immense suspense room for discovery. Now, scientists have shown how the freezing of a 'slushy' ocean of magma may be responsible for the composition of the Moon's crust.

The scientists, from the University of Cambridge and the Ecole normale superieure de Lyon, have proposed a new model of crystallisation. where crystals remained suspended in liquid magma over hundreds of millions of years as the lunar 'slush' froze and solidified. The results were reported in the journal 'Geophysical Review 'Geophysical Letters'

Over fifty years ago, Apollo 11 astronauts collected samples from the lunar Highlands. These



large, pale regions of the Moon -- visible to the naked eye -- were made up of relatively light rocks called anorthosites. Anorthosites formed early in the history of the Moon, between 4.3 and 4.5 billion years ago.

Similar anorthosites, formed through the crystallisation of magma, are also found in fossilised magma chambers on Earth. Producing the volumes anorthosite found on the

Moon however, would have required a huge global magma ocean.

Scientists believed that the Moon formed when two protoplanets, or embryonic worlds, collided. The larger of these two protoplanets became the Earth, and the smaller became the Moon. One of the outcomes of this collision was that the Moon was very hot -- so hot that its entire mantle was molten magma, or a magma ocean.

Coffee consumption improves digestion

recent clinical study has found positive effects of coffee on digestion and the gut, and it protects against common digestive as well as certain liver dis-

The study has been published in the 'Nutrients Journal'. The review of 194 research publications suggested that

moderate coffee consumption (defined by EFSA as 3-5 cups per day) was not found to generate harmful effects on the various organs of the digestive

Two areas of particular interest emerging from the research are the association between coffee and a reduced risk of gallstones and the evidence linking coffee consumption with a reduced risk of pancreatitis, although more research is still needed.

On its journey through the gastrointestinal tract, coffee has three main impacts:

1. Coffee is associated with gastric, biliary, and pan-



creatic secretions all necessary for the digestion of food. Coffee was found to stimulate the production of the digestive hormone gastrin; and hydrochloric acid, present in gastric juice - both of which help break down food in the stomach. Coffee also stimulates the secretion of cholecystokinin (CCK), a hormone that increases the production of bile, also involved indigestion.

2. Coffee appeared to be associated with changes in the composition of gut microbiota. In the reviewed studies, coffee consumption was found to induce changes in the composition of the gut microbiota, mainly at the population level of Bifidobacteria - a ubiquitous inhabitant of the gastrointesti-

3. Coffee is associated with colon motility - the process by which food travels through the digestive tract. The data reviewed suggested that coffee may stimulate motility in the colon as much as cereals, 23 per cent more than decaffeinated coffee or 60 per cent more than a glass of water and it may be linked to a reduced risk of chronic constinution.



ositive role models influence our actions and motivate us to strive to uncover our true potential and overcome our weaknesses. Having them pushes us to make the most of our life. We generally search for our role models in charming celebrities, accomplished professionals, dedicated social reformers, prominent historical characters, innovative businessmen, successful politicians or convincing spiritual gurus. But we miss to acknowledge the influence of those insignificants, whom we don't find in textbooks, posters, internet or amongst a plethora of named roads and government buildings. As a matter of fact, it is they who actually shape our life and hence destiny and they remain etched in our memory for long always providing us a very pleas-

ant feeling upon each recall.

Amongst many such " Heroes" of my life, the story of an unnamed hero, who resides only as a voice within my heart for the last about a decade and half as I never met him, is worth narrating. I have been a regular blood donor since my younger days. My blood group is B negative. I still remember the



first time. When I was pressing the ball on the blood bank bed, the officer in charge, a kind gentleman came to me and started conversing with me. He told me that my blood group is special. I knew that it was a light joke meant to take away my nervousness as we know that a particular blood group does not

make someone more or less special.

If I am not lying, I don't recognise or identify even a single individual who was infused with my blood every time it is donated. One of the cardinal princidonor is not expected to expect anything in return of the precious gift he gave. Even the words of gratitude from the recipient or his family are considered undesirable.

The best way to comply with this

principle is to maintain anonymity between the donor and recipient family as far as possible. Believe me, it took decades of my life to understand that a tiniest desire or expectation of gratitude in return, not only makes us restless and stressful but also inflate our ego in a way that we start positioning ourselves better than the person who has

received our gift of donation.
This pride of "betterness" makes us vulnerable to get smashed again and again in this complex matrix of human

Turning to the story, one fine morning, I received a call from a blood bank, asking if I was ready to donate blood for some life saving procedure of a young man admitted in a hospital. As usual, I quietly went there and donated a unit of blood and forgot. On the same evening, I got a call from an unknown number on

the brother of the patient for whom I had donated the blood during the day. He must have really pleaded with the blood bank to obtain my number as I had instructed the blood bank to keep me anonymous.

The caller seemed to be in real desperation trying to convey to me as to how he and his whole family was indebted to me and how important was the unit of blood to save the life of his young brother.

Although I was feeling a little bit annoyed at the official of the blood bank, who leaked my number to him, I politely told the caller that it was not required to express anything like that. But he was really adamant and pressing me to reveal my identity so that they could thank me in person. By then my annoyance had converted into a bit of amusement. It was really funny that one could pursue someone this much to reveal one's identity and that too just to express its gratefulness. I took a deep breath, smiled and said "I am the one who was driving slow and blocking your way that day when you were in a hurry and getting late to reach the office. I was the one who was trying to cross the road when the traffic light was green and you had to apply urgent brakes to save me. I am the one who was foolish and selfish enough to push people to board the metro train in a crowded metro station because I was afraid that I would miss the train and you were observing me. So I request you to not get angry at me when you meet me next time. Just consider that maybe I am one of those simpletons for whom it is not possible to keep pace with this alarming speed of change in technology and society. Hence I request you to smile and keep cool when you see me next time."

There was silence for a couple of seconds and then came a prompt reply, "Sir, I too have an identity." I giggled and asked smilingly, "OK. And what is

"God forbid, should you get into some grave trouble and you feel too feeble to get out of it. And suddenly, you feel as if an unknown hand has patted your shoulder to comfort you, to support you, to make you emerge stronger, I would have been the one who had




