India logs
2,51,209 new
Covid cases,
627 deaths

NEW DELHI: India has recorded 2,51,209 new Covid cases, the Union Health Ministry said on Friday. According to the bulletin issued by the Ministry, the total caseload rose to 4,06,22,709, while the death toll rose to 4,92,327 after 627 more patients succumbed to the virus. On the other hand, 3,47,443 more people have recovered from the disease, taking the total tally of recoveries to 3,80,24,771. The recovery rate stands at 93.60 per cent. The active case-load now stands at 21,05,611, the figures showed.

BSF trooper
injured, 49 kg
heroin seized

GURDASPUR: A Border Security force (BSF) trooper was seriously injured in a gunfight with drug smugglers on Friday close to the border with Pakistan, leading to the recovery of 49 kg of heroin, officials said. BSF Deputy Inspector General Prabhakar Joshi said the fighting erupted after BSF personnel spotted and warned the smugglers to halt but they opened fire, wounding Gyan Chand in the head. He was rushed to a hospital in Amritsar.

Centre notifies
scheme to enhance
competitiveness in
capital goods

NEW DELHI: Ministry of Heavy Industries has notified the Scheme on Enhancement of Competitiveness in the Indian Capital Goods Sector-Phase-II for providing assistance to Common Technology Development and Services Infrastructure, said a press release. The scheme has a financial outlay of Rs 1,207 crore with Budgetary support of Rs.975 crore and Industry Contribution of Rs 232 crore. The scheme was notified on 25 January 2022. The objective of Phase II of the Scheme for Enhancement of Competitiveness of the Capital Goods Sector is to expand.

Punjab reports
4,189 new COVID
cases, 45 deaths

CHANDIGARH: Punjab lost 45 people to COVID on Thursday as it reported 4,189 fresh cases taking the overall infection tally to 7,32,135, a daily medical bulletin said. The deaths were reported from several districts including Gurdaspur, Barnala Amritsar, Hoshiarpur, Jalandhar and Moga. So far, the state has lost 17,129 lives to the infection. Active cases in the state stand at 36,941. Of the fresh cases, 724 cases were reported in Mohali, followed by 442 reported in Ludhiana and 439 reported in Jalandhar.

No dilution in SC/ST promotion quota, says Supreme Court

The Supreme Court on Friday refused to dilute the conditions for reservation in promotion for SC/ST employees and held that the collection of quantifiable data is mandatory apart from the assessment of inadequacy of representation after a periodic review. A Bench headed by Justice L. Nageswara Rao passed the judgement. The apex court had on October 26 reserved the verdict after hearing the arguments and detailed submissions from the Centre and all the parties. The Supreme Court said a review period should be determined by the Union government. "The State is obligated to collect quantifiable data before granting reservation in promotion to Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe (SC/ ST) employees. It cannot lay down new yardstick after the Constitution bench decision in Nagaraj (2006) and Jarnail Singh (2018)," the Supreme Court said. "Cadre should be unit for collection for quantifiable data for reservation. The collection cannot be with respect to the entire class/class/group, but it should be relatable to Grade/Category of post to which promotion is sought. Cadre should be the unit for



collecting quantifiable data," the court said. Justice Rao said: "On the basis of arguments, we have divided the submission into six points. One is yardstick. In the light of Jarnail Singh and Nagaraj, we have said we cannot lay down any yardstick. With respect to the unit for collecting quantifiable data, we have said that the State is obligated to collect quantifiable data." He said: "We have not expressed any opinion on the merits of individual cases. We have answered only the common issues formulated after hearing the parties. We are listing the matter on February 24."

Apex Court quashes 'arbitrary-
unconstitutional' suspension of 12 Maha MLAs

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Friday set aside the "indefinite suspension" of 12 Bharatiya Janata Party legislators from Maharashtra Assembly noting it could only be limited to the Monsoon Session of 2021. A bench headed by Justice AM Khanwilkar and also comprising Justice CT Ravikumar called the suspension "unconstitutional and arbitrary" on a joint appeal filed by the 12 opposition MLAs challenging their one-year suspension from the state Legislative Assembly for allegedly misbehaving with the presiding officer. The apex court held that the suspension could have only been for the Monsoon Session in July 2021. The top court had on January 19 reserved its order on the plea filed by suspended lawmakers led by Ashish Shelar. It was on July 22 last year they filed the plea in the top court challenging the resolution passed by the state assembly. The 12 suspended members are Ashish Shelar, Sanjay Kute, Abhimanyu Pawar, Girish Mahajan, Atul Bhatkalkar, Parag Alavani, Harish Pimpale, Yogesh Sagar, Jay Kumar Rawat, Narayan Kuche, Ram Satpute and Bunt Bhargava. The 12 MLAs were suspended on July 5, 2021 from the Assembly for one year after the Uddhav Thackeray government accused them of "misbehaving" with presiding officer Bhaskar Jadhav in the Speaker's chamber. The motion to suspend these MLAs was moved by state Parliamentary Affairs Minister Anil Parab and passed by a voice vote. During the course of the arguments, the apex court said the suspension for one year should be linked with some purpose and there has to be an "overpowering" reason the member should not be allowed to even attend the next session. The bench has observed the resolution passed by the Maharashtra Legislative Assembly is prima facie "unconstitutional" as such a suspension cannot operate beyond six months owing to a constitutional bar. It said during the hearing earlier that the explicit outer limit as per the Constitution for an MLA to be absent from his seat is 60 days, after which the seat is deemed to be vacated. "How long can seat remain vacant? At the most six months outer limit can be there. Here we are talking about a constituency being represented in a parliamentary form of democracy?"

Modi wears Sikh cadet turban at NCC Rally

Two days after donning the traditional cap of Uttarakhand and a stole from Manipur during the Republic Day parade, Prime Minister Narendra Modi wore a Sikh cadet turban while attending a rally of the National Cadet Corps (NCC) here on Friday.

Modi wore a rifle-green turban with a red-coloured feather -- similar to how Sikh cadets wear it in the NCC -- for Friday's rally at the Cariappa parade ground here.

On January 26, Modi had ditched his traditional turban look and wore a traditional cap from Uttarakhand with an image of the brahmakamal, the state flower, and sported a stole from Manipur.

Official sources had said that Modi uses the brahmakamal whenever he offers prayers at Kedarnath.

Punjab, Uttarakhand and Manipur are among the five states that head for polls next month.

Turbans have been a highlight of the prime minister's sartorial choices at Independence Day and Republic Day events.

Last year, he sported a special turban from Gujarat's Jamnagar on 72nd Republic Day. On Independence Day last year, he chose a saffron headgear with red patterns and a long plume.

For his maiden Independence Day speech in 2014, he had opted for a bright red Jodhpuri bandhej turban with green at the tail.

Majithia files nomination from Amritsar East, Majitha

Yediyurappa's granddaughter Dr Soundarya dies by suicide

Former Karnataka Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa's granddaughter Dr Soundarya V Y allegedly ended her life by hanging herself from the ceiling fan at her Vasant Nagar flat on Friday morning, police said.

According to police, the reason behind the extreme step taken by the 30-year old doctor working in a private hospital was not known immediately.

Soundarya, daughter of the BJP leader's second daughter Padmavathi, was married to Dr Neeraj S, who works in the same hospital, in 2018, police said. On Friday morning,



Neeraj left for the duty at around 8 AM and it is suspected that she ended her life two hours later. The matter came to light when the maid came to the house and knocked on the door repeatedly but in vain.

Channi's brother Manohar Singh files nomination from Bassi Pathana

FATEHGARH SAHIB: Punjab Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi's brother Dr Manohar Singh Bassi on Friday filed his nomination from Bassi Pathana (reserved) constituency as an independent candidate. Voting for Punjab assembly polls will be held on February 20 and the counting will take place on March 10.



23 Naxals surrender in Chhattisgarh

Twenty-three Maoists -- including three carrying rewards of Rs 1 lakh each -- have capitulated to district and Central Reserve Police Force officers at Kolaiguda camp set up last month within Bheji Police Station limits in this district of Left-wing extremism-affected Bastar division, it was officially learnt on Friday. In a first, 1,000 'Make in India' drones to enthrall audience at Beating Retreat ceremony

A novel drone show will be one of the major attractions of this year's 'Beating the Retreat' ceremony for the first time at Vijay Chowk in New Delhi on Saturday, informed the Ministry of Defence on Friday.

The event will be graced by President and Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces Ram Nath Kovind.

According to the Ministry, the show has been made a part of the ceremony to commemorate 75 years of Independence, being celebrated as 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'.



Other dignitaries, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, will witness the show, which has been conceptualised, designed, produced

and choreographed under the 'Make in India' initiative.

The drone show has been organised by a startup 'Botlab Dynamics' and supported by the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Delhi and the Department of Science and Technology. The show would be of 1">10 minutes duration involving around 1">1,000 drones fabricated through indigenous technology. Synchronised background music will also be played during the drone show. "Martial musical tunes with Indian fervour will be the flavour of the ceremony this year. A total of 26 performances will enthrall the spectators with foot-tapping

music played by the bands of Indian Army, Navy, Air Force and Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF)," the ministry said. The entry band will be Massed Band playing the 'Veer Sainik' tune. This will be followed by Pipes and Drums Band, CAPF Band, Air Force Band, Naval Band, Army Military Band and Massed Bands. The principal conductor of the ceremony will be Commander Vijay Charles D'Cruz.

A number of new tunes have been added to the ceremony to celebrate 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'. These include 'Kerala', 'Hind ki Sena' and 'Ae Mere Watan Ke Logon'.

Standing crops damaged by rain

DEEPAK SHARMA
ISMAILABAD: In 20 thousand acres of 49 villages of Ismailabad block, standing crops have been submerged in rain-water. One hundred per cent loss has been estimated in three thousand acres. The loss has been 75 per cent in about five thousand acres. This report has been sent by the agriculture department to the top officials. In such a situation, it is clear how thin the condition of the farmer has become. Circumstances are such that this time the production of wheat and mustard crop will also be badly affected. This month's record unseasonal rains have made the conditions in the fields worse. The rained wheat, mustard and potato crop is yet to be saved. Farmers are also getting relief from the second day's sunshine and westerly winds. According to the agriculture department, standing crops in 20 thousand acres of 49 villages have been badly affected. In this, three thousand acres have been destroyed one hundred per cent. About five thousand acres have a crop loss of 75 per cent. About eight thousand acres are affected by more than fifty per cent. According to the department, along with mustard and wheat, there has been a big loss of potatoes. Agriculture Development Officer Dr. Vinod Kumar said that the crops have been badly affected by the rains. According to him, this time the farmer has been hit hard. Potatoes and vegetables have been destroyed. Progressive farmer Satish Rana said that the government should install recharge bores in the fields. This will save crops and improve ground water level. INLD leader Manjeet Chaudhary said that the government should compensate the affected farmers.

The highest number of 538 mobile phones were recovered in Yamunanagar district while 349 in Panchkula, 287 in Hisar, 284 in Gurugram, 257 in Karnal, 241 in Ambala, 229 in Kaithal, 188 in Noonah, 188 in Fatehabad, 170 in Jind and 166 in Pal-



wal. 132 in Rohtak, 129 in Panipat, 122 in Sirsa, 119 in Dadri, 112 in Narnaul, 83 in Hansi, 83 in Bhiwani, 54 in Kurukshetra, 56 in Rewari, 46 in Faridabad and 34-34 in Jhajjar and Sonapat. At the same time, the GRP unit of Haryana Police also con-



tributed in recovering 300 mobile phones.

After being recovered, the police contacted the complainants and handed over the mobiles to the real owners. 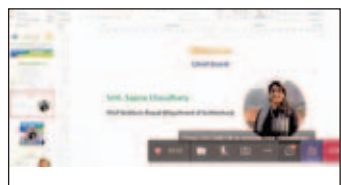

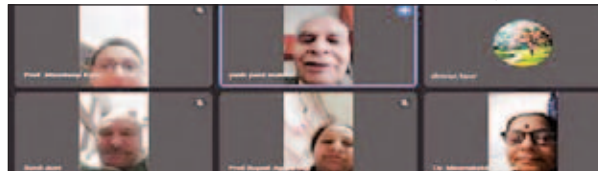

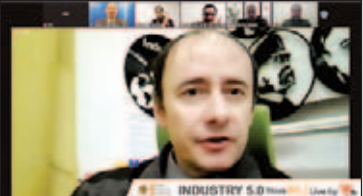

EDITORIAL

Pull back

Old habits die hard. When those habits are hardened over a century, that saying is even truer. The United States of America and Russia today stand on the cusp of a dangerous conflict over Ukraine that in reality is a clash over their perceived spheres of influence. Russian troops have gathered on three sides of the former Soviet republic, while NATO is sending ships, planes and weapons to counter Moscow's threat, all contributing to an ominous drift toward war. The Pentagon has reportedly placed 8,500 US soldiers on standby, for potential deployment to eastern Europe. Post-Brexit Britain is flexing its muscles too, sending weapons to Ukraine. The US secretary of state, Antony Blinken, has accused the Russian president, Vladimir Putin, of stoking these tensions in Europe without any provocation from Ukraine or the West. Meanwhile, Mr Putin has alleged the US is trying to threaten Russia's security. Both are being economical with reality. There can never be a justification for threatening any other nation's sovereignty. At the same time, Russia has legitimate security concerns in the form of an eastward-expanding NATO with American warheads stationed close to its borders.

To be fair, all signs so far suggest that the US president, Joe Biden, is willing to work with Mr Putin to address some of his worries without agreeing to the Kremlin's demand that NATO commit to never including Ukraine. But as is so often the case with US foreign policy, there is a gap between word and action that undercuts America's moral argument. Washington has said that it rejects the notion of global powers carving the world into spheres of influence. But the US itself has, starting with the Monroe Doctrine in Latin America, long demanded fealty from nations in what it views as its sphere of influence. Worse, the US is contradicting itself over the current crisis. By not ensuring the inclusion of Ukraine in its negotiations with Russia, the US is effectively assigning itself the role of suzerain over Kiev. That, in turn, only serves to undermine the elected government of Ukraine. It is a tragedy the country knows well, with Polish, Lithuanian, Ottoman, Tsarist and Soviet rulers controlling all or parts of modern Ukraine through large periods of the past millennium. In the 21st century, Europe's second-largest nation by area must not be denied a say over its future. The onus for that rests with both Washington and Moscow.

N Korea confirms missile tests

North Korea said Friday its two latest rounds of weapons tests this week were successful while vowing to bolster its nuclear war deterrent and speed up the development of more powerful warheads. It appeared North Korean leader Kim Jong Un did not attend the tests on Tuesday and Thursday, which were detected by the militaries of neighbours South Korea and Japan.

But Kim did inspect a munitions factory where workers pledged loyalty to their leader, who smashes with his bold pluck the challenges of US imperialists and their vassal forces," state media said.

North Korea has been ramping up its testing activity in recent months, including six rounds of weapons launches so far in 2022, demonstrating its military might amid pandemic-related difficulties and a prolonged freeze in nuclear diplomacy with the United States.

While aggressively expanding his military capabilities despite limited resources, Kim is also reviving Pyongyang's old playbook of brinkmanship to wrest concessions from Washington, which leads international sanctions over the North's nuclear program. The North's official Korean Central News Agency described the two ballistic missiles launched from a coastal area on Thursday as surface-to-surface tactical guided missile armed with a conventional warhead and said they accurately struck a sea target.

Photos released by state media suggest the weapons test-fired were a short-range solid-fuel missile it apparently designed after Russia's Iskander ballistic system.

The missile, which North Korea has tested since 2019, could be launched from launcher trucks and trains and is designed for maneuverability and low-altitude flight. It's seen as a key piece in the country's expanding arsenal of shorter-range weapons apparently aimed at overwhelming missile defenses in the region.

KCNA said Tuesday's launches were of a purported long-range cruise missile the North first tested in September. The two



missiles flew for more than 2 hours and 35 minutes and demonstrated an ability to strike targets 1,800 kilometers (1,118 miles) away, a performance that underscored their value in boosting the war deterrence of the country, the agency said.

The North has described this weapon as strategic, implying that it's being developed to deliver nuclear weapons.

Kim had attended a January 11 test-firing of a purported hypersonic missile he described as the most significant part of a five-year plan to build up the North's military force. His wishlist also includes multi-warhead missiles, spy satellites, solid-fuel long-range missiles and submarine-launched nuclear missiles. KCNA, in its separate report on Kim's visit to a munitions factory, said the facility was producing a major weapon system." It didn't say

when he visited. Touring the facility with top officials, including his increasingly powerful sister Kim Yo Jong, Kim Jong Un highly appreciated the workers' efforts to modernise the country's military and their devotion to defend the ruling Workers' Party's revolutionary cause with powerful cutting-edge arms, the KCNA said.

North Korea has described its weapons tests as a rightful exercise of self-defense and threatened stronger action after the Biden administration imposed fresh sanctions following this month's hypersonic tests. In a ruling party meeting chaired by Kim last week, senior party members made a veiled threat to resume testing of nuclear explosives and long-range missiles targeting the American homeland, which Kim suspended in 2018 while initiating diplomacy with the United States.

Kim's summitry with then-President Donald Trump derailed in 2019 after the Americans rejected North Korea's demands for major sanctions relief in exchange for a partial surrender of its nuclear capabilities. Some experts say North Korea could dramatically escalate weapons demonstrations after the Winter Olympics, which begin February 4 in China, the North's main ally and economic lifeline.

They say Pyongyang's leadership likely feels it could use a dramatic provocation to move the needle with the Biden administration, which has been preoccupied with bigger adversaries including China and Russia. The Biden administration has offered open-ended talks but showed no willingness to ease sanctions unless Kim takes real steps to abandon the nuclear weapons and missiles.

Study finds overweight dogs respond well to high-protein, high fibre diet

A new study of overweight dogs fed a high-protein, high-fibre diet for 24 weeks found that the dogs' body composition and inflammatory markers changed over time in ways that parallel the positive changes seen in humans on similar diets.

The study has been published in the 'Journal of Animal Science'.

The dogs achieved a healthier weight without losing too much muscle mass, and their serum triglycerides, insulin and inflammatory markers all decreased with weight loss. All such changes are beneficial, said University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign animal sciences professor Kelly Swanson, who led the new research. Previous studies had shown that overweight and obesity lead to a



shorter lifespan and a lower quality of life -- in dogs and humans, Swanson said. "Some of the problems we see in humans with obesity also occur in pet dogs," he said.

"There's added stress on the joints, there's an intolerance to exercise and heat; there's also glucose intolerance, insulin resistance. And if you look at pet insurance claims,

obesity is a big factor there," he added.

The study is unusual in that it also measured changes in the dogs' faecal microbiota over the course of losing weight, Swanson said.

Even though there are similarities in dog and human metabolism and digestive processes, dogs and humans differ in the species of microbes that inhabit the gut, he said.

Expectations from upcoming Budget

At this pandemic time, the demand generation, job creation, and stabilization of the dwindling economy should be the main motive of the upcoming union budget. Experts are suggesting a gradual fiscal consolidation path, by generating demand, capital expenditure to pursue growth and steps to control inflation. On the other hand, the economists expect the Central government to re-introduce wealth and inheritance tax to address the rising inequalities during the Covid pandemic. Oxfam report 2022 and other studies, suggested the re-introduction of these taxes. Changes in progressive and regressive taxation system are need of the hour and by increasing the slab on higher wealth ladder and by covering maximum tax evader as businessmen, lawyers, doctors and big farmers under income tax, so that accumulation of wealth can be checked and further income inequalities can be reduced. Most of the employees are doing work from home due to coronavirus, the salaried class people expect a deduction for home office expenses in calculating their taxes in Budget 2022. The employees clearly need assistance in terms of cost perspective. As multiple members in

a family are working from home and as they need to accommodate online classes for children, the salaried class employees are looking at moving to homes with larger personal spaces. And for this, there is an additional investment required for employees to manage to work from home and their expenses of internet, electricity has also increased, because of all they deserve to increase the limit of income tax exemption, so that their disposable income can increase. At this time, the insurance companies want health covers slotted in the 5% GST slab to make it more affordable to access quality healthcare. They believe that a reduction in the GST on all personal lines of products—from the existing 18% to 5% will encourage



more people to buy health insurance in these times. Moreover, the automobile sector also wants electric vehicles to be put in priority lending to encourage more citizens to buy EVs at low-interest rates. The automobile sector also wants the allocation of more funds for R&D in a public-private partnership model for the development of batteries. This step of govt. can short out the problem of fuel also. In the meantime, the hospitality and tourism sector want restoration of GST input tax credit as it struggles with thin margins, huge losses, and loss of livelihood. We all know that the tourism and hospitality sector has been the worst hit and it is now the third year in a row with practically no revenues. It also ex-

pects the Centre to formulate a mechanism to protect restaurants from further lockdowns. Representatives from banks and MSMEs expect the Centre support for streamlining the Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme—a measure introduced earlier during the pandemic. The airlines which are being affected by the pandemic want tax breaks and suspension of minimum alternate tax for at least two years.

The start-ups expect the Centre to bring clarity over issues such as taxation, legislation, exemptions and regulations. They want FM Sitharaman to acknowledge the potential of the industry and frame some clarity of operations to aid their operations and growth in the future. As the renewables sector in the country is looking for investment-based tax incentives for companies in EVs manufacturing / charging business, they expect the Centre to incentivise R&D, technology adoption and investments in the storage segment Govt. should delay the law on cryptocurrency at this chronic time because people have invested a huge amount of money in cryptocurrencies and at this time it will be like through the bathtub with a baby. Crude oil prices are maximum high in the international market after 2014, so the govt. should take appropriate measures in this budget to control fuel prices in a domestic market otherwise, it will decrease the aggregate consumption demand.

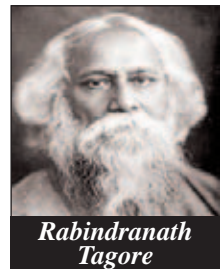

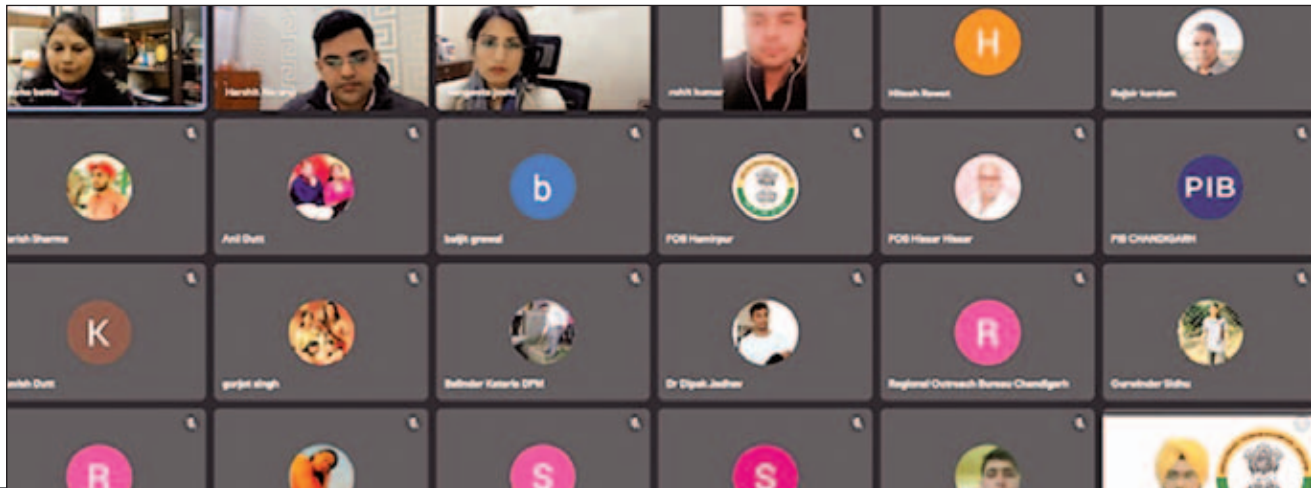

Skilling of Artisans will lead to Self-employment: Prof Som Nath

"There is an urgent need to provide training and skilling to the artisans who are involved in making different handicraft items. To improve the life, earning and for self-employment of 20 per cent poor population in the country, it is imperative to make them self-dependent by training them as artisans." Prof Som Nath Sachdeva, Vice Chancellor Kurukshetra University said this while speaking as Chief Guest in the opening ceremony of a "Workshop on Skilling for Artisans in Handicrafts" organized by Guru Jambheshwar University Hisar and sponsored by Minister of Textiles, Government of India in a private hotel at Kurukshetra. About 150 artisans, mostly women, attended this workshop. Prof Som Nath further said that there are 70 Lac artisans registered with the Government of India. The total export of handicraft from India in 2019-20 was 26,000 crores which is very low as compared to other countries.

TB preventive therapy begins to treat people who come in contact with patients

SANJAY AGGARWAL DHARAMSHALA, JAN 28

Chief Medical Officer District Kangra Dr. Gurdarshan Gupta informed that TB is one of the top 10 causes of death globally. Although TB has declined over the years, it is far from the targets set by the World Health Organization (WHO) strategy, which aims to reduce TB deaths by 90 percent by 2035. Dr. Gupta gave this information while presiding over the review meeting of National Tuberculosis Eradication Program today. He reported that a quarter of people globally are living with latent TB. Latent TB means that a person has TB bacteria but is not causing the disease.

He explained that if you have latent TB bacteria in your body, there is a one in ten chance that those germs will become active and make you sick at some point in the future. Although generally tuberculosis can be cured by treatment, yet it is best not to fall ill. Fortunately, latent TB can also be treated. This will protect your own health by keeping you from getting sick, and at the same time it will reduce the risk of spreading this TB germ to your family and friends. District Health Officer Dr. Vikram Katoh informed that in view of the excellent work of eradicating TB in district Kangra and Shimla, these two districts have been taken under the test and treat TB preventive

therapy model of latent TB under Akshaya Plus project. This activity has been started in district Kangra in collaboration with Akshay Plus project in Shahpur, Nagrota Bagwan, Tiara, Fatehpur, Indora, Gangath and Nagrota Suriyan of the district. District Tuberculosis Officer Dr. Rajesh Sood told that the key to ending the epidemic is to reduce the incidence of TB. We are working to prevent latent TB from becoming active, with a focus on protecting those most at risk. If there is a TB patient in someone's house and he does not have symptoms of TB only, latent TB is being cured by Ho-TPT in the test. This will help in eradicating TB infection from the root.

Ranji Trophy to be held in two phases: BCCI

NEW DELHI: BCCI Secretary Jay Shah on Friday said that the postponed Ranji Trophy will be held in two phases starting next month, clearing the decks for India's premier domestic competition to resume after being cancelled last season.

It is expected that the 38-team tournament will begin in the second week of February and the first phase will continue for about a month.

The tournament, which was not held last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, was scheduled to begin on January 13 but was postponed owing to a third wave of infections across the country.

"The Board has decided to conduct the Ranji Trophy this season in two phases. In the first phase, we plan to complete all matches of the league stage while the knock-outs will be held in June," Shah said in a statement.

"My team is working closely to mitigate any kind of health risk caused by the pandemic, while at the same time ensuring a highly competitive red-ball cricket contest," Shah said that the BCCI understands the significance of Ranji Trophy.

"Ranji Trophy is our most prestigious domestic competition, which has been providing Indian Cricket with an enviable talent pool every year. It is absolutely important that we take all necessary steps to safeguard the interest of this premier event," he said. The BCCI announcement has come a day after its treasurer Arun Dhimal had said that the Board intends to host the event. The two phases are required since the BCCI also plans to host the IPL from March 27 and hosting two big tournaments would not be possible practically as the players' availability would also be an issue.

UTCA all set with its players and hosting for proposed Ranji season: Tandon

CHANDIGARH: The UT Cricket Association (UTCA) has welcomed the move of BCCI for organising the Ranji season in two phases after reviewing the Covid-19 third waves situation on Friday. Earlier the season was proposed from January 13 which is now being shifted in two phases - February and June 2022.

In a press statement, Tandon said that this decision is widely in the interest of players as well as the entire cricketing world. He said, before the third wave of global pandemic, the Chandigarh team was almost set for departure and shortlisting of players was being finalised from the practice matches being played in the camp. Now, after the formal announcement of Ranji Trophy again, UTCA is all set for the trophy. On hosting the matches, Tandon expressed a firm belief that Chandigarh is fully prepared for its staging and other tournaments of the BCCI's calendar. Nadal storms into his 6th Aussie Open final

Spaniard Rafael Nadal has stormed into the final of Australian Open 2022 keeping alive his dream of becoming first men's player to win 21 Grand Slam titles.

Nadal defeated Italy's Matteo Berrettini 6-3, 6-2, 3-6, 6-3 in the semi-final here at the Rod Laver Arena to storm into his sixth Australian Open final.

The 35-year-old Nadal brought out his A-game in the first set, and he showed impeccable talent with his forehand and backhand, winning the first set 6-3.

The Spaniard continued with his momentum and he did not give his Italian opponent any chance, winning the second set quite comprehensively.

Nadal brought out his vintage forehand play and he was just one set away from marching onto the finals.

Berrettini staged a comeback in the third set, and he dominated Nadal, sending the match into the fourth set. For the first time in the match, the Spaniard looked a bit frustrated. This was the first time that Berrettini managed to win a set against Nadal.

However, the 35-year-old Nadal did not get flustered by the third set, and he raised his game winning the fourth set and hence the match to progress into the finals.



Completely unexpected, says Rafael on reaching final

MELBOURNE: Rafael Nadal who barely raised a sweat en route to his sixth Australian Open final on Friday said he wasn't expecting to reach the summit clash in Melbourne.

The 20-time Grand Slam champion Spaniard is now one match away from becoming the greatest major champion in history after defeating Matteo Berrettini 6-3, 6-2, 3-6, 6-3 in the AO semi-final.

An emotional Nadal was keen to put things into perspective after the win, reflecting on his journey to yet another Grand Slam championship match after struggling with a foot injury for the second half of the 2021 season. "It's amazing, and I'm super happy to be able to compete for the past three weeks at the level that I am doing," Nadal said in his post-match press conference, as per aptour.com. "It's surprising for me to be able to play at the level that I am playing. Just competing and playing tennis at this high level again, facing the most important players of the world, it's unbelievable."

Draw would have been fair, both teams deserved points: Odisha FC's Kino Garcia

League and I think we were at the same level," he added.

The head coach further said that the team would have got a better chance if Jonathas could be played from the beginning.

"Of course, we wanted to have Jonathas from the beginning of the match. But we have to think about players' health issues. I could put him on the starting minute, I will put him back. And we have to take care of our players. I think we did well. We were told before the match that Jonathas was going to play around 20-25 minutes. It is better to have him on board for the next match," said the head coach.

The loss means that Odisha FC remained seventh, with 17 points from 13 matches.

The visitors got off to a poor start as they got an early blow with Lauren Winfield Hill (4) getting dismissed by Darcie Brown, with team's total at 6/1. Tammy Beaumont (5) was also sent back to the pavilion by Ellyse Perry.



Skipper Knight took the charge and kept the scoreboard moving for England. Later, Natalie Sciver also perished in the 24th over off the bowling of Annabel Sutherland and the visitors were reduced to 46/3.

Sciver's wicket was followed by Sophia Dunkley's (15) dismissal by Perry. Amy Ellen Jones's later played a small partnership with Knight and brought her side's total to 118/5, before losing her wicket for 13 runs.

Katherine Brunt also couldn't help as she also had

to depart after scoring just 1 run. Charlotte Dean and Knight's partnership took England's total to 150/7. Anya Shrubsole (3) also lost her wicket to Jonassen.

On the cusp of Stumps, Ecclestone and Knight kept on scoring and bringing their side to the total of 235/8, currently, trailing by 102 runs.
