Tearful adieu to Lata Didi

Singing legend Lata Mangeshkar, who enthralled millions with her divine voice for eight decades, was cremated with full state honours in Mumbai on Sunday.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi was among the luminaries from politics and entertainment industry present at her funeral at Shivaji Park in Dadar area in the evening.

Modi left the venue after offering her floral tributes. Floral tributes were also paid to her at Shivaji Park on behalf of President Ram Nath Kovind.

Lata's brother Hridaynath Mangeshkar lit the funeral pyre of the singing legend, who died at 92 in a hospital here on Sunday morning after multi-organ failure.

Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, Deputy CM Ajit Pawar, NCP chief Sharad Pawar, actors Shah Rukh Khan and Aamir Khan, cricketer Sachin Tendulkar and MNS chief Raj Thackeray were



present as Lata's mortal remains were consigned to flames in presence of people from all walks of life.

Hridaynath Mangeshkar was inconsolable as he performed the last rites.

Modi laid a wreath and bowed in front of the mortal remains. He also met the Mangeshkar family members and consoled them. He left the venue before the funeral.

Just before the last rites, the national tricolour in which the mortal remains were draped, was handed over to the family members. The mortal remains of Lata Mangeshkar, draped in the national flag, were taken in a truck from her residence Prabhu Kunj in south Mumbai to Shivaji Park for the last rites. A large number of people thronged the roads from where the cortege passed as the melody

PM attends funeral to pay last respect

MUMBAI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi paid his last respects to the legendary singer Lata Mangeshkar in Mumbai on Sunday.

Last rites with full State honours of Lata Mangeshkar, who passed away earlier today due to multiple organ failure, is being performed at Shivaji Park in Mumbai.

Earlier, the Central Government announced the two-day national mourning to be observed in memory of Lata Mangeshkar. During the state mourning, the National Flag is flown at half-mast throughout India, and there will be no official entertainment. It has also been decided that the state funeral will be accorded to the departed soul. The legendary singer passed away on Sunday morning at an age of 92. The Bharat Ratna awardee was admitted to the hospital after being diagnosed with pneumonia and coronavirus in January. Mangeshkar was an Indian playback singer and occasional music composer and was popularly known as "Nightingale of India" for her melodious voice.

Channi to be CM face of Congress in Punjab

Senior Congress leader and former Congress President Rahul Gandhi on Sunday announced the name of Charanjit Singh Channi as the CM face of the party in the assembly elections. Addressing a virtual rally at Harsheel resort here, Rahul said that making Channi as candidate of the Chief Ministership was a very difficult decision and that he had to make it a democratic decision. He said he can say that this was not his personal decision but is the decision of people of Punjab, party MLAs, MPs and senior leaders of the party. The Congress MP said that the party and the people wanted a person to be the party's chief minister face who could be a poor man and has experienced poverty



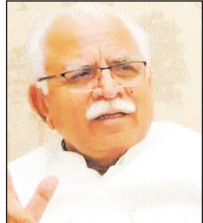
besides who could realize the problems and miseries of the people at the grass root level.

"This is a big fight, I am thankful to Punjab for choosing me as the CM hopeful of the Congress. I sincerely thank the Congress high command and people of Punjab for bestowing their trust in me. Valuables worth Rs. 329.49 crs seized in Pb after enforcement of code

After the Model Code of Conduct came into force in the state for Punjab Vidhan Sabha elections, various enforcement teams have seized valuables worth Rs 329.49 crores in violation of code till February 5, 2022.

Giving details in this regard, Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Punjab Dr S Karuna Raju today said that the surveillance teams have seized 39.62 lakh litres of liquor worth Rs 22.34 crore. Similarly, the enforcement wings have also recovered psychotropic substances amounting to Rs 280 crores besides confiscating unaccounted cash of Rs 23.06 crore, he

added.

The Chief Electoral Officer revealed that as many as 1233 vulnerable hamlets have been identified. Besides this, 3198 persons have been identified as probable sources of trouble, he said adding that out of these persons preventive action had already been initiated against 2527 persons while the remaining would also be brought to book. He also informed that from a security point of view 1593 persons have been bound down under preventive sections of CrPc act.

He informed that all the 2881 cases of non-bailable warrants have been executed. As many as 19716 nakas are operational across the State, he added.

Sale Tax Dept prohibits unnecessary detention of goods on Input Tax credit base: HC orders

LUDHIANA FEBRUARY 6: The Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, while hearing a case, has ordered that the goods being transported through transport can be checked by the sale Tax Officer by stopping them on the way and demanding documents. On completion of the documents, department cannot do the checking on the basis of Input Tax Credit, nor can he impose any penalty on the basis of Input Tax Credit, in addition, further where the papers are complete, Department cannot be disturbed by stopping them on the way. Advocate Varindra Sharma said

that said that this order has been passed by Hon'ble High Court in case of 'M/s Shiva Enterprises Vs. State of Punjab'. He said that in hearing of the matter Hon'ble High Court gave its judgement. Adv. Sharma said that especially where there are necessary documents are completed, even after that department was harassing merchants. Advocate Varinder Sharma said that there can be many such cases, in which the traders are imposed fine and penalty by Sales Tax Department, ihe suggested the aggrieved traders also approach the Hon'ble High Court. He said that this is a big relief for the traders and he welcomes this decision of the Hon'ble High Court.

The government has made a provision to provide reservation in promotion to the differently-abled from the year 1996. State Commissioner with Disabilities Rajkumar Makkar was interacting with the media at the Public Works Department's rest house before attending a huge Divyangjan awareness camp at the local panchayat building on Sunday.

He said that the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act has been implemented in a very effective manner since 2016, the main objective of this Act is to eradicate discrimination against persons with disabilities, to protect and facilitate their rights and to enforce the rules strictly. In this way, a Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities has been appointed in each state by the Government



of India. He said that our first effort is to educate the differently-abled so that they can lead their successful life by getting employment. The handicapped people who cannot come to the school are provided by the government in the form of a pension of Rs. 1950 per month. Apart from this, a provision has also been made for 5 per cent reservation in higher education for the disabled and free training facility has also been made in ITI.

After the press conference, State Commissioner Makkar attended a Divyangjan awareness camp organised in Panchayat Bhawan and listened to the problems of Divyangjan and made them

aware about their rights and public welfare schemes. 2011. He said that this scheme is completely cashless, the beneficiary person can get his treatment free of cost in empaneled private or government hospitals only by showing his Ayushman Bharat card. For making Ayushman Bharat card, the beneficiary can go to any Atal Seva Kendra and get it made by showing his identity card, ration card. For this, this card can be made free of cost in empaneled private hospitals and government hospitals. The unique feature of this scheme is portability i.e. patients can get their treatment free of cost in any state empaneled private or government hospitals, irrespective of the state.

Musical journey of Indian
film industry's most versatile
singer comes to an end

The Queen of Melody -- Lata Mangeskar, also known as the 'Nightingale of India', was one of the most versatile singers of the Indian film industry. In her career spanning over eight decades, she had lent her voice to over 5,000 songs in more than one thousand Hindi and 36 regional films, which include genres such as Filmi, Classical, Ghazals, Bhajans, Folk and Pop.

Over the years, Lata Mangeskar was the singing voice for leading ladies of Bollywood from Madhubala to Priyanka Chopra. She worked with legendary music directors that include Madan Mohan, RD Burman, Laxmikant-Pyarelal and AR Rahman. Born in 1929, Lata was the eldest daughter of Pandit Deenanath Mangeskar, a Marathi and Konkani musician and his wife Shevanti. Lata's father, a classical singer and theatre actor, started teaching her music at an early age. By the time she was five, Lata was seen participating as an actor in plays written by her father. The untimely death of her father in 1942 put the onus of supporting the family on her shoulders and she never looked back since then.

Lata Mangeskar, who moved to Mumbai in 1949, has had an unprecedented impact on Indian film music and received several awards and accolades during her eight-decade-long career. In 1989, she was given the Dadasaheb Phalke Award and the Bharat Ratna, India's highest civilian honour in 2001. The French government conferred her its highest civilian award -- Officer of the Legion of Honour in 2007. She has also been honoured with National Film Awards, Filmfare Lifetime Achievement Award and Bengal Film Journalists' Association Awards. She also holds the distinction of being the most recorded artist in the history of Indian music. Her all four siblings -- Meena Khadikar, Asha Bhosle, Usha Mangeskar and Hridaynath Mangeskar are also accomplished singers and musicians.

Russia at 70 per cent of Ukraine military buildup

Russia has assembled at least 70 per cent of the military firepower it likely intends to have in place by mid-month to give President Vladimir Putin the option of launching a full-scale invasion of Ukraine, US officials say.

The officials, who discussed internal assessments of the Russian buildup on condition they not be identified, sketched out a series of indicators suggesting Putin intends an invasion in coming weeks, although the size and scale are unclear. They stressed that a diplomatic solution appears to remain possible.

Among those military indicators: an exercise of Russia's strategic nuclear forces that usually is held each fall was rescheduled for mid-February to March. That coincides with what US officials see as the most likely window for invasion.

The officials made no suggestion that a prospective conflict would involve the use of nuclear weapons, but the Russian exercise likely involving the test-launching of unarmed long-range missiles on Russian territory could be used as a message aimed at deterring the West from intervening in Ukraine.

US officials have said in recent weeks that a Russian invasion could overwhelm Ukraine's military relatively quickly, although Moscow might find it difficult to sustain an occupation and cope with a potential insurgency.

The ongoing Russian buildup comes as the Biden administration has been disclosing intelligence in hopes of preemptively countering Russian disinformation and blocking Putin's plans for creating a pretext for an invasion. But it has come under



criticism for not providing evidence to back up many of its claims.

On Saturday, The New York Times and The Washington Post said officials were warning that a full Russian invasion could lead to the quick capture of Kyiv and potentially result in as many as 50,000 casualties.

A US official confirmed that estimate to The Associated Press. But it's not clear how US agencies determined those numbers, and any predictions about how an invasion would proceed and the human cost it would inflict are inherently uncertain given the vagaries of war.

President Joe Biden has said he will not send US troops to Ukraine to fight a war. He has, however, ordered additional forces, including combat troops, to Poland and Romania to reassure those NATO allies that Washington would fulfill its treaty

commitment to respond to Russian aggression against NATO territory. Ukraine is not a NATO member but receives US and allied military support and training.

Army officials on Saturday announced that Maj. Gen. Christopher Donahue, the commanding general of the 82nd Airborne Division, arrived in Poland. About other 1,700 soldiers from the 82nd Airborne are deploying to Poland from Fort Bragg, North Carolina, and 300 soldiers are deploying from Bragg to Germany. In addition, 1,000 Germany-based soldiers are shifting to Romania.

Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin said last week that Putin could use any portion of the force he has assembled along Ukraine's borders to seize Ukrainian cities and significant territories or to carry out coercive acts or provocative political

acts like the recognition of breakaway territories inside Ukraine.

More recently, other US officials provided a more detailed breakdown of Russia's continuing force buildup, of US assessments of prospects for war, and of the US view of Putin's approach to the crisis.

The officials reiterated what other Biden administration officials have been saying for weeks that they don't believe Putin has made a final decision to invade Ukraine. But it appears possible that the Russian leader set his intentions and is waiting until the last moment to give the go-ahead for an invasion.

Officials sketched out the disposition of Russian forces that have been deployed toward Ukraine's borders over the past several months, creating what Western officials see as the threat of a full-scale invasion despite repeated

assertions by senior Russian officials that they do not intend to attack unprovoked.

As of Friday, the officials said, the Russian army has put in place near Ukraine a total of 83 battalion tactical groups, each of which is roughly equivalent in size to an American battalion of between 750 and 1,000 soldiers. That is an increase from 60 battalion tactical groups in position just two weeks ago, they said.

Another 14 battalion tactical groups are on their way to the border area from other parts of Russia, the officials said. Two officials said the US assesses that Russia would want a total of between 110 and 130 battalion tactical groups for use in a full-scale invasion, but Putin could decide on a more limited incursion.

Including support units, Russia might be aiming to have 150,000 troops in place for a full-scale invasion, one official said, adding that the ongoing buildup could reach that level in the next couple of weeks.

Depending on Putin's ultimate objective, the Russian forces could attack Kyiv directly by moving south from current positions in southern Belarus. He might also send forces across the Russian border into eastern and southern Ukraine if his intent is to fracture and destroy a large portion of the Ukrainian army, the officials said.

On the lower end of the scale of military action, Putin might order sabotage, cyberattacks and other destabilising actions inside Ukraine with the goal of removing the current government in Kyiv, officials have said.

Daily physical activity effective
for boosting brain function

A new study by researchers at the University of California San Diego School of Medicine has found that daily physical activity is effective in boosting brain function for middle-aged and older adults. Their findings were published in the journal 'JMIR mHealth and uHealth'.

The study added to the canon of research associating physical activity with cognitive



performance, this time using 90 middle-aged and older subjects who wore accelerometers while physically active and completed mobile cognitive testing from home.

"The future of lifestyle interventions really needs to be remote-based," said Raeanne Moore, PhD, associate professor in the Department of Psychiatry at UC San Diego School of Medicine and principal investigator of the study. "The

pandemic has made this especially clear."

On the days their physical activity increased, the study found, the 50 to 74-year-old participants performed more effectively on an executive function task, and on the days when their physical activity decreased, so too did their cognitive performance. "It was a very linear relationship," Moore said. "We hypothesized that we would find this, but we couldn't be sure because we weren't telling people to increase their physical activity. They just did what they do every day."

First author Zvinka Zlata, PhD, a clinical psychologist at UC San Diego School of Medicine, added: "Future interventions, in which we ask people to increase their physical activity, will help us determine if daily changes in physical activity lead to daily gains in cognition measured remotely or vice versa." The correlation between physical activity and cognition remained when adjustments were made for various co-morbidities, such as HIV status, age, sex, education and race/ethnicity.

But it held only for persons who functioned independently -- who rely on others to perform the tasks of daily living, such as managing household activities or paying the bills. "For them, physical activity may have a greater benefit on daily, real-world cognitive performance," Moore said, a finding consistent with research into Alzheimer's disease and related dementias. Though it didn't fall within the purview of this study.

Researchers suggest simpler approach to
explain social stability in humans

Human beings have been known to be social animals. Socialising is an important part of survival in this world, to stay away from loneliness. Also, humans prefer relationships>stable relationships and love to avoid social tensions. Sociology so far used two concepts to describe this preference for social stability, namely, (Social) Balance Theory and the theory of homophily ("birds of a feather flock together"). Now, researchers from the Complexity Science Hub Vienna (CSH) have proposed a simpler approach.

Their study has been published in the 'Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences (PNAS)'. They were able to boil the emergence of stable societies down to one of the two concepts alone: homophily, or our preference to interact with people similar to ourselves. The researchers showed that social balance then followed automatically and demonstrated this fact with data from the Massive Multiplayer Online Game Pardus.

"To explain how innovative this paper is, we have to elaborate on Social Balance Theory first," said CSH President Stefan Thurner, one of the authors of the paper. Social Balance Theory (SBT), introduced by the Austrian sociologist Fritz Heider in 1946, originally described the interpersonal relations between three individuals.

According to SBT, three people connecting to each other formed triangles which can be called balanced or unbalanced, depending on the likes

and dislikes between the three individuals. An example for a balanced triangle is, when Anna likes Bert, Bert likes Corinna, and Corinna likes Anna. If all of them dislike each other, the triad would be unbalanced. (For other variants, see figure).

The Social Balance Theory claims that unbalanced relationships cause bad feelings, why people tend



to avoid them. "Which is exactly what we can observe - and count - in real-world societies," elaborated complexity scientist Tuan Minh Pham, the first author of the study. "Balanced triangles appear way more often than we would expect if they were statistically even distributed. Conversely, unbalanced triangles are underrepresented in societies."

According to this theory, people considered triadic information before they formed (or changed) their social relations: If Anna liked Bert, but Bert did not like Corinna, Anna might decide to dump Corinna just to keep the balance. "Yet we think it is way too complicated for people to think in triangles all the time," said Pham.

Instead, the scientists tried what happened when they applied the concept of homophily alone.

"For our theory, we assume that individuals tend to minimize their social stress; to do so, they prefer to interact with people they like. They might choose somebody to become a friend because he or she has the same opinion, or religion, or education, for instance," said Pham. Based on homophiliic one-to-one interactions, the computer simulation produced a society that almost magically self-organized towards more stability. "The society looked exactly like a society that follows Social Balance Theory, but without individuals having to consider triangles," Tuan Minh Pham pointed out. To test this hypothesis, the scientists used data from the free Massive Multiplayer Online Game Pardus. In the futuristic Pardus world, some 100,000 players interact economically and socially in space, form friendships, co-operate or compete, make friends and fight enemies. Since the game went online in 2004, the scientists log every single interaction between the gamers; by subscribing, the users give their consent that the data can be used for scientific purposes.

Conserving Wetlands, Rejuvenating Ganga

Wetlands are unique ecosystems serving as transition zones where terrestrial and aquatic habitats meet. They are one of the freshwater habitats other than lakes, rivers etc. They are neither totally dry land nor totally underwater and have characteristics of both. The Ramsar Convention on Wetlands defines wetlands as "areas of marsh, fen, peat, and or water, whether natural or artificial, permanent or temporary, with water that is static or flowing, fresh, brackish or salt, including areas of marine water the depth of which at low tide does not exceed six meters."

Wetlands are a kind of natural waste-water treatment places as they are able to trap pollutants and neutralize harmful bacteria. Due to their carbon sequestration capabilities, wetlands play an important role in mitigating climate change. Wetlands are also an important source of food and provide rice and fish that feed billions.

In view of loss of wetlands and considering them as wastelands to be drained, filled and converted for other purposes, World Wetland

Day is observed every year on 2nd February to raise global awareness about the pivotal role these important water bodies play in sustaining ecosystems. The Day also marks the adoption of the 'Convention on Wetlands' on 2nd February 1971 in the Iranian City of Ramsar. The theme of the World Wetlands

Day 2022 is 'Wetlands Action for People and Nature' to emphasize on the importance of actions to ensure the conservation and sustainable use of wetlands for anthropogenic purposes. Apart from recharging groundwater, wetlands can also act like giant sponges or reservoirs that can absorb excess water during heavy rains. They support a very rich aquatic bio-

diversity and act as important nutrient transformer. Several bird species use wetlands as breeding grounds. Wetlands also carry immense tourism potential and could be inviting places for popular recreational activities including hunting, hiking, fishing, bird watching photography etc. The United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) offer a universal agenda that recognizes the need for restoration and

management of water related ecosystems including wetlands to address water scarcity. Overall, wetlands are key to address several challenges around the world related to water, food and climate.

The conservation of wetlands is particularly significant in river rejuvenation as it helps in protecting the ecological and geological entity of rivers. The contribution of wetlands in maintaining e-flows in rivers is one of the most important functions of these water bodies in protecting rivers, especially Ganga. India has nearly 4.6% of its land as wetlands, covering an area of 15.26 million hectares. There are 47 sites in India designated as Wetlands of International Importance (Ramsar Sites), with a surface area of more than 1.08 million hectares. Out of 47 Ramsar sites in India, 21 are in the Ganga Basin. The maximum Ramsar sites are in the State of Uttar Pradesh (9), a Ganga basin state.

Wetlands are inextricably linked to one of the most herculean river rejuvenation project in the world -- Namami Gange Programme. The wetlands play a crucial role in the overall hydrology of a river's basin region and contribute to water flows in sub-surface and in river streams. The Ganga Basin is the richest riverine system in India and is bestowed with

diverse natural and human-made wetlands regime, ecologically and hydrologically interconnected with River Ganga and her tributaries. More than 4,500 reservoirs form an integral component of the Ganga basin's wetland regimes. Of the 180 wetlands identified as national priority by MoEF&CC, 49 are located within the Ganga Basin (1 in Himachal Pradesh, 7 in Uttarakhand, 2 in Haryana, 4 in Rajasthan, 9 in Madhya Pradesh, 16 in Uttar Pradesh, 3 in Bihar and 7 in West Bengal). In 2020, out of total 14 sites declared in India, 9 Ramsar sites have been declared in the main stem of Ganga -- Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Bihar. Sur Sagar Keetham, Kabar Taal, Aasan are a few examples. The latest entrant to the elite list of wetlands is also from Ganga Basin - Haiderpur Wetland in Uttar Pradesh, which was notified in December 2021. Other wetlands included in 2021 and 2022 are Tsokar Wetland Complex, Ladakh, Lonar Lake, Maharashtra, Thol Lake Wildlife Sanctuary & Wadhvana Wetland in Gujarat and Sultanpur National Park & Bhindawas Wildlife Sanctuary in Haryana. The Sundarbans, a saltwater swamp that runs through territories of India and Bangladesh, has the largest mangrove forest in the world

and is also located on mud flats near the delta of the Ganges River in West Bengal. Working closely with the Environment Ministry, State Wetland Authorities are being strengthened in Ganga Basin and other States who are encouraged to notify wetlands and also work for recognition as Ramsar sites. Namami Gange Programme has been working closely with several partners like World Wild Fund (WWF), Wildlife Institute of India (WII), State Wetland Authorities etc. for developing an institutional structure for the conservation of wetlands. A project 'Conserving and Sustainably Managing Gangetic Floodplains of Uttar Pradesh' was sanctioned in June 2020 for comprehensive conservation and management of 282 Gangetic floodplain wetlands in the State within the buffer of 10 kilometers of River Ganga spanning 27 districts. A tool kit titled 'Urban Wetland/ Water Bodies Management Guidelines' for management of Urban Wetlands has also been developed by SPA, New Delhi. Given the role of small wetlands in providing drinking water by acting as decentralized water storage systems, NMCG in collaboration with WWF has initiated an engagement programme with

District Ganga Committees to support the district-level institutions in identifying wetlands, prepare good inventory, conduct ground verifications and develop actions plans for their preservation. Protection and conservation of wetlands is one of the foremost priorities of NMCG, which is trying to bring wetland conservation to the basin level.

In the recent past, the conservation and preservation of wetlands is being increasingly brought to the forefront of India's water conservation efforts in general and river rejuvenation initiatives in particular. Acknowledging the importance of wetlands in ensuring water security, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) established a first-of-its-kind Centre for Wetland Conservation and Management (CWCM) as part of the National Centre for Sustainable Coastal Management, Chennai. The Centre has been established "to address specific research needs and knowledge gaps and aid in conservation, management and wise use of wetlands in an integrated manner." The Centre was launched last year on the occasion of 50th anniversary

of signing of the Ramsar Convention. The theme of last year's World Wetlands Day (Wetlands and Water) was also significant insofar that it signified the inseparability between Water, Wetlands and Life. On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti 2021, the MoEF&CC launched a web portal -- 'Wetlands of India' -- as a single point access website to all information related to wetlands. All these initiatives are a testament of the importance accorded to wetlands in India, especially in the wake of Jal Shakti Abhiyan and Jal Jeevan Mission, that, through source sustainability, aims to make water conservation a people's movement and provide safe drinking water to every household in India. It is the need-of-the-hour to spread awareness on the importance of wetlands -- and their direct correlation with water, food and climate security. The Government of India is committed to preserve these, sometimes small, yet extremely crucial part of India's riverine systems. This World Wetland Day, let us take the onus of respecting and revering our wetlands to make India water-rich.

Samit Singh Mann will win with big lead: Sanjay Sood

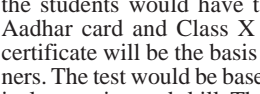

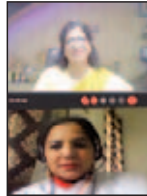

Tributes pour in after Lata Mangeshkar's death

Lata ji is beyond words: Gulzar

Lata Mangeshkar was a miracle who can't be bound in mere words, says Gulzar, the poet-lyricist-writer who on Sunday found himself searching for words to describe his loss at the death of his long-time collaborator.

The association with Mangeshkar that started from the song "Mora Gora Ang Layle" from 1963's "Bandini", Gulzar's first as a songwriter, came to a full stop with 2021's single "Theek Nahi Lagta", which was recorded for a film 26 years ago that eventually got shelved.

In an interview with PTI, the veteran lyricist said, "Lata ji is a 'karishma' (miracle) in herself and this 'karishma' doesn't happen always and 'aaj ye karishma mukammal (complete) ho gaya', she is gone. She was a miraculous singer, with a miraculous voice. It is difficult to find adjectives for her. How much ever we talk about her, it is less. You can't bind her in words. She is beyond words."

The duo went on to create gems one after the other in songs from films like "Khamoshi", "Kinara", "Lekin", "Rudaali", "Masoom", "Libaas", "Dil Se..", "Satya", "Hu Tu Tu", and "Maachis", among others.

The song "Naam Gum Jayega" from "Kinara", which Gulzar also directed, has come to define the everlasting legacy of Mangeshkar and he said the track is "apt" when one talks about her.

"We had written the song for a film. I remember I had told her when you give an autograph you can use this (the lines of the song) Meri awaaz hi pehchan hai aur ye hai pehchan," he recalled. "I didn't mean it thinking (it will become her identity) but it became her identity and she identified (with it)," he added.

Mangeshkar, who passed away Sunday morning following a multiple organ failure at the age of 92, had said she remembers vividly the day she did the playback for the song and the lines that Gulzar spoke to her. "Everyone in the country knows that Gulzar sahab writes beautifully. He also speaks beautifully. When I was singing (this song), he came to me and gently said, 'Meri awaaz hi pehchan hai aur ye hai pehchan'. He said something like this. But later, I also started saying that 'my voice is my identity'. And now whoever sings that song or writes about me says those lines," Mangeshkar told PTI in October 2021 days after the release of "Theek Nahin Lagta".



When Lata Mangeshkar left everyone in awe

It was December 1993. Lata Mangeshkar came to Vijayawada to receive the prestigious Dr Pinnamaneni and Seethadevi Foundation's lifetime achievement award. The function was to be held in Tummalapalli vari Kshetraya Kalakshetram that evening. In the morning, Lata Mangeshkar went to Indrakeladri, the abode of Goddess Kanaka Durga, to worship the presiding deity of Vijayawada.

Foundation Managing Trustee C Nageswara Rao, a couple of her family members and a handful of people accompanied Lata Mangeshkar to the temple, where she was accorded a traditional welcome. After worshipping the Goddess and offering puja, the nightingale rendered, impromptu, a hymn in praise of Goddess Kanaka Durga, right inside the sanctum sanctorum. Everybody stood mesmerised as the queen of melody left everyone in awe with her mellifluous and devotion-filled rendition. Later, in the temple mantapam, she was offered the Goddess'



When the Queen came calling in 1961

Thousands gathered at Delhi's sprawling Ramlila Maidan to catch a glimpse of royalty as Queen Elizabeth II, who on Sunday became the first British monarch to complete 70 years on the throne, and her husband Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh, arrived in the city in January 1961.

The spectators cheered and waved Indian and British flags as the then mayor of Delhi Sham Nath felicitated the young royals on a huge, elevated oriental-style rostrum with garlands in the presence of Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, according to archival records.

The Queen was gifted an artistic model of the 12-century minaret, Qutub Minar, while the Duke of Edinburgh was presented a silver candelabra, according to rare archival footage of the royal tour.

The Queen also attended the grand Republic Day celebrations at Rajpath in the city.

It was a visit of multiple firsts.

It was the maiden visit by the Queen, who ascended the throne on the death of her father and last emperor of India King George VI on this day in 1952, to the country. It was the first visit by a British monarch to India after the country got independence. It was also the first visit by a reigning British monarch to the country.

The Queen, during the Delhi leg of her 1961 tour, also visited Rajghat and offered a ceremonial wreath at Mahatma Gandhi's memorial. She also formally opened the institute buildings of the All India Insti-



tute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) on January 27 at an impressive ceremony attended by the then President Rajendra Prasad.

In the past, the Royal Family has recalled memories of the Queen's India visit, sharing old pictures from the multi-city tour of the country on its official social media handles.

"The Queen and The Royal Family have a personal connection with India and have visited several times," the Royal Family had tweeted in 2017.

"The Queen's first State Visit to India was in 1961, as the guest of Dr Rajendra Prasad, the first President of India," it had said in a subsequent tweet.

"Her Majesty has undertaken three State Visits to India, the first of which was in 1961 - The Queen addresses a crowd in Ramlila Ground and The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh on a walkabout in New Delhi, 1961," it had said in a tweet in 2019, sharing two rare pictures from the 1961 visit.
