SP candidate, supporters booked for rape, assault

GONDA: Hours before Gonda went to polls on Sunday, Samajwadi Party candidate from Colonel-ganj Assembly constituency, his brothers and supporters were booked for allegedly raping a woman and beating her up. Police said they booked SP candidate Yogesh Pratap Singh and others on Saturday night after they allegedly barged into the residence of the woman, and assaulted her and her family members for supporting the BJP. The woman was cooking at her house. Singh, his two brothers and supporters barged into her house and picked up a fight. When her family members resisted, they were beaten up.

Schools to open on Mar 2 in Kashmir

SRINAGAR: Schools in Kashmir valley that have been shut due to security situation and the pandemic will reopen after about three years on March 2, officials said. Since the Covid-19 cases declined in Jammu and Kashmir, the Union Territory Government has decided to reopen the schools after about three years. "The students have been directed to follow the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) guidelines provided by the authorities as soon as they leave home for school", said the Director Health Services Dr Mush-taq Ahmad Rather. He said this on the sidelines of Pulse Polio programme that was kick started at Jawahar Lal Nehru Memorial Hospital for children under five, at Rainwari in Srinagar on Sunday.

2 deaths, 360 fresh Covid cases in Hry

CHANDIGARH: Two more Covid deaths were reported in Haryana on Sunday as 360 fresh cases surfaced, pushing the state's infection count to 9,81,444, according to a Health Department bulletin. So far, 10,557 people have died from the infection in the state. Gurugram district reported 172 fresh cases while 33 infection cases were from Faridabad. The two fresh deaths were from Gurugram district, as per the bulletin.

Kharkiv comes under Russian attack, more than 200 killed

On day four after Russian forces launched a full-scale invasion of Ukraine killing over 200 people, multiple Ukrainian cities and villages are being shelled, attacked with missiles, helicopters, tanks and ships, while ground forces invading, as capital Kyiv, and second largest Kharkiv try repelling imminent siege. The Ukrainian military blew up the bridge between the towns of Bucha and Irpin to slow down Russian troops, in Kyiv Oblast, media reports showed with picture of a large plume of smoke rising out of the area. Apart from Kyiv, second largest city Kharkiv is under heavy attack. Many Indian students are still there and they have been posting on Facebook to update parents and friends. Mediapersons have been trying to keep speaking to them live, but as shelling continues, they face network problems. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said: "Russia should be stripped of its right to vote in UN Security Council. "Russia's attacks on civilian population and infrastructure have signs of genocide and merit an international tribunal." Zelensky posted a video address. At least four explosions were heard near the center of Kyiv. Air raid sirens were activated through the night. Russian troops have been blocked off in Bucha, according to kyivindependent. The air force has shot down a cruise missile fired at Kyiv from Belarus, Ukraine's top military commander Valerii Zaluzhnyi reported on Facebook. He called it "yet another war crime" by Belarus



Protesters world over rally support for Ukraine

NEW DELHI: People around the world, including in India and even Russia, have taken to the streets to protest against Vladimir Putin's invasion of Ukraine. Waving placards and flags in Ukrainian colors and calling on their governments to take action and place sanctions against Russia, these are videos photographs that have flooded the social media since Thursday. Amid escalating tensions in the European nation, a number of people comprising Indians, Ukrainians and diplomats of European countries in India, have been visiting the Embassy of Ukraine lighting candles in support of the war ravaged nation. A number of rallies around the world will take place on Sunday: Poland, Kraków — The Stand with Ukraine rally is scheduled to take place on Sunday at Wiesz Ratuszowa Rynek Główny. Sweden, Gothenburg — Ukrainians and "all those who care and chose peace," are invited to join the #StandWithUkraine demonstration against Russian aggression in Ukraine. Everybody is encouraged to bring posters and flags. Austria, Vienna — Everybody is invited to come and show solidarity with Ukraine and say no to Putin's war by the Embassy of Ukraine in Austria. Germany, Berlin — An alliance consisting of numerous organizations announced a rally against Putin's war of aggression in Ukraine. The protest was registered for 20,000 people. Greece, Athens — Ukrainians in Greece are invited to come and show solidarity with Ukraine at a Sunday rally.

Poland allowing Indian nationals to enter without visas

NEW DELHI: Poland is allowing entry of all the Indian nationals evacuating conflict-ridden Ukraine in its country without visas, said the Poland Embassy in India on Sunday. Ambassador of Poland to India, Adam Burakowski shared the information on his Twitter handle. Taking to Twitter, Burakowski said, "Poland is allowing to enter without any visa all Indian students who escape from Russian aggression in Ukraine." The fourth flight has left Bucharest (Romania) for Delhi to bring back 198 stranded Indians from Ukraine safely under 'operation Ganga', External Affairs Minister Dr S Jaishankar said on Sunday. "Operation Ganga continues. The fourth flight has left to bring our 198 Indians from Bucharest to Delhi safely," Jaishankar said in a Tweet.

and Russia. A 16-story building in Kyiv's outer Troeshchina district has been blasted by an explosion, igniting seven nearby parked cars, according to the Kyiv City State Administration. Two Danish journalists were shot in the town of Okhtyrka but have been taken to the hospital and are "out of danger," according to the Daily Beast. Okhtyrka has seen some fierce fighting since the invasion began. Russian troops have broken through into the center of Kharkiv.

Moderate voting recorded in fifth phase of UP polls



LUCKNOW: A voter turnout of 53.98 per cent till 5 pm was recorded on Sunday as the polling across 61 constituencies is underway for the fifth phase of Uttar Pradesh elections, according to the Election Commission of India (ECI).

A total of 693 candidates are in the fray in this round of voting, which commenced at 7 am and will continue till 6 pm.

The government data shows the highest voter turnout of 59.64 per cent in Chitrakoot, followed by 58.01 per cent in Ayodhya, 57.24 per cent in Shravasti and 57.01 per cent in Kaushambi. Pratapgarh recorded the lowest voter turnout of 50.25 per cent so

far. Amethi and Rae Bareilly, considered Congress bastion, recorded a voter turnout of 52.77 per cent and 56.06 per cent.

Other districts like Sultanpur witnessed a voter turnout of 54.88 per cent, 54.31 per cent in Gonda, 54.65 per cent in Barabanki, 55 per cent in Baharaich and 57.24 per cent in Shravasti.

A total of 61 Assembly constituencies spread across 12 districts, including Ayodhya, Sultanpur, Chitrakoot, Pratapgarh, Kaushambi, Prayagraj, Barabaki, Bahraich, Shravasti, Gonda, Amethi, and Raebareilly, are undergoing polling today.

The counting of votes will take place on March 10.

Snowfall dips mercury in Himachal

Himachal Pradesh experienced snowfall and rain in last 24 hours in many places, dipping the minimum temperature under subzero, the Met Department said on Sunday. However, it was sunny in the morning, they further said. As per the Met Department, Kalpa (Kinnaur) received nine cm snowfall while Kufri recorded six cm, Manali five cm, Shimla 2.8 cm and Dalhousie 2.5 cm, Jhandutta (Bilaspur) 30 mm, Rampur (Shimla) 24 mm, Bhuntar and Bajura (Kullu) 23 mm each, Karsog-22, Wangtoo and Jubberhati 23 mm and Bhuntar 21 mm, Sundernagar 12.6, Bilaspur 12.5 mm, Mandi 10.8 mm, Poanta-Shaib 9.6 mm, Shimla and Manali eight mm each. High reaches of Shimla Khadralla had 30



cm, Kothi (Kullu) 15cm, Nichar (Kinnaur) 13cm, Bijahi and Sarahan six cm each, Sangla five cm. The Minimum temperature below normal in the state following continue spell of snowfall for last three days as Keylong (Lahaul Spiti) was minus 9.6 degree Celsius, Kalpa (Kinnaur) minus 4 degrees, Kufri minus 2.4 degrees, Manali minus 1.2 degrees, Shimla 0.4 degrees, Dalhousie 0.7 de-

grees, Palampur (Kangra) 3.5 degrees, Solan 3.8 degrees, Hamirpur and Dharmshala 7.2 degrees each and Kangra 5.2 degrees Celsius. Normal life out of track in the state due to mounting of snow on 321 roads and power supply is affected in 611 distribution Transformer regions in the state. The Met Office forecast rain and snow in the isolated places in the state during next 24 hours.

Strandja Memorial Boxing: Nitu strikes gold for India

Indian boxer Nitu (48kg) clinched the gold medal in 73rd Strandja Memorial Tournament in Sofia, Bulgaria by notching up a facile win over Italy's Erika Prisciandaro in the finals on Sunday.

Nitu prevailed 5-0 over the former youth world championship bronze-medallist, producing a wonderful counter-attacking performance by taking full advantage of her longer reach and taller frame.

Later this evening, former youth world champion Nikhat Zareen (52kg) will square off against Ukraine's Tetiana Kob, a three-time European Championships medallist. Zareen had won a gold medal at the Strandja Memorial's 2019 edition.

India won two medals in the last edition with Deepak Kumar and Naveen Boora securing silver and bronze respectively.

NDA govt working nonstop to empower country: PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Sunday the NDA Government was working tirelessly to empower the country, its armed forces and its citizens. On the contrary, the opposition parties empowered only mafia and gangsters for petty personnel interests when they were in power, he said. Addressing huge election rallies in Basti and Deoria to seek votes for the candidates of the Bharatiya Janata Party and its alliance partners Apna Dal and Nishad Party for the sixth phase of elections, PM Modi said for NDA life of every citizen was important and, therefore, Operation Ganga has been launched to bring back thousands of Indian citizens stranded in Ukraine. Modi said: "The two years of novel coronavirus and the current global scenario has taught us a lesson that we must build a self-

reliant India, which is not possible without empowering of its states, especially Uttar Pradesh. It's time to rise above caste and petty issues and stand with the country. We are building Defence Corridor in UP for self-reliance in defence products. We will have to keep modernising our forces." In a scathing attack on the opposition parties, the PM said these dynasts did not want a developed and self-reliant India as it did not suit their selfish ends. He remarked: "These dynasts who have a history of receiving commissions in defence deals and who doubted the valour of our forces when they carried out Balakot strike want India to remain dependent on foreign countries for its needs. All that they are interested is their commissions. They want to keep law in their pockets, money in the coffers of their families and people on their feet."

Editorial

Use those words

It may be possible to find purity of lineage — of dogs, horses and human beings — but a language purely itself and nothing else is far more elusive. This has not discouraged the stout-hearted protectors of French within the portals of the Académie Française, which was founded in 1635 to keep the language pure. Alarums and excursions are shaking its dignified facade now that it has discovered the havoc the infiltration of English words is wreaking on the French tongue. Overcome by the horror of its ‘degradation’ which is not ‘inevitable’ — why let English in when there are so many French words available? — the solemn defenders refuse to be tickled by the closeness in spelling and pronunciation of ‘purity’ in French and English. They are offspring of the same parent language — is that why passions are running high? The family is fertile ground for high drama. It is not as though French has no other linguistic influences; these vary in various regions according to their history and geography. That is only natural. But the Académie refuses to countenance entries such as ‘big data’ or ‘drive-in’ and numerous others; these lead to poor communication — since not everyone can make sense of English — and may even hurt social cohesion.

The last concern suggests that the ire over the infiltration of English words — intruders in the high-tech sphere have been named ‘Californisms’ — is not entirely free of a political tinge. Not pure concern for purity, that is. For no expert in languages would ever claim an immaculate conception for the tongue of their choice; languages are born from other languages, they travel and change, absorb and reject, move and grow. Imagine English, or Hindi, or, say, Turkish, or any other living language flourishing without constant imports from and exports to the tongues they rub shoulders with. Languages are as dynamic as the peoples who speak them, as vital as the stories they tell and adapt from one another, creating histories and cultures that are never static. People’s sense of identity becomes linked to the tongue with which they understand the changing world.

Does not the Académie’s anxiety to keep French pure spring from this same sense of identity, a feeling of ownership over the mother tongue? Surely too much of identification, too much of a good thing, would freeze the language in its tracks? Digitization and the internet have changed the world; English words and ‘Californisms’ offer enticing shortcuts. Treating such words as the foe might create hurdles in the path of understanding a changing world. Perhaps the Académie is seeking the necessary balance between the linguistic principles of the host language and new entries, hybrid words and coinages. For the notion of a ‘pure’ language is rather slippery, falling between the two stools of scholarship and politics. But it may just be a war of words, after all.

How recreation will shift with climate change in west

Change can be hard, especially when it involves soaring summer temperatures, mega-droughts, invasive species and other items from the list of unpleasant outcomes of climate change.

There are innumerable economic and social implications from a changing climate—but in the Western U.S. where skiing, hiking, biking, hunting and other forms of outdoor recreation are core to many people’s lives, and where local economies rely on income generated by these activities, the impacts are already difficult to ignore.

New research from the Institute of Outdoor Recreation and Tourism, worked to define what, specifically, the changing climate will mean for the future of outdoor recreation in the West. The lesson at the heart of the review is that adaptation will be a critical skill as the new climate offers unpredictable scenarios to individuals, local economies, land-management infrastructures and long-term planners.

The study compiled the existing research that explores the ways in which climate change alters the types and timing of outdoor recreation activities, and the indirect effects of these shifts on everything from bear popula-



tions to new problems with seasonal staffing. The study was published in the journal ‘Journal of Forestry’.

Campsites that are too hot, ski resorts with fluctuating snowpacks, rivers with low water levels, and forests crowned with a halo of wildfire smoke all affect the number of people who participate in outdoor recreation and the quality of their experiences.

These impacts change the way people move through the landscape, value the experience and spend their money—but the specifics can be hard to define. For instance, if a campsite is too Smokey, one

group of recreationists may decide to drive further to reach an alternate site. Another might wait until the smoke clears, and another might choose to give up a particular activity altogether and go home. In the paper, the researchers provided activity-specific adaptation strategies that can be used to plan for these consequences (for instance, increasing capacities of existing outdoor recreation settings, adjusting season

lengths, or improving communications to manage visitors’ expectations).

“Land managers can prepare for climate change by learning the best strategies for adaptation, as we currently understand them,” said Anna Miller, lead author on the study. “Learning from past successes and failures when responding to things like extreme weather events can help managers better understand what’s going to best help them

adapt to change -- if and when it happens again,” he added.

Building resilience in outdoor recreation systems will take careful planning, according to the research. For example, developing collaborations and communication strategies between agencies within a local region right now will allow managers to respond more effectively as new situations arise. Managers also need to carefully consider how climate change adaptation strategies can improve equitable access to recreation opportunities.

Winter-based recreation sites may need to expand operations to include shoulder- and summer-based activities in order to stay viable in a warming climate. Summer operations may need to adjust budgets and staffing for longer seasons, and be better prepared for extreme temperatures. Wildlife and forest-product-gathering activities will have to build in flexibility and prepare for fundamental changes in the ecosystem as well.

“We may not know precisely what’s in store for outdoor recreation managers in the next decades,” said Miller, “but using our collective experience can help us learn how to adapt recreation planning for the most likely futures,” he added.

Consumption of 'King of fruits' has positive health outcomes

Does the king of fruits, often instructed to be avoided after one is diagnosed with diabetes, have health benefits? As low fruit and vegetable consumption continues to contribute to diet-related chronic diseases like diabetes and heart disease, two new research studies have found that regular mango consumption may improve diets and help manage key risk factors that contribute to chronic disease. The studies were published in ‘Nutrients’ and ‘Nutrition, Metabolism & Cardiovascular Diseases’.

Specifically, these new studies report findings in two areas: 1) mango consumption is associated with better overall diet quality and intake of nutrients that many children and adults lack at optimum levels and 2) snacking on mangos may improve glucose control and reduce inflammation in contrast to other sweet snacks. With mangos consumed widely in global cuisines and 58 per cent of Americans reporting snacking at least once a day in 2021, this new research provided added evidence that regularly consuming mangos may have health advantages and be relevant to cultural dietary preferences and current eating patterns.

A recent observational study found positive outcomes in nutrient intakes, diet quality, and weight-related health outcomes in individuals who consume mangos versus those who do not. The study published in ‘Nutrients’, used United States National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey (NHANES) 2001-2018 data to compare the diets and nutrient intakes of mango consumers to people who did not consume mangos. The study showed that children who regularly ate man-



go had higher intakes of immune-boosting vitamins A, C and B6, as well as fiber and potassium. Fiber and potassium are two of the four “nutrients of concern” as defined by the Dietary Guidelines for Americans, which means many Americans are not meeting recommendations for these.

In adults, researchers found similar results, showing that mango consumption was associated with significantly greater daily intakes of fiber and potassium but also vitamins A, B12, C, E and folate, a vitamin critical during pregnancy and fetal development. For both children and adults, consuming mango was associated with a reduced intake of sodium and sugar, and for adults was associated with a reduced intake of cholesterol.

“We have known for a long time that there is a strong correlation between diet and chronic disease,” said Yanni Papanikolaou, a researcher on the project.

“This study reveals that both children and adults eating mangos tend to have significantly better diet quality overall along with higher intakes of fiber and potassium compared with those who don’t eat mangos. It is also important that mango fits into many diverse cuisines.

Universities re-open in Afghanistan with gender segregation



Universities in the ‘cold areas’ of Afghanistan opened for all students on Saturday with new gender segregation norms in place.

“The public universities and institutes were re-opened today (Saturday),” said Ahmad Taqa, spokesperson for the Ministry of Higher Education (MoHE) of the Taliban regime as quoted by Tolo News.

citing instructors and students. The students at Balkh University said that the segregation of male and female classes has affected the methods of teaching.

The students are also struggling with the problem of the unavailability of instructors to teach classes in two different shifts.

“Many of our instructors were absent. However, there were a couple of instructors,” Hayatullah, a student was quoted as saying. Students and instructors at many public universities celebrated the re-

opening. Badshah Zar Abadi, an instructor at Balkh University said, “The re-opening of universities is great news and a new spring.”

Some students also expressed concerns over possible changes in the textbooks, especially in the arts faculties.

Earlier this month, The United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA) had welcomed the re-opening of the universities in the warmer areas of the country from February 2.

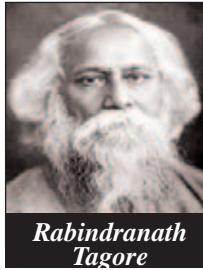

Older adults' medication intake can be improved by smart packaging



A new study has found that older adults are open to using smart packaging to improve their medication-taking experience. The findings of the study were recently published in the journal ‘PLOS One’. Smart packages are used to electronically monitor when patients take their medication. When the prescription is not followed as advised by their physician the smart system can notify patients and their caregivers.

Approximately half of the patients with chronic diseases in developed nations do not take their medication properly. With an ageing population where taking multiple medications is common, incorrect

medication-taking - called medication non-adherence - is a problem impacting the health of patients and costs the healthcare system billions of dollars. There has been a surge of telehealth technology to address this issue in the last two decades, from complex at-home medication dispensing devices to reminder apps.

“Many of these products are advertised as user-friendly and efficient, but not all are tested with seniors in mind. So how would we know if older adults are able to use them for their day-to-day medication intake and are there any factors that can impact their in-home utilization?” said Sadaf Faisal, a PhD candidate at the

University of Waterloo School of Pharmacy and lead author of the study. The researchers visited and studied 10 participants in their homes with a mean age of 76. On average, each took 11 medications for at least five chronic diseases. The participants were provided with a smart blister pack that synchronized with a web portal and recorded each time a participant opened a blister to take medications.

The researchers then interviewed the participants to assess their experience with the smart blister package. They were also asked to rank the usability of the technology against standardized scales used in product assessment.

“Across participants, we found fairly consistent pros and cons to the technology,” said Tejal Patel, a pharmacy professor and co-author of the study. Patel added, “The ability to learn the product easily was important for the participants to use it consistently. Feedback from their social circles, such as supportive children, partners or health-care providers, also helped reinforce using the technology.”

In general, participants who were more comfortable with technology were more open to using and liking the smart blister pack. However, device size and lack of portability were a significant downside, and if the product be-

haved inconsistently - sending reminders one day but not another, for example - participants became frustrated.

Participants also said cost was a barrier to use and that they would be less likely to consider smart technology if it was not covered by a drug plan or funded by the government. “For technology to be effective, it has to be accepted by the end-users,” Faisal said and added, “Smart, technology-based adherence products have the potential to support patients, but health-care providers should assess older adults’ medication intake behaviours and barriers and facilitators to using a product before recommending them.”

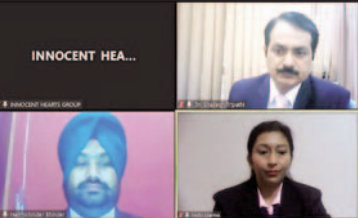

In the 86th edition of 'Mann Ki Baat', PM Modi said, "Till 2013, just 13 idols were retrieved. But after 2014 India has successfully brought back more than 200 precious idols."

The Prime Minister credited India's growing soft power for the other countries coming forward to help retrieve the smuggled idols from India. "Nations where these idols were smuggled to now realise and feel India's attachment to the stolen heritage. They note the importance attached with such



idols in India," said PM Modi.

PM Modi began the 'Mann Ki Baat' with a special mention about the idols that India successfully brought back from Italy and Australia in recent times and said that Avalokiteshwara Padmapani is dated more than 1,000 years old. "At the beginning of this

month, India has been successful in bringing its precious heritage from Italy. It is Avalokiteshwara Padmapani, which is an idol older than more than 1,000 years. It was stolen a few years ago from Gaya's Devasthan Kunlandpur temple. But after a lot of effort, India has got back the statue. Similarly, a few years

ago, Bhagwan Anjaneyar, Hanuman Ji's idol, was stolen from Vellore in Tamil Nadu which was nearly 700 years old. At the beginning of this month, it was handed over to Indian Mission in Australia," PM Modi said.

The Prime Minister said that bringing these idols back to the country is a "responsibility towards mother India" as they are "part of India's soul and faith". "Over a thousand years in our history magnificent idols and statues were sculptured in every corner of India. Each of our idols reflects its own time. Not only were they unique examples of Indian sculpture skills, but our faiths were also tied with them. But in the past, many idols were stolen and smuggled from India to different countries. For them, the stolen objects were just idols. These idols are part of India's soul and faith," he said.

100 examined in Max Hospital's health camp at Manimajra
