Russia seizes Zaporizhzhia nuke plant

The military administration of Ukraine's Zaporizhzhia region said on Friday, citing the state body for nuclear regulation, that the Russian armed forces have seized the site of the Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant (NPP). "The site of the Zaporizhzhia NPP was seized by the Russian military forces -- the State Nuclear Regulatory Inspectorate of Ukraine. Operational personnel monitor the state of power units and ensure their operation in accordance with the requirements of technological regulations for safe operation," the administration wrote on Telegram. Earlier in the day, the Ukrainian State Emergency Service said that a fire erupted outside the Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant, with one of its units having been switched off.

Quad leaders discuss ongoing conflict

CANBERRA: The Quad leaders convened a virtual meeting on Wednesday and discussed the ongoing conflict and humanitarian crisis in Ukraine and assessed its broader implications. Quad Leaders - Prime Minister Scott Morrison of Australia, Prime Minister Narendra Modi of India, Prime Minister Fumio Kishida of Japan, and President Joe Biden of the United States reaffirmed their commitment to a free and open Indo-Pacific, in which the sovereignty and territorial integrity of all states.



Another Indian student shot in Kyiv, hospitalised

RZESZOW: An Indian student has been hospitalised after he was shot with a bullet in the capital city of Ukraine, a few days after an Indian student lost his life in the ongoing conflict between Russia and Ukraine. Speaking exclusively to ANI, Minister of State (MoS) for Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) General VK Singh revealed the information at Poland's Rzeszow airport on Thursday.

Over 160 educational institutions destroyed

KYIV: Over 160 educational institutions in Ukraine have been partially or completely destroyed by the shelling of Russian troops, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) of Ukraine on Friday said. "According to the Minister of Education of Ukraine, more than 160 educational institutions in Ukraine have been partially or completely destroyed by the shelling of Russian troops," the MFA tweeted. This comes against the backdrop of Russian forces launching military operations in Ukraine on February 24, three days after Moscow recognized Ukraine's breakaway regions - Donetsk and Luhansk - as independent entities. Several countries including the UK, the US, Canada, and the European Union have condemned Russia's military operations in Ukraine and imposed sanctions on Moscow. These countries have also promised Ukraine to help with military aid to fight Russia. The US, Canada and European allies agreed to remove key Russian banks from the interbank messaging system, SWIFT which means Russian banks won't be able to communicate securely with banks beyond Russia's borders.

Pak: 56 killed, dozens injured in Peshawar mosque blast

At least 50 persons were killed and dozen injured in the Peshawar mosque blast during prayers on Friday.

Police and rescue personnel have reached the blast site in the Kocha Risaldar area while the injured are being shifted to the nearby health facilities, reported The News International.

"10 injured are in critical condition," according to Lady Reading Hospital (LRH) spokesperson.

According to eyewitnesses, the powerful explosion

sion took place during the prayers.

There are no details available yet on the nature of the blast, reported The News International.

In a statement to the media, Advisor to KP Chief Minister Barrister Muhammad Ali Saif confirmed that the explosion took place during Friday prayers.

"Reportedly the terrorists first tried to enter the mosque where they exchanged fire with the police," said Barrister Saif.

He said that a terrorist managed to enter the mosque and carried out the attack.

Bhagalpur explosion toll rises to 12, PM talks to Nitish

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday expressed his "deep shock" over deaths in a blast in Bihar's Bhagalpur district, as the death toll mounted to 12.

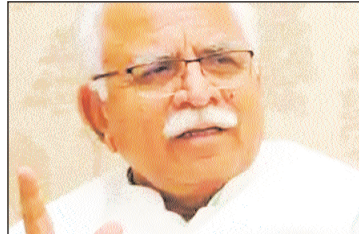
The explosion had taken place in Kajwlichak on Thursday night. Prime Minister in his tweet expressed his grief over the incident saying it is painful for him to learn about the loss of lives of the people in an explosion in Bhagalpur district of Bihar. He wished early recovery of those sustained injuries and said that the administration is engaged in

carrying out relief and rescue operations. "I discussed with Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar Ji about the situation", Prime Minister informed in his tweet. Chief Minister Nitish Kumar also expressed his deep shock over the incident and directed Chief Secretary and DGP to ensure a thorough inquiry. He called both the top officials to get details of the incident. He also directed to make all arrangements for treatment of those injured in the incident. While the death toll increased to 12, several others were injured and were also rushed to hospitals where their conditions are listed as critical.

Conversion Bill does not prohibit anyone from conversion: Hry CM

Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal, who is also the leader of the House, while clarifying, The Haryana Prevention of Unlawful Conversion of Religion Bill, 2022, which was reintroduced on the third day during the ongoing Budget Session in the Haryana Vidhan Sabha, said that this Bill does not stop anyone who is willingly doing a conversion, provided



that such person has to submit an application for willful conversion before the District Magistrate.

He said that any religious priest or any person intending to organize a conversion shall give prior notice to the District Magistrate in advance giving information about the venue where such conversion is proposed to be organized. A copy of this notice shall be pasted on the notice board outside the District Magistrate's office.

If any person has an objection to this conversion, then they can file their objection in writing within 30

days. The District Magistrate shall investigate and decide whether the conversion is intended to be in contravention of Section 3. If the District Magistrate comes to the conclusion that the intended conversion is in contravention of Section 3, then he shall decline the intended conversion by passing a reasoned order. An appeal can be made against the order passed by the District Magistrate before the Divisional Commissioner within 30 days.

Sensex tanks 769 points; Nifty slumps below 16,250

Equity benchmark Sensex tumbled 769 points on Friday, tracking a weak trend in global equities amid escalating tensions between Russia and Ukraine.

Extending its decline for the third straight session, the 30-share BSE index slumped 1,214.96 points to 53,887.72 during the session after a weak start. It finally finished at 54,333.81, lower by 768.87 points or 1.40 per cent.

Similarly, the broader NSE Nifty slumped

252.70 points or 1.53 per cent to close at 16,245.35.

"Global bourses are witnessing a sharp sell-off as reports of Russian attack on Europe's biggest nuclear plant in Ukraine kept tension levels elevated. Rising oil prices along with uncertainties on supply chain disruption have instilled fears that inflation could cross RBI's tolerance level, though temporarily," according to Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services.

The domestic market, however, trimmed its losses as buying was witnessed in IT and pharma stocks.

SC expresses shock on HC order granting protection to ex-Punjab DGP

The Supreme Court on Friday expressed "shock" on the "unprecedented" order passed by the Punjab and Haryana High Court of protecting former Punjab DGP Sumedh Singh Saini in all future cases and asked High Court Chief Justice to decide his plea within two weeks.

A bench of Chief Justice of India NV Ramana and Justices AS Bopanna and Hima Kohli asked the Chief Justice of the High Court to either hear the matter himself or assign it to another bench and not to the one who passed the interim order.

The top court termed the High Court order granting protection to Saini in all future cases as "unprecedented". The bench said, "This is unprecedented order. How can a future course of action be stayed? It is shocking and three of us (judges) feel that it is unprecedented. This will require a hearing."

Yesterday, the High Court has extended till April 20 the stay on the arrest of Saini in all cases pending against him or likely to be



registered, except the murder of Balwant Singh Multani case as it's pending before the Supreme Court.

In its order, the apex court said, "We will request the High Court to dispose of the petition by another judge and not the same judge within two weeks. We request the Chief Justice to take it up himself or by any other judge and we will keep this matter (SLP) pending in (Supreme) Court." In the High Court, Saini has sought to transfer all criminal cases pending against him to the CBI. Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for Saini, told the bench that there have been attempts by the Punjab government against Saini. He further argued that there were assassination attempts on Saini and more than half-a-dozen cases registered against him.

Leg spin wizard Shane Warne is no more

Former Australia spinner Shane Warne, considered as one of the all-time greats of the game who redefined spin bowling, has died of a suspected heart attack in Thailand, according to media reports here quoting a statement from his management.

He was 52. According to 'foxsports.com.au', Warne's management released a brief statement that Warne passed away in Thailand and the reason could be a suspected heart



attack.

"Shane was found unresponsive in his villa and despite the best efforts of medical staff, he could not be revived," the statement reported by the website said.

"The family requests privacy at this time and will provide further details in due course."

An iconic name in international cricket, Warne, since making his debut in 1992, played 145 Tests for Australia, picking up 708 wickets.

In his 194 ODI appearances, Warne Pared 293 scalps.



Pb: SI shoots himself in Strong Room Center

FAZILKA: A sub-inspector was shot dead today in the EVM strong room in Fazilka. Police said when people reached the spot after hearing the sound of bullets, SI Baldev Chand was lying on the ground in an injured condition. He said the SI shot himself with a government pistol. When the injured was being taken to the government hospital, he died on the way. Police officials have reached the spot and started investigation into the matter.

Ex-Punjab Guv F Rodrigues passes away

PANAJI: Former Army Chief General (Retd) and former Punjab Governor Sunith Francis Rodrigues passed away on Friday. He was 88. Born in 1943 in Bombay, he remained the Chief of Army Staff between 1990 and 1993. He originally hailed from Curtorim in South Goa. Rodrigues was Governor of Punjab and Administrator of the Union Territory of Chandigarh from 2004 to 2010. He also served as the Director of International Centre Goa (ICG) for nearly six years. Funerals with full military honours are likely to be held on Sunday, sources said. Chief Minister Pramod Sawant and Leader of Opposition Digambar Kamat expressed grief over the demise of the former Army Staff.

Fodder Scam: Hearing deferred on Lalu Yadav's bail plea

RANCHI: The Jharkhand High Court on Friday deferred the hearing over the bail petition of jailed former Bihar Chief Minister and RJD supremo Lalu Yadav over some defects in his bail petition. The matter was listed in the court of justice Apressh Kumar Singh for hearing. During the proceedings the court directed to correct the mistakes. It is expected that hearing on the bail plea will now be held on March 11. A special CBI court had awarded five years of rigorous imprisonment and imposed a fine of Rs 60 lakh on Lalu Yadav after he was convicted in Fodder Scam case.

Modi chairs meet on Ukraine crisis

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday chaired a meeting to review the Ukraine crisis amid the ongoing exercise to evacuate Indian nationals, mostly students, from the country facing attack from Russia. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and another Union minister Piyush Goyal were part of the meeting besides top officials, including NSA Ajit Doval. The government has launched "Operation Ganga" to evacuate its citizens and sent four Union ministers as Modi's "Special Envoys" to neighbouring countries of Ukraine to coordinate the exercise.

HP tax revenue to
rise by 15 pc: CM

Himachal Pradesh expected to have a tax revenue to the tune of Rs 9,082 crores during 2022-23, which will be 15 per cent higher than last year, Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur said on Friday. He told the Assembly that Rs 7 crore would be deployed to set up cyber stations as cyber crime was going up in the state. The allowance of Home Guards has been increased and a Rs 2 crore fund

has been set up for Sanskriti (Culture) Fund. A new Sanskrit University is to be set up in the state. While a convention centre at Kullu is ready, new ones will come up in Sundernagar, Solan and Baijnath. A total of Rs 20 crore will be set aside to develop sports-related activities. The allowance for diet of sportspersons while taking part in games will be increased to Rs 400 per day from the present Rs 240.

4.40 lakh consumers to get zero power bills

SHIMLA: HP Chief Minister, Jai Ram Thakur announced today that 4.40 lakh power consumers are to be provided zero billing, and seven lakh consumers are to be provided power at Rs one per unit during the

next fiscal year. While presenting the annual budget, he said the agriculture consumer to get power at the rate of RS 50 paise to Rs 30 for which Rs 100 Crore would be provided by the state to

state electricity board, 23 new 33 kva power stations to be set up to improve the voltage in the state. 5000 new power connection to be given to poor people. 9000 wooden pool to be replaced with steel poles.

NEET 'death knell' for dreams of poor,
rural children: Mahila Kisan Union

Opposing the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) mandatory for MBBS education, the Mahila Kisan Union has termed the central admission process as a 'death knell' for the dreams of poor and promising rural students as such children want to achieve medical degrees but due to poverty, adverse living conditions and facilities they were deprived of medical seats in the country and they either lose their dreams or are forced to get cheap medical education from abroad.

In a statement here on Friday, Mahila Kisan Union State President Bibi Rajwinder Kaur Raju appealed to all the regional parties to abolish this pro-rich central entrance exam NEET on the lines of Tamil Nadu state and adopt old practice to admit students in MBBS course on the basis of class XII marks only in the medical colleges of their states.

She slammed the BJP government at the Center for failing to ensure the safety of Indian medical students entangled in the Russo-Ukraine war, saying that two Indian students were killed and more than 30,000 students have suffered physical and mental torture in Ukraine.

Lamenting at the situation, the woman leader said the incidents in Ukraine have exposed the 'shameless face' of NEET exam and the death of these students is a big question for the conscience of India. Terming this national NEET exam as a violation of the federal structure, farmer leader Bibi Raju asked why the central government was denying opportunities to rural and poor children to become doctors while the state governments were providing basic facilities and all kinds of infrastructure to their medical colleges. She said due to the introduction of NEET exam in the country, expensive tuition and coaching centers have mushroomed in every city where only children from affluent homes are taking costly tuition/coaching classes and 99 per cent of them clears in NEET examination.

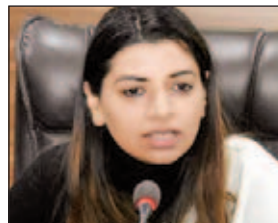
GNDU researchers find sustainable way 'of
shunning' plastic use

AMRITSAR: A team of researchers at Guru Nanak Dev University (GNDU) has found a sustainable way to degrade polythene at a faster rate. The team of researchers at Department of Chemistry, led by Dr Tejwant Singh Kang, identified new solvent system wherein polythene can be dissolved under milder conditions and degraded simultaneously. The research work has been published in one of the prestigious international journals, Green chemistry, published by Royal Society of Chemistry, London. Dr Kang said, "Polythene in the environment is polluting our soil, water and choking the sewage system as no sustainable method for its easy processing exists. The team has been working on the issue for last two years and finally got very promising results. The results provide new insights into pollutant-degrading solvent system under mild conditions." The team is also exploring other opportunities for further enhancing the chemical degradation of polythene. He said the research team has utilised photocatalysis under white light in a deep eutectic solvent to dissolve and simultaneously degrade polythene.

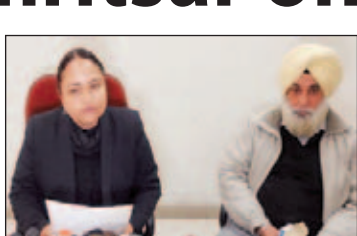

India's services PMI rises to 51.8 in
February from 51.5 in January

India's services Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) rose from 51.5 in January to 51.8 in February on the back of greater bookings, better demand conditions and the retreat of the pandemic, a private survey showed on Friday. The uptick in the index was, however, subdued by historical standards, with some survey participants indicating that growth was dampened by competitive pressures, Covid-19 and higher prices. "Rising from 51.5 in January to 51.8 in February, the seasonally adjusted India Services Business Activity Index pointed to a moderate rate of expansion that was marginally quicker than in January," said the IHS Markit survey. The survey said that the service sector moved up a gear in February as Covid cases declined and restrictions were lifted following the escalation of the pandemic and an associated slowdown in



growth in January. As per the survey findings, there was an uptick in business confidence in February but firms continued to shed jobs. Input costs increased at a softer rate as did output prices during this period. "Growth in the service sector failed to rebound as meaningfully as many would have hoped given that Covid-19 cases receded considerably from January's new wave and

restrictions were lifted," said Pollyanna De Lima, Economics Associate Director at IHS Markit. De Lima further said that new business and services activity expanded only modestly, and at the second-slowest rates since last July. "Looking at the anecdotal evidence supplied by survey participants, inflationary pressures, input shortages and the local elections dampened growth," said the economist. The

Still potent

Non-alignment is outdated. That, in a nutshell, has been the Narendra Modi government's position on one of the pillars of India's foreign policy since Independence. Yet, the last few days have shown that the idea is well and alive for New Delhi, even if it chooses not to accept that, and if its practice of non-alignment is at variance with the philosophy that emerged in the 1950s. India has repeatedly abstained at key United Nations votes critical of Russia's illegal invasion of Ukraine. New Delhi has neither supported Moscow nor joined the growing international chorus to treat Russia as a pariah, by crippling not just its economy but also targeting its cultural and sports icons. The foreign minister, S. Jaishankar, has previously described the government's approach to the world as multi-aligned rather than non-aligned — suggesting proactive engagement with several important partners rather than a passive refusal to be seen as close to anyone. But New Delhi's recent votes at the UN are anything but bold. They are defensive and rooted in a belief that India must choose between its strategic interests — not upsetting its critical military partner, Moscow, or its vital friend, Washington — and principles.

But the two need not be contradictory. To be clear, the West's hypocrisy on unilateral invasions leaves it with no credibility to critique India. But New Delhi must measure itself against its own traditions. Contrary to the lament often levelled against non-alignment, the policy never stopped India from partnering with multiple nations in resolving global crises. In fact, it gave India the necessary moral clout. No instance better illustrates that than the Suez Crisis in 1956, sparked by the invasion of Egypt by Israel, Britain and France. The events of that year bear close parallels to today's war. Then, like now, the UN Security Council was divided because permanent members were among the invaders. As a result, a special session of the UN General Assembly was called under the same "united for peace" resolution used to call for this week's vote. But under the then prime minister, Jawaharlal Nehru, India worked behind the scenes with the United States of America to ensure that most Western nations and the majority of Asia and Africa voted together to set up a peacekeeping force that then kept the warring militaries apart. A non-aligned India helped end a war. As today's crisis shows, there is nothing outdated about that legacy.

Global food system and greenhouse gas emissions

A new report suggests that the food practices of 7.8 billion people account for 21-37 per cent of the greenhouse gases emitted every year in the world due to all human activities.

It means our food systems (the complete process ranging from food production and consumption to its distribution and disposal) emit more than transportation (14 per cent of global GHG emissions) and energy use in buildings (16 per cent), and almost as much as the industry (21 per cent) and electricity production (25 per cent).

In fact, in a scenario where emissions from all other sources are halted, emissions from the global food system alone will contribute enough GHGs to heat up the planet above the 1.5°C target.

These statistics and projections feature in the latest Annual State of India's Environment report, released at the 2022 Anil Agarwal Dialogue, Centre for Science and Environment (CSE)'s annual media conclave, by Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Bhupender Yadav. These statistics, put together recently by a group of researchers from the UK and the US, may come as a surprise to many who think of plants as carbon sinks.

Vibha Varshney, associate editor, 'Down To Earth', said: "While it is true that plants remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere through photosynthesis, they also release large amounts of the gas when decomposing. Food systems also contribute to emissions through other direct and indirect ways. For example, cutting trees to make way for farms and pasture removes a major carbon sink. Operation of farm machinery using fossil fuels, or manufacture of agrochemicals and fertilisers too emit GHGs."

"So what is the world doing about it? The EAT-Lancet Commission on Food, Planet and Health, a gathering of 37 scientists from 16 nations, has set global targets for food systems that are environmentally sustainable and benefit human health. The



commission has proposed a Planetary Health Diet that could reduce urban emissions by 60 per cent in 10 years," she added.

The CSE 'Down To Earth' report refers to a September 2020 assessment by UNEP which says reducing land-use change and conversion of natural habitat alone could lower emissions by 4.6 gigatonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent (GtCO₂e).

Varshney added: "A dramatic transformation of dietary practices is recommended to decarbonise the food sector. But it is

easier said than done. The pathways to achieve that goal are not as clear as they are for, say, the generation of electricity. Carbon emissions are integral to the biological system. Besides, one cannot stop eating."

"There are also financial considerations at play. The most affordable of the EAT-Lancet Commission's 'planetary health diet' exceeds the household per capita income of 1.58 billion people," says Richard Mahapatra, managing editor of Down To Earth. Additionally, business interests that have played a role in shaping modern industrial

food can make the transition difficult as well.

There are also fears that this focus on plant-based diets might prompt other emitters to shirk responsibility and put the onus of reducing emissions on the individual. Says the Annual State of India's Environment report: "The 26th Conference of Parties... in Glasgow, Scotland in November 2021 saw discussions on lowering the agriculture sector's contribution to global warming. It remains to be seen how this affects food systems."

Financially stable people more protected from persistent depression

The pandemic made many people lose their jobs as companies were aggressively retrenching their workforce to sustain the expenses. This increased mental health problems in people as they now not only had a pandemic to deal with but also had the additional burden of lack of finances. In this wake, a new study has shed some light on the correlation between financial stability and mental health.

The study, published in the journal 'Science Advances', found that individuals with physical, social, and financial assets, particularly higher incomes and fewer savings, were less likely to experience sustained depression during the first year of the pandemic. The study was led by the Boston University School of Public Health (BUSPH).

It found that 1 in 5 adults experienced persistent depression, both at the start of the pandemic in March and April 2020 and one year later, but those who had access to more physical, social, or financial assets—particularly higher incomes and more savings—were less likely to experience



sustained depressive symptoms. The findings also showed that job loss, financial difficulties, or relationship problems were important predictors of depression in the first year of the pandemic.

The study is the first of its kind to examine the association of assets and persistent depression across the US during the first 12 months of the pandemic.

"We have been observing particularly high rates of depressions since the beginning of COVID that have persisted throughout the first year of COVID," said study lead author Catherine Ettman, executive director of strategy and planning at BUSPH.

Sri Lanka economy facing mounting challenges

Sri Lanka's economy was facing "mounting challenges" with public debt reaching "unsustainable levels", the IMF has said, calling for urgent reforms in the island nation's economy as it is facing the worst economic crisis. Sri Lanka is currently reeling under a severe foreign exchange crisis with falling reserves and the government is unable to foot the bill for essential imports.

Sri Lanka has been hit hard by COVID-19. On the eve of the pandemic, the country was highly vulnerable to external shocks owing to inadequate external buffers and high risks to public debt sustainability, exacerbated by the Easter Sunday terrorist attacks in 2019 and major policy changes including large tax cuts at late 2019," the International Monetary Fund (IMF) said in a release after global lender's executive board's consultative meeting held on February 25. Despite the ongoing economic recovery, Directors



noted that the country faces mounting challenges, including public debt that has risen to unsustainable levels, low international reserves, and persistently large financing needs in the coming years, the release said.

The IMF has also called for urgent reforms to the island's economy.

Directors emphasised the need for an ambitious fiscal consolidation that is based on high-quality revenue measures. Noting Sri Lanka's low tax-to-GDP ratio, they saw scope for raising income tax and VAT rates and minimising exemptions, comple-

mented with revenue administration reform. The bleak picture of the local economy has come in at a time when the government here is coming under increased pressure to seek an IMF bailout as the island's foreign reserves have hit a critical low.

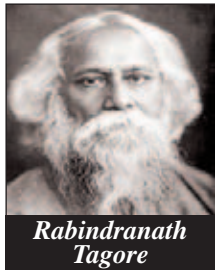
The government has steadfastly refused to resort to the IMF even in the backdrop of the ongoing energy and power crisis and shortages of almost all essentials and medicine. The power generation has been hit by the foreign exchange crisis as fuel to operate thermal power plants are in short supply.

Agroforestry and ToF (Trees Outside Forests) Potential in supporting India's Roadmap towards Carbon Neutral Economy by 2070

India's Commitments led by Hon'ble Prime Minister Sh Narendra Modi during CoP26 of UNFCCC (UN Framework Convention on Climate Change) at Glasgow, United Kingdom in 2021 incorporated five nectar elements of 'Panchamrit' to address Climate Change related challenges. Promotion of Agroforestry and Trees Outside Forests have to play a pivotal role in meeting commitments related to: Reduction of at least one billion tonnes of total projected emissions between now and 2030, Reduction of the country's carbon intensity to less than 45%, Achieving net-zero emissions target by 2070.

Union Budget-2022 emphasis on Agroforestry as one of the four interventions. It also reflects the seriousness of visionary leadership through shaping of "Climate Action" roadmap towards meeting NDC targets of having additional 2.5 to 3 billion tonnes of Carbon Sequestration by 2030 and other National and International Goals related to Biodiversity Conservation, Land Degradation Neutrality (LDN), Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) under Convention on Biodiversity (CBD), UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) and other conventions. Enhancement of India's pledge under Bonn Chal-

lenge -Landscape Restoration to 26 mha from 21 mha by 2030 during UNCCD CoP-14, held in India in 2019 by Hon'ble Prime Minister Sh Narendra Modi is the largest pledge by any Country. The potential of Agroforestry and Trees Outside Forests (ToF) needs to be harnessed optimally in meeting these commitments and goals. Agroforestry also enhances provision of ecosystem services, especially carbon sequestration, and increased inclusive economic opportunities. Agroforestry and ToFs also alleviate some pressure on natural forests by meeting fuelwood and wood product needs.

Agroforestry and ToF include trees growing on private land and farms; in urban areas; along linear infrastructure such as roads, railway lines, canals; plantations in and around industrial areas; shelterbelts; and in land belonging to government and other institutions; etc. ToFs on farms and other private lands provide income and sustenance for farmers from timber, fuelwood, fruits and other products. These ToFs play a critical role in the economy of many developing countries, including India. Additionally, ToFs are important in promoting cultural, social, and ecological functions that are important to human livelihoods. ToFs

also sequester carbon, stabilize soil, filter water and air, regulate water flow, and perform other ecosystem services. When planted along roads and canals, in institutional areas or within urban landscapes, ToFs provide shade to cool microclimates, absorb some air pollutants, beautify green spaces, provide nesting and habitat for birds and other small animals, help to regulate stormwater, and contribute to human well-being.

Haryana State has demonstrated how a State deficient in forest and natural resources scarce with only about 3.5 % area under Forests and more than 80 % area under Agriculture can support the Nation's food security and also wood security. This is mainly due to promotion of Agroforestry friendly policies and encouraging plantation campaigns for planting Trees Outside Forests. Investor and Industry friendly climate for wood based industries, sourcing wood mainly from farmlands and facilitating availability of high productivity and short rotation seedlings of Eucalyptus and Poplar to farmers have played a pivotal role in making Yamunanagar District the Plywood Capital of the Country. Clonal Eucalyptus and Poplar seedlings have short harvesting period of 4-6 years. Farmers' income is supplemented

through farmwood based production along with agricultural crops. Moreover, Agroforestry also ensures economic security in supplementing income from trees in years of crop failures due to drought, frost, extreme temperatures, rainfall or other reasons. Strong formal and informal market linkages, marketing agencies and value chains linking producers, industries, consumers and end users have evolved. There are about 350 plywood units in the State. Yamunanagar Wood Market supports more than 50 % of the India's Plywood Production. It is estimated that wood worth INR 2500to 3000 crores sourced from farmlands is traded in Yamunanagar and nearby region. Finished and value added wood products worth about INR6500 to 8000 crores in the form of plywood, particle board, poles etc have played a vital role in shaping the economy of the region. It is estimated, that about 0.1 million persons are annually employed in activities related to woodbased harvesting, marketing and production.

Haryana State under the dynamic and visionary leadership of Hon'ble Chief Minister Sh Manohar Lal Khattar has undertaken a number of initiatives in supporting National level Commitments. "Oxy- Van" scheme launched in 2021 aims

to have "Mini Forests as natural oxygen factories" so that people can have better surroundings and availability of oxygen, specially in urban areas. This is especially important, keeping in view the Oxygen Crisis, everyone faced during COVID pandemic. The objective of "Praan Vayu Devta" scheme aims to protect and conserve the trees having immense ecological and environmental value and to inculcate in the people sense for protection of old age trees which provide valuable intangible benefits and services to humanity including lifesaving oxygen. The scheme acknowledges and respects old and heritage trees, more than 75 years old by paying annual pension of Rs 2500 to the custodian of tree. Haryana State on the occasion of World Environment Day, 5th June 2021 has also initiated a scheme to promote Agroforestry and plantations on at least 10% of Gram Panchayat lands. For Soil and Moisture Conservation, "MeraPaani Meri Viraasat" scheme has been launched, that aims at crop diversification scheme for farmers. The scheme incentivises farmer or landowner for Rs. 7000 per acre to switch from paddy cultivation to other crops. This water conservation initiative will also protect depletion of natural resources such as water and soil.

The success of Eucalyptus (Eucalyptus tereticornis) and Populus spp. (Populus deltoides) based Agroforestry and the adoption of these species in Yamunanagar and Northern Plains is mainly due to short rotation of 5 to 7 years as compared to other species, linked established market supply chains through utilization in Plywood, Particle Board and Veneer and associated industries facilitating value additions, supplementing economic returns and green livelihoods. The India plywood market reached a value of INR 195.8 billion in FY 2021-22. It is estimated that the Indian plywood market will reach INR 297.2 billion by 2027-28, exhibiting a CAGR of 7.4% during 2022-23 to 2027-28. (www.imargroup.com /indian-plywood-market/toc). Agroforestry offers a huge opportunity in meeting the market demand of wood. Appropriate Policy measures, supported by technology transfer, diversification of wood based products, ensuring appropriate returns to wood grower for encouraging adoption of agroforestry, setting up of industries at strategic locations for balanced agroforestry based industrial development to absorb the available wood and continuous market research are needed.

iPad Air, iPhone SE 2022 likely to be unveiled at Apple's March 8 event

Washington : Apple has announced its online event for March 8 but no hints have been given about what to expect. The next-generation iPad Air and the rumoured iPhone SE (2022) will reportedly be the centrepiece announcements. As per GSM Arena, the information comes from one of the biggest Asian carriers as it received placeholder product images of the rumoured iPad Air and iPhone SE for this year. Companies send out press materials to carriers so that they can prepare product pages in advance. The most recent rumour suggests that the new SE will ask for USD 100 less than its predecessor, meaning USD 300 will be the starting price of the handset. It will, however, sport the latest Apple A15 Bionic chip powering up the current iPhone 13 generation.

Android 13 to give more granular control over phone's LED flash

Washington: American tech-giant Google may give users more granular control over their LED flash on the back of the phone. MoreAs per Google's recently released Android 13 developer preview, Google may give you more granular control over your LED flash on the back of the phone. There are two APIs associated with the new feature - one gives information about the brightness of the LED flash and the other one controls the actual brightness, according to GSM Arena. It will be up to OEMs to tap on those APIs and let users control the brightness from 1 to as high as the hardware allows. As per the outlet, not every phone will support the said feature, probably due to hardware limitations. For now, some Samsung handsets allow users to dim the LED flash as well as iPhones.
