Five of family charred to death in Kerala

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: Five members of a family including an eight-month-old baby were charred to death after their house caught fire at 1:45 am at Varkala district of Kerala on Tuesday. The victims were identified as Prathapan (64), his wife Sherly (53), their younger son Akhil (29), their elder son's wife Abhirami (25), her child Riyan, sources said. Abhirami's husband Nihul who suffered serious burn injuries was taken to a private hospital in Thiruvananthapuram and his condition is said to be critical. A police team including forensic officials rushed to the spot and began a detailed probe into the shocking incident. According to the locals, four bikes parked in the car porch were completely burnt to ashes. The air conditioners of the two-storey building were completely destroyed in the fire that engulfed all materials in the rooms. House owner Prathapan was running a vegetable shop in the area.

India to resume international passenger flights from March 27

In the view of decline in the COVID-19 cases, the Government of India has decided to resume scheduled commercial international passenger services to and from India from March 27, 2022, informed the Ministry of Civil Aviation on Tuesday.

Taking to Twitter, Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya M Scindia said with this step, the sector will reach new heights.

"After deliberation with stakeholders and keeping in view the decline in the



COVID-19 caseload, we have decided to resume international travel from March 27 onwards. Air Bubble arrangements will also stand revoked thereafter. With this step, I am confident the sector will reach new heights!," said Union Minister Jyotiraditya M Scindia.

The ministry further said that the suspension of scheduled commercial international passenger services to and from India, thus, stands extended till 2359 hrs IST on March 26, 2022, and air bubble arrangements shall accordingly be extended to this extent only.

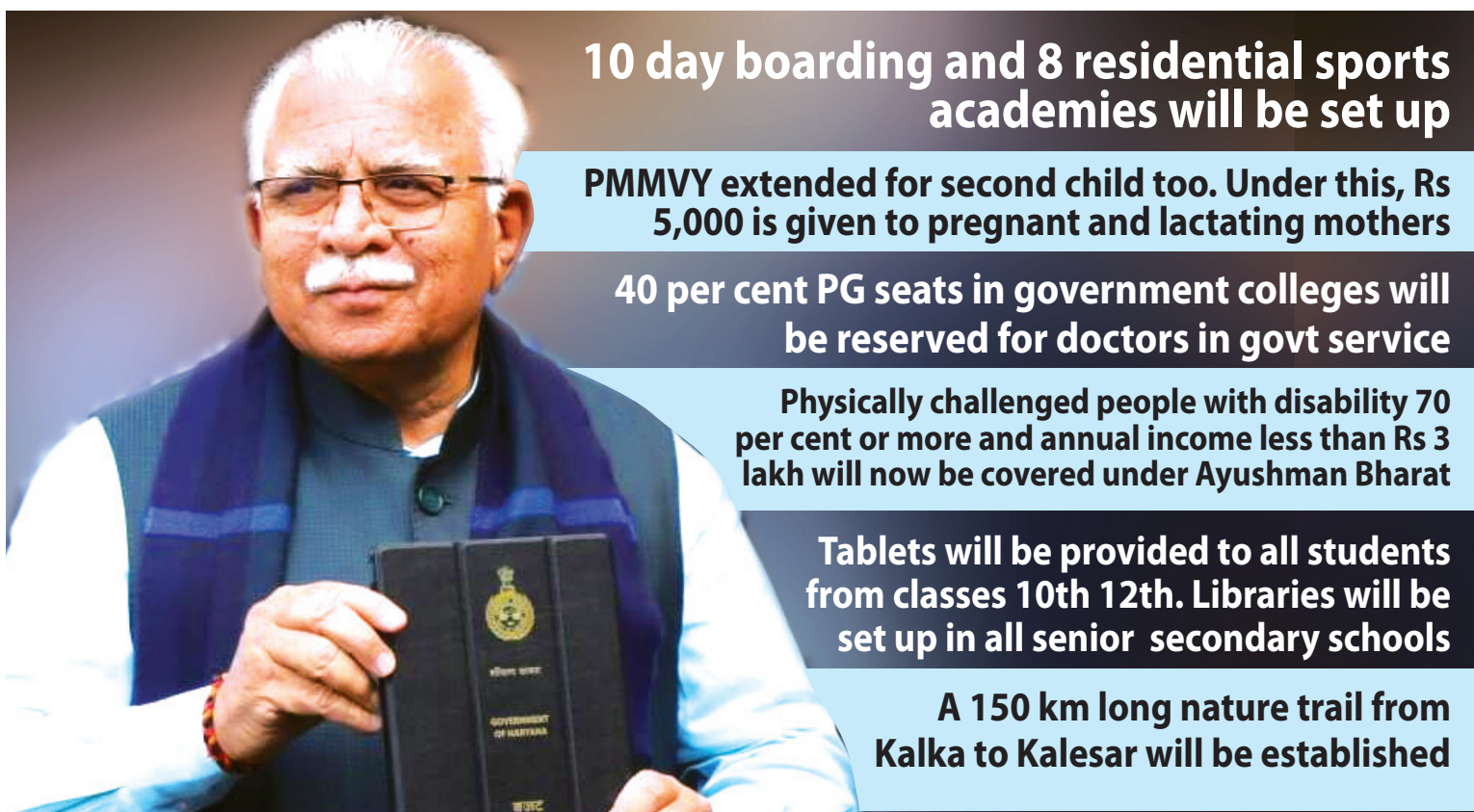
In order to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Directorate

General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) had suspended operations of scheduled international commercial passenger services to and from India with effect from March 23, 2020.

Currently, in terms of DGCA's circular February 28, 2022, suspension of scheduled international commercial passenger services to/from India has been extended till further orders.

The ministry added that the international operations shall be subject to strict adherence to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare guidelines for international travel dated February 10, 2022, and as amended from time to time.

Manohar Lal presents Rs 1.77 lakh cr budget

Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar, who also holds Finance portfolio, presented a Rs 1,77,255.99 crore budget for the year 2022-23 in the Vidhan Sabha, here on Tuesday. Vidhan Sabha Speaker Gian Chand Gupta announced the constitution of eight Committees on various topics to get the State Budget passed through these Committees on the similar lines of Lok Sabha. Meanwhile, after the Chief Minister's around two and half hour long budget speech, the Speaker announced the formation of these Committees in the House. Vidhan Sabha Deputy Speaker Ranbir Singh Gangwa will be the Chairman of the First Committee, while Aseem Goel will chair the second Committee, Geeta Bhukkal will chair the third Committee, Ishwar Singh will chair the fourth Committee, Seema Trikha will head the fifth Committee, Kiran Choudhary will chair the sixth Committee, Parmod Kumar Vij will chair the seventh Committee and Ghanshyam Dass Arora will chair the eighth Committee. The announcement of other members of the committee will be issued by the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat today itself and as per the timetable released for the Budget session, no meeting of House will be convened for three days that is from March 9 to 11, while these are three official working days of the Vidhan Sabha and after discussing various topics of the Budget, these Committees will present their report in the House on March 14. These Committees will also function on Saturdays.

ALLOCATIONS FOR DIFFERENT SECTORS

- **Transport** - Rs 2,821.83 crore for 2022-23, an increase of 12.2% over RE (Revised Estimate) of current year
- **Civil Aviation** - Rs 886.37 crore for 2022-23, an increase of 380.8% over BE (Budget Estimate) of current year
- **Tourism** - Rs 310.24 crore for 2022-23, an increase of 55.1% over RE of current year

To support 10K self help groups

The state has set a target of setting up and supporting 10,000 Self Help Groups in 2022-23. In addition to the support provided by the central government, the state government will bear the entire interest cost for SHGs where more than half of the members of the SHGs belong to families whose income is less than or equal to Rs 1.80 lakhs.

Budget dedicated to women

CHANDIGARH: Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal, who is also the Finance Minister of the state, today dedicated the budget for the year 2022-23 presented in the Haryana Vidhan Sabha to women. In the budget, in the direction of women's empowerment, the Chief Minister gave many significant gifts to women, as well as announced to start an award of Rs. 5 lakhs in the name of Smt. Sushma Swaraj, the daughter of Haryana and women icon.

Presenting his third consecutive budget in the House as the Finance Minister, Chief Min-

ister, Sh. Manohar Lal, while praising the power of mothers on the occasion of International Women's Day, said that without women the society cannot even be imagined. The women of Haryana have made their mark in many fields at the national and international level.

In his budget speech, the Chief Minister also mentioned about the first female Haryana Vidhan Sabha Speaker, Smt. Shanno Devi and the first woman Deputy Speaker, Smt. Lekhvati Jain. He said that this shows the fact that women have been represented in this great house from the very beginning.

RBI launches UPI for over 40 crore feature phone users

Seeking to help over 40 crore feature phone users in the country to make digital payments even without internet connection, Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das on Tuesday launched 'UPI123PAY', a three-step process to complete digital transactions in a secure way. The move would help boost digital economy and provide level-playing field between feature phone users and smartphone users. Launching the new UPI (unified payments interface) service, Governor Das said that the central bank has come up with 50 initiatives in the last three years to boost digital payment system. These initiatives include guidelines on interoperability, tokenisation, switch-on/switch-off facility on cards, turnaround time for failed transactions and 24x7 availability of RTGS and NEFT among others. "India's digital economy has flour-



ished over the past few years. The UPI has played a major role in this process recording about 453 crore transactions worth Rs 8.26 lakh crore in February 2022 which is almost double compared to the position which prevailed a year ago," the Governor said. "We are well on our way to reach, hopefully, with the co-operation of all the service providers, solution providers, NPCI (National Payments Corporation of India) and colleagues from RBI, with more and more initiatives I don't see a day when we are far away from reaching transaction volume of Rs 100 lakh crore on the UPI," he said.

Sardar Singh is chief hockey coach

CHANDIGARH: Former Indian Men's Hockey Team Captain Sardar Singh has been appointed the Chief National Coach of India 'A' Men's hockey team for the national camp to commence at the Sports Authority of India (SAI) in Bengaluru. Sardar Singh is an Olympian who is currently posted in Haryana Police as a Deputy Superintendent of Police. He is also a recipient of the Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna award, Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna award, Padam Shri and Arjuna Award. "It is really a matter of pride for Haryana Police that our officer will be joining a national-level coaching programme in the capacity of Chief Coach. We have seen the wealth of experience, technical know-how and world-class abilities of Sardar Singh that will benefit budding talents, which will, in turn, strengthen Indian hockey manifold," Haryana Director General of Police P K Agrawal said.

Majithia's judicial custody in drug case extended till March 22

MOHALI: Mohali District Court on Tuesday extended Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader and former Punjab Minister Bikram Singh Majithia's judicial custody till March 22, in a drugs case. On February 24, Majithia was sent to judicial custody till March 8 by the court. The SAD leader had surrendered in the court and applied for regular bail in a drug case registered against him in December last year. Majithia has been booked under the relevant sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, on the allegations of his alleged involvement in a drug racket in the state. The Punjab and Haryana High Court on January 24 had dismissed Majithia's anticipatory bail plea.

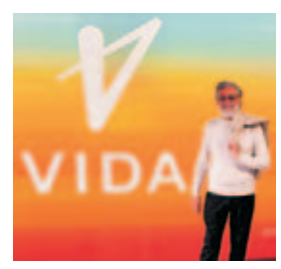
Oldest & youngest Covid vaccinated female felicitated

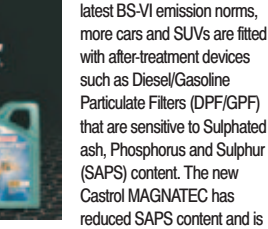

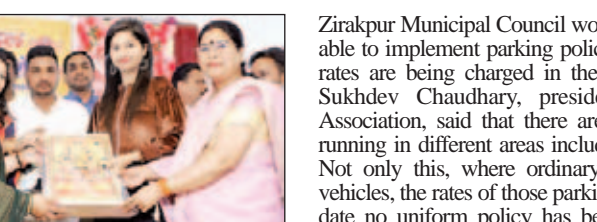

Warne passed away on Friday aged 52 due to a suspected heart attack.

"I see Warne as a flag-bearer for carrying the spin aspect of bowling on the front in the world cricketing map. The top three wicket-takers in the world are spinners in Muttiah Muralitharan, Shane Warne and Anil Kumble. He



was an interesting character. So many Australian legends had so



many nice things to say about him. I still can't accept the fact that life

is so fickle. We cannot predict what can happen," Ashwin said on his YouTube channel.

"Shane Warne was a colourful character, he redefined bowling, he has taken more than 1000 international wickets, not many can achieve this rare feat. Shane Warne brought spin as an attacking commodity to this cricketing world. Everyone will talk about Warne's delivery to Mike Gatting, but my favourite is Warne's delivery to Andrew Strauss in 2005 Ashes. He almost single-handedly fought for Australia in that series. He was a maestro. He was an extraordinary human being and he lived his life to the fullest," he

added.

Warne was one of the most influential cricketers in history. He almost single-handedly reinvented the art of leg-spin when he burst onto the international scene in the early 1990s, and by the time he retired from international cricket in 2007, he had become the first bowler to reach 700 Test wickets.

A central figure in Australia's ICC Cricket World Cup triumph in 1999, when he was player of the match in both the semi-final and the final, Wisden Cricketers' Almanack recognized Shane's achievements by naming him as one of its Five Cricketers of the Twentieth Century.
