Five of family charred to death in Kerala

THIRUVANANTHAPU-

RAM,: Five members of a family including an eightmonth-old baby were charred to death after their house caught fire at 1:45 am at Varkala district of Kerala on Tuesday. The victims were identified as Prathapan (64), his wife Sherly (53), their younger son Akhil (29), their elder son's wife Abhirami (25), her child Riyan, sources said. Abhirami's husband Nihul who suffered serious burn injuries was taken to a private hospital in Thiruvananthapuram and his condition is said to be critical. A police team including forensic officials rushed to the spot and began a detailed probe into the shocking incident. According to the locals, four bikes parked in the car porch were completely burnt to ashes. The air conditioners of the twostorey building were completely destroyed in the fire that engulfed all materials in the rooms. House owner Prathapan was running a vegetable shop



Manohar Lal presents Rs 1.77 lakh cr budget

Meanwhile, after the Chief Minister's around two and half hour long budget speech, the Speaker announced the formation of these Committees in the House. Vidhan Sabha Deputy Speaker Ranbir Singh Gangwa will be the Chairman of the First Committee, while Aseem Goel will chair the second Committee, Geeta Bhukkal will chair the third Committee, Ishwar Singh will chair the fourth Committee, Seema Trikha will head the fifth Committee, Kiran Choudhary will chair the sixth Committee, Parmod Kumar Vij will chair the seventh Committee and Ghanshvam Dass Arora will chair the eighth Committee. The announcement of other members of the committee will be issued by the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat today itself and as per the timetable released for the Budget session, no meeting of House will be convened for three days that is from March 9 to 11, while these are three official working days of the Vidhan Sabha and after discussing various topics of the Budget, these Committees will present their report in the House on March 14. These Committees will also function on Saturdays.

RBI launches UPI for over 40 crore feature phone users

AGENCY MUMBAI, MARCH 8

Seeking to help over 40 crore feature phone users in the country to make digital payments even without internet connection, Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das on Tuesday launched 'UPI123PAY', a three-step process to complete digital transactions in a secure way. The move would help boost digital economy and provide level-playing field between feature phone users and smartphone users. Launching the new UPI (unified payments interface) service, Governor Das said that the central bank has come up with 50 initiatives in the last three years to boost digital payment system. These initiatives include guidelines on interoperability, tokenisation, switchon/switch-off facility on cards, turnaround time for failed transactions and 24x7 availability of RTGS and NEFT among others. "India's digital economy has flour-

On February 24, Majithia was sent to judicial custody till March 8 by the court.

The SAD leader had surrendered in the court and applied for regular bail in a drug case registered against him in December last year. Majithia has been booked under the relevant sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, on the allegations of his alleged involvement in a drug racket in the state.

The Punjab and Haryana High Court on January 24 had dismissed Majithia's anticipatory bail plea.







Back in the USSR

Russians both used to distribute their respective propaganda magazines around India. SPAN, the American product, was glossier but the Russian Sovi-American product, was glossier but the Russian Soviet Land, with its rougher paper and cruder printing, carried a different payload — every year it would have competitions, the prizes for which were trips to the USSR. One of these was a painting competition for under-15s, where the winners would be taken to a Soviet children's camp for a month. In 1972, I was one of the five who won this prize.

one of the five who won this prize.

Like many Calcutta kids who'd spoilt their eyesight from reading too much, I was a 12-year-old already deep into some kinds of adult fiction, including thrillers and Cold War sagas — Ian Fleming, Alistair MacLean and the like. Along with this, I had some rudimentary awareness of world affairs, where I understood that the Soviet Union, unlike India, the United States of America and the western European countries, was not a democracy and that it controlled the Warsaw Pact countries with an iron hand. A lot of my reading, of both fiction and international news magazines, might have given me a 'Western' bias, but with intellectually-aware parents who had participated in the freedom struggle there was no easy pass in our house for former imperialist European countries or for a US that had inflicted such horrors on Vietnam and just recently supported Pakistan's butchery in

Just before our 'children's delegation' caught the flight from Palam airport, my father quietly but firmly removed Leon Uris's Topaz, a pot-boiler about the Čuban Missile crisis, from my carry-on bag. "Why can't I take that? Will they put me in jail if they find it?" "Probably not, but they may think you're pro-American, which is avoidable. Just keep your politi-cal opinions to yourself and see and listen." The halfread paperback was quickly forgotten as I examined the cabin details of the Ilyushin-62 taking us to Moscow. After a brief overnight stay, we flew south to Simferopol in the Crimean peninsula and from there by van to Artek, the vast children's camp scattered across a hillside at the edge of the Black Sea.

Artek was one of the premier summer camps the Soviet Union had created. Every year, school children deemed most deserving were brought to this quasi-resort for a holiday. They came from across the vast — from all the different republics — in batches, each batch spending four weeks across the summer months. At one level, this holiday was a 'prize', for being exceptional in studies or sport, for showing leadership qualities as a Young Pioneer (the Soviet Scouts/Guides), for being talented in music, dance or

Discrimination against Sikhs in US

eligious discrimination and hate crime against the Sikh community in the United States has increased in recent years, an eminent human rights expert has told the lawmakers urging the administration and the US Congress to take steps to end this. Congress must take action, Amrith Kaur Aakre told members of the House Judiciary Subcommittee on Constitution, Civil Rights and Civil Liberties during a recent Congressional hearing on Discrimination and Civil Right. Aakre is legal director of the Sikh

Workplace discrimination harms Sikhs in a range of public and private sector jobs including transportation, entertainment, health care, the military and law enforcement by allowing for the biased interpretation and application of government policies and laws.

"We've seen Sikhs willing to put their lives on the line in defence of their cities and country, only to be told that uniform and grooming policies prohibit their articles of faith, she said.

We have seen Sikhs ordered to cut their hair for work-related drug testing even when alternative means are readily available. And we've seen Sikh first responders in the fight against COVID-19 pressured to shave their religiously mandated beards instead of being given appropriate, safe personal protective equipment that doesn't interfere with their faith, Aakre said.

Regardless of the details, time and again these policies are interpreted in a way which disproportionately impacts minority communities and our system allows it to keep happening, she said. We also receive Sikh travellers' re-

ports of inappropriate demands to remove articles of faith, discriminatory comments by TSA agents and other pro-



Bias against travellers is prevalent at every stage of the travelling process and it starts with the fact that the TSA agents do not receive adequate training on TSA policies or cultural competencies, which is evident from the moment many stigmatized groups arrive at the airport and have to go through behavioural detection before reaching security.

people, she said. Responding to a question, Aakre said TSA profiling for Sikh

Americans and other minority groups has

always been a problem.

In response to another question from Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee, she said Sikh American students experience high rates of bullying and harassment in our nation's public schools and they continue receiving and documenting nationwide reports of school bullying.

Sikh boys who wear turbans are called terrorists and girls are teased for having long hair. And many of these children are subjected to violence.

Our research shows that the majority

of Sikh children, over 50 per cent, have endured school bullying. Over two-thirds or 67 per cent reported that they were bullied in school and turban Sikh children experienced bullying at more than double the national rate, Jackson Lee said. Congresswoman Pramila Jayapal, who is the first and only South Asian American woman elected to the House of Representatives, said 9/11 forever

changed what it means to be Muslim, Arab, or South Asian American in America. In the days and weeks after, I received fearful calls from individuals in the Sikh, Muslim and Arab-American community who were being attacked for wearing turbans or hijabs.

I heard from moms and dads who were afraid to send their kids to school, a fear that I shared for my own child, she said. Jayapal said her resolution, H Res. 629, recognises the climate of hate that Arab, Muslim, Middle Eastern, South Asian and Sikh communities have experienced since September 11 and calls for action to address the event's lasting im-

I hope this hearing becomes one step of many to examine and ultimately dismantle 9/11 era policies that have perpetuated and exacerbated discrimination against these communities, she said.

Positive teacher-student relationships

new study at the University of Missouri has found that posi-A tive teacher-student relationships lead to better teaching along with promoting student's academic in 'Learning and Instruction', emphasize the importance of teachers demonstrating 'soft' skills, or prosocial behaviors, in the classroom, such as showing kindness, compassion and caring for others, compared to solely teaching students the traditional 'hard' skills of reading, writing and arith-

"Students are more likely to learn when they feel cared for and valued by their teacher. One reason for that is students tend to be more motivated to learn and be engaged in the classroom when their teacher likes and cares about them. Positive teacher-student relationships change student behavior, and in this study, we found building those positive relationships actually leads to better teaching, too. It changes teacher behaviour," said Christi Bergin, a research professor at the MU College of Education and Human Development and senior author on the study. Bergin analyzed survey data from the Network for Educator



Effectiveness, a teacher growth and evaluation system developed at the MU College of Education and Human Development that is now used in more than 280 school districts across Missouri.

The survey asked students in grades four through 10 to evaluate their teachers on four teaching practices highly linked with student academic achievement: sparking cognitive engagement, critical thinking and problem solving, helping students follow along from one topic to the next and making curriculum interesting



No parking policy in Zirakpur, mafia is charging arbitrary prices


ZIRAKPUR, MAR 8

"I see Warne as a flag-bearer for carrying the spin aspect of bowling on the front in the world cricketing map. The top three wicket-takers in the world are spinners in Muttiah Muralitharan, Shane Warne and Anil Kumble. He



was an interesting character. So many nice things to say about him. many Australian legends had so I still can't accept the fact that life



is so fickle. We cannot predict what can happen," Ashwin said on his YouTube channel.

"Shane Warne was a colourful character, he redefined bowling, he has taken more than 1000 international wickets, not many can achieve this rare feat. Shane Warne brought spin as an attacking commodity to this cricketing world. Everyone will talk about Warne's delivery to Mike Gatting, but my favourite is Warne's delivery to Andrew Strauss in 2005 Ashes. He almost single-handedly fought for Australia in that series. He was a maestro. He was an extra-ordinary human being and he lived his life to the fullest," he

Warne was one of the most influential cricketers in history. He almost single-handedly reinvented the art of leg-spin when he burst onto the international scene in the early 1990s, and by the time he retired from international cricket in 2007, he had become the first bowler to reach 700 Test wickets.

A central figure in Australia's ICC Cricket World Cup triumph in 1999, when he was player of the match in both the semi-final and the final, Wisden Cricketers' Almanack recognized Shane's achievements by naming him as one of its Five Cricketers of the Twentieth Century.




