Decisive Day: Counting of votes begins at 8 am today

7500 security personnel deputed in Punjab

All preparations have been completed for the counting of votes in five states including Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Uttarakhand, Manipur and Goa. The counting will begin tomorrow.

Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Punjab Dr S Karuna Raju on Wednesday informed that all the necessary arrangements have been made for the counting of votes for the Punjab Assembly Elections 2022.

He said that counting of votes for 117 Assembly constituencies of Punjab would take place on March 10, 2022 from 8 am onwards. He said that 117 counting centres have been set up at 66 locations in the state.

The CEO said the three-tier security measures have been set up with deployment of 45 companies of Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) at all the 117 counting centres. As many as 7500 personnel will be deputed for the counting process in the state, he added.

Dr Raju said that Media Centers



have been set up at each counting center to facilitate the media where the information about the counting rounds would be shared with the journalists. He informed that as many as 3562 identity cards have been issued to journalists for their entry at counting centres and with the permission of Returning Officers, journalists are allowed to go to some specified extent at the counting centres. He said that except from the still and video cameramen deployed for government record, no one else will be allowed to permanently station the video or still

camera at the counting center.

The CEO said that a 100-meter radius around the counting centre area has been declared a "Pedestrian Zone" and no one will be allowed to drive in that zone. He said that to prevent the entry of any unauthorised persons in the counting centres, three-tier cordoning points have been set up outside the counting centres. He said that the first cordoning point had been established at the beginning of a 100 meter radius, where senior magistrates along with the required police force remained to control the

crowd. The second cordoning point would be at the gate of the counting centre, where the State Armed Police Forces have been deployed, while the third cordoning point has been set up at the entrance of the counting hall, which will be manned by the CAPF.

He said that as per the instructions of Election Commission of India (ECI) a maximum of 14 counting tables would be set up at each counting center. In addition, separate tables will be set up for counting of the ETPB issued to service voters and officers/staff engaged in election duty.

Dr Raju said that in view of the vote counting, Section 144 has been imposed in all the districts by the District Election Officers-cum-Deputy Commissioners and gathering of people outside the counting centres is prohibited. He said that as per the instructions of the ECI, only two persons can accompany the winning candidate or his official representative to the counting centre to collect the certificate, while victory procession is also prohibited.

27 pvt institutions booked by CBI in Scholarship scam in HP

The CBI booked as many as 27 educational institutions in multicore scholarship scam as three chargesheets have been filed by the Central Bureau of Investigation against the owners and employees of 11 private institutions, this was stated by Education Minister Govind Singh Thakur laying the information of a query in the House Wednesday. Replying to a query asked by Ram Lal Thakur (Shri Naina Deviji) regarding scholarship scam, Minister said on the prima facie complaint made by the government regarding this scam in the scholarships given to the students of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled

Tribes in private educational institutions. Minister also informed that FIR has been lodged by the Education department under sections 409, 419, 465, 466 and 471 of IPC on Nov 16, 2018, at East Police Station Shimla and after this, this case was transferred by the Himachal Pradesh Government to the Central Bureau of Investigation. The Central Bureau of Investigation is still on; moreover three chargesheets have been made by the CBI against the owners and employees of 11 private institutions in this scam in the special CBI court, Shimla. Minister also informed that out of 27 private institutions 19 belonged to state and eight were situated in the other states.

One killed, 13 injured in mysterious blast in Udhampur

JAMMU: One person was killed and 13 injured in a mysterious blast on a vegetable cart on Wednesday afternoon at Sathia Chowk in Udhampur district of Jammu and Kashmir. Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh, who is also Member Parliament from Kathua-Udhampur Constituency tweeted, "blast explosion around 'Rehri' near Tehsildar office at #Udhampur." "One life lost, 13 injured being moved to hospital. I am in touch with DC Indu Chib on a minute to minute basis. Exact cause and origin of the blast being worked out. Too early to draw any definite conclusion," he tweeted. Earlier, speaking to media, Senior Superintendent of Police, Udhampur, Vinod Kumar said that some injuries have been reported in the mysterious explosion.

Special PMLA court to pronounce order on Anil Deshmukh's bail plea on March 14

MUMBAI: Special Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) court will pronounce its order on a bail plea filed by former Maharashtra Home Minister Anil Deshmukh on March 14 in connection with a money laundering case. Earlier on March 3, 4 and 5, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) questioned Deshmukh in connection with the case. Anil Deshmukh is currently lodged in Arthur Road Jail. The Former Maharashtra Home Minister was arrested by the ED on November 1, last year in connection with the alleged Rs 100-crore extortion and money laundering case.

Inter-state gang involving in weapon smuggling busted

PHAGWARA: The Phagwara Police on Wednesday claimed to have busted an inter-state gang of weapons smugglers and arrested two of its members. Those arrested have been identified as Madhya Pradesh resident Shubham Singh, presently residing in Onkar Nagar Phagwara and Sandeep Kumar of Mehli Gate Nigha Mohalla Phagwara. Confirming this, Kapurthala Senior Superintendent of Police Dharma Harish told UNI that the police have recovered one country made 312 bore pistol and four live cartridges, two .32 bore revolvers and seven live cartridges and two magazines from their possession. The SSP further said that during preliminary interrogation it was revealed that the arrested weapons smuggler Shubham was selling weapons in Punjab at high rates after purchasing them on cheaper rates from Madhya Pradesh. Phagwara CIA Incharge Sikandar Singh said that both accused were nabbed at two different check points near Village Gaunspur and Nangal Majha today.

Cabinet nod to setting up WHO Global Centre for traditional medicine in India

The Union Cabinet has approved the establishment of the WHO Global Centre for Traditional Medicine (WHO GCTM) in Jamnagar, Gujarat.

The WHO GCTM will be established in Jamnagar under the Ministry of AYUSH. This would be the "first and only global outpost" Centre (office) for traditional medicine across the globe.

An official release said the Centre will help position AYUSH systems across the globe, provide leadership on global health matters pertaining to traditional medicine and ensure quality, safety and efficacy, accessibility and rational use of traditional medicine. It will also help develop norms, standards, and guidelines in relevant technical areas, tools and methodologies, for collecting data undertaking analytics, and assess impact. World Health Organization Director General Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus had announced the establishment of WHO GCTM in India on the occasion of fifth Ayurveda Day on November 13, 2020 in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Peace in border areas vital to boost bilateral ties between India, China, says Shringla

Highlighting the engagements with the neighbouring countries in recent years, Foreign Secretary Harsh Shringla on Wednesday said that India has made it clear to China that peace and tranquillity in the border areas are essential elements to boost bilateral relationship between both the countries.

The Foreign Secretary made the remarks while addressing the inaugural session of the Training Module on



India's Neighbourhood at Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration (LBSNAA) in Mussoorie.

"We have made it clear to China

that peace and tranquillity in the border areas are essential for the development of our relationship," Foreign Secretary Shringla said.

The Foreign Secretary underlined that neighbourhood comes first and foremost amongst all of India's foreign policy priorities.

"The Neighbourhood First Policy, at the instance of the Prime Minister, accords the highest priority to our relations with Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Nepal, Maldives, Myanmar, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka," Foreign Secretary Shringla

said, adding further that, "It is these countries, with the exception of Pakistan, that we work most closely with."

Talking about the close cultural and historical ties of India with its neighbours, Shringla said,

"Our ties with these countries are underpinned by a shared history and culture. Policy initiatives taken by India and its neighbours have implications for each other. Ties with the neighbouring countries have direct relevance to our States bordering these countries."

SC extends interim relief to ex-Mumbai Police Commissioner Param Bir Singh

Supreme Court on Wednesday extended the interim protection from arrest granted to former Mumbai Police Commissioner Param Bir Singh in a case related to the allegations of misconduct and corruption.

A bench of Justices SK Kaul and MM Sundresh said that the interim order will continue till March 24.

Earlier the top court had directed the Maharashtra government to completely hold back the ongoing investigation against former Mumbai Police Commissioner Param Bir Singh over the allegations of misconduct and

corruption.

A bench expressed concern over the "messy state of affairs" highlighted by the ongoing legal battle between Singh with the state administration and said that "it is a very unfortunate situation".

The apex court had said that it will take a call on whether the FIRs lodged by Maharashtra police against Singh is to be handed over to CBI or not and asked the state government to keep its hands off from those cases till the issue is decided.

It court in its order stated that the state government has given its assurance to put the matter on hold while the top court is considering the matter.

HP CM lays foundation stone of Rs.49 crore double lane Dhalli tunnel

The State Government was committed to maintain the old glory of Shimla town and Shimla Smart City Project was being executed in town vigorously by initiating various works to benefit the people. This was stated by the Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur while laying foundation stone of about Rs. 49 crore double lane Dhalli Tunnel here today.

Chief Minister said the old tunnel was constructed way back in 1852 and the new 147 meter new double lane tunnel would provide much needed relief to the commuters. He said that Shimla town has grown and expanded manifold and thus

it was important that steps be taken for effective traffic management.

Jai Ram Thakur said that the present State Government was ensuring that all works under Smart City Project were executed at a fast pace. He said that the Project although was started in 2016, but it gained momentum during the tenure of the present State Government. He said that Rs. 70 crore water supply scheme for Shimla town was completed within a record time of year to ensure that water crisis of the town was solved. He said that Rs. 1813 crore new water supply project for the town was being executed, which on completion would solve the water problem of the town for next 100 years.

8,000 Indians stranded in Ukraine evacuated through Romania

A total of 8,000 Indians who were stranded in war-torn Ukraine have been evacuated through Romania, informed the Government of India on Wednesday.

As per the government, the last flight will depart from Bucharest today.

Meanwhile, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on Tuesday informed that it evacuated all Indian students from Ukraine's Sumy.

Under 'Operation Ganga' to rescue Indian citizens from Ukraine's neighbouring countries, about 18,000 Indians have been brought back by special flights so far.



A total of 410 Indians arrived in India on Tuesday by two special civilian flights from Ukraine's neighbouring countries, said the Ministry of Civil Aviation in a media statement.

With this, about 18,000 stranded

Indians in Ukraine have been brought back through special flights which were pressed in services since February 22, 2022.

The number of Indians airlifted by 75 special civilian flights goes up to 15,521. IAF had flown 12

missions to bring back 2,467 passengers, as part of Operation Ganga, and carried over 32-tonne relief material, read the release.

Among the civilian flights, 4,575 passengers have been brought from Bucharest by 21 flights, 1,820 from Suceava by 9 flights, 5,571 from Budapest by 28 flights, 909 passengers by 5 flights from Kosice, 2,404 Indians from Rzeszow by 11 flights, and 242 persons by a flight from Kyiv. This comes against the backdrop of Russian forces launching military operations in Ukraine on February 24, three days after Moscow recognized Ukraine's breakaway regions - Donetsk and Luhansk - as independent entities.

As soon as the information was received, the police station Pratap Nagar reached the spot and the body was pulled out from the water. Police have taken the body in possession and sent it for post-mortem. SHO Pratap Nagar Prithvi Singh said that the case of the missing youth was registered on March 4 last. The body has been identified by the relatives of the deceased.

Alim, 23, a resident of Pratap Nagar, suddenly went missing from his house on March 3. Her missing complaint was lodged by elder brother Salim at the Pratap Nagar police station. The deceased used to work as a cloth hawker till a few months back. But nowadays his elder brother's batwala was working at a mobile shop located in the crusher zone. Ring is going on the mobile of the deceased but no one is attending. On March 3, Bhudkalan on Alim Deodhar Road is seen passing through the cameras installed near the royalty block. Since then the whereabouts of Alim could not be traced. His body was found floating in the water on Wednesday morning. SHO Pratap Nagar Prithvi Singh said that on March 4, the missing report of the deceased was registered at Pratap Nagar police station. He said that the deceased has been identified by his elder brother and father.

In addition, three retail sale drugs license in Sirsa zone and 4 retail sale drugs license in Faridabad zone have been suspended.

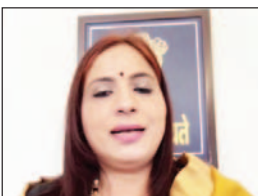
Chief Minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda, MPs will participate.

In addition, they should expedite the work of linking the revenue records with the Aadhaar and immediately remove the surplus land wherever there is illegal occupation. He said that they should also expedite the work of consolidation and cooperate fully in this. He directed all SDMs to make a surprise inspection of the revenue records pertaining to their respective areas and ensure its proper maintenance.

The government of India should never forget that the Sikhs have remained at the forefront in making sacrifices for the freedom of this country and if the culture of the country survives today it is because of the Sikhs", said Advocate Dhami.

SGPC President said that it is unfortunate that in their own country excesses are being committed against the Sikhs, who die for the country. "The governments should refrain from adopting such policies which hurts the religious sentiments of the Sikhs", said Advocate Dhami. Meanwhile, SGPC President also expressed deep concern about growing dis-

Prices of building
material go up

BANGANA: In a single day, there has been a jump of Rs 200 in the price of steel bars. Within two months, the bar has become costlier by Rs 1000. Cement prices have also increased to Rs 425 per bag. One thousand bricks are available for Rs 10,000. Building a house in Himachal Pradesh has become more expensive now. Within a week, the price of bars has increased by Rs 500 per quintal. Last week, bars were selling at Rs 6500 per quintal, now the price has gone up to Rs 7000. In a single day, there has been a jump of Rs 200 in the price of bars. A sand is available for Rs 18,000 and a gravel car for about Rs 17,000 per tipper. In such a situation, the budget of the people building the house has deteriorated. Some traders are citing the Ukraine-Russia war as the reason for the rise in prices. It is being argued that due to the increase in the price of raw materials imported from outside, the bars have become expensive. The businessman told that there is a shortage of goods from the industries.

HP: 440 students rescued from Ukraine, 9 more left

As many as 440 students of Himachal Pradesh who were stranded in war-torn Ukraine and nine others still to evacuate are makeshift to safer places in bordering nations, this was stated by the Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur while making a suo-moto statement in the assembly on Wednesday. On the 12 day of the budget session, Thakur again made a statement in the House stating that 441 students evacuated after the Russia-Ukraine through special flights by the Indian Government. Thakur said eight students who had reached the neighbouring nation decided to not return to India, still staying at these locations. Currently, nine students who are still stranded include seven in Poland and Slovakia and two in Sumy are being evacuated to safer locations on the western borders



of Ukraine, Thakur added. He assured that left out would be brought back to India by special flights. The Chief Minister said

the Indian government maintains regular contact with the Ukraine and Russia Government for safe passage to Indian nationals from

war conflict nation. The Ministry of External Affairs ensured the safe return of all residents of the state from Ukraine, he added.

Police filed 2 chargesheets in fake degree scam: Min

Himachal Pradesh Government informed the House on Wednesday that after completing the investigation two chargesheet have been filed in the court taking action on the fake degree cases in the three private universities of the state as five cases have been registered under various sections of IPC and IT Act.

Replying to a written query raised by the Ram Lal Thakur (Shri Naina Deviji) about fake degree scam Education Minister Govind Thakur said in the context of fake degree scam in the state, three FIR has registered at Police station Dharampur against the Manav Bharati University, Solan under sections 420, 467, 468, 471, 120-B Dharampur district, Solan. Minister informed that under secS

465,467,468,471, 120-B and 201 under IPC, a case was lodged against the APG University, Shimla in the Police Station, Bharadi, in Shimla district and under secs. 465,467,468,471 and 34 of IPC and 66 IT Act against the IEC University Kalujhanda, Barotiwala Solan district at Police Station Barotiwala on the basis of a complaint.

Minsiter said out of the above five cases investigation have been completed in two cases and chargesheet has been filed and matter is under consideration of the court.

Minister also informed that investigation in rest three cases being conducted by the SIT of state police.

No case of recruitment in the government jobs were found on the basis of such fake degrees however investigation is going on in this regard, he added.

ECI banned victory procession after result
outside counting centres: Varinder

Deputy Commissioner-Cum-District Election Officer Varinder Kumar Sharma today said that the Election Commission of India (ECI) has banned all victory processions after the counting, thereby, the candidates participating in the elections must strictly abide by the guidelines issued by the ECI.

Divulging the details, the DC said that the ECI in its directions has prohibited any kind of victory procession on or after counting adding that strict action would be taken against those found violating these guidelines. He also said that any kind of negligence in this regard would be dealt with strictly. The ECI has also restricted the number of persons to accompany the winning candidates while receiving their certificates as only two persons can accompany the candidate or his/her authorized representative during issuing of certificate of election.

The DEO further asked all the 14 Returning Officers to ensure strict compliance of these orders while surveillance teams have also been deputed by the administration to keep a watch over any kind of violation. He said that the counting of votes would start simultaneously at 8 am on March 10 in all the 14 counting centers. The entire counting process would be closely monitored by the 14 counting observers.



Varinder Kumar Sharma also urged the candidates to respect the mandate given by voters tomorrow, even if it is in their favour. He said that for timely dissemination of information, Media Centres have been set up outside all 14 counting centres, while one common media centre has been set up at Bachat Bhawan, District Administrative Complex, Ludhiana.

He said that for mediapersons, entry to these 14 counting centres would be strictly through the Identity cards issued by the ECI. He informed that mediapersons can carry their mobile phones only till the media centre and no mobile phones would be allowed inside counting halls (only photo camera and video camera allowed inside halls). He

further said that as per ECI guidelines, during ongoing counting, closeup shots of EVM's in photographs/video are also not allowed. He also said that nobody (not even the candidate or RO/ARO etc.) except the counting observer shall be allowed to carry a mobile phone inside the counting hall.

He informed that in the counting room, a total of 14 counting tables (7 on each side) would be set up for smooth counting. 2,078 UP students stranded in Ukraine evacuated, says Yogi

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Wednesday said that 2,078 of the total 2,290 students have safely been evacuated from war-torn Ukraine.

Adityanath, while interacting with the students who have been returned from Ukraine, expressed gratitude to Prime Minister Narendra Modi for undertaking the evacuation exercise in the middle Russian military operations in Ukraine.

"From UP, there were a total of 2,290 students studying in Ukraine, out of which 2,078 have safely returned to their respective homes. The rest of the students are also being brought back safely," the chief minister said.

He also said that 74 stranded



students hailed from the Gorakhpur district, and 70 of them have returned from Ukraine.

"As many as 74 students were from Gorakhpur, but 70 have been safely returned back. Arrangements and preparations

are being done for the evacuation of the other four students too. They will return soon," Adityanath stated.

Expressing gratitude to PM Modi, he said, "I would like to thank PM Modi for immediately beginning the evacuation

process after getting information about the situation in Ukraine. Indian students are getting all the possible facilities. This is the result of good relations between India and other countries on account of our Prime Minister."

The Prime Minister had sent four Union Ministers as special envoys to Ukraine's neighbouring countries from where Indian students and citizens were evacuated. Russian forces launched military operations in Ukraine on February 24, three days after Moscow recognized Ukraine's breakaway regions - Donetsk and Luhansk - as independent entities. Several countries including the UK, the US, Canada, and the European Union have condemned Russia's military operations in Ukraine and imposed sanctions on Moscow.

Roasted

Amidst global turmoil, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, the largest international consortium of scientists analysing the impacts of climate change, has delivered a message that is dire but also unsurprising. The world faces multiple, unavoidable climate hazards over the next two decades with a warming of 1.5 degrees Celsius; even temporarily exceeding this threshold would mean additional severe impacts, some of which will be irreversible. The report indicates that the Indian population is among the most vulnerable to severe climate-induced risks and disasters: it has warned that while cities like Calcutta and Mumbai could face flooding due to sea-level rise, places like Ahmedabad are at risk of serious heatwaves.

Alarming, although countries have gone through the motions of preparing strategies to counter climate change, no significant effort has been made till now. The IPCC report says that the latest attempt, the CoP-26 in Glasgow, has set its targets too far into the future to be of use. India's pledge to achieve net zero emissions by 2070 is a case in point. This will not stop the 1.5 degree Celsius mark from being breached and would lead to a rise in heatwave-linked deaths and reduced productivity. The costs of this inertia are staggering: economic damages to Mumbai alone could be up to \$162 billion a year by 2050. That is not all. Climate change would also lead to a significant drop in crop yields — a devastating prospect for a predominantly agrarian economy like India, which already loses 1.5 per cent of its gross domestic product owing to global warming annually at current temperatures.

The fact that 1,700 Indians lost their lives to extreme weather events last year — this is a conservative estimate — should alert policymakers to the challenges ahead. India will have to cushion the most vulnerable from the diverse impacts of climate change and create avenues to offset losses in lives and livelihood. However, climate-sensitive policymaking at the national and local levels can only offer a partial resolution. India and other developing countries have for long argued that developed countries must accept their historical complicity in climate change and compensate in terms of funds and mitigating technology. But this argument has been repeatedly ignored at climate conferences. The IPCC has, once again, called for "equitable adaptation" efforts across the world. But are the warring nations listening?

Death rate linked to extreme temperatures will increase

According to a study by researchers from UCL and the University of Reading, it was found that the death rate linked to extreme temperatures will increase significantly under global warming.

The study was published in the journal, 'Environmental Research Letters'.

Death which is directly linked to climate temperature is called temperature-related mortality. In England and Wales, the hottest days of the year will increase by 42 per cent under a warming scenario of 2°C from pre-industrial levels. This means an increase from present-day levels of around 117 deaths per day, averaged over the 10 hottest days of the year, to around 166 deaths per day. The findings underline the importance of keeping global warming levels below 2°C.

At current global warming levels of around 1.21°C, we see a slight decrease in temperature-related mortality in winter and a minimal net effect in summer, meaning that overall, at this level of warming we see a slight decrease in temperature-related mortality rate.

The team examined the impact of climate change on temperature-related mortality rates in England and Wales, focusing on the risk from the heat in summer and cold in winter. They found that as the global mean temperature increases, temperature-related mortality in summer will increase at a much faster, non-linear rate.

The rate of increase particularly speeds up at 2°C of warming, with a much higher risk appearing beyond 2.5°C. The researchers said that 3°C warmings could lead to a 75 per cent increase in mortality risk during heatwaves.

When plotted on a graph, the relationship between temperature and mortality is roughly u-shaped, meaning that at extremely high temperatures, which the population is not used to, the mortality risk increases sharply for each degree rise of daily mean temperature. The rate in winter will continue to decrease, although this



doesn't take the side effects of extreme weather - such as storms - into account.

Lead author Dr Katty Huang (UCL Civil, Environmental & Geomatic Engineering) said, "The increase in mortality risk under current warming levels is mainly notable during heat waves, but with further warming, we would see risk rise on average summer days in addition to escalating risks during heatwaves. What this

means is that we shouldn't expect past trends of impact per degree of warming to apply in the future. One degree of global warming beyond 2°C would have a much more severe impact on health in England and Wales than one-degree warming from pre-industrial levels, with implications for how the NHS can cope."

In England and Wales, the temperature is associated with around 9 per cent of total

population mortality, meaning that 9 per cent of all deaths during 2021 could be associated with temperature. Most of those deaths are related to the side effects of cold weather. In order to isolate the effects of global warming on mortality risk, the researchers looked at the potential impact for the current population, without taking into account future changes such as average age and health conditions.

Eating prunes may help protect against bone loss in older women



Prunes are good for your gut. However, according to a new study led by Penn State, prunes may be good for bone health. The study was published in the journal 'Advances in Nutrition'. The researchers found that prunes can help prevent or delay loss in postmenopausal women, possibly due to their ability to reduce inflammation and oxidative stress, both of which contribute to bone loss.

"In postmenopausal women, lower levels of estrogens can trigger a rise of oxidative stress and inflammation, increasing the risk of weakening bones that may lead to fractures," said Connie Rogers, associate professor of nutritional sciences and physiology. "Incorporating prunes into the diet

may help protect bones by slowing or reversing this process," he added.

Osteoporosis is a condition in which bones become weak or brittle that can happen to anyone at any age, but according to the researchers, it is most common among women over the age of 50. The condition affects more than 200 million women worldwide, causing almost nine million fractures each year. While medications exist to treat osteoporosis, the researchers said there is a growing interest for ways to treat the condition with nutrition. "Fruits and vegetables that are rich in bioactive compounds such as phenolic acid, flavonoids and carotenoids can potentially help protect against osteoporosis," said Mary Jane De Souza, professor of kinesiology.

Unemployment, inflation biggest concerns in Pakistan

Unemployment and inflation are the biggest concerns for Pakistanis, a new survey revealed on Tuesday after more than three years of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) government's rein.

Unemployment and inflation have been the top issues of concern for the Pakistanis consistently since August 2019, according to the Ipsos survey, a market research company which conducted the survey between February 24 and March 1. Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan had come to power on the promise of creating 10 million jobs and providing 5 million homes but no significant progress was made to accomplish his promises, The Express Tribune newspaper reported on Tuesday. Recently Pakistan PM announced a relief package to offset the impact of inflation but questions remain over its viability due to the lack of financing. The government has put together the relief package despite the Finance Minister's initial opposition to it. Unemployment stood



second on the list of top five concerns, although the ratio was slightly lower than a year ago. About half of the respondents said that they either themselves lost jobs or people known to them were laid off in the past year, The Express Tribune reported citing the study.

During the study, 1,048 people were interviewed across the country in which as many as 80 per cent of respondents believed that they are heading in the wrong direction and also the situation had worsened by 7 per cent in the last year. The survey also stated that 41 per cent of respondents felt that the Pakistani economy is weak and the ratio has in-

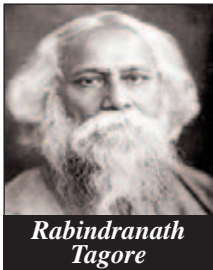
creased by 14 per cent points in the last year. Meanwhile, merely 8 per cent of the population rated the current economy as "strong".

The findings come at a time when the government is already struggling with several challenges and a no-confidence motion move by the opposition. Pakistan's economic conditions have deteriorated in the past few months. In January, the government slapped Pakistan Rupee 360 billion worth of additional taxes in addition to the commitment with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to increase electricity prices by PKR 2.80 per unit.

Physical activity can help in protecting brain as you age

New research from the University of Georgia has shown that physical activity can help protect your cognitive abilities as you age and it doesn't have to be an intense exercise to make an impact.

The findings of the study were published in the journal 'Sport Sciences for Health'.

"This finding isn't saying, 'If you're older, you need to go out there and start running marathons,'" said Marissa Gogniat, lead author of the study and a recent doctoral graduate in psychology from the Franklin College of Arts and Sciences.

She added, "This is saying if you get more steps, if you're moving around your environment a little bit more, that can be helpful to your brain health and keep you more independent as you age." Exercise improves brain function The study followed 51 older



adults, tracking their physical activity and fitness measurements. The participants performed tests specifically designed to measure cognitive function-

ing and underwent MRIs to assess brain functioning. They also wore a device that measured the intensity of the wearer's physical activity, number of

steps taken and distance covered. The researchers assessed fitness through a six-minute walking test, during which participants walked as quickly as they

could to cover the most distance possible within the time limit.

"We've always been told it's good to exercise, but I think this is some evidence that exercise can actually change your brain," Gogniat said. "And that impacts the way you're able to function in your daily life." Brain networks improve with physical activity The brain is made up of a bunch of distinct networks. Those networks are in constant communication, sending information to each other.

But different parts of the brain are active at different times. The network that is active when the body is at rest, for example, flips off when a person starts trying to complete a task. At that time, another network kicks on.

While one of these networks is active, the other should be shut off. If it's not, that's a sign that a person's brain isn't functioning as well as it should be.

These networks are the key to being able to perform basic tasks in daily life, such as remembering important information and exhibiting self-control. But as people age, these tasks often become more difficult.

This study was the first to examine how these networks interact with physical activity and fitness to impact how the brain functions. "This paper is exciting because it gives us some evidence that when people whose brain networks aren't functioning optimally engage in physical activity, we see improvement in their executive function and their independence," Gogniat said. "We're not saying you need to radically change your life. She continued, "Maybe just take the stairs on the way to work. Stand up and walk around a little bit more. That's where you get the most bang for your buck, not crazy, high-intensity exercise."

- 1. Assists in posture improvement: Rooting your feet firmly on the floor encourages you to put more weight on the balls of your feet, bringing

It aids in the relief of back stiffness and neck tension: The lengthening of the lumbar spine and the entire backside of the body helps to relieve lower back pressure caused by sitting or a sedentary lifestyle. When folding forward in Uttanasana, you can also release tension in the shoulders and neck more easily. 3. Enhances hip flexibility: A deep forward fold stretches and lengthens the hip flexors, restoring balance and strength in the hips and pelvic region. How to Do Uttanasana by standing with your hands on your hips, exhale to hinge from the hips and bend forward, think about creating as much length as possible from your hips to your head. Release your fingertips towards the ground or your blocks. Root down into the four corners of your feet. On an inhale, feel your torso lengthen and on an exhale feel your chest reach towards your toes. Stay in Uttanasana for 15 to 20 seconds or up to a minute if you can. To exit the posture, return your hands to your hips and slowly lift up, keeping the length in the front and back of your torso. Beginner's Tip Make sure to always stretch your body beforehand. Don't put too much pressure on yourself. Don't perform Uttanasana when you're in a state of illness, pain, sickness, mental disturbance, etc., or immediately after meals.

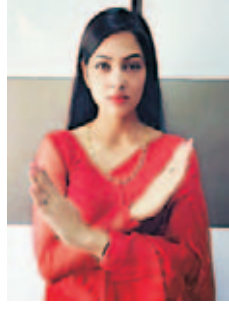

Kaur said three Superintendents of Police (SPs), nine Deputy Superintendents of Police (DSPs) and 33 inspectors along with entire force would supervise the entire security cover at the ground and they would keep tight vigil on the counting operations. SSP told that those coming to the counting centre such as candidates, agents and media persons would have to park their vehicles in the identified parking yards and police would not allow any kind of crowding. She added that unauthorised vehicles and individuals would be kept away from these heavily guarded centres. She said that no one including candidates, agents or officials would be allowed to carry mobile or electronic gadgets to the counting centres.

Former Miss Ukraine recalls harrowing escape experience

Model and former Miss Ukraine Veronika Didusenko recently recalled her harrowing experience of escaping the country with her 7-year-old son and warned that frightened mothers and children huddling in shelters stand to be most impacted as the Russian military operation in Ukraine intensifies. According to The Hollywood Reporter, Didusenko, who was crowned as Miss Ukraine in 2018, talked about this during a Los Angeles press conference held alongside women's rights attorney Gloria Allred on Tuesday. She said, "Some cities fighting back are on the verge of a humanitarian catastrophe, but they're not giving up." Talking about her escape experience with her son from Ukraine on February 24, the day Russian military forces first marched into her country and headed towards Kyiv, where she had lived, Didusenko recalled, "In between raids, we, families, tried to get out of the city in the middle of a giant traffic jam. Directly above my head, dozens of helicopters with were bombing a

nearby airfield." The beauty pageant winner revealed that had to travel through four other countries to reach the U.S and noted that millions of other Ukrainian mothers and children have been left behind in her native land to face the crisis. "Right now, millions of Ukrainian children and their mothers are trembling at every sound they hear in subway stations and shelters, and even more heartbreaking are those forced to give birth in such conditions," Didusenko said. Though the former Miss Ukraine already had a visa to travel to the US, she told that "it was heartbreaking" because she had to leave her son with a friend in Switzerland before she could travel on to Los Angeles as her application at the U.S. embassy in Luxembourg to secure an additional visa for her son was denied. As per The Hollywood Reporter, during the press conference, Didusenko had urged the US and other Western powers to help her homeland against the Russian military operation. She continued, "Men in Ukraine need this help the most, as those are under fire from the Russian bombing are begging our allies to close the skies over Ukraine. Unfortunately, those pleas are falling on deaf ears in Washington and in Europe."

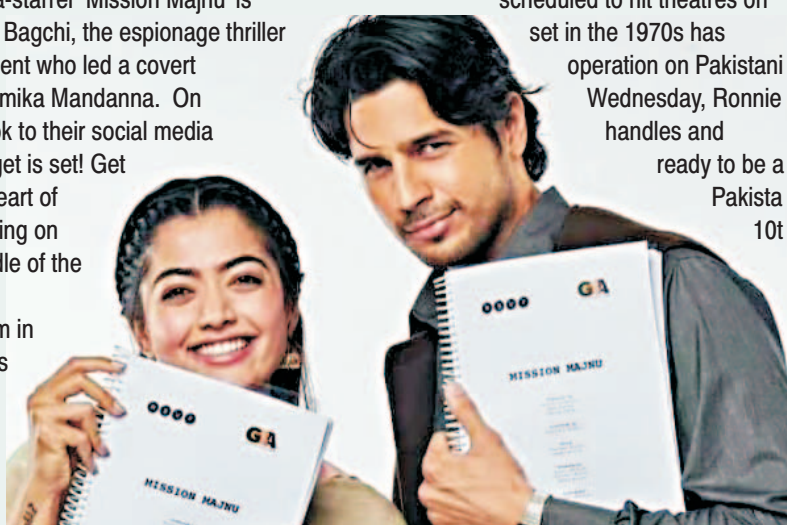
