



# Precaution dose of COVID-19 vaccine for all adults from Sunday

The precaution dose will now be available to the 18 plus population group from April 10 at private COVID-19 vaccination centres, said the Union Health Ministry on Friday.

All those who are more than 18 years of age and have completed nine months after the administration of the second dose, would be eligible for the precaution dose, the ministry said in a statement.

This facility would be available in all private vaccination centres.

India started administering precaution dose to frontline workers, healthcare workers and those above the age of 60 years with comorbidities on January 10 this year. Later, on



March 16, the vaccination drive for precaution dose was extended to all adults above the age of 60 years.

The Health Ministry informed that so far, about 96 per cent of all 15+ population in the country have received at least one COVID-19 vaccine dose while about 83 per cent of 15+ population has received both doses of the vaccine.

More than 2.4 crore precaution doses have also been administered to

healthcare workers, frontline workers and those above 60 years of age.

A total of 45 per cent of 12 to 14 years age group have also received the first dose. They are being administered Corbevax vaccine, which is manufactured by Biological E. The ongoing

free vaccination programme through government vaccination centres for the first and second dose to the eligible population as well as precaution dose to healthcare workers, frontline workers and those aged above 60 years would continue and would be accelerated.

## 26/11 mastermind Hafiz Saeed gets 31 years Jail by Pak court

26/11 mastermind Hafiz Saeed was today sentenced to jail for 31 years by an anti-terror court in Pakistan. Hafiz Saeed, the founder of the terror group Lashkar e Taiba and the chief of Jamaat ud Dawa, was sentenced in two cases. The court also ordered all his assets be seized and fined the UN-designated terrorist \$3,40,000. Reports suggest a mosque and madrasa that Hafiz Saeed allegedly built will be taken over. Hafiz Saeed, 70, has been sentenced in multiple cases of terror financing in the past. In 2020, he



was sentenced to 15 years in jail. He has spent years in and out of detention in varying forms in Pakistan, sometimes under house arrest.

But he roams freely across the country while addressing incendiary speeches targeting India with impunity. He was arrested in 2019, just before Pakistan PM Imran Khan's visit to the US. At the time, US President Donald Trump had tweeted that Saeed had been detained after a 10-year search.

Saeed was travelling to Gujranwala from Lahore to appear before an anti-terrorism court when he was arrested by the Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) of Punjab.

## Haryana completes drone flying target in 6286 Lal Dora villages

With the completion of the drone flying target in 6286 Lal Dora villages, Haryana is set to become the first 'Lal Dora' free state in the country.

In a review meeting chaired by Chief Secretary, Sh. Sanjeev Kaushal regarding SVAMITVA and Haryana Large Scale Mapping Project (HaLSMP) held here today with the Deputy Commissioners through video conferencing it was informed that under SVAMITVA, till date more than 19 lakh property cards have been made. Besides this, the 30 days notice period for raising claims and objections invited under section 26 of Haryana Panchayat Raj Act is also completing by April, 20.

Tasking the Deputy Commissioners to step up and double their efforts, Chief Secretary, Sh. Sanjeev Kaushal directed that every Deputy Commissioner should ensure 50 percent distribution of property cards in the next 10 days.

"Maximum generation of properties should be ensured for verified undisputed properties," directed the Chief Secretary.

During the meeting, it was informed that Drone flying, Map-1 and Map-2 (including attribute collection) have been completed in all 6286 target Lal Dora villages and the work of Map-3 would be completed soon.

Besides this, the notification of claims and objections procedure, under section 26 of the Haryana Panchayat Raj Act has been notified for all target villages.

Till April 6, claims and objections of around 5737 villages have been addressed and the rest are under process. The figure of final maps that have been submitted with the Survey of India(SoI) is 5038.

## Get Punjab rid of gangsters, CM Mann tells task force

He also authorized the AGTF to utilize the services of State Special Operation Cells (SSOCs) at Mohali, Amritsar and Fazilka in addition to the services offered by the 361 police stations across the state.

Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana boon for helpless

**KAITHAL:** Deputy Commissioner Pradeep Dahiya informed that under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (Ayushman), the diseases of helpless families are provided free of cost. Under this scheme free health insurance up to Rs 5 lakh per family is provided per year. 1 lakh 88 thousand 241 cards have been made in the district. So far 24 thousand 200 persons have availed health services under the scheme, in lieu of which 30 crore 10 lakh 1 thousand 20 rupees have been paid to the respective hospitals. Deputy Commissioner Pradeep Dahiya said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had implemented in November 2018 to treat the diseases of helpless families free of cost. Modi has saved them from falling into the quagmire of debt by starting the Ayushman Yojana. Under this scheme, it was selected for the Socio-Economic Caste Census held in 2011. If any new member arrives in these families through marriage or birth after 2011, then he is also the beneficiary of this scheme, for which he can join the scheme by giving birth certificate and marriage certificate. For this, this card can be made free of cost in empaneled private hospitals and government hospitals. He said that the unique feature of this scheme is portability i.e. patients can get their treatment free of cost in any state empaneled private or government hospitals, irrespective of the state. Under this scheme, 17 hospitals of district Kaithal are on the panel, out of which 7 are government and 10 private hospitals. The beneficiary can go to these hospitals by showing his Ayushman Bharat card and get treatment on approved packages. More than 1400 packages have been made by the government under this scheme, which also include packages for treatment related to serious diseases. Not only is the facility of free treatment being provided by the government, but full attention is also being paid to the quality of the treatment.

## MLA performs Bhoomipujan of drinking water tubewell



## Illegal sale of imported cigarettes on rise in Zirakpur

Millions of counterfeit cigarettes are being supplied daily in many markets. According to the rules, there should be a legal warning on the cigarette pack.

There are no legal warnings on packs of illegal cigarettes sold in the market. Nor does it rate print. This is also causing huge loss of revenue to the government. This smoking is harmful to health. Illegal foreign cigarettes are readily available at betel and cigarette shops outside every major market, hotel, club and pub in the city. When I visited some

shops and saw cigarettes of these counterfeit brands, I found different rates everywhere and when asked, the shopkeepers themselves admitted that the brand was completely banned. Despite this, cigarettes of these counterfeit brands are being supplied in the city at the behest of the authorities.

Counterfeit foreign cigarettes are being sold indiscriminately in the city. These include Pine, Black, Yes Light, Mond, Cigars and other foreign brand cigarettes. The government should not pay percentage tax. For this, foreign counterfeit cigarettes are being sold in the city markets.

The consignment of foreign counterfeit cigarettes in the city is coming mainly from Delhi.

These are foreign cigarette brands. She comes from North Korea, China, the United States, Singapore and Dubai. According to cigarette suppliers, these foreign counterfeit cigarettes reach India by sea.

giving them instruction from abroad. They were giving extortions calls from abroad Harbir Singh and Amritpal @ Satta were collecting extortion money on behalf of their handlers based abroad. Regarding this a case FIR No. 103 dated 07.04.2022 u/s 384.34 IPC and 25 Sub Section 7.2 Ammunition Act Police Station City Kharar was registered against his other accomplices and inputs were received against this gang. The operation was carried out on the basis of reliable information. Raids were conducted on their hideouts from where Harbir Singh was arrested and Amritpal @ Satta managed to escape. Two .30 caliber Chinese pistols, 03 magazines, 50 live cartridges along with four 9mm pistol magazines. SSP Mohali further briefed about the ar-

rested Harbir Singh that this person is also a Punjabi lyricist and singer by profession and he is close to the deceased gangster Jaipal Singh Bhullar and Jaspreet Singh Jassi who were neutralized by Kolkata STF on the inputs provided by Punjab Police in June 2021. Harbir Singh was absconding from the day two ASIs of Jagroan police were killed by Jaipal Singh and Jaspreet @ Jassi. Harbir disclosed during the initial investigation that Jaipal had bought large sum of property in the name of Harbir Singh and his relatives with the cash which he has accumulated by committing major robberies like Banur cash van of 2017 (1.33 crore), gold loot 30 Kg at IIFL, Company of Ludhiana in 2020 and other various other robberies.

# Section 144 in Ajmer, admn bans use of religious flags, loudspeakers

After the Karauli communal riots, the Ajmer district administration imposed section 144 and banned the use of flags with religious symbols on public properties and loudspeakers in religious and public places in the entire urban and rural area.

Section 144 has been imposed as a precautionary measure in view of the upcoming festival. The Ajmer District Collector Ansh Deep in an order dated April 7, said, "During religious purposes to be held in Ajmer district the individual or group of person attempt to disturb the communal harmony by affecting the law and order situation in the Ajmer district by raising the flags with religious symbols on public property such as Government Buildings, Government Undertakings, Board Corporation building, public community building/Rest houses, public parks, circle electric and telephone poles, etc. constructed at intersections/tirahas or property



of another person without any valid sanction. This may lead to apprehensions of breach of public peace and adversely disrupting law and order and social harmony. In such a situation, preventive action is necessary immediately to maintain social harmony and public peace."

It further says, "Therefore, in view of the above circumstances, I, Ansh Deep, District Magistrate, Ajmer, in the exercise of the powers conferred under Section 144 of the Code of

Criminal Procedure, 1973, impose prohibitory orders prohibiting the installation of flags with religious insignia on public property in the entire urban and rural area of Ajmer district without any competent sanction. I direct all citizens to comply with this order and not to ignore it. If a person violates the above prohibitory orders, he may be prosecuted under Section 188 of the Indian Penal Code."

He further said in his order the order will be effective in the entire urban and rural area of the

Punched back

Post-war decolonization was followed by a spate of local, bilateral or regional trade arrangements in the world economy; besides, the Soviet Union and other east European socialist countries were a looming presence. Since a defining characteristic of an 'international economic order' in capitalist conditions must be the hegemony of metropolitan capital over it, there was hardly any such 'order' in this period. In this setting, sanctions imposed on any country by the United States of America and other metropolitan countries could hardly bite; hence, pressure by these powers was exerted on recalcitrant countries primarily through CIA-sponsored coups, like those against Jacobo Arbenz of Guatemala or Mohammad Mosaddegh of Iran, but not through sanctions.

Neoliberalism changed this. With the collapse of the Soviet Union, metropolitan capitalist countries succeeded in establishing a global neoliberal order under their hegemony. As there was relatively free flow of goods and services and of capital, including finance, across country borders and insistence on a 'unified exchange rate' in each country (one price per market, including the foreign exchange market), the local and regional trade arrangements dwindled in significance; and sanctions came into vogue as they now could bite. They were used generally against relatively small countries like Cuba, Iran or Venezuela. But after the Russian invasion of Ukraine, they are being employed against a large country like Russia; and when this happens, the chances of sanctions hurting the country that imposes them, rather than the one targeted, become stronger. Sanctions against Russia are threatening today the very international economic order that made sanctions possible in the first place.

Sanctions against Russia have been somewhat farcical from the very beginning: since the European Union is heavily dependent on Russian oil and gas, which meet as much as 40 per cent of its needs, these commodities were kept out of their ambit. Sanctions against a country that exempt its most important export items for the convenience of some major powers lack credibility; and it turns out that after the imposition of sanctions, European purchase of Russian oil has increased further, which is not surprising since speculation has pushed up the spot prices of oil, making Russian crude \$25 to \$30 cheaper per barrel. Indeed, even India's daily purchase of Russian crude has quadrupled over the last several days. Joe Biden ironically has started talking to Iran and Venezuela, countries targeted by US sanctions all these years, to increase their oil output so that the world does not miss Russian oil.

Imran Khan rattles already  
fragile democracy of Pakistan

Prime Minister Imran Khan has done significant damage to the already fragile democracy in Pakistan by overturning the Constitution for his petty selfish political ambitions.

Valentin Popescu, writing in Policy Research Group POREG said that Khan rattled Pakistan's 'democratic' credentials by staging a 'civilian coup' in a desperate one-up man-ship game after he was reduced to a minority in Parliament just when the combined Opposition tabled a no-confidence motion against his government.

Toeing the line of Khan, the deputy speaker Qasim Khan Suri invalidated the opposition's 'no-confidence' motion on Sunday, April 3, saying that "loyalty to the State is the basic duty of every citizen under Article 5 of the Constitution. By implication and amplification, Suri echoed Imran's charge that the Opposition leaders were traitors.

In what was no more than a clever attempt to cover their tracks, Khan and his ministers invoked the time-tested conspiracy theories and made the 'American Shaitan (devil)' appear as the villain, said Popescu.

However, the gamble did not get them any brownie points though; a Gallup Pakistan Survey (April 3-4) has found 64 per cent of Pakistanis reject the Imran narrative, and see the "foreign involvement" card was to avoid the voting on the no-trust motion.

The Opposition alliance had enough numbers to oust Khan-led Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaf (PTI) government from power; their ranks



swelled with a dozen PTI lawmakers crossing over to their side.

Khan also failed to keep his coalition partners in good humour; the result: two allies, one Sindh province-based and the other Balochistan based deserted him and made his defeat on the floor of Parliament a certainty. As a result, Khan opted for a move--what the Pakistan Supreme Court termed as "unconstitutional" and "unparliamentary"--in order to fail the opposition's plan to form the new government, reported POREG.

While taking the high moral ground and dangling the conspiracy card, Imran Khan has acted opportunistically to save himself, but that has come at the cost of Pakistan's fledgling democracy. His high-voltage rhetorical flourish did not lead him anywhere what with lies and half-

truths peddled as gospel truth and name-calling, he has indulged in. The 'victim' card he displayed ended up denting his image further. For the military establishment, the current political 'circus' in the country is good news. It suits them to remain a 'mute' spectator in order to generate goodwill among the people, who are clearly fed up with the country's incompetent and corrupt civilian leadership.

Major outage forces Puerto Rico to shutter schools, offices

More than a million customers in Puerto Rico remained without electricity on Thursday after a fire at a main power plant caused the biggest blackout so far this year across the US territory, forcing it to cancel classes and shutter government offices.

The blackout also left nearly 170,000 customers without water, forced authorities to close some main roads and snarled traffic elsewhere across the island of 3.2 million people, where the roar of generators and smell of diesel filled the air. We urge you to stay home if possible, said Puerto Rico Justice Secretary Domingo Emanuel, who is serving as interim governor since Gov. Pedro Pierluisi is on an official trip in Spain.

Those who could not afford generators and have medical conditions such as diabetes, which depends on refrigerated insulin, worried about how much longer they'd be without power. Owners of shuttered businesses also wondered when they could reopen.

Long lines formed at some gas stations as people sought fuel for generators. Others tried to charge their cell-phones at businesses in scenes reminiscent of the aftermath of Hurricane



Maria, which struck as a Category 4 storm in 2017. Frustration and anger grew throughout the day as officials warned the outage could stretch into Friday. No one can say exactly when power would be fully restored, said Kevin Acevedo, a vice president of Luma, the company that took over transmission and distribution from Puerto Rico's Electric Power Authority last year. We have to be realistic. The system is complex, delicate.

As of late Thursday afternoon, crews had restored power to some 500,000 customers out of nearly 1.5 million. Officials in at least one city distributed food to hundreds of elderly people as well as ice to those whose medication must be kept cool.

Congress votes to suspend Russia trade status, enact oil ban

Congress voted overwhelmingly Thursday to suspend normal trade relations with Russia and ban the importation of its oil, ratcheting up the US response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine amid reports of atrocities. House action came after the Senate approved the two bills with 100-0 votes. The measures now go to President Joe Biden to be signed into law. Lawmakers overwhelmingly support the substance of the two bills, but they had languished for weeks in the Senate as lawmakers worked to hammer out the final details.

Biden has already taken executive action to ban Russian oil, liquefied natural gas and coal to the United States. The legislation puts the effort into law.

The bill to end normal trade relations with Russia paves the way for Biden to enact higher tariffs on various imports, such as certain steel and aluminum products, further weakening the Russian economy under Presi-



dent Vladimir Putin. It also ensures Belarus receives less favourable tariff treatment.

Rep Richard Neal, D-Mass, said it was important to take action because innocent Ukrainians were being slaughtered even as lawmakers were meeting. We have no time to waste and must immediately further punish Vladimir Putin, Neal said. What we have witnessed in Bucha over the course of the last 72 hours alone more than justifies the positions we have taken in the past and to be more assertive and aggressive going into the future. Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer, D-NY, announced late Wednesday a breakthrough in negotiations to bring the bills up for votes be-


fore lawmakers travel back to their home states and congressional districts for two weeks. Some lawmakers said that the failure to take final action on the bills was sending the wrong message to allies and to Russia. Now, I wish this could have happened sooner, but after weeks of talks with the other side, it's important that we have found a path forward, Schumer said. Schumer described the images coming out of Ukraine as the war drags as pure, pure evil. Hundreds of civilians murdered in cold blood.

No nation whose military is committing war crimes deserves free trade status with the United States, Schumer said. While there was overwhelming support for suspending preferential trade treatment for Russia, Sen. Rand Paul, R-Ky., blocked speedy consideration of the bill over concerns that its language on who can be sanctioned for human rights abuses is too broad, leaving it ripe for abuse.

Shanghai seeks medical care amidst worst COVID-19 outbreak

China's financial hub, Shanghai, has been facing the worst COVID-19 outbreak and has been desperately seeking medical care and basic supplies like food.

Shanghai authorities have imposed draconian lockdown measures since March that have locked 25 million residents in their homes with Chinese military and national health care workers. And parents are forcibly separated from their young children, who were infected with COVID-19. These circumstances are making people furious against the government, CNN reported.

"We are not killed by Covid, but by the Covid control measures," one popular comment on the highly censored Chinese social media platform Weibo was quoted as saying by CNN. On Wednesday, the country filed close to 20,000 new Covid cases, crossing the peak of new Covid cases which was



recorded in Wuhan in 2020, at the onset of the pandemic. According to the National Health Commission, by the end of March,

the virus had spread to 29 of China's 31 provinces. On April 1, Wu Zunyou, chief epidemiologist at the Chinese Center for

Disease Control and Prevention, said that China would "continue to focus on dynamic zero-Covid policy," according to CNN citing Global Times.

He further said that loosening the restrictions and opening borders could create many problems such as (a squeeze on) medical resources and rising fatalities.

Meanwhile, on Monday, Sun Chunlan, Vice Premier People's Republic of China, said that the city needed "a more determined attitude, more powerful actions, and more efficient coordination" to achieve zero-Covid, according to CNN.

On April 3, the Chinese government announced the deployment of thousands of military personnel to Shanghai to assist in the mandatory testing of all 25 million residents for the virus that causes Covid-19. On April 4, Shanghai authorities said the city would indefinitely remain under lockdown -

meaning that residents are not allowed to leave their homes, as it reviews the results of the mass Covid testing. Numerous netizens took to Chinese social media to share stories of their or their loved ones being denied access to medical care for non-Covid related illnesses either due to hospitals being closed because of Covid-restrictions, or the lack of health care workers because they were quarantined or got diverted to administer Covid tests. So far, Shanghai authorities defended the policy, stating that anyone found positive - regardless of age - must be isolated from non-infected people and that a parent can only be quarantined with their child if both are infected. China's much-publicised 'zero-covid' strategy that the government credited for bringing the country out of the pandemic till recently is falling apart as the rapidly mounting cases are again forcing mass lockdowns like those seen in 2020.

A visit to the gynaecologist can be daunting for many women. Women may feel uncomfortable revealing certain information about themselves to a total stranger. The prospect of an internal examination may also make one uneasy. Dr Aruna Muralidhar, Senior Consultant Obstetrician and Gynaecologist, Fortis La Femme Hospital, Bengaluru, is of the opinion that this initial anxiety can be overcome by choosing a gynaecologist carefully. "The gynaecologist must ideally be broad-minded, approachable, non-judgemental and, above all, empathetic to the woman's needs. During the consultation, if the woman reciprocates with honest openness without having any preconceived notions and inhibitions, the consultation is likely to be more effective, holistic, and fruitful," she says. gynaecologist All the same, there are some important things you must definitely tell your gynaecologist when you see them next. Dr Muralidhar lists them below. Current Symptoms A complete timeline of the existing problem with the approximate duration is useful for a gynaecologist to understand the problem as a whole. If all the associated issues can be elaborated, it will add to the diagnostic accuracy. Talking about similar concerns in the past and the treatment taken during that episode will help the doctor understand what worked and what didn't for your body. Menstrual History Mention your menstrual cycle length, period duration, heaviness of the flow, presence of pain as accurately


as possible. One of the important symptoms to be mentioned is the presence of pain and bleeding during and after sex. Do not withhold information about personal hygiene, presence of abnormal vaginal discharge, etc. Marital And Sexual History Talk openly about your married life, any previous relationships, divorce, or separation. Although this may be considered irrelevant by some, it helps in certain situations like assessing the risk of sexually



transmitted infections, mental health risks, etc. Couples, even if married for a long time, sometimes do not reveal sexual problems. Being candid helps in solving problems early. Urinary Incontinence And Bowel Habits This is another taboo topic for many women. Leakage of urine with coughing, sneezing, or exercise must be mentioned to the gynaecologist.

Also, a feeling of pressure or a lump in the vagina may indicate prolapse and must be mentioned. Any recent changes in bowel habits or constipation, etc. must also be mentioned. Mental Health Issues Mental health is as important as physical health. Any symptoms or prolonged sadness affecting one's life, inability to focus or enjoy things can be signs of clinical depression. Constant worry, feeling of helplessness or sleep disturbances, and a recent increase in stress levels can also cause or worsen gynaecological problems. Physical Health Mention previous health problems, medications taken, surgeries, etc. without fail as they can affect the current treatment. Any drug allergies and the severity of the reaction must be mentioned without any vagaries for improving the safety of prescription. Health problems that run in families must be recollected accurately so that screening for the same can be done at regular intervals. Let the gynaecologist know if this is your first, second or nth visit for that particular health issue so that they can tailor the consultation accordingly while also avoiding duplication of records, tests, and confusing opinions. "Finally, expectations from the consultation must be clearly defined at the outset to avoid disappointment for the patient and dissatisfaction for the doctor. It always helps in agreeing upon a date for the follow-up to review symptoms and the effectiveness of the treatment. Honest and open feedback directly or online will help the gynaecologist improve their practice," concludes Dr Muralidhar.

## Power tariff and subsidies to continue as such in FY 2022-23 for all categories of consumers of Punjab

Power tariff and subsidies as existing on 31/03/2022 to all consumers are being continued as such in the current year from 01/04/2022 onwards. This was informed by a spokesman of punjab state power corporation limited in a press note issued here today. Spokesman informed that the tariff order for FY 2022-23 has been issued by Hon'ble Punjab State Regulatory Commission vide order dt. 31.03.2022. There is no increase in tariff of any of the Consumer Categories for FY 2022-23. Spokesman further informed that the subsidies which are already being provided to various consumer categories including reduction of tariff by Rs 3 per unit for domestic consumers having sanctioned load up to 7 KW, are also continued. Electricity bills are being issued as above. Electricity consumers need not be misinformed by hearsay. As per present policy of government of Punjab , the consumers of PSPCL are being provided following Subsidies/Concessions. Overall Subsidized rate of Rs.4.99/kWh with GoP Subsidy to SP Category Industrial Consumers. Subsidized variable rate of Rs.5.00/kVAh with GoP subsidy and 50% Fixed Charges to MS Category Industrial Consumers. Subsidized variable rate of Rs.5.00/kVAh with GoP subsidy and Fixed Charges to LS Category Industrial Consumers.

## Court declared Ex MLA Simarjit Singh Bains as proclaimed offender

Rohit urges MI teammates to show desperation and hunger after 3 losses

PUNE: Not one to blame individuals for the team's poor show, Mumbai Indians skipper Rohit Sharma has called on his teammates to show little "desperation and hunger" to cross the finishing line in the upcoming games after suffering their third successive loss in the IPL here. Five-time champions MI has endured a disappointing start to the season, losing their first three matches against Delhi Capitals, Rajasthan Royals and Kolkata Knight Riders. All three games that we've played, we've done some really good things. It's just that those little moments, and that indication, you know an individual has to understand, in that period of time when the game is happening," he said.
