



India logs 12,847 Covid cases in 24 hours

NEW DELHI: India recorded 12,847 Covid-19 cases in the last 24 hours, taking the total number of active cases to 63,063 in the country, the Health Ministry said on Friday. As many as 14 fresh fatalities were recorded in the last 24 hours, taking the total deaths blamed on the pandemic in the country to 5,24,817. The active cases now comprise 0.15 percent of the total infections while the national recovery is 98.64 per cent.

Dera Sacha Sauda chief granted one-month parole

CHANDIGARH: Dera Sacha Sauda chief Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh who is serving a jail term after being convicted in rape and murder cases has been granted parole for a month on Friday. Singh has been incarcerated, since 2017, in Haryana's Sunaria jail where he is serving 20 year-term for raping two women disciples at his ashram's headquarters in Sirsa. Earlier in February, the Dera chief was granted three weeks' furlough. While parole means the release of a prisoner either temporarily for a special purpose or completely before the expiry of a sentence.

'Agnipath' stir intensifies across states, buses- trains torched

One killed in Secunderabad, Rly stations vandalised

Massive protests across the nation against Union government's Agnipath Recruitment Scheme entered day three on Friday.

Trains and buses were seen set ablaze in Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, vandalism at Hyderabad railway station, protests in Rajasthan even BJP-ruled state Haryana was not spared from the brunt.

At Secunderabad railway station in Hyderabad purported videos of reckless vandals destroying properties and shouting slogans were uploaded on social media. One person was killed and 10 others critically injured after the police opened fire to control an angry mob after they went berserk at Secunderabad Railway station in protest against the Union Government's new Agnipath scheme.

Several parts of Bihar and Uttar Pradesh witnessed protests over the new military recruitment policy. The stir spread through BJP-ruled Haryana and Madhya Pradesh.

Large mob set trains on fire in Uttar Pradesh's Ballia and Bihar's Lakhisarai, where two express trains - Jammu Tawi and Vikramshila were vandalised and put to flames on Friday morning.

The Agnipath protests entered the third consecutive day after it was announced on Tuesday. The government has defended the scheme, calling it "transformative" and even went a step further making changes to the upper age limit in the scheme on Thursday.

Bihar bore the maximum brunt of



Section 144 imposed in Gurugram

GURUGRAM: Keeping in mind the opposition of Agnipath, the scheme of contractual recruitment in the army, the Gurugram district administration of Haryana announced the imposition of section 144 in the entire district. District Collector and Deputy Commissioner Nishant Kumar Yadav issued orders to this effect here today, under which the gathering of four or more people has been banned anywhere.

The orders have been implemented with immediate effect and will remain in force till further orders. Violators will be punished under section 188 of the Indian Penal Code. The Agnipath scheme is being opposed since yesterday. Due to the protest of the youth, Delhi Jaipur was jammed throughout the day in Gurugram yesterday. There are reports of protests even today from different parts of Haryana including Gurugram and there are reports of police lathi charge or aerial firing from place to place.

the violence with trains set ablaze on Thursday and Friday. Window panes of buses were smashed and a ruling BJP MLA went under attack during stone pelting by mob on Thursday.

Friday morning agitated youth

squatted on railway tracks in Lakhisarai and other places, blocked roads at many places across the state.

Reports said house of Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Renu Devi came under attack in Bettiah in West

Champaran district. Renu Devi is currently in Patna.

A BJP office was also attacked in Lakhisarai district.

In the Begusarai district, students stormed a railway station, and indulged in arson and stone pelting.

In Uttar Pradesh, a mob reached a railway station in Ballia on Friday morning, set a train coach on fire, damaged railway station property before the police reached the spot and dispersed them.

Another protesters' group carrying sticks got into a scuffle with the police on the streets outside the railway station in the eastern Uttar Pradesh district. Videos of the protest on social media showed men armed with lathis breaking shops and railway station benches.

"Police has stopped the mob. We will act against the men," Ballia District Magistrate Saumya Agarwal told the media. The protest spread to Rajasthan, BJP-ruled Madhya Pradesh and Haryana, where phone internet and SMS was snapped for 24 hours in Palwal district following stone-throwing and violence by protesters. On Friday, Faridabad saw similar measures implemented by the Manohar Lal Khattar government. The Centre unveiled Agnipath on Tuesday. Terming it a "transformative" scheme for recruitment of soldiers in the Army, Navy and the Air Force, basically for a four-year short-term contractual basis. Aspirants immediately launched the protests as they were unhappy with the changes, particularly the length of service, lack of pension provisions for those released early.

In this context, when municipal representative Satnam Ahuja was talked to, he said that some people are engaged on this work and the water will be drained out by boring at many places.

Internet services suspended in Ballabgarh, Mahendragarh

Haryana Government, has issued temporary suspension of mobile internet services (2G/3G/4G/CDMA/GPRS), all SMS services (only including bulk SMS and excluding banking and mobile recharge), and all dongle services etc. provided on mobile networks except the voice calls in the territorial jurisdiction of Sub Division Ballabgarh of district Faridabad and Mahendragarh and will be in force for next 24 hours with immediate effect that is from June 16, 2022 (16:00 hrs) for next 24 hours.

The said suspension has been ordered in the exercise of powers under Section 5 of the Indian Telegraph Act, 1885 to be read along with Rule (2) of Temporary Suspension of Telecom Services (Public Emergency or Public Safety) Rules, 2017.

Sharing more details in this regard an official spokesperson said that there is a likelihood of causing ten-



sion, annoyance, obstruction or injury to persons, danger to human life and proper, disturbance of public peace and tranquillity in Sub Division Ballabgarh of district Faridabad of the state of Haryana by the protesters, agitators, miscreants and antisocial elements, in view of the potential law and order situation aroused in adjoining district Palwal on account of new Army Recruitment Policy.

The spokesperson said that the

The villagers also constructed six rooms here at their level so as to help local children to get an education. Later on the school was acquired by the State Government on 27 October 1972. On 1 April 1997, the government gave this school the status of middle school and in April 2015, the status of high school. The six rooms built in the past are now in a dilapidated condition and that led the Attri family to come to the aid of the children. Local people had also told this thing to the concerned local authorities without any help from them.

Ultimately, the villagers approached the Attri family and told them about the shortage of rooms in the school. Atri immediately gave Rs 23.49 lakh for the construction of rooms in the school. Apart from this, he talked about giving more support to the headmaster and the school management committee. He also asked for the construction of two toilets. School headmaster Kamaraj Sethi and school staff, local panchayat representatives have thanked Pritam Singh Attri and Amit Attri for their help. Local people are hopeful that the new campus of the school will come up shortly with the help provided by the Attri family of the area.

Neuro-Modulation team at Fortis Mohali treats patients
of Parkinson's disease through deep brain stimulation

TheNeuro-Modulation Team at Fortis Mohali comprising Dr Anupam Jindal, Additional Director, Neurosurgery; Dr Nishit Sawal; and Dr Vivek Gupta, Additional Director, Interventional Neuroradiology; discussed the Patient's case thoroughly and subsequently performed Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS) surgery. Deep Brain Stimulationinvolved implanting electrodes inside the brain to produce electrical impulses, which helps treat affected cells and chemicals in the brain. The surgery considerably improves motor complications in patients with Parkinson's disease. Following good rehabilitation at Fortis Mohali,there was a



marked improvement in the Patient's health and symptoms related to the disease began to subside. Slowly his life got back on track, and today he is leading a normal life. Stating that DBS was a boon for patients suffering from Parkinson's Disease, Dr Nishit Sawal, said, "Deep Brain Stimulation can considerably improve motor complications in patients with Parkinson's disease. Symptoms such as trembling of hands, arms, head, and difficulty in walking subside post-surgery." The second Patient, a 65-year-old man from Haryana, had been suffering from Parkinson's Disease for the past eight years. His illness was in an advanced stage and he literally had to drag his feet to walk. The Patient underwent DBS surgery following whichhis health improved and symptoms related to Parkinson's disease subsided.

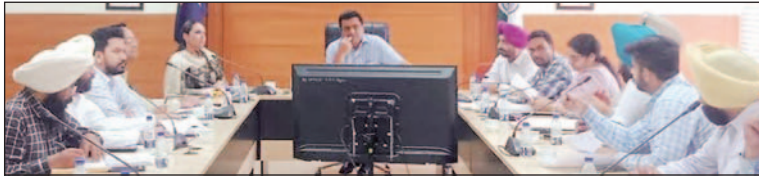

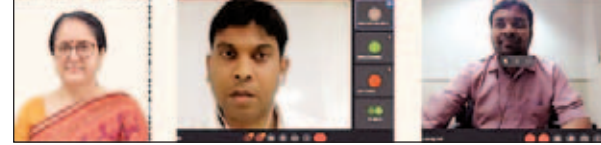

Man versus wild

Earlier this month, a small hamlet called Bothli in the Tadoba Andhari Tiger Reserve in Maharashtra's Chandrapur district pressed for the legal recognition of its community forest rights. Wildlife conservationists promptly filed a public interest litigation claiming that the people living in the core protected forest need to be moved out since the area is a critical wildlife habitat.

It is likely that the residents of Bothli — in spite of their community forest rights — would be thrown out, as have other communities from protected forests all over the country. It isn't the first or the last village to be uprooted from a protected forest. The list of such villages is growing.

As this column goes to print, five villages with some 175 mostly tribal families in the Satpura Tiger Reserve in Madhya Pradesh's Narmadapuram (erstwhile Hoshangabad) district are being evicted as part of the policy of clearing the core areas off human settlements, notwithstanding the fact that the Forest Rights Act speaks of undoing such historic wrong by recognising the rights of people over their own forests. They are evicted without any assurance of basic rehabilitation and resettlement entitlements. It isn't a coincidence that most of those getting evicted are tribal people.

In the last two decades, forest and biodiversity conservation in the country has meant ruthless and unjust evictions of the people and communities living in their midst. Ironically, these are the same people who conserved the forests over many millennia as an integral part of that ecosystem. It's not just an Indian problem; biodiversity conservation sans people is a global phenomenon that has intensified in the process of globalisation, with the argument being that forests and people cannot co-exist.

India, according to data from the ministry of environment and forests, has some 990 protected areas, including 106 National Parks, 565 Wildlife Sanctuaries, 100 Conservation Reserves and 219 Community Reserves, covering a total of 1,73,306.83 square kilometres of geographical area or 5.27 per cent of the total land area in the country. Nearly a million people live in and around these forests.

While the FRA specifically lays down rules and asks for CFR to be granted to the traditional forest dwellers even in the critical wildlife habitats, the forest departments and wildlife lobbies are pushing for the removal of people from such areas, denying communities a scope to air their views.

War isn't funny but humour helps Ukrainians cope with trauma

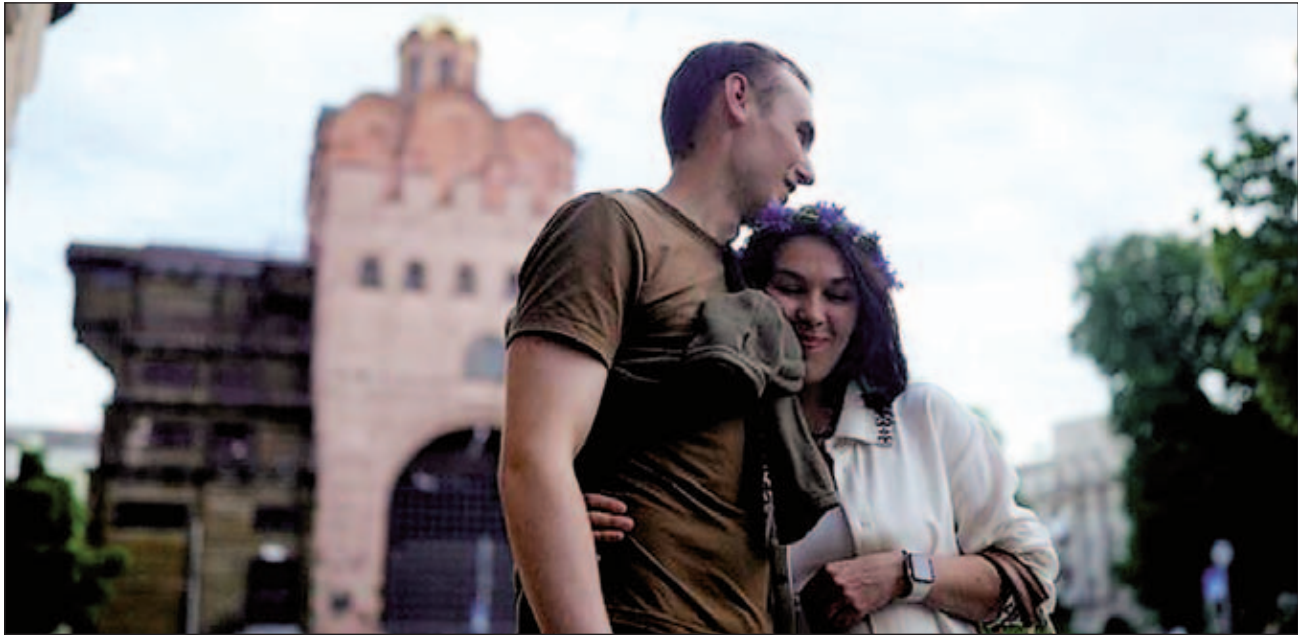
Because he'll shortly be deployed as a soldier on the battlefields of Ukraine, Serhiy Lipko and Anastasia Zukhvala chose to marry first, like a growing number of couples being torn asunder by war with Russia.

Like others, their nuptials were rushed and smaller than they would have been during peacetime, with just a few dozen close friends and family. She wore a simple crown of blue flowers in her hair. And then, because laughter can be medicinal and because Lipko was building a career as a comic before the defense of his country called, they headed to a stand-up comedy club in Ukraine's capital, Kyiv.

There, with his new wife watching from the wings, he took the stage in olive-green fatigues and soon had the crowd in stitches with close-to-the-bone humour about army and married life. He joked that military training with NATO instructors had been a great opportunity for him to practice his English, and how nervous he'd been about handling expensive military gear, for fear of breaking it.

The war isn't remotely funny, but Ukrainians are learning to laugh about the awfulness of it all. Not necessarily because they want to, but because they have to to stay sane in the brutality that has killed tens of thousands of people, is upending Ukraine, millions of lives and the world order as it rages on front lines in the east and south of the country.

Russian President Vladimir Putin and his troops, especially dead and wounded ones, are favorite targets of dark Ukrainian wartime humour. But there are red lines: Ukrainian dead aren't laughed about and the grimest battles, among them the brutal siege of Mariupol and the port city's Azovstal steelworks, are far too raw for jokes. The same is true of atrocities in Bucha and elsewhere. Tragedies cannot and will never be the object of humour," said Zukhvala, who also works as a stand-up



comic, as she and Lipko hugged with the tenderness of newlyweds after his show and scooped up armfuls of bouquets, wondering aloud how they'd find space for them at home. This is an absolutely crazy time, beyond ordinary experience, she said. Our life now is made of paradoxes, and it can even be funny.

Ukraine's most famous comedian is Volodymyr Zelenskyy, now the country's president, elected in 2019. In the TV comedy series Servant of the People," the former stand-up comic and actor played a lovable high school teacher who accidentally becomes president before he later actually became one for real. But Zelenskyy hasn't had much cause for comedy since the Feb. 24 invasion thrust him into the role of wartime leader. His daily video addresses to the nation are often grim and forceful.

But while he works to rally international support and soldiers fight with tanks, artillery and tons of Western-supplied armaments, Ukrainians away from the front are using jokes and humor as weapons against war-time anxiety and moroseness, against Russia and to feel as one, both laughing and crying together in their sorrow and anger. Yuliia Shytko, 29, said she felt in far higher spirits after chortling loudly with the rest of the crowd through Lipko and other comedians' routines in the basement comedy club, the vast majority of their jokes revolving around war-related themes. Laughing and stuff, that's how you cope," Shytko said. Lipko and Zelenskyy crossed paths in comedy before war utterly altered their trajectories. The future president, then still an entertainer, was a juror in 2016 on the TV game show, Make a come-

dian laugh. Lipko was a contestant. He wore camouflage fatigues because he was in the midst of military service and rattled off jokes about his army experiences. He made Zelenskyy laugh by quipping that he'd buy a PlayStation if he won the top prize which he eventually did. They spoke in Russian then; they both stick to Ukrainian in public now.

Lipko is still riffing off army life, even as he prepares within days to leave behind his bride to fight. The army gave him a day off to tie the knot, a quick in-and-out of a marriage office where their comedian friends ruffled the registrar's feathers by joking around. We laughed a lot, said stand-up comic Anton Tymoshenko, who attended and also performed later that night at the club. Lipko's nickname in the army is the comedian."

Brutal beating of women in China sparks outrage on social media

Social media exploded with comments from users decrying the brutal beating of women in China after graphic footage of an attack in a restaurant went viral.

Vivian Wang, writing in The New York Times (NYT) said that the graphic footage of the attack in a restaurant fuelled online debate that showed both the growing awareness of women's rights and how divisive feminism still remains.

The incident took place in the city of Tangshan on Friday when a Chinese man approached a table of three women. He put his hand on the back of one, who shook him off. In response, he slapped her -- then, with several other men, savagely beat her and the other women, hitting them with chairs, kicking them and dragging them outdoors.

It left two women hospitalized. Women flooded social media with their outrage and terror at the threat of sexual violence that looms over everyday life.

Social media exploded with comments from users decrying both the assailants and broader sexist attitudes that they said enabled them, reported NYT. They fumed that the authorities could track down suspected coronavirus patients immediately but seemed unwilling to deploy similar resources to protect women.



Many noted that the women had fulfilled all the usual tips about how to avoid harassment -- they had gone out in a group and were in a well-lit public space -- and were still unsafe.

"Just what kind of precautions does this world want me to take for them to be enough?" wrote the author of one widely shared article on WeChat. One state media outlet, The Paper, examined legal records of similar cases of men assaulting women after being rebuffed. It found several instances of men being sentenced to one or two weeks of detention. In some cases, the men spent less time in detention than the women spent in the hospital. But even as many pored over the role of gender in the attack, other voices dismissed its importance. Some social media users asked why the women were out so late. The state-owned Beijing Youth Daily, in an early report, said the man had "chatted" with the women, and then "both sides began to push and shove."

Pakistan: Zero-balance accounts of govt entities to be closed

Pakistan's federal government has directed all commercial banks to immediately close the accounts of public sector entities having zero balances, Dawn reported on Friday.

The directive, which was communicated through the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP), followed a related May 18 memorandum in which the government ordered all ministries, divisions, the governments of four provinces, Azad Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan and their public sector enterprises to immediately surrender their working capital and surplus funds kept for investment into a single treasury account of the federation. All these entities, including the registrars of the Supreme Court and high courts, the Senate, the National Assembly and the military accounts, were directed last month by the finance ministry that all notifications since July 2003 enabling such entities to keep surplus funds and working capital in their own accounts had been "withdrawn with immediate effect".

"Further, the approval accorded to any public sector entities with respect to maintaining working balance is also hereby withdrawn," the May 18 notification said.

In the latest notification to banks issued on June 11, the finance ministry desired that the process started in 2020 following the passage of the Public Finance Management Act 2019 had also put in place a procedure in consultation with the SBP and the international lending agencies.

With a view to consolidating the cash balances of the federal government, "the finance division has collected information of all the accounts maintained by federal government entities through the SBP. After



analysis of this information, it has been established that thousands of the zero balance accounts (ZBA) in scheduled commercial banks are inoperative and zero balance accounts exist". The finance minister said that Article 78 of the Constitution required that all revenues, loan receipts and all other moneys received by or on behalf of the government of Pakistan were either part of the federal consolidated fund (FCF) or the public account of the federation (PAF). The cash balances of both FCF and PAF are maintained in central account No.1 (non-food) at the SBP. Under the Public Finance Management (PFM) Act of 2019, the operations of the FCF and PAF vest in the finance division. The law also required under Section 23(2) that no authority shall transfer public moneys for investment or deposit from a government account to another bank account without federal government approval.

Subsequently, the government also notified Cash Management and Treasury Single Account Policy 2019-29 and Cash Management and Treasury Single Account Rules 2020 under which "no government office shall open, operate or maintain any bank account for any purpose except in accordance with the PFM Act".

Treatment for peanut allergy safest when started early for infants

UBC researchers demonstrated in 2019 that pre-schoolers can safely overcome peanut allergies with a treatment called oral immunotherapy. Now they have evidence that the earlier pre-schoolers start this treatment, the better.

This real-world study, recently published in the Journal of Allergy and Clinical Immunology: In Practice, focused on infants younger than 12 months old and reveals that not only is oral immunotherapy effective against peanut allergies, it's even safer for this age group than it is for toddlers and older pre-schoolers. "This treatment is affordable, very safe and highly effective, particularly if we can get the treatment going before the infant is 12



months old," said Dr. Edmond Chan, the study's senior author who is also a clinical professor and head of allergy and immunology in UBC's department of pediatrics at the BC Children's Hos-

pital Research Institute. The study looked specifically at outcomes for a group of 69 infants among a larger study group of 452 children aged five and under.

Oral immunotherapy is a treatment protocol in which a patient consumes small amounts of the allergenic food--in this case, peanut flour--with the dose gradually increased to a determined maximum amount. The aim is to desensitize the child until they can have a full serving of peanut protein without triggering a dangerous reaction. To sustain their immunity, the child must continue to eat peanut products on a regular

basis long term. For this study, children visited a pediatric allergist in a community or hospital clinic approximately every two weeks to receive their peanut dose. Parents gave the same daily dose at home between clinic visits. After eight to 11 clinic visits, the children had built up to a "maintenance dose" of 300 milligrams of peanut protein, or the equivalent of about 1.3 grams of peanuts.

Clinicians recorded any symptoms or reactions, and advised parents how to manage reactions at home.

Forty-two infants completed the build-up period plus one year of maintenance dosing. At the end of it, none of them had more than a mild reaction to a 4,000-gram dose of peanut protein,

compared to 7.7 per cent of the children aged one to five who completed the protocol.

Seven infants dropped out along the way. Four experienced reactions beyond mild, but none required epinephrine injections. Another 20 did not have their peanut tolerance assessed at the end, either by choice or because of long wait lists.

Even before beginning the treatment, infants were shown to be at less risk than toddlers and pre-schoolers. In initial testing, only 33.9 per cent of infants had a reaction beyond mild, in comparison to 53.7 per cent of one-to-five year olds. "Despite infants showing the best safety, we were still very satisfied with the safety of this treat-

ment for older pre-schoolers. The risk of a severe reaction is much lower than it is for school-age kids," Dr. Chan noted. "Many of the interventions we use in medicine, such as medications or surgical procedures, carry a small amount of risk that is outweighed by the benefit. If this treatment is performed by well-trained allergists and clinicians then I'm really comfortable with the risk. It's actually very safe."

As for effectiveness, the treatment worked equally well for both age groups. After a year of one peanut per day, approximately 80 per cent of the children had developed a tolerance for 4,000 milligrams of peanut protein in one sitting--the equivalent of roughly 15 whole peanuts.

Though the term may be new and improved these are foods that have been around for centuries and are often found in all our kitchens. The term 'super food' is generally used to refer to foods that offer you the maximum benefits with minimal calories. Quite a few of these superfoods are those that are had on an almost daily basis, and no Indian

dish is complete without. Here are some commonly found Indian superfoods
Amaranth Seeds
Amaranth seeds are a pseudo-cereal that is gluten-free, rich in fibre and has a significant quantity of protein in it. It is packed with vitamins, minerals, phytochemicals, and has a lot of anti-



inflammatory properties; which makes it beneficial in reducing blood pressure levels, promoting smooth digestion, reducing inflammation, etc. Preparations: Ladoos (with puffed rice and jaggery); boiled (as a substitute to rice); the flour

can be used to make chapatis/chillas; Raab (a broth of amaranth flour, ghee, jaggery, and dry ginger powder), etc.
Drumstick Leaves
These are small oval-shaped leaves that are a powerhouse of vitamins and minerals, especially the b-complex vitamins, and minerals such as iron, zinc, magnesium, calcium, etc.
Preparations: Sabjis and curries (either plain or in combination with other vegetables); added to dal or sambhar; made into a powder, and added to any juice; added to batters, and doughs of foods like chapatis, dosas/chillas etc.
Amla
Amla or the Indian gooseberry is a rich storehouse of vitamin C (100g of amla has the vitamin C content of 20 oranges). These are small green and greenish-yellow berries that have been around for 100s of years. As a rich source of vitamin C, when consumed with anything that is rich in iron, it aids in the absorption of iron by the body. Apart from being rich in vitamin C, they are also a good source of fibre and have been linked to better diabetes control, better digestion, healthier skin, hair, eyes, etc. Preparations: It can be consumed as juice, jams, pickles, chutneys, etc. Jamun

The Pragati Maidan Integrated Transit Corridor project has been built at a cost of more than Rs. 920 crore, entirely funded by the Central Government. It is aimed to provide hassle free and smooth access to the new world class exhibition and convention centre being developed at Pragati Maidan, thereby facilitating easy participation of exhibitors and visitors in the programmes being held at Pragati Maidan. The impact of the project, however, will be much beyond Pragati Maidan as it will ensure hassle-free vehicular movement, helping save time and cost of commuters in a big way. It is

part of the overarching vision of the government to ensure ease of living for people through transforming urban infrastructure. The main Tunnel connects Ring Road with India Gate via Purana Qila Road passing through Pragati Maidan. The six lane divided Tunnel has multiple purposes, including access to the huge basement parking of Pragati Maidan. A unique component of the Tunnel is that two cross tunnels below the main tunnel road have been constructed in order to facilitate movement of the traffic from either side of the parking lot. It is equipped with the latest global standard facilities for smooth movement of traffic such as smart fire management, modern ventilation and automated drainage, digitally controlled CCTV and Public Announcement system inside the Tunnel. This long-awaited Tunnel will serve as an alternative route to Bhairon Marg, which is running much beyond its carriage capacity and is expected to take more than half of the traffic load of Bhairon Marg.

Jalwaha hails start of Volvo bus service from Nawanshahr

For this, the Municipality Corporation will organize competitions among the best designers as well as school children and the winners will be awarded with cash prizes. Sh Gupta said that with a view to realize his vision of clean and green Panchkula, a one-day cleanliness drive would be organized with the participation of NGOs, RWAs, Market Association and government officers. He said that a Green Task Force would also be constituted which would work toward planting maximum samplings and also ensure their upkeep. The Speaker said that with a view to

make Panchkula drugs free, it is necessary to identify and break the supply chain.

He said patients who are undergoing treatment in de-addiction centers in district Panchkula can provide vital information in this regard. He also sought the list of all de-addiction centers, patients undergoing treatment and those who were cured, at the earliest. ACP Sh Rajkumar informed that the seven concerns started by Vidhan Sabha Speaker have yielded positive results. He informed that in 2021, about 759 grams of opium were seized by the police whereas in 2022, more than 9 kg of opium has been recovered so far.

PGI explores application of Artificial Intelligence/ Machine Learning Technologies for cardiac surgical applications

CHANDIGARH, JUNE 17

PGI Chandigarh, one of the premier medical institutions in India, is researching the application of Artificial Intelligence/ Machine Learning algorithms to predict critical events such as Mortality, Length of ICU stay etc. Dr G.D. Puri and his team, led by Dr Rajarajan Ganesan, are making inroads into the world of AI/ML in medicine with the support of the cardiothoracic vascular surgery team under Dr Shyam Kumar Singh Thingnam and Dr Nitin Auluck's section at IIT, Ropar. An interdisciplinary team under their guidance is developing a predictive platform over the existing Anaesthesia Information and Management System (AIMS) to aid the decision-making process. This multidisciplinary team includes Mr Sushant Konar, a PhD scholar and an Indian Council of Medical Research-sponsored research fellow under Dr Puri. He is an engineer by training and is currently working on advanced data science applications in medicine under his mentor's guidance. AIMS is already deployed and functional in the four cardiothoracic vascular surgery operation theatres at the Advanced Cardiac Centre. The new technology would enable better utilization of resources and predict adverse outcome probabilities promoting enhanced cardiac care postoperatively, i.e., post-surgery. A copyright application is recently filed for a software program capable of automatically extracting relevant data from patient reports which are pivotal to capturing vital patient data.



Repair of Lala Lajpat Rai's ancestral house govt's duty: MLA Manuke

JAGRAON (SUKH NAHAR): Repair and renovation has been initiated in the ancestral home of freedom fighter Lala Lajpat Rai in Jagraon under the supervision of constituency MLA Saravjit Kaur Manuke and in the presence of development officer. A UNM review monsoon preparedness

UNA: Regarding the preparations for the south-west monsoon, a review meeting was held today under the chairmanship of SDM Una Dr. Nidhi Patel. She instructed various departments in the meeting to establish proper coordination with all the departments in view of the monsoon season so as to minimize the loss in case of any emergency. The SDM said that the Department of Health and Family Welfare should keep adequate stock of medicines required for the treatment of water borne diseases in all medical institutions. She also directed to keep adequate storage of medicines used for snake bites. "Be fully prepared to deal with diseases like malaria and dengue," she said while instructing the health department to ensure sampling of freshwater fountains being installed by people at various places in summer season. Dr. Nidhi Patel instructed the officials of Jal Shakti Department to ensure cleaning of water sources and water storage tanks and chlorination of all drinking water sources. She also ordered checking of the drinking water samples from time to time to detect water borne viruses. She instructed the Municipal Council Una, Mehatpur-Basdehra and Santoshgarh to keep the necessary equipment ready for proper drainage of rain water along with cleaning of drains and nallahs. He directed the officials of Revenue Department, Public Works Department, Power Board, Fire Department and Education Department to expedite the necessary procedures for the preparation of rains in the area under their charge so that immediate relief could be provided to the affected area in case of need.

The ground water will be improved significantly after the completion of above work.

Ban register unwanted record on Day 1 of first Test against WI

ST JOHNS : Bangladesh on Thursday registered the record of getting six ducks in a single innings. Bangladesh achieved this unwanted record during the ongoing second Test against West Indies, here at Sir Vivian Richards Stadium where they got bundled out at 103. Lasting less than a session and a half in North Sound, Bangladesh narrowly avoided a fourth double-figure score in the current World Test Championship cycle, unable to deal with the West Indies' fast-bowling artillery. With six ducks in their innings, Bangladesh now have three of the seven Test innings with the dreaded half-dozen of noughts, crumbling to 103 all out. Jayden Seales and Alzarri Joseph scalped three wickets each while Kemar Roach, and Kyle Mayers took two wickets each. At Stumps on Day 1, West Indies' score read at 95/2, with Kraigg Brathwaite (42*) and Nkrumah Bonner (12*) standing unbeaten at the crease. Bangladesh skipper was the only saving grace as his knock of 51 runs off 67 balls, took them across the 100-run mark. West Indies will be resuming Day 2 at 95/2, just eight runs shy of Bangladesh's first innings total.

Formula 1: FIA to introduce measures to control porpoising

PARIS: In the wake of the Azerbaijan Grand Prix, the FIA have announced plans to control the phenomenon of porpoising that has become a theme in the 2022 season, issuing a Technical Directive to the teams to give guidance about the measures they intend to take to tackle the issue. A return to ground effect cars for 2022 has seen a revival in F1 of the porpoising phenomenon, where cars lose and then regain downforce in quick succession, setting up a cycle of the car moving up and down. Meanwhile, with ground effect working best when cars are run as low to the ground as possible, some teams have also struggled with additional issues like bottoming out and bouncing. Following consultation with its doctors, the FIA said they had felt compelled to react because, according to the governing body itself, "in a sport where the competitors are routinely driving at speeds in excess of 300km/h, it is considered that all of a driver's concentration needs to be focused on that task, and that excessive fatigue or pain experienced by a driver could have significant consequences should it result in a loss of concentration".

Can Espargaro and Bagnaia close the gap? After scoring 45 points in the most recent double-header, at Mugello and Catalunya, 2021 World Champion Fabio Quartararo (Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP™) has firmly established himself as the man to beat in 2022. Aleix Espargaro (Aprilia Racing) remains his nearest rival but has seen the gap between them grow to 22 points, while last year's World Championship runner-up Francesco Bagnaia (Ducati Lenovo Team) is 66 points behind the Frenchman after he was taken out at the first corner of the Catalan Grand Prix. Do they think they can make up ground on Quartararo at the Sachsenring and on the following weekend at the TT Circuit Assen?

A. Espargaro: "I have the feeling these two races are very, very important. Now I have more than 30 points to third in the Championship but Fabio has 22 more than me. I hope in these two races I can achieve a good amount of points to go into the summer break. Anyway, the first 10 races have been like a dream for me. I will try to fight for the podium here and in Assen to have a good summer break, but I believe I deserve a good holiday anyway!"

Bagnaia: "If last year, the mission was to win the Championship, to recover 70 points in five races, now this year I have 11. The ambition is high, I know what the potential is like.

FIFA 2026 WC host cities announced for USA, Mexico and Canada

A significant milestone on the road to the FIFA World Cup 2026 was reached on Friday as the 16 host cities that are due to stage matches at the first edition of football's showpiece to feature 48 teams were unveiled by FIFA.

The highly anticipated announcement was made on a TV show from New York and broadcast live to host countries Canada, Mexico and the USA, as well as the whole world via FIFA+.

FIFA's flagship event is heading back to the Americas for the first time since 1994. It will be the first time the World Cup will be shared by three different countries.

The 16 host cities are: United States: Atlanta, Boston, Dallas, Houston, Kansas



City, Los Angeles, Miami, New York/New Jersey, Philadelphia, San Francisco Bay Area and Seattle.

Mexico: Guadalajara, Mexico City, and Monterrey. Canada: Toronto and Vancouver.

"We congratulate the 16 FIFA World Cup Host Cities on their outstanding commitment and passion. Today is a historic day - for everyone in those cities and states, for FIFA, for Canada, the USA and Mexico who will put on the greatest show on Earth. We look

forward to working together with them to deliver what will be an unprecedented FIFA World Cup and a game-changer as we strive to make football truly global," said FIFA President Gianni Infantino in a statement.

"We were delighted by the unparalleled competitiveness of this selection process. We are extremely grateful not only to the 16 cities that have been selected, but also to the other six - with whom we look forward to continuing to engage and explore additional opportunities to welcome fans and participating teams. This has always been a FIFA World Cup of three countries, and that undoubtedly will have a tremendous impact on the whole region and the wider football community," added FIFA Vice President and Concacaf President Victor Montagliani.

Liston Colaco wins FPAI Indian player of the year award

There was plenty of recognition for the young Indian players in the Indian Super League (ISL) at the Football Players' Association of India (FPAI) awards as ATK Mohun Bagan's Liston Colaco was awarded the Indian player of the year award while Hyderabad FC's Akash Mishra was adjudged to be the Young player of the year.

There was more joy in the Hyderabad FC camp as Bartholomew Ogeche was named the Foreign Player of the year while Manuel Marquez scooped the coach's award.

In the women's section, Anju Tamang won the Indian Women's Player of the year award. The young player award was handed to Manisha Kalyan.

Colaco becomes the second ATK Mohun Bagan player to win the big prize in a row after goalkeeper Arindam Bhattacharya had received the honour for his exploits in green and maroon in ISL 2020-21 season. The 23-year-old who was the top Indian goalscorer in ISL 2021-22 with eight goals in the youngest recipient of the award.

Meanwhile, Mishra who had a solid season for champions Hyderabad FC also showed his quality for India in the



AFC Asian Cup qualifiers and looks set to be in the squad for the finals given his performances. Mishra along with fellow full-back Asish Rai add another dimension to Hyderabad FC's play under Marquez.

The Spanish head coach transformed the Hyderabad-based outfit after he joined ahead of ISL 2020-21 season taking the club who had finished bottom a year earlier to the title in the ISL 2021-22. Ogeche who is the all-time leading goalscorer won the golden boot in ISL 2021-22 and proved to be the difference between Hyderabad FC and the rest. He scored almost everytime Hyderabad FC needed him to, making him one of the most crucial players in their squad.

FIFA U-17 Women's WC: Team India to play Italy and Netherlands

NEW DELHI: After camping in Jamshedpur, Jharkhand, the India U-17 Women's National Team will travel to Italy and Norway, from June 20 till July 8, 2022, to participate in two tournaments as part of its preparation for the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup that is set to be held in India later this year.

The young tigresses will play two tournaments during their exposure tour - the 6th Torneo Female Football Tournament in Italy from June 22, 2022 - June 26, 2022, and Open Nordic Tournament WU16 in Norway from July 1, 2022 - July 7, 2022. This will be the first time, the team is participating in the NORDIC Tournament.

India will face Italy on June 22, 2022, at the Gradisca d'Isonzo stadium in the 6th Torneo Female Football Tournament. Apart from India, Chile, Italy and Mexico will also be participating in the tournament.

On the other hand, in the Open Nordic Tournament WU16 in Norway, eight

teams will compete against each other- Netherlands, India, Norway, Iceland, Denmark, Faroe Islands, Finland and Sweden. India will face The Netherlands on July 1, 2022, at the Strommen Arena. Head coach Thomas Dennerby who took charge of the team earlier this year has selected 23 players who will be playing the international game.
