SC allows floor test in Maha Assembly today

NEW DELHI, JUNE 29


The Supreme Court has ordered for floor test in Maharashtra on Thursday. After a long hearing of more than three hours the Apex Court gave a verdict of floor test in Maharashtra assembly. Earlier Senior advocate AM Singhvi, appearing on behalf of Prabhakar mentioned the plea before a vacation bench headed by Justice Surya Kant and said, "I have 4 or 5 points. Will be brief."

Singhvi said, "The letter which tells us about the floor test is dated June 28. Yesterday evening, the Leader of Opposition met the Governor. Media reports mentioned it was at 10 pm. Today, when we mentioned the matter, we received information

about the floor test at 11 am tomorrow. Currently, two of the NCP MLAs are down with Covid and two Congress MLAs are abroad." He said the supersonic speed of the floor test left us with no time to call MLAs."

Singhvi said, "These people left from Maharashtra and went to Guwahati and on their way, they sent an email from an unverified account that we have no confidence in the Speaker. They have clearly walked across and hobnobbed with the Opposition."

He asked, "After meeting the Leader of Opposition, how can the Governor call for a floor test without



verification of the situation."

"The court must not allow a floor test to be held till the deputy Speaker decides on the disqualification petition against rebel MLAs," Singhvi told the Apex Court.

Citing the Uttarakhand Harish Rawat case, senior advocate AM Singhvi said, "A floor test was directed, but the disqualification decision was taken by the Speaker before the floor test. One day before the floor test, the President's Rule was imposed."

He also cited the Shivraj Chouhan (Madhya Pradesh) case

where an "artificial majority was sought to be created by engineering resignations."

Sunil Prabhu's lawyer told Supreme Court about a letter which tells us about the floor test. He said that on June 28, Opposition leaders met Governor and today morning, we received intimation about a floor test that is scheduled to be held tomorrow. Two NCP members are down with COVID and one Congress MLA is out of the country, he said.

He said, "There is the supersonic speed for the floor test. The floor test determines which government represents the will of the people. A floor test is supposed to find out the true majority. A true majority will include those eligible to be included."

MHA directs NIA to investigate Udaipur beheading incident

Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has directed the National Investigation Agency (NIA) to take over the investigation of the brutal murder of a man in Rajasthan's Udaipur who was allegedly beheaded by two men in broad daylight in the region on Tuesday.

Home Ministry Office (HMO) took to Twitter to make the announcement a day after the incident that shocked people across the country. "MHA has directed the National Investigation Agency (NIA) to take over the investigation of the brutal murder of Shri Kanhaiya Lal Teli committed at Udaipur, Rajasthan yesterday," HMO tweeted. In the tweet, the HMO has also mentioned that "the involvement

of any organisation and international links will be thoroughly investigated". The move comes after a team of NIA was on Tuesday rushed to Udaipur including a Deputy Inspector General (DIG)-rank officer. As per government sources, the NIA team will file a case under provisions of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. The incident took place in Udaipur's Maldas area. Soon after committing the crime, the two accused posted a video on social media boasting about the beheading and threatened Prime Minister Narendra Modi's life as well, police said. The two accused were arrested within hours of the incident. One of the assailants, who was identified as Riyaz Akhtar, attacked Kanhaiya Lal with a sharp-edged weapon while the other, Ghos Mohammad, recorded the crime on his mobile phone, police said.

Complete work of parkings in urban areas by September: Hry CM

CHANDIGARH: Haryana Chief Minister, Mr. Manohar Lal while presiding over the review meeting of the Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) Department held today at Haryana Niwas directed all the ULBs to complete the marking work of parking areas in urban areas by September. He said that this would enhance the beauty of the cities as well as facilitate people to park their vehicles. Besides this, he also directed the officers concerned to prepare



an action plan for the construction of multi-level parking in the cities. Urban Local Bodies Minister, Dr. Kamal Gupta also remained present during the meeting. The Chief Minister directed all the District Municipal Commissioners to prepare the budget of Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) like the State Governments and link it with the data of Parivar Pehchan Patra so that the budget can be allocated according to the existing population of the cities.

He said that after linking the data with PPP, more transparency will be ensured. Giving priority to development, all ULBs should prepare their budget and upload the same on the portal, directed Sh. Manohar Lal.

The Chief Minister said that everyone needs to pay more attention towards ensuring cleanliness in the cities. A portal related to Swachhata Campaign should be developed. The Municipal Corporation should be divided into different zones and in-charges should be appointed for ensuring cleanliness in different areas. The in-charges should personally upload their report on the cleanliness in the city on the portal every day. Even after this, if any complaint regarding cleanliness gets reported from any area, then the required action must be taken.

No decision on extending GST compensation to states

CHANDIGARH: The GST Council on Wednesday took no decision on extending beyond this month the compensation paid to states for revenue lost from the implementation of GST. Puducherry finance minister K Lakshminarayanan said all states sought an extension of the compensation mechanism, but no decision has been taken. A final decision is likely to be taken at the next meeting of the council in August. When a nationwide Goods and Services Tax (GST) subsumed 17 central and state levies from July 1, 2017, it was decided that states will be compensated for any loss of revenue from the new tax for five years.

With two years being lost in the pandemic, states have sought an extension of this compensation mechanism. The Council - the highest decision-making body of the indirect tax regime, which is headed by Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and comprises representatives of all states and UTs - discussed the issue at a meeting here but did not take a decision. Officials said a group of ministers (GoM) have been asked to further deliberate on the tax rate and the method of valuation of taxing online gaming, casinos and horse racing.

Monsoon enters himachal with heavy rains

South West Monsoon entered in most places of Himachal Pradesh on June 29 which is delayed by three or four days of normal schedule, Indian Meteorological Department spokesperson said here Wednesday.

Last year Monsoon entered on June 13, 2021. Southwest monsoon 2022 has advanced in Himachal Pradesh today dated June 29, 2022 with a delay of about 3-4 days. In last 20 years it entered on June 9, 2000 and delayed on 4th July 2002.

With heavy rain shower lashing most places of state Wednesday monsoon set in most places state as Mandi, Hamirpur, Solan and Kangra district received heavy to very heavy rainfall.

The Indian meteorological Department stated here Wednesday south West Mon-

soon entered in most parts of Himachal Pradesh, Punjab and Haryana and active all over state in next 24 hours. Mandi district experienced very heavy rainfall which is continuing as Sarkaghat had 109 millimeter rainfall. Heavy to very heavy rainfall also occurred in other parts of Mandi, Kangra, Solan and Hamirpur district in state. The state capital Shimla receiving in season rain since morning affected the normal life in Bhoranj in Hamirpur which had 100 mm rain, Sujampur Tira 84 mm, Baldwara (Kangra) 72 mm, In Mehre 63 mm, Dehra Gopipur 54 mm, Shimla 48.4 mm, Palampur 48 Pandoh(Mandi), Bilaspur also had 39.2, Nadaun 39 mm and Arki 34 mm rainfall. In view of advancement of monsoon, widespread rainfall very likely to continue in low and middle hill areas of Himachal Pradesh viz. district.

Problem of dirty water solved: SDO



VIRENDRA JANGRA TARAORI: SDO of Public Health Department to solve old dirty water problem of the people of Tarawadi Dayanagar. Vikas Gupta and Municipal Secretary, Tarawadi, Narendra Sharma along with their team inspected the spot. A cistern has been built at one end of the Dayanagar township to collect the waste water and the collected water has been dumped into the canal through tube wells for a long time, but after the NGT's instructions not to dump the dirty water into the canal, this has been done. The dirty water of the drains coming into the nod started going through the overflows to the houses built in the lower part there. Troubled people were constantly pleading with the administration and MLA Dharampal Gondar to solve the problem. Taking action on which today the officials of both the departments decided that a big hole would be built near this hound and all the water would be collected in it. The sewerage remains empty after eleven o'clock in the night, so now this water will be put into the sewerage after eleven o'clock in the night. Municipal Secretary Narendra Sharma said that the problem is big and it is being discussed continuously. After discussion with the officials of Public Health Department, this solution has been found today and this solution will be implemented soon.

Opposition is misleading people in Adani Power's name: Ranjit Singh

Haryana Power Minister, Sh. Ranjit Singh has said that the Opposition is misleading the state in the name of Adani Power Limited. When Sh. Ran-deep Singh Surjewala was the Power Minister, the then Chief Minister, Sh. Bhupinder Singh Hooda had signed a purchase agreement with Adani Power, for 1424 MW of power wherein 70 percent domestic coal and 30 percent imported coal was to be used, which has now been changed to 83 percent domestic and 17 percent imported coal and 1200 MW of power is being taken from Adani.

The Power Minister was speaking to mediapersons in his office here today. In response to a question, he said that power is available from Adani Power Limited at the rate of Rs 2.94 per unit. Also, it is available from other thermals at the rate of Rs 3.40 per

unit. He said that the entire coal is being procured through Coal India Limited.

He elaborated that there is high demand for electricity in the months of May, June and July and there was no cut anywhere except for two-three days during peak hours. There was no cut in Gurugram, Faridabad industrial area as well. The power consumption reduces in monsoon. We purchase power from Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Orissa and West Bengal and if required from independent power producers also. But there will be scarcity of power for consumers. On January 28, 2022, as many as 26.40 crore units of electricity were supplied. About 9500 MW power is available from the state's own resources while the demand has reached 12768 MW.

In response to a question, the Power Minister alerted the consumer that if they receive any call pertaining to fixing power bill, then one should

be careful. The department has not issued any such number. He said that in case of bill, the lineman himself transmits the power bill to the consumers. He directed to conduct a vigilance inquiry on this number, especially on receiving complaints of fake calls from mobile number 0- 7679709312.

Responding to a query about civic election results, the Power Minister said that the performance of BJP in these elections has been outstanding and better. There are two aspects of election, winning and losing and we have won. People have rejected Congress and Aam Aadmi Party in civic elections. We will do well in the coming Panchayat elections as well, he added. When asked about the Sangrur Lok Sabha by-election, Sh. Ranjit Singh said that it is big setback for the Aam Aadmi Party. In Haryana, people are aware of politics and Haryana decides the direction of the country's politics, he added.

Vigilance Bureau nabs Woman ASI taking Rs 4 lakh bribe

CHANDIGARH: Continuing crackdown on corrupt officials, Haryana State Vigilance Bureau has caught a woman ASI red-handed while accepting Rs 4 lakh bribe in lieu of removing various sections from the FIR.

Sharing the information here today, the Bureau's spokesperson informed that arrested accused identified as Sarita Devi, ASI posted in Police Station Sector-32-33, Karnal has been booked under the Prevention of Corruption Act on the complaint of Navjot Singh, a resident of village Sonkra, Police Station Taraori.

In his complaint, he alleged that accused ASI was demanding a bribe of Rs 8 lakh in lieu of removing various sections of the Indian Penal Code for dowry and rape as well as the names of two family members. It was also alleged that accused had already taken Rs 10,000 from the complainant.

On Wednesday, Additional Corporation Commissioner Dheeraj Kumar inspected the work of cleaning the drains being done in zone number two. After this, he also took stock of the cleanliness of the Dich drain near Jammu Colony. He directed the cleaning officers and the concerned agency to expedite the cleaning of all drains and ditch drains. At the same time, instructions were given to impose fine on the agency for not completing the cleaning work within the stipulated time.

Additional Commissioner of Corporation Dheeraj Kumar along with CSI Surendra Chopra, SI Bitoo and others went out on inspection of drains on



Wednesday morning. First of all he reached Panchayat Bhawan. Here he took stock of the cleanliness of the big drain coming from Jagadhri. After this he checked Jabbi Wala Gurdwara, near Masih Hospital, Tarapuri Railway Line culvert, Farakpur, Vishnu Nagar culvert, Vishwakarma Chowk and near Jodiya Gurudwara. During this, he himself checked the cleanliness of the silt by putting sticks in the drain and instructed the agency to clean the silt by deep cleaning the drain. Additional municipal commissioner reached the Ditch drain where the work

of first phase cleaning had been completed. Here he inspected the new gate built. He directed the cleaning officers and the agency to complete the work of cleaning the drains within the stipulated time period. At the same time, the agency was ordered to impose a fine for not completing the cleaning work within the stipulated time. He appealed to the residents not to use plastic carry bags. He asked the public to not throw the garbage from the house and shop in the drains. Due to this the drains get blocked and the problem of water logging arises.

Jasvir Panwar, Abdul Sattar etc. while giving information about the demands of Panchayati Raj Administrative Association said that appointing officer is the Deputy Commissioner. Whereas the right of their promotion, cadre, transfers rests with the Director of Panchayati Raj Department. Therefore, their appointment authority should also be declared to the state headquarters only. The village secretary says that the patwari and his educational qualification are the same. But

are also assigned the work of the revenue department. Which has nothing to do with them. They say that one village secretary has the responsibility of four panchayats. In such a situation, the village secretary should be given a conveyance allowance of Rs 3000 for traveling from one panchayat to another and district headquarters. Village secretaries have demanded from the government that 10 per cent additional salary should be given for appointment in remote areas.

PSPCL supplied highest ever power
in single day of 3265 lacs units

Complying with the strict instructions of Chief Minister S. Bhagwant Mann to provide uninterrupted power supply for agriculture and domestic sector, the Punjab State Power Corporation Limited (PSPCL) had supplied highest ever power in a single day of 3265 lacs units which surpassed the previous year record of 3066 lacs units supplied on July 1, 2021 that is an increase of 6.49%. This year PSPCL has also successfully met highest ever peak demand of 14207 MW on 29-06-2022 at 12.15 PM by surpassing the previous year record of 13431 MW on 01-07-2021. This

summer due to increased temperature, demand of power is persistently high but despite this PSPCL is providing daily 8 hour power supply to its agriculture consumers and 24 hour power supply to all other categories of consumers in the Punjab without imposing any power cuts on any category of consumers.

Divulging further, Punjab Power Minister Sh. Harbhajan Singh informed, in view of the continuous high demand, PSPCL developed the strategy to adopt various deviation settlement mechanism measures for the reactive power management to optimize resources. He said that in order to compensate the reac-

tive power requirement of the system, condenser mode of unit no 3 of Ranjit Sagar Dam plant, which was not being used for many years, has now been made operational to compensate the 60 Mega Volt Amps Reactive (MVAR) requirement of reactive power in the system. Besides this, Mega Volt Amps Reactive MVAR capacity of the system has also been increased through a special drive by the addition of 341.61 Mega Volt Amps Reactive MVAR capacity with 251 units of capacitor banks at the grid sub stations and addition of shunt capacitors of required capacity at 11 KV feeders to improve the voltage profile of the system, he added.

Action will be taken on use of single use plastic from July 1: DC

Legal action will be implemented on the use of single use plastic in Una. This was stated by Deputy Commissioner Una Raghav Sharma in a meeting on this matter today with Additional Chief Secretary Prabodh Saxena after video conferencing held from Shimla. He said that from the point of view of environmental protection, the Central Government has decided to stop single-use plastic from July 1, which the Himachal Pradesh government is going to implement. He said that production, storage, distribution, sale and use of



single-use plastic items would be completely banned in district Una as well. The banned items include ear buds with plastic sticks, plastic sticks for balloons, plastic flags, candy sticks, decorative materials made of polystyrene (thermocool) for decoration, plates, cups, glasses, cutlery such as forks, spoons, knife, film wrapping or packing around sweet boxes, invitation cards and cigarette packets,

plastic or PVC banners less than 100 microns and stirrers.DC has contacted all producers, stockists, retailers, shopkeepers, e-commerce companies, street vendors, commercial establishments, malls, market places, shopping centers, cinema houses, tourist places, schools, office complexes, hospitals and other institutions of district Una. Called them not to use prohibited plastic and ensure their participation in

environmental protection. He said that appropriate legal action would be taken against the violators under the Environment Protection Act. He said that bulk sellers who still have single use plastic material, they should ensure to send it back to the company distributor. He said that the Central Government had apprised all the companies about this about a year ago and has given instructions to take back the old stock. DC directed the officials of the Pollution Board to make them aware by holding meetings with business circles, managers of marriage palaces, persons involved in catering work as well as all other stakeholders on this matter.

Lokpal gets 5,680 corruption
complaints during 2021-22

Anti-corruption ombudsman Lokpal received 5,680 complaints during 2021-22, of which over 5,100 were yet to be registered, according to an RTI reply.

Of the total complaints received in the last fiscal, 169 were format and 5,511 were under non-format category, it said.

The government had in March 2020 issued a format for filing corruption complaints against public servants with the Lokpal.

As many as 61 non-format complaints were pending with various agencies and 5,101 complaints (were) yet to be registered for 2021-22, the Lokpal said in a reply to an RTI query filed by a PTI journalist.

It had got a total of 2,355 complaints - 131 format and 2,224 in non-format - during



2020-21. Of these, 1,579 were disposed of, the reply said.

In 2019-20, the Lokpal had got 1,427 complaints, all of which were disposed of, said the latest reply from the anti-graft ombudsman.

All complainants have to mandatorily give an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper, that among other things mentions, making any false and frivolous

or vexatious complaint is punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to one year and with fine which may extend to one lakh rupees.

Lokpal, the apex body to inquire into and investigate allegations of corruption against public functionaries, including the prime minister, has been working without its regular chief for the past one month.

Spicy, greasy, and acidic foods should be avoided because they can upset the stomach and cause discomfort during practise. 

According to Navjot Sandhu, when he told the female ASI Savita that this is a false case and Rs 10 lakh is too much, the female ASI asked to pay Rs 8 lakh. Savita also told him that out of these Rs 8 lakh, Rs 4 lakh has to go to the DSP and Rs 3 lakh to the SHO of Sector 32-33 police station. She will have only one Rs 1 lakh. ASI Savita asked to give Rs 4 lakh before and Rs 4 lakh after the work is done. Navjot Sandhu complained about this entire matter to the Vigilance. Vigilance officers, after getting the complaint verified, formed a team and gave Rs 4 lakh to Navjot Sandhu, who had put chemicals on it. Navjot Sandhu reached the police station of Sector 32-33 with the amount and caught ASI Savita there with Rs 4 lakh.
