Mirwaiz barred from offering Friday prayers

SRINAGAR: Just a week after Jammu and Kashmir Lt Governor Manoj Sinha said Mirwaiz Umar Farooq was a free man, Kashmir's chief cleric and Hurriyat chairman was stopped from leaving his residence for the Friday prayers by the police. Mirwaiz was expected to deliver the first Friday sermon at historic Jamia Masjid in the heart of old city, after the abrogation of J&K's special status. "Mirwaiz Umar Farooq has been barred from leaving his residence by a posse of Indian Forces. He was on his way to deliver the Friday sermon at the Jamia Masjid today, just a week after Governor Sinha said he was 'free'," a tweet by Mirwaiz Manzil said.

Gold falls Rs 254; silver gains Rs 21

NEW DELHI: Gold prices fell by Rs 254 to Rs 52,031 per 10 grams in the national capital on Friday amid weak global cues, according to HDFC Securities. In the previous trade, the precious metal had settled at Rs 52,285 per 10 grams. However, silver, gained Rs 21 to Rs 55,979 per kg from Rs 55,958 per kg in the previous trade. "Spot gold prices for 24-carat gold in Delhi fell by Rs 254 per 10 gram in line with fall in COMEX gold prices," said Tapan Patel, Senior Analyst (Commodities) at HDFC Securities.

SC reprieve for UP CM in hate speech

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Friday rejected a petition challenging the denial of sanction for prosecution against Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath in a case related to an alleged hate speech he delivered in Gorakhpur in 2007. A three-judge Bench headed by Chief Justice N V Ramana and comprising Justices Hima Kohli and C T Ravikumar dismissed the appeal filed by Pervaz Parwaz, challenging a Allahabad High Court order dismissing his plea. The apex court wanted to know where was the question of sanction once a closure report was filed in a case.

Indian Navy receives first-ever fully indigenous AK-630 gun ammo

NEW DELHI: In a major boost for achieving indigenisation in the armed forces, the Indian Navy on Friday received its first-ever fully Made in India 30mm ammunition for AK-630 guns fitted on warships. "Satyanarayan Nuwal, CMD of the Economic Explosives Limited handed over the first consignment of the ammunition to Navy Vice Chief Vice Admiral SN Ghor-made," Indian Navy said in a release. Speaking on the occasion, Vice Admiral Ghor-made said, "This is a major achievement for the country that private industry has developed fully indigenous ammunition."

Rahul and his PAs taking decisions in Cong: Azad after quitting party

Ghulam Nabi Azad, the latest Congress veteran to quit the party on Friday, attacked former party president Rahul Gandhi in a no holds barred move coming down heavily on him and his coterie for the poor state of the party.

Shooting some acerbic salvos at the leadership as he quit even primary membership of the party, Azad cited: "After the entry of Rahul Gandhi into politics and particularly after January, 2013 when he was appointed as vice president, the entire consultative mechanism which existed earlier was 'demolished' by him."

"All senior and experienced leaders were sidelined and new coterie of inexperienced sycophants started running the affairs of the Party."

His five-page letter addressed to interim president Sonia Gandhi said: "One of the most glaring examples of this immaturity was the tearing up of a government ordinance in the full glare of the media by Shri Rahul Gandhi. The said ordinance was incubated in the Congress Core Group and subsequently unanimously approved by the Union Cabinet presided over by the Prime Minister of India and duly approved even by the Presi-



dent of India.

"This 'childish' behavior completely subverted the authority of the Prime Minister and Government of India. This one single action more than anything else contributed significantly to the defeat of the UPA Government in 2014 that was at the receiving end of a campaign of calumny and insinuation from a combination of the forces of the right-wing and certain unscrupulous corporate interests."

Azad drawing sharp comparison between mother and son said: "While you are just a nominal figurehead all the important decisions were being taken by Shri Rahul Gandhi or rather worse his

security guard's and PAs."

He reminded Sonia Gandhi: "While undoubtedly as the President of the Indian National Congress you played a sterling role in the formation of both the UPA -1 and UPA-2 government's. However, one of the major reasons for this success was that as President you heeded the wise counsel of senior leaders, besides trusting their judgement and delegating powers to them."

"However unfortunately after the entry of Shri Rahul Gandhi into politics...was demolished by him."

He also reminded her, how time and again Congress did not heed sane advice: "You may re-

call that after you took over as the Congress President after dethroning Shri Sita Ram Kesri, the Congress leadership had met for a brainstorming in Panchmari in October of 1998. Subsequently there was another such session in Simla in 2003 and then again in Jaipur in January 2013. I had the privilege of chairing the working group on Organisational Affairs on all these three occasions.

"However regrettably none of the recommendations of these retreats were ever properly implemented. Infact in January of 2013 at Jaipur, I had proposed with the assistance of others members of the Committee a detailed action plan to revitalize the party in the run up to the 2014 Lok Sabha elections. That action plan duly approved by the CWC.

"These recommendation's were supposed to be implemented in a time bound manner before 2014 Lok Sabha elections. Unfortunately, these recommendation's are lying in the storeroom of the AICC for the past 9 years. In spite of my repeated reminders in person both to you and the then Vice President Shri Rahul Gandhi from 2013 onwards to implement these recommendation's. However, no effort was made to even examine them seriously.

Six of family found dead in Ambala village

Six members of a family, including two children, were found dead at their home in a village near Ambala city on Friday morning, police said.

The deceased were identified as Sukhwinder Singh (34), his wife Reena (28), their daughters Aashu (5) and Jassi (7), his father Sangat Singh (65), mother Mahindro Kaur (60), they said.

Station House Officer (Nag-gal) Manish Kumar said some locals from Balana village informed police about the incident in the morning and they rushed to the spot.

While Sukhwinder was found hanging from the ceiling fan in a room, the other family members were lying unconscious, he said.

They were taken to the civil hospital in Ambala City where the doctors declared them brought dead, he said.

Police said a suicide note from Sukhwinder was also recovered from the spot.

In the note, Sukhwinder, who worked at a private company in Yamunanagar, alleged that two officials of the company were forcing him to give Rs 10 lakhs which he could not arrange, they said. He also mentioned the names of the two officials in the note, they said.

Punjab Cabinet gives nod to fill up 359 posts in Agri department

Punjab Cabinet led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann gave approval to fill up 359 vacancies of direct recruitment in various cadres of the technical side of the Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare.

A decision to this effect was taken by the Council of Minister in its meeting chaired by the Chief Minister in Punjab Civil Secretariat- I.

Divulging the details, a spokesperson of the Chief Minister's Office said that there has been acute shortage of officers/ employees in the department due to which its working had been affected adversely. These posts including 200 of Agriculture Development Officers, 150 of Agriculture Sub Inspectors and nine of Laboratory Assistants will be filled without any restructuring. Filling up of these posts will help the Department of Agriculture



and Farmer Welfare in smooth implementation of the Agriculture Development Schemes and in hassle free delivery of facilities to the farmers.

The Cabinet also decided to fill 80 posts of Civil Judge (Junior Division)-cum-Judicial Magistrate through Punjab & Haryana High Court by bringing out the purview of Punjab Public Service Commission, Patiala. This decision will help to expedite the process of recruiting new Judicial Officers to ensure speedy dispensation of work at the Subordinate Courts.

Sonali Phogat drugged with obnoxious chemical before she died: Police

BJP leader Sonali Phogat was forcibly drugged at a party by her two associates who are now arrested after being named as accused in the case related to her death, Goa Police said on Friday.

"On the basis of CCTV footage, it was seen that the accused Sudhir Sangwan and his associate Sukhwinder Singh were partying with the deceased at a club. A video establishes that one of them forceful-



ly made the victim consume a substance," Inspector General of Police Omvir Singh Bishnoi said.

The accused Sudhir Sagwan and

Sukhwinder Singh had travelled to Goa along with Phogat on August 22.

"When confronted, Sukhwinder and Sudhir confessed that they intentionally mixed an obnoxious chemical into a liquid and made the victim drink it," IGP Omvir Singh Bishnoi said. The two accused- Sudhir Sangwan and Sukhwinder Singh- have been arrested and further investigations are on, the Goa Police said.

Sonali Phogat's brother Rinku Dhaka had filed a complaint alleging that Sonali was murdered by Sudhir Sangwan, her personal trainer along

with Sukhwinder Singh who intended "to take over her properties and financial assets to finish her political career." The drugging incident happened at Curries Restaurant at Anjuna in North Goa, according to the confession by the accused. The two accused confessed that after they intentionally mixed an obnoxious chemical into a liquid and made the victim drink it, which made her feel uneasy, after which they took her to the hotel and then to St. Anthony's Hospital, where she was declared brought dead," the Goa police said.

SC issues notice on plea filed by evacuated Ukraine students

The Supreme Court on Friday issued notice to Centre and others on a batch plea filed by Indian students who have been evacuated from Ukraine and seeking permission to continue medical study in India. A bench headed by justice Hemant Gupta issued notice on the plea and listed the matter in September. The plea

was filed by evacuated students, who have sought the urgent indulgence of this court in light of the extraordinary situation which has presented itself in the aftermath of the Russia-Ukraine war crisis which has gravely impeded their education. The unfortunate events in Ukraine have led to the evacuation of students and consequently, their education has inevitably come to a stand-still.

4 Indian women face racist attack in Texas

Four Indian women faced violent racist attack in Texas, US, as a Latina hurled abuse at them and Indians in general asking them to "Go Back" from where they came.

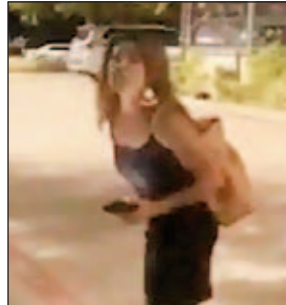
Police on Thursday arrested the Mexican-American woman on charges of assault and "terroristic threats" after the attack, as per police tweet and videos which have since gone viral.

The incident took place in Plano as the Indian group of friends came out of a restaurant, as per the conversation in the viral videos.

The shocking videos captured and shared on social media show the attacker now identified by the authorities as Esmeralda Upton hurling abuses at the four.

While three women made the videos of their attacker, another was seen talking to perhaps the authorities or seeking help on phone.

Plano police also tweeted that Upton "is also being investigated for hate crime, and additional charges may be forthcoming. She is being held on a bond of \$10,000".



The police released a mugshot of the attacker, describing it as "jail photo".

The incident took place late Thursday in the Dallas suburb that has significant Indian population.

As per the media, the four Indian women were headed towards their cars in an empty parking lot when Upton accosted them.

Launching her racist rant, Upton said: "We don't want you here...Go back to India." She keeps walking turning back and repeating herself "Go Back...."

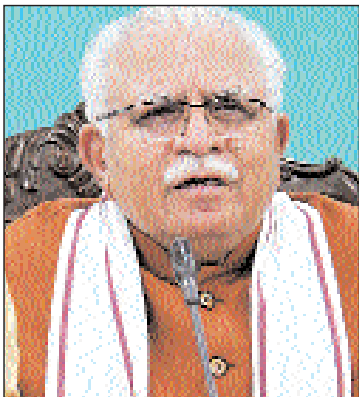
She even physically attacks one of the women and then another after she says that if the Indians thought India was that great they should go back as her country (US) does not want Indians.

Brahmakumaris celebrate memory day of Dadi Prakashmani

NILOKHERI: Brahma Kumari Sangeeta Behen, the chief director of Brahmakumaris Ishwariya Vishwavidyalaya Nilokheri, said that Dadi Prakashmani was an influential and powerful personality. Dadi Prakashmani was the chief administrator of Prajapita Brahma Kumaris Ishwariya Vishwavidyalaya from 1969 to 2007 and during this time thousands of centres of this university were opened. The cosmic name of the Dadi who was full of simplicity was Rama. Born on 01 September 1922 in the northern Indian province of Hyderabad, Sindh (Pakistan). Her father was a great worshiper of Lord Vishnu, Rama also had love and devotion towards Shri Krishna. She came in contact with Om Mandali for the first time only at the age of 15, which was established in 1936. Before Rama came to Om Mandali for the first time, she had a meeting with Shri Krishna sitting at home. Baba named Rama as Prakashmani. So this is how Dadi Prakashmani's supernatural birth took place. The congregation came to Mount Abu, India in March 1950 after 12 years of penance in Karachi (Pakistan), which is still the main centre of Prajapita Brahma Kumaris. Divine service was started for the first time from Madhuban-Mount Abu since 1952, Brahma Kumaris used to go from place to place to narrate knowledge and get dharma done. After Prajapita Brahma Baba, along with Didi Manmohini, Dadi Prakashmani started taking care of the institution from Madhuban itself. Brahma Baba had given all the responsibility of the institution to the grandmother. Under the able leadership of Dadi, the organisation grew and Raj Yoga service centres were opened in many countries. By 2007, the organisation had expanded. During these days, grandmother's physical health was affected and on August 25, 2007, the grandmother left the body. A 'light pillar' has been built in the memory of Dadi in Shantivan. Hukum Singh, Anil Khanna, Mahindra Bakipur, Rampal Dhiman, Amit Goyal, Sudhir Diwan, Joginder, Brahma Kumari Suman, Brahma Kumari Neha were also present on this occasion.

69 active Covid-19 cases in Kaithal dist: DC

KAITHAL: Kaithal deputy commissioner Dr. Sangeeta Tatarwal said that five cases of corona infection have been reported on Friday, while eight corona infected people have recovered. Now 69 cases of corona infection are active in the district. Among them, 66 patients are being treated in home isolation and one patient is being treated in District Civil Hospital, one patient each is being treated in PGI Chandigarh and Kalpana Chawla Hospital in Karnal. To prevent the spread of corona infection, the general public should continue to follow the Covid-19 instructions issued by the government. According to the report of the health department, she said that out of 15 thousand 146 corona patients in the district, 14 thousand 694 patients have been cured. The recovery rate of the district is 97 percent, the positive rate is 2.88 percent and the death rate is 2.49 percent. Of the total 13203 persons living in home isolation, 13137 have recovered. DC Dr. Sangeeta Tatarwal said that anti-coronavirus vaccine is being administered in all PHC and CHC centers in the district. The Deputy Commissioner has appealed to the residents of the district that those who have not yet been vaccinated should get themselves and their families vaccinated. She said that so far 18 lakh 71 thousand 496 people have been vaccinated in the district, out of which 9 lakh 17 thousand 209 people were given the first dose, 8 lakh 56 thousand 536 people were given the second dose and 97 thousand 751 people were given the booster dose. Among the vaccinated are 17 thousand 77 health-care workers, 12 thousand 962 front-line workers, 41 thousand 267 children aged 12 to 14 years, 91 thousand 508 children aged 15 to 17 years, in the age group of 18 to 44 years 10 lakh 86 thousand 682 persons and 3 lakh 47 thousand 221 persons, in the age group of 45 to 59 years, 2 lakh 74 thousand 779 persons above the age group of 60 years.

Narcotics Bureau to hold seminar for officers

A special seminar will be organized in Haryana to provide training to officers and employees of various departments to monitor the movement of narcotics and ensure speedy action at all levels in registered cases. While giving directions in the meeting of Haryana State Narcotics Control Bureau here today, Chief Secretary, Sh. Sanjeev Kaushal said that the Police, Health, Social Justice and Empowerment Departments should participate in this seminar to be organized by Haryana State Narcotics Control Bureau, so that all the departments can take this programme ahead with mutual coordination. He said that the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) should be modernized so that the investigation process in FSL can be further expedited.

Sh. Kaushal said that the State Drug Controller should keep a strict vigil on the supply and use of chemicals and other raw material used for making medicines in the state. Separate monitoring committees should also be constituted for this. Apart from this, a portal should also be prepared on which monitoring committees can upload their reports. The Chief Secretary said that the District Deputy Commissioner should review the district level committee after conducting a monthly meeting. He also directed to ensure to update the information and decisions of these meetings on the portal of Haryana State Narcotics Control Bureau. He directed that the SDM should visit the drug de-addiction centres once in a month in their respective districts and take cognizance of the activities being carried out there and submit the report in the monthly meeting to be held at the district level. They also have

to update their tour on Prayas application. Sh. Kaushal also directed that the Dhakad programme being run to make the youth aware about the harmful consequences of drugs should be conducted on a large scale. Seminars should also be organized in schools and colleges to apprise them about all the information related to this and positive results, so that the implementation of Dhakad programme can be accelerated. Apart from this, Dhakad teams should also be formed in the educational institutions. He said that seminars should also be organized from time to time to make all the stakeholders aware of the rules and regulations regarding the use of drones. The Chief Secretary directed that the toll free number 9050891508 issued by the Haryana State Narcotics Control Bureau should be displayed at all government offices, bus stands, railway stations and public establishments.

This Act, which is applicable throughout India, allows all offences under the law to be tried by a special court in front of the camera in the presence of the parents of the children or persons in whom the children trust. Child trafficking is a legal offence which can be punished by imprisonment of not less than 7 years.

The concerned agency should not be blacklisted from the local body, board or any gov-



ernment department. The Municipal Commissioner informed that for catching monkeys and pigs, the terms and conditions have been set by the Municipal Corporation. He said that monkeys and pigs would be caught as per the norms of Animal Board of India. All the captured monkeys will have to be released in the forest of Kalesar and the pigs will have to be kept in a safe place. The concerned agency has been notified under the

Prevention of Cruelty of Animal Act-1960 and Section-12 (BB) of the Wildlife Act-1972 and AWBI. It will be mandatory to follow the orders of While apprehending them, no cruelty will be taken and the cage and all other equipment will be of the concerned agency. Food items like gram, jaggery, peanuts, fruits and other food items in their cage will have to be made available to the agency only. To release the monkeys in the Kalesar Reserved Forest, the resources like vehicle/tractor-trolley, driver and diesel etc. will also be from the agency concerned. The personnel engaged for this work should be trained. He also informed that on returning the stray pigs to the concerned pig owner, one thousand rupees will have to be deposited in the municipal office as a fine.

Cabinet gives nod to
new Punjab food grains
labour policy 2022

The Punjab Cabinet led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Friday gave nod to the New Punjab Food grains Labour Policy 2022 and the revised Punjab Food grains Transportation Policy 2022 to ensure wider competitive participation with increased transparency and at the same time reducing frivolous litigation.

A decision to this effect was taken by Council of Ministers chaired by the Chief Minister in its meeting held here at the Punjab Civil Secretariat- I. Divulging the details a spokesperson of the Chief Minister's Office said that the revised transportation policy is now in sync with the Custom Milling Policy for procurement and milling of paddy, approved by the Cabinet a few days back. The re-

vised transportation policy mandates, for the first time ever, the installation of vehicle tracking systems in every vehicle used for transportation of food grains procured by the government. The Department of Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs has already initiated the process of empanelling companies, which provide vehicle tracking systems, and making the existing Anaaj Khareed Portal compatible with these systems.

Likewise, new Labour Policy aims at ensuring wider participation of Labour Associations by abolishing the prevailing Labour and Cartage Policy. The existing Labour and Cartage Policy, prevailing for past many decades, was perceived by many to favour participation of contractors, since it involved providing labour and transportation services by the same person.

But the new Policy has completely delinked labor and transportation services thereby providing increased opportunities to Labour Associations to directly participate in the tender process, which will directly increase their incomes by removing the contractor margin, he explained.

Highlighting the aspects of the Labour and Transportation Policies, the spokesperson said that every effort has been made to make the system completely transparent by removing certain existing provisions, which were sometimes open to abuse and often caused frivolous litigations. An important step in this regard was taken by completely eliminating the submission of manual documents during the tender process, as many tenders were often rejected on account of minor discrepancies in their submission, he said.

Govt imposes restrictions to prevent spread of disease

RAWEL SINGH BHINDER PATIALA: The Punjab government has declared the Bandugar Area of city Patiala and Mandofal village of district Fatehgarh Sahib as African swine fever (ASF) affected zones and notified these areas as 'infected zones' for the prevention of the ASF. Giving more details in this regard, Animal Husbandry, Fisheries & Dairy Development Minister Laljit Singh Bhullar today said that the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) - National High Security Animal Disease Institute, Bhopal has confirmed ASF in the samples from these areas. "For the prevention of the disease in these villages, restrictions under the provisions of 'The Prevention and Control of Infectious and Contagious Diseases in Animals Act, 2009' and the 'National Action Plan for Control, Containment and Eradication of African Swine Fever (June 2020)' have been strictly imposed and are being ensured", said the Minister, instructing the officials to keep a close eye on every situation. The Cabinet Minister said that 0 to 1 kilometre area of the villages declared as epicenters would be considered as 'infected zones' while 0 to 10 KM (9 KM) area is classified as 'surveillance zones.'

Govt mulls to develop urban estates in Bathinda: Aman Arora

Punjab Chief Minister S. Bhagwant Mann led state government is mulling to develop Urban Estates in Bathinda for providing affordable residential spaces equipped with state-of-the-art amenities.

Disclosing this here, Punjab Housing and Urban Development Minister Mr. Aman Arora said that for creating modern and planned township in Bathinda, the Bathinda Development Authority (BDA) has invited applications from eligible applicants for applying against the demand survey to develop Urban Estates Phase-6 & 7 on Mansa Road, Bathinda. He said that plots ranging from 100-500 sq.yds of size are proposed to be developed at these sites and have been tentatively priced at Rs.12,000/- per sq. yd. The applicant should be of 18 years of age on the date of submission of application. The last date for applying in this demand survey has been scheduled for September 2, 2022. While divulging the details of the demand survey, the spokesperson of the Housing



and Urban Development department said that the BDA shall retain the applications for a period of maximum two years, if it gets the response to this demand survey. The Authority would develop the urban estates during this period. However, in case the Authority withdraws the scheme or could not develop the urban estates in two years time from the date of closing of the demand survey, the application money shall be refunded to the applicants within three months after two years from the closing date of this Demand Survey.

The Authority has made it clear that half of the total plots under quota of BDA

of each size shall be reserved for allotment to the applicants of this Demand Survey in case a scheme inviting applications from general public is launched. Also, as the Authority is conducting this demand survey to check the demand of plots in the areas where sites are situated, the rates/sizes offered in the demand survey have been kept tentative which may vary when the scheme is announced, he added. Those interested to apply under the demand survey can collect the application form from the BDA office situated at Bathinda or can also download from the website of the Authority i.e. www.bd-abathinda.in, and applications submitted on plain paper will also be accepted, the spokesperson added. He further informed that as far as the submission of the applications is concerned, applicants have the option either to submit in person or by registered post to the office of Estate Officer BDA at Bathinda along with a demand draft of Rs.5000 as application money in favour of Estate Officer, Bathinda Development Authority and payable at Bathinda along with the application.

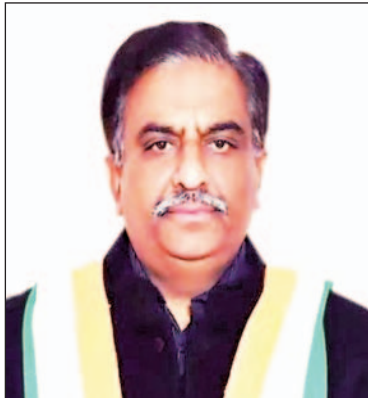
Government should give proper compensation to farmers: Naresh Puri

For those unfamiliar with this scheme, girls are given financial assistance under Kanyashree-I and Kanyashree-II. The K-I level is for students in between Classes VII and XII (annual financial assistance of Rs 1,000) and K-II is a one-time grant of Rs 25,000 (given to girl students who complete Class XII without getting married). The government has reportedly spent over Rs 12,000 crore on the scheme till now. The women & child development and social welfare minister,Shashi Panja, said, "Through Kanyashree, money is not the only thing, it is to also give them strength and self confidence to dream and progress is taking place. This is for everyone, whoever is studying and has not gotten married, they are Kanyashree". Mentioning that there are nearly 8,000 Kanyashree Clubs, the department also released a short audio-visual film, Ami Kanyashree, Ami Cyber Yoddha. The same day, there were eye-catching advertisements in leading dailies announcing: "Almost 80 lakh Kanyashrees touched by the light of progress."This is certainly laudable,if it were not for the grim reality about where and how the funds are used by the recipients.The government certainly does not monitor whether the students are dropping out of schools and colleges after they receive Rs 25,000 in their accounts. A random survey unveiled some unsavoury facts. Mita, the daughter of our domestic help, completed her schooling and enrolled in a college. Once she turned 18, she collected a Kanyashree form from her school and Rs 25,000 was deposited in her account. Her parents added a room to their house with the money meant for their daughter's higher education. Rajlakhmi, whose widowed mother could scarcely make ends meet, used her largesse to straighten her long tresses and buy some ornaments. Shuli, another student, spent it on a new wardrobe. Others have opted for smartphones,mainly to play games, instead of laptops which would have helped them during online classes.

National emergency in Pak after floods kill over 900 people

Amidst the ongoing devastation caused by heavy rains and floods in different parts of Pakistan, the government on Thursday officially declared a "national emergency".

As per the latest data by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), the rains and floods had so far killed 937 people, including 343 children, and left at least 30 million without shelter.

Meanwhile, Sindh recorded the highest number of death as 306 people have lost their lives due to floods and rain-related incidents from June 14 to date. Balochistan reported 234 deaths whereas Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Punjab recorded 185 and 165 deaths, respectively. Nine deaths were reported in the Gilgit-Baltistan region during the current monsoon rains. In the same period Islamabad reported one death, Dawn reported citing NDMA.

The abnormal increase in rainfall has generated flash floods across the country, particularly in the southern part of Pakistan, which remains inundated at the moment with 23 districts of Sindh being declared "calamity-hit".

In the face of calamitous floods, the Minister for Climate Change Sherry Rehman said a "war room" has been established by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif at NDMA, which would spearhead relief operations across the country.

However, the incessant "monstrous" rainfall had made it difficult to carry out relief operations, especially helicopter sorties, minister Rehman admitted.

"Pakistan is going through its 8th cycle of monsoon; normally the country has only three to four cycles of [monsoon] rain," the minister said during a press conference in Islamabad.

"Pakistan is under an unprecedented monsoon spell and data suggests the possi-



bility of re-emergence of another cycle in September." Comparing the current situation of Pakistan with the year 2010 floods, Senator Rehman, earlier this week, said that the current situation was worse than that. "The water is not only flowing from the north as in 2010, but it is equally or more devastating in its sweep and destructive power," she added.

According to the senator, flash floods caused by heavy rains had swept away bridges and communication infrastructure in various areas of the country. "Almost 30 million people are without shelter, thousands of them displaced and have no food," she said as quoted by Dawn.

Stressing the need for relief from international donors, the minister said that the need for shelter and relief was dire as

per what the provinces had conveyed. "It is still an evolving situation and every day the needs assessments were changing as the rains did not stop and the water kept coming," she said, adding that the number of homeless was growing.

Sindh has asked for one million tents and Balochistan has demanded 100,000 tents, she said, adding that all tent manufacturers had been mobilised and external donors were also approached for tents.

Meanwhile, Pakistan's Information Minister Marriyum Aurangzeb urged the nations, including overseas Pakistanis to come forward and helped their people at this critical juncture, according to Dawn.

"The entire nation, especially the overseas Pakistanis, should donate generously to help the flood victims as a huge amount

of money would be required for their rehabilitation in the wake of large-scale disaster, she said in a statement.

This unprecedented emergency situation comes amid the rising political tension in the country over a terrorism case filed against former Prime Minister Imran Khan. Writing for the Dawn, Pakistani columnist Zahid Hussain said nothing could be more surreal than watching political leaders engaged in a sordid game of thrones while a large part of the country is devastated by torrential rains.

In an article titled "Politics in times of calamity", Hussain said villages have been wiped out by flash floods. "There are horrific scenes; the destruction across the country has left thousands of people homeless and without sustenance," he added.

Infants born to older fathers cry differently: Study

A baby's cry is a kind of communication used to draw an adult caregiver's attention, and each infant screams in a similar yet distinct way. An international study team analysed the vocal behaviour of infant mice, known as pups, to establish how the father's age influences the pups' vocal communication and body weight growth.

The team published their findings in the journal iScience.

Research suggests that infant crying can serve as a marker of a baby's development. Altered crying in a baby may indicate a risk for autism spectrum disorder or other neurodevelopmental disorders. Researchers know that children with these disorders show particular crying patterns.

However, scientists do not fully understand what makes the crying patterns of these children different. Recent studies have shown that advanced paternal age is a risk factor for neurodevelopmental disorders and lower body weight in the offspring. Wanting to better understand the connection between a father's age and vocal behaviour in their offspring, a research team led by Professor Noriko Osumi, Tohoku University Graduate School of Medicine has conducted a study, using mice, to determine how paternal ageing influences the vocal behaviour of off-



spring. One of the team's main findings was that the advanced paternal age causes alterations in early vocal behaviour and increases the number of offspring with atypical developmental patterns.

"This vocal feature of pups born to aged fathers is similar to that of pups from autism spectrum disorder model mice. Moreover, pups born to young fathers showed a rich repertoire, while those born to aged fathers exhibited a limited repertoire," said Professor Osumi.

In recent years, scientists have studied ultrasonic vocalizations in mice to learn more about the neurobiology of vocal communication. They know that when a pup is separated from its mother and littermates, it emits ultrasonic vocalizations consisting of various sound elements. When the mother hears these sounds, she responds by coming to retrieve the pup.

Dogs with more active owners get more exercise

Dog owners who spend more time exercising themselves often tend to exercise their dogs, according to a new study. The researchers found that more active owners are also more likely to evaluate their dog's body weight as optimum.

The findings of the research were published in the journal PLoS ONE.

Sydney Banton of the University of Guelph in Ontario, Canada, and colleagues presented the findings in the open-access journal PLOS ONE on August 24, 2022.

Obese dogs may face a number of health problems, such as diabetes and cardiac disease, and concerns about dog obesity are increasing worldwide. Earlier research has identified associations between dogs' body weight and diet, exercise, and sociodemographic factors. However, those studies tended to be small and focused on individual countries.

For a broader, international perspective, Banton and colleagues analyzed results from a survey of 3,298 dog owners living in France, Germany, the United Kingdom, Canada and the United States. The survey included questions about both owners' and dogs' diet and exercise routines, and each owner's perception of their dog's body weight. Analysis of the survey responses showed that dogs were more likely to get more exercise if their owners spent more time exercising themselves. More active owners were also more likely to perceive their dog as having an ideal body weight. Compared to owners in other countries, owners in Germany tended to exercise their dogs



for a longer time, were more likely to perceive their dog's body weight as ideal, and were less likely to report having been told that their dog was overweight.

Among dogs who were 5 years old and older, owners were less likely to perceive their dog as having an ideal body weight if they had been told their dog was overweight, if they reported attempting to control their dog's weight by limiting food intake, and if they reported giving dogs other foods, such as treats, every day. The findings suggest that many owners may attempt to control dogs' body weight through diet, but not through exercise. The researchers therefore call for veterinarians to be given more resources to help owners develop exercise routines to avoid weight gain in dogs.

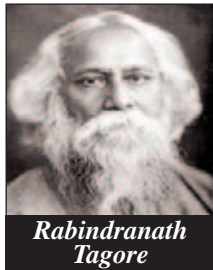

Leisure activities may lower risk of death in older adults



According to a recent study led by researchers at the National Cancer Institute, a division of the National Institutes of Health, older adults may have a lower risk of death from any cause, as well as death from cardiovascular disease and cancer, if they engage in a variety of leisure activities on a weekly basis, such as walking for exercise, jogging, swimming laps, or playing tennis.

The results imply that older persons should take part in leisure activities that they love and can maintain because many of these activities may reduce their chance of passing

away, according to the authors.

The results are published in JAMA Network Open on August 24.

The NIH-AARP Diet and Health Study included 272,550 adults between the ages of 59 and 82 who answered questionnaires about their leisure-time activities. The researchers examined whether engaging in comparable amounts of seven different exercise and recreational activities, such as walking, cycling, swimming, other aerobic exercise, racquet sports, golfing and other forms of exercise, was linked to a lower risk of dying.

The researchers discovered that

compared to not participating in any of these activities, getting the required amount of physical activity each week through any combination of these activities was related to a 13% decreased risk of mortality from any cause. Racquet sports participation was linked to a 16% risk decrease and running to a 15% reduction when they examined the role of each activity separately. However, lower risks of death were found for all of the assessed activities.

Adults should perform 2.5 to 5 hours of moderate-intensity aerobic physical activity or 1.25 to 2.5 hours of vigorous-intensity aerobic physi-

cal activity per week, according to the second edition of the Physical Activity Guidelines for Americans. Even bigger reductions in the risk of death were associated with the amounts of exercise performed by the most active people (those who went above and beyond the guidelines for physical activity), although there were diminishing returns as activity levels rose. Even those who engaged in some recreational activity, even if it was less than what was advised, had a 5% lower risk of passing away than those who did not engage in any of the activities examined.

iPhone Lockdown Mode: Proof of Concept Website Can Detect if It is Enabled on Your Phone

Phone Lockdown Mode was announced by Apple as a way to help people who face grave, targeted threats to their digital security. Apple calls this an extreme but optional protection for a small number of users, including journalists, politicians, and for human rights advocates, who are in the crosshairs of state-sponsored spyware, like Pegasus, which was developed by Israeli-based NSO group. However, it looks like that a simple, proof of concept website can detect whether you have the mode enabled and may potentially make you a target. As per a report by Motherboard, a proof of concept website developed by John Ozbay, who is a privacy activist and the CEO of privacy focused company Cnrylee, can instantaneously detect whether you are using the Lockdown Mode on your iPhone or not. Apple developed this feature to add a new layer of protection after at least two Israeli firms exploited flaws in Apple's software to remotely break into iPhones without the target needing to click or tap anything. Pegasus spyware by NSO Group can carry out such attacks by injecting malware and accessing private user data.

Earlier, in the recently concluded Commonwealth Games 2022 in Birmingham, Chirag and Satwik had also won a gold medal in the men's doubles category.

US Open: Serena to face Kovinic in opening round

NEW YORK: In what is set to be her final tournament, 23-time major champion America's Serena Williams will face Montenegro's Danka Kovinic in the women singles opening round of the US Open, season's final Grand Slam tournament, starting from August 29.

Earlier this month, Williams announced her impending retirement after the US Open. A six time US Open champion will face world No.80 Kovinic for the first time.

The 27-year-old Montenegrin reached a career-high ranking of No.46 in 2016 and became the first woman from her country to win a WTA Tour title last year at Charleston.

In January, Kovinic broke new ground for Montenegro at the Australian Open after defeating Emma Raducanu to become the first woman from her country to reach the third round of a Slam. The winner of that opener will face either No.2 Anett Kontaveit or Romania's Jaqueline Cristian.

World No.1 Iga Swiatek of Poland topped the draw and will face Italy's Jasmine Paolini in the first round. The winner will face either 2018 champion Sloane Stephens of America or Belgium's Greet Minnen.

Also drawn into Swiatek's top quarter are three former major champions in No.9 seed Garbine Muguruza (Spain), Jelena Ostapenko (Latvia) and Petra Kvitova (Croatia), as well as the highest-seeded American, No.8 Jessica Pegula. , No.24 seed Amanda Anisimova and two-time quarterfinalist Elise Mertens(Belgium) also landed in Swiatek's quarter.

Team India sweats it out in nets ahead of Pakistan clash at Asia Cup

DUBAI: Team India held a practice session in Dubai on Thursday ahead of their Asia Cup 2022 campaign opener. The Men in Blue will start their Asia Cup campaign in a high-octane clash against Pakistan on August 28. Star batters Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli, Suryakumar Yadav, KL Rahul, Arshdeep Singh, Yuzvendra Chahal and Bhuvneshwar Kumar were among the players captured while sweating it out in nets.

The Asian Cricket Council's marquee event returns after a four-year interval with the 2022 edition of the Men's Asia Cup. Being played in the T20 format, across two venues, Dubai International Cricket Stadium will host nine games including the final, while Sharjah Cricket Stadium will host four games, starting from August 27 through September 11. Defending champions India are also the most successful team, having won the trophy seven times. While the last edition of the tournament was held in an ODI format, this edition will feature the T20 format.

Kishore Bhanushali reveals, "I lost many acting opportunities"

Chandigarh : Kishore Bhanushali, who plays Commissioner Resham Pal Singh in &TV's popular shows Bhabiji Ghar Par Hai and Happu Ki Ultan Paltan, has played various comical roles in his three-decade-long-acting career. The actor is widely known as a doppelganger of the legendary Dev Anand. He has consistently delivered a flawless performance and won the audience's heart on-screen and on stage with his stand-up comedies. In a candid interview with us, the actor discusses the ups and downs of his journey. **Have you always wanted to work as an actor?** I never intended to pursue a career in acting. I believe I was born to run my small family business. But when I was young, I remember one boy telling me that I looked like Dev Anand. I had no idea who he was because, at the time, we only knew Rajesh Khanna Ji as a superstar. Then, out of curiosity, I watched one of his films, Yeh Gulistan Hamara, for the first time I saw Dev Anand. I remember I saw that film during my school vacation, and then I went on to see Jewel Thief, and I gradually realised that yes, I do resemble him. Then I began imitating him standing in front of the mirror, and now it's been 50 years that my name has been linked to his name, and people know me as Dev

Anand's doppelganger.

Did your resemblance to Dev Anand help you break into the entertainment industry?

No, I had to struggle to get work. Many people will not believe it, but I had to pass on many acting opportunities because of being a look-alike of Dev Sahab. But I never gave up on trying. I always believed that where there is a will, there is a way. So, I never stopped, and slowly things turned out in my favour.

When was the first time you met Dev Anand?

I was very young when I first met Dev Anand Sir and told him about my interest in acting, and he advised me to first complete my studies before I entered this world. My love for him and my passion for acting kept me going. Today I perform a three-hour stand-up comedy show called "Kishore Ki Awaaz Dev ka Andaaz," in which, along with doing comedy, I also sing. I have been in show business for over three decades now, and, thanks to Dev Ji, I managed to make a name for myself.

How do you look at your journey in Bollywood?

My journey in Bollywood has been filled with ups and downs. During the 1980s, I did many dance recordings impersonating Dev Anand, earning

between one and two rupees daily. However, my family opposed my acting career, so they married me and forced me to run our small family business. I dedicated myself to my family business for nearly two to three years, but I was unhappy. One day, actor Mohan Joshi Sir approached me and asked me to do a show impersonating Dev Anand. After that, I received an offer to work with him in Pagalkhana, and while shooting, Raza Murad Ji noticed me and suggested that he increase my screen presence, and thus my journey began. Later, Adi Irani recommended me to his brother Indra Irani Ji, who was working on the film 'Dil' with Amir Khan and Madhuri. He invited me to meet him at the Parsi house, now known as the famous Mannat (Shah Rukh Khan house). I was cast in a crowd sequence on the first day, but I was happy that after years of struggle, I had the opportunity to work in a film. I did something very amusing inside the crowd while giving a shot, which impressed Indra sir, and the next day he allowed me to share the screen with Anupam Kher Ji, which I did in a single shot, making Amir Khan and others impressed. Indra sir cast me as a supporting actor throughout the film, for which I received an award from BR Chopra sir.
