**Delhi govt extends  
complete ban on sale,  
use of firecrackers till  
January 1**

**NEW DELHI:** Delhi government has extended a complete ban on the sale and use of firecrackers till January 1, 2023, in the national capital, informed Environment Minister Gopal Rai said on Wednesday. The Delhi Government has extended the ban on manufacturing, storing, selling and bursting of firecrackers in continuation of last year's directive. This year, the government has also decided to online sales and delivery of firecrackers. Taking to Twitter, Rai further said that an action plan will be drawn up with the Delhi Police, Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPPC) and Revenue Department to ensure strict enforcement of the ban.

**Gold falls Rs 225;  
silver drops Rs 315**

**NEW DELHI:** Gold prices fell by Rs 225 to Rs 50,761 per 10 grams in the national capital on Wednesday, according to HDFC Securities. In the previous trade, the precious metal had closed at Rs 50,986 per 10 grams. Silver also declined by Rs 315 to Rs 54,009 per kg from Rs 54,324 per kg in the previous trade. In the international market, gold was trading higher at USD 1,702 per ounce while silver was flat at USD 18.18 per ounce. "Gold held near USD 1,700 per ounce on stronger dollar and expected US economic data boosting expectations of aggressive rate hike from US Fed," said Tapan Patel, Senior Analyst (Commodities) at HDFC Securities.

## India keen to strengthen ties with Russia: Modi

India is keen on strengthening its partnership with Russia on Arctic subjects as there is immense scope for cooperation in the field of energy between the two countries, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Wednesday virtually at the 7th Eastern Economic Forum being held in Vladivostok.

"India is keen to strengthen its partnership with Russia on Arctic subjects. There is immense scope for cooperation in the field of energy. Along with energy, India has also made significant investments in the Russian Far East in the fields of pharma and diamonds," PM Modi said in his virtual address.

Highlighting the thirty years of the establishment of the Consulate of India in Vladivostok and the fact that India was the first country to open a consulate in the city, PM Modi said that India has also made significant investments in the Russian Far East in the fields of pharma and diamonds along with energy.

In 2019, PM Modi participated in the economic forum in person and announced the "Act Far-



East" policy of India as a result of which India's cooperation with the Russian Far East has increased in various fields.

The Eastern Economic Forum

## Punjab CM offers 1000 acre land to GOI for setting up textile park

Fulfilling his commitment to give impetus to the industrial growth in the state, the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann has offered 1000 acre of land in Fatehgarh Sahib district to the Government of India (GoI) for setting up Textile Park under PM Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel Parks (PM MITRA) scheme. In a letter to the Union Textile Minister Piyush Goyal, the Chief Minister has expressed the desire for setting up this ambitious project on the sacred land of Fatehgarh Sahib. He envisioned that once commissioned this project will emerge Punjab as a 'Textile Hub' of the country. Likewise, Bhagwant Mann unequivocally said that this project will also put the state on the orbit of a high growth trajectory of Industrial growth. The Chief Minister asserted that the ambitious scheme will help in attracting investments on one hand and opening new vistas of employment for the youth on another. He said that the Government of India (GoI) has approved the scheme for setting up of seven PM Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel Parks (PM MI-



TRA) across the country in partnership with the interested State Governments. Bhagwant Mann informed the Union Minister that under this scheme the state government is ready for setting up of Textile Park at Fatehgarh Sahib. The Chief Minister categorically said that all environmental clearances and norms as fixed by Centre and State Pollution Control Boards will be adhered to while setting up this Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel Park. He asserted that one of the basic requirements for the project is that the interested state government should have ready availability of contiguous and encumbrance free land parcels of 1000 acres for this project.

## Punjab Police recover 25 more weapons during ongoing operation in MP

Days after busting an interstate illegal weapon smuggling module operating from Madhya Pradesh (MP) with the arrest of two arms suppliers, Punjab Police has also arrested arms manufacturer from Kazalpur in MP, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Wednesday.

The arrested person identified as Sonu Singh of village Signoor district Khargone in MP, has been running a small manufacturing unit of Arms in MP and

was supplying them illegally in various North Indian States including MP. The Police have also recovered 25 more weapons, including 24 pistols and one revolver from his possession, taking the total recovery of weapons from this module to 80.

Pertinently, Punjab Police on Friday had arrested two persons identified as Bhorelal alias Manish Bade and Kailash Mal Singh, both residents of MP, involved in large-scale of illegal manufacturing and supply of weapons from MP into Punjab as well as other states.

## SC to decide on Shiv Sena on Sep 27

The Supreme Court on Wednesday said that it will consider on September 27 whether the Election Commission should proceed to decide which faction of the Shiv Sena should have the claim to the "bow and arrow" election symbol.

Both the groups led by former Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray and incumbent Chief Minister Eknath Shinde have

staked claim over the symbol.

A five-judge Constitution Bench headed by Justice Dr D Y Chandrachud made the observation.

It asked all the parties as well as the Election Commission to file brief notes not exceeding three pages ahead of the hearing.

Senior lawyer Arvind Datar, appearing for the poll panel, said that under Symbols Act, if there was a complaint, notice has to be issued to all the parties. He added that the process takes a lot of time.

## Income Tax raid at Rajasthan's home minister premises

The Income Tax department on Wednesday carried out raids at various premises of Rajasthan's home and higher education minister Rajendra Yadav, in connection with the mid-day meal scam.

A bag-manufacturing factory, allegedly being run by Yadav's kin in his legislative constituency Kotputli, was also raided in connection with the alleged irregularities related to mid-day meals, which benefit lakhs of stu-

dents in the government-run schools in the state.

More than three dozen officers of the IT department and police personnel reached the factory in over half a dozen vehicles to carry out searches, sources said.

"The IT department officials came to my premises at 8 am today. They also raided my locations in Rajasthan, Uttarakhand and Gurugram, where my children and family do business. The search operation is underway, everything will be clear soon," Rajendra Yadav told.

## India now aspiring to take international trade to USD 2 trn by 2030: Goyal

India's goods and services exports have already crossed USD 675 billion in last fiscal year and the country is now aspiring to take international trade to USD 2 trillion by 2030, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal has said.

Interacting with faculty, researchers, and students at the Stanford University here, Goyal also said by the time India would celebrate the 100th anniversary of its independence, it would be a USD 30 trillion economy.

"...by 2047-2050 period, when In-



dia would be completing 100 years of Independence, we will be at least a USD 30 trillion economy on a business as usual scenario and possibly a

USD 35-45 trillion economy if some of the aggressive plans that the government is putting together work well. That's the kind of opportunity that I bring to the table, Goyal said.

India, with a GDP of USD 3.3 trillion, is currently the fifth largest economy in the world only behind the US, China, Japan and Germany.

A decade back, India was ranked 11th among the large economies while the UK was at the fifth position. With a 13.5 per cent expansion in June quarter, the Indian economy has overtaken the UK, which has slipped to the sixth spot.

Goyal said the government has spent the last few years laying the

foundation on which the country can rapidly transform, grow its economy, improve its systems, and engage in technology.

We have recently seen some successes in terms of our international engagement growing to about USD 675 billion (exports of goods and services) for the first time ever last year. We are hoping to do our international trade to about USD 2 trillion by 2030, the minister added.

During April-August 2022-23, India's exports registered a growth of 17.12 per cent to USD 192.59 billion. Imports during the five-month period grew 45.64 per cent to USD 317.81 billion.



# African swine fever confirmed in samples from Mansa village

**GAURAV GOEL CHANDIGARH, SEPT 7**

Punjab Animal Husbandry, Fisheries & Dairy Development Minister Laljit Bhullar, on Wednesday, informed that African swine fever (ASF) has been found in the swine samples from village Talwandi Aklia of district Mansa and this area has been notified as 'infected zones' for the prevention of the ASF.

He said that after confirmation from the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) -National High Security Animal Disease Institute, Bhopal, the Animal Husbandry department has strictly enforced restrictions and declared 0 to 1 kilometre area of the epicenter as "infected zone" and 1 to 10 KM (9 KM) area as "surveillance zone" to prevent the disease in the district. The departmental officials have also been instructed to ensure that no live/dead pig (including feral or wild pigs), unprocessed pig meat, feed or any material/goods from the piggery farms or backyard piggery shall be taken out of or brought into the infected zone and no person shall bring or attempt to bring into the market any pig or pig products which is known to be infected with the scheduled disease. Giving information about the swine culling to prevent the disease in the state, Cabinet Minister Laljit Singh Bhullar said, as many as 735 swine have been culled in four ASF affected districts i.e. Patiala, Fatehgarh Sahib, SBS Nagar and Fazilka.



He said that a total 471 swine in Patiala, 68 in Fatehgarh Sahib, 176 in SBS Nagar and 20 swine have been culled in district Fazilka. "The Punjab government has announced compensation policy for culling of swine and compensation will be given only for the culling done by the

department within the "infected zone" of one km radius of the epicenter notified by the department", said the Animal Husbandry Minister. He said that compensation for the culling of a piglet weighing up to 15 kg is Rs.2200, Rs.5800 for pig weighing between 15kg to 40 kg, Rs.8400 for weighing between 40kg to 70 kg pig, Rs.12000 for weighing between 70kg to 100 kg, while compensation of Rs.15000 will be given for pigs weighing above 100 kg, while swine feed destroyed within the "infected zone" will also be compensated at the rate of Rs.22 per kg.

## VB nabs registry clerk for taking bribe Rs. 10,000

**CHANDIGARH:** The Punjab Vigilance Bureau during its drive against corruption on Wednesday nabbed registry clerk Jaspal Singh, posted at tehsil Dirba, Sangrur district red handed while accepting bribe of Rs. 10,000.

Disclosing this here today an official spokesperson of the Vigilance Bureau (VB) said registry clerk Jaspal Singh was arrested on the complaint of Sukhdev Singh of village Sular, Sangrur district. He informed that the complainant has approached the VB and alleged that the accused was demanding Rs. 10,000 to execute registration of land. After verifying his information, a Vigilance team from Patiala range laid a trap and the accused clerk was arrested on the spot while accepting bribe of Rs. 10,000 from the complainant in the presence of two official witnesses. He informed that a case under Prevention of Corruption Act has been registered against the accused at VB police station Patiala and further investigation was under progress.

Millets production to be encouraged in HP: Guv

Himachal Pradesh Governor Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar on Tuesday said that the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) last year approved India's proposal to observe 2023 as the International Year of Millets, and thereafter the United Nations General Assembly has adopted 2023 as the International Year of Millets. The Agriculture department of the State and the Universities took the lead in the development and expansion of millets in Himachal Pradesh so that we could promote our traditional agricultural produce. In view of it, a meeting was convened at Raj Bhavan with officers of the Agriculture department and scientists of Chaudhary Sarwan Kumar Himachal Pradesh Agriculture University Palampur and Dr. Yashwant Singh Parmar University of Horticulture and Forestry, Nauni, which was presided over by the Governor. On the occasion, the Governor said that millets



provide nutrition support, climate resilience, and a reasonably good income to the farmers. These grains were grown on marginal land by the farmers, he added and said that the State has already implemented natural farming with multiple aims of making agriculture more economic for the farmer and eco-friendly for the environment and indirectly protecting the population from the adverse effects of excessive use of fertilizers and pesticides. Accordingly, the cultivation of millets may also be provided the state support and to that end, a suitable strategy may be laid down, he added. Prof. H.K. Chaudhary, Vice-chancellor, CSK Himachal Pradesh Agricultural University, Palampur gave a PowerPoint presentation and detailed the background status of millets in the State. He said that as per the statistical yearbook 2019-20, millets were cultivated over an area of 6.71 thousand hectares, having an annual production of 5.88 thousand tonnes in the State.

EC may announce HP poll dates late Sep

With leaders of both major parties, the BJP and Congress having intensified their activities in Himachal Pradesh for the upcoming Vidhan Sabha elections slated for November, sources say dates could be announced during the Navratra. There are indications that the Election Commission may announce the election dates later this month, probably on the first Navratra that falls on September 26, they said. This is due to the reasons that the state government is busy doling out freebies to the public through Chief Minister and other ministers in the shape of inauguration of old projects and laying foundation stones of others in all parts of the state. On other hand, the Congress party has been demanding announcement of the election



dates and enforcement of the Model Code of conduct for the elections in the state so that the BJP-led government would be stopped from making any further announcements to woo the voters in their favour. Latest reports reaching here say that while the Congress party has finalized the names of 40 candidates out of 68 seats in the state assembly by sending one name per seat. The final announcement may be made in Delhi on September 15. On other hand, the BJP is in no hurry to announce

candidates and may take some time for the announcements as it is assessing cadre and people feedback about working of sitting MLAs and other aspirants. The appointment of All India Vice President Sudan Singh and Devinder Singh Rana as BJP In-charge and co-in charge for Himachal elections has given the party the boost that it is not going to take these elections lightly. Both these leaders have reached Himachal Pradesh and have been visiting different parts of the state to meet the party leaders and others there and to seek their views ahead of the key selection. The party is going to invite Prime Minister Narendra Modi, national party president JP Nadda and Union Minister Smriti Irani to address public meetings in the month of September to

woo the electorate and to make the party cadre prepare for the big test. There are indications that the Prime Minister may address the BJYM rally at Mandi instead of Sujampur in Hamirpur due to some political reasons. The arrival of Defense Minister Rajnath Singh to honour the families of post - 1947 martyrs of various wars is also an indication that the party is not going to take the elections lightly. On other hand, the Congress party is going to invite its two top leaders, Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi to the state during the elections. Priyanka Gandhi has made Shimla her home by constructing a beautiful house near Shimla. She visits the place from time to time along with her brother and mother Sonia Gandhi for relaxation and to finalize strategies there.

Sewerage scheme facility will also be provided to villagers: Pawan Kajal

The attackers abused him and called his scribe casteist words. It is alleged that the miscreants grabbed the lawyer by the throat and tried to kill him. It is also alleged that the attackers shot Munshi Sukhdev. Two thousand rupees were also withdrawn from his pocket. When the matter escalated, the attackers started running away, then the lawyers caught one of the attackers, Sanju. The entire incident was also recorded in the CCTV cameras installed there. Even today the lawyers expressed their anger over the incident.

## Father rapes minor daughter, arrested

## Cabinet approves policy on long term leasing of Railways Land for implementing PM Gati Shakti framework

The Union Cabinet, chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved the Ministry of Railway's proposal to revise the railways' land policy to implement PM Gati Shakti framework (Cargo related activities, Public utilities & Railway's exclusive use). This will help in attracting more cargo to railways, increase railways' modal share in freight transportation thereby reducing logistics cost of the industry. This will bring more revenue to railways.

No additional expenditure will be incurred. Liberalizing the land leasing policy would open avenues for all stakeholders / service providers / operators to establish more cargo related facilities and render their participation assisting in generation of additional cargo traffic and freight revenues to Railways. This policy amendment will enable employment generation potential of about 1.2 lakh employment.

300 PM Gati Shakti Cargo Terminals would be developed over next five years and about 1.2 lakh employment would be generated. This will increase modal share of rail in freight transportation and reduce overall logistics cost in the country.

## Stubble Management: DC instructes concerned departments to draw up solid strategy

Considering the upcoming paddy season, Deputy Commissioner Barnala Dr Harish Nair called a meeting of various departments including agriculture today to devise a solid strategy for stubble management. He said that apart from the old machines, about 250 new machines are to be given to the farmers.

Decoding monsoons

Exiled to a desolate monastery, a love-sick yaksha in Kalidasa's Meghadhuta urges a monsoon cloud to take a message to his lover. Arab sailors in the early eighth century would look up to the sky for a hint of the trade winds to set sail for Calicut. The cool, moist winds rising from the Indian Ocean precipitate rain all over Southeast Asia, home to one quarter of humanity. The criticality of the monsoon for the region can be gauged from the fact that climate research institutes are deeply focused on decoding the present abnormality of monsoon rains.

In India, where agriculture's share in employment is over 45% and contribution to GDP 20%, the monsoon, Pranab Mukherjee had wisecracked, is the country's finance minister. A pithier comment came from Lord Minto's finance secretary, G.F. Wilson: "In this country, estimating is largely a gamble in rain." The picture has not significantly changed since Wilson's jocular but penetrating remark in 1909. Of India's 140 million hectares of agricultural land, just about 40% is irrigated. If monsoon fails one year, that triggers a severe economic crisis.

Over the past four decades, five severe droughts have ravaged India. Their cumulative impact shrunk the GDP by 2.1%. Rain fury and floods have wrought havoc too. Cyclones, floods and other natural phenomena, the Union agriculture ministry confirmed, damaged 5.04 million hectares of crop in 2021 alone. The loss suffered by agriculture in the past five years has been estimated to be Rs 30,000 crore. A robust showing by the farm sector, the research organisation, QuantEco, observes, could have offset rising health-care expenses, migrants' loss of livelihood and income plunge in other sectors. Monsoon rains also help generate hydroelectricity that has a 40% share of India's total power production. Hydel power is clean and cheap.

In view of the crucial importance of the monsoon for sectors like agriculture, power, industry and the economy on the whole, Monsoon Mission was launched with an impressive budget of Rs400 crore for flawless predictions. Earlier forecasts were based on historical data but the new initiative was a bold step towards assimilating and analysing data from the Indian and foreign satellites and India's Doppler radars. The results were magical.

Bangladesh faces heavy losses due to tax evasion by Chinese companies

Chinese companies are often found involved in malpractices that cause huge losses to several South Asian countries where they operate.

Bangladesh is one such country that seems to have suffered from the unethical behaviour of the Chinese companies. Bangladesh authorities have found many cases of tax evasion by Beijing-based companies or their subsidiaries in Dhaka, Bangladesh live news reported.

In a recent example, a case involving a Chinese company in tax evasion came to light. A Chinese company 'Conda Art Materials Bangladesh Co. Limited', subsidiary of Ningbo Conda Art Supplies Group Co Ltd. (China), supposedly imported goods labelled 'Made in Bangladesh' from China and evaded huge amounts of duty.

Bangladesh authorities suspect evasion of more than 28 crore rupees in about 200 consignments, as per the publication. It added that further investigation revealed that the company was violating the EPZ (Export Processing Zone) policy which stipulated that only raw materials could be imported. However, the company was importing finished products instead of raw materials and re-exporting the same products to other countries.

In April and May this year, authorities, on suspicion of duty evasion, seized about 10 vans and seven containers loaded with goods which the company apparently imported from China by manipulating and luring some Bangladesh Export Processing Zones Authority (BEPZA) officials.

In July, a large consignment of 2700 cartons of foreign liquor from China was seized on Chittagong-Dhaka highway in a special operation by authorities, as per Bangladesh live news.



Back in January, a Chinese company, DG Anti-Fake Company, supplied fake bandrolls (a thin band wrapped around bidis and cigarette packets) leading to fraudulent tax evasion of Rs 250 crore for Bangladesh. The agency has also been accused of being involved in printing fake Bangladeshi passports, ballot papers, national identity cards, birth registration certificates. Chinese economic involvement in the South Asian region is often accompanied by corruption and crime that Chinese government-affiliated companies habitually use in the region to



gain an unfair advantage. Estimates suggest that China accounts for the largest illicit financial flows related to corrupt business practices by value globally, particularly to developing countries.

Meanwhile, between 2011 and 2021, China invested USD 10 billion in infrastructure in Bangladesh but according to some media reports, Beijing had missed fulfilling the promises on several deals signed during President Xi Jinping's visit to Dhaka in October 2016.

After missing several deadlines, work on Karnaphuli multiple road tunnel

project in Bangladesh's Chittagong district, inaugurated by Chinese President Xi Jinping virtually in 2017, started in 2020.

Being built by China Communication and Construction Company Limited, the 9.3 km long tunnel project would be completed not before 2023, said the Daily Star in its recent report.

The Bangladesh government needs to be careful if it wants to avoid the same fate as Sri Lanka, which is struggling with its worst economic crisis due to the huge Chinese loan debt.

Indian-origin barrister Suella Braverman appointed UK's new Home Secretary

Suella Braverman, an Indian-origin barrister, was appointed as the UK's new Home Secretary, replacing fellow colleague Priti Patel who is also of Indian descent.

The new Prime Minister of the United Kingdom Liz Truss had appointed Suella Braverman as her Home Secretary.

"Great to be at @ukhomeoffice this evening to meet the team as we begin our work: making our streets safer, supporting our security services and controlling immigration," she said in a tweet.

"Thank you to everyone at @attorneygeneral for enjoyable 2-and-a-bit years. You are an excellent and dedicated team and achieved a huge amount of which you can be proud," she said in another tweet.

Suella Braverman was previously Attorney General between 2020-2022.

Prior to that, she was Parliamentary Under Secretary of State at the Department for Exiting the European Union from January to November 2018. Suella was elected as the Conservative MP for Fareham in May 2015.

Queen Elizabeth II on Tuesday appointed the Conservative Party leader Liz Truss as the new Prime Minister of the United Kingdom.



"The Queen received Liz Truss at Balmoral Castle today. Her Majesty asked her to form a new Administration. Truss accepted Her Majesty's offer and was appointed Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury," The Royal Family tweeted.

Truss was elected the head of the UK's Conservative Party on Monday after defeating former chancellor of the exchequer Rishi Sunak.

Truss became the first prime minister to be appointed by the Queen in Scotland, and not at Buckingham Palace, as tradition requires.

After meeting the Queen, the new prime minister will return to London and speak outside the Downing Street office.

Pakistan Sikhs seek action against man for tarnishing community's image

Pakistan's Sikh community has demanded strict action against Muhammad Qasim Dogar, who is falsely claiming to be Sikh and posting controversial videos on social media. They demanded action against him for tarnishing the community's image in the international forum by uploading defamatory videos on Facebook and other social sites, Daily Sikh reported.

Qasim Dogar reportedly belongs to the Madina Town area of district Faisalabad.

As per reports, despite several protests and repeated warnings, Muhammad Qasim Dogar has been posting videos, wearing a turban and speaking fluent Punjabi, against a neighbouring country.

Notably, the Pakistan government is misleading Sikhs and the international community by maintaining only a handful of Gurudwaras in the country, whereas there are hundreds of such structures of historical significance that are being ruined and defiled, media reports said.

Hurting the sentiments of the Sikh community, the local administration in Pakistan has been desecrating their places of worship and have been illegally occupying them.

Gurudwaras in Pakistan are being blatantly neglected by the local authorities. The conditions of many gurudwaras are dilapidated.

Many such incidents have cropped up over which the Sikhs have registered their concerns. One such Gurudwara is the historical Gurudwara Sri Damdama Sahib which is situated in Raja Bazaar, Rawalpindi. It was built by Baba Khem Singh Bedi in 1876, reported Islam Khabar. One more example of the sheer neglect of Gurudwaras in Pakistan is Gurudwara Sri Guru Singh Sabha. It is located in Galha Mandi, Sahiwal in the Punjab Province. The building is huge however the local administration has occupied the gurudwara and has converted it into City Police Station.

Another Gurudwara is Gurudwara Qila Sahib which was built in remembrance of Guru Hargobind Singh. They are located in Guru Nanakpura Mohalla, District Hafizabad. These historical Gurudwaras are either converted into tombs, graves or shrines.



Hillary Clinton not in race for President post in 2024

Former US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton on Tuesday (local time) said that she will not be running for President again following her two failed bids in 2008 and 2016.

Clinton was speaking at a news channel where she was asked by the anchor if the leader would ever run for president again.

"No, no," Clinton said as quoted by The Hill. "But I'm going to do everything I can to make sure that we have a president who respects our democracy and the rule of law and upholds our institutions," she added.

The anchor further asked Hillary Clinton "What if Don-

ald Trump runs again?"

The former US Secretary of State responded that Trump would not fit into that category and that "he should be soundly defeated" if he runs again.

Clinton was defeated by Trump in the 2016 presidential election.

During the 2016 election cycle, Clinton was plagued in scandal following the revelation that she had a private email server while serving as secretary of state during the Barack Obama administration, prompting a lengthy FBI probe, Fox News reported.

Donald Trump has been teasing another run for president in 2024, and according to The Hill, polls show that he

has a good shot of clinching the Republican nomination.

Clinton has said that she would endorse President Biden if he runs for reelection the same year.

"Joe Biden beat in a huge landslide victory in the popular vote Donald Trump.

I think that says a lot," Clinton said had said on television in late June, The Hill reported.

Clinton shot down any comparisons between her use of a private email server while serving as secretary of State and the recent discovery of classified materials at Trump's Florida home, saying the two situations are "really different" from each other.

In this training camp, soil testing officer, Dr. Surendra Tamak gave detailed information about the examination of the soil of the farm. Land Survey Officer Dr. Surendra Tamak said that a soil training laboratory has been established in Indri itself to check the soil of the farm. He gave detailed information to the farmers about taking the soil sample of their farm and how after the soil test, the soil health card will be given to the farmers. According to this card, all the information will be available to the farmer: which crop to grow and which fertilizer is to be used. He said that the farmer must get his soil tested in the laboratory so that the nutrient



deficiency in the soil can be cured. Dr. Surendra Tamak said that due to more drugs and chemical fertilizers in farming, the strength of the soil is decreasing, which has a direct impact on production. So cost is getting high and production is getting very low. He called upon the farmers to get the soil tested to reduce the cost of farming and increase the yield. He urged them to use medicines and fertilizers only on the advice of agricultural scientists. Agricultural Development Officer in the training camp, Dr. Satish Kumar told the farmers that they should not burn the stubble after harvesting the paddy crop, but press the paddy residues into the field soil through machines.
