## HC reserves verdict in Shimla MC delimitation case

**SHIMLA:** Himachal Pradesh High Court Wednesday reserved order on an Election Petition filed by former counselors Rajiv Thakur of CPI(M) and Congress' Siminanda who had challenged delimitation of Shimla Municipal Corporation by Deputy Commissioner Shimla and state government. The matter was listed for hearing before the court of Justice Sabina and Justice Shushil Kukreja on Tuesday and Wednesday to cancel the delimitation of Fagli and Summerhill wards.

## Alliance Air to recommence Delhi-Shimla-Delhi flights from Sept 26

**NEW DELHI:** To enhance the connectivity in north India, Alliance Air is all set to recommence its maiden Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) route Delhi-Shimla-Delhi from Monday. With this recommencement, the airline will expand its network in Himachal Pradesh so that commuters can fly to Delhi-Shimla-Delhi daily, Alliance Air said in a statement.

## Sensex slips 263 points

**NEW DELHI:** The Indian stock market's benchmark Sensex slipped 263 points on Wednesday ahead of the US Federal Reserve's monetary policy outcome. The 30 stock S&P BSE Sensex closed 262.96 points or 0.44 per cent down at 59,456.78 points against its previous day's close at 59,719.74 points. Earlier, the Sensex started the day in the red at 59,504.14 points and slipped to a low of 59,275.40 points in the intra-day. The Sensex briefly turned positive during the day touching a high of 59,799.04 points in the intra-day. The benchmark indices have closed in the red after two consecutive sessions of gains. The Sensex had gained 578.51 points or 0.98 per cent on Tuesday. The broader Nifty 50 of the National Stock Exchange slumped 97.90 points or 0.55 per cent to 17,718.35 points against its previous day's close at 17,816.25 points. The Nifty closed in the red for the first time in three sessions. The Nifty had jumped 194 points or 1.1 per cent on Tuesday.

# Raju Srivastava leaves behind legacy of jokes and laughter

Comedian-actor Raju Srivastava breathed his last breath at the age of 58, on Wednesday at AIIMS Delhi, after being admitted there following a heart attack on August 10. Raju, who received widespread recognition after participating in the first season of the stand-up comedy show 'The Great Indian Laughter Challenge' in 2005, was part of the Indian entertainment industry since the late 1980s.

Born Satya Prakash Srivastava on December 25, 1963, to a middle-class family in Kanpur in Uttar Pradesh, his father, Ramesh Chandra Srivastava was a



poet known as Balai Kaka. Since his childhood, Raju was fond of doing mimicry, which is why he wanted to be a comedian.

After completing his early studies in Kanpur, Raju shifted to Mumbai with the dream of becoming a comedian. He started his career by doing small roles in Bollywood films.

The first part he played was in the 1998 film 'Tezaab', which was followed by the 1989 Salman Khan starrer 'Maine Pyaar Kiya' and 'Baazigar' in 1993. Apart from these, he also worked in 'Aamdani Athani Kharcha Rupaiya', 'Main Prem Ki Diwani Hoon', 'Big Brother' and 'Bombay to Goa' among several other films.

On July 1, 1993, Raju married Shikha from Lucknow and the duo had two children, Antara and Ayushman.

Raju then decided to venture into stand-up comedy after he took part as a contestant in Star One's show 'The Great Indian Laughter Challenge' in 2005, where his comedy got a new identity. He bagged the first runner-up place in the show.

During his stint on the show and even after that Raju, who was known most for his acute scrutiny and comical timing about various Indian aspects of life, became very popular for his stage character 'Gajodhar Bhaiya'.

Subsequently, he also took part in the

show's spin-off, 'The Great Indian Laughter Challenge - Champions', where he won the title of 'The King of Comedy'.

After gaining popularity as a comedian, he worked in TV shows like 'Big Boss', 'Comedy Circus', 'Raju Hazir Ho', 'Comedy Ka Maha Muqabala' and 'Laugh India Laugh'. In 2009, he participated in Colors TV's dance reality show 'Nach Baliye' as a dance couple with his wife Shikha. Raju also appeared on 'Comedy Nights with Kapil'. After conquering the world of comedy and making a permanent place in his audience's heart, he also expanded his reigns in politics. For the 2014 Lok Sabha election, the Samajwadi Party fielded him from Kanpur.

# Hate speech: SC says role of TV anchors critical, asks why govt a mute spectator

The Supreme Court on Wednesday asked why the government was remaining a mute spectator to hate speech and also pulled up mainstream TV news channels for holding debates that often give space for hate speech.

A bench of Justices KM Joseph and Hrishikesh Roy said the role of anchor in the TV channel debate is "very important" and "critical" and observed that it's their duty to ensure that guests invited to the show don't indulge in hate speech.

The bench also said that TV channels which often give space to hate speech escape without any sanctions.

"Role of the anchor is very important. These speeches are on mainstream media or social media that is unregulated. Mainstream TV channels still hold sway. The role of the anchor is critical. The moment you see somebody going into hate speech, it is the duty of anchor to immediately see that he doesn't allow that person," said Justice Joseph.

The apex court was hearing a batch of pleas seeking direction for steps against hate speech



incidents.

The bench further said that hate speech benefits politicians the most and TV news channels give platforms for hate speech.

Senior advocate Sanjay Hegde appearing for one of the petitioners in the case also agreed with the bench and said, "Channels and politicians feed on such speech. Channels get money. They keep ten people in debates."

Jai Ram Thakur said that the State has



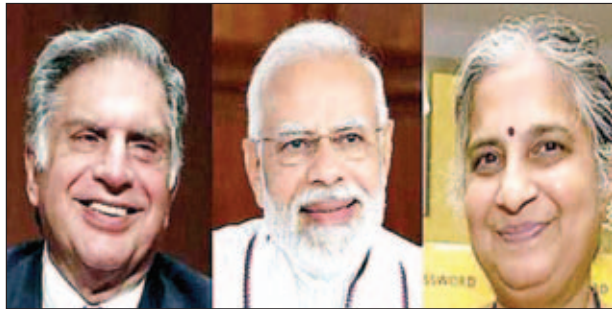
made unmatched progress in all spheres in the development during these 75 years and credit of this goes to the able leadership the State got and the hardworking employees, farmers, youth and general people of the State.

## Punjab Guv cancels one-day special session called by state govt

Punjab Governor Banwarilal Purohit on Wednesday cancelled a special session of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha on September 22. The Governor, in the order, said that the September 20 order stands withdrawn in "absence of specific rules" regarding summoning of the assembly for considering the "confidence motion" only called by the Punjab government. This comes after opposition in Punjab slammed the AAP government over convening a special session to prove its majority in the House. Congress leaders Partap

Singh Bajwa, MLA Sukhpal Singh Khaira MLA and BJP's state unit chief Ashwani Sharma stated that "there is no legal provision to convene a Special Session to move 'Confidence Motion' only, in favour of the State Government." "This matter was examined and a legal opinion was sought from Satya Pal Jain, Additional Solicitor General of India. He has given his legal opinion that there is no specific provision regarding summoning of the Assembly for considering the 'Confidence Motion' only, in the Punjab Vidhan Sabha Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business," an order released.

## BEWARE OF TOUTS & MIDDLEMEN IN RRB EXAMINATIONS

### Know the Truth & Facts

**Q Bogus claims are being made to deposit the form for application for recruitment by RRBs. Is the application process still open?**

**A:** No. The applications were invited by RRBs for CEN RRC 01/2019 - Level 1 (Erstwhile Group D) recruitment in year 2019. The exam could not be held earlier due to COVID pandemic. Now, application process is closed.

**Q Is it possible to provide answer key to the candidate before or at the start of exam?**

**A:** The question paper is in highly encrypted form (256-bit encryption), and no one other than the candidate can have access to the question paper. Candidate gets to see the question paper once he does second & final login into the computer at the time of commencement of the examination. Final decryption of question paper takes place at this instance only. Hence no answer key can be prepared by any person and such claims are totally false, baseless and misleading.

**Q What other safeguards are in place to prevent malpractices in the RRB examinations?**

**A:** The sequence of questions in the question paper is randomized/shuffled along with the randomization/shuffling of all four options available for the question. Each candidate in the exam centre thus has a unique question paper and no two candidates can have same question papers with given sequence of questions & options. This is a system generated through computer logic without any manual intervention. Therefore it is impossible to make answer key for the unique question paper given to the candidate.

**Q Is it possible to get the desired center, desired lab/room or desired node/seat in the exam center?**

**A:** The allocation of the centre to the candidates is randomized through computer logic. The exam center is made known to the candidate only four days before the exam date. Once candidates report at the exam centre and register themselves, the allocation of lab/room is done through computerized randomization. Node/seat in a lab/room is allotted in the similar fashion once candidate reaches at the lab/room. Hence no one can ensure you desired center, desired lab/room or desired node/seat.

**Q What additional mode of verification has been introduced by RRBs?**

**A:** First time in the history of examinations, real-time Aadhaar based biometric authentication of candidates and the exam centres has been introduced at all India level by the RRBs. This is in addition to the measures already in place, like CCTV coverage of each and every computer, capturing and verifying biometrics at each stage of the recruitment process (right upto joining), taking photographs and handwritten paragraph, mid-exam biometrics including every time after bio-break etc.

**Q What is the level of supervision and control over the exam process?**

**A:** Strict vigilance is being done by Railway Staff pre/during/post exams. As a result, a number of candidates involved in malpractice/unfair means are being regularly caught. RRBs also deploy two persons including one RPF personnel in Server Room to keep watch on any suspicious activities.

**Q Can a candidate answer all the questions towards the end of exam?**

**A:** A complete log record of all the responses given by the candidate along with time for those responses is maintained and such candidates gets identified for abnormal activity from their nodes.

**Q Can someone ensure you job in Railways through dubious means?**

**A:** As enumerated above it is impossible for someone to get the candidate selected in Railways through dubious means. RRBs have filed FIRs/GDs in Police Stations against candidates and individuals indulging in malpractices and such candidates have been debarred from appearing in future RRB exams for life.

**Q Where should candidates report all these false claims of providing employment through bogus means?**

**A:** As lots of touters and dealers are active, candidates are advised not to fall prey to such elements and damage their career prospects. All such cases should be reported immediately at following number and email id: **Contact Number: 0755-2746660 • Email id: msrrbbpl@gmail.com**

Anyone who is offering such false promises for job is befooling the candidates. RRB aspirants should not explore Touts/Unscrupulous elements as it is impossible to manipulate RRB system of examination by any means. This may invite penal action as well as debarment from future examinations.

In order to maintain the polio-free status of Punjab, the Punjab Health Department under the visionary leadership of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, in its three-day Pulse Polio drive has immunised 14,24,142 children under the Sub National Immunisation Day (SNID) drive, revealed Health and Family Welfare Minister Chetan Singh Jauramajra.

This door to door drive was carried out in 12 districts of Punjab to ensure that every child less than five years of age was administered polio drops, said Chetan Singh Jauramajra while adding that Health department teams paid special attention to vulnerable areas such as brick kilns, railway stations, bus terminals, construction sites and slums. Appreciating the tireless efforts



of the volunteers, the Health and Family Welfare Minister stated that the state health department had deployed 11,865 polio vaccination teams and they all made commendable efforts for the success of this drive. The teams during the door-to-door activity ensured that every child is administered polio drops. The Health department Punjab and World Health Organisation had deployed internal supervisors and external monitors for multi-level monitoring at various levels. Health depart-

ment had a target of 14,83,072 and this drive has been able to achieve 96.03 per cent of its set target and health officials have been instructed to immunise the remaining children by visiting the houses. The house-to-house mop-up rounds will continue for up to five days to identify and vaccinate children who missed getting vaccinated during the drive. This drive was supported by technical partners and volunteers from WHO, Rotary and other civil society organizations. It is worth mentioning that the district wise performance with regard to coverage of children is as follows, SBS Nagar 100 %, Fazilka 99.58 %, Tarn Taran 99.40 %, Shri Muktsar Sahib 98.74 %, Bathinda 97.53 %, Pathankot 96.82 %, Moga 95.47 %, Amritsar 94.41 %, Faridkot 94.14 %, Shri Fatehgarh Sahib 94.06, Patiala 92.66%.

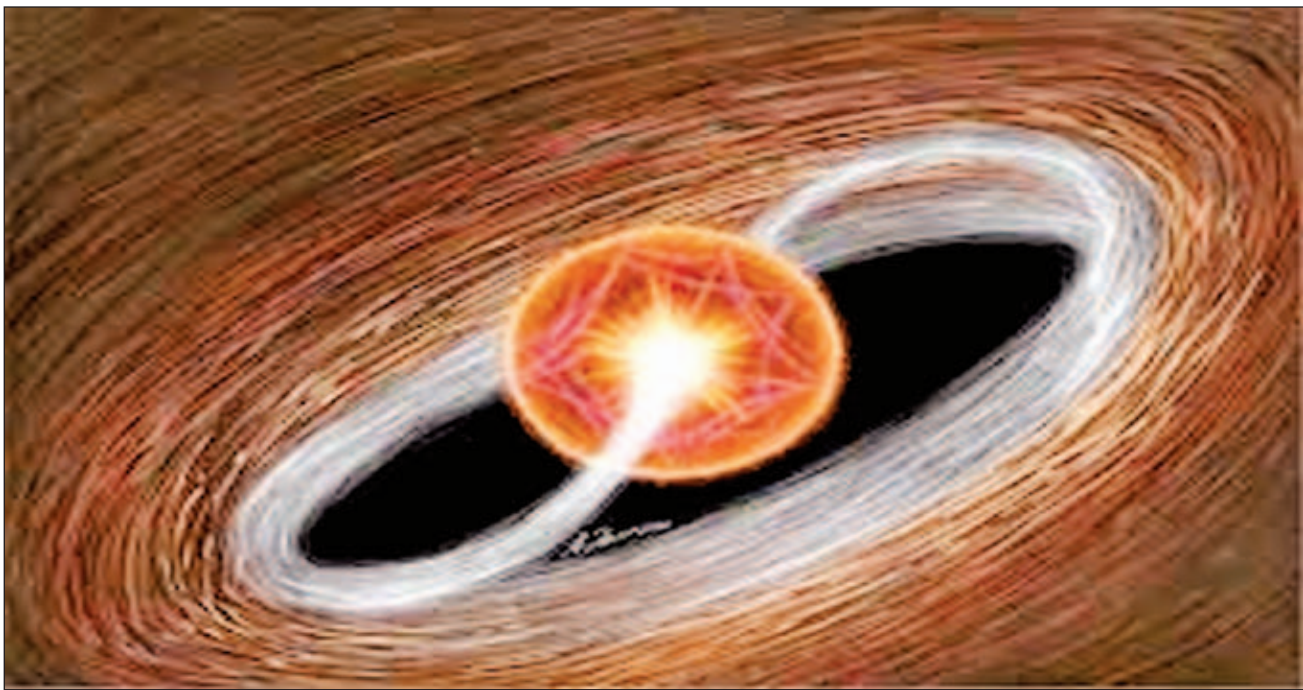

# The nowhere people

Stars are called "children" as long as they are not yet burning hydrogen to helium in their cores. At this stage, they are on the pre-main sequence; after ignition, they become adults and move onto the main sequence. "Research on stars has so far focused mainly on adult stars -- such as our Sun" says Thomas Steindl, a member of Konstanze Zwintz's research group and lead author of the study. "Even if it sounds counterintuitive at first glance, so far little attention has been paid to the evolution of the pre-main sequence be-



musical instrument, even subtle differences in the composition lead to significant changes in the tone. Thus, our modern models better describe the oscillations in real stars." Konstanze Zwintz is delighted with this discovery and is very optimistic about the future: "I was already convinced about 20 years ago, when I first saw the oscillation of a young star in front of me on the screen, that I would one day be able to prove the significance of early stellar evolution on the 'adult' star. Thanks to the great work of Thomas Steindl, we have now succeeded: Definitely a eureka moment for our research group and another milestone for a better understanding of the growth steps of stars."

# Diabetic teens should be screened for depression with caution

"Depression screening is crucial for youth with Type 1 diabetes since depression treatment is likely to keep them healthier now and in the long run," said the paper's lead author, Arwen M. Marker, PhD, a pediatric psychology fellow at Primary Children's Hospital of Salt Lake City. "We need to know which screening tools perform best and how best to use them in this population, so we do not fail to identify depressed kids and get them the support they need."

## Endangered mouse study shares no-contact sampling method


The technique is simple: Scientists bait boxes with a snack of seeds, millet and oats, and lay down cotton bedding. The mice are free to come and go. A researcher returns a week later to collect the lab's fecal pellets for genetic sampling. There, a unique species identification test differentiates salt marsh harvest mice samples from those of other ro-



dents that may have used the bait box. Contrast that process with the more common and intensive method of live trapping: A team of three to five researchers check traps at sunrise and sunset for several consecutive days. To prevent animal drownings, those traps must be placed above the tide line, ruling out several areas of tidal marsh habitat. But with the new, noninvasive technique, mice can leave at any time, allowing researchers to monitor more marshes and more mice, safely and efficiently. "Our genetic identification method is simple, inexpensive, and can be adapted to other small mammal systems," said lead author Cody Aylward, a recent graduate and former doctoral student of the Mammalian Ecology.

# ***Fitness trackers discover connections between exercise, mental health***

A group of people are participating in an outdoor fitness class. They are wearing headphones and using kettlebells. The participants are dressed in athletic wear, and the setting appears to be a paved area with a brick building in the background.

They expected that more active individuals would have better memory performance and mental health, but the results were more nuanced. People who tended to exercise at low intensities performed better at some

overall, but the specific areas of improvement depended on which types of activity people did. The researchers found that participants who often exercised at moderate intensities tended to perform better on the episodic memory tasks while participants who often exercised at high intensities did better on the spatial memory tasks. Sedentary participants who seldom exercised tended to perform worse on the spatial memory tasks. The researchers also identified connections between participants' mental health and their memory performance. Participants with self-reported anxiety or depression tended to perform better on the spatial and associative memory tasks, while those with self-reported bipolar disorder tended to perform better on the episodic memory tasks.

## Easy bruising, excessive bleeding? These could be signs of a disorder called Immune Thrombocytopenia: experts

Chandigarh, : In the backdrop of Global ITP (Immune Thrombocytopenia) awareness month, leading healthcare professionals in the city have emphasized the need to create awareness around the condition- an autoimmune blood disorder that occurs when the platelet count becomes too low. Immune thrombocytopenia (ITP) occurs with an incidence rate of 1.6 to 3.9 per 100,000 patient years, which increases with age and has a slight female preponderance[1]. It is a chronic disease in which patients must take lifelong treatment and hence, experts stress its appropriate management. Dr. Subhash Varma, Professor, Head of Internal Medicine, Fortis Hospital, Chandigarh says, "Increased bleeding is one of the most common symptoms of ITP. The risk of bleeding increases as the platelet counts decreases but is variable from patient to patient. Depending upon the site of bleed patients may experience symptoms differently- purple bruises (ecchymosis), small red dots (petuts) that look like a rash, heavy menstrual periods, fatigue, and nosebleeds. Also, some of the symptoms of this condition might be experienced in other medical problems with low platelet counts. Hence it is beneficial to consult a healthcare provider for a proper diagnosis."

Dr. Rahul Naithani, Director- Bone Marrow Transplantation & Clinical Hematology at Max Healthcare, Saket says, "Spontaneous or increased bleeding with trauma is one of the most common symptoms of ITP which implies that platelets in the blood are low. Patients may experience a variety of symptoms including exhaustion, gum and nose bleeds, purple bruises, and severe menstrual bleeding. The



risk for bleeding develops if a platelet count falls below 20,000/cmm and only less than 1 patient in 1000 has experienced life-threatening bleeding patients whose platelet counts are less than 10,000/cmm. The usual aim of therapy is to keep platelet counts in a safe range which is usually more than 20,000-30,000/cmm. Patients who are taking blood

thinners must be cautious as they are at higher risk of bleeding if the platelet count is below 50,000/cmm."

He continued, "There may be patients for whom some of these symptoms, such as heavy period bleeding, might be more severe, and the treating physician needs to consider these for accurate disease management. The diagnosis of ITP is usually done through a blood count and a peripheral blood smear to evaluate the platelet levels and characteristics. The treatment course depends on the platelet count and the frequency of bleeding. Platelet transfusions are usually futile unless serious bleeding occurs (as transfused platelets are also destroyed). Patients must understand the chronic nature of the illness. The single most important thing to realize is that platelet count is not of significance, but bleeding manifestations are."

The treatment for ITP is usually through oral medication. In severe cases, platelet transfusion and intravenous immune globulin (IVIg) are prescribed. ITP, per se, is not a life-threatening condition and most of the patients lead normal lives. It can be managed well by making some lifestyle changes and appropriate treatment. In a few cases, patients might be advised to avoid certain medications that affect platelets.

India batter Suryakumar Yadav and all-rounder Hardik Pandya have made huge gains in the ICC Men's T20I Player Rankings after fine efforts in the opening T20I of their three-match series against Australia in Mohali on Tuesday, with the former overtaking Pakistan's Babar Azam to gain the third spot.

Yadav has moved up one slot after scoring 46 off 25 balls while Pandya's knock of 71 in 30 balls has lifted him 22 places to 65th position. Pandya has also overtaken Australia's Glenn Maxwell to take the fifth position among all-rounders. Axar Patel has moved up the list for bowlers, his haul of three for 17 taking him from 57th to 33rd position.

For Australia, Player of the Match Cameron Green has entered the top 100 after smashing a 30-ball 61 while fast bowler Josh

Hazlewood, who grabbed two wickets in the match, retains No. 1 position in the bowlers' list. Coming to Mohali T20I, after being put to bat first by Australia, India lost skipper Rohit Sharma (11) and Virat Kohli (2) for cheap scores. This left Men in Blue struggling at 35/2. KL Rahul (55) and Suryakumar Yadav (46) then stabilised the innings with a 68-run stand. Then, Hardik Pandya played a brilliant knock of 71\* off just 30 balls with seven fours and five sixes to finish the innings at 208/6. Pacers Nathan Ellis (3/30) and Josh Hazlewood (2/39) were the most successful Aussie bowlers. Chasing 209, openers Aaron Finch (22) and Cameron Green stitched a quickfire 39-run stand to get Australia off to a solid start. Green played some really impressive strokes and stitched a 70-run stand with Steve Smith (35). Green was dismissed for an impressive 61 off 30 balls.

Like Veerpal Kaur, a beneficiary of Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY), six other women of the same village have also started the business of white shrimp production in an area of about 18 acres including 30 ponds.

to the women belonging to scheduled caste, and tribe beneficiaries, while 40 percent is given to the general category.
