## Ankita Bhandari case: SIT recovers 2 vehicles used in crime

**DEHRADUN:** The Uttarakhand Police probing the horrific Ankita Bhandari murder case said Tuesday that the SIT had recovered two vehicles allegedly used in the crime from a resort where Ankita worked in Rishikesh. DIG P Renuka Devi said the SIT will now record the statements of the women employees of the Vantara Resort, owned by the main accused Pulkit Arya, son of expelled BJP leader Vinod Arya. "We are analysing all the evidence. A post-mortem report has been received. We will record the statements of women who worked at the resort. Two motorcycles used in the crime have been found."

## Veteran star Asha Parekh to be conferred with Dada Saheb Phalke award

**NEW DELHI:** Veteran actor Asha Parekh will be honoured with the Dada Saheb Phalke award for 2020, the highest recognition in the field of Indian cinema, Union Minister for Information and Broadcasting Anurag Thakur said on Tuesday. Parekh, 79, will be presented with the award during the 68th National Film Awards ceremony, to be held on Friday. The five-member Dada Saheb Phalke Award committee - comprising Asha Bhosle, Hema Malini, Poonam Dhillon, Udit Narayan, and TS Nagabharana -- decided on Parekh's name for the honour, Thakur told reporters.

## Raut bail hearing adjourned till October 10

**MUMBAI:** A special Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) court on Tuesday adjourned the hearing of a bail application of Shiv Sena MP Sanjay Raut till October 10. Judge M G Deshpande will hear the case that day. Raut was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate in August under the PMLA for his alleged role in financial irregularities related to the redevelopment of Patra 'Chawl' (old row tenements) in suburban Goregaon. The Shiv Sena leader, now in Arthur Road Jail, contended that he is no more required for interrogation and so should be released on bail. He has denied any wrongdoing.

## PM has given special status to Himachal in matter of development: Anurag Thakur

**HAMIRPUR:** Union Information and Broadcasting Minister, Anurag Thakur said on Tuesday that the central government led by Prime Minister, Narendra Modi had given special status to Himachal Pradesh in matters of developmental activities. While addressing a public meeting at Bir-Bagehra in Sujampur assembly segment of the district, he said that with this status the state government will bear 10 percent expenditure for developmental works in the state and 90 percent expenditure will be borne by the central government. He said that a bulk drug park has been sanctioned in Una for which the government would spend 1,500 crores and the private sector would spend 15,000 crores.

# Punjab CM moves confidence motion in Assembly, voting next week

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Tuesday tabled a confidence motion in the state Assembly to prove his government's majority on the floor of the House. News agency PTI had earlier reported citing Punjab Assembly Speaker Kulter Singh Sandhwan said that Mann will table the confidence motion in the state Assembly on Tuesday. According to The Indian Express, voting on the confidence motion will be taken up on October 3.

Earlier describing Congress and BJP as twin faces of same coin, the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann today said that the confidence motion in state assembly has been necessitated as both the parties have joined hands to topple the democratically elected governments in the state.



"BJP is using anti-defection law as a new tool to form governments in the state through back door in the country and unfortunately despite of being its worst victim the Congress is supporting it", said the Chief Minister while introducing the Confidence motion in the state assembly.

The Chief Minister said that BJP has toppled the elected governments in Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra,

Karnataka and others by luring the MLAs. However, he said that they failed in their sinister moves thrice in Delhi and now also in Punjab they trying to purchase the MLAs with money. Bhagwant Mann said that BJP is running behind mirage with an aim to garner power in the state and in this attempt they are using pennies to purchase Aces of AAP.

The Chief Minister said that BJP his using its money-

bags to cause an irreparable loss to the democracy. He said that in the past Congress has done the same and now the saffron party is following its footsteps. Citing an example of connivance amongst Congress and BJP, Bhagwant Mann said that Congress leadership has started 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' from Kanyakumari to Kashmir but the poll bound states of Gujarat and Himachal Pradesh have been deliberately excluded to give benefit to the BJP.

The Chief Minister said that the Aam Aadmi Party has set new agenda of public welfare in the politics. He said that due to this the BJP leadership has been forced to shun its divisive agenda and talk about the well being of people. Bhagwant Mann said that it is the AAP effect that the leaders who had divided the people are now seen inaugurating schools, colleges and hospitals.

# Farmers will get compensation for crop loss: Haryana CM

Narendra Modi, for renaming the Chandigarh airport after Shaheed Bhagat Singh. It will be a very auspicious thing that on the birth anniversary of Shaheed Bhagat Singh on September 27, the airport would be officially renamed.

## Amid crisis in Raj Congress, Sachin Pilot arrives in Delhi

Amid the ongoing political crisis in Rajasthan, Congress leader Sachin Pilot on Tuesday reached Delhi from Jaipur, but the reason for his arrival has not yet been disclosed. Earlier, Pilot denied media reports stating that he told the party high command that Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot should not remain in office if he decides to contest the party presidential poll. It was ear-

lier reported quoting the sources that Pilot had told the high command that it was his responsibility to bring the MLAs together. Refuting the reports, the Congress leader said that he had spoken neither with the party's high command nor with Rajasthan CM Ashok Gehlot. "Am afraid this is false news being reported", he tweeted. Notably, Pilot is being seen as the successor of Ashok Gehlot in Rajasthan which is engulfed by a political crisis triggered apparently by Gehlot agreeing to file his nomination.



kg of phosphorus, 400 kg of organic matter and 1.2 kg of sulfur and 50 to 70 percent of nutrients are destroyed in the soil. He said that by burning the cord, poisonous gases like 70 percent carbon oxide, 7 percent carbon monoxide, sulfur oxide, 2.09 percent nitric oxide and 0.66 methylene are produced, which pollute the environment, causing harm to humans and animals. Breathing becomes difficult. He said that the Department of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare

has given Happy Seeder, Super Seeder, Zero Drill, MB to farmer groups, cooperative societies and farmers to manage stubble in the fields. Plow, Chopper cum Shredder, Mulcher, Rotary Slicer, Super SMS etc. latest agricultural machinery is being provided on subsidy. He appealed to the farmers to sow the next crops without setting the paddy stubble on fire. The nearest agriculture office can also be contacted for more information regarding straw disposal.



Lumpy skin virus wreaking havoc  
in Himachal Pradesh too

Lumpy skin virus, which started in South Africa from the year 2019, is wreaking havoc in the entire country of India including the land of Himachal Pradesh. The first case was reported in the country on June 29, after which major cases were reported in Solan, Sirmaur in Himachal along with Kangra in August. So far 20 thousand 800 cows have been found infected in district Kangra itself. In which 1656 cows died. There is a slight relief in this that 15 thousand cows have been recovered, they have been saved safely. So in this way, there is 50 percent protection, while if we talk about the death rate, then 5 percent is being told by the Animal Husbandry Department, Kangra. The great thing in this is that till now the lumpy virus has not been declared a pandemic.



Efforts are also being made by the state government, but it has not been declared an epidemic. Due to which also big problems are being faced in dealing with it completely. Its biggest problem has come to the fore that the lumpy virus vaccine is not being available on time. The campaign to vaccinate the lumpy virus has been started in district Kangra. Under this, 28000 animals have been vaccinated, but the important thing is that only those animals who do not have lumpy virus, which are completely safe, are being vaccinated to keep them safe. While efforts are being made to cure the cows that are

infected with the virus by giving them medicines. It has also been said by the state government that compensation will be given on the death of 20 thousand per cow. Apart from this, cases of virus have started coming in Gaushalas too, and in such a situation, the matter of isolating them is being done by the Animal Husbandry Department. While such cases are also being reported in the cattle roaming in the destitute streets, so vaccination is also being done, whereas at present, in view of the virus, they have been completely banned from taking any destitute animal to the cowshed. Is. In such a situation, the Lumpy virus, which is becoming terrible, remains a big threat to the cattle. But not declaring it an epidemic and non-availability of vaccination remains a big problem for the livestock farmers and farmers.

# No commercial activities within 500 metres of Taj Mahal: SC

The Supreme Court has directed the Agra Development Authority to immediately stop all commercial activities within a 500-metre radius from the peripheral wall of the iconic Taj Mahal.

A bench of Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul and AS Oka told the Agra Development Authority to ensure compliance with its order in relation to the 17th-century white marble mausoleum.

The order of the apex court came while hearing an application seeking direction to the authorities to prohibit commercial activities within the 500-metre radius of the historic mausoleum.

In its order, the top court said, "We allow the prayer that reads-- Direct the Agra Development Authority to remove all business activities within 500 meters from the boundary/peripheral wall of the



monument Taj Mahal which shall be in tune with Article 14 of the Constitution of India."

The 500m-radius of the monument is a no-construction zone, besides strict regulations on vehicular movement. There is also a ban on the burning of wood near the monument and municipal solid waste and agriculture waste in the entire area. The bench took on into the submissions of senior advocate ADN Rao, who is assisting the

court as an amicus curiae, that it would be in the interest of the protected monument to issue directions for barring all commercial activities near the Taj Mahal.

The application was filed by a group of shop owners who had been allotted an area outside the 500-metre radius to run their businesses. They told the court that illegal business activities are being carried out near the Taj Mahal which is in gross violation

The cheetah and beyond

The release of the cheetahs from Namibia has been at the centre of major public events and debates in a manner unusual for India. The cheetah project has led to debate on the wisdom or otherwise of the scheme. There has been a range of views, as should be the case. Missing in these discussions is a wider sense of history. It is almost as if histories of and with nature are being written on a clean slate. As it turns out, the reverse may well be the case.

There have been both hits and misses in rewriting locally extinct mammals in parts of India. Just over a century ago, Kuno saw such an experiment. The site itself is redolent with history as it was a hunting reserve of the Scindias of Gwalior. Madhavrao Maharaj, a reform-minded man, was an ardent sportsman who took Lord Curzon no less out on tiger hunts. Kuno, where lions were originally to have been given a second home and is now the first site of cheetah rehabilitation in Asia, was the site of introduction of lions from East Africa in 1910 and 1920. Colonel Kesri Singh, who was in charge, hoped to breed enough for the ruler and the guests to bag trophies.



The lions bred, but many turned on cattle and humans and were eventually shot dead or killed. But the deeper reality is that princes sought to renature the forest and uncultivated lands to renew their legitimacy. But Colonel Singh was always a sceptic. He would later try and establish that Kuno's resident tigers had killed the lions. Even if that were sometimes the case, the lions had been shot as they turned on cattle and villagers.

A lion was shot in Panna. It was a biological success — in terms of breeding and rearing of lions — but a failure in social terms. Conflicts with humans led to an early end of the first-ever transcontinental big cat.

The Indian Board for Wildlife met first in 1952. Besides admitting to the extinction of the cheetah, it called for a second home for the lions of Gir forest. Three animals were taken to Chandra Prabha, a small sanctuary near Varanasi. Dr Sampurnanand, the chief minister of Uttar Pradesh, was present, and he expressed the hope that the lions would be an attraction as important as the holy city and that of Sarnath. Again, the animals bred but were eventually poisoned or shot.

The lion project of the 1950s failed in part because there were no laws to protect them or the wild prey. The sanctuary and nearby forests had cattle herders but there were no schemes to compensate them for the loss of their livestock.

Sensors into t-shirts to monitor breathing, heart rate



Imperial researchers have embedded new low-cost sensors into t-shirts and face masks that track breathing, heart rate, and ammonia. Potential applications range from monitoring exercise, sleep, and stress to diagnosing and monitoring disease through breath and vital signs.

Spun from a new Imperial-developed cotton-based conductive thread called PECOTEX, the sensors cost little to manufacture. Just \$0.15 produces a metre of thread to seamlessly integrate more than ten sensors into clothing, and PECOTEX is compatible with industry-standard computerised embroidery machines.

The first author of the research Fahad Alshabouna, PhD candidate at Imperial's Department of Bioengineering, said: "The flexible medium of clothing means our sensors have a wide range of applications. They're also relatively easy to produce which means we could scale up manufacturing and usher in a new generation of wearables in clothing."

The research team embroidered the sensors into a face mask to monitor breathing, a t-shirt to monitor heart activity, and textiles to monitor gases like ammonia, a component of the breath that can be used to track liver and kidney function. The ammonia sensors were developed to test whether gas sensors could also be manufactured using embroidery.

Fahad added: "We demonstrated applications in monitoring cardiac activity and breathing, and sensing gases. Future potential applications include diagnosing and monitoring disease and treatment, monitoring the body during exercise, sleep, and stress, and use in batteries, heaters, anti-static clothing."

The research is published today in Materials Today.

Seamless sensors

Wearable sensors, like those on smartwatches, let us continuously monitor our health and wellbeing non-invasively. Until now, however, there has been a lack of suitable conductive threads, which explains why wearable sensors seamlessly integrated into in clothing aren't yet widely available.

Enter PECOTEX. Developed and spun into sensors by Imperial researchers, the material is machine washable, and is less breakable and more electrically conductive than commercially available silver-based conductive threads, meaning more layers can be added for to create complex types of sensor. Lead author Dr Firat Guder, also of the Department of Bioengineering, said: "PECOTEX is high-performing, strong, and adaptable to different needs. It's readily scalable, meaning we can produce large volumes inexpensively using both domestic and industrial computerised embroidery machines. "Our research opens up exciting possibilities for wearable sensors in everyday clothing. By monitoring breathing, heart rate, and gases, they can already be seamlessly integrated, and might even be able to help diagnose and monitor treatments of disease in the future."

Next, the researchers will explore new application areas like energy storage, energy harvesting and biochemical sensing, as well as finding partners for commercialisation.

Children succumb to water-borne diseases after floods wreak havoc in Pak

Amid the ongoing devastation caused by floods across Pakistan, children are dying from cholera, an acute diarrheal illness contracted by drinking water contaminated with bacteria.

According to CNN, more than 10 children are dying every day at the Mother and Child Healthcare Hospital in Pakistan's Sindh province alone, according to doctors at the facility from Cholera which is a water-related ailment that stemmed from devastating floods in the South-Asian country.

Balochistan and Sindh have been attacked by numerous infections that caused devastation in the two provinces. The stagnant floodwaters have led to widespread cases of skin and eye infections, diarrhoea, malaria, typhoid and dengue fever across numerous provinces in Pakistan, triggering health threats to people in Pakistan.

"The floods came and the rain fell. And then our patients came in like the floods," said Dr. Nazia Urooj, the physician in charge of the hospital's children's emergency unit, CNN reported. The number of malaria cases in the country had gone up to 229. Despite the efforts of the government and local and foreign relief organisations, many people are in urgent need of food and medicine in flood-hit regions despite the efforts of the government and humanitarian organisations, according to the Express Tribune. A majority of Pakistanis are unhappy with the government's response to the unprecedented natural disaster that has ravaged millions of lives in the cash-strapped country, according to a survey.


After six weeks of flooding, many families from 15 locations were found living under the open sky on roads, and without tents.

Since June this year, Pakistan has endured harsh monsoon weather resulting in a serious humanitarian and development crisis.

According to government estimates, about 33 million people across the country have been affected by unrelenting heavy rains and flooding - the worst in decades.

Millions of acres of crops and orchards - many of those ready to harvest - have been damaged and destroyed, and the next planting season is threatened. Agriculture is a critical source of sustenance and livelihood for the majority of families in Pakistan.

Hurricane forces NASA to delay moon rocket launch



Faced with threatening weather from Hurricane Ian, NASA decided to delay its moon rocket launch mission and haul its Artemis I Space Launch System rocket off its launch pad.

NASA will roll the Artemis I Space Launch System rocket and Orion spacecraft back to the Vehicle Assembly Building on Monday, according to the agency.

The launch team met Monday morning and made the decision based on the latest weather predictions associated with Hurricane Ian, after additional data gathered overnight did not show improving expected conditions for the Kennedy Space Center area, according to NASA.

NASA previously preserved an opportunity for a launch attempt on October 2.

The Artemis I flight test is an uncrewed mission around the Moon that will pave the way for a crewed flight test and future human lunar exploration as part of NASA's Artemis lunar program.


NASA scrubbed its first launch attempt of the Artemis I lunar mission on August 29 due to an issue with an engine bleed, and called off its second launch attempt on September 3 due to a leak issue.

The death rate of cows due to this disease was 2 percent. He said that many works are being done by Chief Minister Manohar Lal for cow welfare. Gau Seva Aayog has been formed in the state. The commission is working to use dung as an alternative to DAP fertilizer, for which lab testing has been completed. Now it will be sent to the area.

He can bowl at the death and he can bowl up front."

"To open the bowling at the other end we'll go with another right-opening bowler, Shaheen from Pakistan, who is a tremendous left-arm fast bowler," Waugh said. "He's a wicket-taker. He sort of lifts the team. He's a guy that other players follow."

"He is a left-armer so that's another point of difference. He

can swing the ball back into the right-hander, he's quick as well, so I've got him number two."

Known for his consistency with the ball, Afghanistan spinner Rashid's help with the bat only helps push his case in the eyes of the Australian.

"In all competitions he plays in, he's just the one guy who you know is going to bowl four overs," Waugh noted.

## Prannoy HS storms into top 15 of BWF rankings for first time in four years

Notably, World Championships quarter-finalists Dhruv Kapila and MR Arjun clinched the men's doubles title at Maha Metro Maharashtra International Challenge badminton tournament in Nagpur earlier this month.

Recently, Prannoy HS became the World's Number one player in the men's singles category in the BWF World Tour Rankings.

In the rankings updated on Sep-



tember 6, Prannoy emerged as the number one shuttler in tour rankings.

The 2022 BWF World Tour started on January 11 and will end on December 18. It is the fifth season of the BWF Badminton World Tour. The tour consists of 22 tournaments which will lead to the final of the tour in December. These 22 tournaments are divided into five levels, Level 1 is the World Tour finals, followed by Level 2 called Super 1000, Level 3 called Super 750, Level 4 called Super 500, and Level 5 called Super 300. Different prize money and ranking points are offered at each of these tournaments. Prannoy started 2022 with a quarterfinal finish in the India Open in January.

Then in the same month, he earned another quarterfinal in the Syed Modi International 2022.

In March 2022, Prannoy earned a quarterfinal finish in the German Open 2022. In the same month at the 2022 All England Open, he could not progress beyond the first round. In the Swiss Open 2022 held the same month, he was the runner-up, losing to Leonardus Jonatan Christie of Indonesia in the final.

During the Korea Open 2022 in early-April, he was eliminated in the first round. In the 2022 Thailand Open held in May, he could not perform well and lost in the first round itself. In June in the 2022 Indonesia Open, Prannoy earned a semifinal finish. In the same month, he lost in the quarterfinals at the 2022 Malaysia Open. In July in the Malaysia Masters 2022, the shuttler finished the tournament after losing in the semifinal.

## ICC Women's Rankings: Harmanpreet climbs to 5th position

Indian skipper Harmanpreet Kaur has climbed up four spots to reach the fifth position in the latest ICC Women's ODI Players Rankings after a match-winning 143 off 111 deliveries against England in the second ODI at Canterbury.

She leads a bunch of Indian players who have made rapid gains in the rankings after some excellent performances that helped complete a 3-0 sweep over England in their ICC Women's Championship (IWC) series.

Smriti Mandhana and Deepti Sharma have also moved up in the latest update that considers performances in the last two matches of that series as well as the IWC series between the West Indies and New Zealand.

Mandhana, a formerly top-ranked batter, who scored 40 and 50 in the two matches, has inched up one place to take the sixth position while Sharma's unbeaten 68 not out in the third match at Lord's has lifted her eight places to 24th position.

Pooja Vastrakar (up four places to 49th) and Harleen Deol (up 46 places to 81st) are other India players to move up the batters' list while new-ball bowler Renuka Singh has gal-

loped 35 places to take 35th position after grabbing four wickets each in the two matches. Fast bowler Jhulan Goswami, a formerly top-ranked bowler, retired in the fifth position.

England's Danny Wyatt, who scored 65 in the second match, has gained two slots to reach 21st position among batters while Amy Jones is up four places to 30th. Charlie Dean has progressed 24 places to get to 62nd among batters and one slot to 19th among bowlers.

West Indies captain Hayley Matthews has grabbed the No. 1 position for all-rounders in the ODI format for the first time in her career after aggregating 88 runs and grabbing five wickets in a 2-1 series win over New Zealand. ## Marketing Board officials harassing oil millers: Bajrang Garg

Despite this, the Haryana Marketing Board officials are harassing the traders for

their personal interest, which is completely wrong. National Chief General Secretary Bajrang Garg said that there is market fee on wheat, not on flour, market fee on gram and not on gram flour. When the market fee of cotton has been paid, then the government should not ask for a market fee on cottonseed, whereas in Haryana about 350 small scale industries are working to extract cottonseed oil.

Municipal Corporation Commissioner Ayush Sinha held a meeting of officials on Tuesday to convert the office into an e-office. He directed the officials to convert the office into an e-office by Friday. First of all, the Yamunanagar-Jagadhri Municipal Corporation office will be converted into an e-office in the state. This arrangement has not yet been made in any corporation in the state. Corporation Commissioner Ayush Sinha said that e-office software has already been implemented by the government to ensure electronic movement of files in various departments. Due to this, e-office software has to be implemented in all the branches of all the three offices of the Municipal Corporation, so that files can be transferred electronically. Moreover, it is much more difficult to keep records of manual files as compared to e-files. With the creation of e-office, files can be easily searched. Apart from this, paper will also be saved. Files can be saved from being lost.
