Bhagwant Mann govt wins confidence motion

CHANDIGARH, OCT 3

The Punjab Assembly on Monday "unanimously" passed the confidence motion moved by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on September 27, even as Congress members staged a walkout.

The BJP members have already announced to boycott the assembly session.

After a lengthy discussion on the confidence motion, Speaker Kultar Singh Sandhwan put it to vote. He asked MLAs to raise hands who were in support, and then asked those who were against the motion of confidence.

Announcing the results, Mr. Sandhwan said 91 AAP MLAs supported the motion.

He also said one of the three SAD MLAs who was present in the House and a lone BSP MLA did not oppose the motion.

No Congress, BJP or lone In-



dependent MLA was present in the House at the time of voting.

AAP has 92 MLAs, including the Speaker, in the House.

"So, 93 MLAs have supported the motion and none is against it. Thus, the motion is unanimously passed," the Speaker said. In the 117-member Punjab Assembly, the AAP has 92 members, Congress 18, SAD 3, BJP 2, BSP 1, while 1 is an Independent. The Assembly had taken up

discussion on confidence motion, with AAP MLAs hitting out at the BJP over "Operation Lotus", alleging a bid to topple the six-month-old government. The AAP had earlier claimed that at least 10 of its MLAs were approached by the BJP with an offer of Rs 25 crore to each of them in a bid to topple the Mann government under its "Operation Lotus". However, as the discussion began, Congress MLAs

staged a walkout, as they were demanding that the Speaker should allot them time to speak and raise issues during the Zero Hour.

The two BJP MLAs — Ashwani Sharma and Jangi Lal Mahajan — have been boycotting the session as they accused the AAP Government of violating the Constitution by bringing the confidence motion in the Assembly.

IAF scrambles to intercept Iranian plane

The Indian Air Force (IAF) on Monday scrambled its fighter aircraft to intercept a China-bound Iranian aircraft following a bomb scare but allowed it to proceed after getting a second intimation to disregard the scare.

"Intimation was received of a bomb scare on an airline bearing Iranian registration when it was transiting through Indian airspace. IAF fighter aircraft were scrambled, which followed the aircraft at a safe distance," the IAF said in a statement.

The aircraft was offered the option to land at Jaipur and then at Chandigarh. However, the pilot declared his unwillingness to divert to either of the two airports, the IAF added.

After a while, intimation was received from Tehran to dis-

regard the bomb scare, following which the aircraft continued on its journey towards its final destination.

The IAF said that all its actions were taken as per the laid down procedure, jointly with Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) and Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS).

The Iranian aircraft remained under close radar surveillance by the Air Force throughout the Indian airspace.

Sources said that the Iranian aircraft was heading to Guangzhou when the first intimation was received around 9 am.

The IAF scrambled its fighter planes from the Jodhpur air force station hours before the preparations of the induction ceremony of Made In India Light Combat Helicopter (LCH) were going on.

5 killed, 43 injured in fire at Durga Puja Pandal in UP

At least five persons were killed when a major fire broke out in a Durga Puja Pandal in which 67 people sustained burn injuries in Aurai area of the district here in Uttar Pradesh, official sources said here on Monday.

Taking note of the incident Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has appealed to the committees associated with religious events including Durga Puja to fully comply with the electrical and fire safety standards in the construction of puja pandals.

Sources said that while three persons died on Sunday night, two others died during treatment at the hospital on Monday, taking the toll to five. "The incident occurred late on Sunday night when the Pandal of Durga Puja being organised by Bal Ekta Club caught fire. As Aarti was being held a large number of people were present inside the Pandal," they said. Sources said that 67 people sustained burn injuries in the incident. "A rescue and relief work was launched immediately by the district administration.

PM to visit HP tomorrow, dedicate over Rs 3650 cr projects

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Himachal Pradesh on Wednesday where he will inaugurate and lay the foundation stones of projects worth over Rs 3650 crores.

At around 11:30 AM, Prime Minister will inaugurate AIIMS Bilaspur, the PMO said.

The Hospital, whose foundation stone was also laid by him in October 2017, is being established under the Central sector scheme Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana.

Constructed at a cost of more than Rs 1470 crore, AIIMS Bilaspur is a state-of-the-art hospital with 18 spe-



ciality and 17 super speciality departments, 18 modular operation theaters, 750 beds with 64 ICU beds.

Spread over 247 acres, the hospital is equipped with 24 hours emer-

gency and dialysis facilities, modern diagnostic machines like ultrasonography, CT scan, MRI among others, Amrit Pharmacy and Jan Aushadhi Kendra and also a 30 bedded AYUSH block, the PMO added.

The Hospital has also set up the Centre for Digital Health to provide health services in the tribal and inaccessible tribal areas of Himachal Pradesh. Also, specialised health services will be provided by the hospital through health camps in the inaccessible tribal and high Himalayan regions like Kaza, Saluni, and Key-long. The hospital will admit 100 students for MBBS Course and 60 students for nursing courses every year. After that, the Prime Minister will

reach Luhnu Ground of Bilaspur at around 12:45 PM, where he will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of multiple development projects and also address a public function, the PMO said. Modi will lay the foundation stone of around 31 km long project for four laning of the National Highway from Pinjore to Nalagarh on NH-105, worth over Rs 1690 cr re. The project road is a major connecting link for the traffic from Ambala, Chandigarh, Panchkula and Solan /Shimla going towards Bilaspur, Mandi and Manali. About 18 km stretch of this four-lane national highway falls under Himachal Pradesh and the remaining portion falls in Haryana, the PMO added.

EC announces schedule for bye elections across 6 states

The Election Commission of India on Monday announced the schedule for bye-elections in seven Assembly constituencies across the states of Maharashtra, Haryana, Bihar, Telangana, Odisha and Uttar Pradesh. As per the release, the assembly constituencies where the elections will take place are 166-Andheri East from Maharashtra, 47-Adampur from Haryana, 93-Munugode from Telangana, 139-

Gola Gokranath from Uttar Pradesh and 46-Dhamnagar from Odisha. The two constituencies of Bihar where the bye-elections will be conducted are 178-Mokama and 101-Gopalganj. The Gazette notification will be issued on October 6. While the polling on the seats will take place on November 3 and the results will be declared on November 6, the release stated. The release also instructed the authorities to monitor the COVID situation in the respective states and adhere to COVID-appropriate behaviour during the conduct of the elections.

Monsoon withdraws from Himachal: IMD

The Southwest Monsoon has withdrawn completely from North Western Himalayan state Himachal Pradesh, Indian Meteorological Department spokesperson said in a press communique released on Monday.

Spokesperson said that Monsoon has withdrawn from the most parts of North Arabian Sea, most parts of Gujarat Region, some parts of West Madhya Pradesh and Uttarakhand; remaining parts of Saurashtra & Kutch, Rajasthan, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and Jammu, Kashmir & Ladakh and some more parts of West Uttar Pradesh today.

The withdrawal line of Southwest Monsoon contin-

ues to pass through Longitude 79 degree East and Latitude of 31.7 degree North to longitude of 71 E and Lat. 20.3 N in between Uttarkashi, Nazibabad, Agra, Gwalior, Ratlam, Bharuch. It is worthwhile to mention that monsoon entered on June 29 and wreaked havoc this season as it took loss of 432 human life and 769 People died rendering estimated loss of about Rs 2,19,226.13 lakh to public and private property. According to State Disaster Management Authority as many as 231 People died in road related accidents, 36 falling from hills and height, 39 from drowning accidents, 28 from landslides, 26 from snake bites, 14 from electrocution, ten from cloud burst, three each of lightning and flash flood and 22 from other Weather vagaries.

IAF inducts indigenously-built Light Combat Helicopter

JODHPUR: The Indian Air Force (IAF) on Monday inducted the first fleet of indigenously-built Light Combat Helicopter (LCH), which has been developed primarily for mountain warfare after a requirement for it was felt during the Kargil war in 1999. Developed by the state-run aerospace major Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd (HAL), the 5.8-tonne twin-engine gunship chopper is armed with air-to-air missiles, 20 mm turret guns, rocket systems and other weapons.

Sensex plunges 638 points; Maruti Suzuki, HUL, ITC slump

MUMBAI: The Indian stock market's benchmark Sensex slumped 638 points on Monday dragged by last-hour heavy selling in auto, FMCG and banking stocks. The 30-stock S&P BSE Sensex slumped 638.11 points or 1.11 per cent to 56,788.81 points against its previous session's close at 57,426.92 points. Earlier, the Sensex started the day marginally down at 57,403.92 points but witnessed heavy selling pressure in the late morning trade. The Sensex slumped to a low of 56,875.05 points in the morning session. The Sensex briefly turned positive in the morning session rising to a high of 57,454.84 points. The markets witnessed heavy selling towards the end of the trading session dragging the Sensex down to 56,683.40 points in the intra-day.

2 dead, as many injured after Gurugram building collapses during demolition

GURUGRAM: An old factory collapsed while it was being demolished here on Monday morning, leaving two labourers dead and as many injured, police said. The deceased were identified as Guddu (35) and Pratap (24), the injured are Ramakant (27) and Naresh (26), all residents of Fatehpur Chaurasi in Unnao district of Uttar Pradesh, they said. According to the district administration, six labourers were carrying out the demolition work of the three-storey building and had been staying on the premises, they said.

In the pay scale to be given from 2016 implemented in January 2022, the technical staff of the fire wing is getting the salary equal to the fourth class employees.

Govt increases social security pension's budget by almost 4 times in 4 yrs

Senior citizens and grieved people like disabled, widows and single women or other helpless people struggling in their daily lives can now not only lead a dignified life but also feel financially independent. This was possible because of a humane and visionary thinking of Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur. He has made a provision of a monthly pension for such people, under the social security pension scheme. Immediately after taking the oath as Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh about five years ago on December 27, 2017 and while presiding over the first meeting of his cabinet, Jai Ram Thakur realising the pain of senior citizens of the state, took a decision to give pension to all senior citizens above the age of 70 years. The income limit for the social security pension was removed for the senior citizen of above 70 years age. Earlier, this provision was only for the elderly persons above the age of 80 years. This very first decision of the Jai Ram Cabinet

had brought a big relief to all the senior citizens of the state, who are in their twilight of life not having any financial support and were also neglected by their family members. An official spokesman said Monday that coming from a very humble background, Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur is always aware of the difficulties of a common man especially poor and needy people, senior citizens and other weaker sections of the society. This is also reflected in the various decisions, welfare schemes, policies and programs of the state government. Now, the Jai Ram government has decided to increase the ambit of social security pension by making the provision of pension for all the senior citizens above the age of 60 years, without any income limit. This unique decision of the state government towards the welfare of senior citizens has enabled the lakhs of senior citizens of Himachal to get a monthly pension ranging from Rs.1000 to Rs. 1700 and they are leading a respectable life. Apart from increasing the scope of pension for senior citizens, the state

government has also provided huge relief to the disabled persons, widows and single women, leprosy patients and other helpless people by considerably increasing their monthly pension.

The annual budget of the social security pension was increased by almost four times during the tenure of the present state government itself.

The state government has increased the pension of the senior citizens of 70 years and above age, from Rs. 700 to Rs. 1700. Similarly, the pension of persons with more than 70 percent disabilities was also increased from Rs.1250 to Rs.1700. Now, about 7.25 lakh people of different eligible categories are getting benefitted under the social security pension scheme across the state, on which an amount of Rs. 1300 crore was being spent during the current financial year. At present, more than five lakh senior citizens, about 68 thousand people with disabilities, about 1.30 lakh widows and single women, 1482 leprosy patients and 150 transgenders are getting social security pension in the state.

The Municipal Corporation Chandigarh declared its office building at sector 17 'Zero Waste Campus'. Smt. Sarbjit Kaur, Mayor and Ms. Anindita Mitra, IAS, Commissioner, MCC checked all the arrangements of collection of waste and its scientific disposal at the office premises, today.

While explaining about the initiative, Smt. Sarbjit Kaur, Mayor said that provisions have been made at floor level to collect stationery waste i.e. paper and other items; red colored bins for sanitary waste collection have been provided at each toilet block of ladies at every floor; wet waste composter in canteen at fifth floor. While e-waste container and old cloth container have been provided



at ground floor besides providing big composter for green waste in the lawn of the office compound.

She said that hazardous waste will be disposed of scientifically by an NGO engaged with the MCC to collect the e-waste once in a week. Similarly old cloths will be collected by Self Help Groups for further disposal in making cloth bags and other

items. She further said that wet waste generated from kitchen at canteen will be processed in a wet waste composter having capacity of 25 Kg per day. The Mayor said that sanitary waste will be collected in red coloured bins from the ladies toilet blocks, which will be further disposed off scientifically. She said that officers concerned have been asked to install shredders to

manage sanitary waste in the ladies toilets. The Mayor said that dry waste i.e. dry leaves and horticulture waste will be dumped in a composter at the lawn inside the office compound, the manure will be used in flower beds and flower pots inside the office compound. She said that all other buildings of MCC will be made 'Zero Waste Campus' very soon.

To support the efforts of the Governments of Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and NCT of Delhi to address air pollution caused due to stubble burning and to subsidize machinery required for management of crop residue, a

Central Sector Scheme on Crop Residue Management has been introduced w.e.f. 2018-19. Under this scheme, financial assistance @ 50% is provided to the farmers for purchase of crop residue management machinery and @ 80% is provided to Coop. Societies, FPOs and Panchayats for establishment of Custom Hiring Centres. The Scheme promote the usage of machines such as Super Straw Management Systems, Happy Seeder, Super Seeder, Smart Seeder, zero till seed cum fertilizer drill, Mulcher, Paddy Straw Chopper, hydraulically reversible mould board plough, Crop reapers and Reaper binders for in-situ management of crop residue and Balers & Rakes which are used for straw collection in the form of bales for other ex-situ uses of straw.

He further underlined that till the time supply from the long term tenders is not started, power utilities should start procurement for the short term via alternate methods like commission agents as the harvesting season has already started. R.K Singh also stressed that measures should be taken for expeditious setting up of manufacturing facilities for torrefication of biomass pellets in different locations to overcome the challenges of supply of biomass's pellets.

Following the narrow 16-run win over South Africa in the second T20I, Indian batter KL Rahul said that the team has been making an effort to get 20-30 more runs than the par score since last one year or so.

David Miller's explosive ton went in vain as Indian bowlers hold their nerve to clinch the T20I series 2-0 with a victory in the second T20I against South Africa here at Barsapara Cricket Stadium, Guwahati on Sunday.

"That effort (to get 20-30 more runs than par score) has been there since the last 10-12 months, since the last world cup. It is something we are trying to do consciously as a team. We have done it a lot of times, whenever we got the opportunity to do so," said Rahul in a post-match press conference.

On his innings with a strike rate of over 200, KL said that the team has been trying to be aggressive and risk-taking while batting first and it was needed from him during the match to score fast.

Questioned on Team India's death bowling woes, the batter said that there are a lot of things the team needs to get better at.

"Before the World Cup, you would want to experiment and see what works for a certain player/certain team. These are great opportunities for teams to experiment. A win is a win, but we will take that, but there is still a lot to learn for bowlers, and scope to get bet-



ter. Previously, bowlers gave only 106 runs in the first T20I. And today we gave away 221. You have to take conditions in mind. It was hot, humid and extremely hard for bowlers to make a grip on the ball. Also, a batter is also trying to smash you on every ball while chasing 238, so it becomes extremely hard for bowlers to execute their plans," he added.

Coming to the match, India was put to bat first by Proteas and they scored a massive 237/3 in their 20 overs. Explosive knocks from KL Rahul (57 off 28 balls), Suryakumar Yadav (61 off 22 balls) and Virat Kohli (49* off 28 balls) helped the Men in Blue reach the total.
