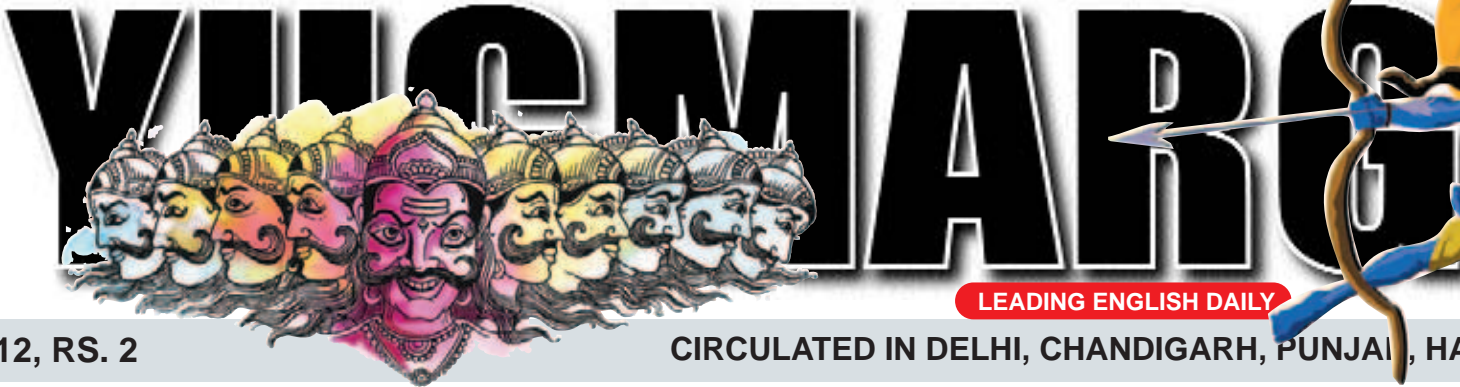

# Paharis, Gujjars in JK to get reservation: Shah

JAMMU, OCT 4

Stating that some people are trying to create a wedge between the tribal communities, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi favoured reservation for Pahari, Gujjar and Bakerwal communities of Jammu and Kashmir.

Shah, on a three-day visit to Kashmir, was addressing a public rally in the border district of Rajouri.

"After the revocation of Article 370, reservation benefits were given to Dalits, backward classes and those living in the hills," said Shah.

He said Modi was in



favour of giving reservation for Pahari, Gujjar and Bakerwal communities of Jammu and Kashmir.

"Many people with vested interests tried to provoke Gujjars, Bakerwals and Pa-

haris by playing a discrimination card in the reservation process but I am saying that Paharis will also come in the ambit of reservation without any discrimination with other communities."

Shah said that three families ruled Kashmir for 70 years but the Prime Minister was seeing a bright and golden future for the people of the region. "The Delimitation Commission was framed to give due representation to Gujjars, Bakerwals and Paharis, which otherwise was a dream," he added. "The 'Modi-Modi' chants in the rally are answers to those who claimed that if Article 370 will be revoked; there will be a bloodbath," said Shah.

The Minister said Modi wanted the youths of Jammu and Kashmir to have laptops in their hands. This resulted in a sharp decline in stone-pelting incidents.

"A sustained drive launched by the Prime Minister against militants and Hurriyat bore fruit and stones in the hands of youth were replaced by laptops," he added. "By nominating Ghulam Nabi Khatana in the Rajya Sabha, Modi proved that he is committed to give due representation to all sections."

Post Article 370 revocation, Shah said that Rs 56,000 crore of outside investment has reached Jammu and Kashmir in three years that would ultimately provide employment to youth.

He hailed Lt Governor Manoj Sinha for announcing a holiday on the birth anniversary of Maharaja Hari Singh.

# 10 mountaineers killed in U'khand avalanche

Ten trainee mountaineers were killed after an avalanche hit them on a mountain in Uttarakhand today. The chief of a mountaineering institute where these trainees had enrolled confirmed the casualties, news agency Press Trust of India reported. Eight have been rescued and rescuers are searching for 11 more.

All the trainees are from Nehru Mountaineering Institute in Uttarkashi.

Uttarakhand police chief Ashok Kumar said Indian Air Force helicopters are helping in the rescue effort.

The avalanche hit the team at 9 am at an altitude of 16,000 feet.

A rescue officer said the injured trainees are being flown to a nearby helipad at a height of 13,000 feet, and



then to state capital Dehradun. Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami's office said teams of the National Disaster Response Force, the state disaster response force and the Indo-Tibetan Border Police are part of the rescue operation. "Rapid relief and rescue operations are being carried out by the district administration, NDRF, SDRF, Army and ITBP personnel along with the team of NIM to rescue the trainees

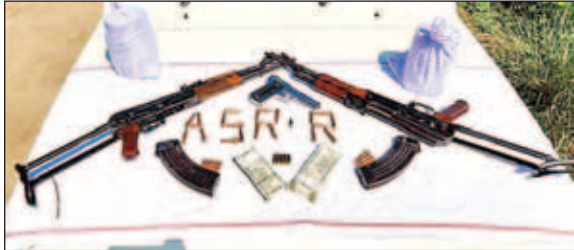
trapped in the avalanche in Draupadi's Danda-2 mountain peak at the earliest," the Chief Minister's Office tweeted. The Chief Minister's Office said he has spoken to Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and sought the army's help. "The centre has assured every help," it said. "All injured and stranded persons will be taken to a helipad at almost 13,000 ft first, and then they will be brought down to Matli helipad.

# Man held with tiffin bomb, 2 AK-56 rifles, 2 kg heroin in Amritsar

With Punjab Police having further intensified vigil and alertness against anti-social elements ahead of the festival season on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, Amritsar Rural Police has busted an ISI-backed Narco-Terrorism module. Its main operative has been arrested after recovering arms and explosives from his possession, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Tuesday.

The module is being jointly operated by Canada-based Lakhbir Singh alias Landa, Pakistan-based



Harvinder Singh Rinda and Italy-based Harpreet Singh alias Happy.

The arrested accused has been identified as Yograj Singh alias Yog, resident of Village Rajoke in Tarn Taran, besides, the Police have also identified five more accomplices, who were part of the module in carrying out illegal activities across Punjab and adjoining

states.

The police have recovered a one RDX loaded Tiffin Box fabricated into an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) or Tiffin Bomb; two sophisticated AK-56 assault rifles along with two magazines and 30 live cartridges; one .30 bore pistol along with 6 live cartridges; and 2 KG Heroin from the accused.

## Mulayam Singh Yadav remains critical

**LUCKNOW:** The former UP Chief Minister and Samajwadi Party leader Mulayam Singh Yadav is still critical and currently admitted to the ICU and is being treated by a comprehensive team of specialists, said Medanta Hospital in a statement. Samajwadi Party patriarch Mulayam Singh Yadav has been under treatment since August 22 for his regular medical checkups and examinations. Still, on Sunday suddenly his health deteriorated after which he was shifted to ICU in Medanta Hospital. The UP CM is 82 years old. As per reports, his son Akhilesh Yadav, daughter-in-law Dimple Yadav and brother Shivpal Yadav visited the hospital on Sunday. Earlier, Telangana Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao inquired about the health condition of Mulayam Singh Yadav who was shifted to the Critical Care Unit.

# PM rally: HP withdraws scrutiny for press

**NEW DELHI:** A notice asking for character certificates from journalists covering Prime Minister Narendra Modi's one-day visit to Himachal Pradesh tomorrow was withdrawn by the administration today as it triggered anger and disbelief. The letter, dated September 29, had asked for a list of all press correspondents, photographers and videographers, "along with a certificate of their character verification". Even state-run Doordarshan and All India Radio journalists were to comply with this.

## Sensex, Nifty rebound over 2 pc amid relief rally in global markets

**MUMBAI:** Benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty bounced back on Tuesday to close over 2 per cent higher on buying in banking, metal and IT shares amid positive trends in global equity markets. The 30-share BSE Sensex spurted 1,276.66 points or 2.25 per cent to settle at 58,065.47 with 27 of its shares ending in green. During the day, it zoomed 1,311.13 points or 2.30 per cent to 58,099.94. The broader NSE Nifty rallied 386.95 points or 2.29 per cent to end at 17,274.30 as 48 of its constituents advanced.

in the state also, the Chief Minister has started Mukhyamantri Bal Suposhan Yojana in consultation with NITI Aayog. The cooperation of the Department of Elementary Education and the Department of Women and Child Development is also being taken in the campaign. Under the campaign, if the children of 6 to 10 years of age are found to be low in hemoglobin, then their treatment will be started simultaneously and the families will be counseled about how malnutrition can be avoided.



He said that artists and artisans from almost all parts of the country are expected to arrive in this fair to be held at Sangrur, for which the district administration is making sure to make adequate arrange-

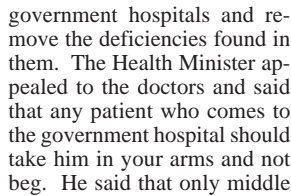

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Tuesday said that AAP is a pro-farmers and pro-people party while BJP has been exploiting the farmers in their ruling states across the country. Addressing a press conference here, AAP's Chief Spokesperson Malvinder Singh Kang said that the Bhagwant Mann government has taken another decision for the welfare of farmers, by hiking the purchase price of sugarcane by Rs 20 per quintal. Now, sugarcane farmers will get Rs. 380 per quintal against the existing

price of Rs.360 per quintal. The AAP government will spend additional Rs. 200 crore annually with this decision to benefit the farmers.

On the other hand, the BJP government in Gujarat has yet to clear dues of about 35 percent sugarcane farmers while in Uttar Pradesh, which contributes 50% of the total sugarcane production, the BJP government has not cleared payment of over 13 percent sugarcane farmers in the state. "This is difference between Arvind Kejriwal's model of governance against BJP's Gujarat model. We are working for the welfare of farmers and every other section of the society while BJP is only fooling the people with their false claims," Kang said. Kang said that at present sugarcane is cultivated on just 1.25 lakh hectares of land in Punjab, although sugar mills have the potential crushing capacity of sugarcane from around 2.50 lakh hectares.

## A question of equality

On September 22, the Supreme Court concluded hearings on the permissibility of the hijab ban imposed on educational institutions in Karnataka. In a case with far-reaching ramifications, there are fundamental issues that must not be overlooked. One mistake in any debate on the hijab ban is the focus on essentiality. In the Shirur Mutt case (1954), the Supreme Court had proposed the test of essentiality. The idea is that only those practices and rituals integral to the religion will be entitled to constitutional protection. This test has since become the bedrock for deciding religious freedom cases.

However, the essentially test is flawed. It often compels courts to interpret religious texts. Since judges are not theological experts, this exercise yields problematic results. For instance, a constitutional court is not competent to read the Quran and consider the varying interpretations of how essential the hijab is to Islam. The test is also problematic as it takes the individual out of the equation and solely looks at the association of the practise with the religion its texts, rituals and concepts.

The question we must be primarily concerned with, however, is that of equality. Article 14 of the Constitution guarantees equality before the law and Article 15 prohibits discrimination on grounds, including sex and religion. The hijab ban is a case of discrimination on the basis of both sex and religion. Discrimination based on multiple identities is conceived as intersectional discrimination. Here, discrimination takes place when two identities intersect: of being Muslim and a woman. In Navtej Singh Johar vs Union of India, while decriminalising homosexuality, the court recognised that the constitutional prohibition of discrimination is not only meant to protect monolithic identities but instances of intersectional discrimination.

The Karnataka government had also passed an order stating that clothes violating law and order must be banned and schools are free to prescribe the dress code. Many argue that the executive order by the state of Karnataka validated by the high court is neutral among religions. This brings us to the doctrine of indirect discrimination. A seemingly neutral criterion impacting one protected group worse than the other is a classic case of indirect discrimination.

# Violence against civilians decreased in Kashmir

After the abrogation of articles 370 and 35A in Jammu and Kashmir in 2019, the Valley has witnessed numerous opportunities to be in alignment with India, as per reports.

For over three decades, Srinagar lay at the epicentre of the increasingly bloody Kashmir insurgency but after the Central government's move, signing up for a "terrorist group" is no longer deemed the only option for those living in the Valley, as per reports. It is to be noted that Pakistan which has occupied a part of Kashmir, has been accused of sheltering terrorists.

Writing in The National Interest magazine, Marcus Andreopoulos said that recently the violence against civilian targets has decreased and tourism has gradually begun to return to the previously very popular region of India.

Marcus Andreopoulos further writes that the Taliban's takeover of Afghanistan last year and coupled with concrete proof of Al Qaeda's presence in Kabul this year, has led to worrying similarities being drawn between now and 1989, suggesting that Kashmir could once again be plunged into darkness.

The author further noted that "this time it's different", adding that the careful cultivation of a Kashmiri civil society and a western neighbour in turmoil means that circumstance has charted a different course for the historically challenged territory, one with less violence and more prosperity for the next decade.

Autonomy has been interwoven into the fabric of the Kashmiri identity since partition.

The author also said that the contentious abrogation of Articles 370 and 35A by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in 2019 have also, theoretically, helped lay the foundations for future prosperity in Kashmir, targeting the many concerns



that had previously perpetuated the violence. On August 5, 2019, the Central government announced its decision to revoke the special status of Jammu and Kashmir (J-K) granted under Article 370 and split the region into two Union territories. During an interactive session in Washington DC recently, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said that Article 370, which gave special status to J-K, was a temporary provision of the Indian

Constitution that was put to rest.

Referring to the abrogation of Article 370, the minister said, "to me, it is mind-boggling, for something whose merit is so obvious, there should even be people who could think in a different way."

Meanwhile, a number of petitions have been filed in the Supreme Court of India including those of private individuals, lawyers, activists and politicians and political parties challenging the Jam-

mu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019, which splits Jammu and Kashmir into two Union Territories -- Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh.

The top court last month said that it would list the hearing of a batch of petitions challenging the abrogation of Article 370 and bifurcation of the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir into two Union territories after the Dussehra break.

## Google shuts down translation feature in mainland China

American tech giant Google on Monday (local time) announced that it was shutting down the Google Translate service in mainland China, citing low usage in the country, as per reports.

"We are discontinuing Google Translate in mainland China due to low usage," Google said in a statement cited by The Hill.

Earlier, several media reports said that the Hong Kong version of the translation service is not accessible in the area without a virtual private network. "Google is shutting down its Translate service in mainland China, one of the tech giant's few remaining products still available in the country," CNN also said in a Tweet, adding that "back in 2010, CNN reported on the end of Google's search engine service in China after it stopped self censoring."

Notably, China is accused of collecting a staggering amount of personal data from millions of citizens with the intention to design a system where they can find out a person's identity, which will help the government in maintaining its authoritarian rule. However, the Chinese government never admitted to the surveil-



lance, the details of the spy technologies at work inside China are emerging from the police research papers, surveillance contractor patents and presentations, as well as hundreds of public procurement documents.

The worst thing about surveillance is its patent illegality. Often people don't know they're being watched. Chinese authorities interfere in the public's privacy without permission.

Earlier, China's 2017 Cybersecurity law made it necessary for businesses that provide essential information infrastructure in China (broadly defined) to keep their data on CCP-run government-run servers.

## Dubai's new Hindu temple all set to open

A new Hindu temple constructed in Jebel Ali in Dubai is set to open on Tuesday, one day ahead of the Dussehra festival. Khaleej Times reported that the temple is an extension of the Sindhi Guru Darbar Temple, one of the oldest Hindu temples in the UAE.

The temple's foundation was laid in February 2020 and the inauguration fulfils a decades-long Indian dream of having a place of worship in the area.

The temple, which will be officially open to the public from October 5 -- the day of the Dussehra festival, welcomes people of all faiths and has allowed entry to worshippers and other visitors to view the 16 deities and other interior works, reported Gulf News.

Welcoming people from all faiths, the temple has already had its soft opening on September 1, 2022, where thousands of visitors were allowed to get a glimpse of the interiors of the temple built with white marble. It has ornate pillars, Arabic and Hindu geometric designs on the facade, and bells on the ceiling.

The temple management activated the QR-code-based appointment booking system via its website on its soft opening.

From day one, the temple has received many visitors, especially over the weekends. The restricted entry has been regulated through QR-coded appointments for crowd management and to ensure social



distancing, the report said. Most of the deities are installed in the main prayer hall with a large 3D-printed pink lotus unfurling across the central dome.

According to the official temple website, Dubai's new Hindu temple will be open from 6:30 am to 8 pm.

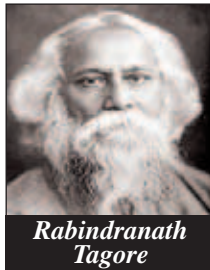

# Survey finds hot summer nights have bad impact on health

Evidence of the negative impact of warmer nighttime summer temperatures on population health has been provided by a survey of residents from Nagoya in central Japan.

In total, more than 1,200 residents filled out a sleep quality questionnaire over the summers of 2011 and 2012. The results showed that sleep disturbance at night increased when the daytime temperature rose above 24.8 degrees Celsius. The findings were published in the journal Sleep and Biological Rhythms.

Using the disability-adjusted life year (DALY) measurement, the number of population health years lost was comparable to the result from heatstroke. This highlights the importance of managing not only increasing daytime temperatures but also providing solutions to achieve healthy nighttime temperatures



so people can get better sleep. Hot summer nights might be nice when you're on holiday, but in Japan, things have been getting a bit too warm for comfort. Talk to a neighbour and the most common greeting will be, "It's hot, isn't it!" It's uncomfortable, to say the least, but what other impacts are these hotter and longer summers having on Japan's sweltering

residents? Researchers from the University of Tokyo conducted a survey with residents from Nagoya to find out how rising summer temperatures might be affecting their sleep. Located in the centre of Japan, the city is an urban heat island which has experienced the largest temperature rise among Japan's three major metropolitan areas (comprising also Tokyo and Osaka). In total, 574 adults in 2011 and 710 adults in 2012, representative of the age and sex ratio of Nagoya's population, completed an online survey over about 10 days each year. "The survey, called SQIDS2 (sleep quality index for daily sleep) was a revised and simplified version of a widely used, standardized sleep survey called PSQI (the Pittsburgh Sleep Quality Index). It assessed seven components, including subjective sleep quality, how quickly people fell asleep and use of

sleep medication," explained Associate Professor Tomohiko Ihara from the Graduate School of Frontier Sciences. "Unlike with PSQI, the new SQIDS2 survey allowed us to correlate overall sleep quality with daily temperature."

The team found that the daily prevalence of sleep disturbance increased when the daytime minimum temperature went above 24.8 degrees Celsius. There was also a significant difference in sleep disturbance between age groups for the male participants, with younger men having more trouble getting a good night's sleep than older men. Using the results from SQIDS2, the team calculated the DALY -- disability-adjusted life year -- for the city's more than 2.2 million residents. DALY is a measure of time lost through premature death and time lived in states of less-than-optimal health at a population level (rather than

for individuals). Used by the World Health Organization (WHO), DALY helps to quantify loss from hundreds of different diseases, injuries and risk factors, which can then be used to help improve health care systems.

"We calculated that the DALY score for heat-related sleep disturbance was 81.8 years in 2012, which is similar to the score for heatstroke. That means that the damage to health caused by sleep disorders due to rising temperatures is comparable to that of heatstroke and must be addressed," said Ihara. "Sleep disorders increase when the minimum daily temperature exceeds 25 degrees Celsius." There were several limitations to the study, not only due to the target population size and restricted age range (children were not involved and the number of respondents over 70 years was relatively small) but also because

other influences on sleep quality were not investigated, such as the mental health of the participants or whether they used an air conditioner. However, this study is a step towards quantifying the damage caused by climate change to sleep health, and the researchers hope it will help climate change legislators recognize the significant impact of high nighttime temperatures and be used to provide guidance for better sleep. "Air conditioners are widely installed in Japan and so their appropriate use may be one solution. I try to acclimate my body to the heat as much as possible, but when it is unbearable, I turn on the air conditioner both day and night," said Ihara. "But this option is not available to everyone and in the long run, promoting measures to reduce outdoor temperatures, both during the day and at night, will be needed."

However we keep monitoring the situation as far as the PLA Air Force goes. You are aware that the infrastructure development continues to take place at a rapid pace across the LAC particularly in Eastern Ladakh," the Air Force chief said at a press conference ahead of the Air Force Day.

"As regards to recent air violations or incursions, we continuously monitor it and we are continuously enhancing our air defence efforts there. We have increased the presence of radars. appropriate, non escalatory air defence measures are always taken on time. I think we have been able to signal our intent and state of readiness with the actions we have taken so far," he said. The Air Force Chief said Confidence



Building Measures are on between India and China and the IAF sees to it that none of CBMs are violated. "If there is any violation... We have an Air Force Officer who is a representative in border talks. The air violation cases have been taken up. We have not established any hotline but we will use Army hotline for communication about air violations," he said.

Asked about China's remark on recent disengagement normalising situation along the LAC in Ladakh where Indian and Chinese soldiers have been

engaged in a stand-off, the IAF Chief said, "The benchmark to judge whether situation is normal (along LAC), I think the best benchmark will be to return to status quo and complete withdrawal from all points all along the LAC, that is the ideal situation that we look for".

Donor Banty from Mohali saves 2 Lives

Life sprang from death again at PGIMER and luck smiled on two patients suffering from terminal renal diseases and hanging in the hope of finding a kidney donor and two other corneal blind patients endlessly waiting for restoration of their sight when a benevolent family from village district Mohali displayed an exemplary gesture of magnanimity and consented to donate the organs of their dear one amid their terrible loss.

The donor family's compassion gave fresh lease of life to both the renal failure patients with the transplantation of kidneys and brought smiles to the other two corneal blind patients with the 'gift of sight'." Prof. Vivek Lal, Director PGIMER, while paying his obeisance to the brave-heart family of Banty, stated, "It takes grit, an elevated



sense of social responsibility and a heart to do what the family of Banty has done. In their act of exemplary courage, they have not only helped give people in end-stage organ failure a second chance to live but have also inspired many more people to donate organs. Donor Banty has not died, instead he will live in four different lives and in the hearts of all of us for his kind act." Detailing about the latest case of organ donation, Prof. Vipin Koushal, Medical Superintendent PGIMER cum Nodal Officer, ROTTO stated, "The consistent efforts at creating awareness about noble cause

are paying dividends as PGIMER continues to trend up in organ donation. With the latest case, PGIMER witnessed 30 deceased organ donations till date in the year 2022 and the magnanimity of all these 30 donor families has given second lease of life to 85 organ failure patients and restored the sight of 48 corneal blind patients, thereby, impacting 133 lives tangibly and kindling hope in thousands of in-waiting recipients."

Banty, 31 year old male from village Chhaju Majra, Landran, district Mohali, Punjab was mercilessly hit by a speeding vehicle from behind while he was going on his two-wheeler from work near Mohali, causing him fatal head injuries on 28th September. After the mishap, Banty was immediately rushed to PGIMER, Banty was shifted here to PGIMER on the same day in a precarious condition. As the ill luck would have it,

all the efforts to save Banty proved ineffective with his condition worsening and he was put on life support. However, nothing could reverse the critical condition of Banty and after four days' of struggle between life and death, Banty was declared brain-dead on 1st October, after following the protocols of THOA. Still in shock and disbelief, the young bereaved wife Nitu Rani said, "Destiny has played havoc with us.

It was so sudden, in four days my husband, the sole bread earner of the family, had gone, and we were all left empty handed with my two small daughters, not able to do anything." When the transplant coordinators approached the family to consider organ donation, the idea of having a chance to save someone else's life made sense to them even though they didn't have the heart to take Banty off life support.
