Massive fire breaks out at plastic company in Noida

Noida: A massive fire broke out at a plastic factory in Noida Sector 3 on Friday afternoon. The thick black smoke rose due to a fire at a building in Noida's Sector 3. Several fire tenders are on the spot to douse the flame. So far no loss of life has been reported. According to the police, the cause of the fire and the extent of damage have not been identified as of now. Ravi Shankar Chabbi, Joint Commissioner of Police, Law & Order said, "We received the information of fire at a plastic tray manufacturing company. Several fire tenders are working to douse the fire."

Rupee record low at 82.32 against USD

Mumbai: The Rupee on Friday plunged 44 paise, breaching 82 level to finish at 82.32 a record low owing to rising oil prices, even rate hike of and of US Federal Reserve too impact on the same, dealer of Foreign Exchange said. The domestic unit slumped 40 paise at 82.28 in early trade. During the day it further lost and settled at 82.32, tumbling down 44 paise as compared to its previous close. The Rupee remained under pressure owing to strong Dollar against other world currencies amid negative opening in stock market.

First phase of Panchayat polls in Haryana on Oct 30, Nov 2

The first phase of Panchayat polls will be held in ten of the 22 districts of Haryana on October 30 and November 2, State Election Commissioner Dhanpat Singh announced on Friday. The ten districts to go to polls first are Bhiwani, Fatehabad, Jhajjar, Jind, Kaithal, Mahendergarh, Nuh, Panchkula, Panipat, and Yamunanagar. Polling will be conducted from 7 am to 6 pm.

"On October 30, polling will take place to elect members of zila parishad and panchayat samitis of these ten districts, while polls for sarpanches and panches of gram panchayats of the ten districts, will be held on November 2," Dhanpat Singh said in a press conference in Panchkula.

The nomination process for the first phase will start from October 14.

"Counting of votes for panches and sarpanches of gram panchayats will take place



on the same day, while counting for zila parishad and panchayat samiti members election, which are expected to be held on party lines and can have a bearing on the results of other districts, will take place after polling in the remaining districts," Singh said.

Polling dates for the re-

maining districts will be given later, he said.

There are a total of 6,220 gram panchayats, 143 panchayat samitis, and 22 zila parishads.

The total eligible voters for the panchayat polls are 1.20 crore with more than 56 lakh women, said Singh.

2 soldiers die as tank barrel explodes near Jhansi

JHANSI: Two Indian Army personnel including a Junior Commissioned Officer (JCO) died after a T-90 tank barrel exploded during the annual firing at Babina Field Firing Ranges in UP, Army officials said.

The field firing exercise was held at Babina Cantonment near Jhansi on Thursday.

Indian Army officials informed that a Court of Inquiry has been ordered to probe into the matter.

"Two Indian Army personnel including a JCO lost their lives after the barrel of a T-90 tank burst during field firing exercise today in

Babina Cantonment near Jhansi. Court of Inquiry has been ordered to investigate the incident," said Indian Army officials. After the explosion took place, the crew was provided immediate medical aid and was evacuated to Military Hospital Babina, where the Commander and the Gunner succumbed to their burn injuries while the driver is currently out of danger and is undergoing treatment. Further investigation into the matter is underway. The Indian Army has expressed deep condolences to the bereaved families of the soldiers who lost their lives in the incident.

HP CM dedicates projects worth Rs. 200 crore in Una

Chief Minister today inaugurated and laid foundation stones of developmental projects worth about Rs 200 crore in Una Vidhan Sabha Constituency.

While addressing a largely attended public meeting at old bus stand Una, Chief Minister took a jibe at the condition of the Congress in the State and the Centre. He said that on the one hand the Congress leaders were on 'Bharat Jodo Yatra', on the other hand several Congress leaders at the Centre and in the State

Dubai Govt finalizes MoU with Hry for investment promotion



Complaint sent to PMO over alleged scam in FCI's Kurali Depot

SHASHI PAL JAIN KURALI (KHARAR) OCT 7

A complaint has been sent by a Kharar-based trader Arun Kumar to the Prime Minister and Food Minister of India regarding the alleged scam in the stock of custom milling rice at the FCI depot in Kurali (Distt SAS Nagar)

In this regard, he had earlier complained to the Prime Minister's Office in the month of September. Arun Kumar said that when it was complained by him that the rice which has been stored in Kurali's Depot has been replaced with very poor quality rice.

He said that about 300 wagon

rice was stored in this depot. After his complaint this depot was checked by the team of the Ministry of Food and Consumer Affairs, Government of India. The team allegedly found that a big scam has happened here. In response to this complaint, Arun Kumar received a letter from the Assistant General Manager, Food Corporation of India, Chandigarh on 15 September 2022. that a number of squads were formed to check the quality of stock at Kurali Depot and based upon their finding, action against the delinquent millers and FCI Staff is being taken.

According to letter the number of official involved have been suspended and process of disciplinary







Centre asks Chief Justice UU Lalit to name successor before retiring

The Central government has asked Chief Justice of India (CJI) Uday Umesh Lalit to name his successor as he retires on November 8.

As per the Memorandum of procedure of appointment (MoP) of Chief Justice of India and Supreme Court Judges on Friday, the Minister of Law and Justice has written to the Chief Justice of India for sending his recommendations for the appointment of his successor.

There is only a month to go for the retirement of Justice Lalit, who had been sworn in as the Chief Justice of India on August 27 by President Droupadi Murmu at the Rashtrapati Bhavan.

He succeeded Justice NV Ramana, who retired on August 26, 2022.

Justice Ramana had recommended Justice Lalit as his successor in keeping with convention and norms of seniority. The President subsequently confirmed Justice



Lalit's appointment as the new CJI.

Justice Lalit tenure would demit office on November 8.

As per the established practice of the Chief Justice naming the senior-most judge as his or her successor, Justice DY Chandrachud is expected to be appointed as the 50th Chief Justice of India.

At the farewell function of Justice Ramana, Justice Lalit said that during his tenure of nearly three months he will focus on three key areas and one of his

top priorities would be to make the listing of cases simple, clear and as transparent as possible.

UU Lalit had also promised to ensure a clear-cut regime where any urgent matters could freely be mentioned before the respective benches of the top court.

He also assured that there will be at least one Constitution Bench functioning throughout the year in the Supreme Court.

Justice Lalit had said, "I have always believed that the role of the Supreme Court is to lay down law with clarity, consistency, and the best possible way to do it is to have larger benches as early as possible, wherever the matters are referred to such benches so that the issues get clarified immediately, the matter has consistency and the people are well aware of what exactly are the contours of the peculiar positions in law."

Justice Lalit was a renowned senior advocate before he became the judge of the apex court. He was appointed a judge of the Supreme Court on August 13, 2014.

Justice Lalit has been the second CJI who was directly elevated to the Supreme Court bench from the Bar. Justice SM Sikri, who became the 13th CJI in January 1971, was the first lawyer to be elevated directly to the top court bench in March 1964.

Born on November 9, 1957, in Maharashtra's Solapur, his father, UR Lalit, was an additional judge at the Nagpur bench of the Bombay High Court and a senior advocate at the Supreme Court. UU Lalit enrolled as an advocate in June 1983 after specialising in criminal law and practising at the Bombay High Court from 1983 to 1985. He shifted his practice to Delhi in January 1986, and in April 2004, he was designated as a senior advocate by the top court. He was later appointed a special public prosecutor for the CBI to conduct the trial in the 2G spectrum allocation case. After Justice Lalit's retirement on November 8, Justice DY Chandrachud is expected to be appointed as the 50th Chief Justice of India.

People are being made aware of dengue and malaria prevention by health department employees and mosquito breeding places are checked. Stating this, Civil Surgeon Barnala Dr Jasbir Singh Aulakh said that pamphlets are also being distributed by the employees of the department to create awareness. Dr Munis Kumar District Epidemiologist said that 63250 houses were surveyed in Barnala district so far this year and larvae were found in 230 places which were destroyed on the spot with larvicide. So far 17 cases of dengue have been reported which have been cured. In Barnala city, the team of the health



department, Buta Singh, Baljinder Singh, Jagjit Singh and Surinder Virk, checked larvae at different places and spread awareness by distributing pamphlets.

Gurmair Singh and Bhupinder Singh Health Inspectors said that due to standing water in the streets and drains and water standing in pots, coolers, tires, pots, back trays of refrigerators etc. for many days in houses, shops, and other places, mosquitoes are

born due to which dengue, malaria spreads.

To protect against malaria and dengue, all water vessels should be dried by destroying stagnant water sources or by adding black oil. If someone has the symptoms of fever, headache, pain behind the eyes, pain in the muscles, red rashes on the body, or bleeding from the nose or mouth, they should be treated immediately according to medical advice.

EDITORIAL

Through a rosy lens

The latest Monthly Economic Review from the ministry of finance gives the reader a great deal of comfort by indicating that all is well with the Indian economy. If there is any cause for concern at all, it is from external economic and political shocks: events like the Federal Reserve in the United States of America raising interest rates, or Russia invading Ukraine. Anticipating global macroeconomic changes is the need of the hour according to the Review. In a similar vein, when the Reserve Bank of India recently raised the repo rate for the fourth time since May 2022, the problems facing the economy were identified as being external. Domestic economic conditions have been claimed to be quite rosy, with credit growth increasing, investment activities picking up, and the utilisation of existing capacity in industry increasing perceptibly. There is a puzzle, however, when one notes that almost all major international agencies that make forecasts about GDP growth have reduced India's projections for the current year and indicated that the next year would be worse than the current one. The RBI and the ministry of finance appear quite happy with forecasts that are higher than those made by other forecasting agencies. The International Monetary Fund has reduced the forecast for the current year as have Ficci, Crisil, Moody's and the Asian Development Bank.

Why are there distinct differences in perceptions? One reason could be that the rating agencies and global organisations are more aware of external economic shocks looming on the horizon. That would cast India's analysts in poor light for having missed out on foreboding signals. The other reason, of course, is the possibility that official Indian sources believe in painting a comforting picture, choosing to ignore disturbing trends and possibilities. In either case, Indian households and firms are unable to factor in the problems that might arise in the near future in the next four or five quarters.

It is well known that economic activity thrives best in an atmosphere of peace and stability along with a well-established rule of law. These parameters depend on a number of social and political factors like freedoms and rights, institutional autonomy, a free press, and economic deprivations kept as low as possible, to name just a few.

Giant blue whales dance to find food

Tracking blue whales by their booming vocalizations, researchers have revealed how these ocean giants find dense aggregations of food. The research team used a directional hydrophone on MBARI's underwater observatory, integrated with other advanced technologies, to listen for the booming vocalizations of blue whales. They used these sounds to track the movements of blue whales and learned that these ocean giants respond to changes in the wind.

Along California's Central Coast, spring and summer bring coastal upwelling. From March through July, seasonal winds push the top layer of water out to sea, allowing the cold water below to rise to the surface. The cooler, nutrient-rich water fuels blooms of tiny phytoplankton, jumpstarting the food web in Monterey Bay, from small shrimp-like krill all the way to giant whales. When the winds create an upwelling event, blue whales seek out the plumes of cooler water, where krill are most abundant. When upwelling stops, the whales move offshore into habitat that is transected by shipping lanes.

"This research and its underlying technologies are opening new windows into the complex, and beautiful, ecology of these endangered whales," said John Ryan, a biological oceanographer at MBARI and lead author of this study. "These findings demonstrate a new resource for managers seeking ways to better protect blue whales and other species."

The directional hydrophone is a specialized underwater microphone that records sounds and identifies the direction from which they originate. To use this technology to study blue whale movements, researchers needed to confirm that the hydrophone reliably tracked whales. This meant matching the acoustic bearings to a calling whale that was being tracked by GPS. With confidence in the acoustic meth-



ods established, the research team examined two years of acoustic tracking of the regional blue whale population.

This study built upon previous research led by MBARI Senior Scientist Kelly Benoit-Bird, which revealed that swarms of forage species -- anchovies and krill -- reacted to coastal upwelling. This time, researchers combined satellite and mooring data of upwelling conditions and echosounder data on krill aggregations with the acoustic tracks of foraging blue whales logged by the directional hydrophone. "Previous work by the MBARI team found that when coastal upwelling was strongest, anchovies and krill formed dense swarms within upwelling plumes. Now, we've learned that blue whales track these dynamic plumes, where abundant food resources are available," explained Ryan. Blue whales recognize when the wind is changing their habitat and identify

places where upwelling aggregates their essential food -- krill. For a massive animal weighing up to 150 tonnes (165 tons), finding these dense aggregations is a matter of survival. While scientists have long recognized that blue whales seasonally occupy Monterey Bay during the upwelling season, this research has revealed that the whales closely track the upwelling process on a very fine scale of both space (kilometers) and time (days to weeks). "Tracking many individual wild animals simultaneously is challenging in any ecosystem. This is especially difficult in the open ocean, which is often opaque to us as human observers," said William Oestreich, previously a graduate student at Stanford University's Hopkins Marine Station and now a postdoctoral fellow at MBARI. "Integration of technologies to measure these whales' sounds enabled this important discovery about how groups of predators find

food in a dynamic ocean. We're excited about the future discoveries we can make by eavesdropping on blue whales and other noisy ocean animals."

Blue whales (*Balaenoptera musculus*) are the largest animals on Earth, but despite their large size, scientists still have many unanswered questions about their biology and ecology. These gentle giants seasonally gather in the Monterey Bay region to feed on small shrimp-like crustaceans called krill. Blue whales are elusive animals. They can travel large distances underwater very quickly, making them challenging to track. MBARI researchers and collaborators employed a novel technique for tracking blue whales -- sound.

MBARI's MARS (Monterey Accelerated Research System) observatory offers a platform for studying the ocean in new ways. Funded by the National Science Foundation, the cabled observatory provides continuous power and data connectivity to support a variety of instruments for scientific experiments.

In 2015, MBARI researchers installed a hydrophone, or underwater microphone, on the observatory. The trove of acoustic data from the hydrophone has provided important insights into the ocean soundscape, from the migratory and feeding behaviors of blue whales to the impact of noise from human activities.

In 2019, MBARI and the Naval Postgraduate School installed a second hydrophone on the observatory. The directional hydrophone gives the direction from which a sound originated. This information can reveal spatial patterns for sounds underwater, identifying where sounds came from. By tracking the blue whales' B call -- the most powerful and prevalent vocalization among the regional blue whale population -- researchers could follow the movements of individual whales as they foraged within the region.

MQM Canada holds protest against state brutalities in Pakistan

In the demonstration, Shahid Raza, a member of the Central coordination committee of MQM, Dr Nadeem Ehsan, advisor coordination committee, Asif Qazi, a member of the central executive committee of MQM, Iqbal Bahadur, joint central organizer of MQM Canada, members

of the central organizing committee, Toronto chapter, office bearers and workers participated.

The protesters carried pictures of MQM founder leader Altaf Hussain, former MNA Panhwar and MQM flags. They carried placards against the burning of MQM leader Altaf Hussain's residence and MQM centre known as Nine Zero, and extra-judicial killings of MQM activists, with words of condemnation written on them. The protestors continued to express their feelings by raising slogans against the state atrocities on MQM workers and Muhajirs in Pakistan from time to time. Talking on this occasion, member of the Central coordination committee Shahid Raza said that the set ablaze of Nine Zero is a part of the conspiracy.

2 female Indian students win prestigious Victorian Premier's Award

Two female Indian students in Australia - Divyangana Sharma and Ritika Saxena - have won the prestigious Victorian Premier's award. Amit Sarwal, writing in The Australia Today said that these awards are an initiative of the Victorian government to celebrate outstanding international students in Victoria.

Divyangana Sharma has won the coveted Victorian Premier's Award - International Student of the Year 2021-22, while, Ritika Saxena won the International Student of the Year award in the Research category.

Divyangana has also won Victorian International Education Awards 2021-22 in the Higher Education category. She came to Melbourne to study nursing at Holmesglen Institute in February 2020, said Sarwal.

"The cultural diversity, inclusion of LGBTQIA+ community, education opportunities, art and culture is what makes Melbourne a unique city and works like a magnet for people wanting to study abroad," he said. Ritika moved to Melbourne as an 18-year-old and is now a PhD student involved in stem cell research, reported The Australia Today. "When you move to Victoria, you are an international student. But by the time you finish your degree, you will be truly global," said Ritika. Award winners in each student category, with the exception of the International Alumnus of the Year, are awarded USD 6,000 each to support their studies and up to two runners-up per student category are awarded USD 2,000 each. The recipient of the



'Premier's Award - International Student of the Year' receives USD 10,000 to support their studies, reported Sarwal. The awards are a ray of hope for Indian parents who are wary of sending their children abroad for studies after a spurt in hate crimes against Indian students abroad.

Notably, Varun Manish Chheda, a 20-year-old Purdue University student was killed on Wednesday at a residence hall on the Indiana campus allegedly by his 22-year-old roommate who is in police custody for investigation. Chheda's roommate, 22-year-old Ji Min "Jimmy" Sha, from Korea is now in police custody and is the prime suspect in the case. Sha is a junior cybersecurity major and international student from Korea. This raises the basic question of how safe it is to pursue higher studies in foreign countries and how cautious parents and students need to be before applying for student visas. After several activities of vandalism of symbols of Hinduism including the Swaminarayan temple and anti-India graffiti in Canada, the Indian Ministry of External Affairs has asked Indian citizens living in Canada to be cautious.



Can omega-3 fatty acid consumption in midlife benefit your brain?



According to an exploratory study, those who consume more foods high in omega-3 fatty acids in midlife may have higher cognitive abilities and even better brain structure than those who consume less of these foods.

The research is published in Neurology, the medical journal of the American Academy of Neurology, on October 5, 2022, online. Fish including salmon, sardines, lake trout, and albacore tuna contain omega-3 fatty acids. They can also be found in supplements or foodstuffs that have been fatty acid-fortified. According to research author Claudia L. Satizabal, PhD, of the University of

Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio, "improving our diet is one strategy to boost our brain health."

"It may have a big influence on public health if people could increase their cognitive resilience and possibly prevent dementia with some easy dietary adjustments. Even better, our research hints that a small amount of omega-3 fatty acids may be sufficient to maintain brain health. This is in keeping with the most recent American Heart Association dietary recommendations, which state that eating fish at least twice a week can help with cardiovascular health.

2,183 adults without dementia or strokes, with an aver-

age age of 46, participated in the cross-sectional study. Their omega-3 fatty acid concentrations were evaluated. They took assessments of their capacity for thought. Their brain volumes were measured via scans.

The average percentage of omega-3 fatty acids in the low group participants was 3.4%, while it was 5.2% for the high group participants. 8% or more is deemed ideal. Levels of 4% to 8% are regarded as moderate. Low levels are those that fall below 4%.

The cross-sectional study included 2,183 persons without dementia or strokes, with an average age of 46. Their levels of omega-3 fatty acids were

measured. They underwent evaluations of their thinking abilities. Scans were used to calculate the size of their brains.

Participants in the low group had an average omega-3 fatty acid content of 3.4%, while those in the high group had an average of 5.2%. 8% or higher is considered excellent. Moderate levels are defined as 4% to 8%. Lower than 4% levels are considered low.

The majority of the sample, according to Satizabal, was non-Hispanic white adults, which may limit the applicability of the findings to other groups even if the study included a small percentage of persons of all races and ethnicities.

Should you eat carbs when fasting?

Although fasting is a very traditional and customary ritual and most people fast for spiritual purification, there is no denying that if you keep yourself nutritionally in check, it can be therapeutic for the body as it can act as a form of detox and keep you healthy as well, says Gurpreet Kaur, Clinical Nutritionist, Cloudnine Group Of Hospitals, Chandigarh. It is significant to choose the right food while you are on a fast diet to prevent yourself from being deficient in important nutrients as it can make you likely to develop health ailments like weakness, heart problems, skin issues, defective bone growth, etc. Avoiding carbohydrates will be the last thing you need to do during fasting as it provides energy to the brain and muscles and make you energetic and more productive throughout the day. So, make sure you are getting enough right kind of carbohydrates, proteins, minerals and vitamins from different sources and be vigilant about selecting healthy foods rather than munch on processed foods. Kaur gives more details about the importance of carbs in one's diet. About Carbs Carbohydrates play a vital role in our growth system. It is an important nutrient source that not only provides energy to muscles and the brain but using the right kind of carbs in the diet can effectively help to provide essential nutrients,



such as bread, sugars, starchy vegetables, fruit juices etc. Slow carbs have a low GI and release energy slowly into the body and help to maintain a "satisfied" feeling as your blood sugar levels are maintained.

There are various food options that include slow carbs and few tips to make your fasting healthier: Because you are fasting, you tend to eat lesser food than usual and feel hungry at odd times. Eating slow carbs foods can help you keep fuller for longer as they take longer to digest and break down. Combine high carbohydrates like potatoes and sabudana (widely used in fasting) with other fibrous vegetables like spinach, cabbage, tomatoes, capsicum, bottle guard, etc. Also, try to bake, roast or grill vegetables instead of deep-frying them. Kuttu is a brilliant combination of carbohydrates (70-75 per cent) and protein (20-25 per cent). It is also rich in proteins, B-complex vitamins and minerals like phosphorus, magnesium, iron, zinc, copper and manganese. Use it to make chapatti instead of gorging on puris. Samak rice is extremely easy to digest and provides energy, contains a high amount of fibre, B-complex vitamins and important minerals like iron and magnesium. Try and adopt healthy snacking and don't binge on puris, sabudana vada, potato chips, and other delicacies as they are loaded with sugar, salt and fat content. Instead, opt for roasted makhana as they loaded with antioxidants or a mixture of nuts (almonds or raisins or walnut/ baked chips, roasted peanuts, etc.)

She is India's Rachel Gupta crowned 'Miss Super Talent of the World'



I stand with you: **Priyanka** comes out in support of Iranian women

Amid the ongoing turmoil in Iran, actor Priyanka Chopra has come out in support of Iranian women who have been protesting over the death of Mahsa Amini. Mahsa was arrested on September 13 as she was leaving a Tehran metro station with her brother and other relatives. She was arrested for allegedly breaching Iran's strict rules for women on wearing hijab headscarves and modest clothing. Mahsa was in a coma for three days, then died "of natural causes," as the authorities claimed, but according to activists, the cause of her death was a fatal blow to the head. After the incident, thousands of Iranians have taken to the streets over the last two weeks to protest the death of Mahsa Amini. Women around the globe have shown solidarity with Iranian women's plight in rallies and demonstrations by cutting or shaving their hair in public or while being filmed. Taking to Instagram, she wrote, "Women in Iran and around the world are standing up and raising their voices, publicly cutting their hair and many other forms of protest for Mahsa



Amini, whose young life was taken away so brutally by the Iranian Morality Police for wearing her hijab 'improperly'. The voices that speak after ages of forced silence, will rightfully burst like a volcano! And they will not and MUST not be stemmed."

She added, "I am in awe of your courage and your purpose. It is not easy to risk your life, literally, to challenge the patriarchal establishment and fight for your rights. But, you are courageous women doing this every day regardless of the cost to yourselves."
