2 labourers from UP killed in grenade attack in JK

**SRINAGAR:** Two non local migrant labourers were killed in a grenade attack in Shopian district of Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday wee hours, police said. Police said a local "hybrid terrorist" of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) who lobbed the grenade was arrested. Police said the grenade was lobbed at the labourers from Uttar Pradesh at Harmen Shopian when they were asleep at their accommodation. "Terrorists lobbed hand grenade in Harmen Shopian in which two labourers from UP namely Monish Kumar & Ram Sagar.

**BSF downs Pakistani drone in Amritsar, narcotics recovered**

**AMRITSAR:** The Border Security Force has shot down a Pakistani drone in the Amritsar sector of Punjab. BSF Public Relations Officer said here on Tuesday that on Monday at about 8.27 pm, alert BSF troops of 183 Bn BSF deployed at border heard a buzzing sound of suspected drone entering from Pakistan into Indian territory in the area falling near Chhanna village. As per drill, the troops tried to intercept the suspected drone by firing. Bullet hit the drone and it fell on the ground. The whole area was cordoned off and police and other concerned agencies were informed. During the preliminary search, the BSF party recovered a quadcopter (Make - DJI matrices) and suspected narcotics (about 2.5 kg) wrapped in a polybag, the official said.

**Bar Council condemns NIA 'raid' at Chandigarh advocate's residence**

**CHANDIGARH:** The Bar Council of Punjab and Haryana on Tuesday condemned the alleged NIA raid at the residence of an advocate in connection with a case to probe "emerging nexus" between terrorists, gangsters and drug smugglers. Shelly Sharma, a senior lawyer at the High Court of Punjab and Haryana and the district court here is the counsel of some gangsters and criminals. The Bar Council wrote to the Director General of the National Investigation Agency after the alleged raid was conducted at the residence-cum law-office of Sharma.

**SBI hikes interest rates by 0.30 pc**

**NEW DELHI:** The State Bank of India (SBI) on Tuesday increased the interest rates on saving bank deposits by 0.30 per cent for a balance Rs 10 crore and above. The interest rates for deposits below Rs 10 crore remained unchanged at 2.70 per cent. The revised rates are applicable from October 15, a statement from the bank said.

## Seven including pilot killed in Kedarnath chopper crash

A helicopter carrying seven persons including a pilot crashed in a blanket of fog near Kedarnath in Uttarakhand on Tuesday, state official said confirming all dead.

The Prime Minister's Office tweeted, Anguished by the helicopter crash in Uttarakhand. In this tragic hour, my thoughts are with the bereaved families: PM @narendramodi

Seven people onboard the helicopter have died, Uttarakhand Civil Aviation Development Authority CEO C Ravi Shankar told the media at a press conference.

The incident took place around 11.40 am, Shankar said.

"The chopper took off from Kedarnath and was heading towards Guptkashi. The cause of the accident will be known after a proper investigation," he added.

According to an official spokesperson, the helicopter crashed in Rudraprayag in Kedarnath-Garudchatti district. Rescuers immediately got into the act. The crash took place between Lincholi and Garudchatti on the Kedarnath Yatra route.

The helicopter belonged to Aryan Company in which seven



people were on board. The crashed reportedly took place after the helicopter collided with a hill due to poor visibility.

The details of the occupants was shared by Uttarakhand government spokesperson Lalita Das Negi. They were Prba Ramanuj, Kriti Brar, Urvi, Sujata, Prem Kumar, Kala and pilot Captain Anil Singh. Union Minister for Civil Aviation Jyotiraditya Scindia tweeted: "The helicopter crash in Kedarnath is extremely unfortunate. "We are in touch with the state government to ascertain the magnitude of the loss, and are constantly monitoring the situation."

## President, PM condole loss of lives

**NEW DELHI:** President Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday expressed condolences to the bereaved families of the seven people who died in the helicopter crash near Kedarnath in Uttarakhand earlier in the day.

President Murmu expressed her condolences to families who lost their loved ones in the crash.

"The news of the death of many pilgrims including the pilot in the helicopter crash near Kedarnath Dham is very sad. My deepest condolences to the families who lost their loved ones," the President said in a tweet.

The Uttarakhand Police and teams of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) have reached the spot where the helicopter crashed today.

## Centre approves hike in MSP for Rabi crops

NEW DELHI, OCT 18

The government on Tuesday approved an increase in the minimum support prices (MSP) for all mandated Rabi crops for marketing season 2023-24 ensuring remunerative prices to the growers for their produce.

Accordingly, the MSP for wheat has been increased by Rs 110 to Rs 2,125 a quintal.

As per a media release, the cost of wheat production is estimated at Rs 1,065 per quintal thus the new MSP provides 100% return over cost. The absolute highest increase in

MSP has been approved for lentil (Masur) at Rs 500 per quintal followed by rapeseed and mustard at Rs 400 per quintal. For safflower, an increase of Rs 209 per quintal has been approved. "For wheat, gram and barley an increase of Rs 110 per quintal, Rs100 per quintal respectively has been approved," the media statement said. The official statement following the Cabinet meeting said that the increase in MSP for Rabi crops for marketing season 2023-24 is in line with the Union Budget 2018-19 announcement of fixing the MSP at a level of at least 1.5 times of the All-India weighted average cost of production.

## It's for Parliament to frame law on Uniform Civil Code: Centre tells SC

The Centre on Tuesday told the Supreme Court that it could not direct Parliament to frame or enact any law on Uniform Civil Code in the country.

The Ministry of Law and Justice in its affidavit stated that the matter of policy is for the elected representatives of the people to decide and no direction in this regard can be issued by the Centre. "It is for the legislature to enact or not to enact a piece of legislation," the ministry told the apex court. The affidavit was filed on a plea of advocate Ashwini Upadhyay seeking uniformity in the personal laws regulating succession, inheritance, adoption, marriage, divorce, maintenance and alimony.

The Centre while seeking dis-



missal of the plea said, "It is settled position of law as has been held in a catena of judgements by this court that under our constitutional scheme, Parliament exercises sovereign power

to enact laws and no outside power or authority can issue a direction to enact a particular piece of legislation." It further said that Article 44 of the Indian Constitution is a directive

principle requiring State to endeavour to secure a Uniform Civil Code for all citizens.

The ministry said that Article 44 is to strengthen the "Secular Democratic Republic" object as enshrined in the Constitution's Preamble.

"This provision is provided to effect integration of India by bringing communities on the common platform on matters which are at present governed by diverse personal laws. Thus, in view of the importance and sensitivity of the subject matter, in-depth study of various personal laws is required," it said.

It told the top court that it is conscious of the matter and that the 21st Law Commission undertook a detailed examination of the issue by inviting representations from several stakeholders.

## Delhi HC dismisses Umar Khalid's bail plea

The Delhi High Court on Tuesday dismissed a bail application of JNU student leader Umar Khalid arrested in the 2020 Delhi riots case.

Justices Siddharth Mridul and Rajnish Bhatnagar after hearing argument from both sides dismissed the bail saying the court did not find any merit in the plea.

Khalid's counsel moved the bail plea submitting that the student leader has been falsely implicated in the matter and did not have any role in the violence of Delhi's Northeast area.

Police opposed it saying

that Khalid was arrested on September 13, 2020 on the charges of Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA).

Police has charged Khalid, Sharjeel Imam, and several others person under the anti-terror law and Indian Penal Code for allegedly being the masterminds of the protests and riots in Delhi's Jamia and Northeast area in the December 2019 and February 2020 violence during the protests against the Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA) and the National Register of Citizens (NRC) that left 53 people dead and over 700 injured.

CM, Hardeep Puri dedicate India's  
largest bio energy plant to people

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, along with Union Petroleum Minister Hardeep Puri, today dedicated India's largest Bio Energy plant constructed at a cost of Rs 230 crore over 20 acres of land.

Describing it as a red letter day for the state, the Chief Minister said that this step will go a long way in wiping out the menace of paddy straw burning from the state.

He said that Verbio Group has strong association with state as its Indian subsidiary Verbio India Private Limited as this is largest biofuel (Biomethane/Bio-CNG) production units in India with 33 TPD (tons per day) and 550 TPD per



year of Bio-CNG capacity adding that this Bio-CNG project of 80,000 m<sup>3</sup>/day capacity will produce biogas by anaerobic digestion process and is a great way to solve the problem of stubble burning. Bhagwant Mann said that the annual straw consumption in this unit will be 1.30 lakh ton adding that it will help in solving the

vex problem of paddy straw burning.

The Chief Minister said that set up over an area of 20 acres of land this unit will contribute to an annual reduction of 1.50 lakh Metric Ton of pollutants and 20,000 MT of fly ash currently produced due to paddy straw burning. He further said that this unit will also give em-

ployment to 1000 youth and affect more than 5,000 families. Bhagwant Mann said that the acreage of soil enriched from Biomanure will be 2150 acres.

The Chief Minister further said that the verbio group has evinced keen interest in setting up more such plants in the state. He said that once successful the

verbio group will set up 10 more such plants in the state. Bhagwant Mann said that the target is to make Punjab free from the menace of paddy straw burning.

The Chief Minister said that with the intense cropping pattern of wheat and paddy, Punjab is facing the problem of disposal of crop residues particularly the paddy straw and stubble which have no other usage.

He said about 18 Million Ton of the straw/stubble is generated every year but only 5 Million Ton is being used in biomass power plants, industrial boilers and plywood industry. Bhagwant Mann said that the rest of 13 Million Ton is being burnt by farmers in the fields as no other safe disposal techniques are available.

Excise Department seizes huge  
quantity of illicit liquor

State Taxes and Excise Commissioner Yunus informed here that in view of the Model Code of Conduct, in district Bilaspur, a team constituted by district in-charge Vinay Chaudhary, today took action against illegal liquor in the border village of Mazari. 6260 litres of illicit liquor were seized and destroyed as per rules. Three liquor furnaces and other materials drums, tins, cans, handi were destroyed on the spot, besides 45 litres of liquor were seized by the Special Task Force in district Hamirpur and fined as per rules. He said that in the ongoing action against illegal liquor sellers, the



State Taxes and Excise Department have also seized 1,88,000 liters of raw liquor and 50 liters of Lahan from Gagwal and Chak Terian villages yesterday. He said that the raid was conducted in the border areas under the leadership of Excise Revenue District Nurpur in-charge Tikkam Thakur. He said that a case has been registered under Section-39 of the Himachal Excise Act and the Lahan, tarpaulin and other materials used were videographed following the legal process. He said that under the Excise Act, raw liquor was destroyed on the spot and drums, cans etc. were taken over by the police. 50 liters of Lahan has been seized by the department and an FIR has been registered in this

regard. This inspection was conducted with the combined effort of Excise Department Punjab, Himachal Police and Punjab Police. In another case, a team formed by district in-charge Himanshu Panwar in Khara forest of Paonta Sahib tehsil in district Sirmaur went deep into five km forest in Khara of Paonta Sahib and destroyed illicit liquor distilleries. Under the Excise Act, the officials destroyed 22 thousand liters of liquor filled in drums, tire tubes, and plastic gallons of raw liquor prepared on the spot. State Taxes and Excise Commissioner Yunus informed that in view of the elections, no illegal liquor business would be allowed to flourish in the state. The department has



constituted a task force for checking the manufacturing and supply of illicit liquor. These teams would conduct surprise inspections under the Excise Act. One such raid was carried out by the teams in different parts of the state yesterday, in which a large quantity of raw liquor was taken into possession and was destroyed as per rules. Excise Commissioner Yunus informed that in view of the elections, the department is adopting the policy of zero tolerance towards illicit liquor in the state. He further elaborated that this category of essential services officials includes Doctors, Para-Medical Staff, Ambulance Service of Health Department, Driver and Conductors of HRTC, excluding local route bus services, Fire Services, the staff on milk supply service of HP State Milk Federation and Milk Cooperative Societies, local media persons authorized by ECI, Pump Operator and Turner in Jal Shakti Department and Electrician and Lineman in HPSEB, who are enrolled in electoral rolls can cast their vote through Postal Ballot. He said a certificate in this behalf will be issued to these AVES by the concerned Nodal Offices of respective departments. The CEO said that such applications seeking postal ballot facility should reach the Returning Officer (RO) till 21st October 2022. This facility is being extended for the first time in Himachal Pradesh.

Delhi CM inaugurates 11  
new EV charging stations

**NEW DELHI:** Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Tuesday inaugurated 11 electric vehicle charging stations in the national capital on Tuesday as part of a larger project to establish 100 charging stations across Delhi. While speaking at the event at the Indraprastha Metro Station Parking, the CM said that these high-tech low-cost electric vehicle charging stations are to promote the adoption of Electric Vehicles (EVs) in Delhi and one can charge their vehicle at these stations at a meagre cost of Rs 3 per unit.

The 100 EV stations that are to be set up in the next two months will have a total of 900 charging points and 103 swapping stations. The 11 EV stations launched today will have 73 charging points and 12 swapping points.

The cost of driving an electric two-wheeler is just 7 paise per km while it is Rs 1.75 for a petrol scooter. For electric three-wheelers, the cost is just 8 paise per km while it is Rs 2.62 for a CNG 3-wheeler. Driving a 4-wheeler EV will cost just 33 paise per km while it is roughly Rs 7 for a petrol 4-wheeler," Kejriwal said adding that such rates are perhaps the lowest all over the world.

of the relevant agencies through Panseed. # SC notice on plea seeking guidelines on search, seizure of digital devices

The Supreme Court on Tuesday issued a notice to the Centre on the petition filed by a group of journalists seeking guidelines on the search and seizure of digital devices. The Court also tagged the petition with other similar matters. The direction was passed by a bench of justices KM Joseph and Hrishikesh Roy.

The court was hearing a plea filed by Foundation For Media Professionals through Advocate Rahul Narayan. In the petition, the journalist association has raised the issues like today, digital devices, especially personal devices such as mobile phones and laptops, contain more sensitive personal data about individuals than any physical space, such as a house or a vault and can be found with a person almost at all times, and are effectively an extension of the self. "Even if it is assumed that the existing legal provisions across general and special laws are applicable in context of the digital realm-going beyond mere production / seizure of devices but to the production/searches of their



contents-it is submitted that existing legal provisions, either under the Criminal Procedure Code 1973 or under various special laws, are insufficiently tailored to ensure that law enforcement agencies exercise powers in a manner consistent with the fundamental right to privacy," the plea said. The petitioner said that state agencies seek to justify these practices by invoking their powers to compel the production of items, or conduct search and seizure operations during inquiries or investigations and submitted that these practices are contrary to the fundamental right to privacy inherent in Article

21 of the Constitution and other constitutional provisions. The petitioner has urged the top court to declare that the contents of an arrested/ accused person's digital device and password/ passcode/ biometric ID thereof are protected by the guarantee against compelled self-incrimination as under Article 20(3) of the Constitution of India. The petitioner also urged the court to declare that the extant legal regime of search and seizure does not cover the search, seizure and access to contents of an individual's personal digital devices. In the alternative, declare that to the extent that the extant

legal regime does apply to search, seizure, and access to contents of an individual's personal digital devices, it breaches the fundamental right to privacy under the Constitution of India, the petitioner said. The petitioner also sought to pass appropriate orders directing the Union of India to draft model legislation for enactment by states in respect of the search and seizure of digital devices and examination of their contents in consonance with the fundamental rights guaranteed under Part III of the Constitution of India as interpreted by the top Court. The petition also sought to issue appropriate guidelines to fill the lacuna until such time that legislation is passed, including that law enforcement agencies may not seek access to an individual's digital device without applying for and obtaining a prior judicial warrant, except in cases of emergencies, where such a warrant must be sought for and granted within 48 hours of the search, failing which the search shall be deemed to be unconstitutional and any material obtained therefrom rendered inadmissible in evidence.

EDITORIAL

A reality check

India's ranking as one of the world's fastest growing economies – a bright spot in a troubled and slowing world economy – routinely figures in the public discourse. It was upheld even as oil prices zoomed and inflation surged early this year. It did not waver when growth forecasts were lowered some six months ago. It wasn't rattled when growth underperformed in the April-June quarter. And it resonates, once again, amidst further downgrades by the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund to 6.5% and 6.8%, respectively. Soothing as it may be to stand out when others are growing slower than us, the triumph over growth rates and rankings needs a contextual placement. In the present instance, the perspective is provided by the repeated income shocks of the last two years and what their immediate and future consequences may be. A reality check is appropriate.

We must recall the severe contraction of national economic output due to the pandemic in 2020-21 (-6.6%). That devolved upon pre-existing economic weakness – the previous year, 2019-20, India's GDP growth had collapsed to 3.7%. Two successive waves of the virus have been accompanied by the resurgence of inflation which hits India – a net importer of oil and commodities – and Indians particularly hard. Real incomes have been falling even before being fully restored from the pandemic shock. The cost-of-living crisis, monetary and financial tightening, lasting effects of the pandemic, and Russia's invasion of Ukraine are expected to drag down the world economy which, according to the IMF, is likely to grow at its slowest since 2001, excluding the global financial crisis and the critical pandemic year. These factors would undoubtedly affect India's revival prospects adversely.

The Fund-Bank meetings have significances beyond these periodic economic outlook updates. The accompanying research identifies and analyses pressing problems of economic policy, often illuminating specific developments that enable better understanding of their member policymakers in a comparative international perspective; at times, these have proven to be cautionary.

This year, the World Bank's comprehensive examination and analysis of poverty and inequality stand out for stretching itself to cover the impact of Covid-19. Poverty and Shared Prosperity (2022) sheds light on a historic increase in global poverty in 2020 due to the pandemic shock – 71 million more people are likely living in extreme poverty, 11% higher than in 2019.

India emerging as key investment destination for Singapore

India has been identified as a key investment destination by Singapore and its official investment arm – Enterprise Singapore encouraging local companies to invest in India.

EnterpriseSG is a government agency within Singapore's Trade and Industry Ministry which supports Singapore SMEs (small and mid-size enterprises) by helping them upgrade their capabilities, innovate, transform and develop internationally.

It also supports the growth of Singapore as a hub for global trading and start-ups and builds trust in Singapore's products and services through quality and standards. In addition, it develops strategies that enable companies in specific sectors in Singapore to enter new markets, drive regional expansion, and internationalize through alternative formats.

When the COVID-19 pandemic hit in 2020, EnterpriseSG together with other government agencies in Singapore redoubled their efforts to ensure impacted industries were supported through various support and training schemes as well as positioned for growth along with other less impacted organisations when borders reopened and business returned to normal.

Another case in point is the refreshed Singapore Retail Industry Transformation Map (ITM) 2025 which was launched about a week ago and does exactly that. Its aim is to build a core of global Singapore brands and to uplift the quality of jobs in the sector. It does this with the help of other Singapore government agencies including the Singapore Tourism Board.

This approach has reaped results as Singapore's economy is one of the fastest growing in Asia at the moment. A poll of economists by Bloomberg projects it to achieve third-quarter growth of 3.9 per cent. Singapore's financial sector is booming as its COVID strategy has allowed it to safely reopen much faster than regional competitors especially those in North Asia.



While rival financial center Hong Kong is in danger of a talent drain due to the departure of expatriates and locals, Singapore's finance minister and future prime minister Lawrence Wong are looking to increase financial industry jobs by over 10 per cent by creating 20,000 jobs between now and 2025.

EnterpriseSG assisted around 80 companies in projects in Africa, India and Latin America between January and May. This is 50 per cent more than in the same period in 2019 before the pandemic hit.

The easing of border restrictions also allowed the government agency to resume its physical business missions and visit trade shows. Among the missions that it has led are a mission led by the Singapore Precision Engineering and Technology Association to Mexico in October and a built environment one to Ghana and Ivory Coast in

the same month. In early 2023, a mission to India for furniture firms is in the works.

EnterpriseSG also has an in-country presence in many of the countries where it is helping Singapore firms operate. They do this through their 36 overseas centers each headed by a regional director. These centers work with companies in areas such as facilitating business opportunities, sharing policy updates, and helping companies adjust their strategies for entering new markets.

It believes that a diversified global presence enables it to help companies make the first move or adapt to developments quickly. Most Singapore firms usually prefer to expand into nearby and safe markets like Indonesia, Vietnam, or China while places like India, Africa and Latin America seem too far away, unfamiliar and intimidating. However, these markets could hold

potential for Singapore companies that want to diversify and grow.

The most recent overseas center was set up in Nairobi, Kenya, in 2018 following growing interest from Singapore firms looking to enter East Africa. Most of the smaller Singaporean firms venturing into these markets do so with the help of local partners, which include joint ventures and distribution partners.

However, Ms Sabrina Ho, regional director of EnterpriseSG's center in New Delhi feels that there are limitations with a partnership approach as Singapore firms end up having limited exposure to operations on the ground.

This is because most of the work and risk in such partnerships are taken up by the local partner. "We recommend that companies communicate with their local partners regularly.

As Xi seeks third term, questions remain over future of Premier Li

As Chinese President Xi Jinping is seeking an unprecedented third term in office, analysts are thinking of premier Li Keqiang's role in the country's top decision-making body.

On Sunday, the 20th National Congress began, and talks have started about the succession of the country's second most powerful position as well as repercussions for China's economic policy, Channel NewsAsia reported. Earlier, in March, Premier Li said that he would step down this year as head of China's state council but gave no further details on whether he will stay in politics or will retire from his position.

China's Premier is a trained economist with a liberal background, whose policies included plans for sweeping reforms to boost China's economic development. However, after Xi came into power, Li's power has been curtailed and the Chinese President headed a new leading group that oversaw economic reform.

"Age limit is politically neutral. Unless you break down somebody with charges of corruption, usually you don't take them out if they haven't reached their age limit," said China elite politics expert Professor Bo Zhiyue, founder of the New Zealand-based Bo Zhiyue China Institute.

He thinks Li could take up the third highest-ranking post as chairman of the National People's Congress, China's legislative body while noting that there are other indi-



viduals in the party's pecking order waiting to fill leadership slots, according to Channel NewsAsia.

Other experts think Li may choose to retire from the standing committee, or even from Chinese politics altogether, given how he is widely viewed as being sidelined by Xi during his term in office.

Earlier, Li was tipped to be running for the presidency but was in the end made premier to Xi in 2013, according to Channel NewsAsia.

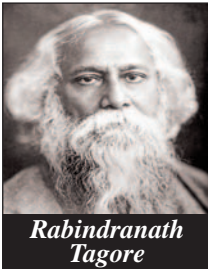
His appointment came with support from Xi's predecessor Hu Jintao, with whom Li forged a relationship while in the Communist Party Youth League.

How mushrooms become "magic mushrooms"



It is becoming more widely acknowledged that the psychedelic substances present in "magic mushrooms" have the ability to treat diseases like addiction, obsessive disorder, anxiety, and depression.

However, little is understood about these substances' evolution and function in the natural world.

To address this, researchers from the University of Plymouth are carrying out a ground-breaking investigation utilising cutting-edge genetic techniques and behavioural studies to address unproven claims regarding the origin of psychedelic chemicals in fungi. This includes determining whether such qualities

originated as a line of defence against invertebrates that feed on mushrooms or whether the fungi themselves create substances that control insect behaviour for their own advantages.

The initiative will pay close attention to psilocybin, a substance frequently found in 'magic mushrooms'. It is highly similar to serotonin chemically, which plays a role in the communication of information between nerve cells in animals.

To determine whether there is a varied animal community feeding on psychedelic mushrooms, the researchers are sampling psychedelic and non-psychedelic fungi and utilising next-generation DNA sequencing.

Additionally, they are performing laboratory procedures to look into whether the fungi experience genetic changes throughout development and attack. They will also look into how psilocybin affects the growth of soil microbes.

Modern gene editing techniques will also be used in the study to attempt to produce mutant fungi that are incapable of synthesising psilocybin. In the future, it is believed that this will aid researchers in understanding the function of a variety of fungal substances.

Molecular Ecology, animal-plant interactions, and fungal biology experts from the university's School of Biological and Marine Sciences are lead-

ing the project. Dr Kirsty Matthews Nicholass, a postdoctoral research fellow, and Ms Ilona Flis, a research assistant, are leading the project.

Dr Jon Ellis, Lecturer in Conservation Genetics, is supervising the study. He said: "In recent years, there has been a resurgence of interest in psychedelic compounds from a human health perspective. However, almost nothing is known about the evolution of these compounds in nature and why fungi should contain neurotransmitter-like compounds is unresolved."

"The hypotheses that have been suggested for their evolution have never been formally tested, and that is what makes our project so ambitious and

novel. It could also in future lead to exciting future discoveries, as the development of novel compounds that could be used as fungicides, pesticides, pharmaceuticals and antibiotics is likely to arise from 'blue-sky' research investigating fungal defence."

Dr Kirsty Matthews Nicholass said: "Within Psilocybe alone, there are close to 150 hallucinogenic species distributed across all continents except Antarctica. Yet, the fungal species in which these 'magic' compounds occur are not always closely related. This raises interesting questions regarding the ecological pressures that may be acting to maintain the biosynthesis pathway for psilocybin."

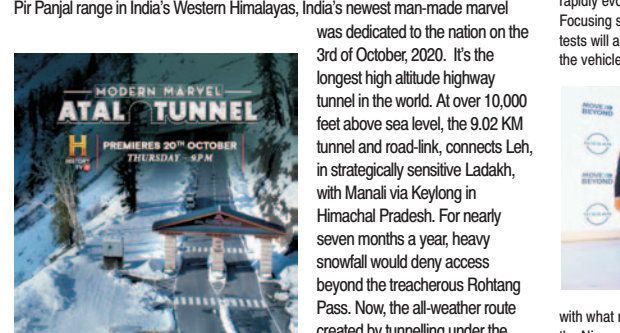

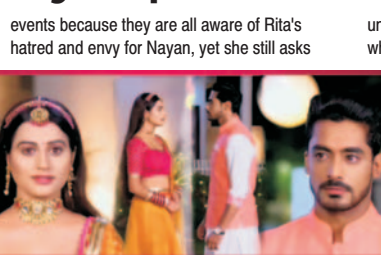

Antimicrobial Resistance -Things To Be Aware: Dr. Vijay Sherawat

Increasing bacterial resistance to antimicrobials is the cause of serious infections, complications, longer hospital stays and increased mortality. If we appropriately use antibiotics, antibiotics can again effectively kill bacteria's. To prevent and control the spread of antibiotic resistance, individuals should only take antibiotics when prescribed by their treating physician. One should not use antibiotics prescribed for a friend or a family member for a similar condition in their case. The decision on their use should be taken only by your treating physician.

Chasing the target, Netherlands got off to a flier with opener Vikramjit Singh going hell for leather from the very beginning. The batter smashed two consecutive boundaries in the first over.

Singh put his foot on the pedal on the fourth over as he smashed Ben Shikongo for consecutive sixes. The team continued the onslaught and brought up the team's fifty on the last ball of the powerplay to finish at 51/0 at the end of the six overs.

Bernard Scholtz finally broke the first-wicket stand of 59 runs to give Namibia a much-needed breakthrough. Vikramjit Singh was dismissed for a well-made 39(31).

Max O'Dowd and Bas de Leede did not take any risk as the scoring rate saw a dip to take the Dutch team to 68/1 at the halfway mark.

The Netherlands seemed to be cruising to victory with 32 needed off 42 balls, but there was a twist in the tale as the Namibia bowlers pulled things back by taking four quick wickets within a span of 10 runs.

With 14 needed off the last 12 deliveries, Scott Edwards and Tim Pringle saw the team across the line to win another low-scoring thriller.

Vikramjit Singh was the highest scorer for Netherlands with JJ



Smit picking two wickets for Namibia.

Opting to bat first, Namibia could not repeat the heroics of their victory against Sri Lanka. The team got to an awful start, losing three wickets inside the powerplay. Openers Michael van Lingen and Divan la Cock were dismissed within the first five overs with Jan Nicol Loftie-Eaton losing his wicket in the sixth over.

Divan went for a duck with Tim Pringle drawing first blood while Lingen played some beautiful shots, but his innings was cut short by Colin Ackermann for 20 off 19 balls. Loftie-Eaton was caught off Paul van Meekeren and headed to the pavilion without troubling the scorers.

Namibia ended their powerplay at 33-3, failing to make use of the fielding restrictions. The Dutch were excellent with the ball and struck to their plans to refuse Namibia a solid opening stand.

Regular fall of wickets never saw Namibia score freely as the Dutch bowlers kept chipping with the wickets, using the wicket's two-paced nature.

The Netherlands bowled brilliantly to dry off the boundaries in the middle overs forcing Namibia to settle for a below-par score. Namibia got to the three-figure mark in the 18th over with Jan Frylinck and Gerhard Erasmus at the crease with powerful hitters like David Wiese and JJ Smit still in the hut.

Namibia scraped to a total of 121/6 after managing just three boundaries in the last three overs.

Jan Frylinck top-scored for Namibia scoring 43 off 48 balls. Netherlands bowler Bas de Leede carried his form from the last match and was the pick of the bowlers bagging two wickets for 18 runs.

Former Australian captain Mark Knowles, who has been retired for several years now, will no longer be on the team sheet at the FIH Odisha Hockey Men's Hockey World Cup Bhubaneswar-Rourkela 2023 in January. However, the former Australian skipper insisted that he will be keeping a close eye on proceedings.

Australia, Belgium, Netherlands, India, Argentina, Germany, New Zealand, England, France, Korea, Malaysia, Spain, South Africa, Japan, Chile and Wales are the 16 teams, who will be competing in the tournament.

Knowles believes there's no clear favourite for the coveted trophy this time around.

"Realistically, I believe that any of the top seven or eight teams in the world could win the World Cup. I think the top, the top two in my eyes are still Belgium and Australia. But they're followed very, very closely by the India Men's Hockey Team, who on home soil, of course, are extremely hard to beat in front of passionate fans," Hockey India quoted Mark Knowles as saying.

"The Dutch, the Germans, Argentina, Spain, England, certainly right up

there. I think international hockey is as tight as it's ever been and so I expect a very, very close tournament," he added.

"And I expect absolutely amazing fans. We love the noise, it's something that hockey doesn't get enough of. And you know it's one of the reasons why I think the players will enjoy again going to India and playing in front of big crowds," he said.

One of the most decorated players in modern-day field hockey, Mark Knowles, who was part of an Australian team that was ranked first for more than 10 years during his career, said his first big heartbreak and first World Cup memory was in 2006 in Monchengladbach. In 2010, the Australians, Knowles noted, felt quietly confident about changing the colour of the medal. "We felt like we could do something special at that World Cup in March 2010 and what many people forget is we started with the loss to Great Britain. When people potentially might write you off after the first game of the tournament, that was something our team, I guess for me, being one of the leaders of that group was very proud of," Knowles said. "For me, it was one of those moments where I wondered if we'll get a chance to right the wrongs of four years before."

Member of the 1983 World Cup winning team Binny was a strong contender to succeed Ganguly after the former India captain's exit was confirmed. Binny has previously served as a member of the BCCI selection committee.

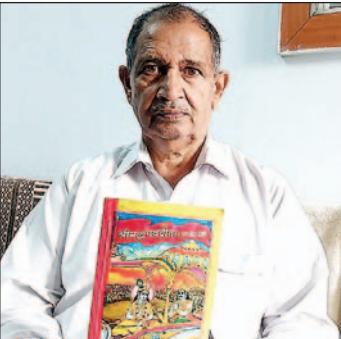


## Paddy arrival picks up
