**Sensex rallies for
4th day, breaches
61,000-mark**

MUMBAI: Equity indices darted up for the fourth day running on Tuesday to close at over nine-month highs, buoyed by positive macroeconomic data and a bullish trend overseas. Gujarat tragedy: PM meets survivors, takes stock of relief operations

Prime Minister Narendra Modi chaired a high level meeting in Morbi, Gujarat to review the situation in the wake of the unfortunate bridge mishap killing at least 135 people.

The Prime Minister stated that the authorities must stay in touch with the affected families and ensure that they receive all possible help in this tragic hour.

According to a press statement from the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), Officials briefed the Prime Minister on the rescue operation and the assistance provided to those affected.

PM Modi said the need of the hour is to conduct a detailed and extensive inquiry which will identify all aspects relating to this mishap. He also added that the key learnings from the inquiry must be implemented at the very earliest.

Those present at the meeting were CM Bhupendra Patel, state Home Minister Harsh Sanghavi, Minister Brijesh Merja, Chief Secretary of Gujarat, State DGP, local Collector, SP, Inspector General of Police, MLAs and MPs and other officials.

Earlier, upon reaching Morbi,



the Prime Minister visited the site of the bridge mishap. He went to the Morbi Civil Hospital where the injured are recovering.

Modi also met persons who were involved in the rescue and relief operations when the cable bridge collapsed.

At least 135 people, including women and children, were killed and over 100 are receiving treatment for their injuries sustained after a cable suspension bridge in Morbi town collapsed on Sunday, plunging people into the Machchu River.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi chaired a high-level meet-

ing at Raj Bhavan, Gandhinagar, on Monday to review the situation in Morbi. Bishnoi's son Bhavya, who is contesting the bypoll as the BJP candidate, had also quit the Congress and joined the BJP. A total of 22 candidates, all men, are in the fray. Polling will take place from 7 am to 6 pm on Thursday, in which nearly 1.71 lakh voters are eligible to cast their vote, and the counting of votes will be taken up on November 6.

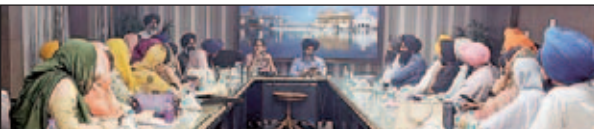

from upper area of Shimla district. There are around 8000 voters belonged to upper area of Shimla district. The pollsters consider that huge chunk of votes get polled in favour of Congress. 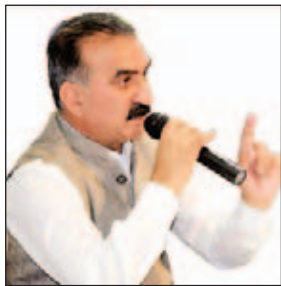

Don't panic about dengue, need to take precautions: District Health Department

Urging the district residents not to panic due to the increasing cases of dengue fever, Civil Surgeon Dr. Adarshpal Kaur and District Epidemiologist Dr. Shalinder Kaur said that till now there is a decrease of about 60 percent in total number of dengue cases in the district in comparison to 2021.

Sharing the details, senior health officials said that a total of 2631 cases of dengue fever were reported from January 1 to October 31 last year, while 1071 cases were reported from January 1 to October 31 this year. The Civil Surgeon further said that a total of 2260 dengue cases surfaced in the month of October 2021 alone while 551 cases have been reported in the month of October this year. With regard to the weekly trend in the month of October, a total of 111 cases were reported in the district in the first week while 144 cases in the second week, 180 in the third week and 52



cases in the fourth week, which shows the declining trend of dengue cases.

They also said that sharing of this information should not be taken to mean that precautions should be abandoned, but all the precautions should be used to prevent this deadly disease. Notably, anti-dengue teams consisting of breeding checkers, Multi-purpose health workers and health supervisors have been constantly working since

March this year. The teams have visited 3,65,956 houses in the district till now. Larvae have been found in 11950 houses and 1923 violators have been issued challans. Civil surgeon said that Bal-longi, Badmajra, Zirakpur were identified as high-risk areas where large-scale checking, fogging and awareness activities are being carried out. District Epidemiologist Dr. Shalinder Kaur said that residents need to be vigilant and cautious during November and December too.

She asked residents to not allow the storage of water anywhere in their homes and surroundings. She said, 'Most of the fevers should not be taken as dengue fevers and many are simple fevers that can be treated at home. Normally, platelet count goes down with every fever. She said dengue testing and treatment is available free of cost in government hospitals across the district and Health Department helpline no. 108 can be contacted for any information.

PIL in SC seeks ex-judge-led probe into Gujarat bridge disaster

A day after the horrific Morbi suspension bridge crash that killed over 140 people, a PIL was filed in the Supreme Court seeking probe headed by a retired apex judge into the disaster. The public interest litigation filed by a lawyer also sought detailed safety audit of all old public structures across country. Vishal Tiwari filed the PIL on Monday and also demanded formation of permanent disaster probe team in the states which could promptly attend to such tragedies. The PIL sought direction to the Union of India (UOI) and the State Governments to form committee to survey and conduct assessment risk of old and risky monuments, bridges to ensure environmental viability and safety. It pleaded for a direction to the State Governments to Constitute in their respective States -- Construction Incident Investigation Department (CIID) --



so that prompt investigation could be initiated whenever such incidents occur. The plea also sought that the CIID shall also have duty to access and inquire about the quality and safety of any public construction taking place. As per reports over 140 people have lost their lives and many are still missing after the British-era suspension bridge in Morbi town of Saurashtra region in Gujarat came crashing down on Sunday

evening. Tiwari said that such incidents depict the serious condition of responsibility lapse, negligence by the government authorities, and hence filed the PIL. "Such incident prima facie depicts the serious condition of responsibility, lapse, negligence, failure of administration, and unfaithful duty of care towards the public by the government authorities. The maintenance and repairing work was delegated to a

private operator, who had absolutely failed in the functioning of the bridge," Tiwari said, in his PIL. He further stated in his PIL that from 1989 Bihar-Banmakhii Express train bogey accident tragedy, leading to 500 casualties, to Morbi bridge failure, it is clear that nothing in the country's administration has changed wherein such actions could have been avoided by showing reasonable duty of care and upfront repair and development activity. The SC should impose absolute liability on the Central and State Government to put public interest at large and work in accordance to public welfare. Many a times, there are reports of casualties, due to overcrowding and lack of management by the administration and its municipal bodies thereby causing severe public casualties, his plea said. He pleaded the top court to pass appropriate order and directions to the authorities concerned to put an end to such kind of failure of administration.

Deliberative democracy

Within five days of the announcement of Agni-path, the scheme had been amended 10 times, raising the larger question concerning consultation in policy-making. The Bharatiya Janata Party-led National Democratic Alliance government has taken a number of policy decisions without public consultation — from demonetisation, which saw 60 changes in 43 days, to GST, which has been amended 376 times in 10 months, to farm laws that were repealed after one year. Continuous changes in legislation indicate poor consultation in policy-making. A recent news report suggests that even deliberation in the cabinet has shrunk, with ministers conceding their space to the Prime Minister's Office.

The constitutional framework does not mandate the chief executive to mandatorily consult the council of ministers. But a careful reading of Article 75(3) reveals that the council of ministers is responsible to the House of the people, making the prime minister first among equals. The Kerala High Court and the Supreme Court have endorsed this principle in separate judgments. Internal consultation is not only important in bringing uniform and refined laws but also affirms to the broader constitutional principle of power-sharing among the representatives. Scholars, too, have argued that the cabinet has a very significant role in policy-making.

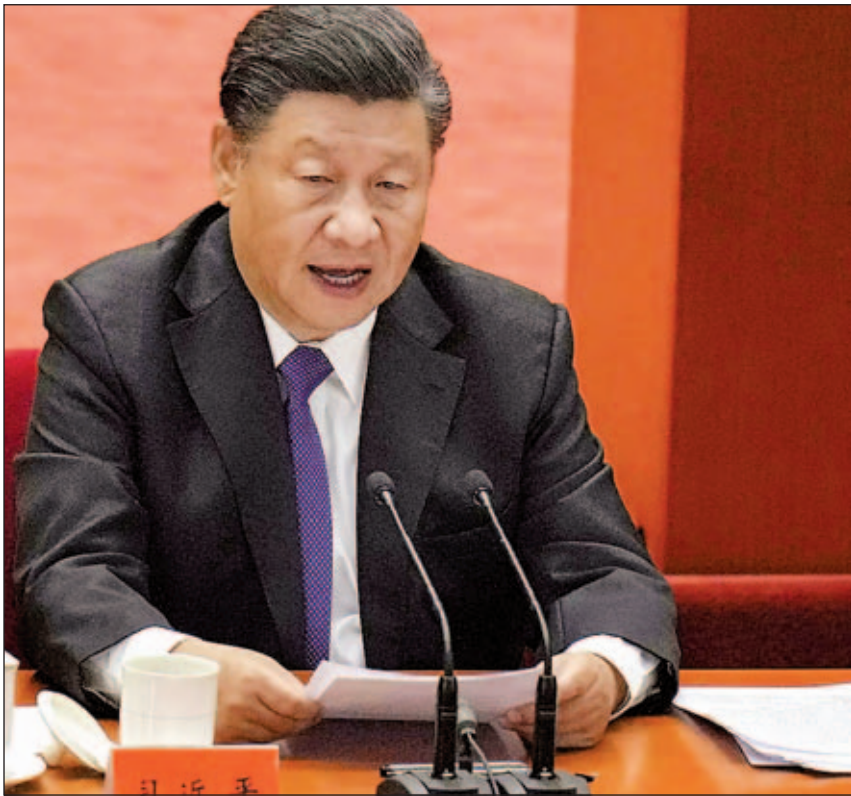
Citizens' participation in policy-making is an important factor in assessing the quality of democracy. Despite the technological advancement and launch of MyGov.in to collaborate with different public institutions to echo the people's voice, India is still performing poorly in public consultation. In a deliberative democracy, the value of participation in policy-making is crucial as it gives representation to the voice that gets affected by the outcome of these policies. Legislative consultation in diverse societies like India can be an effective tool for not only raising civic consciousness on democratic participation but also ensuring the continuity of democratic culture.

Uploading bills for mandatory consultation, providing the requisite time for feedback, translating bills into regional languages, and making them accessible can make the policy framework inclusive. Translation is an important tool in bridging the gap in citizens' participation. Research has affirmed that comprehending regional languages is significant for individual identity. However, what we are witnessing instead are efforts to impose Hindi, alienating a section of non-Hindi speaking citizens from policy-making. The presidential order of 1960 mandates the creation of the Official Languages (Legislative) Commission in the states.

Return of Xi Jinping frightens colonised countries

As Chinese Communist Party leader Xi Jinping won the historic third term through the 20th National Congress, his return as China's President has heightened fears among vulnerable countries like Tibet, East Turkistan (Xinjiang), Southern Mongolia, Manchuria and Hong Kong that have been occupied and colonized by China over recent decades of history over new Chinese colonies.

Xi is seen as the second reincarnation of Chairman Mao Zedong who successfully headed the Communist revolution and ruled over the CCP and China decisively, ruthlessly and unchallenged for 27 years (1949-1976), as Xi is also planning for modernization of the military but also policies of the country, according to Singapore Post. Moreover, Xi Jinping has also created terror among a large number of countries ranging from China's South China Sea and East China Sea neighbors like Taiwan, Japan, South Korea, Philippines, Vietnam, and Brunei after taking over for the third term as Xi Jinping's historic third term as China's President will likely see more hardline policies out of Beijing on the economy, foreign relations and human rights. The fears of these countries are further multiplied by the stark erosion of the influence of the United States of America and the near takeover of international institutions, especially those of the United Nations China, The Singapore Post reported. Violation of basic rights of humans in Tibet and their exploitation in their own country has been on a surge for years by the Chinese government



with the recent one being discrimination against the Tibetans in employment and housing, making the locals feel 'second-class' in their own land. Tibetans are not even offered basic unskilled work in any sector and in some instances are offered a wage significantly lower than their Han counterparts, according to a report of the International Campaign for Tibet. Moreover, repressive policies continue to re-

main a part of Chinese rule in Tibet as Tibetans are denied freedom of religion and over 6000 monasteries have been destroyed from the year 1951 and 1960. Moreover, Xinjiang, a Chinese region is notorious for its human rights violations. China has been rebuked globally for cracking down on Uyghur Muslims by sending them to mass detention camps, interfering in their religious activities, and sending members of the

An estimated 1.8 million members of these groups have been held in internment camps, where some experienced severe human rights abuses, torture, rape, and forced labor.

Twitter bosses entitled to USD 122 million in 'golden parachute' payouts

Twitter's top executives, including Parag Agrawal and Vijaya Gadde will be entitled to "golden parachute" payouts worth more than USD 122 million after being fired by the company's new owner, Elon Musk fired.

A golden parachute is essentially a contract which entitles top executives of a company to substantial benefits in case they lose their jobs following a merger, takeover or acquisition. This measure is also known as a 'poison pill' since it can act as a safeguard against hostile takeovers.

In August, US-based corporate research firm Equilar had estimated that ex-CEO Parag Agrawal alone could receive a USD 42 million payout if he is terminated after the takeover. The debt-funded deal has become a costly exercise even for Musk, the world's richest man. Legal costs in particular are likely to have run into the tens of millions of dollars after Musk tried to terminate the deal with Twitter in July, arguing that the company had misled him over the number of bot accounts on the social network. Agrawal is likely to receive the largest payout, worth USD 57.4 million, while Segal and Gedde are entitled to USD 44.5 million and USD 20 million respectively, according to company filings. The



three executives also hold a cumulative 1.2 million shares, which are likely to be bought by Musk as is standard in any takeover. Those payments would be worth USD 8.4 million to Agrawal, USD 22 m to Segal and USD 34.8 million to Gadde. After closing the USD 44 billion acquisition deal, Elon Musk has started to reform the policies of the micro-blogging platform and is wasting no time remodelling it by cutting off employees, and introducing plans for a council to determine content decisions, The Hill reported. In one of the first few changes, he purged the top executives of the company as soon as he closed the expected deal in which Twitter CEO Parag Agrawal and finance chief Ned Segal left the company's San Francisco headquarters.

Afghanistan's mainstream media shaken by Taliban takeover

The mainstream media in Afghanistan that had just started to get on its feet was shaken by the disruptions of 2021 - the takeover of the war-ravaged country by the Taliban.

A survey conducted by Reporters Without Borders and the Afghan Independent Journalist Association in December 2021 reported the closure of more than 200 media outlets; rendering about 6,400 journalists jobless after the regime change, reported Afghan Diaspora Network.

The transfer of power from a west-supported government to the Taliban saw many changes in the way institutions were working for the past twenty years.

Not accustomed to working within the framework of the Taliban regime, several media personalities moved to neighbouring or western countries, reported Afghan Diaspora Network.

Though it remains to be seen what the future holds for popular media in the country, the upheaval has surely distressed it in the short term. While most of the media is attempting to adapt to the new environment, the turbulent times have come as an opportunity for Pakistan, reported Afghan Diaspora Network. Drawing flak from all around for fomenting trouble and interfering in the governance of Afghanistan, Islamabad has now resorted to manipulating



Afghan media to improve its public image, reported Afghan Diaspora Network.

According to some Afghan journalists, the efforts are part of a well-coordinated strategy focused on exploiting the media vacuum in the country to implant favourable coverage of Pakistan.

Though common Afghan journalists working on the ground are not aware of the full plan, they suspect it to be backed by Pakistani agencies.

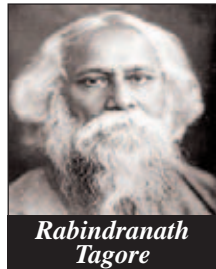

First impression matters in relationship

A recent study on romantic first impressions from the University of California, Davis, found that compatibility and popularity in the dating pool have an impact on who individuals pursue as possible love partners.

The study was published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

Although popularity and compatibility have been studied in established romantic relationships, in one of the first studies of its kind, UC Davis researchers explored whether these and other types of romantic first impressions affected later romantic outcomes. Researchers found that first impressions tend to linger, shaping whether people desired further contact with potential romantic partners after an initial meeting.



"Although we expected popularity to be an important factor in the study, we were amazed to find that a good

first impression is not just a popularity contest, it's also about compatibility, even when people are still getting

to know each other," said Alexander Baxter, a UC Davis doctoral student in psychology and co-author of

the study. "In other words, although it helps to be popular when it comes to getting a second date, having a unique

connection with a potential partner can be just as important."

Assessed during speed dates

The researchers asked more than 550 speed-daters, including some men who date men, to rate their romantic interest in the potential partners they met. The participants, all from the United States or Canada, included both college students and people attending a comic book convention, who cumulatively attended more than 6,600 speed-dates during the experiment.

"Representation really matters in psychology research, and one of the strengths of our study is that we included a subsample of men who date men that attended an all-male speed-dating event," Baxter said. "This means that our findings gen-

eralize not only to male-female relationships, but also to male-male relationships too. We hope that future studies will consider other diverse types of relationships."

After the speed-dating event, researchers surveyed the participants over the next two to three months to assess whether they dated any of the potential partners that they met and how their romantic feelings changed over time.

Researchers used a statistical model to test whether later romantic outcomes were predicted by three factors that affect how romantic first impressions form -- selectivity, popularity and compatibility. In other words, they looked at patterns of initial desire that were observed during the speed-dates, and assessed whether these factors differently predicted whether peo-

ple later pursued a relationship with the potential partners that they met.

The factors assessed were:

Selectivity -- Daniel liked Rose because he liked everyone;

Popularity -- Daniel liked Rose because everyone liked her; and Compatibility -- Daniel uniquely liked Rose, above and beyond his own flirty disposition and her general popularity.

The results showed that people were particularly likely to pursue a romantic relationship with those who were popular and those they were compatible with. Selectivity played a relatively small role, with more romantically outgoing individuals being slightly more likely than less outgoing people to pursue their speed-dating matches, according to the study.

Tesla Autopilot Crash to Put Legal Question of 'Man vs Machine' Driver Responsibility to the Test

A manslaughter trial set to begin in Los Angeles for a fatal crash caused by a Tesla operating on Autopilot presents a first-of-its-kind test for the legal responsibility of a human driver in a car that was partly driving itself, legal experts say. The trial, set to begin November 15, comes as civil cases head to trial next year over accidents involving Tesla's Autopilot and adds to scrutiny of a system that Tesla co-founder Elon Musk has touted as a step to fully autonomous driving.Critics say Tesla's claims and Autopilot have contributed to accidents – and deaths - by making drivers inattentive. The US Department of Justice is investigating whether Tesla itself should face criminal charges over its self-driving claims. Reuters reported. The Los Angeles trial could shape public – and future jury – perceptions of Tesla and could be a test case for whether the technology has advanced faster than legal standards, legal experts say. "Who's at fault, man or machine?" Edward Walters, an adjunct professor at the Georgetown University law school who specialises in the law governing self-driving cars.

Millions of accounts suspended due to Instagram outage

Instagram users are being logged out of the app as a result of an outage that began on Monday morning, and many are being told "we suspended your account on October 31, 2022," as per The Verge. On Monday Instagram issued a statement acknowledging the ongoing problem and took to Twitter to write "We're aware that some of you are having issues accessing your Instagram account. We're looking into it and apologize for the inconvenience." According to Down Detector, around 74 per cent of users reported Login issues, 16 per cent reported application access issues and 9 per cent reported server connection issues. Down Detector reports that the outage has massively impacted Delhi, Chandigarh, Kolkata, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Chennai, Nagpur, and Mumbai. On Monday, many users were notified that their accounts had been suspended on the platform. The majority of reports of the problem came from iPhone users, with some claiming that their app recently crashed and became unusable prior to an update earlier this morning. The suspensions also seem to be sharply reducing follower counts, which gives us an idea of how many people are affected by the problem, as per The Verge.

A strong third quarter lifts gold demand to pre-pandemic levels - WGC

CHANDIGARH: The World Gold Council's latest Gold Demand Trends report reveals that gold demand (excluding OTC) in the third quarter of 2022 hit 1,181 tonnes, up 28% year-on-year. Strong demand pushed the year-to-date total to its pre-COVID levels. Gold demand was bolstered by consumers and central banks, although there was a notable contraction in investment demand. Investment was down 47% year-on-year, as ETF investors responded to a challenging combination of markedly higher interest rates and a strong US dollar with significant outflows of 227t. These movements, alongside weakness in OTC demand and negative sentiment in futures markets, hampered gold's price performance - contributing to an 8% quarter-on-quarter drop in the price during Q3 2022. Despite these headwinds, gold continued to hold favour with retail investors who reacted to different market cues and turned to gold for its status as a store of value amidst rampant inflation and geopolitical uncertainty. Investors sought to hedge inflation with bar and coin investment, driving total retail demand up 36% y-o-y. This was supported by significant purchasing in Turkey (up more than fivefold y-o-y) and in Germany (up 25% y-o-y at 42t), but also from visible contributions across all major markets. Jewellery consumption continued to rebound and is now back to pre-pandemic levels, reaching 523t - 10% higher compared to Q3 2021. Much of this growth was spearheaded by India's urban consumers who drove up demand 17% y-o-y to 146t. Similarly impressive growth was also seen in much of the Middle East, with Saudi Arabian jewellery consumption up 20% since Q3 2021, and United Arab Emirates up 30% for the same period. Chinese jewellery demand also saw a modest 5% increase y-o-y driven by improved consumer confidence and a dip in the local gold price, prompting the release of some pent-up demand. Just as consumer gold demand firmed, central bank buying picked up significantly with estimated record purchases of nearly 400t in the third quarter. This pattern reflects insights from our recent central bank survey, in which 25% of respondents said they intended to increase their gold reserves in the next 12 months.

Almond consumption may benefit some gut microbiota functionality, study finds

LUDHIANA:Scientific progress in understanding the human gut microbiome thrills experts in nutrition and gastrointestinal health. Researchers know that diet affects the gut microbiome in ways that benefit health and disease prevention, but they are still discovering the mechanisms of how this happens. New almond research may add another piece to the puzzle.A clinical study investigated how gut microbes break down almonds to produce butyrate, a specific microbiota product associated with several health benefits. New research found that consuming almonds significantly increases butyrate, a type of beneficial short-chain fatty acid (SCFA), in the colon. Commenting on this study, Ritika Samaddar, Regional Head – Dietetics, Max Healthcare, Delhi said, a healthy gut is crucial for maintaining a good immune system and overall wellbeing. Various factors can lead to imbalance in the gut which can result in the increase of bad bacteria in comparison to the good. Butyrate, which is produced by microbes in the gut when they digest fiber, is the

primary fuel source for colonocytes, the cells that line the colon, and may play a role in multiple processes related to human health, including improving sleep quality



and fighting inflammation, and has been associated with a lower risk of colon cancer Almond consumption also significantly increases stool output. Regular stool output is associated with a well-functioning gastrointestinal system. A team of researchers led by Professor Kevin Whelan from King's College London, set out to determine the impact whole almonds and ground almonds have on the composition of gut microbiota, gut microbiota diversity and gut transit time. The study was funded by the Almond Board of California.

BSNL, MTNL to Raise Rs. 19,356 Crore Through Government Bonds, Merchant Bankers Say

Indian corporate bond market participants are braced for a heavy supply of government-guaranteed bonds over the next few weeks, as state-run telecom giants MTNL and BSNL aim to raise \$2.34 billion (roughly Rs. 19,300 crore), three merchant bankers said. Mahanagar Telephone Nigam Ltd and Bharat Sanchar Nigam Ltd intend to raise an aggregate of Rs. 19,356 crore through government-guaranteed bonds, the bankers said.

MTNL plans to raise Rs. 10,910 crore in November. It is set to seek bids next week and will meet bankers and investors on Tuesday, according to the bankers. The telecom company is looking to issue bonds maturing in 10 years and will pay a semi-annual coupon, similar to how central government bonds are priced. MTNL and BSNL both intend to raise the sovereign guarantee to raise Rs. 10,910 crore and Rs. 8,446 crore, respectively, in the current financial year, the government

said in September. Despite the guarantee, the spread over sovereign bonds may widen this time. "The companies may have to pay a higher yield this time as the market is not that favourable," said one of the bankers, adding that the companies are being advised to spread out the borrowing. MTNL had said in August that it plans to issue sovereign guarantee bonds worth Rs. 17,580 crore and would use the proceeds to service older bonds and bank loans.

iOS 16.2, macOS Ventura 13.1 to Launch in Mid-December

iOS 16.2, iPadOS 16.2, and macOS Ventura 13.1 were issued to beta testers by Apple last week as part of the Cupertino-based iPhone maker's next round of software updates. The company is said to be targeting a mid-December release date for these software updates. As per Bloomberg's Mark Gurman, while Apple will not have any more hardware releases for the year, it still may have more software updates on the way. Meanwhile, macOS Ventura 13.3 and iOS 16.3 could be expected between February and March next year, he says.

In his weekly Power On newsletter, Bloomberg's Mark Gurman states that the iOS 16.2 and iPadOS 16.2 updates, which began rolling out to beta testers last week, "should be released around mid-December." Gurman also says that the company is aiming to introduce upgraded M2-based versions of its 14-inch and 16-inch MacBook Pro models, which are expected to run on macOS Ventura 13.3 and iOS 16.3, in the first quarter of 2023.

"Those software updates (macOS Ventura 13.3 and iOS 16.3) are expected to debut between early February and the beginning of March," Gurman said. Gurman had previously predicted that Apple would skip hosting its October Event for the year, as the company reportedly only has routine incremental announcements which do not justify a full-fledged digital or physical event. Apple typically launches new iPad and MacBook models during its October event. Last month, Apple released the iOS 16.1 update to users, alongside updates to iPadOS 16.1, macOS Ventura, tvOS 16.1, and watchOS 9.1. The Cupertino company revealed that this version includes a patch to address a previously reported zero-day vulnerability in the operating system, which the company admitted could have been actively exploited. Zero-day vulnerabilities are exploits that are identified by external sources, such as security researchers, before the original development team detects these issues.

Nokia set to launch its G60 smartphone in India

New Delhi Finnish multinational company Nokia's G60 smartphone, which was unveiled last month, is set to be launched in India soon. According to GSM Arena, the news regarding the phone's India launch was announced by the company's Indian branch on Twitter. Nokia hasn't revealed the G60's Indian pricing and availability details yet, but the smartphone's already listed on its official Indian website with just one



memory configuration - 6GB RAM and 128GB storage. Though, it will come in Black and Ice colour options. The rest of the Nokia G60's specs include the Snapdragon 695 SoC, 6.58" 120Hz FullHD+ LCD, and a 4,500 mAh battery with 20W charging. The smartphone runs Android 12 out of the box and comes with the promise of three Android version upgrades and three years of monthly security updates. Nokia G60 has four cameras onboard - an 8MP shooter on the front and a 50MP primary camera on the back, joined by 5MP ultrawide and 2MP depth units. The smartphone supports 5G networks, features a side-mounted fingerprint scanner, and has an IP52 rating. Nokia also announced the X30 last month alongside the G60, but it's unclear if that one will debut in India with the G60.

BJP district office in-charge Subhash alleges that a tender of lakhs of rupees is issued by the public health department to cover the drains of the city, but even after that the drains are open, which causes accidents. He said that he wants to draw the attention of the administration to this problem so that no accidents occur in future. When contacted, Surendra Doon, SDM Gannaur, said that the matter of negligence of the public health department has not come to their notice.

The Deccan Arena in Hyderabad and the Chhatrasai Stadium in New Delhi will be the other two debuting venues in the league this season for Sreenidi Deccan FC and Sudeva Delhi FC, respectively. Meanwhile, the I-League will return to one of its favourite venues, South Bombay, once again, with Kenkre FC hosting their home games at the iconic Cooperage. Over in Delhi, the historic Ambedkar Stadium will play host to Rajasthan United FC.

It's a dream come true: Carlos Alcaraz after winning World No 1 trophy

PARIS: Spaniard Carlos Alcaraz's dream run in 2022 earned him the ATP Number One Trophy for achieving his career-best, number-one ranking. The tennis star was awarded the trophy at the Paris Masters tournament in the French capital by ATP Chairman Andrea Gaudenzi on Monday. Carlos Alcaraz had a season that will go down in history to be remembered. One of its key moments was when the Spaniard broke the record for the youngest World No. 1 in ATP Rankings history. The tennis sensation expressed his happiness to have won the trophy and stated that it means a lot to him and added that it's like a dream come true for him. "For me it's a dream come true being No. 1 in the world, to be a Grand Slam champion. I feel like the No. 1, and to have this trophy, it means a lot to me," Alcaraz said as quoted by ATP Tour. Alcaraz is one of the 28 athletes to reach World No. 1 in the Pepperstone ATP Rankings. He achieved it after winning his first major championship at the US Open.

"Everything has come so fast. I didn't think at the beginning of the year that I'm going to have the year that I'm having right now. I always believe in my team and in my work, so this is something that came with the hard work that I put in every day, the hard preseason, the work during the year with my team. Everything pays off," said Alcaraz.

The teenager, who is this week's top seed in Paris, will face left-handed Yoshihito Nishioka of Japan in the second round. Alcaraz will make his debut at the Nitto ATP Finals, where he will compete for the honour of being the youngest year-end World No. 1 in history. Novak Djokovic will also be in action on Tuesday for the second-round match in the French capital against Maxime Cressy on Court Central. The match will mark the start of Djokovic's quest for a record-extending eighth Rolex Paris Masters victory. The sixth-seeded Serbian has consistently fared well at the season-ending ATP Masters 1000 tournament, winning the title in each of his previous two appearances in 2019 and 2021. In other matches, Dane Holger Rune will face Swiss great Stan Wawrinka, while third-seeded Norwegian Casper Ruud will face French wild card Richard Gasquet. Ruud progressed to the Grand Slam finals at Roland Garros and the US Open after making it to the Miami final earlier this season.

England beat NZ by 20-run to keep semifinals hopes alive

Jos Buttler's blistering 73 followed by a superb bowling effort from bowlers helped England keep their semifinals hopes alive with a 20-win over New Zealand in the ongoing ICC T20 World Cup, at the Gabba in Brisbane on Tuesday.

With the win, England climb up to the second spot in the group 1 points table. And that's also New Zealand's first loss of the tournament.

Glenn Phillips top-scored for New Zealand with 62 off 36 deliveries while skipper Kane Williamson scored 40 off 40 balls. For England, Chris Woakes and Sam Curran bagged two wickets each.

Chasing a target of 180, New Zealand got off to a bad start as they lost their opener Devon Conway for three on the delivery of Chris Woakes. Skipper Kane Williamson then came out to bat.

New Zealand opener Finn Allen and Williamson then opened their hands and slammed Woakes for 12 runs with a stunning four and six.

Sam Curran struck in his first over as he removed set batter Finn Allen for 16 off 11, leaving New Zealand tottering at 28/2. The right-handed batter Glenn Phillips



then came out to bat.

Phillips and Williamson took their team's total beyond the 50-run mark in the 8th over of the innings. After 10 overs of the game, New Zealand's score read 66 with a loss of two wickets. The duo of Phillips and Williamson brought up their crucial 50-run partnership in 38 deliveries to ease some pressure from their team. The danger man Phillips started playing aggressively and slammed England

bowlers all around the ground. While hammering Adil Rashid for 17 runs in an over Phillips brought up his half-century in just 25 balls in the 14th over of the innings. Rashid then gave his team a big breakthrough as he dismissed Williamson for 40 off 40. James Neesham then came out to bat. After 15 overs of the match, New Zealand needed 57 runs in 30 balls. Neesham's stint on the crease was cut short as he was

sent packing by Curran for 6 off 3, leaving Kiwis tottering at 126/4. Daryl Mitchell then came out to bat on the crease, but the latter could not do much as he was sent back to the pavilion after scoring 3 off 5 on the delivery of Woakes. Mitchell Santner then came out to bat. Curran then gave New Zealand a huge blow as he dismissed well-set batter Phillips, who played superb innings of 62 off 36.

In the match, Brevis smashed 162 runs in just 57 balls with a strike rate of 284.21. His knock consisted of 13 fours and 13 sixes.

The highest score in T20 cricket is by West Indies legend Chris Gayle, who smacked 175* in just 66 balls against Pune Warriors India while playing for Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB) in the Indian Premier League (IPL). It is followed by Aaron Finch, who score a cracking 172 off 76 balls, followed by Zimbabwe batter Hamilton Masakadza's 162* off 71 balls for his side Mountaineers against Mashonaland Eagles in the country's domestic T20 competition, and Afghanistan batter Hazratullah Zazai's 162* off 62 balls against Ireland.

The batter now also has the record for the fastest 150 in T20 cricket. Brevis scored his 150 in just 52 balls, overtaking Chris Gayle's record of scoring the same in 53 balls against PWI and Graham Napier's 57-ball 150 for Essex against Sussex in 2008. Brevis came into the spotlight after emerging as leading run-scorer in Under-19 World Cup this year. He scored a phenomenal 506 runs in six innings at an average of 84.33.

Potato can be grown in air through aeroponic

Jymar Karnal November 1, New farming techniques are coming for development in the field of agriculture. Similarly, potato can now be grown in the air through aeroponic technology. This is a revolutionary step of Potato Technology Centre Shamgarh. Through aeroponic technology, now potatoes will be able to grow in the air without land, without soil and the yield will also be more than 10 times. This potato center has an MoU with the International Potato Center. After this, permission for the Aeroponic project has been received from the government.

Under the supervision of the Horticulture Department in Karnal, Haryana, the Potato Centre is making its contribution in cultivating with this technology. Through aeroponic technology, farmers will now be able to grow potatoes in air without soil, without soil. In this technique, potatoes are initially transported from the lab to the hardening unit. After this, the roots of the plant are immersed in Bavstein. It does not cause any fungus in it. After this, these plants are planted



in the cockpit by making a bed. After about 10 to 15 days, these plants are planted inside the aeroponic unit. After this, after a suitable time, the potato crop is ready.

Greenhouse technology is generally used for potato seed production. It yields very less. Five small potatoes are obtained from one plant, which the farmer planted in the field, after which potato seed production was started in the cockpit without soil. In this the yield has almost doubled. After this, potato production is being done with aeroponic technology. In this, potatoes have started growing without soil, without land. One plant is giving 40 to 60 small potatoes

which are being planted as seeds in the field. This technique will increase the yield by about 10 to 12 times.

Dr. Jitendra Singh, scientist of Potato Center Karnal said that Aeroponic is an important technology. As its name suggests, aeroponics means growing potatoes in the air. He said that whatever nutrients are given to the plants in this technique, they are not given through the soil but through the hanging roots. Through this technique, very good production of potato seeds can be done which will be free from any soil borne diseases. Dr. Jitendra said that in comparison to traditional farming, more yields are obtained through this technique.
