Terrorist killed, infiltration bid foiled along LoC

JAMMU: Army on Thursday foiled an infiltration bid and neutralised one terrorist along the Line of Control in Poonch district of Jammu and Kashmir, defence spokesman here said. At about 10 am, alert troops of the Indian Army observed a suspicious movement of some individuals along the Line of Control in the Poonch sector, the spokesperson said. "They were trying to infiltrate across the Line of Control, into the Indian side," he said adding, "the troops challenged the infiltrators and the terrorists fired on own troops". In the ensuing fire fight, one terrorist was neutralised and the body was recovered along with two AK-47 rifles, one pistol and other war like stores. The operation continues and the search of the area is under progress," he added.

Satyendar Jain's bail plea to be decided by Nov 11

NEW DELHI: Hearing on Delhi Health Minister Satyendar Jain's bail will be concluded by November 11, civic judge hearing the case ordered on Thursday. Principal District & Sessions Judge Vinay Kumar Gupta told the Rouse Avenue District Court that arguments and rebuttal in the bail application of Jain who is arrested under the provisions of Prevention Money Laundering Act will be concluded next week. The judge for PC Act and CBI, Gupta after receipt of request from the Court of Vikas Dhull, Special Judge (PC Act) (MPs/MLAs Cases) CBI, New Delhi, for extension of time for disposal of the bail application issued notice to the Directorate of Enforcement and to accused Jain, Vaibhav Jain and Ankush Jain on November 11 for appearance on Thursday. After the hearing on the day, Gupta directed both the parties to conclude their arguments and rebuttal on the bail application by November 11. Dhull after hearing arguments on behalf of Jain adjourned the matter for further arguments.

Patients surge at hospital OPDs as Delhi air quality remains 'severe'

NEW DELHI: Hospitals in Delhi are teeming with people suffering from cough, nasal congestion, shortness of breath and even asthma attacks as an eye-stinging smog blankets the national capital. With Delhi's air quality remaining 'severe', doctors advised a return to wearing masks to guard against pollution. While forecasters on Wednesday predicted the air quality to improve due to stronger winds, Delhi's overall Air Quality Index (AQI) stood at 426 at 9.10 am.

Imran Khan injured in firing at rally, taken to hospital

AGENCY ISLAMABAD, NOV 3

Former Pakistan prime minister Imran Khan was injured in firing during his rally at Wazirabad in Pakistan's Punjab province and was rushed to a hospital. His right leg bandaged, he was seen waving to supporters before he was shifted into an SUV, indicating that the injury was not serious in what his party called an assassination attempt.

The attacker, who has been arrested, fired at the former cricketer from below when he was standing atop a container-truck to address his ongoing "long march to Islamabad" against the Shehbaz Sharif government.

At least four of his party leaders were injured, one of whom, parliamentarian Faisal Javed Khan, later called it an assassination attempt and said a supporter had died.

The incident in Gujranwala district, about 200 km from Islamabad, comes just seven months after he was unseated upon losing the army establishment's confidence. He has since been campaigning against the army and intelligence agency ISI's "interference" that "undermined democracy".



It brought back chilling memories of how former prime minister Benazir Bhutto was shot dead during a rally in 2007.

PM Shehbaz Sharif condemned the firing and directed Interior Minister Rana Sanaullah to seek an immediate report from the police and administration.

Barely an hour before the firing, he had told supporters in another part of the town, where he was scheduled to deliver a speech, that they should accompany him to a different area instead, promising to speak there,

Geo reported. His party tweeted a video showing him boarding the container-truck from his black SUV.

The firing took place minutes later as he got to the container's roof for his speech.

The gunman fired from a pistol from the left side of where Imran Khan was standing; he could not get close enough for a clear shot in a tight crowd, reports said.

Local channel Geo News reported that chaotic scenes broke out near his reception camp at Al-lahwala Chowk after the gunshots

rang. At least four party leaders were among those injured, it added.

Having been unseated reportedly after losing the army establishment's confidence in April, the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) leader has been demanding resignation of the new central government formed by his two main opponents that are otherwise rivals of each other too, the Sharifs' Muslim League (PML-N) and the Bhuttos' Pakistan People's Party (PPP).

HC to hear afresh Salman defamation plea

The Bombay High Court will hear afresh a defamation petition filed by actor Salman Khan against his neighbour as the judge who had partly heard his plea is retiring on Friday.

Justice CV Bhadang who had earlier reserved his order, on Thursday said it would not be possible to pronounce order on an appeal filed by Salman in the defamation suit due to paucity of time.

Justice Bhadang had in August begun the hearing on the appeal against a lower court order of March 2022.

The lower court had re-

fused to restrain Ketan Kakkad, who owns land near Salman's farmhouse in Panvel, from posting derogatory videos against the actor. It had also refused to direct Kakkad to delete his earlier YouTube videos.

On October 11, Justice Bhadang closed the matter for orders after arguments were over. In his order Justice Bhadang said that "Unfortunately I am unable to complete the judgement. I tried my level best till last evening. But unfortunately there was vacation and then administrative work, and I had other assignments. I will have to list this as part heard.

Three drug smugglers wanted in 73 kg heroin haul arrested from Gurdaspur

SC confirms death penalty to Mohammad Arif in 2000 Red Fort attack case

The Supreme Court on Thursday dismissed the petition of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorist Mohammad Arif alias Ashfaq seeking a review of the top court's earlier order, upholding the death sentence awarded to him in connection with the 2000 Red Fort attack case. A bench of Chief Justice of India UU Lalit

and Bela M Trivedi confirmed the death penalty sentencing to Mohammad Arif observing that his guilt has been proved.

According to the prosecution, on the night of December 22, 2000 at about 9 pm terrorists belonging to a banned militant organization Lashkar-e-Toiba armed with AK-56 rifles and hand grenades entered the Lal Quila and started firing indiscriminately and gunned down three Army jawans of 7 Rajputana Rifles.

Omar won't contest polls till J&K statehood restored: Farooq

Former Chief Minister and Vice President of National Conference Omar Abdullah will not contest the election till Jammu and Kashmir's statehood is restored.

This was said by NC President Farooq Abdullah on Thursday. On Wednesday Farooq Abdullah appointed party leaders constituency in-charges for the 47 segments of Kashmir Valley. This was seen by many as a first step towards preparation for the

next Assembly polls.

"He (Omar Abdullah) has already stated that he will not contest polls till return of statehood," Farooq Abdullah told reporters in Budgam.

On the question that announcement of constituency in-charges by NC was an indication that there may be no pre-poll alliance with other constituents of the People's Alliance for Gupkar Declaration (PAGD), Farooq Abdullah said the announcement was done to reinvigorate party workers and it was premature at this point of time to discuss about any alliance.

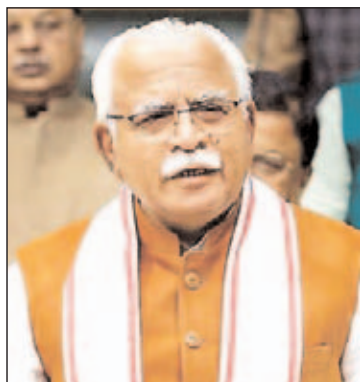
Record of every inch of land in state will be maintained: Hry CM

Haryana Chief Minister said that digital record of every inch of land in the state will be maintained to have a real time data about number of ponds, road or infrastructure.

He directed the Survey of India and the Revenue Department to complete the large scale mapping project for this work at the earliest. During this, Deputy Chief Minister, Sh. Dushyant Chautala also remained present.

While presiding over the meeting with the officers concerned associated with this project, the Chief Minister directed that the concerned department should complete the technical works related to the large scale mapping



project in each village sequentially so that no work remains pending in any village.

With this, the project should also be completed in a systematic

manner across the state. Once the work of large scale mapping project is completed, Haryana would set an example for the entire country, added Sh. Manohar Lal.

The Chief Minister directed the officers that complete mapping should be done outside the villages as well while executing large scale mapping. This should also include houses and other infrastructural constructions built in the fields outside the village.

He further directed the officers of Survey of India to complete this large scale mapping work at the earliest by increasing the workforce of the employees.

During the meeting, the team of Revenue and Survey of India apprised the Chief Minister that the work of large scale mapping

has also been completed in 8 urban areas of Jind, Karnal and Sonapat districts. With this, each property in these areas can now be identified. In this, information about the area of the property, its location on the map and details of the property owner can also be easily obtained. The Chief Minister also congratulated the officials on the completion of this work.

Additional Chief Secretary, and Financial Commissioner, Revenue and Disaster Management Department, Sh. V S Kundu, Additional Chief Secretary, Urban Local Bodies Department, Sh. Despite challenges, India aims to become land of opportunities: Hardeep Puri

NEW DELHI, NOV 3 (UNI) India is facing certain challenges and the government's attempt is to convert these challenges into opportunities, Union Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas Hardeep Singh Puri said on Thursday.
"We have been able to navigate global prices. Clearly when prices are high, the situation will be inflationary," he said while addressing the day 2 of INDIA CHEM 2022, organized by FICCI, jointly with the Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers, Govt of India.
The world's largest economy has faced negative growth along with many of the European countries which are facing very challenging times, he said.
Puri said, 'India will be affected by high petrol prices but so far we



have navigated through it. The government brought down the central excise on two occasions in November '21 and May '22 even at a time when we were feeding 800 million people 3 meals of dry ration in a day.'

"We will continue to take such steps but the high energy prices, globally will result in more inflation and recession and unless it is corrected there will be pressure on the global economies," he said.
The Minister said, "We are

taking corrective measures including the new pipeline and other innovative steps like introduction of solar cooker, which in the coming months will make a major impact in lowering the demand for domestic kitchen energy because it will feed on the natural sunlight."
Puri highlighted that the Indian economy is growing at a rate of 7 per cent, and energy is a critical driver of growth.
"Our refining capacity, which currently stands at about 252 million metric per annum, is likely to go up to about 400 million metric tons per annum in the coming years. We are also transiting from fossil fuel based energy to a greener energy including solar, wind and compressed biogas," he added.

Machines used in illegal mining seized in Patiala village

PATIALA: Based on the information received about illegal mining at village Kutha Kheri in Ghanour, the site was checked by the field staff of the mining department team led by Mining Inspector Sushant Walia and Vikram JE of the Mining Department. Giving information in this regard, SDO cum Assistant District Mining Officer Raghav Garg said that he had come to know that a pit about 6-7 feet deep had been dug in a field and there was a Poklen machine of Hitachi company standing there. In this regard, the concerned police station was informed and the police officers were called to the spot. The application regarding the issue of illegal mining was forwarded to the concerned SHO and asked to take action under Punjab Mines and Minerals Rules 2013 and Mines Development and Regulation Act 1957 and NGT guidelines dated 19-02-2020. He further informed that FIR No. 90 dated 3-11-2022 has been registered in this regard at Kheri Gantia police station. Apart from this, regular checking and patrolling of the area is also done and appropriate action is taken against anyone who does illegal mining in the area. The officials further said that similarly on November 3, 2022, a raid was conducted at village Dodhar under police station Pasiana regarding illegal mining and today while taking action on illegal mining, 1 tipper and Poklen were handed over to the in-charge Dakala. Another raid was conducted at village Sahajpura Khurd. A complaint was received regarding illegal mining.

Banwarilal Purohit inaugurates 3-day International Conference at RGNUL

Shri Banwarilal Purohit, Governor of Punjab, presided over the 3-day International Conference (3-5 November 2022) "Securing Justice to Victims of Crime" organised by the Centre for Criminology, Criminal Justice and Victimology (CCV), Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab in collaboration with Indian Society of Victimology (ISV) and World Society of Victimology (WSV). The Eighth International and Twelfth Biennial Conference of the Indian Society of Victimology on "Securing Justice to Victims of Crime" commenced with the inaugural Session. Shri Banwarilal Purohit, Governor of



Punjab, deliberated on the Indian justice system. He elaborated on relationship between accused and the state in liberal democracies. Shri Purohit said, "Victimology is a language of empathy. It is high time that the victimological foundations must find a place in our criminal justice administration." Mr. Purohit cited the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India while alluding to

the case of Jagjeet Singh v. Ashish Mishra.

He exhorted lawyers to reserve time for providing legal aid to the poor and underprivileged. He emphasized that cognitive training of functionaries and appropriate framework for empirical investigation of victimization of vulnerables could be plausible alternatives to avoid delay in justice. Trial delays thwart the

safety of victims deprived of justice. He narrated instances from the court of King Vikramaditya and Jahangir. 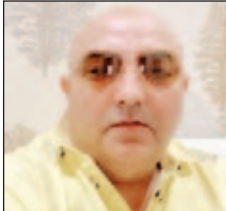

Farmers will burn effigies across state in protest against PM ferry on Nov 5

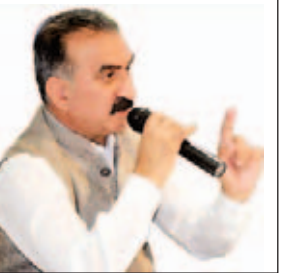

Make maintenance, safety a top priority across India

If one person dies in an accident that could have been prevented, it is one life lost too many. The needless and avoidable death of 133 people so far after a suspension bridge collapsed in Morbi in Gujarat, and the structure and people plunged into the waters below, must become India's resolve to never again have such a tragedy. Alas, we don't learn anything and the tragedy, when it repeats, becomes a farce, a shame, an indignity and an insult to our entire nation and culture. We Indians make and build great things, but we cannot put ourselves to maintaining them. We don't care about safety much, either.

The best of buildings will have leaking faucets, fire safety devices which don't work, standard safety instructions being flouted with impunity and indifference, and never do people stand up against it — not till it results in a consequential tragedy.

Buildings which are past their structural safety date are habitats for lakhs of people in our cities but we don't remedy them enough on time. Lifts and elevators which are not regularly tested and maintained, garbage dumps which can catch fire, bridges, cable cars, electric wires hanging unsafely, manholes uncovered before rains, people carrying fireworks and cooking on trains, overloaded buses and boats, people transported on top of truck and bus — we live with an insensitivity to ignore them all.

Till they become tragedies. But tragedies too we have learnt to forget. Accidents too don't make us learn and act. Deaths of fellow citizens which could have been avoided are written off as collateral damage with a karmic nonchalance as a bad accountant or unscrupulous bookkeeper. We are one bad cacophony, a cobbled up infrastructure about to rust and wither, and a potential accident every way in every nook and corner. The rest is a standard template. Condolences of leaders. Criticism by Opposition. Hectic rescue and rush to hospitals. Media exposure in excess. Promises of probe into root cause. Shifting of blame. Finding scapegoats. And then we all press some invisible button and forget. Till the next time. Jumping with a total memory loss from one accident to the next. Without fear, guilt, shame or remorse.

But it is time, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, when you stand up and take up the onerous responsibility to inspire us all to change ourselves. Because only you can, PM Modi, launch a 'Maintain in India' and achieve 'Safe in India' result.

African countries trapped in debt circle

African countries feel that they have been trapped in Beijing's debt circle after China showed reluctance in lending financial support to them and diplomatic analysts described this move as a disturbing trend, Federico Giuliani writes in Inside Over.

Charles Robertson, the global chief economist at Renaissance Capital Ltd, clarified that China's scaling back would slow growth in the region and "can't be welcomed by most debt investors."

This new development is seen in the context of the worsening growth rate in the African region as the World Bank recently reviewed the economic growth outlook for Sub-Saharan Africa (SSA) to 3.3 per cent in 2022 from the initial projection of 3.6 per cent in April, due to the slowdown in global growth and the ongoing crisis between Russia and Ukraine.

According to the author citing Robertson, in the early years of China starting its lending process, Africa was just 25 per cent of countries at high risk of debt distress and now it has grown to 60 per cent.

It may be noted that German insurer Allianz and its credit insurance subsidiary Euler Hermes disclosed disturbing findings in November 2020. Over the coming decade, China may no longer be able to provide Africa with the same amount of funding, taking the form of loans, investment, and trade, as in the past. China has a heavy debt burden, stated Hermes. According to its 2020 report, the country's share of overall debt owed to G20 countries increased from 45 per cent in 2013 to 63 per cent at the end of 2019. China has made significant investments in foreign countries to secure supply and promote its exports. What's more, the country buys half of the



world's raw materials, reported Inside Over. The authors of the report indicated that they "expect China to slow its international engagement over the next few years". They argued that besides the trade war with the United States, two reasons are behind this shift.

First, the Chinese Communist Party's decision, driven by President Xi Jinping, to change the country's growth model to what it calls a "dual circulation" strategy. The idea is to prioritize its domestic market in order to reduce the country's reliance on imports while maintaining its export market shares.

This refocusing is expected to help reduce cash outflows. Second, the Chinese economic machine is set to continue to experience a systemic slowdown and see its pace of growth diminish from

the 7 per cent observed each year in the 2010s to somewhere in the range of 3.8 per cent and 4.9 per cent each year over the coming decade. This shift will further strain China's overseas lending and investment activities.

According to the report, this disengagement would adversely affect low and middle-income countries in particular. For instance, China has incurred significant losses on the loans it granted to multiple countries.

It has become clear that several countries - mainly in Africa, including Angola, Ethiopia, the Republic of Congo, and Zambia - are no longer in a position to repay the debt they owe China. Sri Lanka which faces the worst economic crisis has started restructuring talks with China now. Nigeria's external debt owed to Chi-

na accounts for 83.57 per cent of its total bilateral debt as of June 30, 2022, totaling 3.9 billion US dollars, a 12.7 per cent increase from 3.5 billion US dollars in the same period last year, according to data from the Debt Management Office (DMO).

From 2000 to 2020, the top 10 African government recipients of Chinese loans were Angola, Ethiopia, Zambia, Kenya, Egypt, Nigeria, Cameroon, South Africa, the Republic of Congo, and Ghana, according to data from the Boston University Global Development Policy Centre.

Analysts accused China of ruining the lives of millions of Africans who depended on China for the infrastructural and overall development of their countries, according to Inside Over.

14 million Ukrainians displaced from their homes

14 million people have been forcibly displaced from their homes since the start of Ukraine's invasion on February 24 this year, United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees Filippo Grandi has said.

In a briefing to the Security Council on Wednesday, the UN refugee chief said, "The Russian invasion of Ukraine has driven the fastest and largest displacement witnessed in decades. Some 14 million people have been forced from their homes since the 24th of February."

Filippo Grandi warned the Ukrainians are about to face one of the world's harshest winters in extremely difficult circumstances. "Humanitarian organizations have dramatically scaled up their response, but much more must be done, starting with an end to this senseless war," he said.

As the war continues to prolong in Ukraine, the UN refugee chief said the destruction caused by strikes at civilian infrastructure is quickly making the humanitarian response look like a drop in the ocean of needs.

He said UNHCR's focus is increasingly on helping displaced people in Ukraine, working under the government's able leadership. Of the



neighbouring countries, Moldova continues to need special attention, given its vulnerability.

"Meanwhile in the European Union, we have seen an open, well managed and above all shared refugee response that has proven wrong many of the statements frequently repeated by some politicians: that Europe is full; that relocation is impossible; that there is no public support for refugees," he added.

Over UNHCR's response to the crisis in Ukraine, Grandi said that they are maintaining a high level of preparedness for further population movements, both inside and outside Ukraine, taking into account different possible scenarios and the scope and limitations of humanitarian assistance.

Kim Jong-un wants US' attention

North Korea is deliberately ramping up tensions with its neighbours. Analysts think it is building to something bigger, such as a nuclear test, or a full long-range ballistic missile test out in the Pacific, or both, the BBC said.

There is a political objective to all this noise, the analysts said, adding, the ultimate aim is not just to threaten South Korea and Japan. North Korea can do that already. It is to threaten the US with a nuclear capable intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM).

Thursday's test will certainly have shaken those who heard the sirens go off in Japan, they said. The inter-continental ballistic missile that was launched by North on Thursday never made it into Japanese airspace. According to South Korean military sources it failed mid-flight and fell back to earth, splashing down in the Sea of Japan.

It's a pattern Pyongyang has used in 2010 and again in 2017. First, ramp up tensions to a frightening level, then call for engagement and concessions from South Korea, Japan and the US. Pyongyang is almost certainly doing the same again now, the BBC report added.

However, Kim Jong-un has a second objective, the report claimed. Explaining Pyongyang's recent steps, the report said, the North is still far from perfecting its missile technology. In previous tests it appears

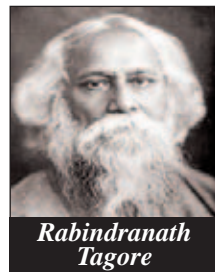


that North Korea's re-entry vehicles have failed. So, Pyongyang needs to keep on testing to perfect its technology. If Thursday's test was another failure - it only demonstrates how far it still has to go. After the missile is launched in to space the warhead separates and comes back towards earth in a "re-entry vehicle". This must be able to withstand the enormous heat and pressure generated as it plunges through the atmosphere, the report added. The Japanese coast guard on Thursday said a missile fired from North Korea was heading over Japan. North Korean missiles have crossed Japan before - one did last month - but never this far south, the BBC said.

Study outlines ways to help children learn forgiveness

A recent study suggests that teaching children to understand other people's perspectives could make it easier for them to learn how to forgive other people. The study also found that teaching children to make sincere apologies can help them receive forgiveness from others.

"Forgiveness is important in children and adults for restoring relationships and limiting future conflicts," says Kelly Lynn Mulvey, lead author of the study and an associate professor of psychology at North Carolina State University. "But we didn't know much about what makes children more likely to forgive others, particularly from early childhood to adolescence. That's what we wanted to explore with our study."

To that end, Mulvey and her collaborators enlisted 185 children, between the ages of 5 and 14, in the study. Researchers conducted an in-depth interview with each child that collected background information and assessed the child's "theory of mind" skills. Theory of mind is your ability to understand that someone else's beliefs, intentions and desires are different from your own.

Researchers then led each child through a series of scenarios involving other children who are "in group" and "out group." Specifically, each study participant was told they were part of a group like the green team. During interviews, researchers described some children in the scenarios as also being on the green team (making them in-



group), while other children in the scenarios were on the yellow team (making them out-group). In each scenario, interviewers asked study participants whether they were

willing to forgive a group that left them out of a game or activity. There were three main findings. First, children are more likely to forgive someone if they have apolo-

gized. Second, children are more likely to forgive people who are "in group." Third, the more advanced a child's Theory of Mind skills are, the more likely they are to forgive others.

"We found that kids have sophisticated abilities to forgive others," Mulvey says. "Children are capable of restoring relationships with others, and are usually interested in doing so." The researchers identified two things that parents and teachers may want to focus on related to forgiveness. One is helping kids understand how important it is to apologize in a meaningful way.

"Children are capable of discerning an insincere apology, and insincere apologies were not conducive to encouraging forgiveness," Mulvey says. "The apology needs to make clear that someone understands why what they did was wrong. This, in turn, makes other kids more likely to give them a second chance."

The second focus area is helping kids understand the perspectives of other people, even if they are different from you.

"One of the biggest implications of our study is that teachers and parents need to actively help children cultivate theory of mind skills," Mulvey says. "A good starting point is getting kids to explain the rationale behind their actions and how this might make other people feel. Helping young people develop these skills in childhood will aid them in navigating a diverse and complex world."

leads to heart failure. This is called Broken Heart Syndrome or Takotsubo cardiomyopathy. In congenital heart disease, the heart is not formed correctly. People born with such defects are predisposed to heart failure.

Diagnosing And Managing Heart Failure "Checking medical history, a simple physical exam, few blood tests, X-ray, ECG and echocardiogram are some of the routine things done to diagnose heart disease and heart failure. Sometimes, a CT scan and MRI may be required," says Dr Rajesh. In most patients, heart failure can be effectively managed with oral medications and simple measures. Sometimes, it may require hospitalisation and administration of injections. "The basic underlying cause has to be rectified, if possible. This may require an intervention or cardiac surgery. In a few patients, the condition can deteriorate to such an extent that medications become ineffective. This is called terminal heart failure. Even in such patients, treatment options are available, one of them being heart transplant," shares Dr Rajesh.

Strict action has been taken by the Election Commission against those who do not provide the details of the money spent in the elections. If the candidate does not give the details of the election expenses within the stipulated time, then he can be disqualified by the Commission for 3 years.

An impartial inquiry should be conducted into the matter as to what time, where and how the father was killed and whether he was taken to the hospital alive or taken to the dead.

Iftikhar Ahmed and Shadab Khan's sensational fifties followed by Shaheen Shah Afridi's three-wicket haul guided Pakistan to a 33-run victory over South Africa in a rain-curtailed do-or-die match in their Super 12 encounter of the ongoing ICC Men's T20 World Cup at the SCG in Sydney on Thursday.

In the rain-curtailed 14-over match, skipper Temba Bavuma top-scored for South Africa with 36 off 19 while Aiden Markram played a knock of 20 runs in 14 deliveries. For Pakistan Shaheen bagged three while Shadab Khan scalped two wickets.

With this comprehensive victory over the Proteas, Pakistan can keep hoping against hope for a miracle after doing what was needed of them against South Africa.

With the win, Pakistan claimed third place in the Group 2 points table with four points in their hands. Even after the defeat South Africa are placed in the second spot in the table with five points in their hands.

Chasing a competitive target of 186, South Africa got off to a bad start as they lost their opener Quinton de Kock and Rilee Rossouw under three overs and left tottering at 16/2.

Pakistan's star pacer Shaheen Afridi struck in the very first over of the innings as he dismissed de Kock for zero. In the third over of the innings, Afridi produced a stunning short and wide outside-off delivery to send Rossouw packing for 7 runs.

Temba Bavuma and Aiden Markram then handled the charge as they hammered Haris Rauf for 20 runs in the fourth over of the game.

Shadab Khan was then brought into the attack and the bowler proved he is one of the best bowlers of Pakistan's attack as he removed well-set batter Bavuma for 36 off 19 and Markram for 20 off 14, leaving South Africa tottering at 66/4.

Tristan Stubbs then came out to bat. After 9 overs rain stopped play, new batters Tristan Stubbs batting at 2* off 6 and Heinrich Klaasen




playing unbeaten at 2 off 4, South Africa's score read 69/4. At that point Pakistan were 16 runs ahead on Duckworth-Lewis-Stern (DLS) method.

The play was resumed after much delay and South Africa's innings was reduced to 14 overs, with a DLS target of 142. That meant the Proteas needed 73 from their remaining five overs.


In the first over of the resumed play, Tristan Stubbs slammed Shadab Khan for 14 runs with the help of a stunning four and a six.

Heinrich Klaasen also opened his hands to slam Afridi for back-to-back two fours, however, his stint on the crease was cut short as he was dismissed after scoring 15 off 9 deliveries. Wayne Parnell then came out to bat, but the latter could not do much as he was dismissed by Mohammad Wasim Jr in the 12th over of the innings after scoring just three runs. Kagiso Rabada then came out to bat. The equation went down to Pro-


teas needing 43 runs in 12 balls. Naseem Shah's slower ball removed Stubbs for 18 off 18 in the 13th over of the game. In the last over South Africa's batters could only manage to score 7 runs and handed a 33-run win to Pakistan. Earlier, Pakistan posted a challenging total of 185/9 with the help of brilliant fifties from Shadab Khan and Iftikhar Ahmed after losing quick wickets against South Africa. Shadab scored a blazing fifty off just 20 balls to help Pakistan recover from the early setback by Protea pacers. Iftikhar also scored 51 playing the role of anchor to help his team end with a decent score. Opting to bat first, the Pakistani inning started on a bad note as they lost key batter Mohammad Rizwan to an inswinging delivery from Wayne Parnell in the first over.

Drone mapping up to 15 meters below ground to be done

While taking yet another pivotal step towards ensuring maximum use of information technology, the Haryana Chief Minister today directed the officers of Drone Imaging and Information Services of Haryana Limited (DRIISHYA) to do the work developing anti-drone technology. Apart from this, sensors should also be procured for mapping to be done up to 15 meters under the ground from drones, directed Sh. Manohar Lal.

Sh. Manohar Lal, who is also the Chairman, DRIISHYA said this while presenting over the third meeting of the Board of Directors of DRIISHYA held here today. He directed the officers to complete the process of taking permission for flying drones from the Directorate General of Civil Aviation, Government of India at the earliest. The services of experienced people associ-

ated with aviation should be taken by DRIISHYA, said the Chief Minister. Sh. Manohar Lal was apprised that DRIISHYA has done a successful survey of Khanak mines using a fixing wing drone (F-90) for volumetric analysis in the mining areas of Bhiwani district, Dadam and Khanak. Apart from this, the work of inspection of the Bahadurgarh – Daulatabad high tension power line, and survey work of a waterlogged area in 11.55 square kilometre area of 10 villages along Yamuna River in Karnal district has also been done. With this, large-scale mapping work has also been done in Sector 15-A and Sector 75 of the Faridabad and Rakhigadhi Heritage area of Hisar district. The Chief Minister was apprised that apart from the revenue department, the use of drones should also be ensured in other departments like Urban Local Bodies, Power, Disaster Management, Mining, Forest, Traffic, Town and Country Planning,

and Agriculture. This will help in mapping, land records, disaster management and emergency services, and development plans in urban areas. Notably, Haryana is the first state to create a separate corporation to speed up the Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) driven governance application. The establishment of DRIISHYA marks a unique beginning in Haryana, as now with the help of drones the extension of the area can be traced as well as illegal encroachments can be controlled. Earlier manual surveys were conducted from time to time, which was time-consuming and costly as well as. These manual surveys also required more manpower. Chief Secretary and Vice-Chairman, DRIISHYA Sh. Sanjeev Kaushal, Chief Principal Secretary to Chief Minister, Sh. D.S Dhesi, Additional Chief Secretary and Financial Commissioner, Revenue and Disaster Management and Consolidation Departments.

SI Dr. Ashok Verma delivers platelets at midnight
