## Gold falls Rs 141; silver climbs Rs 132

**NEW DELHI:** Gold price in the national capital fell Rs 141 to Rs 51,747 per 10 grams on Wednesday amid rupee appreciation, according to HDFC Securities. In the previous trade, the yellow metal had settled at Rs 51,888 per 10 grams. Silver, however, climbed Rs 132 to Rs 62,400 per kilogram.

## CBI arrests two former Directors of Bharat Papers

**NEW DELHI:** The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) on Wednesday arrested two former Directors of a private company (Borrower) based at Kathua in Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) in an ongoing investigation into a bank fraud case. The arrested accused have been identified as Anil Kumar and Praveen Kumar, both former Directors of M/s Bharat Papers Ltd.

A case was registered on February 12, 2020, against the private company (Borrower) and others including its MD, Directors etc. on a complaint from SBI, SAM Branch, Ludhiana.

## BB Bharti is new Pol Secy to Haryana CM

# When Congress loses power, it loses forever: PM in Himachal

Prime minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday said that when Congress loses power in any state it never return to power and cited names of different states where Congress party has not been able to come to power even after decades. He said that it should be repeated in Himachal too that Congress lost power in the 2017 polls should not be allowed to come back to power again in the interest and for the development of this hill state.

Modi was addressing a public meeting at Chambai in Kangra district 15 kms from here on Wednesday. He said that in Tamilnadu Congress party lost 60 years back and didn't come back even once. He said that Congress could not make a come back even after five decades in West Bengal and Tripura.

He said that 40 years have passed when Congress party had ruled Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Gujarat and even could not enter back into government for decades



in Delhi, Sikkim, Nagaland and Odisha.

He said that contrary to Congress the BJP was repeating governments and added that BJP repeated government in Utranchal, Manipur and Uttar Pradesh.

Modi asked the people to pay goodbye to Congress party because if it is repeated it will create a stumbling blocks in the development of the state.

He said that Congress means

Dynasty rule and corruption.

He said that the trend of changing government after every five years if continues allegedly gives Congress an opportunity to indulge in Corruption and loot and spend five years in make marry and go.

He said that people should vote for BJP double engine government for development, continuity and accountability. He said that it is because of the double en-

gine government during Corona pandemic Himachal Pradesh topped in the country in vaccination program.

He said that it is because of the double engine government 8000 houses were constructed during last five years against 15 house during three years of Congress rule from 2014 -2017.

He lambasted Congress party for cheating the innocent people of the state when Congress was in power in both state and the center and decided to have projects in 60:40 ratio so the state suffered which his Government amended and changed to 90:10.

Prime minister said that four lane projects of Pathankot - Mandi and Shimla- Matour were in progress to boost tourism in the state.

He lauded Himachal BJP for announcing eleven point Sankalp Patter to push the development of the state.

## India to receive its last Rafale by December 15

India will receive its 36th and final Rafale fighter jet from France by December 15 completing the delivery of all the aircraft it had signed for in an over Rs 60,000 crore deal inked in 2016.

"The last aircraft will arrive in India around December 15. The aircraft was used for developing the India-specific enhancements in the Rafale fleet of the Indian Air Force," senior defence officials told .

India had signed a deal for 36 of these planes and 35 of them have already arrived and are stationed at Ambala, Haryana and Hashimara in West Bengal.

The officials said the 36th aircraft with RB tail number has

been provided to the Indian side by France with all its spares and other parts replaced as it was being used for developmental activities.

Meanwhile, the Indian Air Force has also started upgrading the planes to the highest standards and has been equipped with all India-specific enhancements. The Rafale is a 4.5-generation aircraft and has helped India regain its supremacy over Indian sub-constituent skies with long-range air-to-air and air-to-ground missiles along with advanced radar and electronic warfare capabilities.

The French firm Dassault Aviation is also involved in the maintenance of the aircraft whose serviceability is over 75 per cent.

## Rajnath Singh interacts with senior leadership of Indian Army

Addressing the ongoing Army Commanders' Conference held in Delhi from November 7-11, Singh highlighted the stellar role played by the Army in guarding our borders and fighting terrorism apart from providing assistance to the civil administration whenever called for.

Army top brass discussed current and emerging security threats, transformation,

and increasing induction of made-in-India weapon systems in force on the third day of the conference, Indian Army officials said. "During the event, the Indian Army's apex leadership is comprehensively deliberating upon all aspects of existing security scenarios and challenges for the present security apparatus," the official said adding that the conference is also focusing on issues pertaining to organisational restructuring, logistics, administration, human resource management, modernisation through indigenisation and induction of Niche technologies.

## Double engine govt doubled Haryana's growth pace: CM

In all these eight years, the State has not only set a record in terms of implementing several first-of-its-kind development reforms but has also placed Haryana as one of the prominent state of the country in terms of infrastructural development.

The credit for this success certainly goes to the visionary thinking of the Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal. The Chief Minister not only increased the fund allocation for the development of infrastructure but set up various new developmental projects



so as to ensure the holistic development of Haryana.

"We don't just promise, we deliver. Our government is giving special focus to the overall development of

the state by bringing in radical changes. In today's era, Haryana has become prominent state of the country in terms of infrastructural development," believes Sh. Manohar Lal.

The Chief Minister, who is also the Finance Minister of Haryana, while bringing in a policy change had created a Medium Term Expenditure Reserve Fund of Rs 8,700 crore so as to ensure the smooth execution of long-term projects.

The budget allocation is done on an annual basis and many projects are of long duration, which takes more than a year to complete. Our government has accepted the fact that many projects, especially those related to infrastructure, require continuous support of budget. Therefore, a

Reserve Fund has been created for such projects by making provision for medium-term expenditure structure to avoid delay in the completion of projects due to budget allocation on annual basis, says Sh. Manohar Lal.

From time to time, the Manohar Lal-led government is ensuring the construction of Railway Over Bridges (ROBs) or Railway Under Bridges (RUBs). In the last 8 years, railway mapping has been done and such places have been identified where there is a need for ROB / RUB. During the tenure of the present State Government, 59 ROB or RUBs have been constructed and construction of 40 ROB / RUBs is in progress.

## Court grants bail to Sanjay Raut

A special PMLA Court on Wednesdays granted bail to Shiv Sena leader & MP Sanjay Raut in a money laundering case linked to a housing project in Mumbai.

He was in jail for 100 days and celebrated his Dussehra and Diwali in Arthur road jail only.

Special PMLA court judge MG Deshpande deliver its order after arguments of Defence and prosecution was concluded on November 2 and the order was reserved till to-

day. The judge also granted bail to Pravin Raut, a co-accused in the same case and directed both of them to furnish bail bound of Rs two lakh each.

Meanwhile, the Court also turned down the request by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) for a stay on the order for one week so as to enable the ED to file an appeal against the judgment. Additional Solicitor General Anil Singh while arguing the ED plea submitted that "We need time to read the order, it is not an unreasonable request. Its the court's order, it has the powers to say that give effect to the order on a later date.

## UK HC dismisses Nirav Modi's appeal against extradition to India

Fugitive diamond businessman Nirav Modi on Wednesday lost his appeal against extradition to India with a United Kingdom court dismissing his plea.

The High Court of London (United Kingdom) on Wednesday dismissed the appeal of Nirav Modi, who is wanted in India to face money laundering and fraud cases.

Nirav Modi, who is a prime accused in the Rs 13,500 crore PNB scam, had fled India. He lost his appeal after he had moved High Court in London against extradition on mental health grounds. The Bench of Justice Stuart Smith and Justice Robert Jay of the High Court said "no features of psychotic illness". The court rejected Nirav Modi's counsel's claims that he will die by suicide due to severe depression and said "Nirav Modi neither is nor is very likely to be at the most severe end of the scale of depressive illness". "He has so far displayed no features of psychotic illness. Although he has exhibited persistent



suicidal ideation, he has neither attempted suicide or deliberate self-harm nor disclosed plans to do so, except in the most vague and general way," the court said. The High Court also noted the steps taken to render Barrack 12 safe and to ensure that there is effectively constant monitoring to reduce both the risk of attempted suicide and the prospect of suicide being committed. The Court noted that the appellant, Nirav Deepak Modi, is sought by the Government of India. The High Court noted the sets of criminal proceedings before it. The first, brought by the Central Bureau of Investigation ("the CBI"), relates to a fraud on the Punjab National Bank, which caused losses equivalent to over £700 million.

## 'Will protect all citizens,' says CJI Chandrachud after taking oath

Soon after taking oath as the Chief Justice of India (CJI) on Wednesday, D Y Chandrachud assured that he would protect all Indians and that serving the nation was his priority.

Talking to the reporters, CJI said, "To serve the nation is my priority. We'll protect all the citizens of India, be it in terms of technology or registry reforms, or judicial reforms."

Chandrachud also paid tribute to the Mahatma Gandhi statue in the Parliament after taking the oath. He was sworn in as Chief Justice of India after Justice Uday Umesh Lalit was demitted from office.

President Droupadi Murmu administered the oath of office to Justice DY Chandrachud at the swearing-in



ceremony held in the Rashtrapati Bhavan.

Justice Chandrachud succeeds Chief Justice UU Lalit who retired on November 9.

The senior-most judge of the Supreme Court of India Justice D Y Chandrachud on Wednesday has become the 50th head of the Judiciary of the country. He will have a tenure till November 10, 2024. Last Month the Centre Government had notified the name of Dr Justice Dhananjaya Yashwant Chandrachud, Judge of the Supreme Court, as the Chief Justice of India, with effect from November 9, 2022.

The press statement issued in this regards stated that "In exercise of the power conferred by clause (2) of Article 124 of the Constitution of India, the President is pleased to appoint Dr

Justice Dhananjaya Yashwant Chandrachud, Judge of the Supreme Court, as the Chief Justice of India, with effect from November 9, 2022."

Justice Chandrachud's father Justice YV Chandrachud was the 16th Chief Justice of India serving from February 2, 1978, to July 11, 1985.

This has become the first time in the history of the judiciary, Father and son have become CJI.

Justice Chandrachud is known as a progressive and liberal judge of the country. He is also considered as very sensitive to the fundamental rights of citizens and the most distinctive feature of Justice Chandrachud is known for his tough attitude towards the abusers. Justice Chandrachud, born on November 11, 1959, was appointed judge of the Supreme Court on May 13, 2016.

133 boxes of liquor, 75  
liters of lahan seized

In view of the assembly elections, the enforcement team of the Central Zone of the Excise Department took action against illegal liquor in district, Bilaspur and recovered 125 boxes (1500 bottles) of different brands of English liquor. The Commissioner of State Taxes and Excise, Yunus said here today that the department had been receiving information about liquor being sold in the area for quite some time. The officials of the enforcement team have succeeded in seizing this consignment by alerting their information system in this area. He said that the place where this liquor was caught was a closed shop; the owner of the shop was not present on the spot. Therefore, in the presence of Panchayat



Pradhan and Police, action was taken under the Excise Act by breaking the lock and taking possession of the said quantity of liquor and the case has been handed over to the nearest police station for further action including liquor. In another case, the task force of Revenue District Baddi searched a Scorpio vehicle during checking of vehicles in Nalagarh and seized 8 boxes (96 bottles) of liquor in it.

Taking action under the Excise Act, an FIR has been registered against the person involved in taking possession of liquor at Nalagarh Police Station. He said that after the notification of the election, a campaign is going on against illegal liquor and goods which can affect the electoral process in the entire state. Teams of the department are thoroughly checking all the vehicles coming to the state at the inter-state borders. This Special Summary revision is special since now there will be four qualifying dates, i.e., the 1st of January, the 1st of April, the 1st of July, and the 1st of October, and citizens with 17 plus years of age can apply in advance for enrolment in the electoral roll.

He also informed that the dates of 19-20 November and 3-4 December have been fixed by the Chief Election Officer Punjab for setting up vice camps at the polling booths. Form no 6, 6A 7 and 8 will be received from the general public/voters regarding claims

Apart from this, the claims and objections received from November 9 to December 8 will be settled by the concerned Electoral Registration Officer by December 26, 2022, and the final publication of the voter list will be done on January 5, 2023. Gannaur sees 61.7 pc polling,

Vicious cycle

An essential characteristic of modern capitalism is that the living conditions of millions of people are determined by the whims and caprices of a handful of financial speculators; indeed, that is what 'leaving things to the market' really entails. Consider what is happening in India today. There is a massive outflow of finance from the country because of which the rupee is depreciating vis-à-vis the dollar. It has already fallen by more than 10% since February even though the Reserve Bank of India has spent over \$100 billion, almost a sixth of the country's foreign exchange reserves, to prevent such a fall, and even though it has been raising the interest rate almost in tandem with the rise in the United States of America to discourage such an outflow.

The depreciation of the rupee is exacerbating the inflationary process by raising the cost of imported goods, including essential goods like oil; inflation, in turn, is creating expectations of a further depreciation of the exchange rate that become self-fulfilling; they encourage a further outflow of finance and cause a further depreciation of the rupee. So the spiral of depreciation-inflation-depreciation goes on, fed by the rush of speculators away from the rupee.

This latest financial outflow began with the rise in the US interest rates effected by the Federal Reserve Board from the beginning of March. The financial outflow was not only from India but from almost the entire capitalist world, barring one notable exception. That exception, ironically, was Russia, against whom sanctions were imposed by the Western powers led by the US with the avowed objective of 'reducing the rouble to rubble'; and yet, after an initial fall, the rouble has recovered dramatically to reach a level vis-à-vis the dollar that has not been seen in years, aided no doubt by Russia's insistence on being paid for its oil and gas in terms of roubles. The currencies of other capitalist countries, including India, by contrast are falling despite increases in their interest rates.

It may be thought that this financial outflow is occurring from India only because the rise in Indian interest rates has not yet matched the increase in US interest rates, that it would automatically come to an end when this matching is fully achieved; and, indeed, it is true that while the increase in the US federal funds rate between March 1 and October 31 has been 3%, the increase in the RBI's repo rate has been around 2%. But the RBI is all set to raise the repo rate further, and will keep on doing so since it is about the only instrument available to it to entice financial flows under a neoliberal regime.

Pakistan poses threat to  
Iran-Afghanistan relations

Pakistan has become a significant threat to Iran and Afghanistan's relationship. Because of their own reason, Pakistan doesn't want Iran to grow closer to Afghanistan, reported Afghanistan Diaspora Network.

Despite Iran and Afghanistan sharing the same history and natural ties on religious, cultural, linguistic, and economic lines but their relationship is always tested on trust and now, Pakistan has become the spoilsport in their ties.

Pakistan always sees Iran through the prism of Tehran's relation with India which pushes Islamabad to counter the threat emanating from closer Iran-Afghanistan relations which could have a natural extension to India, according to the Afghanistan Diaspora Network.

Iran and Afghanistan's relationship with time has become more bitter, especially, after Pakistan extended its support to the Taliban, and the targeting of Hazara Shia by the group has put Iran in a tight spot in extending support to the Islamic Emirates against the US.

Besides this, Pakistan has been using Iran as a transit point for trafficking heroin sourced from Afghanistan. As evident from the recent report by North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), the whole supply chain of drug trafficking from Afghanistan is completely controlled by Pakistan.

To guise the source, Pakistan uses the route of Iran to traffic the drugs to South and Southeast Asia. This has brought tremendous strain to the relationship between Iran and Afghanistan, reported Afghanistan Diaspora Network.

Iran and Afghanistan signed the friendship treaty in 1921. Both countries, initially face disputes over the sharing of water rights of Helmand River diversified into other domains with the Iranian revolution



and the rise of the Taliban. Their relationship reached its worst point in 1998 when the Taliban killed eight Iranian diplomats and an Iranian journalist during the occupation of Mazar-e-Sharif in the north of Afghanistan. And now it turned to worst.

Iran wanted to improve its relationship with Afghanistan and for that reason, Tehran kept its Mission in Kabul. Iran tried to capitalize on the shelter provided to some leaders of the Taliban during the US presence in Afghanistan. But the expectations of Iran remain unfilled. Here again, Pakistan used its influence with the Taliban to ensure that the tide doesn't change. This coupled with a lack of representative government from the Taliban, targeting of Hazara Shia and a huge influx of refugees from

Afghanistan has slowed down any visible progress in the relationship. Iran wants the Taliban to officially recognize the Shia Jafari school of thought as part of Islamic jurisprudence tradition as the Taliban government codifies a new constitution for Afghanistan. Iran also wants the Taliban to adhere to the 1973 water treaty regarding the flow of the Helmand River and keep the Kamal Khan Dam open. Tehran has demanded that the Taliban leadership have to take steps to contain the flow of refugees, while Taliban leaders have raised the ill-treatment of Afghan refugees in Iran as a major problem, according to the Afghanistan Diaspora Network. It is a factor that the Taliban is the best vanguard in its fight against Islamic State in

Afghanistan, as it would be hard for the Fatemiyoun Brigade to operate without consent from the Taliban leaders. Pakistan doesn't want any other elements to operate with the Taliban and wanted to control the Taliban, especially the Haqqani network completely. Leaders in Iran continue to see the Taliban as a proxy of Pakistan. It is imperative for the Taliban to demonstrate otherwise. This is the first step towards normalising and putting the relationship on a growth trajectory. A stable and growing relationship with Tehran is important for the Taliban to show to the world that Pakistani agencies do not bind them, to diversify the relations and thereby increase the possibility of faster international recognition, reported Afghanistan Diaspora Network.

Sugary foods may influence  
poor oral health

New research on postmenopausal women identifies associations between commonly eaten foods and the diversity and composition of oral bacteria.

Scientists from the University at Buffalo have shown how eating certain types of foods impacts the oral microbiome of postmenopausal women. They found that higher intake of sugary and high glycemic load foods -- like doughnuts and other baked goods, regular soft drinks, breads and non-fat yogurts -- may influence poor oral health and, perhaps, systemic health outcomes in older women due to the influence these foods have on the oral microbiome.

In a study in Scientific Reports, an open access journal from the publishers of Nature, the UB-led team investigated whether carbohydrates and sucrose, or table sugar, were associated with the diversity and composition of oral bacteria in a sample of 1,204 postmenopausal women using data from the Women's Health Initiative.

It is the first study to examine carbohydrate intake and the subgingival microbiome in a sample consisting exclusively of postmenopausal women. The study was unique in that the samples were taken



from subgingival plaque, which occurs under the gums, rather than salivary bacteria. "This is important because the oral bacteria involved in periodontal disease are primarily residing in the subgingival plaque," said study first author Amy Millen, PhD, associate professor of epidemiology and environmental health in UB's School of Public Health and Health Professions.

"Looking at measures of salivary bacteria might not tell us how oral bacteria relate to periodontal disease because we are not looking in the right environment within the mouth," she added.

The research team reported positive associations between total carbohydrates, glycemic load and sucrose and Streptococcus mutans, a contributor to tooth decay and some types of cardiovascular disease, a finding that confirms previous observations.

It's confirmed! Processed food  
key to rising obesity

The growing body of evidence suggesting highly processed and refined foods are the main cause of the rising obesity rates in the Western world is supported by a 12-month study of the eating habits of 9,341 Australians.

The Charles Perkins Centre (CPC) at the University of Sydney recently published a new study that supports the "Protein Leverage Hypothesis" and was based on a nationwide nutrition and physical activity survey done by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS).

The Protein Leverage Hypothesis, first proposed in 2005 by professors Raubenheimer and Stephen Simpson, contends that humans overeat fats and carbs due to their bodies' great demand for protein, which it actively prefers above all other nutrients. People are compelled to consume more energy-dense meals until they meet their protein needs because the majority of current diets consist of highly processed and refined foods, which are poor in protein.

Processed foods lack protein and drive craving

"As people consume more junk foods or highly processed and refined foods, they dilute their dietary protein and increase their risk of being overweight and obese, which we know increases the risk of chronic disease," said lead author Dr Amanda Grech, a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the CPC and the university's School of Life and Environmental Sciences. "It's increasingly clear that our bodies eat to satisfy a protein target," added Professor David Raubenheimer, the Leonard Ullmann Chair in Nutritional Ecology at the School of Life and Environmental Sciences.




"But the problem is that the food in Western diets has increasingly less protein. So, you have to consume more of it to reach your protein target, which effectively elevates your daily energy intake."

"Humans, like many other species, have a stronger appetite for protein than for the main energy-providing nutrients of fats and carbohydrates. That means that if the protein in our diet is diluted with fats and carbohydrates, we will eat more energy to get the protein that our bodies crave."

New theory explains recovery delays in COVID-19 and cardiac patients

COVID-19 patients placed on ventilators can take a long time to regain consciousness. New research is now illustrating that these delays may serve a purpose: protecting the brain from oxygen deprivation.

The existence of such a brain-preserving state could explain why some patients wake up days or even weeks after they stop receiving ventilation, and it suggests that physicians should take these lengthy recovery times into account when determining a patient's prognosis.

In a study published November 7 in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, the investigators connect the pattern seen among those



who have survived severe COVID-19 with similar delays known to occur in a small fraction of cardiac arrest patients.

"The delayed recoveries in COVID-19 patients are very much like the rare

cases we've documented in previous research. In this new paper, we describe a mechanism to explain what we're seeing in both types of patients," said study co-senior author Dr. Nicholas D.

Schiff, the Jerold B. Katz Professor of Neurology and Neuroscience in the Feil Family Brain and Mind Research Institute and co-director of the Consortium for the Advanced Study of Brain Injury (CASBI) at Weill Cornell Medicine. He found evidence for this explanation -- that patients' brains are protecting themselves -- in animals, most notably painted turtles, that can tolerate extended periods without oxygen.

More than a decade ago, Dr. Schiff and his colleagues first observed these delays among comatose cardiac arrest patients who received cooling therapy to reduce brain damage caused by a loss of

blood flow. In one such case, a 71-year-old patient took 37 days to awaken, before ultimately making a near-complete recovery.

During the pandemic, Dr. Schiff, who is also a neurologist at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center, performed neurology consultations for COVID-19 patients, and he soon began seeing similar, delayed awakenings occurring when patients were taken off ventilators and stopped receiving the sedatives given to them to reduce their movement. In a separate analysis of a large cohort of Covid-19 patients from Weill Cornell Medicine and two other major U.S. medical centers, Dr. Schiff and his colleagues,

including co-author of the current paper, Dr. Emery N. Brown, professor of anesthesia at Harvard Medical School, Edward Hood Taplin Professor of Medical Engineering and Computational Neuroscience in The Picower Institute for Learning and Memory at MIT and an anesthesiologist at Massachusetts General Hospital, found that a quarter of patients who survived ventilation took 10 days or longer to recover consciousness. The more oxygen deprivation they suffered while on the ventilator, the longer that delay.

In the prior study of cardiac patients, the researchers recorded a distinctive pattern in brain activity, one also seen in

patients under deep anesthesia. (Recordings from COVID-19 patients are extremely limited.) Dr. Schiff read that a similar pattern had been seen in the brains of painted turtles, which can withstand up to five months without oxygen under ice in the winter. To do so, they activate the same inhibitory system within the brain targeted by anesthetics given to human cardiac and COVID-19 patients but in novel ways developed by evolutionary specializations.

Dr. Schiff and Dr. Brown propose that, by chance, the same protective response emerges in the patients. "It is our theory that oxygen deprivation as well as practices in

the ICU, including commonly used anesthetics, expose elements of strategies that animals use to survive in extreme conditions," Dr. Schiff said.

"These observations may offer new insights into the mechanisms of how certain anesthetics produce unconsciousness and new approaches for ICU sedation and for fostering recovery from disorders of consciousness," Dr. Brown added.

When patients fail to regain consciousness for an extended time, physicians may recommend withdrawing life-supporting care. This threshold is typically set at 14 days or less for cardiac patients, while no such guidelines exist for COVID-19.

## Skin fungal infection could be a marker of internal disease: Dr. Maleeka Sachdev

CHANDIGARH: Skin fungal infections are often taken lightly but Dermatologists in Chandigarh have warned people to get themselves checked if they witness red round rash associated with itching, seen on the folds like underarms, inner thighs or breasts. Dr Maleeka Sachdev, M.D (Dermatology) Chandigarh said as this contagious condition could be a sign of an underlying condition.

The prevalence of skin fungal infections is high in India for the last few years. If a fungal infection stays untreated it may lead to secondary infection and spread to other areas of the body and can spread across community. It can also be fatal sometimes. "Fungal infections can be a marker of internal diseases. People with a weak immune system like those suffering from diabetes, HIV, and cancer are more predisposed to fungal infections. Drugs like steroids and chemotherapy also lead to an increased incidence of fungal infections. The most commonly reported fungi during Covid-19 were Mucormycosis (Black Fungus), candidiasis and aspergillosis. Fungal infections need immediate medical intervention by a dermatologist," said Dr Maleeka. Dr Maleeka is getting multiple cases of fungal infections in a month in her OPD, wherein all age groups can be affected from paediatric to old age patients. "Fungal infections can happen to anyone be it a child or a senior citizen. You can catch it

even after maintaining proper hygiene by getting in touch with affected people. There are no dietary restrictions for infected people and clinical diagnosis is generally good to understand how far the infection has spread. It



becomes scary when these point toward an internal disease," Dr Maleeka. added.

Haryana Vidhan Sabha Speaker Gyan Chand Gupta said that 7 concerns have been started here to make Panchkula a unique identity. In these, action has been ensured at the administrative level as well as the role of common citizens to make the city



free from encroachment, slum, straw cattle, street dog, drug, pollution, plastic. In this, some departments of the district administration take direct action, while some departments contribute by running an awareness campaign. In the meeting held on Wednesday, the progress of work on these concerns was discussed and thoroughly reviewed. Deputy Commissioner of Police Surendra Pal Singh and ACP Rajkumar Kaushik presented the data of action taken for drug eradication and compliance of traffic rules. Rajkumar Kaushik said that in the year 2022, a special campaign has

been launched against drug addicts and people involved in related crimes at a faster rate than the previous years. In just 10 months of this year, 111 cases have been registered against drug traffickers and 158 accused have been arrested. These include 7 cases of opium, 9 of charas, 14 of sawdust, 24 of ganja, 55 of heroin and 2 of drugs. Last year 70 cases were registered and 92 accused were arrested. Similarly, the gamblers and speculators have also been arrested. In 10 months of this year, 376 cases have been registered and 547 people have been arrested. 14 lakh 77 thousand 643 rupees have been

recovered from them. In the year 2021, 240 people were arrested by registering 202 cases and recovery of Rs 5 lakh 16 thousand 987 was made. The Speaker said that the police should not be satisfied with this action and the campaign against drug addicts will have to be intensified. He said that at many places in the city, liquor is being made available on the vehicles around the ahaatas. Such cases will have to be dealt with strictly. The Vis President inquired about the functioning of drug de-addiction centres operating in the city. Instructions have been given to take action against hookah bars operating without licence. In the meeting, information was given about the awareness campaign being run by the Education Department to make the city drug-free and plastic-free. Municipal Corporation Deputy Commissioner Deepak Sura said that along with an awareness campaign, challans of shopkeepers using unauthorised plastic are being deducted.

The duo took star bowlers Trent Boult and Tim Southee to attack, smashing them for boundaries. The duo brought up their 50-run partnership in just 5.4 overs. At the end of six overs of the powerplay, Pakistan stood at 55/0, with Mohammad Rizwan (28\*), Babar Azam (25\*).

Kiwis did not seem to have any answers for Azam-Rizwan's batting as runs kept pouring. At the end of 10 overs, Pakistan stood at 87/0, with Azam (43\*) and Rizwan (41\*) unbeaten still.

beaten still.

Azam brought up his 30th half-century in the shortest format in just 38 balls with a couple. Pakistan reached the 100-run mark in 11.5 overs. Pacer Boult produced the breakthrough for Kiwis, dismissing skipper Azam for 53 off 42 balls after he was caught by Daryl Mitchell at long-on. Mohammad Harris was the next up on crease and he hammered Boult over mid-off on his second ball. Rizwan continued to score, bringing up his 23rd T20I fifty. The duo continued to tick the scoreboard. At the end of 15 overs, Pakistan was 122/1, with Rizwan (54\*) and Harris (11\*) unbeaten. Boult got his second wicket in the match in the 17th over as Rizwan was caught by Glenn Phillips in the covers region. The batter departed after a well-made 57 off 43 consisting of five fours. The inning got off to an action-packed first over with Allen smashing a boundary on the first ball, surviving a leg-before-wicket call on the second and finally getting dismissed on the third. Conway struck two boundaries to Nassem Shah in the second over to get things started for Pakistan and himself. Captain Kane Williamson looked to push the ball into the gaps and keep the scoreboard ticking amidst impressive bowling from the Pakistani bowlers. New Zealand looked set to end the powerplay with just one wicket down but Shadab Khan's brilliance on the field cost the Kiwis Conway's wicket after the batter set out for a risky single on the last ball of the sixth over.

# Hasaranga regains top spot in ICC Men's T20I Player Rankings

Sri Lanka spinner Wanindu Hasaranga has regained the No.1 spot for bowlers in the ICC Men's T20I Player Rankings while India's Suryakumar Yadav has consolidated his position as the top batter in the latest weekly rankings update.

Hasaranga's haul of two for 23 versus England at the ICC Men's T20 World Cup took his tournament haul to 15 wickets and helped him overtake another leg-spinner Rashid Khan of Afghanistan in the rankings table. Interestingly, Hasaranga captured the top spot for the first time after his performances in the last edition of this tournament in the United Arab Emirates and Oman as quoted by ICC.

Yadav, who totals 225 runs in the tournament so far, scored 30 against Bangladesh and a match-winning 61 off 25 balls against Zimbabwe to add six rating points to his tally and reach a career-best 869 points, 39 more than Pakistan's Mohammad Rizwan. Devon Conway of New Zealand is 90 points adrift of Yadav in the third position while Pakistan captain Babar Azam is a further seven points behind in fourth place.



Australia bowlers Josh Hazlewood and Adam Zampa, who grabbed two wickets each against Afghanistan, have moved up in the top 10. Hazlewood has inched up one place to third while Zampa has gone from seventh to fifth.

England spinner Adil Rashid is also in the top10 while India's Ravichandran Ashwin has advanced five places to 13th after picking up three Zimbabwe wickets.

Left-arm fast bowlers Shaheen Shah Afridi of Pakistan and Arshdeep Singh of India have also made significant gains. Shaheen has jumped 20 places to reach 22nd position after grabbing a total of seven wickets against South Africa and Bangladesh. Arshdeep is one

place behind Shaheen at a career-best 23rd position after gaining four slots.

Bangladesh's Nasum Ahmed (up six places to 26th), New Zealand's Lockie Ferguson (up two places to 30th), South Africa's Wayne Parnell (up 12 places to 37th) and Afghanistan's Naveen-ul-Haq (up 20 places to 41st) are among the others to find their way up in the latest update.

In the batting rankings, Sri Lanka's Pathum Nissanka has moved up to the 10th position after scoring 67 against England. New Zealand's Finn Allen has progressed six places to 15th while India batter Lokesh Rahul's half-centuries against Bangladesh and Zimbabwe have lifted him five positions to 16th.

Bangladesh's Litton Das (up five places to 31st) and Australia's Glen Maxwell (up seven places to 33rd) have also moved up while England's Alex Hales has surged 36 places to 34th after scoring 47 against Sri Lanka.



## We overcame England at their home, gives us confidence: Rohit

Indian captain Rohit Sharma stated that the team is confident as they overcame England at their home and exuded confidence ahead of the semi-final clash while speaking at a press conference in Adelaide on Wednesday.

"We know the nature of T20 cricket but beating England in England is a challenge and we overcame that and that is going to give us confidence," stated Rohit Sharma on the English challenge that lies ahead of the team in the semi-final clash of the T20 World Cup. The captain backed the team to stick to its processes that have rendered results for them in this tournament and said that the semi-final clash is an opportunity for them to do what they came here for.

"Absolutely it's an opportunity for us to do what we wanted. We have done well in this tournament we need to stick to what we are doing. Trust what we are doing so far. It is a contest between bat and ball," remarked Rohit.

The Indian captain stressed on the importance of doing well in the knockout games. He said that the players need to play with pride and remember that a bad game doesn't define either a player or a team.

"Knockout games are important. It is essential to

do well in that knockout game but it doesn't define you in one particular game. It is crucial to realize this. As players it is important to play and take pride in ourselves, and where we have come from. Tomorrow we will have to play well to get the result. If you do well in knockout games then it gives you confidence. One bad game in knockout can't truly define you," mentioned the opener.

India had defeated England in the three-match T20I series 2-1 on their English tour in the month of July earlier this year. Suryakumar Yadav had scored 171 runs in three innings, with an incredible strike rate of more than 200.

Suryakumar smashed a brilliant century in the final T20I and scored 117 runs in 55 balls, almost taking India to a win. India had lost the match by 17 runs, chasing 216.

Bhuvneshwar Kumar was declared the player of the series for his superb bowling throughout the series, scalping four wickets at an economy of just 6.25.

India will be locking horns with a formidable England line-up in their semi-final clash at the Adelaide Oval on Thursday, November 10. Fans have been rooting for an India-Pakistan T20 World Cup final on November 13 at the iconic Melbourne Cricket Ground.

## 'Before 2014, poor lived in kuchha houses, defecated in open': Anurag

**SUJANPUR:** Union minister Anurag Thakur on Wednesday said before the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) came to power in 2014, the poor across rural India did not have permanent roofs over their heads and had to relieve themselves in the open for want of toilets. The BJP MP added that the country's rural poor did not even have bank accounts of their own before Prime Minister Narendra Modi was sworn into office.

Addressing a rally at Sujanpur in the Hamirpur district poll-bound Himachal Pradesh on Wednesday, the Union minister for sports and youth affairs said, "Before 2014, the poor lived in kuchha houses, went in open for defecation and did not have bank accounts." Listing out the achievements of the Modi-led central government, especially with regard to the welfare of the country's rural poor, Thakur, who represents the Hamirpur constituency in the Lok Sabha, said the PM had pucca houses built for 3.22 crore people in Himachal Pradesh and it was under his leadership that every village in the state was electrified.

The Union minister added that as part of the flagship 'Swachh



Bharat' (Clean India) programme of the Union government, the prime minister had toilets built in every Himachal village to ensure that locals do not have to step outdoors to relieve themselves. He said as part of the Centre's targeted outreach towards the rural populace and ensure that they derive the desired benefits of the government's direct cash transfer schemes, bank accounts were opened.

"(The PM) made toilets for every house and got bank accounts opened," the Union Sports minister said.

In an earlier rally in the state on Tuesday, the Union minister claimed that the body of work of the BJP government in five years was more than what the previous Congress regimes did in 60 years.

## Women not safe under BJP rule: Mahila Cong chief

**SHIMLA :** Congress's state Mahila Congress president Zainab Chandel on Wednesday claimed women were not safe in the state under BJP rule.

Addressing a public meeting in Shimla ahead of the Assembly elections, on Wednesday, Chandel alleged that criminals have been emboldened on the watch of the BJP government, to the extent that they no longer spare minor girls.

Citing a recent case at Kullu in Manali district where a two-year-old girl was allegedly brutalised after being abducted, Chandel said, "There have been similar incidents across the state in the recent past and the police and the administration only remained a mute spectator.

It is unfortunate and sad that not a single word on these incidents has been uttered by the state BJP leadership or the central government, which boast of 'Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao'."

She added that even in the recent incident of a college girl, who was found dead at Rampur in Shimla district, the hands of the administration seem to be tied as no breakthrough has yet been made in connection with the case. "Criminals are committing murders in broad daylight and the police administration does not have a clue. There has been a rise in such incidents across the state and the BJP leaders are tight-lipped about them. Not just in Himachal Pradesh, even in other BJP-ruled states such as Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh, incidents of crime against

women are rising with every passing day," she added.

Citing recent incidents to support her claim on the decline of law and order in BJP-ruled states, Chandel said, "In the murder of a woman (a receptionist) at a Uttarakhand resort, the name of a BJP leader's son came to the fore. The BJP government brought an earth-moving machine to destroy evidence on the resort premises."

She claimed that while the BJP government in Himachal contested the last Assembly election on the promise of ensuring women's safety and opening the 'Gudiya' helpline, "the sad part is that the complaints registered through the helpline have not been addressed".
