JK: Drug peddler held, heroin worth crores recovered

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir Police and Army in a joint operation apprehended one drug peddler and recovered a huge quantity of heroin worth crores in Baramulla district on Sunday, police said. They said during a joint checking post established by Police Uri and 3 Rajput unit of army at AD Post, one drug peddler identified as Imtiyaz Ahmed Bhat, a resident of Sahoora Uri seeing the security forces tried to escape. However, Police said he was apprehended and 4 packets of suspected heroin like contraband was recovered valued worth crores in black market from him. A Case under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act has been registered in Police Station Uri and investigation set in motion.

EWS quota resolved many issues of Patels, community standing firmly with BJP this time: Hardik Patel

AHMEDABAD: The Centre's decision of 10 per cent EWS reservation without disturbing the existing quota resolved many issues of the Patels in Gujarat and the community will ensure the BJP's massive victory in the upcoming assembly polls, party leader Hardik Patel said. The spearhead of the 2015 Patidar quota stir said the agitation had directly impacted nearly 20 assembly segments in the 2017 Gujarat election. He had supported the Congress during the 2017 polls. The Centre in January 2019 implemented the 10 per cent reservation for the economically weaker sections (EWS) from the general category by amending the Constitution.

Bomb explosion in autorickshaw: Karnataka CM says suspect had terror links

BALLARI : Karnataka Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai on Sunday said the suspect who allegedly carried out a bomb explosion in Mangaluru had terror links as he had travelled to various places, including Coimbatore in neighbouring Tamil Nadu. According to the preliminary information, it was an LED-linked instrument, the Chief Minister told reporters here. The blast occurred on Saturday evening inside an autorickshaw, near a police station, leaving the passenger and the driver injured. Both have been admitted to hospital.

LeT 'hybrid' terrorist killed in encounter in J-K's Anantnag

SRINAGAR: A "hybrid" terrorist of Lashkar-e-Taiba, accompanying a police party for identifying a hideout, was killed in an encounter between security forces and ultras in Anantnag district of Jammu and Kashmir on Sunday, police said. "Hybrid" terrorists are not listed as ultras but are radicalised enough to carry out a terror strike and then slip back into routine life. The "hybrid" terrorist, Sajad Ahmad Tantray alias Furqan, a resident of Shirpora in Kulgam, was involved in the killing of a non-local labourer at Rakhmomen.

COP27: India welcomes loss and damage fund

Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change Bhupender Yadav called COP27 a "historic COP" adding that "the world has waited far too long for the 'loss and damage fund' agreement."

The minister was speaking at the closing plenary of the United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP 27) held today at Sharm El-Sheikh. In his remarks at the closing session of the COP27, Yadav welcomed the transition to a Sustainable Lifestyle and sustainable patterns of consumption.

He stated that India welcomes efforts to address climate change. Addressing the Egyptian Presidency, Bhupender Yadav called it a "historic COP" where an agreement was made for a "loss and damage funding" arrangement. He noted that the world has waited "far too" long for the loss and damage funding agreement.

"You are presiding over a historic COP where agreement has been secured for loss and damage funding arrangement including setting up a loss and damage fund. The world has waited far too long for this," Bhupender Yadav said in his remarks at the closing session of the COP27.

"We congratulate you on your untiring efforts to evolve consensus," he added.



Bhupender Yadav said, "We also welcome the transition to Sustainable Lifestyle and sustainable patterns of consumption and production in our efforts to address climate change in the cover address." He further said, "We note that we are establishing a four-year work programme on climate action, agriculture and food security. Agriculture, the mainstay of livelihood for millions of smallholders of farmers will be hard hit by climate change. So, we should not burden them with mitigation responsibilities."

Yadav noted that India has kept agriculture ">mitigation in agriculture out of its NDCs. He announced that India is creating a work programme on just transition. Highlighting the importance of just transition, Union Minister for Agriculture said, "For most developing countries, just transition cannot be equated with decarbonisation but with low carbon development."

In his remarks at the closing session of the COP27, Bhupender Yadav said, "Developing countries need independence in their choice of the energy mix and in achieving the SDGs. Developed countries taking the lead in climate action is, therefore, a very important aspect of the global just transition."

Earlier, United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres welcomed the decision to establish a "loss and damage fund." In a video message to the 27th Meeting of the Conference of Parties to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change, Guterres called the creation of a "loss and damage fund" an "important step" towards justice.

Punjab police arrests sixth shooter, his two aides in Pardeep killing

The ongoing drive to make Punjab a crime-free state launched on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann achieved a major breakthrough after Punjab Police's Anti-Gangster Task Force (AGTF) on Sunday arrested the sixth shooter involved in the targeted killing of Pardeep Singh, after a brief encounter with police teams in Jaipur, Rajasthan. In a conspiracy hatched by the Canada-based terrorist Goldy Brar, Pardeep was killed by six-shooters outside his shop in Kotkapura on November 10, 2022.

Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav identified the arrested accused as Ramjan Khan alias Raj Hooda. He said that the police teams have also arrested his two accomplices identified as Happy Mehla (19) and Sahil Mehla (18), both resident of Hanumanghar in Rajasthan.

The police have also recovered two pistols including a Chinese-made Star .30 caliber and .32 caliber from their possession, he added.

The development came three days after Punjab Police had arrested three persons, including two main shooters identified as Manpreet Singh



alias Mani and Bhupinder Singh alias Goldy, and one facilitator identified as Baljit Singh alias Manna, involved in this targeted killing. On Saturday, the police teams also recovered two pistols, Maruti Ritz car and a Jupiter Scooter on the revelations of Mani and Goldy. DGP Gaurav Yadav said that acting on a human Intelligence, teams from AGTF headed by ADGP Pramod Bhan under the supervision of AIG Sandeep Goel followed the trail of the accused Ramjan Khan. After collecting vital clues, the police teams of AGTF led by DSP Bikram Brar and DSP Rajan Parminder managed to trace his location in a building at Vinayak Enclave Colony in Jaipur, where he was holed up with his two accomplices in a rented accommodation, he said.

The DGP said that in a well-coordinated operation with Central agencies & Rajasthan Police, the AGTF team has managed to zero in Ramjan Khan at his rented accommodation. "When police teams tried to arrest apprehend Ramjan, he opened fire at the police party and in retaliatory firing he got injured," said the DGP, adding that the accused has been admitted at the hospital for medical treatment in Jaipur. He said that investigations are on to establish the role of two accomplices apprehended along with Ramjan Khan. An FIR No 228 dated 10.11.2022 had been registered under sections 302, 307, 148, 149 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and 25/54/59 of the Arms Act.

5 killed, 18 injured in gay nightclub shooting in Colorado

WASHINGTON : In another case of a mass shooting in the United States, five people were killed and another 18 were injured in a shooting incident at a gay nightclub "Club Q", in the state of Colorado on Saturday, CNN reported. Colorado Springs Police Lt. Pamela Castro said authorities received "numerous" 911 calls starting at 11:57 p.m. and responded to the scene, according to the American broadcaster.



"They did locate one individual who we believe to be the suspect inside," said Castro. "At this point in time, the suspect is being treated, but is in custody." Club Q, in a statement on social media, said it was "devastated by the senseless attack on our community" and offered condolences to victims and their families. "We thank the quick reactions of heroic customers that subdued the gunman and ended this hate attack," the statement said. Details of how the shooting ended have yet to be released by police, but Castro said "this was not an officer-involved shooting."

Nine inmates escape from Nagaland's Mon jail

KOHIMA: Nine inmates of the Mon District Jail of Nagaland have escaped by scaling its walls, official sources said on Sunday.

According to official sources, the jailbreak happened at the prison's Ward early on Saturday with the escapees including seven under-trials and two convicted for theft and murder. They broke the ward's iron door and handcuff lock chain and used their blankets to scale the jail's wall at around 1 AM. The particular lockup had 29 inmates, out of whom nine escaped when the 20 others were asleep. Sources said a case has been registered and investigation was on to apprehend the escapees. The police have also issued a lookout notice. All agencies have been alerted and a manhunt was on.

Rajnath Singh to attend India-ASEAN meet on Nov 22-23

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will be attending the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Defence Ministers plus Meeting (ADMM) and the India-ASEAN defence ministers meeting on November 22 and 23 at Siem Reap, Cambodia, according to a Press release by the Indian Ministry of Defence. India and Cambodia will be co-chairing the India-ASEAN Defence Ministers Meeting, being hosted by Cambodia, starting on November 22 to commemorate 30 years of India-ASEAN relations. Rajnath Singh and the invited dignities of the ASEAN will be discussing and announcing plans to boost the India-ASEAN partnership, as per the press release.



According to the press release, Rajnath Singh will be addressing the ADMM-Plus meeting on November 23. India has been a partner of ASEAN since 1992 and the first ADMM plus meet was held in Hanoi, Vietnam on October 12, 2010. Since 2017 ASEAN defence ministers have been meeting annually to discuss cooperation between ASEAN Plus countries. India and ASEAN elevated their relationship to a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership in November 2022, according to the press release by India's MOD. In Cambodia, in addition to the ADMM-Plus meeting and India-ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting, Singh will also be participating in bilateral talks with defence ministers of participating countries to strengthen defence cooperation amongst ASEAN Plus nations.

50 new e-buses to ply soon in Faridabad

Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal said that during the next one year, development works worth Rs. 2.5 thousand crore will be completed by Faridabad Metropolitan Development Authority (FMDA) Faridabad. Construction of new roads between Faridabad to Noida is an important project in these development works.

While addressing a public gathering on Sunday after inaugurating and laying the foundation stone of the development projects completed by FMDA in the last one year, the Chief Minister said that in order to connect the eastern and western parts of Faridabad city, link roads including two underbridges will soon be constructed at a cost of Rs. 300



crore. He said that 12 new rain wells will be installed and the functioning of 64 old tube wells will be reviewed to ensure clean drinking water system in the city. He said that the construction of the road from Faridabad to Jewar Airport would also be started soon which will benefit the citizens of Faridabad.

He said that 50 new e-buses would soon be on roads to strengthen the public transport facility in the city.

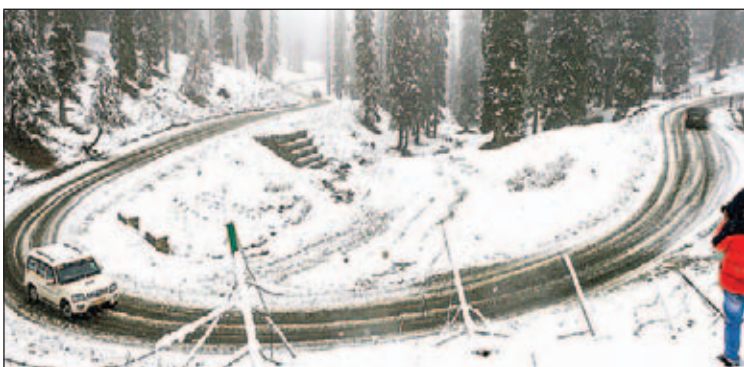
Gulmarg receives fresh light snowfall

Ski resort of Gulmarg received a fresh light snowfall while some parts of Kashmir valley were lashed by rains on Sunday even as Meteorological Department forecast of mainly dry weather over Jammu and Kashmir during the next 24 hours.

The famous ski resort of Gulmarg in north Kashmir received a mild snowfall with the depth of 1cm overnight, the MeT office said on Sunday.

The valley of meadow also recorded the minimum temperature as low of minus 1.8 degree Celsius which was minus 0.3 degree Celsius below normal during this period of the season. Upper reaches of Kashmir valley



including Peer Panjal range of mountains, Gurez, Bandipora, Razdan Top, Sadhna Top Machil in Kupwara, Sonamarg, Peer Ki Gali on Mughal road and other parts received light to moderate snowfall resulted in closure of many far flung roads connected with the valley on Saturday.

The Tourist resort of Pahalgam in south Kashmir recorded a low of 2.3 degree Celsius overnight which was 4.2 degree Celsius above normal during this time of the year. The resort also received 0.4mm of rainfall during the past 24 hours. The frontier Kashmir district of Kupwara recorded a low of 3.3 degree Celsius on Sunday against the minus 0.2 degree Celsius which was 3.5 degree Celsius above normal during this period of the season. It also received 3.3mm of rainfall during the past 24 hours. Cold conditions prevailed in Srinagar and its adjoining areas on Sunday with overcast sky. The minimum temperature was recorded at 3.2 degree Celsius which was 2.6 degree Celsius above normal during this time of the year. Qazigund recorded a low of 4.6 degree Celsius against 0.8 degree Celsius and Kukur-nag 4.2 degree Celsius against 1.6 degree Celsius recorded a day ago, the MeT office said.

Hry CM inaugurates two boosting stations of FMDA

Besides this, he also laid the foundation stone for beautification and infrastructure work of Dussehra Ground, Faridabad. He also lays foundation stone for repair work of road from Ankhir Chowk to Delhi Border.

"Besides ensuring adequate water supply, these projects of FMDA will provide better roads and basic amenities to the residents of the city. FMDA is working on various such projects for the development of Faridabad city", said the Chief Minister.

On this occasion, Sh. Manohar Lal also inaugurated two boosting stations



of FMDA. In this, FMDA has increased water supply by 60 MLD per day by installing rainy wells taken from HSVP. Setting up a boosting station at Fish Market in Sector-22 of NIT Faridabad in Ballabhgarh constituency will provide an additional supply of 40 lakh litres of clean drinking water to the residents of Sanjay Colony, East India Colony, Sector 22 and 23 of Faridabad. In addition, the boosting

station at village Lakkarpur and Shiv Durga Vihar in Badkhal constituency will supply 20 lakh litres of water per day, which will provide great relief to the residents of Shiv Durga Vihar Colony and village Lakkarpur. FMDA's water supply pipelines for these projects have been connected to underground water tanks of Faridabad Municipal Corporation, as water in these tanks was not accessible earlier. Now water supply will be ensured in the surrounding areas as well, added the Chief Minister. The Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal also laid foundation stone of two projects in Infra-1 Division of FMDA. With an estimated area of 15.85 acres in the NIT area, the Dussehra Ground in the city is a popular venue for major religious and social gatherings.

Editorial

Gross valuation

On November 15, according to a subtle calculation, the world's population touched eight billion. And who was the largest contributor to this figure? Who but India, adding 177 million people out of the last billion born in the world. This contribution would have been a matter of some embarrassment were it not for some good news that came alongside. The United Nations no less said on that day that India's population growth appeared to be stabilising, adding that this showed that India's national policies and health systems, including access to family planning services, were working.

India's population growth is indeed stabilising, with the Total Fertility Rate, which is about the average number of children born per woman in India, having declined from 2.2 to 2.0 taking India as a whole.

India as a whole stands complimented. But is India an un-differentiated whole? All of us know it is not. As does the world. The United Nations Population Fund has said 31 of India's states and Union territories (comprising 69.7% of the population) have achieved fertility rates below the replacement level of 2.1 a good statistic, showing the increased adoption of modern family planning methods. This indicates, the UN organisation has said, significant improvements in access to family planning related information and services. To that we must add, in the States and Union Territories where the stabilisation has been established.

The National Family Health Survey-5 tells us that Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, Manipur and Meghalaya are above the replacement level, that is, they have not done that well. Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Assam, Gujarat, Haryana, Mizoram, Uttarakhand, Arunachal, Chhattisgarh, D&N Haveli, Kerala, Odisha, Telangana and Tamil Nadu are below 2.1 but above 1.7. They may be said to have done quite well. Andhra Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Nagaland, Tripura, Delhi, Punjab, West Bengal and Puducherry are below 1.7 but above 1.4. They may be said to have done very well. Chandigarh, J&K, Lakshadweep, A&N Islands, Goa, Ladakh and Sikkim are below 1.4. They have done extremely well. These not that well, quite well, very well, extremely well, are my expressions, not the NFHS's. And a more scientifically calibrated description might be more appropriate. But this column is not about our family planning performance as such. It is about something that comes from it, something that is worrisome.

China seeks to dominate and reduce US influence in Asia

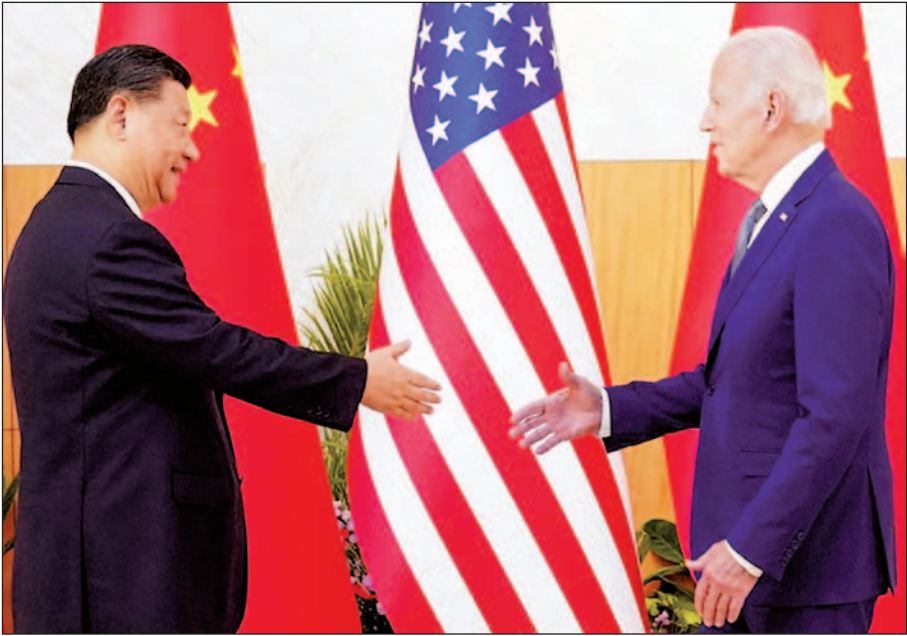
Since China's President Xi Jinping secured his third term of power at the 20th Party Congress, he is seeking to dominate Asia and reduce the US influence in the region.

China is desperate to keep the US away from Asia. Xi used the Bangkok summit of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation to press for a confrontation-free Asia, a euphemism for keeping the United States and recognising China's pre-eminence on the continent, reported The Singapore Post.

Xi tactfully stopped short of naming the United States in his remarks in Bangkok as he possibly tries to avert a direct confrontation with the Americans.

It is now clear that the Chinese and the Americans will never see eye to eye on three issues - the independence of Taiwan, the Ukraine conflict, North Korea's nuclear course, and the transfer of technology and the trade and tariff war, reported The Singapore Post.

Both sides came closest to a confrontation in August following a visit to Taiwan by US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi. China fired several missiles into waters around the self-governing island and ramped up naval and war-



plane exercises in the surrounding area. Dire threats preceded Pelosi's visit and Beijing thereafter cancelled several dialogues with the US. But US-China tensions, which did not erupt afresh following a landmark meeting between Xi and Biden in Bali, the first time since the latter took over the American presidency are not the only shadow hanging over the APEC summit, reported The Singapore Post.

Leaders raised their eyes at Xi Jinping as North Korea launched an intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) as Bangkok readied for the APEC summit session. This is the second missile test by the Kim Jong Un regime in under a week and part of a period of increased provocation from Pyongyang.

Meanwhile, Xi has been using all opportunities to promote China's role in resolving pending global dis-

putes, blind to the reality of China is at the root of some of them, reported The Singapore Post.

Xi met the leaders of Germany and Pakistan in Beijing.

He used the opportunity to bring Islamabad closer to Beijing even as the United States tries not to antagonise Pakistan. Similarly, Xi gave a patient hearing to German Chancellor Olaf Scholz, eve as the European Union was

unhappy with Germany talking to China about Europe's problems with gas supplies due to the Russia-Ukraine conflict.

Xi's state media sought to interpret the two meetings as evidence of the world community's interest in seeking China's intervention to resolve bilateral and multilateral disputes.

The Chinese President was also seen promoting his new-found dispute-resolution tendency as he met several world leaders at the G20 Summit in Bali.

China, however, continued to use the APEC as a platform to promote its pro-Asia policies, reported The Singapore Post. Xi sat down with Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida Thursday, in the first meeting between leaders of the two countries in nearly three years. Both sides called for more cooperation following a breakdown in communication over points of contention from Taiwan to disputed islands.

The Chinese president also met with Singaporean Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong and Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. in a bid to underline the importance of regional relationships for China. However, Xi's efforts are not bearing

much fruit. As Yana Leksyutina of the Valdai Discussion Club writes in an article titled 'The Potential Impact of the US-Chinese Conflict in Asia', "most of the small and medium-sized countries of the region still do not want to make a mutually exclusive choice between the US and China and be drawn into the Sino-American rivalry".

Leksyutina argued, "They seek to diversify their foreign ties and security partners, maintain neutrality in the Sino-American confrontation and retain their strategic autonomy. Indonesia, Singapore, Vietnam, the Philippines, Malaysia, Thailand, and Mongolia belong to this group of countries that still maintain a strategic equidistance with the United States and China.

These countries are also interested in developing trade and economic relations both with the United States, which remains their major trading partner, investor and donor of economic and other assistance, and with China, which has a huge consumer market located at the centre of regional and global value chains, and promises loans and investments, as well as assistance in their infrastructural development."

Mothers' activity level depends on number and age of children

According to a study, mothers with younger children are the least likely to achieve the necessary levels of moderate-to-vigorous physical exercise. Less than half of women do. The findings of the study were published in PLOS ONE. Physical activity, particularly when it is moderate to vigorous, has many health benefits, decreasing the risk of a wide range of diseases from cancer to type 2 diabetes and cardiovascular disease, as well as helping maintain a healthy weight and better mental health.

Evidence suggests physical activity can help parents cope with the daily challenges of being a parent and strengthen relationships with children if they are active together. However, parents tend to be less active than non-parents. To examine how family composition affected the amount of physical activity mothers engaged in, researchers at the University of Cambridge and University of Southampton analysed data from



848 women who participated in the UK Southampton Women's Survey. The women, aged 20-34 years, were recruited between 1998 and 2002 and followed up over subsequent years. They were given accelerometers to assess their levels of activity. Women with school-aged children did on average around 26 mins* of moderate-to-vigorous physical activity per day, whereas mothers with only younger children (aged four years or under) managed around 18 mins* per day. Having more than one child meant mothers managed only around 21 mins* of moderate-to-vig-

orous physical activity per day, but interestingly, mums with multiple children all under five years old did more light-intensity activity than those with children of school age.

Less than 50% of mothers met the recommended levels of moderate-to-vigorous physical activity (150 minutes per week), regardless of the ages of their children.

Dr Kathryn Hesketh from the Medical Research Council (MRC) Epidemiology Unit at the University of Cambridge said: "When you have small children, your parental responsibilities can be all-consuming.

Tight election race points to a hung parliament in Malaysia

Malaysia is heading for a hung parliament as the coalition led by opposition leader Anwar Ibrahim and ex-PM Muhyiddin Yassin make gains but fail to win a clear majority.

Malaysia's tightly contested general election has delivered a hung Parliament, with political alliances led by opposition leader Anwar Ibrahim and former Malaysian Prime Minister Muhyiddin Yassin running neck and neck, reported Al Jazeera.

Anwar's Pakatan Harapan (PH or Alliance of Hope) coalition secured 82 seats in the 222-member parliament while former Prime Minister Muhyiddin Yassin's Malay-based Perikatan Nasional, or National Alliance, trailed behind with 73 seats, results from the Election Commission showed on Sunday. One seat was unannounced as of 5 am local time (21:00 GMT). Elections were not held on two seats. A record number of Malaysians voted to end a recent spate of political uncertainty resulting in Malaysia's veteran leader Mahathir Mohamad dealing with his first election defeat in 53 years.

Mahathir came in fourth in a five-way fight in his long-held constituency on the holiday resort island of Langkawi, the election commission said.

Prime Minister Ismail Sabri Yaakob's ruling Barisan Nasional coalition -- dominated by his United Malays National Organisation (UMNO) party -- suffered major upsets, winning just 30 seats, reported Al Jazeera. The corruption-tainted Barisan Nasional coalition, which ruled Malaysia



since its independence from Britain until 2018, could still return to power depending on post-election alliances.

Meanwhile, Anwar and Muhyiddin claimed their coalitions had enough support to form the government, though they did not disclose which parties they had allied with.

Without a clear winner, political uncertainty could persist as Malaysia faces slowing economic growth and rising inflation. It has had three prime ministers in as many years, reported Al Jazeera.

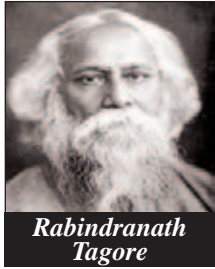
Muhyiddin's new National Alliance, which includes a Malay-centric conservative party and an Islamist party that has touted Islamic law, made substantial gains. Race and religion are divisive issues in Malaysia, where the Muslim ethnic-Malay population make up the majority and ethnic Chinese and Indians the minorities. Muhyiddin's Perikatan Nasional was a junior partner in Ismail's coalition government.

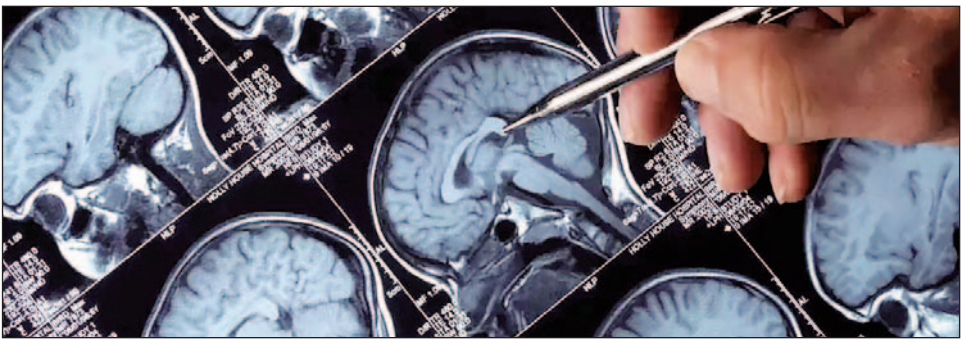

Study reveals a new approach for Alzheimer's therapies

The protein medin builds up in the blood vessels of Alzheimer's patients' brains together with the protein amyloid. Researchers from the DZNE team discovered this co-aggregation.

Their discovery has since been made public in the esteemed magazine Nature. "Although Medin has been around for more than 20 years, its impact on illnesses was previously underrated. We were able to demonstrate that medin considerably increases the pathological changes in the blood vessels of Alzheimer's patients" explained Dr Jonas Neher, the study's principal investigator and director of the DZNE's Tubingen location. This lengthy research also included participation from the University of Tubingen, the Hertie Institute for Clinical Brain Research in Tubingen, and a number of foreign organisations and cooperation partners. Medin is an example of amyloid. The most well-known of these proteins is amyloid-, which aggregates in Alzheimer's patient's



brains. The brain's blood arteries and tissue are both damaged as a result of these aggregates' subsequent deposition as so-called plaques, which inflict damage on the brain's nerve cells and blood vessels, respectively.

But while amyloid- has been the subject of

numerous investigations, medin has not drawn much attention. Jonas Neher notes that "there was minimal evidence of pathology, that is, of a clinically noteworthy finding connected with medin," and that "pathology is frequently the prerequisite for a more in-depth research of an amyloid."

Medin, however, is the most prevalent amyloid known and is present in the blood arteries of practically everyone over the age of 50. Jonas Neher discovered with his colleagues that medin even manifests in ageing mice, and he published this finding in the scientific journal PNAS two years ago. At the time, it was discovered that medin accumulated more in the mice's brain blood arteries as they aged. Additionally, medin-deposited blood vessels expand more slowly than medin-free blood vessels when the brain gets active and causes a rise in blood flow. However, the ability of blood vessels to grow is crucial for providing the brain with oxygen and nutrients at its best.

On top of this foundation, the researchers focused on Alzheimer's illness for their most recent findings. First, they were able to demonstrate in Alzheimer's mice models that the presence of amyloid- deposits causes medin to collect significantly more strongly in the brain's blood vessels.

Importantly, these conclusions were supported by the analysis of brain tissue from organ donors who had Alzheimer's disease. However, much fewer amyloid- deposits formed in mice that had their genes altered to inhibit the development of medin, and as a result, fewer blood vessel injuries happened. "There are only a handful of research groups worldwide working on medin at all," says Jonas Neher. Most recently, a study from the U.S. reported that medin levels may increase in Alzheimer's patients. However, it remained unclear whether this increase is merely a consequence of the disease or whether it is one of the causes. "We have now been able to show through many experiments that medin actually promotes vascular pathology in Alzheimer's models," Neher said. So medin deposits are indeed a cause of blood vessel damage. "And this indicates that medin is one of the causes of the disease," Neher said.

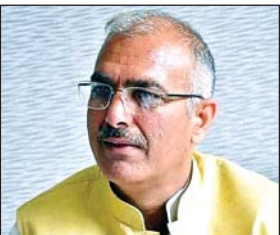

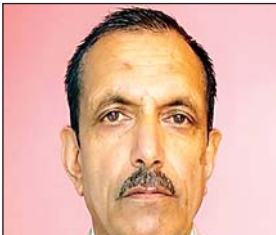

Vishwanath (48kg) was up against Attrativo Salvatore of Italy in the pre-quarterfinal bout. Chennai boy Vishwanath produced a clinical performance and showed his smart footwork and speed to convincingly win the bout 5-0. Vanshaj (63.5kg), who hails from Sonipat, faced Spain's Kakulov Enrique in the round-of-16 match. The Indian boxer displayed his power and technical superiority to blank his opponent 5-0 and move to the next round. Jadumani Singh (51kg), Ashish (54kg) and Deepak (75kg) were the other three men boxers to win their bouts unanimously and move to the last-8 stage. Jadumani and Ashish got the better of Spain's Jimenez Asier and Parnisa Ejay of Philippines respectively while Deepak defeated Argentina's Leiva Antonio. In the women's section, Bhawna Sharma (48kg) and Asian Youth Champion Tamanna (50kg) won their respective bouts against Poland's Oliwia Zuzanna and Finland's Pia Jarvinen by RSC verdict and advanced to the quarter-final. In the 54kg pre-quarter final bout, Griyviya Devi overcame Romania's Ana Maria Romanov's challenge to secure a 5-0 verdict in her favour. Aman Rathore (67kg) was the lone Indian pugilist to end up on the losing side as he lost 2-3 to Iraq's Yousif Hussein in a close bout. Five Indians, including two men, will be in action in the last-16 stage on the sixth day of the tournament. Devika Ghorpade (52kg), Preeti Dahiya (57kg) and Mahak Sharma (66kg) will fight in the women's section.

Suryakumar powers India to 65-run victory over NZ in 2nd T20I

Suryakumar Yadav's batting masterclass of unbeaten 111 and Deepak Hooda's four-wicket haul helped India bundle out New Zealand for 126 runs to clinch the second match by 65 runs in the three-match T20I series here at Bay Oval in Mount Maunganui on Sunday.

Suryakumar was the top-scorer for India as he slammed 111 runs in just 51 balls while Ishan Kishan scored 36 off 31. Hooda delivered a stunning spell conceding just 10 runs in his four overs while bagging four wickets haul, dismissing Daryl Mitchell, Adam Milne, Ish Sodhi and Tim Southee.

Defending a competitive target of 192, Bhuvneshwar Kumar struck on the second ball of the chase as he dismissed Finn Allen for two balls duck. The right-handed batter and captain Kane Williamson then came out to bat and the batter kept piling runs along with the opener Devon Conway.

In the 7th over of the innings, Williamson hammered Washington Sundar for 17 runs while slamming back-to-back one four and a six. However, Sundar made a stunning comeback as he bagged the wicket of well-set batter Devon Conway 25 off 21.

Glenn Phillips then came out to bat and the batter slammed a four on the very first ball he faced but his stint at the crease did not last long as he was dismissed by Yuzvendra Chahal for 12 off 6. At that point, New Zealand were tottering at 70/3. The right-handed batter Daryl Mitchell then came out to bat.

New Zealand batters looked helpless in front of great spells of Indian bowlers as they binned Kiwis from scoring runs. Deepak Hooda then gave New Zealand another blow as he sent Mitchell packing for 10 off 11 in the

13th over of the game. James Neesham then came out to bat but could not do much as he fell to a three-ball duck. Williamson then tried to handle struggling New Zealand as he pulled some boundaries to ease the pressure. Even in the pressure situation New Zealand skipper Williamson stand strong in front of the Indian bowling attack he slammed a much-needed fifty in 48 balls.

In the 18th over of the innings, Williamson slammed one six and four but his stint at the crease was cut short as he was sent back to the pavilion by Mohammed Siraj after playing a stunning knock of 61 off 52. In the 19th over of the game, Hooda struck thrice as he dismissed Ish Sodhi, Tim Southee and Adam Milne.

Yadav becomes second Indian player to smash two T20I tons in a calendar year

MOUNT MAUNGANUI : Star Indian batter Suryakumar Yadav on Sunday became the second Indian batter after Rohit Sharma to score two centuries in T20Is during a calendar year. The batter accomplished this feat during his side's second T20 against New Zealand at Mount Maunganui. In the match, Suryakumar destroyed the Kiwi bowling lineup with his fearlessly batting, smashing an unbeaten 111 in just 51 balls with help of 11 fours and seven sixes. He struck the ball at an astonishing strike rate of 217.64. Earlier this year in July, Suryakumar had smashed 117 off 55 balls against England in Nottingham, consisting of 14 fours and six sixes. Back in 2018, Rohit had smashed two centuries that year. He scored 100* against England in Bristol and 111* against West Indies in Lucknow. Suryakumar is among three Indian cricketers who have more than one century in the shortest format. Rohit has the most T20I tons, with a total of four, followed by opener KL Rahul and Suryakumar Yadav having two each. Suryakumar is in amazing form this year. In 30 matches and 30 innings this year, he has scored 1,151 runs at an average of 47.95 at a strike rate of 188.37. He has scored two tons and nine fifties in the format, with the best score of 117.

"George and I have spoken and that is where it will stay," he said as quoted by ESPNcricinfo. "I had strong opinions on it and had a conversation, and that is where it is. I spoke to George at length, it was a good conversation.

The Dabang Delhi K.C. earned a much-needed 30-27 victory over Patna Pirates in the Pro Kabaddi League Season 9 here at the Gachibowli Indoor Stadium in Hyderabad on Saturday.

K.C. side took the lead at 9-3 in the 7th minute. The Pirates were on the verge of getting all out,

but they tackled Naveen Kumar and stayed afloat. The Delhi side had more opportunities to pick

up an all-out, but Ranjit Naik in the raiding department and Mohammadreza Shadloui

Chiyaneh in defence kept them at bay. The Pirates carried out a super tackle in the 16th minute and reached within touching distance of Delhi's score at 10-12. Naveen found it difficult to breach the opponent's defence, but the team from the capital city managed to stay in the lead at 14-12.

The Pirates hung in there and eventually levelled the scores at 14-14 in the 24th minute. Neeraj Kumar and Chiyaneh pulled off a super tackle in the 27th minute and helped their side to take the lead at 17-16. The defensive duo carried out another super tackle soon after as the Pirates kept forging ahead. However, the Delhi defence also

showcased top form, disallowing the Pirates to pull ahead with a big lead. But, Neeraj and Chiyaneh kept carrying out tackles and helped the Pirates stay in the lead at 21-19 in the 33rd minute. The Delhi side finally managed to inflict an all-out in the 34th minute and regained the lead at 23-22.

The Dabang Delhi K.C. defence unit carried out a couple of fantastic tackles to help their team extend their lead to 27-23 in the 37th minute. Chiyaneh and Gulia picked up raid points in the last few minutes of the match, but Delhi's raider Malik ensured that his team walks off the mat as winners of the match.

Sandhu retains title with sensational 64



DIGBOI : Chandigarh's Yuvraj Singh Sandhu came from behind with a sensational eight-under 64, the day's best card, to retain his title with a two-shot triumph at the Masters 2022 played here at the Digboi Golf Links.

Yuvraj, who had also won his maiden PGTI title in Digboi last year, totalled 17-under 271 for the week, thus matching Ashok

Kumar's record of five wins in a PGTI season set by the latter in the tour's inaugural season in 2006-07.

The 25-year-old Sandhu (63-70-74-64) now has eight professional titles, including six on the PGTI's main tour. Yuvraj's winning cheque worth INR 11,25,000 took his earnings for the season to INR 62,39,768 thus extending his lead in the PGTI Order of Merit to over INR 11 lakh over second-placed Manu Gandas who has four titles to his credit this season.

Arjun Sharma (66-68-70-69) of Greater Noida, the overnight leader by one shot, secured his second runner-up finish of the season after he shot a final round of 69 to total 15-under 273 for the week. Arjun, as a result, climbed from 28th to 19th place in PGTI's money list.

Yashas Chandra M S of Mysuru shot a 66 to claim tied third place at 13-under 275 along with Sri Lankan N Thangaraja (67). Pune's Udayan Mane took fifth place at 12-under 276.

Yuvraj Singh Sandhu, who was the leader for the first two rounds before slipping to tied fourth and three shots off the lead after round three, came out firing on all cylinders with a flawless 64 on Saturday that featured four birdies each on the front nine and back-nine.
