India and Germany ink mobility pact, discuss key global challenges

Jaishankar also strongly defended India's import of crude oil from Russia and noted that it is largely driven by market forces.

Exit polls: BJP sweeps Gujarat, neck and neck fight in Himachal

AAP likely to rule Delhi civic body

AGENCY NEW DELHI, DEC 5

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) is predicted to win a consecutive seventh term in Gujarat, according to poll of exit polls. BJP is also predicted to win in the Himachal Assembly elections, but a tough fight is expected in state. The counting of votes will take place on December 8.

In a major upset, the Aam Aadmi Party is expected to win the Delhi civic body polls, BJP's first defeat there after 15 years. The electoral battle in Gu-

jarat, the home state of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has turned more intense this time with the entry of the Aam Aadmi Party. Ac-

cording to NDTV's poll of exit polls, the BJP is predicted to win 131 seats in the 182-member Gujarat assembly. Debutant AAP is predicted to win only 7 seats. Himachal

Pradesh, exit polls show that the BJP would win the most seats in the state, just like the last Assembly elections in 2017. AajTak exit poll predicted Congress would form government

in Himachal. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) is likely to in the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) election, according to NDTV's poll of exit

The AAP may get 149-171 wards, according to an exit poll by Aaj Tak. Another exit poll by Times Now shows Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's party getting anywhere between 146 and 156 wards.

Only 100 students enrol in Imran Khan's "dream university"

"In the first batch, we enrolled 40 students, and 60 more were enrolled in the second batch; 20 in Islamic Studies and 40 in Management Sciences," The News International quoted Dr Amjadur Rehman as saying.

Farooq Abdullah reelected NC president SRINAGAR: The National Conference on Monday re-elected

Farooq Abdullah as the party president unopposed 85-year-old Abdullah was unanimously elected the NC chief at the party's delegate session held near the mausoleum of party founder Sheikh Abdullah at Naseem Bagh here.

After his re-election for the next term. Abdullah said he wasn't willing to continue as president. "But my people in the party insisted that I cannot leave at this crucial juncture, so I agreed. But I suggest they should prepare the next generation for leading the party in future," he said. Abdullah had last month informed party leaders that he was not willing to continue as the president. After his decision. the NC issued notification for holding elections to the post of president on December 5.

Haryana to impart administrative training to officers and employees for good governance



Congress MP Shashi Tharoor comes to NCP, we will accept him warmly. Shashi Tharoor will remain as Thiruvananthapuram


MP even if the Congress party rejects him. I do not know why Congress is ignoring Tharoor."

India in driver's seat

presidency of the G20, a premier forum for global economic cooperation. The new role offers the second most populous country in the world an unprecedented opportunity to shape the international response to pressing global challenges and transition from being a rule-taker to being a rule-maker. It can now serve as the voice of the Global South, a grouping that largely includes lowerincome nations in Latin America, Asia, Africa and Oceania. The theme of India's G20 presidency will be driven by the underlying vision of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' (the world is one family), best encapsulated by the motto 'One Earth, One Family, One Future'. The focus will be on highlighting the linkages between inclusive development, gender equality, peace and security and the full use of technological innovations for universal benefit. The challenge before New Delhi will be to forge unity within a disparate grouping to tackle larger global challenges such as economic slowdown, indebtedness of countries and the climate crisis amid persisting divisions over the Ukraine conflict. This approach will require constant and meaningful engagement with all G20 members, including China, which is engaged in a bitter border standoff with India. At a time when the world is passing through turmoil marked by military conflicts, economic uncertainty and the aftereffects of the pandemic, there are high expectations on India to strive for unity that can address the most challenging and pressing issues.

Amidst the widening gulf between the West and Russia over the Ukraine conflict. India needs to act as a bridge so that G20 members can tackle the larger pressing issues together and revive the momentum for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). India also needs to work for reforms of multilateral bodies such as the World Bank and International Monetary Fund (IMF) whose current mandate does not equip them to respond to contemporary challenges, including raising more finances through the private sector or providing financing for climate action. New Delhi is positioned uniquely in the world as a country that understands the priorities of the developed nations and appreciates the challenges and ambitions of the developing world, allowing it to act as a bridge to meet expectations on both sides.

India's independent foreign policy, effectively demonstrated in the ongoing Ukraine war, has made the world sit up and take notice. In its new position, India plans to shake up global climate goals, secure green investment and shift global governance to the benefit of fellow travellers in the Global South. It is expected to continue to push the rich countries to keep their long-delayed promises for significant amounts of spending for climate adaptation in lower-income countries. India was instrumental in the creation of a specific fund to help poorer nations

US, Israel's confrontation with Iran

Thile since last February the world's attention has been mainly focussed on the war in Ukraine, the confrontation between Iran with the United States and Israel is escalating dangerously and could take the form of unconventional

This dangerous situation is basically due to three reasons:

First, the failure of the parties involved to reach an agreement on a nuclear deal that would significantly reduce economic sanctions on Iran and in exchange Tehran would reduce its nuclear program -which is seen by the West as aiming at building a nuclear bomb- and would allow international monitoring.

Second, the supply of hundreds of cheap Iranian drones to the Russian Army which it uses to destroy Ukraine's electricity and water supply infrastructure. The use of Iranian drones is causing severe hardship to millions of Ukrainian civilians, leaving them without heating, lighting and running water.

Third, the brutal repression of Iranian protesters demonstrating against the government, using live ammunition and killing hundreds of them and arresting and sending to jail more than 1000 people. Now let's see in more detail the reasons why the confrontation between Tehran and the West has greatly escalated in recent months and can take the form of an unconventional

Hopes for the revival of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) that would have prevented the development of an Iranian nuclear bomb in exchange



for the lifting of Western sanctions were dashed a few months ago.

Last month Iran announced that it would start enriching uranium at 60% purity at its Fordow plant - a plant buried inside a mountainwhich could be protected from missile attacks or air strikes

This decision, taken in retaliation for a resolution of the International Atomic Energy Agency ordering Iran to cooperate in an investigation concerning the finding of uranium particles in undeclared sites, was seen by the West as a serious provocation.

Israeli Prime Minister-designate Benjamin Netanyahu as well as many Israeli leaders belonging to different parties have repeatedly warned that Israel was prepared to use its right to self-defense and do whatever it takes to stop Iran from obtaining a nuclear bomb.

Another issue that raises concerns among NATO allies and the West, in general, is that Russia, which is facing a serious depletion of its drones, has bought a few thousand inexpensive Iranian Shahed drones and uses them as suicide drones to strike against a

wide range of military targets in Ukraine and mainly the electricity infrastructure of the country, turning the conflict into a war of attrition.

Such drones are known to cost about USD dollars 20,000, whereas surface-to-air missiles or groundbased interceptors cost between USD 400,000 and USD 1.2 million each. So far, Russia has been sending swarms of drones against Ukraine, forcing it to use all its means to intercept or destroy them and at the same time making them unavailable for attacks against the Russian forces.

However, this situation may change soon as Ukroboronexport, a Ukrainian arms producer, claims that it is developing better and equally inexpensive drones as the Iranian Shahed. So, Ukraine too could soon use drones to give Moscow tit for tat.

Presumably, Ukraine too could target Russia's infrastructure with drones or carry out acts of sabotage Furthermore, countries hostile to Tehran, which in the past had been attacked by Iranian drones, like Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates, can use such drones to avenge Tehran for the attacks they had suffered.

Another point of friction is the Western condemnation of the harsh methods used by the Iranian regime to suppress the wave of protests sparked by the death of Mahsa Amini, a Kurdish woman, who last September was arrested by the morality police for an alleged breach of the strict Islamic dress code and subsequently died in police custody.

The Islamic regime accuses the West of exploiting the unrest and demonstrations in the country as Iranians from all walks of life continue to take part in massive protests. Many incidents have been reported in which protesters showed their outrage by torching police stations and vehicles, while the police on several occasions used deadly force to dispel them.

According to the Iranian Interior Ministry, the death toll due to the continuing unrest was 200, but foreign human rights organisations estimate that the death toll is more than 300 people, including 41 children.

Unrest has recently increased in at least a dozen major Chinese cities, primarily as a result of discontent with the government's harsh measures to reduce coronavirus infections, according to the Washington Post swiftly. This unrest was triggered by the Urumqi incident

where 10 people lost their lives, according to the On November 24, a fire tore

through a residential building in the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region's capital Urumai. After the incident. citizens circulated the videos on the internet space, with demanding authorities to open exits. The residents said that they were closed under strict COVID-19 restrictions that have been in place for more than 100 days and have caused widespread hardship. Not only this, the videos shot at plant in China also went viral

where men and women were captured marching with some of them confronted by people in Hazmat suits and riot police. Reuters reported citing videos circulated on social media. The protests in China mark an escalation of unrest at the massive factory in Zhengzhou city. The workers were frustrated with the delayed bonus payments, as the demonstrators said on Livestream feeds

Xi Jinping's zero-Covid policy fails Green tea extract may be harmful to liver

ong-term consumption of high-dose green tea extract may provide some protection against cancer, cardiovascular disease, obesity, and type 2 diabetes, according to one study, but it may also cause liver damage in a small percentage of people. Who is in danger? The first concrete hint comes from Rutgers research, published in The Journal of Dietary

Supplements: two genetic variations that predict some of the

"Learning to predict who will suffer liver damage is potentially important because there's growing evidence that high-dose green tea extract may have significant health benefits for those who can safely take it." said Hamed Samavat. senior author of the study and an assistant professor of nutrition sciences at the Rutgers School of Health Professions.

Using data from the Minnesota Green Tea Trial, a large study of green tea's effect on breast cancer, the researchers looked to see if people with certain genetic variations were more likely than others to show signs of liver stress after consuming 843 milligrammes per day of the primary antioxidant in green tea, a catechin called epigallocatechin gallate (EGCG).

Researchers led by Laura Acosta, then a

PhD student and currently a graduate student, chose the two genetic polymorphisms in issue because each regulates the manufacturing of an enzyme that breaks down EGCG. The Minnesota Green Tea Trial was selected because it was a large, well-designed trial of a distinct demographic. The year-long, placebocontrolled experiment included over 1,000



postmenopausal women and gathered data at three, six, nine, and twelve months

An analysis by researchers showed that early signs of liver damage were somewhat more common than normal in women with one variation in the catechol-O-methyltransferase (COMT) genotype and strongly predicted by a variation in the uridine 5'-diphosphoglucuronosyltransferase 1A4 (UGT1A4) genotype.

On average, participants with the highrisk UGT1A4 genotype saw the enzyme that indicates liver stress go up nearly 80 per cent after nine months of consuming the green tea supplement, while those with low-risk genotypes saw the same enzyme go up 30 per cent

> "We're still a long way from being able to predict who can safely take high-dose green tea extract," said Samavat, who noted the risk of liver toxicity is only associated with high levels of green tea supplements and not with drinking green tea or even taking lower doses of green tea extract. "Variations in this one genotype don't completely explain the variations in liver enzyme changes among study narticinants. The full explanation probably includes a number of different genetic variations and probably a number of non-genetic

factors.'

"Still," Samavat continued, "we do think we have identified an important piece of the puzzle and taken a step toward predicting who can safely enjoy any health benefits that highdose green tea extract provides."

Researchers test promising technological cure for adolescent depression

ew study on neurotechnological techniques to treating adolescent depression vields encouraging results. The study was headed by Faranak Farzan, a professor at Simon Fraser University (SFU), and was published in the Journal of Affective Disorders Reports.

The clinical and neurophysiological effects of brain stimulation followed by cognitive exercise in 26 adolescents with Major Depressive Disorder (MDD) were investigated (aged 16 -24 years old).

TBS, a sort of brain stimulation, has previously been proven to be a rapid and effective therapy for treating depression in adults.



TBS stimulates the prefrontal cortex of the brain with magnetic pulses or bursts. This brain

region is involved in many aspects of cognition, including reasoning, problem-solving,

comprehension, and impulse control. It also happens to be a brain area associated with MDD. For example, prefrontal brain dysfunction has been linked to symptoms such as rumination and suicide ideation.

TBS was employed to target the prefrontal cortex in juvenile participants for four weeks in this investigation. The research">researchers then saw and monitored changes in brain activity using a multimodal brain mapping technique of transcranial magnetic stimulation paired with

electroencephalography. At the end of the four-week trial, research">researchers observed significant changes in brain activity in both the treatment and non-TBSstimulated regions. Changes in brain activity were also linked to lower depression and rumination scores.

More treatment options needed: "Major Depressive Disorder affects approximately 11 per cent of adolescents and youth but existing treatments, such as medication and psychotherapy, fail to significantly improve symptoms in about 30 - 50 per cent of cases," says Farzan, a professor in SFU's School of Mechatronic Systems Engineering (MSE). She also holds the chair in Technology Innovations for Youth Addiction Recovery and Mental Health and heads SFU's new

eBrain Lab.

Researchers note that some medications have also been associated with side effects in youth such as suicidal thoughts and behaviours - leading to the search for safer treatment

Building on previous research">research: Previous research">research has shown a link between dysfunction of the prefrontal cortex and MDD. "Using TMS-EEG brain mapping technology, we also found that the prefrontal cortex in youth with MDD exhibited greater brain activity relative to healthy youth. It was exciting to see in the current study that four weeks of TBS treatment seemed to reduce this excessive brain activity, possibly reflecting a return to a 'healthy' state," says SFU

doctoral student Prabhjot Dhami, the study's first author.

Prefrontal cortex impairments in youth with MDD may also contribute to symptoms such as rumination and suicidal ideation/behaviour, Farzan notes. Since the prefrontal cortex is critical for executive functioning, dysfunction or deficits in this region can lead to the onset and maintenance of depressive

symptoms. Neurotechnological treatments, such as TBS targeted to the prefrontal cortex followed by a cognitive exercise that may also engage this brain area, according to the research">researchers, have the ability to optimise the impact on the prefrontal cortex in youth MDD to alleviate symptoms more effectively.

Night shelters well equipped to protect homeless from cold: DC

The shelters built by the Municipal Corporation in different parts of the city are sheltering the homeless people and protecting them from the chilling winter. Among them, there are one permanent and five temporary shelters, in which destitute people spend the night. Facilities like warm blankets, mattresses, drinking water, toilets and electricity are provided in these shelters. All night shelters are in good condition, this is also being taken care of. The duty of a sweeper has also been assigned to clean them. Additional Commissioner Gaurav Kumar said that there are some people who spend the night here in the city. They do not have a house of their own, but it is difficult to spend the night in the open in the cold. In this regard, night shelter arrangements have been made by the Municipal Corporation. One of these is a permanent camp in Prem Nagar, which can accommodate about 85 people. On the other hand, 5 temporary shelters have also been provided at different places, of which 4 are small and one is large. A



large temporary shelter with a capacity of 20 persons is located near Uttar Haryana Bijli Vitran Nigam in Sector-12, while smaller shelters are located near Kalpana Chawla Government Medical College, under the Kachhwa Railway Flyover, behind the old bus stand and on Meerut Road. They are placed on the square. Each has the capacity to accommodate 10 to 15 people. He said that the timing for staying put in the temporary shelters is 7 pm to 7 am, while the permanent shelter at Prem Nagar is open throughout the day.

Expressed anger over the neglect of those doing risky election duty

In the recently concluded Himachal Vidhansabha elections, employees of various departments rendered their services on deputation for months as per the instructions of the State Election Commission. But when the notification to pay one month's basic pay as honorarium to the employees on election duty was issued by the concerned department, many employees ignored it. Due to this, there is a lot of anger among the affected employees. State President Prof. Dharamveer Singh surrounded the government machinery and the Election Commission and said that the flying squad team has the most important and risky duty in the elections, which is activated with the announcement of the elections and must render its services in the field day and night until the election process is completed, which takes more than a month. Their duty schedule is as follows: 6 a.m. to 2 p.m., 2 p.m. to 10 p.m., and 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. The task of the team is to seize all kinds of illegal material,

such as cash, liquor, and any other material that can be used to entice voters, by going to different areas and setting up nakas. Apart from this, every complaint coming from the control room of the district election officer and the concerned assembly election officer has to be handled on the spot, and online reporting has to be done in a very short time. Whatever illegal material is seized, it has to be deposited in the concerned police station or treasury. In many cases, one has to make court appearances again. Despite this, depriving the officers and employees of the Flying Squad team of one month's basic pay as honoraria is discriminatory. It may be noted that in the present elections, the Flying Squad teams have made a significant contribution to the fair election process by seizing crores of rupees in cash, liquor, and other materials in the entire state, due to which the revenue of the exchequer has also increased. Senior professors of colleges and principals of plustwo schools were put in charge of the flying squad teams, who come under the category of gazetted officers.

Mirpur on Sunday.
Ranjan Madugalle of the ICC Elite Panel of Match Referees imposed the penalty after India was ruled to be four overs short of the target after time allowances were taken into consideration, as per a statement from

In accordance with Article 2.22 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel, which relates to minimum over-rate offences, players are fined 20 per cent of their match fee for every over their side fails to bowl in the allotted time.

India captain Rohit Sharma pleaded guilty to the offence and accepted the proposed sanction, so there was no need for a formal hearing.

On-field umpires Michael Gough and Tanvir Ahmed, third umpire Sharfuddoula Ibne Shahid and fourth umpire Gazi Sohel levelled the charge.

Coming to the match, India lost to

Bangladesh by one wicket. The hosts have a 1-0 lead in the three-match ODI series.

Put to bat first by Bangladesh, India was bundled out for merely 186 runs in 41.2 overs. KL Rahul (73 off 70 balls) was the lone warrior for India as big names like skipper Rohit Sharma (27), Shikhar Dhawan (7) and Virat Kohli (9) failed to create impact.

Except for a 60-run stand between KL and Washington Sundar for the fifth wicket, there was nothing positive for Indian bat-

It will be a great experience for him to come into the environment," Bailey said in an official statement released by Cricket Australia.
