**3 LeT militants shot dead in Shopian**

**SRINAGAR:** Security forces shot dead three Lashkar-e-Taiba militants including an alleged killer of a Kashmiri Pandit in a gun battle in Jammu and Kashmir's Shopian district on Tuesday, officials said. The encounter erupted at Munjh Marg area of Shopian during a cordon and search operation which was launched by joint forces following an input about militant presence. "When the cordon was being laid, the hiding terrorists fired indiscriminately. The fire was effectively retaliated leading to an encounter."

**Dy CM Dushyant Chautala's convoy car meets with accident**

**HISAR:** A vehicle in the convoy of Haryana Deputy Chief Minister Dushyant Chautala met with an accident in Dhandhoor village due to heavy fog while headed to Sirsa from Hisar, official sources confirmed. The accident took place late Monday. As per the sources, the deputy chief minister escaped unhurt. A commando in the convoy received minor injuries and was taken to a hospital. The impacted vehicle was replaced.

**Taj Mahal gets Rs 1 crore water bill**

**AGRA:** The Agra Municipal Corporation has served notices on the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) asking it to pay property tax and water bills for the iconic Taj Mahal, officials said. According to officials of the ASI, a notice for water tax and one for property tax has been issued. The ASI has been asked to pay around Rs 1.40 lakh and Rs 1 crore as water tax. ASI's Superintending rchaeologist (Agra circle) Raj Patel told a news agency, "A notice for water tax and one for property tax has been issued. The property tax is around Rs 1.40 lakh and the water tax is around Rs 1 crore".

**Bharat Jodo Yatra to enter Haryana today**

**CHANDIGARH:** Congress leader Rahul Gandhi-led Bharat Jodo Yatra will enter Haryana on Wednesday from Munda-Ka border in Nuh and senior party leaders have started reaching the district. Former Haryana chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda, senior Congress leaders Ran-deep Singh Surjewala, Kumari Selja, Ajay Singh Yadav, Deepender Singh Hooda, state party chief Uday Bhan, newly appointed state incharge Shaktisinh Gohil, among others, are expected to be present when the yatra enters the state. Gohil along with senior state unit leaders has been holding meetings of various committees constituted for the party's foot march.

## Uproar in Parliament over 'Dog' jibe: BJP demands apology from Kharge

Union Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi on Tuesday condemned the "dog" jibe made by Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge at the BJP and said that the latter was merely playing the role of "rubber stamp" in the opposition party.

"We strongly condemn the statement made by Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge in Rajasthan yesterday. It's an Italian Congress which is running today. It is being said that he is a rubber stamp president," Joshi said. "Congress is not original. Mahatma Gandhi had demanded the dissolution of the Congress," the minister said.

The parliamentary affairs minister further said, "Their (Congress) mindset is like this only. They have also said such things for Veer Savarkar and Smriti Irani. I thought Mallikarjun Kharge had some common sense but it has been proven today that he doesn't have it."

The war of words was triggered by Congress president Kharge's dig at the BJP over the India-China border row.

Addressing a rally in Rajasthan's Alwar, Kharge said that his party's leaders sacrificed their



lives for the country and asked whether the BJP's leaders had contributed the same way.

"Did any of your dogs die for the country? Has any family member made any sacrifice? No!" Kharge had said.

Today in parliament BJP demanded an apology from Kharge.

Union Minister and Leader of the Upper House Piyush Goyal said in Rajya Sabha that "He (Kharge) gave us a glimpse of his mindset and jealousy."

"Yesterday, LoP Mallikarjun Kharge gave an indecent speech in Alwar. The language used is

unfortunate. I condemn the manner in which he used indecent language, said baseless things... I demand apology from him," Goyal said.

"After independence Gandhi said Congress should be disbanded... Khargeji is a living example of that... and is showing the nation that what Gandhiji said was true... he is a national president who doesn't know how to speak," Goyal said.

Union Minister Kiren Rijiju speaking to reporters outside Parliament today said: "I can't believe that Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge could stoop so low

and use such objectionable remarks."

"He should understand his responsibilities as a leader of a political party. We're not enemies, we're rivals. It's distasteful, unfortunate and uncalled for" the union law minister said. The Congress leader, however, refused to apologise for his remarks stating that he had made the remarks outside the House and there was no need to discuss it in Parliament.

"What i said during Bharat Jodo Yatra in Rajasthan's Alwar was outside the House. What I said was politically outside the House not inside."

## Mukhya Mantri Awas Yojana will start in Haryana, announces CM

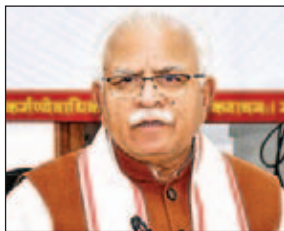

Reiterating his commitment to provide houses to the deprived and needy in Haryana, Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal announced to launch a separate Mukhya Mantri Awas Yojana on the lines of the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana.

He said a survey is being done in Haryana and houses will be provided to the eligible beneficiaries who do not have houses.

The chief minister made this announcement while virtually addressing the gathering during a state-level programme held on the occasion of the birth anniversary of Maharaja Shoor Saini in Hisar.

On this occasion, Sh. Manohar Lal further announced to give Rs 31 lakh from his discretionary fund for the renovation and construction of Saini Senior Secondary School where the function was held. Apart from this, he also announced Rs 11 lakh each on behalf of Urban Local Bodies Minis-



ter, Dr. Kamal Gupta and Deputy Speaker, Vidhan Sabha, Sh. Ranbir Gangwa.

Besides this, considering the demand of the representatives of the Saini community, the Chief Minister said that the educational institution will be named after the first female teacher, Savitribai Phule. For this, the people and representatives of the community will share which government college or school in which city or area, should be named after Savitribai Phule.

Sh. Manohar Lal, while announcing the demand raised by the community people for the land required for the construction of dharamshala, said that the community people will have to apply and according to the rules.

## Geelani's house among 3 Jel properties to be sealed in Srinagar

Jammu and Kashmir government has ordered sealing of three properties of banned Jamaat-e-Islami (Jel), including a residential proprietary land in the name of now dead separatist leader Syed Ali Geelani.

The orders for the sealing have been issued by the district magistrate (DM) Srinagar following the investigation by the State Investigation Agency (SIA), Kashmir in a case U/S 10, 11 & 13 of police station Bata-maloo.

The DM Srinagar in its order had



stated that the Government of India, in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 has declared the

Jamaat, Jammu & Kashmir as an unlawful association.

"... The State Investigation Agency, Kashmir vide communica-

tion date December, 16, 2022 has intimated that during investigation of case FIR UA(P) Act of P/S Bata-maloo now being investigated by P/S SIA, below mentioned three properties have surfaced that are owned by and / or under possession of banned association Jamat-e-Islami and are located in the jurisdiction of District Srinagar and are to be notified in terms of section 8 UA (P) Act," the order read. The property notified included land measuring one kanal and seven marla at Khushipora Shalateng in the name of Jamaat J&K through District President Bashir Ahmad Lone of Harwan, Srinagar.

## 12 killed in gas cylinder blast in SW Pakistan

At least 12 people were killed and 13 others injured in a gas cylinder blast in a market in the Lasbela district of Pakistan's southwest Balochistan province, media reports said on Tuesday.

Deputy Commissioner of Lasbela Murad Khan Kasi told media that a cylinder blasted at a shop during its refilling process on Mon-

day, causing a huge explosion and spreading fire to the adjacent shops in the Bela area of Lasbela.

The official said 25 people received burn injuries who were shifted to the Civil Hospital in the neighboring southern port city of Karachi, adding that 12 of the wounded succumbed to their injuries during their treatment overnight. The official feared that the death toll might rise because most of the injured were in critical condition.

## Delhi Court issues notice to ED on Jacqueline's application

A Delhi Court on Tuesday issued a notice to the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on the application moved by actress Jacqueline Fernandez requesting permission to go abroad.

Fernandez is accused in a Rs 200 crore money laundering case which also involves alleged conman Sukesh Chandrashekhar.

Special Judge Shailendra Malik after hearing the application of Fernandez seeking permission to go abroad for issued a notice to Enforcement Directorate to file its response.

The Special Court granted bail to Fernandez on November 15 on the condition to furnishing a personal bond of Rs. 2 lakhs and not to go abroad without permission of the court.

Counsel for Fernandez submitted in the bail application that she appeared twice for questioning by the investigating agency and was never arrested.

Enforcement Directorate earlier opposed the regular bail application of Fernandez by submitting that she never



cooperated with the investigating agency and said that if granted bail she may flee from the country.

Delhi Police has registered a case under section 170, 384, 386, 388, 419, 420, 506 and 120 B of Indian Penal Code (IPC) and the violation of provisions of Information Technology Act (IT Act) against the actress. After that Enforcement Directorate investigated the case under the provisions of PMLA.

The Special Court had taken cognizance of the supplementary charge sheet filed by the Enforcement Directorate in which Fernandez was first time named as an accused.

Dense blanket of fog covered the Indian capital city Delhi and adjoining states including Haryana, Punjab and UP on Tuesday, leading to disruptions in rail and road transport, officials said.

The fog caused zero visibility impacting the traffic. On the roads in the capital, the vehicular traffic was plying slowly because of the poor visibility and drivers were seen driving with emergency lights on.

Reports pouring in from adjoining states of Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh and parts of Uttar Pradesh said dense fog engulfed the areas, for the second consecutive morning.



A local media report said no flight landed or took off from the airport in Chandigarh due to poor visibility conditions on Tuesday morning.

Railway officials said Tuesday

that 11 trains were reported running late by one to five hours due to the drop in visibility.

According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), the cities

affected by low visibility amid dense fog on Tuesday include Bathinda, Patiala and Amritsar in Punjab, Ganganagar in Rajasthan, Lucknow, Gorakhpur, Bareilly and Agra in Uttar Pradesh, Ambala in Haryana, Patna, Gaya and Purnea in Bihar and Kolkata in West Bengal. Delhi's Palam and Safdarjung were also included in the list by the IMD.

Meanwhile, dense fog in the night and morning hours is likely to continue over Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi and Uttar Pradesh during the next four days.

The air quality in the national capital has fallen to the "very poor" category Tuesday morning.

Air pollution continues to worsen in Delhi and it gets aggravated during winter months.

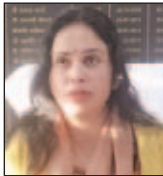
weaker sections of the society. He said that during their training program they should also focus on making themselves a good human being as only a good human being could provide good services.

No logic for transporting coal through rail-ship-rail route: AIPEF

**BAHADURJEET SINGH RUPNAGAR:** Power Ministry has absolutely no logic to put an additional burden of transporting coal through a rail-ship-rail (RSR) route having prohibitive cost. Punjab should be allowed to transport coal by rail route only, writes Padamjit Singh Chief Patron of All India Power Engineers Federation (AIPEF) in a letter to R K Singh, Union Power Minister. The power ministry has asked Punjab to start lifting coal from Mahanadi and Talchar coalfields in Orissa through RSR formula from January 2023. It may be mentioned that 1980 MW Talwandi Sabo Power Limited in Punjab has coal linkage of 67.20 lakh MT with Mahanadi and Talcher and as per the advisory,15-20 percent of total annual requirements of about 12-13 lakh MT is to be routed through RSR mode. V K Gupta Spokesperson AIPEF said that in case of present practice at Talwandi Sabo thermal plant , wherein coal is moved from mine to thermal station by rail the freight distance by rail is 1900 KM, but with RSR mode the coal would be transported 1700-1800 Km by rail in addition to sea travel of 4360 km.

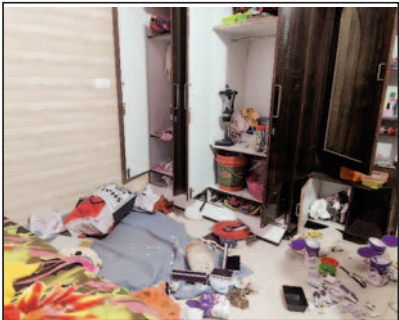
Theft of lakhs of rupees from closed house

# Kashmir valley in grip of severe cold

A day ahead of the 40-day-long harshest part of the winter “Chilai Kalan” to commence Kashmir valley is in a grip of severe cold with Srinagar experiencing yet another coldest night of the season on Tuesday. Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir, experienced yet another coldest night of the season on Tuesday with temperature recorded at minus 3.4 degree Celsius against the minus 3.1 degree Celsius the previous night. It was minus 1.9 degree Celsius below normal during this period of the season. This is for the third time during this month that the minimum temperature in Srinagar plunged to minus 3.4 degree Celsius. On December 5 and December 14 Srinagar recorded the similar temperature of the season. The 40 day-long harshest part of the winter, locally known as “Chilai Kalan” , is likely to commence on a dry note from midnight December 21. The Meteorological Department forecast dry weather to continue in Jammu and Kashmir during the next 24



hours. Pahalgam in south Kashmir continued to be the coldest part of the Kashmir valley with minimum temperature plummeting to minus 5.4 degree Celsius on Tuesday against the minus 4.8 degree Celsius recorded a day ago. It was minus 1.0 degree Celsius below normal for the tourist hot spot during this time of the season. Ski resort of

Gulmarg in north Kashmir had a low of minus 4.0 against the minus 2.5 degree Celsius recorded the previous night, it was still 0.8 degree Celsius above normal for the valley of meadow during this period of the season. Qazigund on Srinagar-Jammu national highway recorded a low of minus 3.6 degree Celsius against 3.2 degree Celsius the previous night while

Kukernag recorded a low of minus 1.8 degree Celsius against minus 0.7 degree Celsius a day ago. The frontier Kashmir district of Kupwara dipped to minus 3.9 degree Celsius against minus 3.5 degree Celsius recorded the previous night which was minus 1.5 degree Celsius below normal for the place in north Kashmir, the MeT office said.

EDITORIAL

A leap of faith

Shortly after Narendra Modi became prime minister, I was approached by a senior Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh leader passing through London. A local Bharatiya Janata Party official said the leader had read my book, India's Muslim Spring: Why Is Nobody Talking About It?, and wanted to discuss it. The book profiled a new generation of aspirational Indian Muslims who wanted to rid the community of its insular mindset.

We had a rather robust discussion on the 'whys' and 'wherefores' of the Muslim distrust of the sangh parivar. Two things struck me: his readiness to engage in a rational discussion about Muslim concerns and his careful avoidance of any attempt to point fingers at Muslims. Indeed, he expressed frustration with "hardliners on our own side" who are opposed to overtures towards Muslims.

Interestingly, barely some days later, the RSS chief, Mohan Bhagwat, while addressing party activists, reportedly 'cautioned' them against using 'offensive' language while referring to other faiths and specifically told the Vishwa Hindu Parishad to observe 'restraint' while celebrating its golden jubilee. To cut to the chase, the burden of his song was that like the young Muslims I had mentioned in my book, there was a new generation of Hindus, including BJP and RSS activists, who wanted to put the past behind and open a dialogue with like-minded Muslims. To set the ball rolling, his India Foundation think-tank had organised a 'workshop' in Goa to provide a platform for moderate Muslims and BJP/RSS supporters to exchange views. It was billed as the start of "a long-term process of engagement with Muslims", as he put it. When I wrote about my encounter in The Hindu, gently suggesting that Muslims could explore the idea of talking to the RSS, I was accused of naivet  . I'm recalling it at such length because eight years on, amid worsening Hindu-Muslim relations, that old debate on 'what to do?' is back in play.

There are deep divisions in the community on the way forward. But it's a measure of desperation that for the first time a section of Muslims is open to talking to the sangh parivar leadership if it helps ease the pressure on them.

Apparently, they have been encouraged by conciliatory noises from the other side, notably Bhagwat's rebuke to the party's foot soldiers to "stop looking for a shivling in every mosque" while referring to the controversy over the origins of Varanasi's Gyanvapi mosque. Indeed, a number of Muslim groups, including the Jamiat Ulema-i-Hind, the country's oldest Muslim organisation, have already set the ball rolling through informal contacts.

Tracing tomatoes' health benefits to gut microbes

Two weeks of eating a diet heavy in tomatoes increased the diversity of gut microbes and altered gut bacteria toward a more favourable profile in young pigs, researchers have found.

After observing these results with a short-term intervention, the research team plans to progress to similar studies in people, looking for health-related links between tomatoes in the diet and changes to the human gut microbiome -- the community of microorganisms living in the gastrointestinal tract.

"It's possible that tomatoes impart benefits through their modulation of the gut microbiome," said senior author Jessica Cooperstone, assistant professor of horticulture and crop science and food science and technology at The Ohio State University.

"Overall dietary patterns have been associated with differences in microbiome composition, but food-specific effects haven't been studied very much," Cooperstone said. "Ultimately we'd like to identify in humans what the role is of these particular microorganisms and how they might be contributing to potential health outcomes." The research is published in the journal Microbiology Spectrum. The tomatoes used in the study were developed by



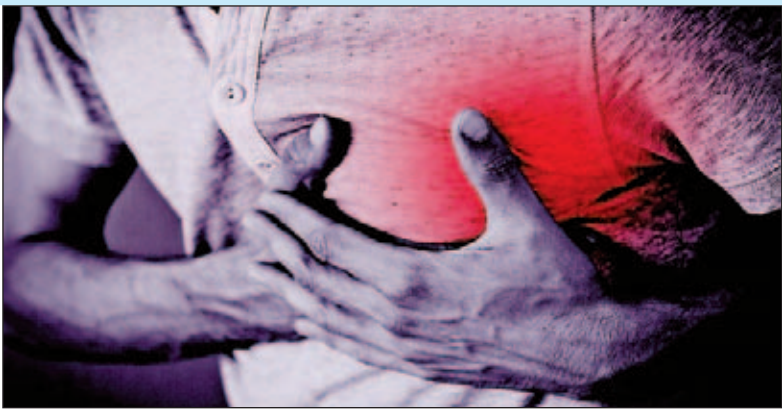
Ohio State plant breeder, tomato geneticist and co-author David Francis, and are the type typically found in canned tomato products. Ten recently weaned control pigs were fed a standard diet and 10 pigs were fed the standard diet fine-tuned so that 10% of the food consisted of a freeze-dried powder made from the tomatoes. Fiber, sugar, protein, fat and calories were identical for both diets. The control and study pig populations lived separately, and researchers running the study minimized their time spent with the pigs -- a series of precautions designed to ensure that any microbiome changes seen with the study diet could be attributed to chemical compounds in the tomatoes.

Bad cholesterol, high blood pressure contribute to heart attack risk

High levels of lipoprotein(a), a form of "bad" cholesterol, may raise the risk of cardiovascular disease in people with hypertension by 18-20 per cent, according to recent research that was published in the American Heart Association journal Hypertension. However, those without hypertension did not have an increased risk of CVD.

"High blood pressure is a known cardiovascular disease risk factor, and lipoprotein(a) is a type of inherited 'bad' cholesterol that may also lead to cardiovascular disease," said lead study author Rishi Rikhi, M.D., M.S., a cardiovascular medicine fellow at Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. "We found that among people with hypertension who have never experienced a stroke or heart attack before, lipoprotein(a) seems to increase the risk of cardiovascular disease and risk of a major cardiovascular event like a heart attack or stroke."

Hypertension is a key risk factor for cardiovascular disease. In this study,



hypertension was defined as a top number of 140 mmHg or higher, a bottom number of 90 mmHg or the use of blood pressure medication. In 2017, the Association updated its definition of hypertension to be a top number of 130 mmHg or higher or a bottom number of 80 mmHg or higher.

Previous studies have indicated that when a person has hypertension and lipid imbalance, or dyslipidemia, their

cardiovascular disease risk substantially increases. According to the study's authors, there is less information on how much of an effect lipoprotein(a) may have on cardiovascular disease risk among people with hypertension.

Lipoproteins, which are made up of protein and fat, carry cholesterol through the blood. The subtypes of lipoproteins include low-density lipoprotein (LDL), high-density

lipoprotein (HDL) and lipoprotein(a), or Lp(a). Much like LDL cholesterol, lipoprotein(a) cholesterol may deposit and build up in the walls of blood vessels, thus increasing a person's risk of a heart attack or stroke.

The research used health data from the Multi-Ethnic Study of Atherosclerosis (MESA) study, an ongoing community-based study in the U.S. of sub-clinical cardiovascular disease-meaning the disease is discovered before there are clinical signs and symptoms. MESA is a research study including nearly 7,000 adults that began in 2000 and is still following participants in six locations across the U.S.: Baltimore; Chicago; New York; Los Angeles County, California; Forsyth County, North Carolina; and St. Paul, Minnesota. At the time of enrollment in the study, all participants were free from cardiovascular disease.

The current study included 6,674 MESA participants who had lipoprotein(a) levels and blood pressure assessed and for whom there was documented cardiovascular disease event

data throughout MESA's follow-up exams in approximately 2001, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2010, 2017 and in telephone interviews every 9 to 12 months to gather interim data on new diagnoses, procedures, hospitalization and deaths. The study's participants were from diverse racial and ethnic groups: 38.6 per cent self-identified as white adults; 27.5 per cent self-identified as African American adults; 22.1 per cent self-identified as Hispanic adults, and 11.9 per cent self-identified as Chinese American (n=791) adults. Additionally, more than half of the group was female (52.8 per cent).

To evaluate the potential correlation between hypertension and lipoprotein(a) on the development of cardiovascular disease, the researchers first categorized the participants into groups based on their lipoprotein(a) levels and blood pressure measures obtained once at baseline:

1. Group 1 (2,837 people): lipoprotein(a) levels less than 50 mg/dL and no hypertension.
2. Group 2 (615 people): lipopro-

tein(a) levels greater than or equal to 50mg/dL and no hypertension

3. Group 3 (2,502 people): lipoprotein(a) levels less than 50mg/dL and hypertension

4. Group 4 (720 people): lipoprotein(a) levels >= 50mg/dL and hypertension

Participants were followed for an average of approximately 14 years and cardiovascular events, including heart attack, cardiac arrest, stroke or death from coronary artery disease, were tracked.

The study's results include:

1. A total of 809 of the participants experienced a cardiovascular disease event.
2. Lipoprotein(a) levels had an effect on hypertension status that was statistically significant (meaning it was not due to chance).
3. When compared to Group 1 (low lipoprotein(a) levels and no hypertension), Group 2 (higher lipoprotein(a) levels and no hypertension) did not have an increased risk for cardiovascular disease events.

Evolution of our solar system

The UK's national synchrotron facility, Diamond Light Source, was used by a large, international collaboration to study grains collected from a near-Earth asteroid to further our understanding of the evolution of our solar system.

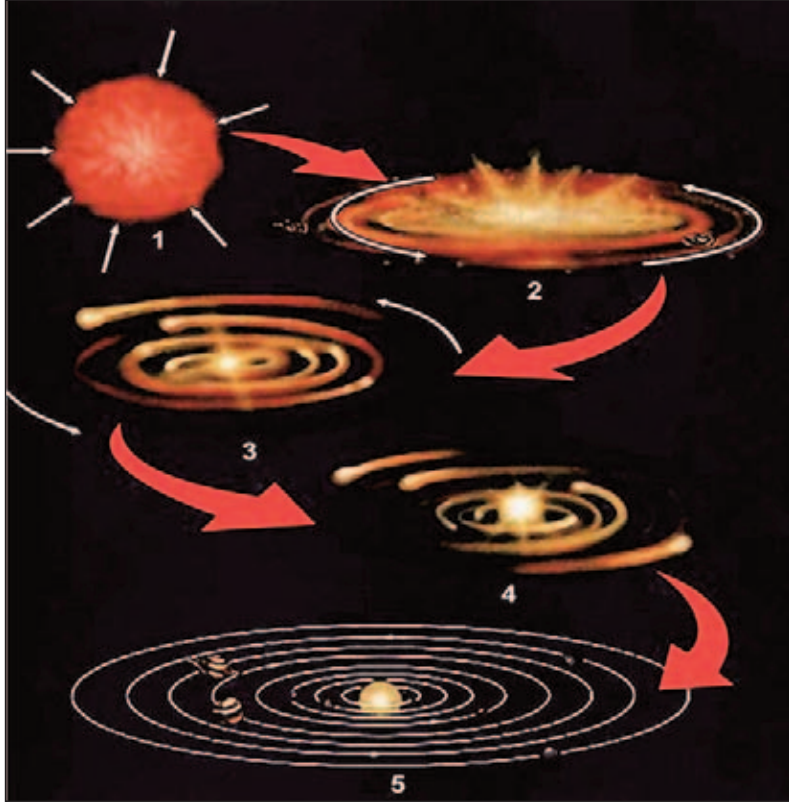
Researchers from the University of Leicester brought a fragment of the Ryugu asteroid to Diamond's Nanoprobe beamline I14 where a special technique called X-ray Absorption Near Edge Spectroscopy (XANES) was used to map out the chemical states of the elements within the asteroid material, to examine its composition in fine detail. The team also studied the asteroid grains using an electron microscope at Diamond's electron Physical Science Imaging Centre (ePSIC).

Julia Parker is the Principal Beamline Scientist for I14 at Diamond. She said: "The X-ray Nanoprobe allows scientists to examine the chemical structure of their samples at micron to nano length scales, which is complemented by the nano to atomic resolution of the imaging at ePSIC. It's very exciting to be able to contribute to the understanding of these unique samples, and to work with the team at Leicester to demonstrate how the techniques at the beamline, and correlatively at ePSIC, can benefit future sample return missions."

The data collected at Diamond contributed to a wider study of the space weathering signatures on the asteroid. The pristine asteroid samples enabled the collaborators to explore how space weathering can alter the physical and chemical composition of the surface of carbonaceous asteroids like Ryugu.

The researchers discovered that the surface of Ryugu is dehydrated and that it is likely that space weathering is responsible. The findings of the study, published today in Nature Astronomy, have led the authors to conclude that asteroids that appear dry on the surface may be water-rich, potentially requiring revision of our understanding of the abundances of asteroid types and the formation history of the asteroid belt.

Ryugu is a near-Earth asteroid, around 900 metres in diameter, first discovered in 1999 within the asteroid belt between Mars and Jupiter. It is named after the undersea palace of the Dragon God in Japanese mythology. In 2014, the Japanese state



space agency JAXA launched Hayabusa2, an asteroid sample-return mission, to rendezvous with the

Ryugu asteroid and collect material samples from its surface and sub-surface. The spacecraft returned to Earth in 2020, releasing a capsule containing precious fragments of the asteroid. These small samples were distributed to labs around the world for scientific study, including the University of Leicester's School of Physics & Astronomy and Space Park where John Bridges, one of the authors on the paper, is a Professor of Planetary Science.

John said: "This unique mission to gather samples from the most primitive, carbonaceous, building blocks of the Solar System needs the world's most detailed microscopy, and that's why JAXA and the Fine Grained Mineralogy team wanted us to analyse

samples at Diamond's X-ray nanoprobe beamline. We helped reveal the nature of space weathering on this asteroid with micrometeorite impacts and the solar wind creating dehydrated serpentine minerals, and an associated reduction from oxidised Fe3+ to more reduced Fe2+. It's important to build up experience in studying samples returned from asteroids, as in the Hayabusa2 mission, because soon there will be new samples from other asteroid types, the Moon and within the next 10 years Mars, returned to Earth. The UK community will be able to perform some of the critical analyses due to our facilities at Diamond and the electron microscopes at ePSIC."

The building blocks of Ryugu are remnants of interactions between water, minerals and organics in the early Solar System prior to the formation of Earth. Understanding the composition of asteroids can help explain how the early solar system developed, and subsequently how the Earth formed.

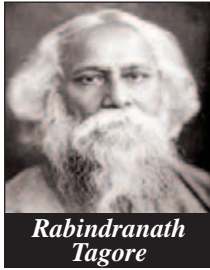
They may even help explain how life on Earth came about, with asteroids believed to have delivered much of the planet's water as well as organic compounds such as amino acids, which provide the fundamental building blocks from which all human life is constructed.

The information that is being gleaned from these tiny asteroid samples will help us to better understand the origin not only of the planets and stars but also of life itself. Approval to GM Mustard pays way for transformation of Indian agriculture

CHANDIGARH The long-awaited approval of the Genetic Engineering Appraisal Committee (GEAC) to the GM Mustard has brought two good news for India. First, the genetically modified variety of mustard will help the country achieve self-sufficiency in edible oils by boosting overall productivity. Second, it will facilitate the release of other crop varieties developed through genetic engineering. This would help us attain food security and nutritional security in an expedited manner. The GEAC's landmark decision has approved a food crop for commercial release for the first time. Dr Shivendra Bajaj, Executive Director, Federation of Seed Industry of India and Alliance for Agri Innovation, India has so far allowed commercial cultivation of non-food Bt Cotton crop variety. The GM Mustard variety, known as Dhara Mustard Hybrid (DMH)-11, had faced fierce opposition that was purely based on unfounded and unscientific reasons. Since the technical body of the GEAC has approved it, the case of GM Mustard appears vindicated, clearly showing the edible oil crop is safe for human consumption and the environment.

The government of India too is quite positive about the commercial release of GM Mustard. So the green signal for the development of new and high-yielding GM Mustard hybrids and seeds is expected very soon. GM Mustard is going to be a gamechanger. It offers the opportunity for development of hybrids with higher yield, efficient use of water and fertilisers, improved oil quality and disease resistance. While India's domestic consumption of edible oils has increased by 2.5-3 times since the 1990s, the production however has increased marginally. This has made us rely heavily on imports to meet our domestic demand. We have imported around 13.35 million tonnes of edible oils in 2020-21. Dr Shivendra Bajaj, Executive Director, Federation of Seed Industry of India and Alliance for Agri Innovation Mustard oil is the widely consumed edible oil in India. The average output of mustard is 1,000-1,300 kgs per hectare, which is quite less compared to over 2,000 kgs in other countries such as Australia, China, and Canada where GM hybrids are cultivated. We need to increase the production of edible oil seeds by 20 million tonnes in the next five-six years. Experiments conducted under the Indian Council of Agriculture Research's (ICAR) supervision showed the GM Mustard variety DHM-11 has an output advantage of 29-37 percent. This can help farmers enhance their farm income and will encourage more farmers to cultivate mustard, which will



boost the edible oil production. Higher production will lead to reduction of oil imports and make us self-sufficient gradually. India has witnessed a massive 174 percent increase in edible oil imports in the past decade. This makes it imperative for us to

embrace technological solutions to address vulnerabilities arising due to climate change, volatility in international markets, and geopolitical tensions. India farmers should not be prevented from accessing new technology that can benefit their farms, income and domestic consumers. Many farmer organisations in the country have welcomed the GEAC's decision and appealed to the government to allow its commercial release at the earliest. They are also seeking permission to cultivate other genetically engineered crops including Bt Brinjal and HT cotton. Biotechnology has answers to several conventional and contemporary problems that the agriculture sector faces. GM Mustard is paving a way for transformation in Indian agriculture. It will be easier for us to achieve food security and nutritional security at a greater pace. This will help facilitate the introduction of many genetically engineered varieties including rice, wheat, maize, brinjal, castor in the market for commercial cultivation. Although it has taken over a decade to reach this stage, the GEAC approval has rekindled hopes for the use of biotechnological solutions. They will make our agriculture better, more profitable, and more resilient in times of climate change. - Dr Shivendra Bajaj, Executive Director, Federation of Seed Industry of India and Alliance for Agri Innovation

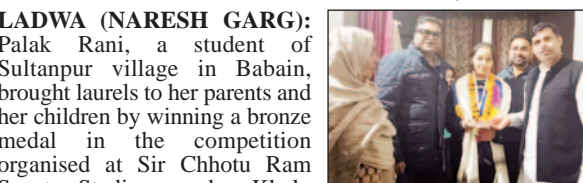

## Youth donates 32 units of blood at the blood donation camp



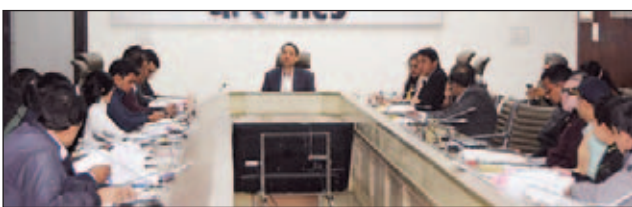

The second Test will take place in Dhaka from December 22 through 26.

Australia successfully defended 188 in the fourth T20I, Healy was unable to bat or field forcing McGrath to take over as captain. Beth Mooney, wicketkeeper for the Perth Scorchers in the WBBL, kept during the chase and will do so once again in the final game.

When Healy returns to Australia later this week, she will have scans done on her leg to establish the severity of the injury. In mid-January, Australia will host ODI and T20I series against Pakistan in preparation for the T20 World Cup in February.

Healy's injury means that her remarkable record streak of 107 straight T20Is for Australia will end.

McGrath seemed confident about taking over the captaincy reigns after maintaining composure on Saturday to take Australia to victory and leading Adelaide Strikers to the WBBL championship last month.

"I'm new to leadership in this team and been learning a lot on the fly and it probably worked in my favour that I didn't have long to think about it," McGrath told reporters in Mumbai on Monday. I was strangely calm out there, I had a lot of support. I had to try and stay calm and keep the team calm. I've come off the back of captaining Strikers for six weeks and that's their high pressure. The best players in the world are there and where's what it felt like, I was captaining the Strikers with a few extra players," expressed McGrath as quoted by ESPNcricinfo.

Phoebe Litchfield, who made her international debut in game two of the series despite not batting, is set to receive a second chance.

Australia has a number of options, including Litchfield and Ellyse Perry, but are still unsure of who would open alongside Mooney.

"We haven't decided yet. But I think the good news is we've got a lot of options, whether Phoebe [Litchfield] comes in, she's done it in the Big Bash, myself, Pez [Perry]. We've got so many options but we'll have to wait and see," mentioned McGrath.

On the fourth morning in Karachi, England required 38 minutes to finish off a decisive eight-wicket victory, eventually reaching their fourth-innings target of 167 in 28.1 overs.

After an unsuccessful bid to win the third Test in three days, England were a little more cautious on the fourth morning, but still took only 11.1 overs to complete the clean sweep with captain Ben Stokes undefeated on 35 at one end while Duckett with unbeaten 82 runs, at the other end.

England resumed their inning on the fourth day at 112-2, with Stokes at 15\* and Duckett on 50\*. The duo took England to victory within an hour only requiring close to 12 overs for the remaining 55 runs.

In an incredibly spectacular return to test cricket, Duckett continued to sweep, reverse-sweep, and paddle-sweep Abrar Ahmed while

"Perfect (sums up the Test series). We got a process in which we want to play, the challenge is to play on different kinds of pitches and we stuck to our gameplan and adapted really well with bat and ball. Everyone delivered. Lot spoke about the way we bat, but our bowling stood up as well. It comes down to belief. The belief we have on the team in what we were trying to do and it resonates around everybody, it's unbelievable and to be able to lead the group full of confidence, it's amazing. Every person stood up at some point and put on some kind of match-winning performance," Ben Stokes said in a post-match presentation.

Stokes set the tone by muscling the third ball down the pitch and he faced through midwicket. Earlier, Pakistan's batting collapse had suffered a dramatic collapse in their second innings which saw them lose their last 7 wickets for 52 runs, extending their lead to a 1-1 paltry 166-run which was never going to be enough against the free-flowing English batting line-up. Debutant Rehan Ahmed was the wrecking-in-chief as he scalped five wickets and made an excellent start to his test career. Following the final match of his lengthy and illustrious international career for Pakistan,

Azhar Ali was cheered off the field while holding a souvenir stump. The former Pakistan captain appeared in 97 tests and scored 7097 runs at 42.49, including 19 centuries. Harry Brook, who amassed 468 runs in five innings to lead the tour, was declared Player of the Series after scoring three hundreds in the series. Since Stokes and Brendon McCullum took over as captain and coach, respectively, England has won nine out of ten Test matches, a remarkable turnaround from a run of just one victory in 17 prior to their appointments. India skipper Rohit Sharma and bowler Navdeep Saini have been ruled out of the second and final Test match of the two-game series against Bangladesh to be played in Dhaka starting from December 22, BCCI announced on Tuesday.

"Rohit Sharma is under the care of the BCCI Medical Team following his left thumb injury, which he sustained during the 2nd

ODI against Bangladesh in Dhaka. The Medical Team is of the opinion that the injury needs some more time to heal completely before the Indian captain can bat and field with full intensity. He will continue his rehab and will not be available for the second and final Test against Bangladesh," BCCI said in a statement.

"Navdeep Saini is also ruled out of the second Test owing to an abdominal muscle strain. The fast bowler will now report to the NCA

for further management of his injury," it further added.

India skipper missed the third and final ODI against Bangladesh with a finger injury sustained in the second match and could not make it to the ongoing first Test match being played at Chattogram. With Rohit not travelling to Dhaka, vice-captain KL Rahul will continue to lead the team in his absence in the second and final Test of the series which India lead 1-0. Not only Rohit Sharma but there were

many other cricketers who failed to make it to the Indian squad like Jasprit Bumrah (back), Mohammad Shami (shoulder) and Ravindra Jadeja (knee). These star players have failed to recover in time and have been ruled out of both Tests. In the first Test against hosts, India boosted their chances of appearing at next year's ICC World Test Championship with a comprehensive 188-run victory over a gritty Bangladesh in Chattogram on Sunday.
