Equities tumble nearly 2 pc; Sensex settles below 60k

MUMBAI: Equity benchmarks tumbled nearly 2 per cent on Friday in tandem with weak Asian market trends as investors sentiment remained muted in view of the COVID-19 surge in some countries. The 30-share BSE Sensex continued to remain under selling pressure for the fourth day running and slumped 980.93 points or 1.61 per cent to settle at 59,845.29. During the day, it tanked 1,060.66 points or 1.74 per cent to 59,765.56. On similar lines, the broader NSE Nifty dropped 320.55 points or 1.77 per cent to end at 17,806.80.

Journalist Siddique Kappan granted bail in PMLA case

LUCKNOW : Allahabad High Court's Lucknow bench on Friday granted bail to journalist Siddique Kappan, who was arrested in connection with Prevention of Money Laundering Act case lodged by Enforcement Directorate, as per reports. Kappan moved high court after Lucknow Sessions Court denied him bail. He has already been granted bail in the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) case by the Supreme Court. A single-judge bench of Justice Dinesh Kumar Singh granted him bail. The verdict has paved way for Kappan's release after 2 years.

Avoid overcrowding, ensure wearing of masks in crowded places: Centre to states ahead of festive season

NEW DELHI: Ahead of the festive season, the Centre on Friday asked states and Union territories to take measures to avoid overcrowding and ensure adequate ventilation for indoor gatherings and wearing of masks in crowded places. In a letter to states and UTs, Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan stressed on monitoring and reporting of district-wise influenza-like illness (ILI) and severe acute respiratory illness (SARI) cases in all health facilities on a regular basis for detecting the early rising trend of cases. Ensure higher samples for whole genome sequencing amongst positive samples of COVID-19 in the community so as to enable timely detection of new variants, if any, in the country, he wrote. "Considering the upcoming festive season and new year celebrations, there is need to put in place requisite public health measures and other arrangements to minimize risk of increase in transmission of the disease by maintaining and strengthening focus on test-track-treat-vaccination and adherence to Covid-appropriate behaviour, i.e. use of mask, hand .

16 Army jawans killed as vehicle falls into gorge in Sikkim

Sixteen soldiers died as an Army truck fell into a gorge in North Sikkim on Friday morning.

The truck carrying the soldiers skidded off the road in a mountainous area. The truck was part of a three-vehicle convoy that had started from Chatten towards Thangu in the morning.

At Zema, the vehicle skidded down a steep slope while negotiating a sharp turn, Army officials said. A rescue mission was immediately launched and four injured soldiers were evacuated. Three JCOs and 13 soldiers succumbed to their injuries, the officials said. The Army stands firm with the bereaved families, the official said.

Quoting Modi, the PMO tweeted, "Pained by the loss of lives of our brave army personnel due to a road mishap in Sikkim. Condolences to the bereaved families. May the injured recover soon." The Army said the truck was part of a three-vehicle convoy that moved from Chatten in the morning towards Thangu.

"Unfortunately, three Junior Commissioned Officers and 13 soldiers succumbed to the injuries sustained in the accident. Indian Army stands firm with

the bereaved families, at this hour of loss," it said.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said he is "deeply pained" over the loss of lives of the personnel.

"The nation is deeply grateful for their service and commitment. My condolences to the bereaved families. Praying for the speedy recovery of those who are injured," he said in a tweet.

Govt to conduct across country Covid response mock drill on Dec 27

A mock drill to test the Covid emergency preparedness would be conducted in hospitals across the country on Tuesday, 27th December.

"A mock drill for an emergency response to deal with Covid 9 cases will be conducted at hospitals across the country on Tuesday, 27th December, the Union Health Minister Dr Man-sukh Mandaviya will also be participating in the Mock drill," official sources to a news agency.

The mock drill is being conducted amid fear of a Covid surge in the country in the wake of a spurt of Covid cases reported in China and other countries. The Union Ministry in India has started taking several proactive steps in this direction.

The Union Ministry of Health advised States on December 20 to significantly increase genome sequencing. A high-level meeting was also chaired by Union Health Minister on December 21 to review the COVID-19 situation & preparedness of the public health system for surveillance, containment & management of COVID-19.

On Thursday Prime Minister chaired a high-level meeting to review status and preparedness and guided on Cautions against



Complacency, advised maintaining Strict Vigil and emphasized the need for strengthened Surveillance with a focus on Genome Sequencing and increased Testing.

During the high-level meeting, States were advised to ensure the Operational readiness of Hospital Infrastructure, and adherence to Covid appropriate Behavior including Wearing Of Masks.

The Union Health Ministry has also appealed for Precaution Dose Vaccination, especially for Elderly and Vulnerable Population Groups.

According to officials, Travel guidelines have been revised and issued. 2% Random Screening of International Passengers to be re-initiated from Saturday, December 24, the random screening charges will be charged to the passengers.

Manohar govt offers big relief to cancer patients with monthly pension of Rs. 2500

3 dead, 3 wounded in Paris shooting; suspect arrested

PARIS, DECEMBER 23

A shooting targeting a Kurdish cultural center in a bustling Paris neighbourhood on Friday left three people dead and three others wounded, authorities said. A 69-year-old suspect was wounded and arrested.

The Paris prosecutor's office opened an investigation for murder and attempted murder. The Paris prosecutor said the suspect had a prior police record, including an arrest for attacking migrants living in tents, and that investigators are considering a possible racist motive for the shooting.

The shooting occurred at midday at a Kurdish cultural center and a restaurant and hairdresser nearby, ac-



cording to the mayor for the 10th arrondissement, Alexandra Cordebar. Speaking to reporters at the scene, she said the "real motivation? for the shooting remains unclear.

As she spoke, a crowd nearby chanted, "Erdogan, terrorist" — re-

ferring to Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan — and "Turkish state, assassin." Police cordoned off the area in the 10th arrondissement of the French capital, on a busy street with shops and restaurants near the Gare de l'Est train station. The shoot-

ing came at a time when Paris is buzzing with activity before the Christmas weekend. The Paris police department warned people to stay away from the area.

Paris Prosecutor Laure Beccuaud said three people hit in the shooting have died, one is in critical condition and two others are hospitalised with less serious injuries. The attacker was also wounded in the face, she said.

She said anti-terrorism prosecutors are in contact with investigators, but haven't indicated any sign of a terrorist motive. In 2013, three women Kurdish activists, including Sakine Cansiz — a founder of the Kurdistan Workers' Party, or PKK — were found shot dead at a Kurdish center in Paris. A Turkish citizen was charged with their killing.

On the basis of which the Director Rural Development and Panchayat Department took action and ordered the suspension. Sarpanch Ravinder Singh Dhalwal termed all the allegations as fabricated and baseless and termed this action as political vendetta.

State fully prepared to tackle fresh wave of covid pandemic, asserts CM

SHASHI PAL JAIN CHANDIGARH, DEC 23

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Friday said that the state government is fully prepared to tackle any unforeseen challenge in wake of the fresh wave of covid pandemic.

The Chief Ministers reviewed the arrangements of the state government during a review meeting here at his office in Punjab Civil Secretariat I. The Chief Minister urged the people to wear appropriate masks in all Educational Institutions, Government & Private Offices and indoor/outdoor gatherings, malls, Public places etc. for the prevention of further spread of the virus in the population and for the well-being of every individual adding he appealed the people to wear mask at public places. Likewise, he said that COVID-19 appropriate behaviour must be strictly followed like social distancing, respiratory etiquettes and no spitting at public places. Bhagwant Mann asked the Health department to



ensure that anyone having symptoms of COVID-19 must get tested and follow COVID-19 protocol. He also asked all the Deputy Commissioners to constantly review the arrangements in their concerned districts.

The Chief Minister further said that the state government has decided to set up a State Level Covid Control Room to tackle any exigency. All hospitals/ labs/ Collection centres offering testing for COVID-19 must upload details of tests including positive and negative results on COVA Portal of Government of Punjab as well as intimate complete testing details to re-

spective district and State COVID-19 cell. He also said that Those due for second dose and precautionary dose of COVID-19 vaccine must take it at the earliest. Bhagwant Mann asked the officers to ensure that decision of the Government in this regard should be implemented strictly and also disseminated for compliance. The Chief Minister expressed satisfaction that in order to contain the spread of COVID-19, a total of 2,10,80,032 samples have been conducted so far and on an average 2500 RT-PCR and RAT tests are being done on daily basis.

He said that these tests are conducted at Sub Divisional Hospitals level on Saturdays and Sundays as well. Bhagwant Mann said that in the past three weeks the average positive rate is 0.02% and the positivity is less than 0.1 from the last two months. The Chief Minister said that there are 790 Level-II paediatric oxygen supported beds adding that 324 paediatric ICU beds are available in case of require-

ment. He said thag Additional 3518 adult Level-II beds and 142 adult ICU beds are available in case of requirement.

Bhagwant Mann said that 14701 Level 2 and 3132 Level 3 beds are available in case of requirement. The Chief Minister said that 23 Liquid Medical Oxygen (LMO) storage tanks (with MGPS) have been installed in the state and 87 Pressure Swing Adsorption plants are working.

SJVN expands footprint in wind energy; secures 100 MW Project

Nand Lal Sharma, Chairman & Managing Director, SJVN today informed that SJVN has won the full quoted capacity of 100 MW Wind Power Project @ Rs 2.90 per unit on Build Own and Operate basis through e- Reverse Auction. Sharma stated that SJVN participated in the tariff based competitive bidding for setting up 1200 MW Inter State Transmission System connected Wind Projects in India (Phase -XIII) conducted by Solar Energy Corporation of India Limited. The project will be developed anywhere in India through SJVN's wholly owned subsidiary SGEL. The tentative cost of the development of this project is Rs. 700 crores. The project is expected to generate 262 MU in the first year of



commissioning and cumulative energy generation over a period of 25 years will be about 6574 MU. Nand Lal Sharma further told that the project will be commissioned in a period of 24 months from the date of signing of Power Sale Agreement (PSA). The PSA shall be executed after issuance of Letter of Intent by SECI. “SJVN has already commissioned Sadla & Khirvi Wind Power Stations with cumulative capacity of 97.6 MW in the states of Gujarat and Maharashtra. The commissioning of this Project

is expected to reduce 322150 Tonnes of carbon emission and would contribute in Government of India's mission to make our nation carbon neutral by 2070.” said Sh. Nand Lal Sharma. The present total portfolio of SJVN is around 45,000 MW and out of this around 97% is based on non-fossil fuel sources. Take special care of health in cold: DC

Chairman and Deputy Commissioner of District Disaster Management Authority, Una Raghav Sharma while issuing an advisory on the cold wave affecting several parts of the state said the cold is continuously intensifying in the district, and in such a situation, in view of the decreasing temperature, more cold wind, cold wave and dense fog/mist are expected in the coming days. He appealed to the people to be cautious about their health. He said, "the drivers should drive their vehicles at low speeds in the fog. Keep the



lights on low beam during fog. High-beam lights are not as effective in foggy conditions. Use fog lights in extremely foggy weather."

Deputy Commissioner advised them to maintain the prescribed distance between vehicles, and when visibility is extremely poor, use the line painted on the road as a guide. "Do not use mobile phones and loud music systems while driving." He advised the

people to stay safe indoors during the cold wave. "While going out of the house, go out only by covering your head, ears, hands, feet, and nose. Because there can be a lack of heat through the head in the cold. Cover your mouth as well; this will protect your lungs from the cold. Keep taking weather information from newspapers, radio and TV. Stay alert to changes in local weather forecasts and upcoming temperatures. To maintain the flow of heat in the body, take nutritious food and hot beverages. Wear woolen and warm clothes in cold weather. Keep body dry. If the clothes are wet, there may be a lack of heat. Using

heaters, kerosene, and coal stoves in the rooms, make sure to make proper arrangements for exhausting the smoke." He said, "Do not do physical work beyond capacity in low temperatures, it can cause the risk of a heart attack. Keep an eye out for the symptoms of frostbite such as numbness of body parts, white or yellow spots emerging on hands, toes, ears, nose, etc. Watch for symptoms of hypothermia such as memory loss, excessive chills, lethargy, fatigue, lisp, etc. If you do not feel well in cold weather and feel any kind of problem, contact the doctor immediately".

Baltana's furniture market is often jammed due to illegal encroachments by roadside shopkeepers. People continue to get upset because of the jam but shopkeepers and council officials don't care. The reason behind this is the subject of inquiry as to why the council has failed to remove illegal encroachments. Here,



every morning, the shopkeepers of the furniture market occupy the roadside in violation of the rules and arrange their goods. Due to which the passers-by passing through here have to face a lot of trouble. While the showrooms of furniture made here are very big but still they have encroached illegally in front of the shops. The customers who come to their shop to buy furniture do not have a place to park their cars, due to which they park their vehicles on the road, which makes the situation even worse. Not only here, the trucks that came to store the furniture load-unload on the roadside.

City council employees do show action Municipal Corporation employees have taken so-called actions to remove the illegal encroachments made in the furniture market, but the morale of the shopkeepers is so high that they redecorate the shop after a few minutes. During the festivals, after the reprimand of the administration, the council team takes some action, but its effect lasts only for an hour. What is the reason behind this is a subject of investigation. There are dozens of such societies in the Baltana area, whose only means of transportation has been encroached upon by the furniture market shops.

State of the art “Kidney Diseases Research Laboratory” in the Department of Nephrology at PGIMER, Chandigarh was inaugurated today by Prof. Vivek Lal, Director of the Institute. In addition to routine clinical investigations, the Laboratory will offer facilities for advanced diagnostics and research. A large bio-bank storing biological samples of patients with kidney diseases has been established. The Department is home to the central bio-bank of the countrywide cohort of



Chronic Kidney Disease and various Glomerular Diseases. This has been made possible through numerous grants from the Department of Biotechnology, Department of Science and Technology, Indian Council of Medical Research and grant in aid from PGIMER, Chandigarh. The Department is also host to the prestigious Indian Alliance (Department of Biotechnology, Government of India and Wellcome Trust, UK) Clinical and Public Health grants by way of which the Department is es-

tablishing a network of various centres for clinical research. The Department is the only place in India where a dedicated facility for measurement of kidney function (Glomerular Filtration Rate) by Plasma Clearance of Iohexol has been established. “The facilities in this laboratory will not only help in patient care but will also enhance the quality of research”, said Prof. H.S. Kohli. Prof. Vivek Lal, Director of the Institute appreciated the efforts and urged the students.

Non-regularisation of services: NHM employees hold protest against Pb govt

SHIMLA: The coldwave further plummeted Mercury in Himachal Pradesh as night temperature of Kaza in Lahaul-Spiti district was minus 17 degrees coldest of this winter, district administration official confirmed. EDITORIAL

Keep it clean

It is that time of year when migratory birds, tourists and non-resident Indians flock to the City of Joy and partake in our fleeting winter festivities. Indeed, Calcutta looks its festive best around this time, if not in the manner of Durga Puja then certainly in keeping with the Yuletide spirit. The 28th edition of the Kolkata International Film Festival, which concluded yesterday, has earned accolades for the city at a time it is thronged by these visitors.

Walking along the spectacularly bedecked Park Street reveals a slice of Calcutta that is barely representative of most other localities grappling with existential concerns. With the sprucing up of the city in mind, the mayor announced stiff penalties for those found dumping garbage or littering the streets. Individuals littering a road will have to pay Rs 525 for the first offence, Rs 735 for the second time and for every subsequent offence, the fine will be Rs 1,050. But how will that be effective in a milieu where offenders are known to wriggle out of fines by greasing willing palms? The Calcutta Municipal Corporation announced that from December, waste segregation would be introduced in all 144 wards. The practice is prevalent in only 27 wards thus far, and December-end was earmarked as the deadline for all households to be provided with two bins — one green (for biodegradable waste) and the other blue. The CMC was supposed to distribute 38 lakh buckets and bins of these colours for residents and at strategic locations in every ward to dissuade them from indulging in indiscriminate littering.

However, only a few councillors have assumed the task in earnest. While the residents of the Pallisree-Bansdroni locality were fortunate to have their representative, Arup Chakraborty, distribute bins to individual houses, a vast majority of wards are yet to initiate the programme, despite the imminent deadline. A random survey found wards 56, 75, 109 and many others untouched by any effort to implement the bin programme, while ward 81 has been initiated into this drive over a year ago. The CMC did organise workshops in late November to familiarise councillors with the drill, but that is yet to translate into any meaningful action.

Our locality, for instance, has garbage dumps on vacant land, including the surroundings of the ruling party's club. Kali Puja was celebrated here with such pomp that a permanent wall was built to shield visiting dignitaries (the local councillor was the chief guest) from unsavoury visions of the canal that runs alongside.

Beijing expects Covid peak within a week

China can witness a peak in COVID-19 cases within a week as the mainland reported less than 4000 new symptomatic local cases nationwide on Thursday and still downplayed the disease's severity and continue to report no new deaths, Bernard Orr and Casey Hall write in Australian Associated Press, News agency reported.

Amid the increase in Covid cases this month, China began dismantling its zero-Covid policy in the country.

China's containment measures had slowed the economy to its lowest growth rate in nearly half a century, jamming global supply chains and trade. As Chinese workers increasingly fall ill, more disruption is expected in the short term before the economy bounces back later next year, according to Australian Associated Press.

In the daily briefing, the Chinese mainland reported 3,030 new cases of confirmed infections but reported no new deaths.

On Dec 21, 2,352 patients were released from the hospital after being cured. 56,880 people who had had close contact with infected patients were freed from medical observation. The number of serious cases increased by 45, according to China's National Health Commission.

Meanwhile, British-based health data firm Airfinity, on Wednesday, said that the infections in China are likely to be more than one million a day with deaths at more than 5000 a day.

New modelling by Airfinity has examined data from China's regional provinces. The current outbreak is



growing more rapidly in some regions than in others. Cases are currently rising much more quickly in Beijing and Guangdong.

"Using the trends in regional data our team of epidemiologists has forecast the first peak to be in regions where cases are currently rising and a second peak driven by later surges in other Chinese provinces," Airfinity said in a statement. The Airfinity mod-

el estimates case rates could reach 3.7 million a day in a January peak and 4.2 million a day in March 2023.

Airfinity's Head of Vaccines and Epidemiology Dr Louise Blair said, "China has stopped mass testing and is no longer reporting asymptomatic cases. The combination means the official data is unlikely to be a true reflection of the outbreak being experienced across the country. "China has also

changed the way it records COVID-19 deaths to only include those who die from respiratory failure or pneumonia after testing positive.

This is different to other countries that record deaths within a time frame of a positive test or where COVID-19 is recorded to have attributed to the cause of death. This change could downplay the extent of deaths seen in China."

Study suggests gender stereotypes are reflected by characters' actions in movie scripts

A novel machine-learning framework has been developed by researchers that uses scene descriptions in movie scripts to automatically recognize different characters' actions.

Applying the framework to hundreds of movie scripts showed that these actions tend to reflect widespread gender stereotypes, some of which are found to be consistent across time. Victor Martinez and colleagues at the University of Southern California, U.S., present these findings in the open-access journal PLOS ONE on December 21.

Movies, tv shows, and other media consistently portray traditional gender stereotypes, some of which may be harmful. To deepen understanding of this issue, some researchers have explored the use of computational frameworks as an efficient and accurate way to analyze large amounts of character dialogue in scripts. However, some harmful stereotypes might be communicated

not through what characters say, but through their actions.

To explore how characters' actions might reflect stereotypes, Martinez and colleagues used a machine-learning approach to create a computational model that can automatically analyze scene descriptions in movie scripts and identify different characters' actions. Using this model, the researchers analyzed over 1.2 million scene descriptions from 912 movie scripts produced from 1909 to 2013, identifying fifty thousand actions performed by twenty thousand characters. Next, the researchers conducted statistical analyses to examine whether there were differences between the types of actions performed by characters of different genders. These analyses identified a number of differences that reflect known gender stereotypes. For instance, they found that female characters tend to display less agency than male characters, and that female characters are more likely to show affection.

Imran Khan's ex-wife Reham gets married for 3rd time

Former Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan's ex-wife Reham Khan on Friday announced that she got married to model and actor Mirza Bilal Baig in a ceremony in the United States.

Taking to Twitter, the 49-year-old who is now based in the US posted, "We had a lovely Nikkah ceremony performed in Seattle with the blessings of @MirzaBilal_ parents & my son as my Vakeel."

"Finally found a man who I can trust @MirzaBilal_" she said.

In pictures that she shared on the social media, Reham was seen in a white wedding gown while her 36-year-old husband Bilal was seen dressed in a mauve coloured suit. Earlier, she announced her marriage by posting a picture of two hands and the words "Just Married".

This is also the third marriage for Mirza Bilal Baig a US-based corporate professional and a former model.

In 2015, Pakistani-British television journalist Reham Khan tied the knot with Imran Khan in January in a ceremony at his Islamabad home but divorced him ten months later, Daily Pakistan reported.

After the divorce, Reham revealed that she - like Jemima, Khan's first wife - had



been subjected to a hate campaign in Pakistan and that their marriage had not survived it.

Reham Khan was born in Ajdabiya, Libya in 1973. After studies in Pakistan, she began working as a broadcast journalist in the UK in the mid-90s, including as a weather presenter for BBC South Today. After moving to Pakistan in 2012, she met Imran Khan when interviewing him for a local TV show, according to Daily Pakistan.

Atal Bihari Vajpayee: A statesman who dreamt of a stronger, inclusive India

It's Christmas today - the day Jesus Christ was born. His teachings of love, peace, compassion and brotherhood are the lifeline of humanity. I extend my X-Mas greetings and wishes to all, especially our fellow Christian citizens of the country. It is also a great coincidence that our former Prime Minister Bharat Ratna Late Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee ji was also born on this solemn day in 1924 in the family of a humble school teacher in Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh. Throughout his life, Vajpayee ji adhered to the ideals of peace, co-existence, compassion, respect for all, equality, justice and fraternity. Poet, writer, journalist, statesman, freedom fighter and a visionary par excellence, Vajpayee ji was blessed with a multifaceted personality. He was a true nationalist and always chose to rise above petty politics for the sake of national interest.

Whether in power or in opposition, he believed in taking along all for the cause of the nation and its people. That is why he was also hailed as Aatishatru of Indian politics. In a public life of several decades, there was not a single spot on his personality. Integrity, honesty and large heartedness were an integral part of his personality, which always reflected in his writings as a journalist, speeches as a politician



and in his approach as an administrator. A Hriday Samrat, indeed! A man of masses, firm in his political convictions, he commanded respect from all political quarters for his vision, views and ideals so integral to our democratic and secular legacy.

Vajpayee ji joined the RSS at a very tender age in 1932 and became a Pracharak in 1947. He formally joined politics by becoming a member of the Bharatiya Jana Sangh in 1951. He was deeply inspired by the thoughts of Shyama Prasad Mukherjee and Deen Dayal Upadhyay. He fought the Lok Sabha election for the first time in 1957 and got elected from Balrampur in Uttar Pradesh, and thereafter never looked back. Then Prime Minister Jawaharlal

Nehru was so much impressed by his lively and enriching debates and discussion in Parliament that he predicted that Vajpayee ji would occupy his seat 'one day.' In 1980, he became the founder president of the Bharatiya Janata Party.

As the External Affairs Minister in the Janata Party government in 1977, head of various important Parliamentary Standing Committees and Leader of the Opposition, Vajpayee ji's journey of life is all about giving his best to the nation. Impressed by his 'Nation First' belief, then Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao asked Vajpayee ji, who was Leader of Opposition, to lead the delegation to represent India at the UN. His authority on matters of diplomatic and external affairs was fabulous. He left an indelible mark on our foreign policy. In 1996, he became the Prime Minister of the first non-Congress government.

I would like to mention here an incident, which amply reflects how he created a positive impression about our country and the huge respect he used to command among the world leaders. The then Pakistan Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif had come to attend the funeral of former Prime Minister Late Shri Rajiv Gandhi ji. He had stayed at Ashoka Hotel in New Delhi. He invited Vajpayee ji and LK Advani ji for a per-

sonal meeting. Mr Sharif expressed during conversation that he was meeting him for the first time but knew that his tenure as the External Affairs Minister had seen the most cordial relations between India and Pakistan.

In matters of national interest, Vajpayee ji used to have a non-negotiable approach. When he became the Prime Minister for the first time, he had made up his mind to go for the nuclear test but his government did not last long.

However, he did not delay Pokhran II when he became the PM again in 1998. In a meeting with Dr APJ Abdul Kalam and Dr R Chidambaram, the decks were cleared for Pokhran II - five nuclear tests of advanced weapons on May 11 and 13, 1998, and joined the comity of nuclear powers. We celebrate May 11 as the National Technology Day.

He was always full of self-confidence in matters of national interest. This was perhaps the only reason that when Pokhran-II was conducted in 1998, he was not rattled despite impending sanctions from the US and other countries. However, he was ever keen to improve relations with Pakistan. He undertook the Lahore Bus Yatra. He also took a bold step to improve ties with Pakistan by inviting Pervez Musharraf to India for the Agra summit.

Musharraf betrayed India by attacking us in Kargil but our gallant soldiers under the leadership of Vajpayee ji inflicted a crushing defeat on Pakistan.

As the PM, Vajpayee ji was very particular about infra upgradation, improved road, rail and air connectivity. He initiated big reforms in tune with the spirit of liberalization unveiled by former Prime Minister Rao. Notwithstanding all odds India under his leadership maintained a stable economic growth of eight per cent. By forming a separate Disinvestment Ministry, he brought in required resilience in the functioning of PSUs.

The historic decision to launch Sarv Shiksha Abhiyan to make elementary education free for children aged 6-14 years. The ambitious project of Inter-Linking of Rivers was the long-cherished dream of Vajpayee ji. Similarly, he gave a big boost to road infra through the Golden Quadrilateral project and the Pradhan Mantri Gramin Sadak Yojana, thanks to which our villages are today connected with all-weather roads. Through Valmiki Ambekar Awas Yojana, roofless people were provided with pucca houses.

As his colleague in the party, Parliament and the Union Ministry for many decades, I know him as an erudite politician, a selfless and ded-

icated leader, who used to articulate the 'aspirations of the masses' in true sense. He was blessed with rare qualities to take along people of different political hues and was never ever supportive of any bid to disrupt the proceedings of the House. Doctors concerned that FSSAI's proposed food label will fail to have any impact on public health

Chandigarh : Top doctors are concerned that the food labelling system proposed by FSSAI for which they are currently seeking public comments will fall short of fulfilling its main role. Front-of-package warning labelling is gaining traction across the world as an important strategy to improve public health as it helps consumers to identify in a quick, clear and effective way, products high in sugar, sodium, saturated fats, trans fats and total fats, critical nutrients associated with the spiralling burden of non-communicable diseases (NCDs). Consumption of packaged and ultra-processed foods and beverages has increased exponentially across India, regardless of income-level or rural-urban settings. Doctors have been warning that this paradigm shift in diets is a leading cause of India's rising diabetes and cardiovascular disease burden. Termed ‘Indian Nutrition Rating’ (INR), the recently published draft regulation for a front-of-pack nutrition label (FOPLI) is based on a ‘star rating’ system, which experts across the world have rated as least effective in achieving health benefits. For over a year, leading doctors of India, including paediatricians, endocrinologists and cardiologists from institutes of national importance, have urged that clear warnings on the front of food and beverage packets should be a priority for India if it were to avert a

Google Chrome updates to undergo another layer of testing before release

Washington : American tech conglomerate Google is changing the release cycle for the next update of its Chrome web browser, the company recently announced in a blog post. According to The Verge, an American technology news website, for a small set of users, the company has added a new early preview of updates available via the Stable channel starting in February 2023. Before Google rolls out the update to the wider public, the early stable release will be available one week before the scheduled stable release date to address any reported issues. Chrome's release cycle currently pushes updates to the Google Chrome Canary channel first (an experimental version of the browser used for testing unstable code), then to the Dev, Beta, and Stable channels, in that order, reported The Verge. The new early stable release sits between the Beta channel testing and the final stable release and is intended to uncover issues that slipped through other testing phases. Google Chrome v110 will be the first version of the browser to follow the new release schedule. Chrome v110 is already available in both Canary and Dev channels and will be released for Beta on January 12 before pushing to the early stable version on February 1, which is the original stable release date. As per The Verge, the full stable release for Chrome v110 is now scheduled for February 7, 2023.

Twitter Blue allows video uploads up to 2 GB in size, 60 minutes in length

Los Angeles: Twitter shared excellent news in store for the many video creators on the platform. With the release of 'Twitter Blue', the microblogging site updated a number of features to 'improve the experience' for users, including one allowing 'longer video upload'. "Share more content with your followers. Twitter Blue subscribers can upload videos up to ~60 minutes long up to 2GB file size (1080p) (web only)," a message on Twitter Blue's official page read. Before the update, subscribers of the service could only upload videos up to 512 MB in size and 10 minutes in length at 1080p resolution on the microblogging platform, as per a report by US-based Tech portal, TechCrunch. The limit is still applicable if users access Twitter from iOS or Android. Earlier, Twitter started rolling out view count for tweets, a feature that shows how many people have viewed a particular tweet. Announcing this new feature in a tweet, Elon Musk wrote, "Twitter is rolling out View Count, so you can see how many times a tweet has been seen! This is normal for video." However, not every tweet will have a visible view count, according to a Twitter FAQ. The exceptions include Community tweets, Twitter Circle tweets, and "older" tweets because the data for them won't isn't available. "Anyone who views your Tweet counts as a view, regardless of where they see your Tweet (e.g. Home, Search, Profiles, Tweets embedded in articles, etc.) or whether or not they follow you. Even an author looking at their own Tweet counts as a view," Twitter clarified.Further, viewing a tweet from the web and then looking at it on the phone would count as two separate views. Also, these views will be visible to everyone, not just the owner of the account.

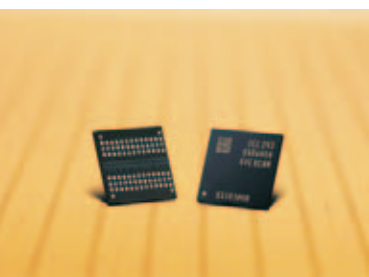

The Cabinet Minister said that under this project, wet and dry waste would be collected separately from the city by using this machinery, so that the risk of diseases and odors coming from the dumps could be minimized. He said that with this amount, a trommel machine worth Rs. 30 lakh, a ditch machine worth Rs. 26 lakh, cleaning machines like three hydraulic trolleys would be purchased at a cost of 30 lakhs to ensure proper waste management. The garbage collected can be



treated daily. He instructed the officials that the entire process of procurement of machinery should be carried out in a transparent manner. He said that the Punjab government is committed to provide standard and excellent facilities to the people in all areas and for this necessary efforts are being made on a large scale. Cabinet Minister Aman Arora said that under this project, rickshaws

and other equipment would be procured for the collection of wet and dry waste, as well as collecting sanitary waste and other waste from houses. He added that along with this, a machine will be purchased to eliminate garbage heaps from the city, with the help of which things like compost and plastic or glass can be separated. Arora said that with this, where the fertilizer can be extracted from the waste and sold,

the plastic can be sent to the relevant industries for the recycling. 
