Four terrorists killed in Jammu encounter; arms, ammo seized

Security forces on Wednesday morning have neutralised four terrorists engaged in a fierce gun battle in Sidhra area here in the city outskirts. "Four terrorists have been killed in an encounter in Sidhra area," said a senior police officer. He said that seven Ak-47 rifles, one M4 rifle, three pistols along with other ammunition were recovered from the encounter site. The truck owner is yet to be identified, he said adding, "truck was going from Jammu towards Srinagar while the searches are on." Earlier, Mukesh Singh, Additional Director General of Police Jammu Zone had said that in view of the Republic Day, border grid was already



strengthened and the movement of heavy vehicles especially the trucks have a fixed timing to move on the highway.

"The movement of one truck on Sidhra-Narwal bye pass was found to be unusual by the security personnel after which it was followed by the

QRT and was stopped at the check point on fourth bridge at Sidhra," said Singh. He said that the driver of the truck managed to flee but when the security personnel when frisked the vehicle, they were fired upon, which was effectively retaliated and encounter started. The terrorist were heavily armed, he added. The truck in which the terrorists were hiding, was set ablaze thus eliminating all the terrorists. Police said that large quantity arms and ammunition has also been found while the identities and outfit of neutralised terrorists are being ascertained. Notably, few days ago, a grenade blast was also took place near Sidhra bridge.

UGC 7th pay commission implemented for college teachers in Punjab

Giving importance to the education sector is the top priority of the Punjab government under the leadership of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann. In the higher education sector, the government fulfilled the demand of teachers of colleges and universities which was pending for the last six years. Higher Education and Languages Minister Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer said that in the very first year, the Bhagwant Mann government took a big step to implement the UGC 7th Pay Commission for teachers of colleges and universities in Punjab. With this decision implemented in the month of October, teachers will get a financial benefit of Rs. 280 Cr from the government exchequer. Along with this, the salaries of the guest faculty and part-time teachers working in the



colleges were increased and they were given various types of holidays. In order to give due respect to the Punjabi language, the month of November dedicated to Punjabi mother tongue was celebrated as Punjabi Month by the Language Department. During this month, in a state-level function at Amritsar, Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann took a major decision and announced to give top priority to Punjabi language on all boards till February 21, 2023 across the state. On any gov-

ernment, private or other board, Punjabi language must be written at the top, after that any language can be written. Penalties will be imposed for non-compliance with these orders after International Mother Language Day, on February 21. Prizes were given to the authors selected for the best books at Bhasha Bhawan, in the beginning of Punjabi month. Apart from this, events dedicated to great literary figures were organized throughout the month.

PM Modi reaches hospital to meet ailing mother

AHMEDABAD: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday arrived at the UN Mehta Institute of Cardiology and Research Centre in Ahmedabad where his mother Heeraben Modi is admitted. As per the hospital, her health condition is stable. Heeraben Modi was admitted to the hospital earlier in the day and her condition is reported to be stable. The hospital in a statement said, "Heeraben Modi, mother of Prime Minister Narendra Modi is admitted at UN Mehta Institute of Cardiology & Research Centre in Ahmedabad and her health condition is stable." Ahead of the recently held Gujarat assembly polls, the prime minister during campaigning had visited his mother who turned 100 this June. Heeraben had also cast her vote in the second phase of the Gujarat Assembly polls.

Anil Deshmukh released from Jail

MUMBAI: Former Maharashtra minister Anil Deshmukh was given a hero's welcome by his supporters as he was released from Mumbai's Arthur Road jail today after more than a year's incarceration. The 72-year-old was accused in a corruption case registered by the Central Bureau of Investigation or the CBI. Mr Deshmukh was given bail by the Bombay High Court on December 12, but the judge put a freeze on the order for 10 days as the CBI sought time to challenge it in the Supreme Court. The agency has gone to the top court, but its appeal can be heard only after the court reopens in January after the winter vacation. Earlier, the top court had refused to interfere with the bail granted to him by the Bombay High Court in a money laundering case.

Next 40 days crucial as India may see Covid cases surge in mid-January

The next 40 days will be crucial as India may see a surge of COVID cases in mid of January, said Union Health Ministry sources on Wednesday. The sources said the assessment had been made after analysing the previous trends of the COVID surge the country experienced. As there have been reports of a surge in COVID cases in some countries, the operational readiness of health facilities is being reviewed in all States and Union Territories in case of another wave. Notably, two passengers coming from Dubai tested positive for the COVID infection at Chennai airport on Wednesday.



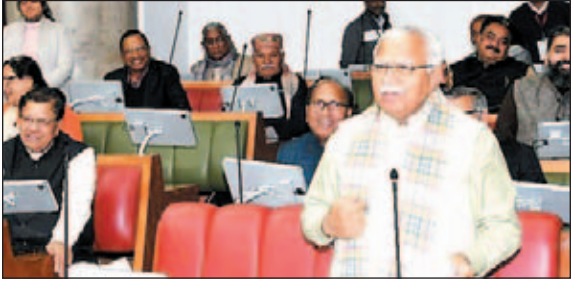
Five of a family charred to death in Mau

"Recently Chandni (14), daughter of Guddi's sister, also started living with them. Late on Tuesday night their thatched house caught fire in which all five were charred to death," they said. ICICI bank-Videocon Loan Fraud Case: CBI custody of Chanda Kochhar, Venugopal Dhoot extended NEW DELHI: The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) court on Wednesday granted two days more of custody to the CBI of three accused -Chanda Kochhar, Deepak Kochhar and Venugopal Dhoot- in the alleged ICICI bank-Videocon money laundering case. In the alleged fraud case, CBI had sought custody of Videocon chairman Venugopal Dhoot, Former Managing Director and CEO of ICICI bank Chanda Kochhar and her husband Deepak Kochhar. On Tuesday, the Vacation Bench of Bombay High Court refused any interim relief to the Kochhar couple and asked the petitioners to approach a regular bench when the court reopens after the Christmas-New Year holidays.

Opposition misleading people over debt issue: Manohar Lal

Taking a dig at the Leader of Opposition for making the wrong statement about the state government having high debt, Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal said that the statement of the Leader of Opposition was beyond facts. Citing the 2021-22 report of the CAG, the Leader of Opposition said that the state has a debt of more than Rs 4,15,000 crore; while in reality the amount of debt on Haryana in 2021-22 has been shown at Rs 2,39,000 crore in the CAG report. A debt of Rs 2, 27,697 crores is recorded in the account books of the



Haryana government. If the difference of this amount is also taken out, then only a difference of Rs 12,000 crore is visible; but the state does not have a debt of Rs 4,15,000 crore in any respect. The Chief Minister said that the state's debt position

should always be disclosed correctly and the facts placed before the House should be correct. The Chief Minister, who also holds the portfolio of the Finance department, apprised the House that the state's economic condition was better than other states.

4 bills passed on third day of winter session of Hry VS

CHANDIGARH: A total of 4 bills were passed today on the third day of the winter session of Haryana Vidhan Sabha. The bills passed include the Haryana Sikh Gurdwaras (Management) Amendment Bill, 2022, the Haryana Municipal Corporation (Second Amendment) Bill, 2022 and the Haryana Municipal (Second Amendment) Bill, 2022 and the Haryana Appropriation (No. 4) Bill, 2022.

Haryana Sikh Gurdwaras (Management) Amendment Bill, 2022: Haryana Sikh Gurdwaras (Management) Amendment Bill, 2022 has been passed to further amend the Haryana Sikh Gurdwaras (Management) Act, 2014.

Under this, new provision shall be substituted for the existing proviso to sub-section (8) in section 16 of the Haryana Sikh Gurdwaras (Management) Act, 2014.

According to this, all the forty one members so nominated by the Government shall elect their President, Senior Vice President, Junior Vice President, General Secretary, Joint Secretary and six members, who shall be the members of the Executive Board of the Committee in its first meeting to be convened and presided over by the officer appointed by the Government. The adhoc committee and the Executive Board shall cease to exist after the formation of a new Executive Committee. After the newly elected Haryana Gurdwaras Management Committee assumes charge, the adhoc committee will hand over the charge to the newly elected committee.

Provided that if elections are not held under



section 11 within a period of eighteen months, a new adhoc committee shall be nominated by the Government for a further period of eighteen months or until the elections are held, whichever is earlier. After the newly elected Haryana Gurdwaras Management Committee assumes charge, the ad-hoc committee will hand over the charge to the newly elected committee.

A new sub-section (9) shall be inserted after sub-section (8) of the Act. Accordingly, the government may nominate one member of the committee or ad-hoc committee as the patron, who shall be a member of

the elected executive board.

The Haryana Municipal Corporation (Second Amendment) Bill, 2022 The Haryana Municipal Corporation (Second Amendment) Bill, 2022 has been passed to amend the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994.

Section-2 and section-346 of Haryana Act-16 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 have been amended. 'Core area' means the built-up area within the municipal limits planned or developed fifty years before the coming into force of this Amendment Act and which due to urbanisation and efflux of time

required replanning of land use and also includes built-up area of village abadi; which has been included in the city limits, later.

As amended, the Director, not later than six months from the date of declaration under sub-section (1) or within such further period as the Government may allow, indicating the controlled area and including the terms and conditions proposed to be implemented in the controlled area and prepare plans showing the nature of the plan and submit it to the government. But mixed land use shall be permitted in the core area subject to planning norms and payment and recovery of charges as notified by the Government.

The Municipal Limits Act, 1994 provides provisions to notify controlled area in and around the municipal limits. In addition, there is also a provision for declaration of controlled areas under the Punjab Scheduled Roads and Controlled Areas 'Restriction of Unregulated Development Act, 1963' and publication of development plans for such controlled areas to regulate haphazard development around municipalities. The area within the municipality city is governed and regulated by the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994. Controlled areas notified under the provisions of the Act of 1963 and proposals for development plans have been adopted under the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 in the municipal limits for the purpose of integrated planning of the area.

Proper arrangement of medical facilities by health department In Shahidi Jod Mel: Chetan Singh

Making optimum use of the internet to provide hassle-free services to people at their doorsteps, Punjab Housing and Urban Development (H&UD) Department has adopted a new mantra to bring far more efficiently while ensuring time-bound services to the people in a transparent manner.

The creation of a robust online system is among the various people-centric initiatives taken by the Housing & Urban Development Minister Mr. Aman Arora in 2022, to live up to the promise made by Chief Minister S. Bhagwant Mann to provide an honest and transparent model of governance. The single portal designed by the H&UD offers numerous services including regularization of plots and buildings, Change of ownership, and procuring NOCs, etc at a click, that too in a mandated timeline. Earlier, an applicant had to make nu-



merous rounds to the government offices to get these basic services done. Giving a major reprieve to the people who bought properties in unauthorized colonies, the H&UD department has introduced a facility for on-line submission and processing of applications on the regularization portal www.punjabregularization.in for obtaining NOC. Further, the timeline for issuance of NOCs has also been reduced to 15 working days from the earlier stipulated period of 21 days to ensure quick and timely disposal of applications. Pertinently, this facility of regularization

could be availed only by those allottees/residents whose properties fall under the unauthorized colonies developed before March 19, 2018. Earlier, the applications were processed offline so the applicants had to wait a long time for getting issued the NOC. Now, the portal extends a large number of facilities such as on-line submission of applications, on-line payment, status checking of applications, and online disposal of the same.

This one single portal is designed for the regularization of plots and buildings falling within MC and outside the MC area for quick disposal of applications. To fix accountability in the functioning and ensure all the services in time bound manner. In first, the H&UD department has also made digitally signed permissions accessible to the owners of their properties, thereby bringing in 100 percent transparency in the functioning of the department, which will further create a mechanism that peo-

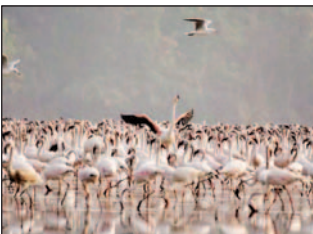

birds reach Wildlife

With the arrival of winter, water-dependent foreign birds have started camping in the Pong Dam Wildlife Sanctuary in district Kangra. As of now, more than 53 thousand foreign birds have reached the Pong Dam Wildlife Sanctuary. Apart from this, more than 7.5 thousand local birds have also reached the sanctuary area. Most of the exotic birds can be seen from Buhal Khad to Chatta Watch, while the maximum number of local birds can be seen from Dehra Bridge to Dada Khad. Due to snowfall in many countries in winter, exotic birds in search of food are grebes, cormorants and darters, herons, egrets and bitterns, storks, geese and ducks, rallus, gallinules and coots, shorebirds and waders in Pong Dam Wildlife Sanctuary. Gulls, Terns and Skimmers, Hawks, Eagles,



Osprey and Falcons, Wagtails and Pipits, Larks, Beau Throt, Malkoha, Kestrel and Hobie are major species of exotic birds that have arrived. While other species of these species have also reached here. Apart from this, more than 60 local species of birds have also come to the sanctuary area these days. In the Pong Dam Wildlife Sanctuary, Jwali, Nagrota Suriyan, Bhatoli Fakoriyan, Dehra, Dhameta Beet, Pong Dam Beet, Sansarpur Terrace Beet, Dadasiba Beet are prominent, where birds found in foreign and other states of the country reach.

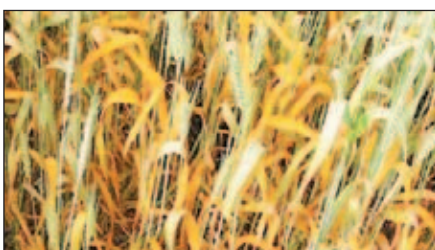

Agriculture department alert on
yellow rust problem in wheat crop

At the end of the month of December, the Agriculture Department has formed teams, gearing up for the problem of yellow rust in the wheat crop. Not only this, the Agriculture Department has identified those areas as hotspots every year where the problem of yellow rust comes up. When cases of yellow rust come to the fore, the teams of the department first check the hotspots only. According to the Agriculture Department, yellow rust which is a fungus is a national problem. This disease is also found in district Kangra, Una and other districts. Joint teams are formed at the district level by the department to make the farmers aware on time. Agriculture Officer, scientists from Rice and Wheat Research Center Malan have also been included in these teams. Mostly this yellow rust disease starts in late December. Wheat plants emerge, there is moisture in the fields, if there are particles of disease, they infect the plants and turmeric-like powder appears on the leaves. Farmers can easily feel it, this is the symptom of yellow rust. Where good quality wheat seed is sown, this type of problem does not arise. According to Dr. Ashok Kumar, senior expert of Agriculture Department, some hot spots have been identified in district Kangra regarding



yellow rust, where this disease occurs every year. The Agriculture Department team first checks the hotspots. Symptoms of yellow rust can be seen in Bagdu-Puhada area in Rait block, if old variety is planted. Bauhan Bhati is also a hotspot near Jwalaji. There is a hotspot in Ghalore Chaniyara in Dehra block. There are some yellow rust hotspots in Paragur as well. He said that if symptoms of yellow rust are seen in the wheat crop, then farmers should spray 200 ml propiconazole 25 EC medicine mixed with 200 liters of water per acre in clear weather. If there is effect of one spray, then second spray should be done after 15 days. He told that in view of the problem of yellow rust coming to the fore at the end of December, hotspots have been identified by the department where yellow rust disease occurs every year. The department has also constituted teams to make people aware about it.

Dense fog in North India causes massive flight disruptions

As many as 100 flights have been disrupted in Delhi alone as the city continues to reel under severe cold conditions with a thick layer of fog over it again on Wednesday.

"Due to bad weather (fog) for three days, over 100 flights are reported delayed from and to Delhi airport, some have also been diverted to the nearest airport," a Delhi airport official told ANI. Even as the congestion at the airport in New Delhi was being tackled amid a busy year-end holiday season, the problems of air travellers increased once more with dense fog covering most parts of north India.

Poor visibility affecting the northern parts of the country over the past few days, once again disrupted flight movement on Wednesday.



According to the Delhi airport official, another reason for the delay in flights is that some airlines have not deployed their CAT-III-compliant pilots yet.

Delhi International Airport Limited (DIAL) advised passengers on Tuesday to check their flight status with the airline concerned as flight operations at Delhi airport was only for CAT-III compliant ones.

"While landing and take-offs are continuing at Delhi airport, flights that are not CAT-III compliant may get affected. Passengers are requested to contact the airline concerned for the updated flight information," DIAL said.

CAT-III Instrument Landing System (ILS) allows flights to land safely in low visibility. CAT III-B ILS allows aircraft to land with a runway visual range

(RVR) of up to 50m with a decision height of 15m.

According to Flight Information Display System (FIDS) at Delhi airport over 18 flights status are delayed till 12:00 Hrs which majorly operating in north India's airport from Delhi, however arrivals flights are showing on time.

Flight services were affected at West Bengal's Bagdogra airport for around six hours on Tuesday as dense fog reduced visibility. The disruption caused inconvenience to hundreds of passengers.

On Tuesday, Vistara, SpiceJet, IndiGo expressed regret for the delay and diversion.

"Early morning Fog at Delhi has caused massive delays across the network. We're trying our best to minimize the inconvenience caused..." IndiGo said on Tuesday.

Spectral season

Marilyn Monroe had once compared life to a sweater. If Monroedi, by a quirk of history, had been born in this part of the world, she may have tweaked her quote and said, instead, that life is a bit like the monkey-cap, the Bengali's reliable, metaphorical igloo to stave off winter, which has set in — apparently. In spite of the mirth that is generated in the rest of India by the sight of Bengal arming its men and, at times, even ladies with the monkey-cap, a cursory look at history would reveal a certain wisdom in this sartorial choice. This piece of attire, the claim goes, is a close cousin of the balaclava, which derived its identity from the knitted headgear worn by British troops in the Battle of Balaclava. To the Bengali — shivering — soul, what could be a more honourable endeavour than a battle against the cold in the land of sun and sweat? Freud may have chuckled at this invocation of a bloody, martial history: for it could be a wily strategy on the part of the Bengali's subconscious given the stigma he has had to bear, all through the raj, of being a rather effete race.

But could it be that the monkey-tupi is now battling an even more formidable adversary? Bengal's winter, much like hemanta — the pre-winter — faces an existential threat in the Anthropocene. Data bear out the severity of the crisis. Writing in Firstpost, Chirag Dhara, a climate physicist, referred to meteorological figures to suggest that temperatures in and around Calcutta have witnessed a rise of 1.2 degree Celsius in the last 170 years; the clearest signifiers of the city's changing climate are its milder — fleeting — winters and scorching summers.

Indeed, at the time of writing, the minimum temperature has dropped below 13 degree Celsius just once in Calcutta this winter. Yet, the monkey-cap, comforters, shawls, scarves, jackets, sweaters members of the Woollen Tribe — have not exactly disappeared from the city. Is this because of that unique, albeit comical, Bengali ability to imagine the season even though winter is, today, a pale shadow of its former self? However localised, this cultural reflex action, which enables a collective to conjure up a season in its absence, deserves interrogation. For it introduces a fascinating layer to the unfolding discourse on climate change.

The world over, the climate crisis is synonymous with a grudging recognition of the failure of human imagination. Or what Rob Hopkins calls "imaginative poverty" in his book, From What Is to What If: Unleashing the Power of Imagination to Create the Future We Want.

China relocates Tibet's nomads in garb of ecological conservation

In the 38th session of the National People's Congress (NCP) Chinese government put a draft law on the ecological conversation of Tibet for consideration. Although, in reality, the law has been made to relocate Tibetan nomads from their lands, all the while accusing them of degradation and deforestation, when in reality they have been the managers and keepers of these lands for ages, according to a report by Tibet Rights Collective (TRC) a Delhi-based advocacy and policy research institute.

In the name of restoring the landscape of Tibet and for grassland preservation, China has been forcibly resettling nomads. In 2017 a policy was announced under which vast areas of Tibet were turned into National Parks. Although for this more than 1000 Tibetan were displaced from their lands in north Tibet in 2018 which China named "high-altitude ecological migration".

The draft law according to Tibetologist Gabriel Laffite seeks to displace more Tibetan nomads from their landscapes but does not stop mining. "In the name of ecological restoration, Tibetans are further demobilized, made to stay put in new border villages, under surveillance".

Ironically the Chinese legislation mentions that it is important to relocate Tibetan pastoralists from pastures because they are responsible for the degradation and desertification of the Tibetan landscape. Although this overlooks the role that they play in maintaining and protecting Tibet's ecosystem.

According to Laffite the draft law passed by China "is a fantasy of perfect management, perfect risk control, perfect imposition of human will, a nationalization and Sinicization of Tibetan land-



scapes by a nation-state empowered by legislation to remove the Tibetan pastoralists and thus restore nature, under the vigilant gaze of the party-state".

The TRC report further says that there were no productive consultations with key stakeholders while drafting this law. This is not the first time that the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) is greenwashing its crimes in Tibet. China since 2006 has imposed relocation plans for

the nomadic population of Tibet as the Chineses authorities have viewed them as backward, ignorant, and irrational and have been overgrazing the lands causing damage to Tibet, according to the TRC report.

The TRC report further says that this relocation and change in the Tibet plateau must be considered with caution as Tibet is a land that plays a central role in the climate change scenario today. It is

the home of many rivers that feed the Asiatic continent and has been named the third pole of the world for its ecological significance. That is why recent floods draughts and other calamities cannot be ignored. All the uncontrolled construction of dual-use infrastructure, hydro dams, and over-tourism have disturbed the fragile ecosystem accelerating the impacts of global warming in Tibet, the TRC report points out.

Apple's Japan unit gets USD 105 million tax bill for bulk sale of iPhones to tourists

The Tokyo unit of US technology giant Apple has been slapped with USD 105 million (14 billion yen) in additional taxes over bulk duty-free sales of iPhone smartphones and other Apple devices to foreign visitors, Kyodo News reported.

Citing a source close to the matter Kyodo News reported that the Tokyo Regional Taxation Bureau found Apple Japan's approximately USD 1,04,16,84,000 (140 billion yen) tax-exempt sales for two years through September 2021 were made by fraudulent duty-free purchases to be resold for commercial purposes.

The taxation bureau, which began its investigation last year, found multiple unusual transactions, including a tourist purchasing several hundred devices at an Apple store, the Japanese news agency reported.

The additional tax of USD 105 million (14 billion yen) imposed on underreported sales, is believed to be the highest additional consumption tax charged on record for tax-free sales, as per the news report.



Only foreign visitors who purchase souvenirs or daily goods within six months of arriving in Japan to take them abroad can do tax-free shopping.

The products are subject to taxation if they are bought to resell, as per the Kyodo News report. However, the stores need to assess the nature of purchases.

Certain goods like iPhones are said to be cheaper in Japan than in other nations. The tax bureau suspects vendors want to take advantage of Japan's duty-free system by soliciting visitors to Japan to buy the products and then sell them abroad for profit, according to the news report.

Saudi Arabia's first certified yoga teacher brings yoga to delegates

Delegates from 11 Arab countries took part in a workshop organized by the Saudi Yoga Committee in Jeddah as part of the 'Arab Youth Empowerment Program' organized by the Ministry of Sports that started on December 22 and will continue until December 30, 2022.

Arab countries like UAE, Oman, Yemen, Palestine, Egypt, Libya, Alegria, Morocco, Tunisia and Mauritania participated in the event. The program aims to introduce the Arab youth delegations to the sporting, cultural and recreational developments in the region, including yoga.

Nouf Marwaai, the first certified yoga teacher in Saudi Arabia and a Padma Shri Awardee who is also the head of the committee said that she wants everybody to have access to this practice to enhance the quality of their life and how Yoga is needed amidst today's World challenges that could bring a message of peace between the nations. "First I really thank the Ministry of Sports for this opportunity to introduce our Arab brothers and sister to this beautiful art for their health & well-being physically and mentally. I think we tried to answer all the questions they need to know to start promoting yoga in their societies and to understand the benefits of practising



yoga for enhancing the quality of life and fighting depression as we included scientific studies findings about yoga and quality of life and depression," Nouf Marwaai said. 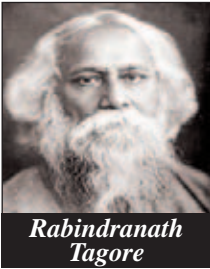

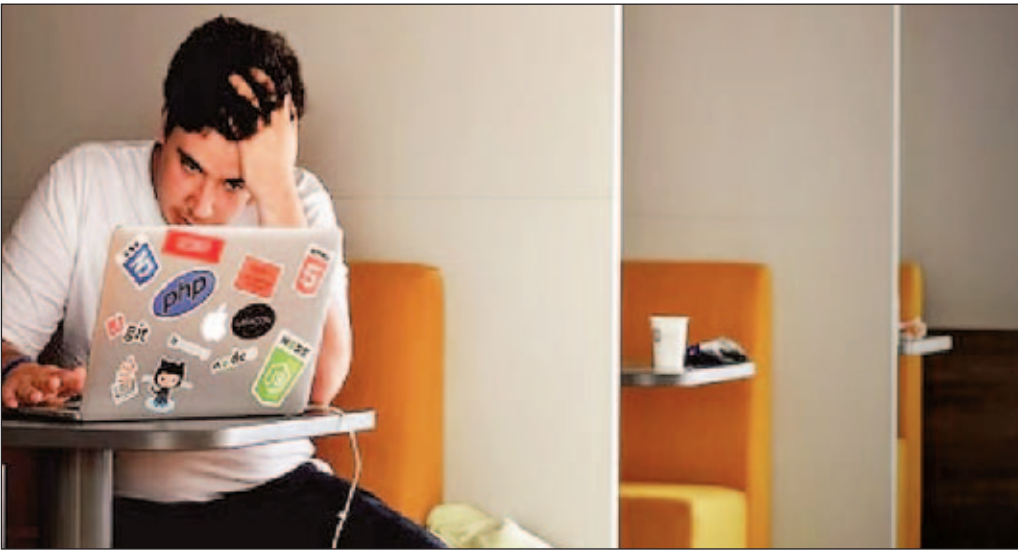


Study finds stress accelerates immune aging

Stress in the form of traumatic events, job strain, everyday stressors and discrimination, accelerates aging of the immune system, potentially increasing a person's risk of cancer, cardiovascular disease and illness from infections such as COVID-19, according to a new USC study.

The research, published June 13 in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences (PNAS), could help explain disparities in age-related health, including the unequal toll of the pandemic, and identify possible points for intervention.

"As the world's population of older adults increases, understanding disparities in age-related health is essential. Age-related changes in the immune system play a critical role in declining health," said lead study author Eric Klopach, a postdoctoral scholar in the USC Leonard Davis School of Gerontology. "This study helps clarify mechanisms involved in



accelerated immune aging." As people age, the immune system naturally begins a dramatic downgrade, a condition called immunosenescence. With advanced age, a person's immune profile weakens, and includes too many worn-out white blood cells circulating and too few

fresh, "naive" white blood cells ready to take on new invaders.

Immune aging is associated not only with cancer, but with cardiovascular disease, increased risk of pneumonia, reduced efficacy of vaccines and organ system aging. But what accounts for drastic health dif-

ferences in same-age adults? USC researchers decided to see if they could tease out a connection between lifetime exposure to stress -- a known contributor to poor health -- and declining vigor in the immune system. They queried and cross-referenced enormous data sets from

University of Michigan's Health and Retirement Study, a national longitudinal study of the economic, health, marital, family status, and public and private support systems of older Americans. To calculate exposure to various forms of social stress, the researchers analyzed responses from a national sample of 5,744 adults over the age of 50. They answered a questionnaire designed to assess respondents' experiences with social stress, including stressful life events, chronic stress, everyday discrimination and lifetime discrimination. Blood samples from the participants were then analyzed through flow cytometry, a lab technique that counts and classifies blood cells as they pass one-by-one in a narrow stream in front of a laser. As expected, people with higher stress scores had older-seeming immune profiles, with lower percentages of fresh disease fighters and higher percentages of worn-out white blood cells. The association between stress-

ful life events and fewer ready to respond, or naive, T cells remained strong even after controlling for education, smoking, drinking, BMI and race or ethnicity.

Some sources of stress may be impossible to control, but the researchers say there may be a workaround. T-cells -- a critical component of immunity -- mature in a gland called the thymus, which sits just in front of and above the heart. As people age, the tissue in their thymus shrinks and is replaced by fatty tissue, resulting in reduced production of immune cells. Past research suggests that this process is accelerated by lifestyle factors like poor diet and low exercise, which are both associated with social stress. "In this study, after statistically controlling for poor diet and low exercise, the connection between stress and accelerated immune aging wasn't as strong," said Klopach. "What this means is people who experience more stress tend to have

poorer diet and exercise habits, partly explaining why they have more accelerated immune aging."

Improving diet and exercise behaviors in older adults may help offset the immune aging associated with stress.

Additionally, cytomegalovirus (CMV) may be a target for intervention. CMV is a common, usually asymptomatic virus in humans and is known to have a strong effect accelerating immune aging. Like shingles or cold sores, CMV is dormant most of the time but can flare up, especially when a person is experiencing high stress.

In this study, statistically controlling for CMV positivity also reduced the connection between stress and accelerated immune aging. Therefore, widespread CMV vaccination could be a relatively simple and potentially powerful intervention that could reduce the immune aging effects of stress, the researchers said.

2 out of 5 honey brands fail ‘NMR purity test’ facilitated by The Association of Consumer Protection (ACP)



New Delhi: The Association of Consumer Protection (ACP), an association of non-profit consumer organizations that is registered under NITI Aayog, Govt. of India to advance consumer interest through research, advocacy, education, and protection facilitated a study to conduct an investigation of adulteration of Honey in India. Honey samples of major brands were sent to five national and international laboratories and the results of the 'purity tests' were declared today at a press conference held in Delhi. Various samples of honey brands were sent to a renowned food testing laboratory in Germany (ILAC-MRA accredited), besides national laboratories like AES Laboratories (P) Ltd. (NABL and FSSAI notified lab), Noida, Uttar Pradesh, India; State Govt. Food Lab, Meerut, (Food Safety and Drug Administration, Uttar Pradesh, India); State Govt. Food Lab, Agra (Food Safety and Drug Administration, Uttar Pradesh, India); and Forest Lab, Delhi, India. Sealed samples of NMR-Certified brands Saffola, Dr. Morepen, Zandu Pure Honey, Nature's Nectar and Dalmia were sent to the German lab for Nuclear Magnetic Resonance (NMR) profiling. Samples of 2 out of these 5 brands were found to be adulterated in NMR testing. Zandu Pure Honey and Saffola honey were found to have added sugar syrup in honey, which they claim to be pure! 18 samples were also sent to four national laboratories for testing under key quality and adulteration parameters as per FSSAI. 6 out of these 18 samples of various brands were found adulterated or misbranded by FSSAI Standards.

Study identifies new cause of melting Antarctic ice shelves

Norwich (England):Researchers have identified a technique that may aid in the Antarctic ice shelves' melting.

A multinational team of scientists discovered that the instability of one ice shelf might affect others downstream. The study, which was conducted by the University of East Anglia in the UK, also found that the Thwaites Ice Shelf's proximity to a small ocean gyre, or system of circulating ocean currents, can affect how much meltwater flows beneath it. More warm water can enter the areas below the ice shelf when the gyre is weaker, which causes the ice shelf to melt.

The Thwaites Ice Shelf is one of the biggest ice shelves in West Antarctica and buttresses the eastern side of the Thwaites Glacier, which has been retreating rapidly over the last 20 years and is the largest contributor to global sea-level rise among Antarctic glaciers. Using a unique dataset collected by sensors installed beneath the Thwaites Ice Shelf -- which has also thinned and weakened significantly in recent decades -- the researchers observed that the shallow layers of the ocean underneath it warmed considerably during the period from January 2020 to March 2021. Most of this warming was driven by waters with a high volume of glacial meltwater originating from the Pine Island Ice Shelf, further east, flowing into the area beneath the Thwaites Ice Shelf. The glacial meltwater mixes with saltwater when the ocean melts the base of ice shelves and can form a buoyant layer of water that is warmer than the surrounding waters. This lighter, relatively fresher and warmer water brings heat that melts the base of the Thwaites Ice Shelf. Lead author Dr Tiago Dotto, of the



Centre for Ocean and Atmospheric Sciences at UEA, said, "We have identified another process that could impact the stability of ice shelves, revealing the importance of local ocean circulation and sea ice." "Circumpolar Deep Water, a warm variety of Antarctic waters, is a key player in melting the base of ice shelves. However, in this study, we show that a great amount of heat at shallow layers beneath one ice shelf can be provided by waters originating from other melting ice shelves nearby. Therefore, what happens to one ice shelf, can impact the adjacent ice shelf, and so on," he said. "This process is important for regions of high ice shelf melting such as the Amundsen Sea because one ice shelf sits next to the other, and the export of heat from one ice shelf can reach the next one through the ocean circulation," he added. Dr Dotto added, "These atmosphere-sea-ice-ocean interactions are important because they can prolong warm periods beneath ice shelves by allowing warm and meltwater-enriched water to enter adjacent ice-shelf cavities."

No License, No Music this New Year

Jalandhar : In a series of orders issued against individual establishments in December 2022, the Bombay High Court has restrained the use of copyright-protected sound recordings of Phonographic Performance Ltd. (PPL) without license by hundreds of popular commercial establishments like Hotels, Resorts, Lounges, Pubs, Clubs, Bars etc. such as Xeco Media LLP (Discover Resorts), Digi1 Electronics, The Bar Stock Exchange, Snow World Entertainment, Adyar Gate Hotels, Byke Hospitality, Siddhivinayak Hospitality, FMI Hospitality, Sai Silks (Kalamandir), Ambuja Neotia Holdings, GRT Hotels and Resorts and their outlets across the country.

The recent court orders assume great significance, as the order applies to all usage of music including ones being played in public places on New Year's Eve, Christmas, and any other events or in the background throughout the year. The eighty-year-old establishment PPL India is a music licensing company that control/ owns on ground performance rights of more than 350 music labels controlling over 4 million domestic and international sound recordings in several languages like Hindi, English, Punjabi, Tamil, Telugu, Kannada, Haryanvi, Bhojpuri, etc. It controls rights for on ground usage of recorded songs of some of the biggest record labels, such as Aditya Music, Ananda Audio, Divo, Diljit Dosanjh, Lahari Music, Saregama, Sony Music, Sonetok, T-Series, Times Music, Universal Music, Warner Music, and many more. The commercial establishments are required to obtain two types of licenses, one for playing Copyrighted songs in background in the premises throughout the year and another for events like New Year, Christmas, Valentine's Day, Holi or corporate events etc. helping people to celebrate featured usage of music.

His photo along with that of former chief minister Omprakash Chautala was also found hanging on a wall. Preliminary investigation revealed that Jagveer alias Nanha committed suicide by shooting himself with his licensed revolver, said Karmjeet Singh, station in-charge Ganaur.

Ashwin, Iyer advance in ICC Men's Test Player Rankings

DUBAI: Ravichandran Ashwin and Shreyas Iyer have made significant gains in the ICC Men's Test Player Rankings after helping India win the second match of their ICC World Test Championship (WTC) series against Bangladesh in Mirpur.

Ashwin has moved up one slot and is joint-fourth among bowlers along with Jasprit Bumrah after finishing with six wickets in the match. He has also inched up three places to 84th among batters following a crucial knock of 42 not out in the second innings that enabled a three-wicket victory and won India crucial WTC points.

Ashwin, who has been the No. 1 bowler and all-rounder in the past, has also earned seven rating points in the all-rounders' rankings, which are led by his compatriot Ravindra Jadeja. Jadeja is currently on 369 rating points while Ashwin is on 343. Iyer, who partnered in an unbroken 71-run partnership with Ashwin that steered the team to victory, has attained a career-best 16th position. Iyer's scores of 87 and 29 not out have helped him progress from 26th position, his previous best in the rankings. Rishabh Pant remains the top-ranked Indian batter in the sixth position after gaining three rating points courtesy of his score of 93 in the first innings while fast bowler Umesh Yadav has gained five places to reach the 33rd position after finishing with five wickets in the match.



Scheduled rates of PWD increased by 21.8 per cent: Dushyant

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, DEC 28

Deputy Chief Minister of Haryana, Sh. Dushyant Chautala said that the 'Haryana Scheduled Rates' of the Public Works Department has been increased by 21.18 percent after 33 years. if we compare the item by taking an average lead of 5 km in case of Earthwork, then the HSR rate in the year 1988 was Rs.170 per cubic meter which has been increased to Rs.206 per cubic meter in the year 2021.

Sh. Chautala said this in response to a question raised by a member of the House during the winter session of Haryana Vidhan Sabha here today.

The Deputy Chief Minister stated that HSR 2021 is applicable from the gazette notification issued on May 3, 2021. The nomenclature of some items in Chapter 7, 15, 17, 20, 21 and 27 has been amended vide notification dated August 6, 2021. Also, some new



items have been added to these chapters HSR. The rates have been revised after a period of 33 years in 2021 whereas the last ceiling premium on some items was revised in 2011. A General increase or decrease in rates on account of HSR 2021 as compared to HSR 1988 cannot be worked out mainly due to the reason that many new items have been included in HSR 2021. However, some tenders relating to road works, bridge works and

building works, which were invited on HSR 1988 ceiling premium before the gazette notification, and were opened after the notification. They were compared with HSR 2021 and it was found that there was a cost overrun of about 15 to 18 per cent for road works, about 19 to 21 per cent for building works and about 18 to 21 per cent for bridge works.

In case of Earthwork, if we compare the item by taking an average lead of 5 km, the rates of this as per HSR 1988 was Rs. 170/- per cum and the same item as per HSR 2021 is Rs. 206/- per cum, which is 21.18% above than the rates of HSR 1988 rates.
