**PCS officers

**CHANDIGARH:** The PCS Officers' Association on Wednesday withdrew its protest and decided to resume work immediately. The announcement was made jointly by ACS to CMA Venu Prasad and Association president Rajat Oberoi. Earlier, CM Bhagwant Mann had asked them to resume work by 2pm on Wednesday or face action. As the deadline neared, a six-member delegation of PCS Officers Association reached the CMO. Prasad said the anti-corruption drive would continue and the Association had promised that they would not shield the corrupt officers.

**Cabinet nod for a  
national level multi-  
state cooperative  
export society**

**NEW DELHI:** Union Cabinet on Wednesday approved setting up and promoting a national-level multistate cooperative export society under the Multi-State Cooperative Societies (MSCS) Act, 2002 aimed at providing thrust to exports from the cooperative sector by acting as an umbrella organisation for carrying out and promoting exports. The move will help to unlock the export potential of Indian cooperatives in global markets, said a Ministry of Cooperation statement followed by the Cabinet meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The multistate cooperative export society will be set up with support from relevant Ministries especially the Ministry of External Affairs and Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce and Industry through their export-related policies, schemes and agencies by following the 'Whole of Government Approach' for undertaking exports of all goods and services produced by cooperatives and related entities.

**HP: Sanjay Awasthi  
to look after PWD,  
Health and IP&R**

**SHIMLA:** Member of Assembly from Arki and Chief Parliamentary Secretary Sanjay Awasthi was assigned by Chief Minister Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu to look after the work of Public Works Department, Health and Information and Public Relations Department. This was stated in a order issued by Chief Secretary today. It is worthwhile to mention that Awasthi made debut in public life after winning 2022 by Election and he was also elected for another term as he win recent Assembly Election. He was considered closed to Chief minister and he has got the benefit of proximity to Sukhu who entrusted with the work of important departments due to their bonding in shortest stints in the politics. This is a big gift for Arki assembly constituency. In 1990, Nagin Chandra Pal was made a minister in the Shanta government.

## Corruption: CBI searches across 50 FCI locations; DGM arrested

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) on Wednesday conducted raids at over 50 locations in Delhi, Punjab, Haryana and Chandigarh in connection with the Food Corporation of India (FCI) scam. "CBI conducted a massive operation against the unholy nexus of corrupt officers in FCI with technical assistance and ED level officers and grains merchant, millers including food grains distributors. They are involved in supplying low-quality food grain," CBI official told. CBI has arrested Rajiv Mishra, Deputy General Manager (DGM) of FCI and is conducting raids at over 50 places

in connection with unholy nexus between FCI officers (technical assistants and ED-level officers). CBI has registered cases against around 74 people in connection with the FCI case. From technical assistants to executive directors in the FCI, the role of these officials are under the agency's scanner, according to reports. The FCI buys rice and wheat from growers every season at guaranteed prices. The operation is reportedly spread across multiple cities in Punjab, Haryana and two locations in Delhi. The report added that the agency has started the operation against an "unholy nexus of corruption" in the FCI involving a chain of officers, rice mill owners, grain merchants etc.

### ED attaches Archana Nag's house worth Rs 3.64 crore in honey trap case

**NEW DELHI:** The Enforcement Directorate has attached a house worth Rs 3.64 crore of Archana Nag, prime accused in an alleged sextortion case of Odisha, under the anti-money laundering law, the federal agency said on Wednesday. "A luxurious house of the prime accused Archana Nag worth Rs 3.64 crore has been attached in connection with ongoing money laundering investigation into the high-profile sextortion racket being run in and around the city of Bhubaneswar," the agency said in a statement. The ED said the state police complaint states that the lady blackmailer namely Archana Nag, and her husband (Chand) with the assistance of Shradhanjali Behera and Khageswar Patra generated properties worth crores of rupees through extortion by way of honey trapping high profile and rich people.

### JCO among 3 soldiers dead after fall into Kashmir gorge


Three soldiers including a Junior Commissioned Officer were killed after they slipped into a deep gorge near Line of Control in Machil sector of Kupwara district in Jammu and Kashmir, Army said on Wednesday.

They said the incident took place last evening in a forward area during a regular operational task.

"A routine operational task was undertaken on January 10, at about 5:30 pm in the Sector, along a narrow winter track. While moving towards the forward post, snow along the narrow track broke, leading to slipping of one JCO and two Jawaans into a deep gorge," a statement issued by the Army said.

Immediately a search and rescue operation was launched with troops from the nearest post.

"In spite of adverse weather condition and rough terrain, sustained efforts of



the search party led to the recovery of mortal remains of the three brave soldiers today morning between 4:15 to 4:45 am," the statement added.

The three slain have been identified Naib Subedar Parshotam Kumar, 43, Havaladar Amrik Singh, 39 and Amit Sharma, 23.

Kumar a resident of village Majua Uttami, Bishnah Jammu in J&K had joined Army in 1996. He is survived by his wife and two children.

Hav Singh had joined Army in 2001. He belonged to Village Mandwara, Una in Himachal Pradesh. He is survived by his wife and one son.

### Haryana to introduce law to give ownership rights to Jumla Malkan, Mustraka Malkan: CM

held here today, the Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal said that a special Committee being monitored by him has been constituted to study the old laws and prepare new ones. Deputy Chief Minister, Development and Panchayat Minister, Urban Local Bodies Minister and Advocate General have also been included in this Committee, he informed. Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister Sh. J.P Dalal also remained present in the meeting.

### Uttarakhand govt announces Rs 1.5 lakh interim relief for those affected in Joshimath

The Uttarakhand government on Wednesday announced Rs 1.5 lakh interim relief to affected families who have been shifted to safer locations after land subsidence in Joshimath led to houses and establishments to develop cracks.

"Each family will be given immediate interim assistance of Rs 1.50 lakh. Apart from the two hotel buildings which are marked 'unsafe', no other building is being demolished. Till now, cracks have been noticed in 723 buildings," the Secretary to Uttarakhand chief minister R Meenakshi Sundaram said today. Cracks have appeared in 723 buildings in Joshimath town of Uttarakhand which

has been affected by land subsidence and so far 131 families have been shifted to safer locations, according to the district administration.

"We are in touch with local representatives and asked them to bring it to our notice if new cracks appear. 131 families have been shifted to relief centres," District Magistrate, Chamoli, Himanshu Khurana told a news agency. The district magistrate said that a central team will survey the damage to properties due to the land subsidence and suggest a way forward while coordinating with the local administration in relief and rescue efforts. "A team of scientists from IIT Roorkee have been asked to inspect the buildings of the affected Bahuguna Nagar of Karnprayag."

### Over 400 US flights grounded due to technical glitch

Over 400 flights across the United States have been stranded due to a major outage in the computer system of the US regulator Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) on Wednesday.

According to media reports, the flights that were severely impacted were within, into, and out of the United States.

Operations are normal at all the airports in India and as of now there is no impact on flights from India to the US amid a glitch in US Federal Aviation Administration's system, said a senior DGCA official.

However, as of now, India-US flights do not have any impact due to a glitch in the computer system of the



US regulatory body, FAA. FAA has tweeted, "The FAA is working to restore its Notice to Air Missions System. We are performing final validation checks and reloading the system now. Operations across the National Airspace System are affected. We will provide frequent updates as we make

progress." The Federal Aviation Administration stated that it is 'experiencing an outage that is impeding the update of Notice to Air Missions (NOTAMs)' and that 'all flights are unable to be released at this time' due to the enormous glitch that caused flight delays. Notably, the US Feder-

al Aviation Administration's (FAA) system that alerts pilots and other flight personnel about hazards or any changes to airport facility services and relevant procedures. Moreover, the Air Traffic Control System Command Center (ATCSCC), a part of the Federal Aviation Administration air traffic control system, located in Warrenton, Virginia also issued an advisory that the United States NOTAM system failed and since then no new amendments have been processed. "The United States NOTAM system failed at 2028Z. Since then no new NOTAMs or amendments have been processed. Technicians are currently working to restore the system and there is no estimate for restoration or service at this time," the ATCSCC advisory read.

## CS directs to issue new guidelines for farm tourism operators in State

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, JAN 11

Haryana Chief Secretary, Sh. Sanjeev Kaushal said that the state government proposes to identify Special Controlled Areas from the Tourism point of view. While presiding over the meeting of promoting tourism and homestay operations in the state, he further directed the Town and Country Planning Department to also include the representatives of Tourism Department in State and District Level Committees of the Town and Country Planning Department for preparation of development plans and declaration of Controlled Areas from a tourism point of view. Sh. Kaushal further directed the officers to issue new guidelines for farm tourism operators for the has-

sle-free registration of farm tourism houses in the state. He said that the detailed guidelines including tourism promoting activities like rural games, farm rides, agriculture, regional art and culture should also be issued to open new farm tourism houses in the state. The Chief Secretary directed the officers that a field survey should be conducted mandatory to prevent the misuse of land for the purpose of banquets, restaurants and marriage halls etc while registering the specific area to open farm houses. Sh. Kaushal further asserted that guidelines including clarity regarding the requirement of 'Change of Land Use' (CLU) from the competent revenue authority by the farm owners should also be issued as CLU is mandatory document before the registration of

opening farm tourism house in the agricultural zone. It was apprised in the meeting that to overcome impediments in the way of farm tourism operators, the state pollution control board will issue new guide lines within 15 days. It is worth mentioning that the objectives of the tourism policy of the state are to position tourism as a state priority and identify it as a growth engine for employment generation. Tourism has to be treated as a multi sectoral activity which would require effective linkages and close co - ordination with the various Departments, Boards, Corporations of the State Government like Industry, Town and Country Planning, Panchayats, Excise and Taxation and Haryana Urban Development Authority. The objective would be to brand and promote Haryana as an ideal tourist destination.

## MNREGA online portal turning disaster for laborers/ward members

Plan to mark the attendance of MGNREGA daily wage earners on the online portal NMMS launched by the central government is not going well. One, ward members of panchayats and MNREGA workers are illiterate, on the other hand, ward members do not have Android phones. Ward members of panchayats and daily wage earners of MNREGA are also unable to pay the expenses on internet. A GRS has been appointed on 4 to 5 panchayats by the development blocks, who is not able to mark attendance daily in 7 wards of 4 to 5 panchayats. In this app, it has been made mandatory to mark attendance twice in a day. From January 1, it has been made necessary for the government to mark the attendance of MNREGA

workers through the NMMS app on the online portal, but in 80% panchayats of the district, the wages of MNREGA workers have not been received through this app. The master rolls of the development works to be done under the MNREGA scheme are remaining vacant. Panchayat representatives and government employees of most panchayats are stuck in a state of confusion. The second problem is arising with the panchayat employees and public representatives that most of the ward members of the panchayats are illiterate and they do not have Android phones. No other ward member is in a position to spend Rs 300 per month to get internet pack installed. The Central Government has issued instructions to mark the attendance of laborers twice a day through the

online portal, but in most of the panchayats, the master rolls of MNREGA are remaining vacant.Panchayat representatives include Pradhan Kamal Dev, Pradhan Joginder Dev, Shakuntala Devi, Mahendra Chauhan, Rakesh Dhiman, Pradhan Ajay Sharma, Ashok Sharma, Ashok Kumar, Saroj Kumari, Swarna Singh, Suram Singh, Pradhan Kamlesh Kumari, DJ Sharma, Vijay Sharma, Ward members including Rajkumari have demanded the administration to adopt offline process as before from the state government.In this regard, development block officer Ramesh Chand was talked to then and told that complaints are coming from Panchayat representatives and employees about the problem of marking the attendance of laborers twice a day in the online portal.

18 Councillors of Kharar MC give requisition to call spl meeting for removal of President of Kharar Nagar Council

Movements have intensified to remove Kharar Municipal Council President Jaspreet Kaur Logian from her post and in this regard 18 members of the council have written a letter to the Municipal Council's Executive Officer and demanded that a Special Meeting be called to remove the present President from her post and to elect new president.

It may be recalled that there are total 27 members of Kharar Municipal Council and one member has died.

The MLAs of Kharar and Chamkaur Sahib also have the right to participate in the meeting and vote. In this way Kharar Municipal Council have total 28 members. A requisition has been

given by the elected 18 members of the Council to the Executive Officer yesterday in which they have written that they have lost their trust and confidence in the said President and they have requested that an immediate meeting be called to remove the President from her post.

Meanwhile, while acting on the letter of these members, the Executive Officer has written a letter to President Jaspreet Kaur Logian yesterday asking her to call a special meeting of the council to pass a no-confidence motion.

He has also written that according to Section 25 of the Punjab Municipal Act 1911, there is a provision to issue the agenda within 14 days of receiving the requisition. The letter of those members has also been sent

to the President for further necessary action. It may be mentioned that considering the number of existing members, 2-thirds of the members are required to remove the President, which is 19. According to the information, the President can call a meeting within 14 days and that meeting must be held within next 14 days. In this manner, this meeting must be held within 28 days. The current president belongs to Shromani Akali Dal and now most of the members have joined the AAP party. According to information, the post of president of Kharar Council is reserved for women. If the present president is removed for her post then any woman who is AAP party supporter can become the next president.


ADGP rlys shares achievements of GRP

# Telling labels

**I**n my career as a student and then as a teacher, I have filled countless forms in which I have identified my social category from a specified list of options. I have seen many others spelling out these details, picking their designated category from similar-looking lists. These usually include the same set of options, 'General', 'Scheduled Caste', 'Scheduled Tribe', 'Other Backward Classes'. In recent years, another category, 'Economically Weaker Section', a quota for unreserved groups, has been added to these seemingly sacrosanct application forms. Filling these forms is seen to be the first requisite step towards a government job in or admission to an educational institution. What is consistent in these forms is the use of the innocuous term, 'General', as a social category. The descriptor, Unreserved, is used sparingly as an alternative reference.

The word, *general*, implies what is commonplace, known, familiar — in effect, the norm. Thus, the groups that constitute the 'General' category come to regard themselves as the norm, while those that fall outside its ambit and are included in other categories get pushed outside the bounds of what is supposedly normal. 'General' thus serves a very specific purpose: it tries to conceal the gamut of privileges and unwritten advantages that identification with a high caste group can readily ensure. Correspondingly, the terms, Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe, also seek to obscure the everyday experience of living amidst entrenched social hierarchies, the ideas of purity and pollution, together with attendant vulnerabilities. Essentially, all these labels are deployed to underplay the existing iniquitous social realities, differences, and exclusions that inform Indian society and make them seem less egregious.

In official idiom, Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe appear as neutral categories, stripped off the underpinning experience of persistent marginality that forged these categories in the first place. The use of these terms is intended to obscure the meanings and wider implications of belonging to these categories and the multiple ways in which they can constrain individual life choices. Likewise, 'General' is framed as an isolated construct, seemingly disconnected from the foundational base of social differentiation and discrimination on which the pyramid of caste securely rests. This construct quietly encapsulates the privileges stemming from high-caste status, the financial, social and cultural capital they translate into, and a range of other benefits they afford.

## ***Pentagon reiterates importance of India-US defence relationship***

Pentagon on Tuesday asserted that the defence ties between India and the US are "very important." Pentagon Press Secretary Air Force Brig Gen Pat Ryder in a press briefing said, "I would say, you know, I don't have any specific announcements to make in terms of the relationship but -- but as you know, it's a very important relationship between the United States and India when it comes to security cooperation, defence cooperation. So we look forward to continuing to engage with the Indian leadership."



# ***4 million children living near contaminated floodwater in Pakistan: UNICEF***

Up to four million children are still living near contaminated and stagnant floodwaters in Pakistan, risking their survival and well-being according to UNICEF, more than four months after a national state of emergency was declared in Pakistan, the Dawn reported.

Many families in Jacobabad have little more than mere cloth to cover their temporary shelters by stagnant flood waters while temperatures have dropped to seven-degree celsius at night. UNICEF and partners have started providing items, including children's kits, and jackets to people living in mountainous areas, aiming to reach 200,000 children, women and men, as per the Dawn report.

The children continue to live near contaminated water more than four months after a national state of emergency was declared in Pakistan. Acute respiratory infections have been witnessed among children, a leading cause of child mortality



worldwide have increased in the flood-affected regions, according to Dawn. The number of cases among children suffering from severe acute malnutrition in the flood-stricken regions monitored by UNICEF nearly doubled between July to December in comparison to 2021 and estimated 1.5 million children are still in need of life-saving nutrition interventions. UNICEF's current appeal of USD 173.5 million to provide life-saving support to women and children impacted by the flood remains only 34 per cent funded, as per the Dawn report.

"Children living in Pakistan's flood-affected areas have been pushed to the brink," Dawn quoted UNICEF Representative in Pakistan Abdullah Fadil as saying. "Severe acute malnutrition, respiratory and waterborne diseases, coupled with the cold, are putting millions of young lives at risk," he added. UNICEF's health interventions have

reached nearly 1.5 million people with primary healthcare services. Furthermore, 4.5 million children have been immunised against polio in 16 flood-hit districts.

The UN agency and its partners have given more than one million people access to safe drinking water and provided hygiene kits to one million people. UNICEF will continue to respond to urgent humanitarian needs in the coming months.

On January 9, Pakistan received more than USD 9 billion to help it recover from devastating floods at the International Conference on Climate Resilient Pakistan, Dawn reported.

The international conference on Climate Resilient Pakistan was co-hosted by the United Nations and the Pakistani government in Geneva. During the conference, Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif urged the international community to support Pakistan in rebuilding after devastating floods last year.

Age and location will be the only information about a teen that the company will use to show them advertisements, which will make sure that teens see ads that are meant for their age and products and services available where they live. Moreover, starting in March, users under 18 will have more ways to manage the types of advertisements they see on Facebook and Instagram with Ad Topic Controls. Teens can also choose to hide any or all advertisements from a specific advertiser. "The topics we already restrict in our policies will be defaulted to See Less, so that teens can't choose to opt into content that may not be age-appropriate," Meta said "We've added a new privacy page with more information for teens about the tools and privacy settings they can use across our technologies," it added.

**NASA mission spots 2nd Earth-size world within 'habitable zone'**

Washington: NASA mission has discovered a second Earth-sized, rocky planet within the habitable zone of its star—the range of distances where liquid water could occur on a planet's surface. Using data from NASA's Transiting Exoplanet Survey Satellite (TESS), the astronomers found "TOI 700 e" which is one of only a few systems with multiple, small, habitable-zone planets that we know of. Astronomers previously discovered three planets in this system, called TOI 700 b, c, and d. Planet d also orbits in the habitable zone, but the scientists needed an additional year of TESS observations to discover TOI 700 e. "That makes the TOI 700 system an exciting prospect for additional follow-up. Planet e is about 10 per cent smaller than planet d, so the system also shows how additional TESS observations help us find smaller and smaller worlds," said Emily Gilbert, a postdoctoral fellow at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Southern California who led the work. TOI 700 is a small, cool M dwarf star located around 100 light-years away in the southern constellation Dorado.

**ASCI's EdNext study lays down a progressive approach to advertising for EdTech industry**

Chandigarh : The Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI) released a comprehensive report on advertising in the education technology sector (EdTech) and the impact it has on parents and students. The report aims to decode the challenges and opportunities for EdTech sector advertising. The report also identifies ways in which the sector can shape a more responsible narrative, and move away from opportunistic advertising which many consider problematic. EdTech as a sector holds immense promise in being able to address the infrastructural and learning challenges in India, hence it is critical that the advertising of the sector does not undermine its potential. The study, done with the active participation of both industry and non-industry stakeholders identifies opportunities and challenges and proposes a framework that could guide advertisers to more balanced advertising. The EdNext study was undertaken by ASCI with Sprint Studio.ai as the research partner and UNICEF as the knowledge partner. A total of 100 EdTech advertisements across print, TV, digital video and static mediums were analysed by a wide set of stakeholders including parents, students, policymakers, educationists, child development experts, as well as representatives of the industry from the marketing and creative fields. The study was conducted across the cities of Delhi, Bangalore, Indore, Kanpur, Patna, Kolhapur, Warangal and Bardhaman.

This is completely a contractual job for the time of contract period decided as per terms and conditions. Firstly, regarding the pay increment demand, the wages of 108 Ambulance services staff is fixed according to the Punjab Govt. minimum wage notification under skilled category (DC rate) and have been given an increase in the pay last year in October along with arrears which were due to the staff.







## Rohit Shetty pens motivational note after sustaining injury on sets of 'Indian Police Force'


