## India's WPI inflation eases to 4.73 pc

The WPI-based inflation recorded in December 2022 was 5.95 percent, the data showed. These are provisional data. Decline in the rate of inflation in January, 2023 is primarily contributed by mineral oils, chemicals and chemical products, textiles, crude petroleum and natural gas, textiles, and food products, the commerce ministry said.

## Rahul Gandhi to travel to Srinagar today on personal visit

**NEW DELHI:** Congress leader Rahul Gandhi will be travelling to Srinagar on Wednesday on a personal visit, said sources. Rahul Gandhi, who was scheduled to visit Varanasi on Tuesday, had to return to Delhi as his flight was unable to land at the Varanasi airport. The Congress has alleged that the airport authorities denied Rahul Gandhi's plane permission to land at the Varanasi airport. Congress leader Ajay Rai has alleged that the airport authorities did not grant permission as they were under pressure, and that they used President Droupadi Murmu's visit as an 'excuse'.

## EAM Jaishankar arrives in Fiji for 12th World Hindi Conference

**NEW DELHI:** External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Tuesday arrived in Fiji to attend the 12th World Hindi Conference that is being co-hosted by the Governments of India and Fiji on February 15-17 in Nadi, Fiji. In a tweet after he landed in Suva, the EAM tweeted in Hindi and English that he is looking forward to meeting Hindi enthusiasts from across the world at the conference: "Bula and Namaste Fiji. The 12th #VishwaHindiSammelan will begin from tomorrow in Nadi. Thank Minister of Education Aseri Radrodoro for the warm welcome. "Look forward to meeting Hindi enthusiasts from all over the world."

# Taxmen visit BBC Delhi, Mumbai Offices; phones, laptops seized

Income Tax officials searched the BBC's Delhi and Mumbai offices today and seized phones and laptops, weeks after a massive controversy over the UK broadcaster's documentary series on Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the deadly sectarian riots in Gujarat in 2002.

The taxmen sealed off the offices for a "survey" linked to alleged irregularities in international taxation and transfer pricing involving the BBC (British Broadcasting Corporation), said sources.

"The Income Tax Authorities are currently at the BBC offices in New Delhi and Mumbai and we are fully cooperating. We hope to have this situation resolved as soon as possible," the BBC tweeted.

Documents were seized and phones and laptops of journalists were taken away. Employees were asked not to call anyone.

BBC, in a memo to staff, asked those not in office to stay away and those at work to not panic, reportedly saying, "We are handling the situation".

Tax officials insisted that this was a survey, not a search, and



that the phones would be returned.

"We needed some clarifications and for that our team is visiting BBC office and we are carrying out a survey. Our officers have gone to check account books, these are not searches," Income Tax sources asserted, adding that the taxmen asked the BBC's finance department for details of balance sheets and accounts.

The opposition accused the government of targeting the BBC for airing a documentary critical of PM Modi over the riots that swept Gujarat in 2002, when he was Chief Minister.

The two-part series, "India:

The Modi Question", was taken down from public platforms last month. The Centre used emergency powers under IT Rules to block YouTube videos and Twitter posts sharing links to the documentary. The government slammed the documentary as "hostile propaganda and anti-India garbage".

Opposition leaders and students protested against what they called blatant censorship by organising public screenings of the documentary, which led to clashes on campus between students, college authorities and the police.

"Here we are asking for a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) probe into the Adani-Hin-

denburg row, and there the government is hounding BBC. Vinash Kaale Viprit Buddhi (when one is doomed, one makes wrong decisions)," commented Congress leader Jairam Ramesh.

Trinamool Congress MP Mahua Moitra jibed in a tweet: "Reports of Income Tax raid at BBC's Delhi office. Wow, really? How unexpected."

"When a government stands for fear and oppression instead of fearlessness, then one should realise the end is near," wrote Samajwadi Party leader Akhilesh Yadav in Hindi.

The ruling BJP ripped into the BBC for what it called "venomous, shallow and agenda-driven reporting" and said the Income Tax department should be allowed to do its job. "No individual or agency can be above the law. If they are working in India, they need to follow Indian law. If they have not done anything illegal, then what's the worry? Why are the opposition parties defending the agency for cheap and petty politics," said BJP spokesperson Gaurav Bhatia. He also mocked the BBC as "Bhrasht, Bakwas Corporation (Corrupt, nonsensical corporation)".

## Punjab Police committed to deal with gangsters with Iron hand

Further tightening the noose around gangster-terrorist nexus to make Punjab a crime-free state as per the vision of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, Punjab Police on Tuesday conducted raids at suspected hideouts of persons linked with Gangster Jagdeep Singh alias Jaggu Bhagwanpuria. The simultaneous raids were conducted at the residential and other premises linked to the gangster in all the districts across the state.

Notably, this was the fourth such raid conducted at the suspected places of different terrorists and gangsters in less than two months. Earlier, Punjab Police had conducted raids at suspected hideouts of Arsh Dalla, Lakhbir Landa, Lawrence Bishnoi and Goldy Brar.

Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav said that as many



as 2371 suspected hideouts of anti-social elements linked with Jaggu Bhagwanpuria were raided during a day-long operation carried out by at least 409 parties of Punjab Police involving

about 2863 police personnel across the state.

He said that raids were planned after the questioning of several persons in the recently busted modules backed by Bhagwanpuria.

Giving more details about the Op-

eration, Additional Director General of Police (ADGP) Law and Order Arpit Shukla said that Police teams have conducted thorough searches at the houses and other premises linked with Bhagwanpuria and also collected the data from Electronic devices, which will be sent for forensic examinations. He said that several persons have also been detained for further verification and incriminating material has been seized from their possession, which is being further examined.

He said that the Police teams have also checked arms licences and questioned people about the sourcing of ammunition, besides, gathering travel details of foreign-based family members, bank transactions from abroad, and western union and property details for further examination. He said that the operation was aimed at disrupting the nexus between terrorists, gangsters, and drug smugglers based in India and abroad.

VB nabs private person taking bribe  
Rs 15,000 to provide govt job

He further added that the complainant has informed to the VB that the accused had already taken Rs 15,000 as an advance money and now demanding Rs 25,000 more to get his file/case signed from the complainant and further to submit it to get its approval from concerned authorities. After preliminary investigation, a VB team laid a trap and the accused Sandeep Singh was arrested while accepting bribe money of Rs 15,000 from the complainant in the presence of two official witnesses. During investigation it has come to light that

the above said accused Sandeep Singh prepared and get the complainant to sign a forged/fabricated appointment letter and other relevant documents to convince the complainant about his recruitment, he added.

The spokesperson further added that a case FIR No. 8 Dated 13-02-2013 under section 7A of prevention of corruption act has been registered against Sandeep Singh at VB police station, flying squad, Punjab, SAS Nagar. Local court has granted two days police remand of the accused and further investigation was under progress so as to uncover modus operandi of the accused.

Pulwama anniversary: Police says out of  
19 perpetrators, 15 killed or arrested

A senior Jammu and Kashmir police officer on Tuesday said that out of 19 terrorists involved in deadly 2019 Pulwama terrorist attack, 15 have been either killed or arrested.

On this day in 2019 a local suicide bomber Adil Dar of Jaish-e-Mohammad rammed his explosive-laden car into CRPF bus at Lethpora Pulwama leaving 40 personnel of the force dead. The attack was followed by Balakote air strikes. A day later Pakistan attempted a retaliation and it triggered a brief dogfight. The Pulwama attack had brought India and Pakistan at the brink of war.

"Out of 19 terrorists and OGW involved in the Pulwama Attack, 8 have been killed, 7 arrested and 4 including Azhar Masood (JeM chief), Rauf Masood and (Ammar) Alvi who



all are based in Pakistan are still alive," Additional Director General of Police, Vijay Kumar told reporters after paying tributes at Lethpora Pulwama to the CRPF men killed in 2019 bombing.

Kumar said over the last few years security forces have broken the back of Jaish in

Kashmir.

He, however, said the Jaish was trying to recruit locals into the organisation and during the last six months they have increased recruitment.

"But we will not allow Jaish to flourish here," he said. ADGP Kumar said at present JeM has only 7-8 locals and 5-6 active

But the relatives of the deceased have expressed the possibility of murder. Police and forensic department team reached the spot and collected evidence, while the accused has been rounded up. Editorial

A long wait

Few things have bothered Indian policymakers as much as the travails of private investment. In the past decade, its share in economic output or the investment rate has declined to levels substantially lower than those recorded in the preceding decade ending 2011-12, after which its descent began. Despite a multitude of support — from fiscal policy to far-reaching structural reforms and plentiful improvements in the business climate — investment has failed to regain its former vigour. In 2019-20, or before the pandemic, gross fixed capital creation had declined a steep 3.2 percentage points. Covid-19 aggravated the shortfall — understandably so. This is why fiscal action in the budget, presented earlier this month, plans a large thrust via enhanced public capex. This is expected to reinforce the nascent revival, signs of which are visible in a small increase in aggregate investment in early estimates of national income. The expectations of a turnaround are high even though business spending has remained unresponsive. In this light, a turning point would be a compelling economic story.

A brief recapitulation would be useful to the current context. Up to 2012-13, India's capital spending share in GDP, or the investment rate, recorded an average 39% over five years. Investment was the locomotive that propelled growth rates into the 7.5%-8% region in that period. This plunged a steep 5 percentage points in 2013-14 with the 'taper-tantrum' crisis and by 2015-16, the ratio was down a further 2 points. The investment rate averaged a mere 32.5% in the five years to the pandemic, a good deal lower than the previous decade and insufficient in maintaining the economy on a higher growth path. Without bringing back this catalyst, consumer demand cannot grow economic output on its own. Investment is what generates employment and incomes which, in turn, inspire consumer spending, making it a virtuous loop. This has not been for want of support or serious efforts from the government. The list of enabling structural reforms, big and small, is long. The notable ones include the switchover to a new monetary policy regime and inflation targeting to provide certainty and confidence to investors and businesses; recapitalisation and resolution of bad assets of public banks; the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code for quick, effective exit of sick businesses; demonetisation to formalise the economy; real estate regulation for transparency and rationalisation; GST to harmonise the indirect taxation system for raising revenues and efficiency; corporate tax cuts for competitive alignment and elicit factory investments; agriculture reforms that had to be rolled back; labour market alterations — a work in progress; a production-linked incentive scheme for export-oriented manufacturing and global championship.

The Ahmadiyya community in Pakistan regularly fell prey to atrocities and faced some severe violent attacks, social exclusion, and harassment, Maryland-based news website Baltimore Post-Examiner reported.

The hatred for the Ahmadiyya in Pakistan is at such a level that they don't celebrate the achievements of their only Nobel prize winner in the Science category, Abdus Salam.

Unfortunately, Pakistan doesn't celebrate the achievements of Salam because he was an Ahmadi, which is considered a heretic and non-Muslim in Pakistan.

Salam received the Nobel Prize for the discovery of the Higgs boson, famously known as the God Particle.

According to the Baltimore Post-Examiner, Pakistan's former Prime Minister Zulfikar Bhutto played a pivotal role in having the parliament declare Ahmadis non-Muslims.

His successor, General Zia-ul-Haque took one step further and introduced a penal code to incarcerate Ahmadis for claiming Islam. This institutionalized persecution and pogrom of Ahmadis continue to date. Today, hundreds of Ahmadis are serving life or on death



row for blasphemy without recourse to evidence gathering, appeal, and trial. Meanwhile, Brad Adams, the Asia Director of Human Rights Watch said that the election can never be termed as "free" and "fair" as the entire community is effectively excluded from the electoral process.

In an article titled, "The Town That Doesn't Vote", Saad Sayeed writes that all Ahmadis show immense pride in their Pakistani citizenship but remain disen-

franchised in a country that their ancestors helped create with great valor and sacrifices.

In the city of Chenab Nagar, 97 per cent of the population is contributed by the Ahmadiyya but still, the Punjab government changed the name since it is blasphemous for Ahmadis to use a Quranic word to name their city and they also have no rights to manage the region.

The city doesn't receive funds from the provincial or federal government, which

forces its residents to use private funds for development. The residents are governed by outsiders with laws of discrimination that remind them of white-ruled South Africa. Despite their sheer size, they feel helpless in the fight against apartheid and many call their city the largest Ahmadi jail in the world. Pakistani law prohibits Ahmadis from calling their places of worship mosques or distributing religious literature, reciting the Quran, or using traditional

Islamic greetings.

These measures criminalize their daily lives and enable regular attacks on both individuals and organizations. Four days after the Ahmadis celebrated the birthday of Abdus Salam; some Sufi zealots attacked an Ahmadi mosque on Martin Road in Karachi and damaged its minarets. London-based International Human Rights Commission has reported nine such incidents from Karachi-Saddar, Umerkot (Amarkot), and

Mirpur Khas where Muslims tried to set Ahmadi mosque on fire and shot fires at the congregants, according to Baltimore Post-Examiner.

In the last quarter of 2022, police in Gojra, Gujranwala, and Wazirabad districts destroyed Ahmadi mosques by razing domes and minarets and removing Quranic verses from the walls. These districts are a stronghold of Chaudhry Pervez Elahi, the ex-Chief Minister of Punjab, who is an outspoken opponent of Ahmadis and proposes stricter laws to curb their religious activities. Today, each Ahmadi household manifests a tale of discrimination, persecution, and death which reminds them of the grave mistake their leaders made in 1947 by helping the British Monarch create Pakistan as a safe haven for the Indian Muslims. The constitutional apartheid against the Ahmadis is a clear violation of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and all related international treaties that Pakistan has signed. The US government should recognize the Ahmadi genocide and hold the Pakistani government accountable to ensure basic rights and protection for Ahmadis, as per the report in Baltimore Post-Examiner.

Smart necklace to help you stop smoking

A necklace that could help you quit smoking is on the way. Northwestern Medicine researchers created a smart neck-worn gadget that looks like a lapis blue pendant and detects smoking significantly more reliably than prior systems. It accomplishes this by collecting heat signatures from thermal sensors.

The necklace, called SmokeMon, completely maintains a smoker's privacy, only tracking heat, not visuals -- which is a critical factor for people to feel comfortable wearing it. "This goes way beyond how many cigarettes a person smokes per day," said senior investigator Nabil Alshurafa, associate professor of preventive medicine at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine. "We can detect when the cigarette is being lit, when the person holds it to their mouth and takes a puff, how much they inhale, how much time between puffs and how long they have the cigarette in their mouth." All these details are called smoking topography, which is essential for two reasons. The first is that it allows scientists to measure and assess harmful carbon monoxide exposure among smokers and understand more deeply the relationship between chemical exposure and tobacco-related diseases including cancer, heart disease, stroke, lung disease, diabetes, COPD, emphysema and chronic bronchitis.



The second is to help people in their efforts to quit smoking by understanding how smoking topography relates to relapse (going back to smoking regularly), which happens frequently in people who

quit. Say a former smoker takes a few puffs of a cigarette. Do five puffs or five entire cigarettes send them into a full relapse? This information can be used to predict when a person will relapse and when to intervene with a phone call from a health coach, for example, or even a smartphone text or video message to help encourage them to prevent a relapse. The scientists also plan to study the effectiveness of the device in detecting smoking puffs and topography from electronic cigarettes. "We want to catch them before they completely fall off the wagon," Alshurafa said.

New report: You're wrong if you think era of globalization is over!

According to a new study by scholars at the University of Waterloo, the University of British Columbia, and the China Europe International Business School in Shanghai, reports of globalization's demise are premature.

Their findings call into question widely held beliefs that the rivalry between the United States and China, lately highlighted by the Chinese spy balloon problem, can only worsen and divide the world into two antagonistic camps. Dr Victor Cui, a professor at Waterloo's Conrad School of Entrepreneurship and Business, said the analysis shows that most likely isn't going to happen. "First, the potential economic cost of doing this is too high for the U.S., China, their allies, and the entire world," Cui said. "The breakdown of globalization ultimately hurts consumers, which we are all experiencing too well. Globalization is not over." Beyond economic realities, the researchers found that the U.S.-China rivalry is based, in part, on a misunderstanding. For example, China's intentions to seek 'self-reliance' were largely defensive while being interpreted in Washington's narratives as solely aggressive. For their part, China's communist leaders bristled at what they saw as American attempts to limit China's growing economic and political power. The authors suggest that Washington may have overstated China's techno-nationalistic threat to the liberal world order for a few reasons. First, China increasingly centralizes top-down control over its innovation effort, which is unlikely to sustain its rapid technological advancement. Second, China may not be able to continuously inject the funding required to sustain its technology innovation because of its continuing economic

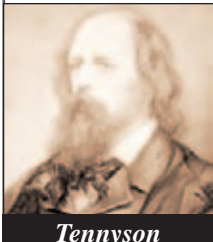


growth decline. Moreover, China also faces a growing shortage of young productive workers in the next decade due to its former one-child policy. The researchers conclude key assumptions -- that China's rapid pace of technology innovation will accelerate, and that China may establish its own technological hegemony and surpass the U.S. in some strategic fields -- are overstated. "We expect China's threat will slowly disappear -- it is not sustainable," said Cui, the Conrad Research Excellence Chair. "Once the fear of China's rise declines in the U.S., we expect the disengagement to slow down and even dissipate. We can be conservatively optimistic there will be changes." The researchers argue the entire world would benefit if the U.S. and China acted as partners instead of rivals, as they can more effectively manage existential global challenges such as inflation, climate change and future pandemics while minimizing the risks of military confrontations.

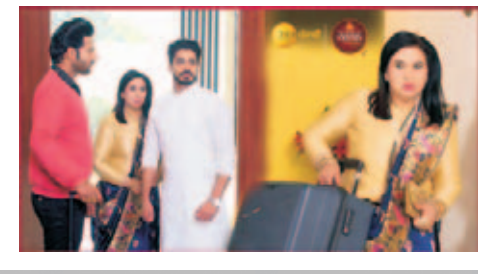
