Harichandan becomes new Governor of Chhattisgarh

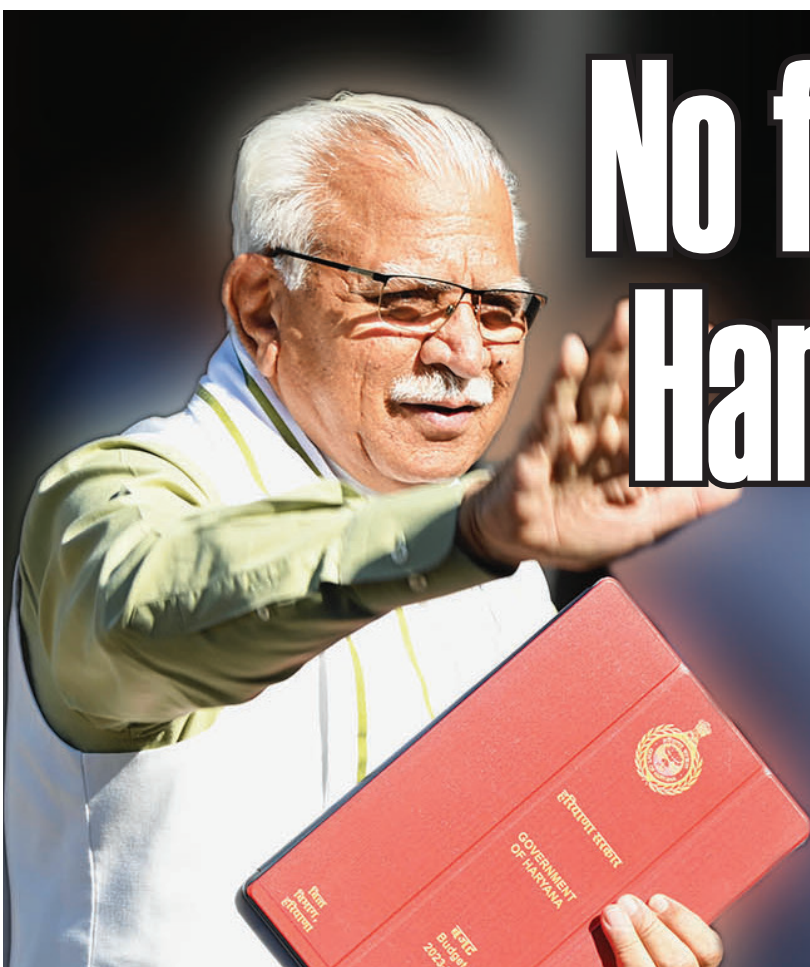

Markets fall for 5th day; Sensex declines 139 pts

MUMBAI: Falling for the fifth straight session, equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty declined on Thursday amid concerns that the US Federal Reserve might raise interest rates further to curb inflation. Fresh foreign fund outflows and mostly weak trends in Asian markets also hit investor sentiments, traders said. In a highly volatile trade amid monthly derivatives expiry, the Sensex declined 139.18 points or 0.23 per cent to settle at 59,605.80.

DGPs of Punjab, Himachal hold meet for better synergy between police forces

CHANDIGARH: The heads of the Punjab Police and Himachal Pradesh Police Thursday held a meeting for better synergy and coordination between the two forces. The meeting was held between Punjab Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav and his Himachal Pradesh counterpart Sanjay Kundu here at the Punjab Police headquarters. Both the police forces will work together on joint operations at the Punjab and HP border areas with the HP Police saying it was decided to work in close coordination to give a "knock-out-punch" to the organized inter-state crime.



Old age pension increased from Rs. 2500 to Rs 2,750 per month

Chief Minister Manohar Lal today proposed a budget of Rs 1,83,950 crore for the financial year 2023-24 without any fresh taxes. This year's budget is an increase of 11.6 per cent over the revised estimates of 1,64,808 crore for the previous year 2022-23. Khattar said Haryana's contribution of about 3.86 per cent in India's GDP is beyond its size of population.

The CM proposed revenue receipts of Rs 1,09,122 crore for the budget estimate year 2023-24. This includes tax revenue of Rs 75,716 crore and non-tax revenue of Rs 12,651 crore. GST, VAT, excise and stamp duty are major sources of revenue in tax revenue receipts. The share of central taxes is Rs 11,164 crore and grants-in-aid from the Center is Rs 9,590 crore.

The Budget proposed an expenditure of Rs 57,879 crore on capital asset creation and Rs 1,26,071 crore on revenue expenditure. This is 31.5 per cent and 68.5 per cent, respectively. He said the government has maintained focus on increasing capital expenditure. The government increased the social security pension from Rs 2,500 per month to Rs 2,750 per month from April 1. The government Increased old-age pension to Rs 2,750 per month. Income eligibility for old-age pension increased from Rs 2 lakh to Rs 3 lakh. More than 2 lakh antyodaya families will get financial assistance of Rs 2,000 crore. One lakh houses for antyodaya families. B benefit of Chirayu-Ayushman Bharat Yojana extended to families with annual income up to Rs 3 lakh. CM Khattar said the state has allocated Rs 101 crore for construction of SYL to get the state's due share of waters of Ravi-Beas river system.

No fresh taxes in Haryana Budget

Manohar Lal presents budget of Rs 1,83,950 cr for year 2023-24

Funds for Gau Sewa Aayog hiked by 10 times

CHANDIGARH: Committed to ensure the care and protection of stray cows, the provision for the Haryana Gau Sewa Aayog has been increased from Rs. 40 crore to Rs. 400 crore. Gram Panchayat land will be made available with the concurrence of the Gram Panchayats for new Gaushalas registered with the Haryana Gau Sewa Aayog. The Gaushalas will be linked to the GOBAR DHAN scheme under which biogas plants will be constructed in every district, announced Sh. Manohar Lal while presenting the state budget 2023-24 during the ongoing session of State Vidhan Sabha here today. "I hope that with these two measures, we will ensure the care and protection of stray cows while also eliminating the occurrence of accidents being caused by stray cattle on the roads," said Sh. Manohar Lal. The Finance Minister further announced the enhancement of financial assistance to Gaushalas housing stray cattle appropriately so that the Gaumata in the Gaushalas are cared and protected. There are 632 Gaushalas registered with Haryana Gau Sewa Aayog in the State of Haryana, which are housing around 4.6 lakh stray cattle.

Assistance of Rs. 2500 announced for girls seeking admission to ITIs

CHANDIGARH: With an aim to give a big push to the admission of girl students in Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), the Haryana Finance Minister announced to provide financial assistance of Rs. 2500 to every girl child who takes admission in Government ITIs whose annual family income is upto Rs. 3 lakhs. Sh. Manohar Lal while presenting the state budget 2023-24 during the ongoing session of State Vidhan Sabha here today also announced to allocate Rs. 1636 crore to the youth sector for FY 2023-24. The Finance Minister said that Youth constitutes the backbone of the State. There is also a need to skill the youth and provide them with employment and entrepreneurship opportunities. To achieve this objective, a sum of Rs. 250 crore has been allocated for the skill training of two lakh youth in 2023-24. If required, additional budget provision beyond the projected amount will be provided, announced Sh. Manohar Lal.

SC gives interim bail to Pawan Khera

Supreme Court in its order on Thursday protected and granted interim relief to Congress Spokesperson and leader, Pawan Khera from arrest for now, till Tuesday, after noting that he will be released on interim bail upon production before the magistrate in Delhi.

The interim relief is till Tuesday for Pawan Khera, the Apex Court said and posted Khera's petition for hearing on Monday for the purpose of consolidating the FIRS against him at one place, as was done in the case of TV anchor Arnab Goswami.

"In order to protect the petitioner (Pawan Khera) until such date as he applied for regular bail before the jurisdictional court, till the next date of listing, he shall be released on interim bail by magistrate," a three-judge bench of the Supreme Court, headed by the Chief Justice of India (CJI) Dr Dhananjaya Yeshwant Chadrachud, and also comprising Justices P S Narasimha and M R Shah, said, in its order.

Police crack Nabha gas agency robbery case, 5 held

Under the leadership of SSP Varun Sharma, the Patiala Police has launched a special drive to trace the unsolved felony cases. According to which a special team was formed by SSP Patiala to trace the robbery of money that happened on February 16, 2023 at Rajwant Hospital Nabha near Das Gas Agency.

The team, investigating from every aspect, traced the robbery incident and arrested five accused within just five days. Items recovered from the accused included 1 rifle with twelve bore, five cartridges, one gun, 2 iron rods, 1 Kirch, two lakh rupees in cash and the motorcycle used in the incident.

The police said that the CIA Patiala had received a tip-off that members of a



robbery gang had robbed a gas agency, who were looking to commit another robbery incident. A case has been registered against him on the basis of confidential information. He further said that the main ringleaders of this gang are Parminder Singh alias Ravi and Manpreet Singh alias Manna. All these members have committed about 10 cases including looting and have been arrested and are locked up in Sangrur Jail. At Gas Agency Nabha on

February 16, this gang entered Dr. Rajwant Hospital near Das Bharat Gas Agency Nabha at around 8 pm and looted 2 lakh rupees by threatening with deadly weapons. A case in this regard is registered at Kotwali Nabha police station. At Shiv Mandir Bhawanigarh near Bharat Petroleum Gas Agency, on January 5, at around 8 o'clock in the evening, they entered the gas agency and looted the cash at the point of deadly weapons.

Pvt bus operators postpone agitation

Centre notifies elevation of advocates as Additional Judges of High Courts

I extend my best wishes to all of them."

Recently the Supreme Court Collegium in its meeting held on 17th January 2023 had approved the proposal for the elevation of the nine Advocates as Judges in the Allahabad High Court.

Out of nine recommended names the Centre has notified the appointment of three Advocates Prashant Kumar,



Manjive Shukla and Arun Kumar Singh Deshwal as the Additional Judges of Allahabad High Court.

The Supreme Court Collegium in its meeting held on January 17, 2023, had approved the proposal for the elevation of

the Advocate Venkatachari Lakshminarayanan as the Judges for Madras High Court.

Recently, during the Parliament session, Law and Justice Minister Kiren Rijju told Parliament that Government is committed to filling up of

vacant posts expeditiously in a time-bound manner.

He also informed the Parliament that while filling up vacancies in the High Courts is a continuous, integrated and collaborative process requiring consultation and approval from various constitutional authorities, vacancies keep arising on account of retirement, resignation or elevation of Judges.

Rijju further informed that to increase the judge strength of a High Court, the concurrence of the Chief Justice of the concerned High Court, as well as the State Government, is required since the Chief Justice of that High Court is responsible for the day-to-day administration of the court and the State Government has to provide for infrastructural facilities, salaries of Judges etc.

The sanctioned strength of Judges of the High Court has increased from 906 in (2014) to 1108 in (2022).

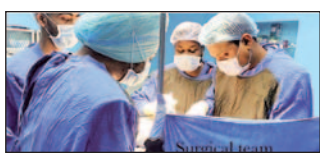

Sting in the tail

Look at the sting at the tip of its tail", said Feluda to his sidekick, Topshe, describing a scorpion he had managed to trap in an upturned tumbler in the Jodhpur Circuit House. "If it bites?" asked Topshe. Pat came Feluda's response: "Certain death for the young and old, everyone else half-dead." Similar is the effect of Section 30(2), the 'tail' of the digital personal data protection bill 2022, India's first comprehensive privacy legislation. This seemingly innocuous provision will certainly kill the Right to Information Act, 2005. Participatory democracy in India will be half-dead as a direct consequence.

In one fell swoop, Section 30(2) prioritises the privacy of personal information over the right to information of citizens. In the original scheme of the RTI Act, personal information may have remained exempt from the scope of RTI disclosure only if two further conditions were met. First, such information should not have any public interest attached to it; second, if such information had to be disclosed to Parliament or the state legislature (say in response to a legislator's question), it would have to be disclosed to the citizen who had filed the RTI request.

As an example, if a judge had failed to disclose his/her assets as per the Supreme Court's own internal resolution, a citizen could ask for such information through a RTI request and it would have to be provided. The proposed amendment shuts this door. It simply states that anything that relates to personal information may be denied in an RTI request. Whether that personal information has public interest attached to it or not, or whether it has to be made available to Parliament or not, is immaterial. Privacy wins. Transparency must give way. How is this provision likely to be used? The former Central Information Commissioner and RTI activist, Shailesh Gandhi, has provided many telling examples — the redevelopment of Crawford Market in Bombay was halted after an RTI request disclosed that the developer would make a gain of Rs 1000 crore and the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation would only get Rs 40 crore. Again, a land parcel in Pune allocated to the former president, Pratibha Patil, for building a post-retirement home was shown in an RTI request to be far beyond her entitlement. After public outcry, the former president chose to forego the land allocation. (<https://scroll.in/article/1042602/these-instances-show-how-the-digital-data-protection-bill-will-undermine-the-rti-act>). These requests can now be legally denied since they relate to personal information — the financial details of the developer, the address of the plot where Patil's new house was being built and so on.

After banning discrimination on the basis of caste, Seattle became the first city in the US to take such step, CNN reported.

The Seattle City Court, on Tuesday, approved the ordinance that amends the city's municipal code to include caste as a protected class, alongside categories such as race, religion and gender identity.

The law prohibits caste discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodations and other arenas, and allows caste-oppressed people in the city to lodge complaints of discrimination.

The Seattle City Council approved the ordinance 6-1. Scores of people across race, religion and caste backgrounds registered to speak during the public comment period on Tuesday, with an overwhelming majority supporting the legislation. Supporters included dominant and oppressed caste workers, union members, progressive political organizers, Hindus, Sikhs and Muslims, among others, reported CNN.

Seattle's council member Kshama Sawant, who sponsored the ordinance, said that casteism should not be the basis of discrimination.

During the city council meeting, she said, that casteism is an insidious form of discrimination that typically operates within South Asian

communities. The caste system is a social hierarchy that divides people into rigid categories at birth, with those on the lowest rungs of the ladder — many of whom self-identify as Dalits — on the receiving end of slurs, discrimination and even violence because of their caste identities. Though the caste system originated in ancient

India and is rooted in Hinduism, its contemporary form developed under centuries of Muslim and British rule, and it can now be found in virtually all South Asian countries and religious communities.

Caste is especially relevant in Seattle, one of the nation's largest tech hubs and home to major companies that employ

large numbers of South Asian immigrants, according to CNN. In the week leading up to the vote, several people testified in public comment hearings and letters to the city council about how caste has manifested in area workplaces and other settings. Meanwhile, Thenmozhi Soundararajan, executive director of the Dalit ad-

vocacy organization Equality Labs, said, "This was a winning century in the making and it was really the fruition of many years of organizing in Seattle across racial and gender and worker lines". She further stated, "It's also proof that the South Asian community wants to heal from caste." Despite broad support, the ordi-

nance faced some opposition from groups including the coalition of Hindus of North America, the Hindu American Foundation and the Vishva Hindu Parishad of America, who argued that the legislation unfairly singled out Hindus and contributed to harmful misconceptions of them, as per the report in CNN.

Study shows circovirus involved in human hepatitis

Scientists from the Institut Pasteur, Necker-Enfants Malades Hospital (AP-HP), Inserm in the Imagine Institute, Université Paris Cité and the Alfort National Veterinary School (EnvA) have identified a previously unknown species of circovirus, provisionally named human circovirus 1 (HCirV-1).

Circoviruses are a family of small, highly resistant DNA viruses that were initially identified in 1974 in various animal species, where they can cause respiratory, renal, dermatological and reproductive problems. HCirV-1 is a novel virus that is distant from known animal circoviruses. It was shown to be implicated in damage to the liver of a patient undergoing immunosuppressive treatment. This discovery of the first circovirus in humans, linked to hepatitis, was published in the journal Emerging Infectious Diseases on January 3, 2023. Although the transmission of animal viruses to humans is regularly re-



ported in the scientific literature, it is rare for a novel virus to be identified in a patient in Europe. But as part of a recent study, scientists and physicians have identified the first circovirus involved in human hepatitis. "The patient had unexplained chronic hepatitis, with few symptoms. She had received a heart-lung transplant 17 years earlier and had been monitored regularly since. We had access to a large number of samples over several years and were therefore able to identify this novel virus, which was completely unexpected," explains Marc Eloit, last author of the study, Head of the Institut Pasteur's Pathogen Discovery laboratory and a Professor

of Virology at the Alfort National Veterinary School (EnvA). His laboratory specializes in the identification of pathogens in patients suspected of severe infection of unknown cause. In March 2022, in collaboration with the Department of Clinical Microbiology at Necker-Enfants Malades Hospital (AP-HP), the pathological tissue samples of this 61-year-old female patient receiving immunosuppressive treatment, whose hepatitis had no identifiable cause, were sequenced to search for microbial sequences. The RNA (ribonucleic acid) sequences extracted from the tissues were analyzed and compared with those of known microbes.

Japan celebrates "Setsubun" event



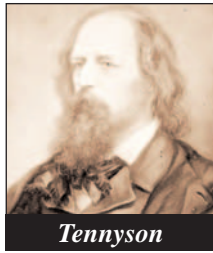

How human body can predict mealtimes

According to a recent study from the University of Surrey, the human body can forecast the timing of frequent meals. The researchers also discovered that daily blood glucose rhythms are influenced not just by meal timing but also by meal quantity.

This study was published in the journal Current Biology.

In the first study of its kind, researchers from Surrey, led by Professor Jonathan Johnston, investigated if the human circadian system anticipates large meals. Circadian rhythms/systems are physiological changes, including metabolic, that follow a 24-hour cycle and are usually synchronised to environmental signals, such as light and dark cycles.

Previous studies in this field have focussed on animal controls and until now it has been undetermined whether human phys-



iology can predict mealtimes and food availability.

Jonathan Johnston, Professor of Chronobiology, and Integrative Physiology at the University of Surrey said: "We often get hungry around the same time every day, but the extent to which our biology can anticipate mealtimes is unknown. It is possible that metabolic rhythms align to meal patterns and that regularity of meals will ensure that we eat at the time when our bodies are best adapted to deal with them."

To learn more, 24 male participants undertook an eight-day laboratory study with strict sleep-wake schedules, exposure to light-dark cycles, and food intake. For six days, 12 participants consumed small meals hourly throughout the waking period, with the remaining participants consuming two large daily meals (7.5 and 14.5 hours after waking).

After six days, all participants were then put on the same feeding schedule for 37 hours and received small meals hourly in a procedure known to reveal internal circadian rhythms. Glucose was measured every 15 minutes during the study, and hunger levels were measured hourly during waking hours on days two four and six in the first stage of the study and then hourly for the final 37 hours.

Analysing results of the first six days of the study, researchers found the glucose concentration of participants in the small meal group increased upon waking and remained elevated throughout the day until declining after their last meal. In the large meal group, there was a similar increase in glucose concentration upon waking however there was a gradual decline leading up to the first meal.

In the final 37 hours, when both groups were fed the same small meals hourly, all par-

ticipants exhibited an initial rise in glucose concentration upon waking. However, in those who had previously received two large meals, glucose levels began to decline before the anticipated large meal (which they did not receive) whereas for participants who had always consumed small meals hourly, their glucose levels continued to rise as previously seen. In addition, in the large meal group, there was an increase in hunger preceding projected mealtimes which sharply declined after the anticipated mealtime had passed.

Professor Johnston added: "What we have found is that the human body is rhythmically programmed to anticipate mealtimes particularly when food is not readily accessible. This suggests that there is a physiological drive for some people to eat at certain times as their body has been trained to expect food rather than it just being a psychological habit."

HC asks govt report on illegal mining in distt

NIRMAL RADAUR: The High Court has shown strictness in the case of illegal mining in the district. In a public interest litigation filed by the Haryana Anti-Corruption Society regarding illegal mining and overloading, the High Court has asked the government for the current report of illegal mining. The next hearing in the case is on March 22. State President of Haryana Anti-Corruption Society, Advocate Waryam Singh said that he complained to the concerned authorities about illegal mining and overloading and damage to the embankments of Yamuna river. But instead of taking action on his complaint, it was suppressed on which he was forced to go to the High Court in the year 2017. Illegal mining is changing the natural course of Yamuna river due to which soil erosion is taking place. About half a dozen villages along the river are in danger. Whenever there is excess water in the river Yamuna, it changes its direction due to the raw banks because illegal mining is happening on a large scale on the banks of the river. If the situation of illegal mining remains here, then the raging form of Yamuna river is a threat to many villages.

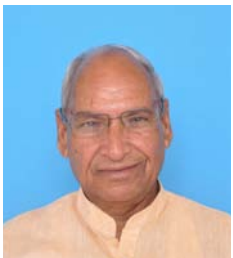
