Militants shot dead a **Kashmiri Pandit in Pulwama**

SRINAGAR, FEB 26

A Kashmiri Pandit working as a security guard at a bank was shot dead by militants in Jammu and Kashmir's Pulwama Sunday morning, police said. This is the first civilian killing in Kashmir this year. Police said militants fired upon



a minority community member Sanjay Shar ma son of Kashinath Sharma, a resident of Achan Pulwama this morning when he was on way to a local mar-

"The injured was shifted to hospital,

however, he succumbed to his injuries", police said. The entire area was cordoned off and a massive search was launched to track down the militants responsible for

Deputy Inspector General (DIG) of Police, South Kashmir range, Rayees Muhammad Bhat said those involved in the killing will be tracked soon. "We are acting swiftly and investigating the matter. The terrorists involved in this heinous crime will be tracked down and neutralized soon," Bhat told media persons.

The killing sparked widespread condemnation.

No end in sight for war

s the Russia-Ukraine war completes one year, leaving a trail of death and destruction on both sides and a massive disruption of global trade, there is still no sign of resolution. When he sent troops to invade Ukraine, Russian President Vladimir Putin expected a meek surrender by the neighbour with no meaningful involvement of other countries. However, it has turned out to be a grave miscalculation, leading to a protracted conflict with seemingly no end in sight. Thousands of people have died and more than 13 million people were made refugees abroad or displaced inside Ukraine. Contrary to the initial expectations, Ukraine managed to push back the invading army from Kyiv. It also reversed some other territorial losses, including at Kherson in November, the only regional capital Russia had seized

The pointless war is fanning regional instability and fuelling global tensions and divisions while diverting attention and resources from other crises and pressing global issues. The trust deficit between Russia and the West is now at an all-time high. The reverberations of the war are being felt far and wide. For India, the Ukraine crisis has thrown up a diplomatic dilemma, forcing it to do some tightrope walking and strike a balance between the imperatives of its long and time-tested bilateral ties with Russia and the need to side with the chorus of outrage over Moscow's unjustified invasion of a sovereign country. India has been consistently rooting for a negotiated settlement of all disputes and immediate cessation of hostilities. It took a pragmatic approach throughout the conflict, purely guided by national interests.

While abstaining from the US-sponsored UN Security Council resolution condemning Russia's aggression, New Delhi has also criticised Moscow by flagging three key concerns: respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity of states, the UN Charter and international law. The global impact of the war came as a major test of the resilience of the Indian economy. The invasion caused prices of fuel, fertilizer, wheat and other critical commodities, of which Russia or Ukraine were major suppliers, to spike. This caused the value of imports to skyrocket in India. From energy requirements to defence supplies. India opted for a practical approach and ensured supplies from Moscow despite the pressure from Western countries

As the war enters its second year, that tightrope walk will get tighter. New Delhi needs to be constantly vigilant on the possible need to recalibrate its relationship with Moscow and, at the same time, ensure that its interests are protected. Slowing global growth, as a result of the Ukraine war, also implies weak international trade. thus hurting the prospects for Indian exporters. The latest World Bank Global Economic Prospects report, released in January, expects global growth to be just 1.7% in 2023, down from an earlier forecast of 3% six months ago

Women over 50 with specific mutations are at higher risk of cancer

omen who have BRCA1 or BRCA2 genetic abnormalities continue to have a significant chance of developing cancer after age 50, even if they have never been diagnosed with the disease.

"Our analysis highlights the effectiveness of these risk reduction surgeries, and emphasizes the need for individuals as well as health care providers, to consider clinical guidelines and recommendations for their cancer risk, including how their genetics might impact them even at a later age," says Metcalfe.

This is true even though these mutations are linked to a younger beginning of breast and ovarian

cancer. The findings of the study published recently in the

American Cancer Society Journal



The study followed over 2000 women between the ages of 50 to 75, from 16 countries, who were aware they had a BRCA mutation and had no previous diagnosis of cancer. The study found that the cumulative risk of these women developing any type of cancer after the age of 50 was 49 percent for those with a BRCA1 mutation and 43 per cent for those with a BRCA2 mutation. For those in the study cohort who had not undergone a cancer risk-reduction surgery, the risk was even greater at 77 per cent for those with a BRCA1 mutation and 67 per cent for those with a BRCA2

mutation.

"What is striking about our results is that breast and ovarian cancers were the most frequently observed cancers occurring and that is concerning, considering we know how to reduce the risk of cancer in women who have these genetic risk factors." says Metcalfe who is also a Senior Scientist at Women's College Hospital.

Of the women included in the study only 15 percent underwent a preventative bilateral mastectomy, and 43 percent a bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy (BSO) - removal of both ovaries and fallopian tubes - before the

age of 50. The study found that these women had the lowest risk of any occurrence of cancer at just 9 per cent.

"Our analysis highlights the effectiveness of these risk reduction surgeries, and emphasizes the need for individuals as well as health care providers, to consider clinical guidelines and recommendations for their cancer risk, including how their genetics might impact them even at a later age," says

She acknowledges that there are some limitations to the study including the fact that in some countries access to risk reduction surgeries may be limited, and knowledge of how often or whether these women received genetic counselling was not

'We are not aware of whether the participants in our study received additional counselling about their elevated risk of cancer as they age and we are also unable to determine why some of these women chose to forgo preventative surgery before the age of 50," says Metcalfe. "However, it is important to point out that screening alone only reduces mortality risk by increasing the chances of detecting the cancer early, it does not reduce the risk of cancer

Understanding the limitations

of screening is of particular importance for women with either a BRCA1 or BRCA2 mutation especially in assessing their risk of ovarian cancer, as no good screening method exists to detect the cancer early enough. Metcalfe's study references the National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN) guidelines where it is recommended that women with a BRCA1 mutation undergo a BSO between ages 35-40 and those with BRCA2 mutation between 40-45.

Future studies says Metcalfe, will look at exploring women's decision-making around whether or not to undergo surgery and their own understanding of risk. For now, Metcalfe is hopeful that advances in genetic testing will help make it more accessible to all women who want to know their risk status.

The Screen Project Canada, housed at Women's College Hospital, is one example of a consumer-based model of testing where individuals can pay to access genetic testing that allows anyone, regardless of family history, to find out if they carry a BRCA1 or BRCA2 mutation. While it currently operates at a small cost to the patient, Metcalfe believes that lower barriers to genetic testing will not only save lives, but eventually become a mainstay of cancer care in

In particular sperm count and semen quality are thought to be the major drivers of growing infertility rates among males -- a previous analysis led by the EARTH study team found that among me seeking fertility treatment, sperm count and quality

between 2000 and 2017. "Further, there is increasing evidence that male infertility is associated with common chronic diseases such as cardiovascular disease and autoimmune disease, highlighting the broader importance of male reproductive health," said Minguez-Alarcon. The EARTH study is a collaboration between the Harvard T. Chan School of Public

Health and Mass General Brigham to evaluate the effect of environmental and lifestyle factors on fertility. EARTH has collected samples and survey data from over 1,500 men and women, and the current study focused on a subset of these participants, including 377 male partners in couples seeking treatment at a fertility center. The researchers found that men who reported often lifting or moving heavy objects at work had 46% higher sperm concentration and 44% higher total sperm count compared to those with less physical

tourists to have a glimpse of rural life. Together with the Trans Bhutan Trail organisation, the guides have started creating a Trans Bhutan Trail Passport programme. To date, more than 60



"Passport Ambassadors" who host tourists have spread across Bhutan and the majority of them are women, as per the news report.

Local farmers serve tourists a traditional meal at their homes while sharing their culture and heritage with their guests, The Bhutan Live reported, adding that some people offer cooking demonstrations while others indulge tourists in traditional hot stone baths.

The partnership empowers women to work in the tourism sector and earn a sustainable

income. It also provides travellers v a deep cultural understanding and connection with some of the most remote communities and people in Bhutan, added the news report.

Zangmo, one of the women opening her house to the tourists, said, "I wanted to open the doors of my farmhouse to tourism in 2018 but then the pandemic hit and ruined my plans," The Bhutan Live reported.

She added, "Then last year, a quide from the TBT knocked on my door and invited me to be an ambassador, which changed my life Not only can I make some extra money for my family, but I also have the opportunity to interact with people

Study suggests skipping breakfast might harm immune system

ccording to a recent study from the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, fasting can make it more difficult to fight infections and increase your risk of getting heart disease.

The study, which concentrated on mouse models, is one of the first to demonstrate that skipping meals causes the brain to react in a way that harms immune cells. The findings, which centre on breakfast, were released in the Immunity journal and may help researchers better understand how longterm fasting may influence the body.

"There is a growing awareness that fasting is healthy, and there is indeed abundant evidence for the benefits of fasting. Our study provides a word of caution as it suggests that there may also be a cost to fasting that carries a health risk," said lead author Filip Swirski, PhD Director of the Cardiovascular Research Institute at Icahn Mount Sinai, adding, "This is a mechanistic study delving into some of the fundamental biology relevant to fasting. The study shows that there is a conversation between the nervous and

Researchers aimed to better understand how fasting -- from a relatively short fast of only a few hours to a more severe fast of 24 hours -- affects the immune system. They analysed two groups of mice. One group ate breakfast right after waking up (breakfast is their largest meal of the day), and the other group had no breakfast. Researchers collected blood samples in both groups when mice woke up (baseline), then four hours later, and eight hours later. When examining the blood work,

researchers noticed a distinct difference in the fasting group. Specifically, the researchers saw a difference in the number of monocytes, which are white blood cells that are made in the bone marrow and travel through the body, where they play many critical roles, from fighting infections to heart disease, to cancer.

At baseline, all mice had the same amount of monocytes. But after four hours, monocytes in mice from the fasting group were dramatically affected. Researchers found 90 per cent of these cells



disappeared from the bloodstream, and the number further declined at eight hours

Meanwhile, monocytes in the non-fasting group were unaffected

In fasting mice, researchers discovered the monocytes travelled back to

the bone marrow to hibernate. Concurrently, the production of new cells in the bone marrow diminished. The monocytes in the bone marrow -- which typically have a short lifespan -significantly changed. They survived longer as a consequence of staying in the bone marrow and aged differently than the monocytes that stayed in the blood.

The researchers continued to fast mice for up to 24 hours and then reintroduced food. The cells hiding in the bone marrow surged back into the bloodstream within a few hours. This surge led to a heightened level of inflammation. Instead of protecting against infection, these altered monocytes were more inflammatory, making the body less resistant to fighting infection. This study is among the first to make the connection between the brain and these immune cells during fasting. Researchers found that specific regions in the brain controlled the monocyte response during fasting. This study demonstrated that fasting elicits a stress response in the brain -- that's what makes people "hangry" (feeling hungry and angry) -- and this instantly triggers a largescale migration of these white blood cells from the blood to the bone marrow, and then back to the bloodstream shortly after a food is reintroduced.

Dr Swirski emphasized that while there is also evidence of the metabolic benefits of fasting, this new study is a useful advance in the full understanding of the body's mechanisms.

"The study shows that, on the one hand, fasting reduces the number of circulating monocytes, which one might think is a good thing, as these cells are the other hand, the reintroduction of food creates a surge of monocytes flooding back into the blood, which can be

important components of inflammation. On problematic. Fasting, therefore regulates this pool in ways that are not always beneficial to the body's capacity to respond to a challenge such as an infection," said Dr. Swirski, adding, "Because these cells are so important to other diseases like heart disease or cancer, understanding how their function is controlled is critical.

She also made the fruit growers aware about friendly insects and suggested spraying of horticultural mineral oils at the green bud stage to prevent the hatching of winter eggs of the mite. If the number of mites per leaf becomes 6-8 then insecticides should be sprayed, she suggested.

On the occasion, fruit expert Neena Chauhan, plant pathologist Dr. Usha Sharma and soil expert Dr. Upendra Sharma provided important information related to horticulture to the fruit growers.

NZ vs Eng: Kiwis fight back, take battle to Day 4

Southee played a valiant knock 73 off 49 balls but it was not enough to take the hosts across the line in the second and final Test against visitors New Zealand on Sunday

New Zealand ended their first innings with a score of 209, with the visitors deciding to impose the follow-on in the hope of the Kiwis crumbling under pressure. But the hosts had something else in store for the English bowlers.

Patience is a virtue was the story of Day-3 and this story was justified by the Kiwi openers as Tom Latham and Devon Conway with their knocks of 83(172) and 61(155), respectively, gave New Zealand a glimmer of hope

The way things unfolded for the hosts in the first session, it looked like they would give up sooner or later and England would walk away with another simple victory. But the opening pair of Latham and Conway led the fightback with a crucial partnership of 149. After finally getting the breakthrough, England capitalised quickly to take wickets at regular intervals. Devon Conway became the first victim of Jack Leach. With his partner gone, Tom Latham didn't survive long on the Day-3. He gave his wicket away to Joe Root. Will Young came in to restore New Zealand's hope once again. He tried to settle on the pitch first but ended up falling to Jack Leach. After losing three wickets in a span of 10 overs Kane Williamson and Henry Nicholls stepped up to re-ignite New Zealand's innings. The hosts ended the day with a score of 202/3.

Rio Open: Carlos Alcaraz beat Nicolas Jarry to set Cameron Norrie showdown in final

RIO DE JANEIRO: World No.2 Carlos Alcaraz produced an outstanding performance to conjure a stunning comeback victory over Nicolas Jarry in the semi-finals to set a summit clash against Cameron Norrie in the ongoing Rio Open.

At the Rio Open semifinals on Saturday, qualifier Nicolas Jarry was giving the Spaniard all he could handle. In the second set, the Chilean came within two games of winning twice, at 4-4 and 5-5, with Alcaraz requiring treatment for an injury to his uppe left thigh after each time he held

Yet precisely when he appeared to be most at riskfrom serving out the opening set at 5-3--the 19-yearold went on a devastating eight-game run to win 6-7(2), 7-5, 6-0. Both men had winning streaks going into the contest, which was shown in their performances against Court Guga Kuerten. Alcaraz stopped Jarry's five-match winning streak in Rio by moving to 8-0 on the season. Jarry had won three matches in the main draw and two matches in

qualifying without dropping a set. Early in the match, Jarry dominated Alcaraz, quickly jumping out to a 3-0 lead and making it three sets in a row where the Spaniard gave up the first break.

Camila Giorgi to face Swedish qualifier Rebecca Peterson in Merida Open final

MERIDA: Camila Giorgi of Italy will face Swedish qualifier Rebecca Peterson in the final of the Merida Open on Sunday. Ranked No.68, the 31-year-old Italian defeated

No.4 seed Katerina Siniakova 7-5, 7-6(2) in the semifinals to advance to her 10th career final and first since winning Montreal in 2021.

Giorgi has had a successful week in Merida. She has won all four of her matches without dropping a set, including the guarterfinal match against No 2 seed Sloane Stephens, which she defeated 6-0, 6-0. Giorgi's victory marked her maiden career double-bagel triumph.

Giorgi stunned Siniakova on Saturday night with

her assured power game and clutch play, rallying from 4-2 down in the first set to win it 7-5. She defeated the current No. 1 in doubles to take a 7-5. 5-2 lead, but Siniakova forced a tiebreak by taking advantage of a drop in the Italian's performance. After 2 hours and 11 minutes, Giorgi reacted by playing a calm and composed tiebreak to break the Czech's momentum and secure the victory. Giorgi outperformed Siniakova, who had 17 victories to 33 unforced mistakes, by winning the match with 25 to 23. She now leads Siniakova 3-1 in their head-tohead matchups after winning their last three meetings. After overcoming a 4-0 deficit to defeat Caty McNally in the final set, Peterson won 6-2, 6-7(4), 6-4 to become the fourth qualifier to reach a WTA Tour final this year.

10 men Atletico Madrid hold Real Madrid for a 1-1 draw

MADRID: Real Madrid was left frustrated by Diego Simeone's men as the match ended with the scores level at Santiago Bernabeu. With a resolve to get close to the league leaders Barcelona, Real Madrid stepped on the pitch to reduce the gap between both teams to five points. However, things didn't pan out as they had initially thought they would. Two set pieces were enough to decide the fate of this Madrid derby.

Atletico went down to 10 men as the clock struck the 64th-minute mark. The 27-year-old Argentinian attacker Angel Correa was shown a straight red card after he elbowed Antonio Rudiger off the ball. Correa pushed his arm on Rudiger's chest as the former Chelsea man fell straight on the ground in

On any other day, Real Madrid would have easily put two or three goals past Atletico's or any other team's defence. However, in this case, Atletico held their ground and breached the host's defence in the 78th minute of the game. The French wizard Antoine Griezmann produced a delightful cross from a set piece and Jose Maria Jimenez rose high to head the ball into the back of the net. With time running out Los Blancos, they shifted their gears to find the equalizer. In the 85th minute. Carlo Ancelotti's gamble paid off as the 18-year-old Alvaro Rodriguez levelled the game following a cross from the Croatian maestro Luka Modric. After playing an extra game Real Madrid are now seven points behind Xavi's Barcelona

Irani Cup: Mayank Agarwal to lead Rest of India



GWALIOR: India batter Mayank Agarwal will be captaining the Rest of India (ROI) team against Madhya Pradesh in the Irani Cup, which will commence on March 1 at Captain Roop Singh Stadium in Gwalior.

Agarwal has been rewarded for being the leading run-scorer of the recently-concluded Ranji Trophy season where he scored 990 runs in 13 innings, with a highest score of 249.

The Irani Cup venue was shifted to Gwalior from Indore after the third India-Australia Test was assigned to the Holkar Stadium, hence the game had to be moved from its original location. The Irani Cup match will mark Gwalior's return to first-class competition after more than six years.

Mumbai's Sarfaraz Khan is the

most noteworthy exclusion from the 16-member roster, which has not vet been formally revealed by the BCCI.

According to ESPNcricinfo, Sarfaraz, who has been phenomenal with the bat over the past three seasons, has been told to take 8-10 days off to recover from a finger injury he suffered while competing in the DY Patil T20 Cup in Mumbai. Sarfaraz is now nursing his injury at a Delhi Capitals conditioning camp in

Agarwal last featured for India in March 2022 in a Test against Sri Lanka and has since failed to secure his place on the national side. The right-hander is eyeing a comeback after a stellar

Abhimanyu Easwaran, the Bengal opening batsman, will partner

Agarwal at the top. Abhimanyu, who was a member of the Test squad that travelled to Bangladesh in December, is also hoping to make a breakthrough. He had previously led India A on a shadow tour to Bangladesh when he scored two consecutive hundreds. The other toporder batsmen on the Rest of India team include Yash Dhull, Sudip Kumar Gharami, Yashasvi Jaiswal, B Indrajith, and Sudip Kumar Gharami. With 803 and 798 runs respectively, Gharami and Abhimanyu finished sixth and seventh in the Ranji top run scorers list as Bengal finished as runners-up.

Only two members of Saurashtra's championship-winning team were chosen, left-arm seamer Chetan Sakariya and wicketkeeper-opener

A four-man attack featuring Sakariya, Navdeep Saini from Delhi, and Mukesh Kumar and Akash Deep from Bengal completes the fastbowling unit's well-rounded composition. Saini will be making a comeback after suffering an abdominal muscle strain on India A tour to Bangladesh. The only seambowling all-rounder in the mix is Atith Sheth of Baroda

Jalaj Saxena, the Kerala allrounder, and Shams Mulani, the Mumbai all-rounder, two of the season's top wicket-takers, are not a part of the squad despite having taken 50 and 46 wickets, respectively.

The selection committee, comprising SS Das, S Sharath, Salil Ankola, and Subroto Bannerjee, have picked Saurabh Kumar of Uttar Pradesh, a left-arm spinner, and Mayank Markande of Punjab, a legspinner.

The fact that the selectors are eager to offer opportunities to legspinners in red-ball cricket is probably one of the reasons Markande is still in the running despite having taken only 22 wickets from seven games. Rahul Chahal and Ravi Bishnoi are Markande's closest rivals. While Chahar did not play at all for Rajasthan, Bishnoi only participated in one game.

In the absence of regular captain Aditya Shrivastava, wicketkeeperbatsman Himanshu Mantri will lead Madhya Pradesh. With Rajat Patidar, Venkatesh Iyer, Avesh Khan, Shubham Sharma, and Yash Dubey all in the mix, the core group that won the Ranji Trophy in June of last year has mostly been retained.

INDORE, FEB 26 (UNI) India has looked a much better side than Australia in the ongoing Border Gayaskar Test series. The hosts have won the first two Tests comprehensively, but there is a gaping hole in their armoury - a brittle batting order.

India has retained the Border-Gavaskar Trophy, but a big challenge faces them is to qualify for the ICC Test Championship final. The underperforming middle order has been a bane for India. The big names haven't delivered the goods, and this has become a big headache for Captain Rohit Sharma. Virat Kohli and Chteshwar Pujara have scored a combined 114 runs in this series so far.

The top order has not delivered yet in the series. In the three innings they played, Rohit, Kohli, Pujara and KL Rahul have scored 183, 76, 38, 38, respectively and Shreyas Iyer scored 16 in 2 innings.

Except, Rohit no other top order batsman has gotten a half-century, and this has left the lower-order in the lurch, though it has been doing all the heavy-lifting with aplomb.

Axar Patel has been outstanding with the bat, while Ravindra Jadeia and Ravichadran Ashwin have lived up to their allrounder tag to perfection. The trio have contributed a combined 314 runs in the series.

The lower-order have been

the last two years, they have put their foot down and produced sparkling batting displays, both on home soil and on foreign territory.

In the recent past, the Indian allrounders have been phenomenal with the bat at home. Pant has been at the heart of most of the lower-order rescues, but the likes of Jadeia, Axar, Ashwin and Washington Sundar have played their role to the team.

India's allrounders have produced 13 fifty-plus stands since 2021, the most by any side. And Sundar has scored 181 in 4 innings, Jadeja (347 in 7), Rishabh Pant (455 in 9), Axar (355 in 12) and Ashwin

Since 2018, Jadeia is the only allrounder to take more than 50 wickets and average over 40 in Tests.

Over the years Team India have been craving for batting depth, and fortunately the allrounders are delivering way better than the biggest batting stars. The Indian fans could see more rescue acts staged by them if the mega stars fail.

It might take a while for big stars to come out with flying colours with their bats, but till then the Indian fans could be in for watching Jadeja's celebrations embellished with his swivelling bat, Ashwin's extraordinary shots, and of course Mohammad Shami's towering sixes.
