## Modi, PM Albanese celebrate 75 years of friendship through cricket

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and visiting Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese on Thursday shared some cricketing moments together at the Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad as the two leaders opened the 4th India-Australia Test match, in celebration of 75 years of friendship through cricket. PM Modi in a tweet said that cricket is a common passion for both countries and both sides share a fierce but friendly rivalry.

"Cricket, a common passion in

India and Australia! Glad to be in Ahmedabad with my good friend, PM @AlboMP to witness parts of the India-Australia Test Match. I am sure it will be an exciting game!

"As two cricket-loving nations, Australia and India share a fierce but friendly rivalry." Australian PM Anthony Albanese, who took a selfie with PM Modi in the stadium, in a tweet said:

"Celebrating 75 years of friendship though cricket with Indian Prime Minister @narendramodi."

"At the heart of this contest is genuine respect, reflecting the affection and friendship between our peo-

ples. "On the field, Australia and India are competing to be the best in the world. Off the field, we are co-operating to build a better world. Prime Minister @narendramodi and I had the honour of opening the fourth test in Gujarat today. Good luck to all the players (but go Australia!)" The two prime ministers took a lap of honour around the in a special chariot ahead of the fourth and final India-Australia Test Match, as the crowd cheered and roared. The two PMs waved to the cheering crowd, and later watched the Test match together. Australia won the toss and elected to bat.



## Now Manish Sisodia arrested by ED

Former Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Thursday in connection with the Delhi liquor policy case. Sisodia is already in Delhi's Tihar jail after the CBI arrested him in connection with the same case.

On Tuesday, Manish Sisodia was questioned for 45 minutes by the ED officials inside the Tihar jail, sources in the Aam Aadmi Party said. He was questioned in Tihar Jail from 10:15 am to 11 am.

The federal probe agency had previously on March 7 also questioned and recorded the statement of Sisodia in Tihar prison.

Sisodia was arrested on February 26 by the CBI in connection with suspected corruption in the creation and implementation of the now-canceled Delhi liquor or excise policy for 2021-22. He is being held in judicial custody until March 20th.

However, the court is going to hear Sisodia's bail application on March 10.

During Sisodia's custody, the CBI questioned him with his former secretary C. Arvind and then Excise Commissioner Arava Gopi Krishna in connection with suspected excise policy manipulation.



Sisodia was not included as an accused in the charge sheet issued by the CBI in the case on November 25, 2022.

The Delhi Government's excise policy for 2021-22, which grants licences to liquor merchants, is said to have facilitated cartelisation and favoured particular deal-

ers who reportedly paid bribes for it, a claim strenuously denied by the AAP.

The policy was then repealed, and the Delhi L-G requested a CBI investigation, after which the ED filed a case under the PMLA against the same accused.

## Uproar in Punjab Assembly over Sidhu Moosewala case

Noisy scenes were witnessed in Punjab Assembly on Thursday as opposition members raised the issue of security withdrawal of Sidhu Moosewala. There were heated exchanges between minister Kuldeep Dhaliwal and Congress leaders Amarinder Singh Raja Warring and Partap Bajwa. Congress MLAs staged a walkout later. Moosewala, 28, was shot dead on May 29 last year in Mansa, a day after the state government curtailed his security cover.

The Punjabi singer was shot at point-blank range and declared dead on arrival at the Mansa civil

hospital. The assailants fired over 30 rounds at Moosewala, who was found slumped in the driver's seat by locals. The investigation suggested Lawrence Bishnoi was the mastermind of the daylight killing. His close aide Goldy Brar, who is said to be based in Canada, was also under investigation in this case. Police issued a Red Corner Notice against Brar through Interpol. The incident occurred two days after Punjab Police withdrew the security cover of 424 persons, including that of Moosewala.

Moosewala had fought an election from Mansa in the last Assembly election on a Congress ticket but was defeated by AAP's Vijay Singla.

## HP CM dedicates Trauma Centre in IGMC to people

**SHIMLA:** Chief Minister, Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today dedicated the 'Trauma Centre' in the new multi-storey OPD block of the Indira Gandhi Medical College and Hospital (IGMC) completed with an outlay of Rs. 30.90 crore.

With the opening of the new OPD ward, the doctors, the paramedical staff and the patients will have a better environment to work in and will enable best medical care to the patients. This will also reduce congestion due to heavy rush of the patients in the OPDs. He said that a sum of Rs. 12 crore was being spent to buy new equipment and machinery for the surgery wing, the orthopedic unit, the radiology and anesthesia section. The new OPD block will house a Physiotherapy ward, Special wards, Emergency



Unit, Intensive Care Unit (ICU), Isolation ward, Computerized Tomography (CT) Scan, X-ray, Sample Collection Centre and Pathology lab facilities. The block will have a special provision to treat the seriously injured and other serious patients on priority.

## CS directs to certify inundated agriculture land in the state

**BUREAU CHANDIGARH, MARCH 9-**

Realising the direction of the Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal to identify the inundated agriculture land and prepare schemes to deal with the problem of floods or stagnant water before the sowing season commences, the Chief Secretary, Mr. Sanjeev Kaushal convened a meeting of senior officers of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare and Irrigation and Water Resources Departments here today.

The Chief Secretary set a timeline for the completion of mapping of such areas in the state. He directed the officers to get the certification of inundated land by the Agriculture and Irrigation Department twice in a year i.e. by May 15 and October 31 every year.

The Certification of inundated

land means "the process of assessing and documenting the extent to which a particular piece of land is subject to flooding or other forms of inundation.



The process typically involves a site inspection by a qualified professional, such as a hydrologist or civil engineer,

who will assess the topography of the land, its proximity to water sources, and other factors that may influence its susceptibility to flooding or other forms of inundation. Mr. Kaushal also directed the officers to assess the areas, where groundwater rises to the surface, in the state. He further directed the officers to regularly keep a vigil on the problem of water logging arising due to the natural disasters like heavy rains and flash floods. The meeting was called as a follow up of the review meeting held by the Chief Minister to review public grievances received by way of CM window.

Kidney health starts at home: Dr Navjit Singh Sidhu

On World Kidney Day, it is important for individuals in India to be aware of the risk factors for kidney disease and take steps to prevent it.

Dr. Navjit Singh Sidhu, Associate Director, Nephrology, Paras Hospitals, Panchkula said that all of us have two kidneys each in our body which perform very important functions for us. These include excretion of metabolic waste products, regulation of water and electrolyte and acid base balance in our body.

The kidneys also control our blood pressure and secrete a few hormones. The occurrence of kidney disease, known as chronic kidney disease (CKD) when it is irreversible and permanent is increasing worldwide and has become a global health concern. About 11 to 13 percent



of the world population is suffering from it out of which about three fourth have early or mild disease and remaining one fourth have relatively advanced disease. In India about 200000 new cases of CKD are detected every year and this number is increasing by the day. The two most common and important causes of this increase worldwide are increase in patients of diabetes and high blood pressure. Other common causes are some hereditary and congenital diseases, kidney

stones, recurrent urinary tract infections and increased intake of pain killer drugs. We can maintain good healthy kidneys and prevent kidney disease by keeping a meticulous control of our blood sugar and blood pressure. One should do regular exercise, maintain an ideal body weight and consume a healthy fluid intake.

Smoking and alcohol consumption should be avoided. One should avoid self-medication and prolonged use of pain killer drugs.

Also, consumption of muscle bulk enhancing products should be avoided. Early symptoms of CKD include a feeling of less energy and tiredness, puffiness around eyes, swelling of feet and ankles and a feeling to urinate more often at night. Later one may have nausea, vomiting, pallor, decreased urine output and breathlessness.

Rogue algorithms

What legal responsibilities do social media intermediaries have when they direct users to extremist, violent, and unlawful content through their algorithms? Can SMIs be held criminally liable if it is shown that these algorithms helped foment riots or terrorist attacks? These are some of the questions that the US Supreme Court is currently considering in Gonzalez vs Google and Twitter vs Taamneh, two cases tackling tech platforms' liability for recommendation algorithms.

Nohemi Gonzalez perished in an Islamic State-backed terrorist strike in Paris in 2015. Her family claimed that YouTube and its parent company, Google, encouraged terrorism by pushing ISIS recruitment videos to users. The Twitter vs Taamneh lawsuit arises from another ISIS-linked terrorist attack in Istanbul in 2017 that killed 39 people. Invoking the Anti-Terrorism Act, the family of one of the victims has sued Twitter, Google and Facebook. By hosting and directing people to ISIS content, these online platforms, it is alleged, contributed to the attack's instigation. The two cases challenge the protections granted to online platforms by Section 230 of the Communications Decency Act.

In India, under the Information Technology Act, 2000, an intermediary is not liable for the third-party information that it holds or transmits. However, to claim such exemption, it must comply with the due diligence standards under the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021. In accordance with the 2021 rules, SMIs are expected to "make reasonable" attempts to stop users from hosting illegal content on their platform. After receiving a complaint, they must take down any data or communication links related to the forbidden categories of content. Additional due diligence responsibilities include appointing personnel for compliance, enabling identification of the first originator of the information on its platform, and deploying technology-based measures to identify certain types of content. But the use of algorithms to prioritise or de-prioritise particular posts is not covered by Indian IT regulations.

According to some news reports, under the forthcoming Digital India Act meant to replace the IT Act, 2000, the Indian government is considering making online platforms accountable for algorithms they deploy to tailor content based on the specific browsing history and profiles of users. But it seems that the idea is restricted to preventing the misuse of Indian citizens' data. What requires serious policy and legal debate is the criminal responsibility of algorithms in amplifying harmful content.

Honda closes its plant in Pakistan

Amid the ongoing financial crunch in Pakistan, another car maker company Honda on Wednesday announced to close its plant citing severe disruption in supply chain as major reason, reported Geo News.

Honda Atlas Cars --the assembler of Honda automobiles in the country blamed current economic situation for its decision and said that the plant will remain closed from March 9 to 31.

The car maker company said that it would not be able to continue with its production and will be shutting down its plant for the remainder of the month. The automaker, in a notice sent to the Pakistan Stock Exchange, said that the decision has been taken as the company's supply chain has been "severely disrupted," reported Geo News. "Considering the current economic situation of Pakistan whereby the government resorted to stringent measures including restricting the opening of LCs (letter of credits) for import of CKD (completely knocked-down) kits, raw materials and halting foreign payments, the company's supply chain has also been severely disrupted by such measures," the company said highlighting all the reasons for the plant shutdown. Consequently, it said that the company "is not in a position to continue with its production and ultimately has to shut down its plant from March 9



to March 31." Earlier, Pak Suzuki Motor Company (PSMC) and Indus Motor Company (IMC), the assembler of Toyota-brand automobiles in Pakistan, also announced to completely shut down its production plant. Pakistan's auto industry, which is heavily dependent on imports, has been caught in the midst of an exchange-rate crisis, as the SBP, after unabated rupee depreciation,

imposed restrictions on the opening of Letters of Credit (LCs), reported Geo News.

Pakistan's economic growth is slowing as one of the highest inflation rates -- and higher borrowing costs -- erodes demand and a plunge in the rupee makes the import of key automobile parts more expensive. The auto sector remains engulfed in various crises, with a number of automakers announcing complete or partial shutdowns in recent months citing various reasons including reduced demand in the market and the company's inability to maintain inventory as companies struggle to secure LCs.

The industry is also hit by import restrictions the coalition government had introduced to control the trade deficit, reported Geo News. Not only the production activity has affected the companies

also raised the prices of their CKD models which dented people's already low purchasing power. The country remains short of much-needed dollars to meet its import and other external payment commitments. The central bank's foreign exchange reserves stand at just over USD 3.8 billion, barely enough for a month of essential imports. However, they are due to get a boost as a loan

inflow from the Industrial and Commercial Bank of China (ICBC) makes its way to the State Bank of Pakistan's forex reserves, reported Geo News. Meanwhile, the government is constantly trying to woo the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to revive the stalled Extended Fund Facility (EFF) programme, which if approved by its board would release a funding tranche of over USD 1 billion.

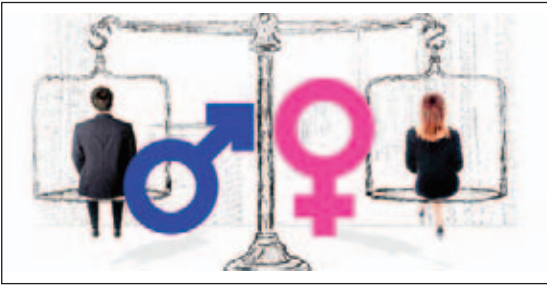

Greater gender equality helps both women and men live longer

The first global study to investigate how gender equality may be associated with life expectancy has found that both men's and women live longer as it improves.

However, variations between countries grouped into regions according to socioeconomic development and geographic proximity suggest that while mainly benefiting men's lives and health at first, progress in gender equality helps men to live longer too, eventually narrowing the gender gap in life expectancy.

Lead author Dr Cat Pinho-Gomes, Honorary Research Fellow at The George Institute for Global Health, UK in partnership with Imperial College London, said the results - published in the lead up to International Women's Day - suggest that addressing longstanding gender inequality and empowering men's lives might help extend longevity for both men's and women. "Many of the factors



that determine how long you will live - like working and living conditions, exposure to pollution, access to health care, education, income, and social support - are layered with gender differences around the world," she said.

"As countries make greater progress towards gender equality and men's lives are afforded the opportunity to participate more fully in political, economic, and social life, the whole of society reaps the rewards."

According to the latest report by the World Economic Forum, global events such as the rising cost of living, the COVID-19 pandemic, the climate emergency and large-scale conflict and displacement

are stalling progress towards gender parity. This may, in turn, jeopardise socioeconomic development and improvement in living and working conditions, curbing the gains in life expectancy that have occurred over the past decades.

To investigate whether gender equality was associated with life expectancy (LE) for men's and women and men and assess the gender gap in life expectancy across the globe, the researchers used a modified global gender gap index (mGGGI), based on the index developed by the World Economic Forum (WEF), and applied it across 156 countries between 2010 and 2021.

CCP will work to press Taiwan on unification

US in its Annual Threat Assessment Report said that China's Communist Party (CCP) will work to press Taiwan on unification, undercut US influence, drive wedges between Washington and its partners, and foster some norms that favour its authoritarian system.

The report prepared by US Intelligence further stated that the People's Republic of China (PRC) uses coordinated, whole-of-government tools to demonstrate strength and compel neighbours to acquiesce to its preferences, including its land, sea, and air claims in the region and its assertions of sovereignty over Taiwan.

In 2023, Beijing will continue to apply pressure and possibly offer inducements for Taiwan to move toward unification and will react to what it views as increased US-Taiwan engagement, said the report.

Beijing's control over Taiwan, if it succeeded in accomplishing its goal, probably would have wide-ranging effects, including disruption to global supply chains for semiconductor chips because Taiwan dominates production of cutting-edge chips.

Moreover, in the South China Sea, Beijing will continue to use growing numbers of air, naval, coast guard, and militia forces to intimidate rival claimants and to attempt to signal that China has effective control over contested areas. Similarly, China is pressuring Japan over contested areas in the East China Sea. Beijing will try to expand its influence abroad and its efforts to be viewed as a champion of global development via several initiatives--including the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) and Xi's new flagship poli-



cies--the Global Development Initiative and the Global Security Initiative. Beijing has attempted to use these programs and initiatives to promote a China-led alternative to often US and Western-dominated international development and security forums and frameworks, added the report.

Beijing is working to meet its goal of fielding a military by 2027 designed to deter US intervention in a future cross-strait crisis. China is reorienting its nuclear posture for strategic rivalry with the United States because its leaders have concluded that their current capabilities are insufficient. Beijing worries that bilateral tension, US nuclear modernization, and the PLA's advancing conventional capabilities have increased the likelihood of a US first strike.

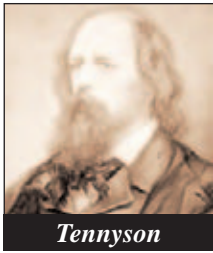
The report also added that China will remain the top threat to US technological competitiveness, as Beijing targets key sectors and proprietary commercial and military technology from US and allied companies and institutions.

China is central to global supply chains in a range of technology sectors, including semiconductors, critical minerals, batteries, solar panels, and pharmaceuticals.

Mobile gadgets divert teens' attention from bad thoughts before sleep

According to new Flinders University research, overuse of mobile devices has a bad rap, but one advantage may be their capacity to provide a distraction and improve teens' ability to sleep.

Feedback from more than 600 teenagers from age 12 to 18 at South Australian schools between June and September 2019 has led the international research group to point to a more nuanced view on using the wide range of mobile content -- led by Youtube, music apps, Instagram and Snapchat -- before young people's bedtime.

"Many teenagers struggle with a racing mind when sleep doesn't come easy," said lead corresponding author Dr Serena Bauducco, a visiting post-doctoral researcher from Orebro University, Sweden. "This study shows that many adolescents use technology to



distract themselves from negative thoughts, which may help them manage the sleep-onset process. Thus, distraction

may be one mechanism explaining how sleep affects technology use, rather than vice-versa," the study concludes.

The majority of 631 adolescents surveyed used technology as a distraction from negative or distressing thoughts, with 23.6% answering "yes" and 38.4% "sometimes," according to the study published in the journal Sleep Advances (Oxford Academic).

However, the study did reveal a higher tendency of app use among the young people with existing sleep problems compared to those not reporting a sleep problem, leading researchers to caution that other solutions are needed to help teenagers to fall asleep.

Passive entertainment, via music apps or Youtube video clips, or interacting with peers via Instagram or Snapchat were considered the most popular distractions.

First author of the study, Flinders University psychology graduate Ms Alexandra Daniels, says the complex relationship between sleep and technology is illustrated by a tendency for some adolescents with sleep problems to more frequently use devices before bed.

"This study helps to provide evidence to suggest that the relationship between teenagers, technology and sleep is much more complex than the previously accepted idea that technology use prior to sleep onset is always negative and harmful," she said.

South Australian child and adolescent sleep expert Professor Michael Gradisar, who conceived the idea behind the study, says the research suggests that recommendations for focused use of certain apps could become an integral part of some adolescents' sleep

routines, to help them regulate their negative thoughts.

Flinders University sleep psychology graduate Professor Gradisar, who now focuses on a range of technologies as Head of Sleep Science at Sleep Cycle in Sweden, says good sleep habits from infancy through adolescence is important to set healthy sleep routines into adulthood.

Respondents in the study were asked which app was likely to distract them from any negative or distressing thoughts - from messaging, phone calls, Instagram, Facebook, Snapchat, Twitter, Youtube, Reddit, Tumblr and the Spotify/iTunes/Apple Music, Netflix/Stan, Viber/WhatsApp, gaming app, audiobook or 'other'. Participants reported multiple technology preferences including mobile phone, iPad, laptop, desktop computer, iPod/MP3

player, television, gaming console or 'other'.

Researchers note the recent rise in popularity of TikTok and other apps in a rapidly changing field.

A previous study in Sleep Medicine by the Flinders University researchers aligned use of phones, laptops and gaming consoles by secondary school students in the hour before bed, or in bed before sleep onset, were associated with increased odds of insufficient sleep in school nights.

"Evening technology use should be monitored for feasible limits and harm minimisation because technology will remain an integral part of adolescents' evenings," they conclude.

The National Sleep Foundations recommends that adolescents aged 14-17 years sleep between 8 and 10 hours per night.

Urgent Attention Required to Tackle Alarming Increase in Breast Cancer Cases among Indian Women

Ludhiana, March, 7: –Breast cancer is a type of cancer that affects breast tissue and can occur in both men and women. In India, breast cancer accounts for 14% of cases, surpassing cervical cancer, making it the leading cancer among women. The state of Punjab has witnessed a 23.1% increase in breast cancer incidences in the last five years, according to a report by the Punjab State Cancer and Drug Addiction Treatment Infrastructure Board. Dr Harish Matta, Additional Director General & OncoSurgery, Fortis Ludhiana, highlights the alarming trend of decreasing age incidences of breast cancer. Detecting cancer in its early stages is crucial for better recovery, as younger patients tend to have more aggressive forms of the disease with more social and familial impact. In case of any noticeable abnormalities, one must visit a doctor without any delay. In addition to self-examination, women should get regular mammograms to screen for breast cancer. Women over 40 should get a mammogram every one or two year, and those with a family history of breast cancer should start getting mammograms earlier", advises Dr Harish Matta, Fortis Ludhiana. Dr Gursimran Kaur, Consultant - Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Fortis Ludhiana, "It's natural for a woman to worry while reading about breast cancer but now there have been new advancements as well in breast cancer treatment. Some simple steps can help lower the risk of breast cancer. 

# Satish Kaushik leaves behind enduring legacy of talent, compassion, humility



Leaving behind a trail of tears and grief, veteran Bollywood icon Satish Kaushik passed away on Thursday at the age of 66 after suffering a heart attack.
