Both houses adjourned amid ruckus over Rahul

Within minutes of the commencement of proceedings of both Houses, Rajya Sabha was adjourned and Lok Sabha till 4 pm on Monday, amid Opposition MPs' protest in the second phase of the Budget Session.

They were sloganeering over the Adani Group issue and Rahul Gandhi's disqualification.

Earlier today, the opposition MPs held a meeting at the chamber of LoP Rajya Sabha and Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge in the Parliament building on Monday to formulate the strategy for the day. The opposition parties which participated in the meeting include DMK, Samajwadi Party, JD(U), Bharat Rashttra Samithi, CPI(M), RJD, Nationalist Congress Party, CPI, IUML, MDMK, Kerala Congress, TMC, RSP, AAP, J-K NC and Shiv Sena (Uddhav faction). Trinamool Congress MPs also participated in the meeting which came as a huge development



following Rahul Gandhi's suspension as MP from Lok Sabha. TMC chief and West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, who has been a critic of the BJP, supported Rahul Gandhi. "In PM Modi's New India, Opposition leaders have become the prime target of the BJP! While BJP leaders with criminal antecedents are inducted into the cabinet, Opposition leaders are disqualified for their speeches. Today, we have witnessed a new

low for our constitutional democracy," the TMC Supremo had earlier said.

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge welcomed TMC's move to participate in the meeting stating that anyone who comes forward to "protect democracy" is welcome.

"I thank everyone who supported this. That is why, I thanked everyone yesterday and I thank them today as well. We welcome anyone who comes forward to protect democracy and Constitution and safeguard the people. We extend heartfelt gratitude to the people who support us," Kharge said.

India asks Nepal not to allow Amritpal to flee to third country

India has requested the Nepal government not to allow fugitive radical preacher Amritpal Singh, who is believed to be hiding in Nepal, to flee to a third country and arrest him if he attempts to escape using Indian passport or any other fake passport, a media report said on Monday.

In a letter sent to the Department of Consular Services on Saturday, the Indian Embassy in Kathmandu has requested the government agencies to arrest Singh if he tries to flee from Nepal, the Kathmandu Post newspaper reported.

"Singh is currently hiding in Nepal," the paper said, citing a copy of



any third country and arrest him if he attempts to escape from Nepal using Indian Passport or any other fake passport under intimation to this mission," it said.

The letter and Singh's personal details have been circulated to all the concerned agencies from hotels to airlines, the paper said, citing multiple sources. Singh, who is said to be possessing multiple passports with different identities, has been on the run since March 18 when the police launched a crackdown against him.

The elusive preacher gave the police the slip and escaped their dragnet when his cavalcade was intercepted in Punjab's Jalandhar district.

Opposition MPs march towards Vijay Chowk in black attire

NEW DELHI: In an attempt to show unity, the opposition parties protested against the Centre over the Adani Group issue wearing black attire and marched from the Parliament complex towards Vijay Chowk in the national capital on Monday. The opposition MPs raised slogans against the government at the Gandhi statue in the complex and demanded the constitution of a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) over the Adani issue. Congress president Rajya Sabha LoP Mallikarjun Kharge and UPA chairperson Sonia Gandhi also joined the protest. During the march, Kharge was seen holding the hands of other MPs and marching. A banner of Satyameva Jayate was also seen. Other opposition MPs were seen holding placards. The MPs chanted slogans against the Centre and Prime Minister Narendra Modi linking him with Adani. The march comes after both the Houses of the Parliament were adjourned within minutes of their commencement.

Mann announces relief from repayment of loans taken by farmers from primary agricultural societies

BUREAU CHANDIGARH: In a major pro-farmer initiative, the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Monday announced to freeze repayment of loan taken by the farmers from Primary Agricultural co-operative Societies.

The Chief Minister has taken the decision in wake of the losses suffered by the farmers due to recent rain and hailstorm. He expressed hope that this will give much needed relief to the farmers in this



hour of crisis. Bhagwant Mann said that the farmers can pay back this amount later after they recover from the

losses. The Chief Minister envisioned that this will prove boon to the farmers of state by giving them more time to repay their loans and avoid imposition of penal interest, which will have been levied on farmers who did not repay the loan. He said that the state cooperatives lends crores of rupees per crop to the farmers of Punjab as short term crop loan through the Primary Agricultural Cooperative Societies.

Union Minister Anurag Thakur on Monday lashed out at the Congress' "drama" over Rahul Gandhi's disqualification from Lok Sabha and questioned whether leaders of the Opposition party will "continue to wearing black clothes after their black deeds". Thakur also took a jibe at Rahul Gandhi claiming that that he was not ready to accept the verdict by Surat court which convicted him in a 2019 defamation case on his 'Modi surname' remark. Dressed in black clothes, members of Opposition parties earlier today marched from Parliament complex towards Vijay Chowk in protest against the Centre's inaction over the Adani issue.

"Rahul Gandhi and Congress have been insulting the OBC community. Has the Congress party stopped believing in the courts? Rahul Gandhi's arrogance is such that he did not apologise to the OBC community, or in the court. He is not ready to accept



the court's judgment. The order was of the court. His membership ended soon after the court delivered its verdict. Why are they creating this drama now?" Thakur said. "They are not letting the Parliament session run for one man who goes abroad and insults India. And when he returns, the Parliament cannot run if he does not speak. Will the Congress party keep on insulting the OBC community like this? Will Congress keep wearing black clothes after doing black

deeds? Will the party now resort to black magic to save itself?" the union minister. Asked about assertions by Rahul Gandhi that he would never express any regret for criticising the BJP-led government, Thakur stated that the Congress leader can never be Veer Savarkar even in his "best dreams" as it as it required strong determination and love for the country. The new Letter of Undertaking Form for FY 2023-24 is available on GST Portal for making zero rated supplies on or after 01-04-2023



WHAT IS LETTER OF UNDERTAKING

All zero rated supplies are subject to payment of IGST, which can later be reclaimed as Refund. Any eligible supplier* registered under the CGST Act can furnish LUT in FORM GST RFD-11 and made zero rated supply of Goods or Services or both without payment of IGST.

- Enter the required details and submit FORM GST RFD-11

In a major gift to residents of Jalandhar, the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Monday dedicated and kicked off development projects worth around Rs 100 crore to give facelift to the city.

The Chief Minister dedicated newly constructed automatic fermented milk product plant of Verka at a cost of Rs 84 crore to the city residents. Likewise, he also virtually inaugurated the Smart school at Basti Danishmandi at a cost of Rs 4.83 crore. Bhagwant Mann also laid foundation stone of roads and street lights to be installed at Leather complex in the city.

Meanwhile addressing the gathering, the Chief Minister said that Jalandhar will be developed as a model city in the coming days.



He said that no stone will be left unturned for this noble cause. Bhagwant Mann also announced to give impetus to the sports industry in the city. The Chief Minister said that in a major relief to the farmers of the state the state government has announced 25% upward revision in the compensation for the crop loss to the farmers.

He said that in case the loss is more than 75% then the state government will compensate the farmers with Rs 15,000 per acre. Bhagwant Mann said that the motive is to ensure the well being of the farmers at all costs.

The Chief Minister said that the compensation was earlier only 12,000 but his government has decided to

enhance it. He said that earlier the entire process was a sham as the government used to give meagre compensation to farmers. Bhagwant Mann said that instead of giving relief to farmers the previous governments used to rub salt into wounds of food growers. The Chief Minister said that fully Automated Fermented Milk

Product Plant with capacity of 1.25 lakh litre per day milk has been constructed at a cost of Rs.84 Crore. He said that it has fully automated Dahi Plant of 50 MT/Day and Lassi processing and packaging infrastructure of 1.5 Lakh Litre/Day.

Bhagwant Mann envisioned that this step will go a long way in ensuring remunerative rate of milk to milk producers of Jalandhar, Kapurthala & SBS Nagar Districts besides providing direct or indirect employment opportunities to the youth and entrepreneurs of adjoining areas. The Chief Minister said that a year ago the people of state had voted them to power by pressing a button on the EVM. Bhagwant Mann said that today within a year he is pressing four-five buttons daily for dedicating new projects to the people of the state.

Vigilance bureau arrests patwari
for taking bribe Rs 24,000

The Punjab Vigilance Bureau (VB) during its anti-corruption campaign, has arrested a revenue Patwari Prem Kumar, posted at revenue halqua, Nawanshahar, SBS district for demanding a bribe of Rs 24,000.

Disclosing this here today, a spokesperson of the VB said this case has been registered against the above said revenue official after investigation of an online complaint lodged at the Chief Minister's anti-corruption action line.

Giving details he added that the complainant Amarjit Singh, resident of Karnana, tehsil Banga, has alleged that the above said Patwari has taken Rs 24,000 as a bribe in instalments in lieu of mutation of land belonging to his father and his uncle.

He further added that the complainant has recorded the conversation on his mobile while the accused Patwari was demanding this bribe.

The spokesperson added that the VB unit of Jalandhar range has investigated the allegations levelled in the complaint and registered a corruption case at VB police station Jalandhar against the above mentioned revenue official after finding him guilty for demanding and accepting a bribe money. Further investigation in this case was under progress, he informed.

in Kangra: Dr Bhanu

Medical College, Tanda is committed to extend the benefits of super specialty services to the local population and to reduce the burden on the local population seeking healthcare outside the state, by making maximum surgical procedures available at the institution itself. Dr. Bhanu Awasthi, Principal Dr ROGM College Tanda told UNI on Monday that the institution is continuously adding to the spectrum of services already being delivered and placement of Left atrial appendage (LAA) device has been done for the first time in Himachal Pradesh for prevention of stroke in Atrial fibrillation patients. Dr Bhano Awasthi said while congratulating the team of the Department of Cardiology Dr RPGMC Tanda, led by Dr Mukul, Dr Nareesh and Dr Ambudhar for performing a difficult procedure for the first time in this college. He

said one patient suffering from CKD (chronic kidney disease) on hemodialysis with AF with high bleeding risk and another patient with AF with history of bleeding on standard anticoagulants were placed LAA Closure device successfully without any complications. He said the department accepted the challenge and went ahead with the procedure with success. Dr. Awasthi said it is a mechanical non-surgical treatment option for the patients of AF with the risk of cardio-embolic stroke therapies. Since Left atrial appendage is source of embolization in more than 90 per cent cases of cardio-embolic stroke, so this treatment will prove to be milestone for treatment of such patients, he disclosed. He said this is a very costly treatment which was provided free of cost under the cashless scheme (HIMCARE) being run by Govt of Himachal Pradesh. The patients had to go to PGI Chandigarh for this treatment in the past.

On this occasion, Deputy Commissioner Aashika Jain told the minister that the work of Girdavari has started in the district and the officials are instructed to complete this work within the time limits. The money added by the parents to this account will help the girl child to move ahead in her life. Shantanu Sharma said that Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana has been started by the government to give impetus to the Beti Bachao-Beti Padhao campaign. Under this scheme, the account can be opened for as little as Rs 250. A maximum of Rs 1 lakh 50 thousand can be deposited in the account in a year. Income tax exemption has been given by the government on the deposit amount and maturity amount. Under Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana, whenever the daughter gets married after the age of 18 years, the account can be closed. The account can be closed one month before or three months after the marriage. Under the scheme, parents can add money on compound interest by depositing little by little for their daughter's education and marriage.

Editorial

Partial success

On April 1, the chief ministers of Kerala and Tamil Nadu will jointly launch the centenary celebrations of the legendary Vaikom Satyagraha, the first prominent agitation in the country waged against untouchability under the national movement. The 20-month-long struggle held in Vaikom, a small lakeside town in the erstwhile Thiruvithamkoor (Travancore) princely state, began on March 30, 1924 and was against the ban on the backward castes from walking on the roads surrounding the famed Shiva temple.

The struggle revealed that despite Thiruvithamkoor's claim as a model state with the highest levels of literacy and health among India's princely and British-ruled states, it had the worst forms of untouchability, which included even 'unapproachability' and 'unseeability'. The backward castes were barred from temples and the roads around them. The Vaikom Satyagraha was directly led by an array of prominent political and social personalities of the day, including Mahatma Gandhi, Kerala's sage-reformer, Sree Narayana Guru, Tamil Nadu's rationalist, anti-caste leader, E.V. Ramaswami Naicker, and the Akalis from Punjab. It was a rare occasion when progressives from several Hindu upper and lower castes, Muslims and Christians fought together for the rights of backward castes.

Hundreds of men and women partook in the non-violent agitation that lasted for 604 days and braved prohibitory orders, arrests, physical assaults by the police and the orthodoxy, and even the century's most devastating floods. The satyagraha ended with the Thiruvithamkoor government opening three of the four roads around the temple for all. A decade later, all the temples were also thrown open for everyone. Gandhi described the Vaikom Satyagraha as a "battle of no less consequence than that of Swaraj." B.R. Ambedkar mentioned it as "the most important event in the country for the untouchables."

Yet, was the Vaikom Satyagraha a great success as is held traditionally? Many contemporary historians think otherwise. They have challenged the idealised narratives describing the struggle as an unqualified success. According to them, the agitation's achievements were limited. By getting reduced to an internal issue of Hindus, it ended up as a missed opportunity to awaken and mobilise the backward castes for a larger political and social movement. Interestingly, these revisionist historians blame Gandhi for the agitation's failures much as they credit him for its achievements. Mary Elizabeth King, the American political scientist and civil rights activist, writes: "Gandhi's involvement in Vykom had produced a compromise accepted by Travancore's princely state government in relation to the Hindu orthodoxy; nonetheless, no concrete material gains were achieved for the untouchables."

Pakistan contemplates SCO participation in India

Pakistan has begun in-house consultations to decide whether to attend the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) meetings of the defence and foreign ministers in India since New Delhi has already extended invitations to Defence Minister Khawaja Asif and Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari, Tribune reported.

The defence ministers' meeting is scheduled in April in New Delhi while foreign ministers would meet in May in Goa.

India is the current president of the eight-nation SCO is holding a series of events. Barring one event where Pakistan was denied entry over a map controversy, Islamabad has attended all other events, including the chief justices' conference and meeting of energy ministers via video link, Tribune reported.

India denied Pakistan's participation in the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) seminar on armed forces' contributions to military medicine, healthcare and pandemics, held in New Delhi on March 21.

India objected to the map used by the Pakistani side, showing Jammu and Kashmir as its territory. After the matter came to the Indian ex-



ternal affairs ministry's notice, the Pakistani side was asked to show the "correct map" or to stay away from the seminar.

Tribune reported that the Pakistani delegation chose to stay away while Pakistan media sources in Islamabad said India effectively withdrew the invitation.

A three-member Pakistan military delegation headed by a brigadier attended the meeting of an expert working group under the Council of Defence Ministers in person in New Delhi on Thursday, Tribune reported.

The presence of the Pak-

istani delegation in New Delhi has raised the possibility of defence and foreign ministers travelling to the neighbouring country.

While the Foreign Office (FO) spokesperson insisted that the final decision would be taken closer to the events, sources said that in-house consultations are already underway, Tribune reported.

The authorities are currently divided over attending high-profile meetings. One view is that given the current state of the relationship with Pakistan if required, only junior officials could be sent to the SCO meetings. But the

others do not agree with this, Tribune reported.

They believe that Pakistan must not leave such key regional forums unattended, and since SCO comprises powerful countries, including Russia and China, Pakistan must use this opportunity to advance its interests.

Sources said that a lot will depend on China. If China, being the founding member of SCO that played a key role in making Pakistan its full-time member, asks Islamabad to attend the meetings it would be difficult for the government to ignore the advice.

Pakistan and India were accepted as full members of the SCO after both sides committed not to undermine regional focus by bringing up their bilateral issues, Tribune reported.

Given this, in mind, it would be extremely difficult for Pakistan to stay away from the SCO gatherings altogether.

Sources said that Foreign Minister Bilawal was keen to go to India for the SCO meeting. If Pakistan attends the defence and foreign ministers' meetings, it is possible that Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif may also go to India in

July for the SCO summit.

The relationship between Pakistan and India remains at a standstill despite efforts in recent times to normalise ties. If Pakistan sends a high-powered delegation to India for SCO, it may break the ice though it may not bring any dramatic change in the bilateral ties.

Sources said the final decision about Pakistani participation in SCO ministerial meetings and a summit would be taken after due diligence. It would also depend on the political situation in Pakistan, they added, Tribune reported.

Poor children have poorer health

A new investigation conducted by UCL academics indicates that Generation Z youngsters born into the lowest fifth of families in the UK are 12 times more likely to experience a slew of bad health and educational outcomes by the age of 17 than their more affluent classmates.

The study, published in The Lancet Public Health, used data from the Millennium Cohort Study, a major study of more than 15,000 children born after the new millennium (September 2000 - January 2002) who are now in their early 20s.

Researchers collected data on five adverse health and social outcomes in adolescents aged 17 years, which are known to limit life chances: educational achievement, smoking, poor health, obesity and psychological distress.

Children who were most disadvantaged between the ages of 0-5 were four and a half times more likely to do worse at school at the age of 17 compared to those in the



highest income group. And they were three and a half times more likely to start smoking.

Those born in the lowest income quintile group were also more likely to have a harmful cluster of vulnerabilities at age 17 and were 12 times more likely to experience all - or all but one - of the five adverse health and social outcomes examined by researchers, compared to those born in the highest income quintile.

However, lifting families with children from the poorest income quintile group to the next poorest group would only result in a modest reduction in the clustering of multiple ad-

olescent adversities (4.9% according to the scenario model). Consequently, the researchers advocate co-ordinated action on childhood disadvantage across health, education, social care and other public services, across the social spectrum.

The researchers suggest that policymakers should, as a minimum, aim to prevent absolute poverty in childhood, characterised today by widespread food and fuel poverty.

They argue this is a necessary step but insufficient without a concerted effort to deliver coordinated public services to disadvantaged communities.

How different perspectives of mother and father as co-parents affect children



Researchers discovered that in a sample of low-income couples, children fared best when both parents had high expectations for their co-parenting relationship, and the poorest when they had low expectations.

In the study, published online recently in the journal Child Development, participants were asked about their co-parenting relationship with their partner -- in other words, how they related to each other as parents.

Sarah Schoppe-Sullivan, the study's lead author and a psychology professor at The Ohio State University as well as the president of the board of the Council on Contemporary Families, noted that when couples perceived their co-parenting relationship as moderately good but mothers and fathers had different perspectives on one another as co-parents, the outcomes for the children varied.

"The best outcome for children was when both parents saw their co-parenting relationship as positive. But children were almost as well-adjusted when the relationship quality

was moderate and mothers were less positive about co-parenting relative to fathers," Schoppe-Sullivan said.

Child outcomes suffered, though, when it was fathers who were less positive about co-parenting, the study revealed.

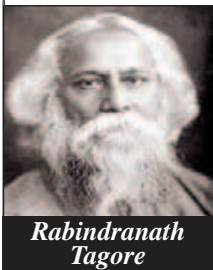
Previous studies have shown that parents with better co-parenting relationships are more effective as parents and their children are more well-adjusted -- for example, they have fewer behaviour problems and better social relationships with others.

But most of the previous research has been done in middle-class white families and relied solely on mothers' perspectives on the co-parenting relationship. The participants in this new study were 2,915 low-income couples in seven US states who took part in the Supporting Healthy Marriages program. All couples had a child under 5 years old. Participants were asked about their co-parenting relationship with their partner -- in other words, how they related to each other as parents.

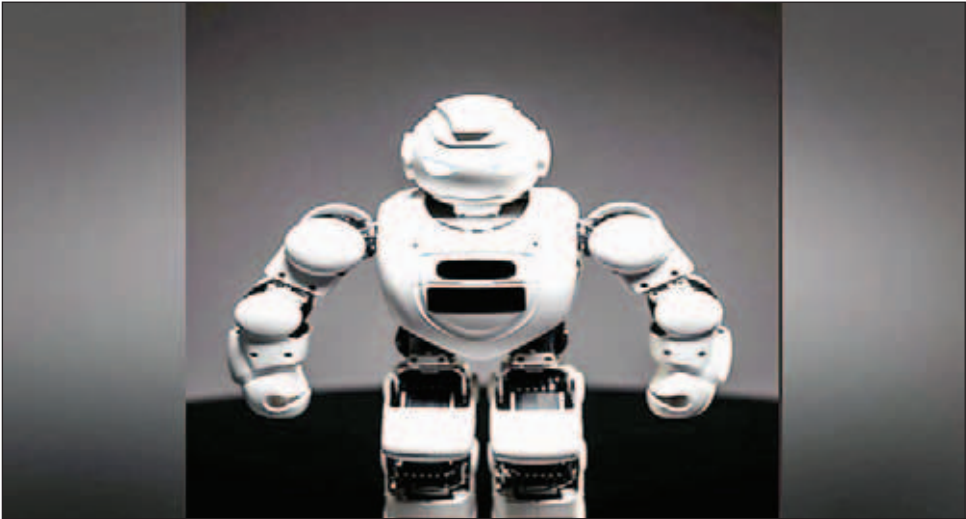

Robotic tech enables control by human thought

Have you heard about biosensor technology? Researchers from the University of Technology Sydney (UTS) have developed biosensor technology that will allow you to operate devices, such as robots and machines, solely through thought control.

The advanced brain-computer interface was developed by Distinguished Professor Chin-Teng Lin and Professor Francesca Iacopi, from the UTS Faculty of Engineering and IT, in collaboration with the Australian Army and Defence Innovation Hub.

As well as defence applications, the technology has significant potential in fields such as advanced manufacturing, aerospace and healthcare -- for example allowing people with a disability to control a wheelchair or operate prosthetics."The hands-free, voice-free technology works outside laboratory settings, anytime, anywhere. It makes interfaces such as consoles, keyboards, touchscreens and hand-



gesture recognition redundant," said Professor Iacopi." By using cutting edge graphene material, combined with silicon, we were able to overcome issues of corrosion, durability and skin contact resistance, to develop the wearable dry sensors," she said. A new study outlining the technology has just been published in the peer-reviewed journal ACS Applied Nano Materials. It shows that the graphene sensors developed at UTS are very conductive, easy to use and robust.

The hexagon patterned sensors are positioned over the back of the scalp, to detect brainwaves from the visual cortex. The sensors are resilient to harsh conditions so they can be used in extreme operating environments.

The user wears a head-mounted augmented reality lens which displays white flickering squares. By concentrating on a particular square, the brainwaves of the operator are

picked up by the biosensor, and a decoder translates the signal into commands. The technology was recently demonstrated by the Australian Army, where soldiers operated a Ghost Robotics quadruped robot using the brain-machine interface.

The device allowed hands-free command of the robotic dog with up to 94% accuracy."Our technology can issue at least nine commands in two seconds.

This means we have nine different kinds of commands and the operator can select one from those nine within that time period," Professor Lin said."We have also explored how to minimise noise from the body and environment to get a clearer signal from an operator's brain," he said. The researchers believe the technology will be of interest to the scientific community, industry and government, and hope to continue making advances in brain-computer interface systems.

Thus, it is more than just an exercise, it is a requirement of the body for the advancement of a healthier living. So if your concern is how to do yoga for diabetes, here are some effective and easy asanas you should try today.

Trikonasana (The Triangle Pose)
Benefits: A major side effect of diabetes is damaging kidneys. This asana reverses this effect and also betters digestion and absorption in the body.

How to do it:
Position your legs around two feet apart, turn your right toes to the right side and place your left toes slightly inwards. Press the left hips out as you slide both your

arms to the right.
Focus on deep breaths as swing into the arms, raising the left arm and resting the right hand, with the palms facing front.
This asana is all about keeping the legs strong, pressing into the feet, and pulling up the knee caps. Hold onto the breath for three to six seconds.
Repeat this pose on the other side.
Surya Namaskar (Sun Salutation)
Benefits: Honestly, while combating any health issues, Surya Namaskar is the first asana that comes to mind for its numerous benefits. For diabetic patients, it will improve blood circulation in the pancreas and increase their metabolism rate.
How to do it:
Stand straight, pull your abdomen in and join your hands together. Take in a deep breath while stretching your arms first up then behind, finally forward till you are down.
Place your right leg behind your right knee on the floor. The left knee must be at a 90 degrees angle. Push your left leg behind and come in a plank position. Bend your chest and chin down, lifting your hips

and inhale in a deep breath.
Again touch your toes, placing your arms on the floor and stretching the spine.
This should be repeated on each side five times.
Bhujangasana (Cobra Pose)
Benefit: A very effective asana for strengthening the spine and improving the functionality of the abdomen organs. It can regenerate and restore pancreatic cells.
How to do it:
Start by lying down flat on your stomach with your legs stretched out.
Elbows must be kept on the sides with palms flat on the surface. Next, take in a deep breath, lift your upper body, placing all the body weight on the palms.
Ensure that your navel is touching the floor.
Exhale gradually and come back to the starting position.

Do this a minimum of four to five times.
Matsyasana (Fish Pose)
Benefits: While practising intense breathing, this asana counters diabetes symptoms. Using abdominal muscles also tones the pancreas.
How To Do It:
Begin by lying flat on the back, with feet placed together and hands alongside the hips.
Cautiously, lift your body and stretch the back till the head touches the ground.
Concentrate on inhaling and exhaling.
Hold onto this pose for a few seconds and then come back to the starting position.
Repeat five to six times.
Mandukasana (Frog Pose)
Benefits: For people suffering from very high blood sugar, this asana is promising because it reduces body weight, which is vital to keep diabetes under check.
How To Do It:
Sit comfortably and with fists of both hands flat on the floor.
Press your navel with both the fists and bend forward, slightly raising your hips.

Prepare new plan for stilt plus 4 floor building plans in HSVP group housing: CM

Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal directed the officers of Haryana Shehri Vikas Pradhikaran (HSVP) to prepare a new plan for group housing and stilt plus 4 floor building plans in sectors to provide residential facilities to the people in urban areas.

The Chief Minister, who is also the Chairman of Haryana Shehri Vikas Pradhikaran, was presiding over the 125th meeting of the HSVP here today.

In the meeting, giving ex-post facto approval for the construction of multi-storey car parking and commercial complex being constructed by Faridabad Smart City Limited on about 4,000 square meter land of HSVP in Sector-18A of Faridabad, the Chief Minister said that in place of this land, the Haryana Shehri Vikas

Pradhikaran should get the same amount of land transferred from Municipal Corporation, Faridabad or Faridabad Smart City.

In the meeting, post facto approval was also given for the issuance of allotment letters of ownership rights to 131 shopkeepers and Antyodaya Market being constructed in place of the Rehri Market; as per the instructions of the Chief Minister, after the incident of fire in the Rehri market of Sector-9, Panchkula. Apart from this, pucca shops will be set up as Antyodaya Market in place of Rehri markets in Sectors 7, 11 and 17 of Panchkula.

The Chief Minister said that pucca shops should be made in the cities where Rehri markets are functioning. On this, Chief Administrator, HSVP, Sh. Ajit Balaji Joshi informed the Chief Minister that the HSVP has a proposal to set up Antyodaya Market in place of Rehri markets in Guru-

gram, Faridabad and Karnal.

Sh. Manohar Lal instructed the officers to constitute a committee to prepare a list of the cities where build- ings or any other type of construction or activity has been done on the HSVP's land or on the land of other departments.

It was apprised in the meeting that the HSVP has 5,418 residential, 2,688 commercial and 230 institutional properties, out of which 4,804 residential, 2,305 commercial and 205 institutional properties have been sold through e-auction. On this, the Chief Minister instructed the officers that a separate dashboard should be prepared for all the properties of HSVP, on which all information like location of the property, name of the owner, etc. would be registered. He also directed that the entire record of the HSVP including the documents of the properties should be digitised.
