## Centre relaxes wheat procurement norms in Punjab, Haryana, Raj

The Centre has relaxed quality norms for wheat procurement in Punjab, Chandigarh, Haryana, and Rajasthan to prevent distressed sale as well as protect the interest of farmers, a senior official said on Tuesday.

The recent untimely rainfall, hailstorm and high velocity wind have damaged the standing wheat crop, which was ready for harvest, in some parts of these states. These state governments had demanded the relaxation in procurement norms.

Currently, wheat procurement is underway in Madhya Pradesh, while it has been delayed in other states because of untimely rains. State-owned Food Corporation of India (FCI) along with state agencies undertake the procurement of wheat.

The value cut will not be applicable on wheat having lusture loss up to 10 per cent, while value cut of Rs 5.31 per quintal on flat basis will be deducted on wheat having lusture loss grains above 10 per cent up to 80 per cent.

That apart, both damaged and slightly damaged grain altogether should not exceed 6 per cent, he added.

Singh further said any deterioration of quality of wheat stock procured under relaxed norms during storage will be the sole responsibility of the state governments. This wheat will be liquidated on an overrid-

ing priority basis.

Any financial or operational implications due to the relaxation will be the responsibility of the state governments, he added. The Centre has asked these state governments to deduct the imposed value cut from the minimum support price of Rs 2,125 per quintal while making a payment to the farmers. The official mentioned that the Uttar Pradesh government's similar de-



mand is under consideration. A decision will be taken soon after analysing the field report. The government has purchased 13.20 lakh tonnes of wheat till April 10 of the ongoing 2023-24 marketing year (April-March) mostly from Madhya Pradesh. About 1,000 tonnes of wheat has been procured in Punjab, while 88,000 tonnes in Haryana in the same period, as per the Food Ministry data.

## Hry CM expresses gratitude

**CHANDIGARH:** Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal has expressed gratitude to Prime Minister, Sh. Narendra Modi, on behalf of the farmers of the state; for relaxation in the uniform specifications of wheat during procurement season 2023-24, in view of lustre loss or shriveled and broken grains in Rabi crops, especially wheat crop, due to unseasonal rains and hailstorms.

The Chief Minister said that in view of the problems faced by the farmers, he spoke to the Union Minister for Food, Public Distribution and Consumer Affairs over telephone; who assured that the government would relax the procurement norms for wheat. In this regard, a circular to this effect has been issued by the Central Government. He said that farming is such a business which always involves risk and the farmer remains in uncertainty until the crop reaches his house from the farms.

The Chief Minister said that coincidentally a similar time was witnessed in 2015, when unseasonal rains in the month of February had caused damage to the wheat crops. At that time, the state government had given a compensation of Rs 1,190 crore to the farmers and that too before May-June.

## Dr Sukhwinder Sukhi is joint SAD-BSP candidate for Jalandhar bypoll

The Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) – Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) alliance today announced the candidature of prominent social activist, two time Banga legislator and senior SAD leader Dr Sukhwinder Singh Sukhi as its joint candidate for the Jalandhar parliamentary bypoll.

Announcing this here, SAD President Sukhbir Singh Badal said the decision to field Dr Sukhwinder Sukhi from the Jalandhar seat had been taken unanimously and had the overwhelming support of the entire SAD-BSP cadre. He said Dr Sukhi was not only known for his philanthropic works but also for his performance in the Vidhan Sabha. "He is the ideal choice to represent Jalandhar in the Lok Sabha".



Asserting that the SAD-BSP alliance would contest the election on the plank of peace and communal harmony besides justice for farmers, Dalits, youth and government employees, Mr Badal said "goondaism had become the order of the day during the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) regime with

gangsters calling the shots to the detriment of the common man. Communal tensions are also on the rise even as all development and infrastructure creation has been stopped". He said it was also a matter of concern that many parties were practicing divisive politics which had vitiated the atmosphere in the State.

Asserting that chief minister Bhagwant Mann had failed on all fronts, Mr Badal said "the law and order situation is at its lowest ebb. Extortions have forced the industry to shift out of the State. All promises made to weaker sections, women and the youth have been dishonoured".

Speaking on the occasion, BSP State President Jasvir Singh Garhi while welcoming the candidature of Dr Sukhwinder Sukhi, said the family of Dr Sukhi was part of the BSP bhairchara and had always worked for

amelioration of the weaker sections. He also listed how the AAP government was discriminating against Scheduled Castes while denying them reservation in key jobs including appointments as Law Officers.

Senior BSP leader Avtar Singh Karimpuri said it was unfortunate that the BJP was following in the footsteps of the Congress party and discriminating against depressed sections of society. He said the BSP cadre would ensure an overwhelming victory to the SAD-BSP joint candidate.

SAD-BSP candidate Dr Sukhwinder Sukhi assured to raise the issues of Jalandhar and Punjab in parliament on the occasion. He said it was unfortunate that an attempt was being made to paint Sikhs as separatists and said the AAP government was creating an atmosphere of fear in Punjab.

## Opposition sharing unreal figures about State debt: Hry CM

**CHANDIGARH:** Taking a dig at the statement given by the opposition regarding government's debt of Rs 4 lakh crore, the Chief Minister said that Opposition sharing unreal figures about State debt.

"We have taken loan within the prescribed limit. In the year 2014-15, the previous government had left the debt of 71000

crores in the budget. Together, the combined loss of the four power department companies was Rs 31,000 crore. If we add this deficit,



then the debt is more than Rs 1 lakh crore. But we took a loan of Rs 27,000 crore from the power corporations in the state budget. Now Opposition refrain themselves from debating about the 31000 crores of the power DISCOM's," said Sh. Manohar Lal. He said that any government can borrow up to 25 per cent of GSDP and we are within this limit. At the time of Congress, the state's GSDP was 3 lakh crore, according to which they had taken a loan.

## IMD predicts 'normal' monsoon in country

The Southwest monsoon is likely to remain "normal" for June to September this year, with expected rainfall being 83.5 cms all over the country, said the India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Tuesday.

"There is a 67 per cent probability of normal to above-normal rainfall," M Mohapatra, Director General of Meteorology, said at a press conference. "Quantitatively, the southwest monsoon seasonal rainfall between June and September over the country as a whole is likely to be 96 per cent of the Long-Period Average with a model error of plus or minus 5 percent" Director General



Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said here. The LPA of the seasonal rainfall over the country as a whole based on data of

1971-2020 is 87 cms. Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said that the El Nino conditions will be developing during the monsoon

season, and the impact of El Nino conditions is likely to be felt in the second half of the monsoon season. He pointed out that all El Nino years have not been bad monsoon years. Mohapatra also said that out of 15 El Nino years from 1951 to 2022, six years had normal to above normal rainfall. El Nino involves the unusual warming of waters in the eastern equatorial Pacific, which has a high correlation with warmer summers and weaker monsoon rains in India. "If at all there is any adverse impact due to the evolving El Nino conditions during the monsoon season, it is likely to be countered by the favourable impact of a positive IOD and the lower snow cover over the northern hemisphere," Mohapatra said.

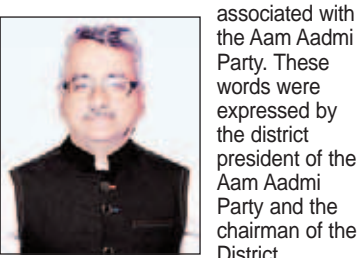

New Data Protection Bill likely to be  
introduced in Monsoon Session

The Centre on Tuesday informed the Supreme Court that the government will table the Digital Personal Data Protection Bill in the upcoming Monsoon Session of Parliament in July. A five-judge Constitution bench of Justices KM Joseph, Ajay Rastogi, Aniruddha Bose, Hrishikesh Roy and CT Ravikumar fixed the matter for hearing in August. Attorney General R Venkatramani, appearing for the Centre, told the bench that the new Bill on personal data protection is ready and will be introduced in the Monsoon Session of Parliament. "The Bill is ready, it just has to be introduced in parliament in the monsoon session at the end of June, July," the Attorney General said. To this, the bench replied, "So, it will be under consideration if we list in July...August will be most practical." "We take note of the submission of the AG that a Bill which would cover many aspects of the... addresses all concerns will be tabled in the



Monsoon Session in July 2023. Considering the circumstances, the matter is to be placed before the Chief Justice of India for a bench to be constituted preferably in the first week of August," the bench stated in its order. Counsels appearing for the petitioners requested that the top court list the case earlier as Bill has not been introduced in the Parliament for so long. "Consultation is a long process... We want a good law to come," the Attorney General replied. The bench was hearing pleas filed by two

students challenging WhatsApp's 2021 Privacy Policy to share users' data with parent company Facebook and others as a violation of their privacy and free speech. Last year, the apex court had asked the government either place before the Parliament, the Bill, which addresses the privacy concerns of users and standards to be followed by WhatsApp or it will begin the final hearing in the case. Earlier, the Centre had said Indian users cannot be discriminated against by other users of WhatsApp and informed

the apex court that the government has already withdrawn the old Data Protection Bill and a new Bill will be introduced in the Parliament. Senior advocate Shyam Divan, appearing for the petitioners, had told the bench that Indian users are deprived of their fundamental rights and the same platform operating in other countries, especially in the European Union, has higher standards of privacy and those standards are not prevalent in India. Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for WhatsApp, had told the bench that European countries have their own set of laws which are applied there and in India, the company follows the present law. The Constitution bench was hearing the plea filed by two students -- Karmanya Singh Sareen and Shreya Sethi -- challenging the contract entered into between the two companies to provide access to calls, photographs, texts, videos and documents shared by users is a violation of their privacy and free speech.

## Editorial

### The web of populism

The roots of the populist upsurge in India lie in the deepening of intra-subaltern conflicts. Dominant explanations of populism perceive it as the ‘massification’ of democracy through an anti-elitist discourse manifest in populism’s extra-institutional mobilisation. There is, though, a need to transcend this elite-subaltern binary to locate the source of consent to populist-authoritarian regimes in the growing intra-subaltern conflict. The centre of gravity of social conflicts in India has moved away from one between dominant and lower castes to conflicts within the subaltern castes of Dalits and the other backward classes. These conflicts have been in the making for some time now and are centred on developmental programmes, social status, distribution of governmental benefits, control over resources, representation and voting. Similarly, the burgeoning tension between the disadvantaged Pasmanda Muslims and dominant castes such as Sayyids has lent legitimacy to populist modes of mobilisation within that community.

Intra-subaltern conflict is best conceptualised through the process of ‘sectarianisation’, which is marked by the formation of insular identities. Identities are imagined in a zero-sum game where the gains of one group are perceived as a loss for the others, leading to spiralling social conflicts. The process of ‘secular sectarianism’ has resulted in a decisive shift of support among various constituencies within Dalits and OBCs towards the ‘conservative populism’ of the BJP-RSS combine. For instance, in the 2019 general elections, 33% of Dalits and 42% of the OBCs voted for the Bharatiya Janata Party.

Populist politics is being able to mediate in intra-subaltern conflicts because it lays claims to the universalist notion of civil solidarity. Populists argue for such universalist ideas as inclusive civilisational ethos, nationalism, civil religion alongside inclusive development manifest in rhetorical slogans like ‘Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas’, ‘Saaf Niyat, Sahi Vikas’ and so on. They have invoked imagery beyond narrow political considerations that include the extra-political ideals of seva and tapasya. While claiming universal inclusion, they also make a pitch for an exclusive Hindu identity. Much of the symbolism of Hindu identity does not represent the everyday culture and lifeworld of disadvantaged castes. For instance, India’s ruling regime vigorously campaigns in favour of vegetarianism. As the boundaries of subaltern identity become rigid, alien cultural practices are adopted as elements integral to civilisational ethos.

How does the populist regime maintain its claims on universal civil solidarity with a symbolism that is narrow, exclusivist but also universal? Referring to recent insights from ‘emotion studies’ might offer us significant clues into such paradoxical social processes.

# Indian visitors in Singapore surged by 350pc

There were a total of 1,93,230 Indian visitors to Singapore in the first three months of this year, which is about 3.5 times more than the 54,530 who arrived in 2022, informed the Singapore Tourism Board (STB).

Last week, the STB announced that the number of visitors to Singapore was far beyond expectations, with over 2.9 million arrivals in the first quarter of this year, which is 62 per cent of 2019’s first three months figure.

Indians accounted for the fourth-largest source of tourist arrivals in the first quarter of this year after Indonesians (523,300), Malaysians (278,910) and Australians (265,730). Americans were the fifth-largest at 168,960.

Meanwhile, China, which was the largest source of tourists for Singapore with over 3.75 million visitors in 2019, ranked as the ninth largest group of tourists in the first quarter of this year with only 124,560.

In 2019, based on figures from China’s National Bureau of Statistics, Chinese tourists made nearly 170 million trips abroad.

Although China has lifted travel restrictions, cumbersome travel processes targeted at Chinese residents by countries such as South Korea and Japan earlier this year dampened the enthusiasm for outbound travel. The same was exacerbated by delays in passport renewals and visa applications as well as the inability of Chinese airlines to mount the same number of flights as before Covid. Based on data from Alibaba-owned travel booking site Fliggy, during February, international flights out of China are at less than 10 per cent of 2019 levels.



Furthermore, the travel habits of Chinese citizens have been changed by three years of Covid-19 restrictions, with many now content to explore the vast and varied attractions in their own country. “The Chinese tourists we will welcome this year and in the coming years are very different from those who came before,” Wolfgang Georg Arlt, founder and chief executive of COTRI (Chinese

Outbound Tourism Research Institute), was quoted by CNBC as saying at ITB Berlin, the world’s largest tourism trade fair.

COTRI is an independent consulting company based in Germany.

In China as elsewhere, years of pandemic-induced lockdowns sparked a shift away from major tourist attractions toward “more nature-orientated, more outdoor-orientated tourism”, Arlt said. He highlighted the emergence of trends like camping and glamping, as well as family-focused trips.

COTRI predicts that Chinese outbound travel will recover to about two-thirds of 2019’s figures, with around

110 million overseas trips this year. In the meantime, the Singapore Tourism Board is not waiting for Chinese tourists’ return to launch new activities and attractions to boost tourism on the island.

To inspire travel to Singapore through TV series and films, STB together with the Infocomm Media Development Authority (IMDA) announced the launch of an SGD 10 million (USD 7.5 million) Singapore On-screen Fund. The fund aims to support international media and entertainment (M&E) partners in marketing Singapore through television and film shows aimed at an international audience. The Singapore On-screen Fund will

support selected projects by key M&E companies, which must be set in Singapore and launched before the first quarter of 2027. Successful projects will receive funding support of up to 30 per cent of qualifying costs related to featuring Singapore, including production and marketing costs.

This is, in part, inspired by past collaborations which resulted in movies such as “Crazy Rich Asians”, the popular K-drama “Little Women (2022) and the HBO sci-fi hit series “Westworld Season 3” (2020). These shows created an international impact and left a positive impression on audiences around the world. Also just announced in April

is the return of the Free Singapore Tour which is very popular with Indian tourists as well as those from Australia and Indonesia. The tour was suspended during the pandemic. This tour is organised by STB together with Changi Airport and is meant for transit passengers at Changi, who have a layover period of at least five-and-a-half hours but less than 24 hours. They must also have valid entry visas for Singapore to take part in the tours.

The objective of organising these free tours is to entice transit passengers to make Singapore a destination for their next holiday.

The original three tours available before Covid -- the City Sights Tour, Heritage Tour and Jewel Tour -- have been refreshed to include new points of interest. A brand-new Changi Precinct tour will introduce travellers to the interesting sights and sounds of the eastern region surrounding Singapore Changi Airport. Each tour lasts two and a half hours and will be available daily, with plans to progressively increase to nine hours a day.

In 2019, over 80,000 passengers went on the Free Singapore Tour.

Another exciting development is the stationing of a brand-new Disney Cruise Line ship in Singapore from 2025 for five years. A memorandum of understanding between STB and Disney Cruise Line was announced on March 29.

## Taliban bans women from restaurants with gardens in Herat

The Taliban on Monday barred entry of families and women into restaurants with gardens or green spaces in Herat province, Afghanistan, reported Fox News.

The decision came after religious clerics complained of mixing genders in such places. Afghan officials said that the curbs have been brought in place because of gender mixing or because women allegedly are not wearing the hijab. So far, the ban is applicable to restaurants with green spaces in the Herat province only.

The outdoor dining ban only applies to establishments in Herat, where such premises remain open to men. Baz Mohammad Nazir, a deputy official from the Ministry of Vice and Virtue’s directorate in Herat, denied media reports that all restaurants were off limits to families and women, dismissing them as propaganda, reported Fox News.

He said it applied only to restaurants with green areas, such as a park, where men and women



could meet. “After repeated complaints from scholars and ordinary people, we set limits and closed these restaurants.”

Azizurrahman Al Muhajir, who is head of the Vice and Virtue directorate in Herat, said, “It was like a park but they named it a restaurant and men and women were together. Thank God it has been corrected now. Also, our auditors are observing all the parks where men and women go.”

It was the latest in a slew of restrictions imposed by the Taliban since they took power in August 2021. They have shut girls out of classrooms beyond sixth grade and women from universities, most types of employment, including jobs at the United Nations. They are also

banned from public spaces such as parks and gyms.

Meanwhile, the European Union (EU) bounded aid to the Taliban with the removal of the ban on Afghan working women, reported Tolo News.

EU said that the ban on women working for UN organizations violates international law and that aid to Afghanistan cannot be delivered regardless of gender, aid activities will be reconsidered.

The United Nations said that 3,300 male and female employees of the organization have stayed at home since women were banned from working at UN agencies. Since the Taliban took control of Afghanistan in August 2021, the situation of women in the country has only got worse.

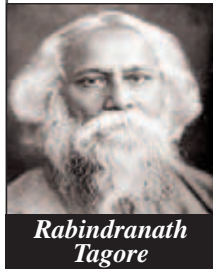

## Expert explains how one can tackle sudden cardiac arrest

Sudden cardiac arrest is an emergency condition where the heart stops functioning completely and suddenly. If not treated immediately (in minutes), the person succumbs to it. Dr Ganesh Nallur Shivu, Senior Interventional Cardiologist, Kauvery Hospital Electronic City, Bengaluru says that cardiac arrest is distinct from a heart attack. "A heart attack is also an emergency that results from complete blockage of one of the blood vessels that supply the heart. Heart attack can lead to cardiac arrest, but not all the time. Cardiac arrest is the terminal event in most conditions that results in death of the person," he explains. How Can You Help?

If a person suffers a cardiac arrest, various steps can be undertaken to try and save their life. "The first responder should get attention and help of others around. Anybody trained in cardio-pulmonary resuscitation should immediately commence it. Another person should call for an emergency ambulance in order to shift the patient to the nearest hospital. If an automated defibrillator is available, one should immediately get it and attach it to the patient, so that life saving shock can be provided if indicated," advises Dr Ganesh. Note that automated defibrillators are available at various places like gyms and sometimes, in malls. These

devices, when attached to the patient, are able to determine the cardiac rhythm and provide shock, if necessary. "If the patient doesn't regain

to prevent the occurrence of these events. In high-risk heart failure patients, internal cardioverterdefibrillator (ICD) devices are

implanted. These devices monitor the cardiac rhythm and provide shock treatment when a cardiac arrest situation happens," explains Dr Ganesh. Further to this, corrective surgeries and devices can help prevent cardiac arrest in valvular heart disease and congenital heart disease patients. How To Prevent Cardiac Arrest? Underlying heart diseases are the main cause of sudden cardiac arrest. Prevention and timely treatment of any of these conditions can prevent the occurrence of sudden cardiac arrest. "Patients should undergo regular health check and treat risk factors like diabetes, high blood pressure and high cholesterol," says Dr Ganesh. He also advises quitting smoking, leading a

healthy lifestyle with regular exercise and good dietary habits. "Mental stress and westernised lifestyle is one of the main causes of heart disease, especially at a younger age. Individuals who undertake professional sports should be formally screened for underlying heart disease. Undiagnosed heart disease is the commonest cause of sudden cardiac death among players on the field," he adds. Dr Ganesh believes that general awareness about cardiac arrest should be increased and that training for cardio-pulmonary resuscitation should be provided to more individuals.



consciousness after delivery of shock, cardio-pulmonary resuscitation should be continued whilst waiting for the ambulance," he adds. What Causes Sudden Cardiac Arrest? The commonest cause for cardiac arrest is a heart attack. However, there are other various conditions like cardiomyopathies, heart failure, valvular heart disease or congenital heart conditions that can also result in sudden cardiac arrest. "In heart attack patients, opening of the blocked blood vessel in the heart via angioplasty or thrombolysis can prevent cardiac arrest and save lives. In heart failure patients, specific medications called antiarrhythmic drugs are used

Previously, one person identified as Dhakad Ram, a resident of Luni in Rajasthan's Jodhpur district was arrested on March 26 for sending an e-mail threat to Salman Khan and handed over to Mumbai Police. A case was registered at Bandra police station. The accused had allegedly sent a threat mail to Salman Khan stating that the actor will "end up like Sidhu Moose Wala."

"In the case registered in Bandra police station of threats to kill Salman Khan via email, the Mumbai police team and Luni police team in joint action caught Dhakad Ram, a resident of Luni in Jodhpur district," Luni Police Station Officer, Jodhpur Ishwar Chand Pareek had told earlier.

Khan has been provided with Y+ category security by the Mumbai police as the actor is perceived to be under threat. The Maharashtra State government took this step after the actor received a threat letter from the Lawrence Bishnoi gang.

Mumbai Police have also booked jailed gangsters Lawrence Bishnoi, Goldie Brar and Rohit Garg for allegedly sending threatening emails to actor Salman Khan's office. Bandra Police registered a case under sections 506(2), 120(b) and 34 of IPC. Meanwhile, the actor has begun promotions of his upcoming Kisi Ka Bhai Kisi Ki Jaan and participated in its trailer launch event held in Mumbai on April 10.
