Excise policy case: CBI summons Delhi CM Kejriwal on Sunday

In a major development in the Delhi excise policy case, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has been summoned by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) for questioning.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convener has been summoned for questioning.

This development comes as former Delhi deputy CM Manish Sisodia continues to languish in judicial custody in the same case.

Sisodia was arrested by ED and CBI in the ongoing investigation of a case related to alleged irregularities in the framing and implementation of the excise policy of GNCTD. The CBI arrested Sisodia in the liquor policy case on February 26, 2023. Later on March 9, the ED arrested him, after hours of questioning at Tihar Jail.

In October, the ED had raided nearly three dozen locations in Delhi and Punjab following the arrest of Sameer Mahendru, Managing Director of Delhi's Jor Bagh-based liquor distributor Indospirit Group, in the case and arrested him later. The CBI too filed its first charge sheet in the case early this week.

The ED and the CBI had alleged that irregularities were committed while modifying the Excise Policy, undue favours were extended to licence holders, the licence fee



was waived or reduced and the L-1 licence was extended without the competent authority's approval. The beneficiaries diverted "illegal" gains to the accused officials and made false entries in their books of account to evade detection.

As per the allegations, the Excise Department had decided to refund the Earnest Money Deposit of about Rs 30 crore to a successful tenderer against the set rules.

Even though there was no enabling provision, a waiver on tendered licence fees was allowed from December 28, 2021, to January 27, 2022, due to COVID-19.

This allegedly caused a loss of Rs 144.36 crore to the exchequer, which has been instituted on a reference from the Union Home Ministry following a recommendation from Delhi Lieutenant-Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena.

PM inaugurates first AIIMS in Northeast India

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday inaugurated the first AIIMS in the North-east region of India, located in Guwahati, Assam.

The cost of constructing the hospital was Rs 1,123 crore, and it is expected to provide healthcare services to not only the people of Assam but also to other states in the region.

In addition to this, the Prime Minister also virtually inaugurated three medical colleges in Nalbari, Nagaon, and Kokrajhar, which will have 24 undergraduate departments and a 500-bed capacity.

The medical colleges will begin with an annual intake of 100 MBBS students, raising the total MBBS student intake to 1,500 in Assam.

Furthermore, the Prime Minister laid the foundation of the Assam Advanced Healthcare Innovation Institute (AAHII)



with a budget of Rs 546 crore.

The AAHII is a joint initiative between the state government and IIT Guwahati and aims to promote inventions and innovations in medicine and healthcare. It also focuses on nurturing multidisciplinary research and development in frontier areas of medicine by combining engineering with healthcare.

Pakistan: Several injured after mob storms flour distribution point in Mansehra

A mob took away bags of free flour after running amok at a distribution point in Oghi tehsil's Karori area in Pakistan's Mansehra on Wednesday, Dawn reported. Several people were injured in the stampede.

According to witnesses, people flocked to the designated health centre to receive free flour under a government scheme and went on a rampage due to the "delayed and unjust distribution." They said that the mob stormed a truck carrying flour and took away hundreds of bags of flour.

Witnesses further said the people walked away after taking the flour. The witnesses said that several people who

were injured in the stampede were taken to the health centre for treatment, as per the Dawn report.

The people have said that distributors were doing favouritism. Speaking to Dawn, an elderly man at the distribution point said, "The powerful got away with many flour bags but the weak returned empty-handed despite queuing up for long hours while fasting."

All Primary Teachers Association President Fayyaz Khan called on authorities to ensure fair flour distribution, as per the news report. Khan expressed fear that stampedes will continue if the authorities do not ensure fair flour distribution and called for strict measures at sites of distribution.

Haryana, first state in country to purchase 14 crops on MSP: CM

Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal said that Haryana is the first state in the country which is procuring 14 crops at minimum support price (MSP) in the interest of farmers. Along with this, the rest of the crops are being procured through Bhavantar Bharpayee Yojana. He assured that the farmers would be given compensation till the month of May for the crop loss due to recent unseasonal rains and hailstorms.

The Chief Minister was interacting with the people during a Jan Samvad programme in Palwal's Hodal town on Friday. He also extended good wishes to the people of the state on the auspicious festival of Baisakhi.

He said that the government stands with the common man and along with basic infrastructural development, the



benefits of government services are being provided to the citizens through Parivar Pehchan Patra. Giving relief to the safai karamcharis of Hodal Municipal Council, the Chief Minister ordered immediate release of 75 percent pending salary of the concerned karamcharis.

183 criminals killed in encounters in UP since March 2017

LUCKNOW: The Uttar Pradesh Police said Friday that they have gunned down 183 alleged criminals in encounters in the six years of Yogi Adityanath's government and this included gangster-turned-politician Atiq Ahmad's son Asad and his accomplice, who were killed in an exchange of fire in Jhansi. The UP Police data showed that more than 10,900 police encounters have taken place in the state since March 2017, when Adityanath took over as the chief minister of Uttar Pradesh for the first time. In these encounters, 23,300 alleged criminals were arrested and 5,046 were injured. The number of policemen injured in them was

1,443 and 13 were killed, the data showed. Of the 13 policemen killed in encounters since March 2017, eight were ambushed in a narrow lane of Kanpur by the aides of notorious gangster Vikas Dubey. Dubey was shot dead by police when he tried to escape while being brought to UP from Ujjain in Madhya Pradesh. Police said Dubey's vehicle had overturned during the transit and he had snatched a policeman's gun. "As many as 183 criminals have been gunned down in police encounters in the state since March 20, 2017," Special Director General of Police (Law and Order) Prashant Kumar told a news agency.

Rahul Gandhi starts shifting belongings from official bungalow

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi has started shifting his belongings from his 12, Tughlaq Lane residence as he was asked to vacate the premises by April 22 following his disqualification from Lok Sabha.

Two trucks were seen parked outside his residence and the belongings were later shifted to his mother's 10, Janpath residence. Sources said Gandhi is likely to soon vacate the official bungalow allotted to him.

While Rahul Gandhi has seen a number of houses, he may also opt to stay with his mother and Congress Parliamentary Party Chairperson Sonia Gandhi.



The Lok Sabha Secretariat had sent Gandhi a notice asking him to vacate the premises by April 22 fol-

lowing his disqualification as MP after his conviction and two-year sentence by a Surat court in a defamation

case. A few years ago, Priyanka Gandhi Vadra was also asked to vacate her Lodhi Estate bungalow as SPC cover was removed from her security.

Rahul Gandhi, who was representing Wayanad constituency in Kerala was disqualified by Lok Sabha recently after he was sentenced to two years of imprisonment in a defamation case by a Surat Court. Gandhi has filed an appeal before the sessions court against the verdict and has also appealed for a stay on the conviction.

Rahul was served a notice on March 27 by the Lok Sabha Secretariat, asking him to vacate the official bungalow following his disqualification.

18,000 cattle killed in "Horrific" explosion, fire in Texas

A "horrific" explosion and fire at a dairy farm in the southern US state of Texas killed about 18,000 head of cattle and injured one agricultural worker, authorities said on Thursday.

"This was the deadliest barn fire for cattle in Texas history and the investigation and cleanup may take some time," Texas Agriculture Commissioner Sid Miller said in a statement.

The explosion and fire ripped through the Southfork Dairy Farms near the town of Dimmitt in the Texas Panhandle on Monday night.

Firefighters and police rushed to the scene and "determined that one person was trapped inside," the Castro County Sheriff's Office said on Facebook. The person was rescued and flown to a hospital in Lubbock, it said.

The cause of the explosion and fire were not immediately clear, said Miller, who described it as a "horrific event."

"Once we know the cause and the facts surrounding this tragedy, we will make sure the public is fully informed -- so tragedies like this can be avoided in the future," he said. Castro County Sheriff Sal Rivera told the CBS affiliate in Amarillo that a system to remove manure from the barns may have gotten "overheated."

He said methane may have "ignited and then spread out with the explosion and the fire," adding that a probe would have to determine the precise cause. "Farms must do more to protect animals by adopting commonsense fire safety measures," tweeted the Animal Welfare Institute, one of the oldest animal welfare charities in the United States, referring to the Texas tragedy.



Ghulam's family refuse to take the body

PRAYAGRAJ: The family of Ghulam, one of the shooters involved in the Umesh Pal murder case and who was killed in an encounter with Uttar Pradesh Special Task Force (STF) in Jhansi, has refused to take his body. After Ghulam Mohammad was killed in the encounter with STF, his mother Khushnuda said that they have nothing to do with the son who tarnished the family. "I am also a mother. Umesh also had a mother."

Bitcoin price reaches \$31,000 for first time since June 2022

MOSCOW: Bitcoin's price is going up 2.58%, nearing \$31,000 for the first time since June 8, 2022, trading data showed on Friday. On Friday, the cryptocurrency's price topped \$31,000, followed by a minor fallback. As of 08:56 GMT, Bitcoin was trading at \$30,714, gaining 2.58% in price, the Binance cryptocurrency exchange showed on Friday. According to Binance, Bitcoin's highest trading price on Friday is a record since June 8, 2022, after which it dropped to \$19,000 by June 19 and has been slowly recovering ever since.

Around 52 injured as foot bridge collapses in Udhampur

JAMMU: Around 52 people including children suffered injuries on Friday when an iron foot bridge collapsed in Bani Sangam village of Bain in Chenani block of Udhampur district in Jammu and Kashmir. Police said that to participate in an annual Baisakhi Festival at Bani Sangam temple, hundreds of people were visiting to the spot. While on the way, the bridge collapsed suddenly due to overloading in which around 52 persons sustained injuries. "Three of the injured have been rushed to the district hospital Udhampur from where one 6-yr-old was referred to the Government Medical College."

India reports 11,109 fresh cases of Covid-19 in last 24 hours

NEW DELHI: India recorded 11,109 new cases of Covid-19 infection in the last 24 hours, a sharp jump from yesterday when 7,830 cases were reported, as per the daily health bulletin released by the Union Health Ministry on Friday. The active caseload stood at 49,622, which is 0.11 per cent of the total cases, added the Union Health Ministry. The country witnessed 6,456 recoveries in the last 24 hours increasing total recoveries to 4,42,16,583. The daily positivity rate stood at 5.01 per cent while the weekly positivity rate was at 4.29 per cent.

Your corruption can not be washed out by your crocodile tears: Harpal Cheema

CHANDIGARH, APRIL 14 : Taking a dig at former chief minister Charanjit Singh, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) senior leader and finance minister Harpal Singh Cheema said that Channi is only shedding crocodile tears. If he had actually cared about SC and ST people he would have taken an action against the people who embezzled SC scholarship money. Now when he is facing the consequences of his corruption he only wants the sympathy of the people.

Addressing the media here on Friday, Harpal Singh Cheema said that Congress has always treated SC, ST and BC people as their vote bank, misled them and used them for 70 years. In Punjab also months before assembly elections Congress made Charanjit Singh Channi first SC Chief Minister of Punjab to lure the voters. He said that if Congress would have actually cared about the poor people of our state and country they



would have facilitated them but instead Congress kept basic rights and facilities out of the reach of these people because they never wanted them to be educated and developed.

Cheema said that Channi launched all schemes just a couple of days before the code of conduct

at the time of Punjab assembly elections 2022, this shows his insincerity towards these people. He said that during the rule of Congress their ministers gulped down 64 crores of SC scholarship funds but even after becoming the CM Channi took no action against any corrupt minister or officer. Due

As soon as the NOC is received from various departments, the work of taking four will also be started. The repair work that was done earlier will be the same and now there is no need to be in any doubt. The renovation of the Kaithal-Cheeka road will be preceded by the four-laning work.

Flawed approach

When it comes to China, the world’s attention may be focused on its threatening military manoeuvres against Taiwan and the visits by various European leaders to Beijing, but for India, it is about deciphering the message China is trying to send with its recent actions. On April 2, the ministry of civil affairs in Beijing announced it would “standardise” the names of 11 places in Arunachal Pradesh, the third such list of standardised names after 2017 and 2021. It published the new list along with a map showing Arunachal Pradesh as part of China’s Tibet Autonomous Region.

A few days earlier, Bhutan’s prime minister, Lotay Tshering, gave an interview to the Belgian newspaper, La Libre, where he claimed that “there is no intrusion” by China into Bhutan and the two countries will be able to settle their boundary dispute “after one or two meetings.” A sharp response from Indian commentators earned the ire of China’s State-run media outlets, which asserted that Tshering’s interview was a victory for China and a setback for hegemonic India. On March 23, the prime minister of Bangladesh, Sheikh Hasina Wajed, inaugurated the country’s first ‘state of the art submarine base’ at Cox’s Bazar, which was made in collaboration with the Chinese who had provided two Ming class submarines to Dhaka in 2016.

Then came the news of Beijing’s decision to “freeze” the visas of two Indian journalists, asking them to not return to China. Two other Indian journalists, who remain in China, may meet the same fate. Beijing argues that its decision is a response to India taking steps against Chinese journalists. Meanwhile, Chinese diplomats in India proclaim that the situation on the border is “stable” and the two governments are bringing in “normalized management and control” at the earliest. In the least, these moves point to a hardening of the Chinese stance against India and diminish hopes of an early resolution to the ongoing border crisis.

The official Indian response to Chinese provocations is elusive, as along with the embattled Adani Group, any discussion or questions on the China border issue has been barred in Parliament and in Standing Committees. Large sections of the mainstream media follow the lead, other than providing an unquestioning platform to the external affairs minister, S. Jaishankar, to hold forth on the subject in a patronising manner. A respected diplomat in his previous avatar, Jaishankar now comes across as just another spokesperson of the Bharatiya Janata Party — partisan, defensive and self-congratulatory, who is loath to acknowledge the ground realities.

Broccoli consumption reduces risk of diseases

The health benefits of broccoli are well recognized. Research has revealed, for instance, that increasing the intake of cruciferous vegetables lowers the risk of type 2 diabetes and cancer.

Researchers at Penn State discovered in a recent study that broccoli has specific chemicals that bind to a receptor in mice and aid to preserve the lining of the small intestine, preventing the onset of sickness. The results provide evidence that broccoli is a "superfood" in the truest sense.

The study published in the journal Laboratory Investigation.

"We all know that broccoli is good for us, but why? What happens in the body when we eat broccoli?" said Gary Perdew, H. Thomas and Dorothy Willits Hallowell Chair in Agricultural Sciences, Penn State. "Our research is helping to uncover the mechanisms for how broccoli and other foods benefit health in mice and likely humans, as well. It provides strong evidence that cruciferous vegetables, such as broccoli, cabbage, and Brussels sprouts should be part of a normal healthy diet." According to Perdew, the wall of the



small intestine allows beneficial water and nutrients to pass into the body but prevents food particles and bacteria that could cause harm. Certain cells that line the intestine -- including enterocytes, which absorb water and nutrients; goblet cells, which secrete a protective

layer of mucus on the intestinal wall; and Paneth cells, which secrete lysosomes that contain digestive enzymes -- help to modulate this activity and keep a healthy balance.

In their study, Perdew and his colleagues found that molecules in broccoli, called aryl hydrocarbon receptor

ligands, bind to aryl hydrocarbon receptor (AHR), which is a type of protein called a transcription factor. This binding, they found, initiates a variety of activities that affect the functions of intestinal cells.

To conduct their study, the researchers fed an experi-

mental group of mice a diet containing 15% broccoli -- equivalent to about 3.5 cups per day for humans -- and fed a control group of mice a typical lab diet that did not contain broccoli.

They then analyzed the animals' tissues to determine the extent to which AHR was

activated, as well as the quantities of various cell types and mucus concentrations, among other factors, in the two groups.

The team found that mice that were not fed broccoli lacked AHR activity, which resulted in altered intestinal barrier function, reduced transit time of food in the small intestine, decreased number of goblet cells and protective mucus, decreased Paneth cells and lysosome production, and decreased number of enterocyte cells.

"The gut health of the mice that were not fed broccoli was compromised in a variety of ways that are known to be associated with disease," said Perdew.

"Our research suggests that broccoli and likely other foods can be used as natural sources of AHR ligands, and that diets rich in these ligands contribute to resilience of the small intestine."

More broadly, added Andrew Patterson, John T. and Paige S. Smith Professor of Molecular Toxicology and of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, "these data suggest that dietary cues, relayed through the activity of AHR, can reshape the cellular and metabolic repertoire of the gastrointestinal tract."

Cluster headache and migraine

According to a meta-analysis published in the online issue of Neurology, the medical journal of the American Academy of Neurology, both cluster headache and migraine have strong links to the circadian system, the internal clock that regulates body processes.

The meta-analysis included all available studies on cluster headache and migraine that included circadian features. This included information on the timing of headaches during the day and during the year as well as studies on whether genes associated with the circadian clock are more common in people with these headaches.

The researchers also looked at studies on cluster headache and migraine and hormones related to the circadian system, including cortisol and melatonin. "The data suggest that both of these headache disorders are highly circadian at multiple levels, especially cluster headache," said study author Mark Joseph Burish, MD, PhD, of the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston in Texas and a member of the American



Academy of Neurology. "This reinforces the importance of the hypothalamus -- the area of the brain that houses the primary biological clock -- and its role in cluster headache and migraine. It also raises the question of the genetics of triggers such as sleep changes that are known triggers for migraine and are cues for the body's circadian rhythm."

For cluster headache, the meta-analysis found a circadian pattern of headache attacks in 71% of people. Attacks peaked in the late hours of the night to early hours of the morning. During the year, people had more attacks in the spring and fall. On the genetic level, cluster headache was as-

sociated with two main circadian genes, and five of the nine genes that increase the likelihood of having cluster headache are genes with a circadian pattern of expression.

People with cluster headache also had higher cortisol levels and lower melatonin levels than people without cluster headache. For migraine, the meta-analysis showed a circadian pattern of attacks in 50% of people. While the peak for attacks during the day was broad, ranging from late morning until early evening, there was a circadian low point during the night when few attacks happened. Migraine was also associated with two core circadian genes.

Improving your work-life balance may help you become a more effective leader



According to a recent study, turning off your notifications and ignoring your email at the end of the workday might help you become a better leader.

Managers who disconnected from their jobs at home felt more refreshed the next day, identified as effective leaders and helped their employees stay on target better than bosses who spent their off hours worrying about work. Less-experienced leaders were especially prone to becoming ineffective if they spent their time focusing on their jobs at home. The upshot is that the key to effective leadership in the office might be a better work-life balance. Led by scientists from the University of Florida, the University of Arizona and Florida State University, the new study was published in the Journal of Applied Psychology.

"The simple message of this study is that if you want to be an effective leader at work, leave work at work," said Klodiana Lanaj, a professor in UF's Warrington College of Business who led the research. "This is par-

ticularly important for inexperienced leaders, as they seem to benefit the most from recovery experiences when at home. Leaders have challenging jobs as they juggle their own role responsibilities with the needs of their followers, and they need to recover from the demands of the leadership role."

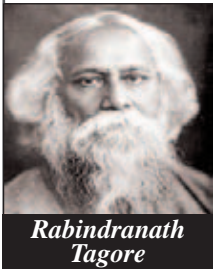
The study surveyed managers and their employees at U.S. businesses in 2019 and 2022. The researchers assessed leaders' ability to disconnect from work when at home the night before and their level of energy and how strongly they identified as a leader in the morning at work. Employees rated their bosses on their ability to lead their teams.

"What we found is that on nights when leaders were able to completely turn off and not think about work, they were more energized the next day, and they felt better connected to their leadership role at work. On those same days, their followers reported that these leaders were more effective in motivating them and in guiding their work," Lanaj said.

Migratory birds can partially offset climate change: Study

Climate change-induced habitat degradation is causing havoc with bird migratory dates. According to a new study, birds can partially compensate for these changes by delaying the start of spring migration and finishing the journey faster. Yet, the method has a cost--a decrease in overall survival.

The findings by researchers from Cornell University, the University of Maryland, and Georgetown University are published in the journal Ecology.

"We found that our study species, the American Redstart, can migrate up to 43% faster to reach its breeding grounds after delaying departure from wintering grounds in Jamaica by as much as 10 days," said lead author Bryant Dossman. He led the study while a graduate student at Cornell and is currently a postdoctoral fellow at George-



town. "But increased migration speed also led to a drop of more than 6% in their overall survival rate."

Tactics for speeding up migration

can include flying faster and making fewer or shorter stopovers to refuel along the way. Though migrating faster helps compensate for delayed depar-

tures, it can't entirely make up for lost time. In general, for a 10-day delay, Dossman says individuals can recover about 60% of the lost time, but that means still arriving late on the breeding grounds.

Jamaica has become increasingly dry in recent decades and that translates into fewer insects, the mainstay of the redstart diet. Now, it takes the birds longer to get into condition for the rigors of migration, especially from poorer quality habitats. At the same time, plants are greening and insects are coming out sooner on the breeding grounds--also because of climate change.

"On average, migratory songbirds only live a year or two, so keeping to a tight schedule is vital. They're only going to get one or two chances to breed," said Dossman. "Longer lived birds are

less likely to take the risk of speeding up migrations because they have more chances throughout their lives to breed and pass on their genes."

The study is based on 33 years of American Redstart migration departure data at the Fort Hill Nature Preserve in Jamaica. Senior co-author Peter Marra, director of the Earth Commons--Georgetown University's Institute for Environment & Sustainability--oversees the study site. Using this historical data in tandem with automated radio tracking and light-level tags, scientists compared the redstarts' expected departure date with their actual departure date in recent years to see how it's changed.

"The behavioral shifts documented in this research remind us that the manner in which climate change affects animals can be subtle and, in some cases,

able to be detected only after long term study," shared Amanda Rodewald, a co-author on the paper as well as the Garvin Professor and Senior Director of the Center for Avian Population Studies at the Cornell Lab. "Understanding how animals can compensate is an important part of understanding where the impacts of climate change will play out," said Marra. "In this case, we may not lose a species entirely, but it is possible that populations of some species may go extinct locally due to climate change." What happens on the redstart wintering grounds carries over into the breeding season. Though the redstart population is stable and increasing in much of its breeding range, detailed eBird Trend maps show the species is declining in the northeastern United States and southern Quebec, Canada.
