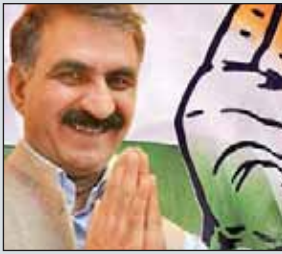

India's wholesale inflation drops to 1.34 pc in March

NEW DELHI: Continuing declining trend, India's wholesale inflation fell to 1.34% in March, 2023 as against 3.85% recorded in the previous month. "Decline in the rate of inflation in March, 2023 is primarily contributed by fall in prices of basic metals, food products, textiles, non-food articles, minerals, rubber & plastic products, crude petroleum & natural gas and paper and paper products," an official release from Commerce Ministry said on Monday. Driven primarily by the softening of food prices, India's retail inflation measured by consumer price index (CPI) also dropped in March to 5.66% from 6.44%.

Bathinda Military station killing: Army Jawan confesses to killing four colleagues

NEW DELHI: After sustained interrogation, Gunner Desai Mohan, who was arrested by the Punjab Police on Monday has confessed his involvement in the killing of four of his colleagues in Bathinda Military station, said the Indian Army. As per statement by the Headquarters of South Western Command, Gunner Desai Mohan confessed to his involvement in stealing an INSAS rifle and killing four of his colleagues. "Initial investigations indicate that this was apparently due to personal reasons/animosity" said the statement.

Massive fire damages 6 residential houses, shopping complex in Srinagar

SRINAGAR: At least six residential houses and a multi-storeyed shopping complex were gutted in a devastating fire that broke out at Hazratbal causing damage to the property worth Crores on Monday, officials said. Fire and Emergency Service officials said a massive fire broke out at around 11.58 am in one of the rooms of a U-shaped shopping complex and engulfed other compartments, housing several food outlets and residential houses at Hazratbal in Srinagar causing extensive damage to the property.

Court extends Manish Sisodia's judicial custody till May 1

NEW DELHI: The Rouse Avenue Court on Monday extended the judicial custody of former Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia till May 1, in a case pertaining to alleged irregularities in the now-scraped excise policy. Sisodia was produced physically on Monday before the Court from Tihar Jail after the end of his judicial custody period. Earlier on April 3, the same court extended Sisodia's judicial custody till April 17. Sisodia was arrested on February 26, by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and Enforcement Directorate (ED) in an ongoing investigation of a case related to alleged irregularities in the framing.

Heatstroke : Death toll rises to 11 in Mumbai; over 100 hospitalized

The death toll in the heat stroke that took place at an award event in Maharashtra's Navi Mumbai rose to 11 on Monday. More than 120 people suffered from heat-related health issues, like dehydration, due exposure to sunlight on Sunday during a mega event in Navi Mumbai, where social activist Dattatreya Narayan alias Appasaheb Dharmadhikari was given the Maharashtra Bhushan award, a government official said.

Thirteen of these people were admitted to different local hospitals and the condition of one of them is serious, the official said.

Lakhs of followers of Dharmadhikari attended the grand function held on a sprawling 306-acre ground in Kharghar. Union Home Minister Amit Shah presented the award, instituted by the Maharashtra government, to Dharmadhikari. The event, for which people had started gathering since morning, began around 11.30 am and went on till around 1 pm. Many of them had arrived on Saturday.

The ground was packed with people and equipped with audio/video facilities for followers of Shree Sadasya (Dharmadhikari's organisation) to witness the function. The seating arrangement for the attendees was made in the open and there was no shed.

"A total of 123 people complained of heat-related health ailments, like dehydration during the event. They were immediately referred to the 30 medical booths set up at the venue. Thirteen of the patients, who needed



further treatment, were shifted to different private hospitals and the condition of one of them is serious," a revenue department official, who was on duty at the venue, said.

"A total of 30 doctors were deployed at the medical booths that had intensive care unit (ICU) facilities to treat people at the venue," she said.

A doctor at a civic hospital in Navi Mumbai's Vashi said that five patients were admitted there for treatment after they complained of heat-related health issues.

During the event, Shah said he has never seen such a big presence of lakhs of people to honour a person for his social service. Maha-

rastra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, Deputy CM Devendra Fadnavis were also present on the occasion.

CM Shinde on Sunday informed that around 7-8 persons died after attending the 'Maharashtra Bhushan' award event. He claimed that these people lost their lives at hospitals hours after they were exposed to sunlight during the event. At least 24 people are undergoing treatment at a hospital.

Earlier in the day, Union home minister Amit Shah conferred the award on Appasaheb Dharmadhikari at the ceremony held in the Kharghar area in Raigad district neighbouring Mumbai.

Atiq's Killers moved to another jail over security concerns

The men who shot and killed gangster-politician Atiq Ahmed and his brother, Ashraf, have been shifted to another jail in Uttar Pradesh due to security reasons.

Sunny Singh, Arun Maurya, Lovelesh Towari - the three men in their twenties who killed the gangsters while they were being escorted by cops - have been moved to Pratapgarh jail from the earlier Naini jail in Prayagraj.

According to intelligence inputs, there could have been an attack on the three in Naini jail.

The three men, who cops say wanted to make a name for themselves by eliminating Ahmed's gang, were sent to judicial custody for 14 days after they were produced in court over the weekend.

The Uttar Pradesh government has given a

three-member judicial inquiry committee two months to submit a report on the killings, which were caught on live television.

The state police has also announced to form two spe-



cial investigating teams (SITs) to probe the sensational killing incident.

The assailants had been posing as journalists. They shouted slogans of 'Jai Shri Ram' after the killings and surrendered. The police said they recovered three fake media ID cards, a microphone and a camera from the shooters. They surrendered to the police after the shooting and were arrested. Lovelesh was hit by one of the bullets on his foot and is in hospital.

Centre opposes same sex marriages in Apex Court

Calling marriage an "exclusively heterogeneous institution", the Centre today again opposed granting legal sanction to same-sex marriage, and said the question of considering it equal to the existing concept of marriage "seriously affects the interests of every citizen". A court order recognising same-sex marriages would mean a virtual judicial rewriting of an entire branch of law, the government argued, adding that the Court must refrain from passing such "omnibus orders".

It's not discrimination to grant recognition to the "heterogeneous institution of marriage alone" to the exclusion of same-sex marriage, the government argued, saying that this is



because conventional and universally accepted socio-legal relationships like marriages across all religions, are "deeply rooted in the Indian social context and indeed is considered a sacrament in all branches of Hindu law. Even in Islam, though it is a contract, it is a sacred contract and a valid

marriage is only between a biological male and a biological woman".

Calling the petitions "mere urban elitist views for the purpose of social acceptance," the Centre in its submission to the top court said that the Parliament will have to take into account "broader views and voices of all rural,

Raids on drug stores in Haryana to check storage of cold temperature medicines

As per the directions of Haryana Health and Family Welfare Minister Anil Vij, a campaign was launched by the officers of the Department of Drugs and Administration. The officers raided more than 50 shops across the state.

He said that he was continuously receiving complaints regarding the Chemist shopkeepers turning off the main switch while closing the shop at night, due to which the refrigerators containing medicines also get turned off. He informed that with this practice the medicine requiring cold temperature like anti-rabies vaccine, insulin, tetanus etc. gets adversely affected. Sh. Vij said that if such medicines are kept at a temperature higher than the prescribed freezing temperature for 72 hours, then also they lose their potency.

He said that under this campaign checking has been done at 12 shops in Faridabad, 05 in Jhajjar, 11

in Gurugram, 10 in Karnal, 10 in Kurukshetra, 01 in Sonapat, 01 in Panipat and 11 in Ambala. Out of these, refrigerators were found turned off in 02 shops in Faridabad-Bharat Medical Store MCF-184, Main Market, Mujesar, Faridabad and Shree Balaji Medical Store, Shop No. 752, Main Market, Sector 24, Faridabad. Both these shops were sealed on the spot.

Apart from this, Anish Medical Store, Ashok Vihar, Main Palam Vihar Road, Gurugram was also sealed. Similarly, a refrigerator was found switched off in a shop in Sonapat which has also been sealed. Sh. Vij warned the chemist shopkeepers that they should store cold temperature medicines in refrigerators properly and the wholesalers should also distribute such medicines to the retailers as per the rules, otherwise they will be punished for violation and stringent action will also be taken against the shopkeepers.

No more NPS deduction in Himachal: CS

The Himachal Pradesh government on Monday issued a notification directing that no deduction should be made from the salaries of its employees for the National Pension Scheme (NPS) with effect from April 1.

A notification issued by the Chief Secretary Parboddh Saxena said that in view of the state cabinet's decision for implementation of the Old Pension Scheme under the CCS (Pension) Rules 1972, the government has decided that contributions of its employees covered under National Pension System shall be stopped from April 1, 2023.

The state council of ministers decided to restore the Old Pension Scheme in a cabinet meeting on January 17 and notified the OPS in place of NPS on March 15.

The state government stated that it would help 1.36 lakh state employees to get pension after their retirement on the basis of OPS. Earlier, under the NPS, the employees and the state government contributes share of 12 pc each based on the basic and DA of the employees.

Commissioner Gurdaspur Dr. Himanshu Aganwal said that the benefit of this scheme will be given only to those industrial workers who are working in the registered institution/ establishment under the Punjab Labor Welfare Fund Act-1965 and are continuously contributing to the Punjab Labor Welfare Fund. He said that workers can send a application letter on the prescribed form to the concerned Assistant Labor Commissioner/ Labor Conciliation Officer till the specified date of their daughter's marriage. Under the Shagan scheme, the girl who works herself (is a worker) will also be given the benefit of this scheme. Under this scheme, The Shagan scheme will be applicable only once on the occasion of marriage of 2 girls and not on remarriage after divorce etc. A worker can apply within 6 months after the fixed date of his daughter's marriage. If the worker is receiving any such financial assistance from the state government or any other organization under this scheme then he will also be entitled to get the benefit under this scheme.

Nand Lal Sharma, Chairman & Managing Director, SJVN accompanied him during the visit. NJHPS is India's largest underground hydro Power Station in operation since 2003-04. During his visit, Union Power Secretary, Sh. Alok Kumar inaugurated the newly constructed Central Robotic Hard Coating Facility and O&M workshop at NJHPS, Jhakri. Nand Lal Sharma



CMD, SJVN apprised the Hon'ble Secretary that NJHPS has been exceeding annual generation targets by efficiently tackling the issue of heavy silt that is part of river Sutlej. Earlier,

NJHPS established High Velocity Oxy Fuel Hard Coating facility at its project site to protect the critical underwater parts of the power station. Previously there were separate facilities

for repair of individual parts. Subsequently, SJVN management felt the need for setting up common hub for repair and refurbishment of the parts at one place. Accordingly, new Central Robotic Hard Coating Facility and O&M Workshop have been established. With this facility large parts of the Power Station would be repaired and transported easily thus expediting the reclamation process of these parts, thereby shortening the maintenance time. Nand Lal Sharma further informed that NJHPS is the first Hydro Power Station in the country to have such facility of its own.

A 2022 study in India showed that while 52% patients with psoriasis were satisfied with their treatment

I see around 300 patients with psoriasis in a month and most of them expect the treatment to give them complete skin clearance with minimal to no side effects. Conventional therapies generally provide about 75% skin clearance; however, they also have some side effects. Innovative therapies such as biologics, have the potential to meet patients' expectations because of their improved efficacy and safety. Affordability of these treatments should be addressed to ensure that all patients have access to them. My advice to patients is to seek treatment from a qualified dermatologist and to follow a healthy lifestyle to manage psoriasis effectively." Psoriasis is an immune mediated chronic inflammatory disorder of the skin which gives rise to dry, thick, raised, red patches on the skin that continuously shed silvery scales. The skin patches are accompanied by unstoppable itching and sometimes pain. The itching and the pain can make it difficult for patients to even tolerate everyday clothes. Studies have documented that itching interferes with sleep and affects productivity in at least one third of patients.

4-in-1 Flu Vaccination can help protect against H3N2 - Dr. Sunny Narula

CHANDIGARH : Recent reports from ICMR show that cases of flu caused by the virus H3N2 is spreading across the country. This viral strain causes prolonged illness and has led to more hospitalizations than flu infections caused by other type of strains. People whose immunity is weak are more likely to suffer from complications such as pneumonia, bronchitis, and seizures, where H3N2 can also be life-threatening in some cases. ICMR data show that in the past three months, 10% of SARI patients hospitalized with H3N2 complications needed oxygen and 7% required ICU care. H3N2 is a sub-type of influenza A virus. Every year during seasonal changes, the temperature change causes flu viruses to rise and spread fast. Annually some subtypes spread more than others. All flu viruses, including H3N2, spread through an infected individual when they cough, sneeze, or talk. They can also spread when uninfected people touch an object or surface contaminated by these viruses and then touch their nose or mouth, eople most at risk for H3N2 and other strains of flu are children below 5 years of age, ageing adults, pregnant women, and those with chronic conditions such as diabetes, asthma, kidney disease and heart disease. The main symptoms of flu infection are fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffed nose and headache & bodyaches. In H3N2 infection, the fever usually lasts for three days, but the cough can persist for 3 weeks.

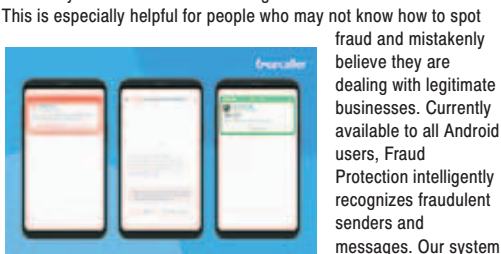
