SC says it can dissolve marriages on grounds of irretrievable breakdown

AGENCY NEW DELHI, MAY 1

A five-judge Constitution bench of the Supreme Court in its judgement on Monday ruled that the Supreme Court can dissolve a marriage on the ground of irretrievable breakdown by dispensing with the need of the waiting period as required under the marital laws.

"Article 142 must be considered in light of the fundamental rights. We have held that the period of six months can be dispensed with. It is possible for this Court to dissolve the marriage on irretrievable breakdown of marriage," a five-judge Constitution bench, led by Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul said, in the judgement.

While dealing with Article 142 of the Constitution of India, the Supreme Court also said that we have laid out the factors for this, specifically with regards to maintenance and rights of the children.

"It (SC) can invoke special power granted to it under Article 142 of the constitution to grant divorce in such cases to do complete justice," the bench said.


It also held that the Court under the power is empowered to complete justice

According to Article 142 of the Indian Constitution, this deals with the enforcement of decrees (Order) and orders of the apex court to do "complete justice" in any matter pending before it.

While reserving its verdict in September 29, last year, the five-judge

The Apex court also comprised of Justices Sanjiv Khanna, A.S. Oka, Vikram Nath and J.K. Maheshwari, as the part of the five-judge Constitution Bench, which pronounced the judgement on a batch of pleas today.

The Top Court also acknowledged the significant role that families play in Indian marriages. The Apex Court had in one of its hearing, had said, "We believe that another question which would require consideration would be whether the power under Article 142 of the Constitution of India is inhibited in any manner in a scenario where there is an irretrievable breakdown of marriage in the opinion of the court but one of the parties is not consenting to the terms.

The Supreme Court on Monday extended its interim order by which it had stayed the trial court's proceedings against Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in a case registered against him in 2014 in Uttar Pradesh during the election campaign.

Kejriwal approached the Supreme Court challenging the Allahabad High Court order which had rejected his plea for discharge from the case. The High Court while dismissing Kejriwal's plea had said that it appeared that Kejriwal is threatening the voters in the name

Operation Kaveri: 3,000 evacuated from Sudan

NEW DELHI: Nearly 2,500 Indians rescued from Sudan have arrived in India so far, while India has successfully evacuated around 3,000 of its nationals from the strife-hit country under Operation Kaveri so far. Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Arindam Bagchi in a tweet said that the 9th outbound flight from Jeddah, where India has set up a coordination centre, has landed in India ferrying 186 passengers. #OperationKaveri continues to bring Indians back home. Flight carrying 186 passengers touches down in Kochi." Meanwhile, another IAF C-130J flight carrying the 16th batch of evacuees left Port Sudan carrying 122 passengers. With this nearly 3,000 persons have now left Sudan under Operation Kaveri, the MEA said.

Ludhiana gas leak: PM announces ex-gratia of Rs 2 lakh for kin of dead, Rs 50,000 for injured

NEW DELHI : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday announced an ex-gratia of Rs 2 lakh for the kin of the deceased and Rs 50,000 for those injured from the Prime Ministers National Relief Fund (PMNRF) in the Ludhiana gas leak accident.

In a tweet posted on the official page of the PMO, the Prime Minister Modi expressed grief over the incident. "Expressing grief over the tragic incident due to gas leakage in Ludhiana, the Prime Minister @narendramodi has announced an ex-gratia grant of Rs 2 lakh through PMNRF for the next of kin of each deceased. 50,000 will be given to each injured person," tweeted the PMO.

Meanwhile, the National Disaster Relief Force (NDRF) investigating the Ludhiana gas leak case on Monday said the release of the hydrogen sulphide gas was the "possible reason" for the deaths

Domestic air travel surpasses pre-Covid average in April

Domestic air travel surpassed the pre-Covid average, after touching an alltime high on Sunday.

According to the Ministry of Civil Aviation, "India's domestic air traffic reached a new height with an all-time high on Sunday when a total of 9,13,336 passengers travelled on 5,947 flights".

Recently, International Air Transort Association (IATA) report said that India is fast emerging as a key global aviation market, according to the latest market analysis report.

India's domestic air travel has continued to grow robustly and as of February, it was a mere 2.2 per cent shy of



reaching pre-pandemic levels measured by passenger revenue kilometres (PRK)

"The India domestic passenger market also led the rest of the domestic markets in the passenger load factor (PLF) metric in the report which includes the US, China and Japanese domestic markets. It has been the top domestic market measured by PLF for the last four months achieving PLFS of 81.6 per cent in February,

85.2 per cent in January, 88.9 per cent in December 2022, and 87.9 per cent in November 2022," the report stated. In the last IATA report released in February this year, it was said that India's domestic air travel witnessed massive improvement as it hit 85.7 per cent of pre-COVID levels in the year 2022. Recovery in air travel continued in December 2022. The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) data shows that in the year 2022 had seen 12.3 crore domestic flyers which was up from 8.4 crore in 2021 and 6.3 crore in 2020 (flights were suspended due to Covid). There were also assumptions that the number is going to hit somewhere between 14.5-15 cr in the year 2023.







In his keynote address, he said that Tibet stands as one of the least free countries in the world, having struggled with South Sudan and North Korea over the past 72 years of Chinese colonial rule in Tibet. We are dying a slow death. Our culture is dying a slow death. All the policies and programs of the Chinese government are aimed at destroying the Tibetan national identity and the environment of Tibet. Sikyong commented and expressed regret that the Chinese

identity and environment: Penpa Tsering government deliberately perpetrates such atrocities. He expressed concern about one million Tibetan children being separated from their families and forced assimilation into colonial boarding schools. He denounced the policy as having as much to do with providing education as sinning Tibetan children in pursuit of the One China policy. In an effort to counter this growing Chinese aggression, Penpa Tsering urged the global community not to recognize China's suzerainty over Tibet as China would have it. 

srael has no written Constitution but its Basic Laws allow the Supreme Court to rule on the constitutionality of Knesset (Parliament) legislations. Israel is, according to the Basic Laws, a "Jewish and democratic state" in which "the Jewish people have a unique right to self-determination." It is, therefore, preferentially democratic, because about 22% of Israel's population is Arab but they have no equal rights, whereas true democracy requires equality.

Israel's founding fathers decided against a written Constitution because of this contradiction between a Jewish State and a democratic one. The latest coalition of Benjamin Netanyahu's Likud plus religious (Bezalel Smotrich's Religious Zionists) and nationalist (Itamar Ben-Gvir's Jewish Power) parties results in the most right-wing regime in Israel's 75 years, and the ultra-nationalists wish to take the preferential State to its logical conclusion — reforming the law so that Israel's Basic Laws would be beyond the reach of the courts, annexing the West Bank and East Jerusalem, and expelling Arabs who do not agree to be reduced to second-class citizens.

Netanyahu, prime minister for the sixth time after elections last December, seeks to reform the Israeli Supreme Court for reasons curiously similar to the debate now current in India, calling the judiciary a self-selecting club, stating, "judges in Israel have a veto over the selection of other judges" — except that he is personally involved as a person indicted for breach of trust, bribery and fraud and his criminal trial process is ongoing. The proposed reforms envisage shifting judicial appointments from the present nine-member body made up of representatives of government, Parliament, Bar and bench into the exclusive hands of politicians who would strip the Supreme Court of power to strike down legislation that they regard as unconstitutional. If passed, the ultra-nationalist coalition could bypass all the legal safeguards for the Arabs with more extensive arbitrary arrests, killings, and house demolitions.

Netanyahu is now caught between his far-right policies and public anger over the reform plan. Military and business leaders oppose the government, along with most of the media and the academia. Thousands of military reservists refused to report for duty, causing Netanyahu to dismiss the defence minister, Yoav Gallant. The national labour federation, Histadrut, called for a general strike and swelled the protesting number of mainly Sephardic and Ashkenazi, middle-class, non-religious Jews. Netanyahu, confronted with massive demonstrations against a background of Israeli air strikes in southern Lebanon.

India emerging as key aviation market

ndia is fast emerging as a key global aviation market, according to the latest market analysis report of the International Air Transport Association (ATA).

India's domestic air travel has continued to grow robustly and as of February, it was a mere 2.2 per cent shy of reaching pre-pandemic levels measured by passenger revenue kilometres (PRK).

The India domestic passenger market also led the rest of the domestic markets in the passenger load factor (PLF) metric in the report which includes the US, China and Japanese domestic markets. It has been the top domestic market measured by PLF for the last four months achieving PLFs of 81.6 per cent in February, 85.2 per cent in January, 88.9 per cent in December 2022, and 87.9 per cent in November 2022.

Globally, traffic is now at Globally, traffic is now at 84.9 per cent of February 2019 levels. Total traffic in February 2023, based on RPKs, rose 55.5 per cent compared to February 2022. The report added, "Asia-Pacific airlines had a 378.7

Pacific airlines had a 378.7 per cent increase in February 2023 traffic compared to February 2022, maintaining the very positive momentum of the past few months since



the lifting of travel restrictions in the region. Capacity rose 176.4 per cent and the load factor increased 34.9 percentage points to 82.5 per cent, the second highest among the regions.'

Domestic air passenger traffic for all markets meas-ured for February rose 25.2 per cent compared to one year ago. Total February 2023 domestic traffic was at 97.2 per cent of the February 2019[°] level.

At the moment, it is estimated that only about 35 to 40 million Indians travel by air every year. Although World Bank data shows that

pre-COVID India had about 168 million air transport passengers, many are repeat flyers. This is much lower than China, which has a similar population and has 660 million air transport passengers during the same period in 2019. Chinese airlines also have about five times as

many planes. With a rapidly growing middle class and rising incomes, together with the right encouragement including lower airfares, many, including airline companies, are expecting India to become the fastest-growing aviation market for years to

come. Swiss airline intelligence provider, ch-aviation reported in March this year that French Finance Minister Bruno Le Maire said that IndiGo Airlines could announce an order for "several hundred" Airbus aircraft at the Paris Air Show to be held at Paris Le Bourget Airport in June.

IndiGo, the largest airline in India has over 300 aircraft and currently provides over 35 per cent of all the available seat kilometres on flights in and out of India's airports. Measured by flight frequencies, IndiGo provides almost 48 per cent of all flights across India's international and domestic markets.

Just in February, competitor Air India announced a world record order of 470 aircraft - 250 planes from European manufacturer Airbus and 220 from its US rival Boeing. The deal beats a 2017 order by IndiGo for 420 planes, and an order by American Airlines for 460 planes in 2011.

Besides aircraft manufacturers, foreign Airlines are also eyeing the Indian aviation market.

Singapore Airlines is one of them. Following the takeover of Air India by Tata Sons. it announced a

USD267 million investment into the revamped airline giving it a 25.1 per cent stake in the new Air India group. This adds to the money it has al-ready put into Vistara Airlines which is to be merged with Air India.

SIA released a statement during the announcement which said, "The merged entity will be four to five times larger in scale compared to Vistara, with a strong presence in all key airline segments in India. The proposed merger will bolster SIA's presence in India, strengthen its multi-hub strategy, and allow it to continue participating directly in this large and fast-growing aviation mar-ket." Etihad Airways under new CEO Antonoaldo Neves is another airline that is planning to expand its presence in

the India aviation market. In an interview with Reuters published on April 27, the former CEO of TAP Air Portugal said that: "Etihad has India as a priority." He added that the country is among its top three markets but declined to name the other two. Etihad, which flies to places like Delhi and Mumbai, has identified six other Indian cities it does not serve but wants to launch flights to, he said. He also announced

plans for Etihad to double its fleet to 150 planes and triple its passenger number to 30 million annually by the end of the decade. The expansion plans of the Middle Eastern airline will focus on medium and long-haul destinations, and the airline will avoid operating ultra-long-haul flights, where it can be tough to make money. Neves explained that the goal will be connecting places like China, Southeast Asia, India, and Gulf countries, with Europe and the East Coast of the United States.

Neves said that he ex-pects Etihad's growth to be organic relying on more code sharing and interline agreements. It will not look at mergers or equity partner-ships as it had done in the past. It once had a stake in the now-defunct Jet Airways.

Abu Dhabi's sovereign wealth fund ADQ took full control of Etihad last October and appointed Neves who had previously led a turnaround at Portugal's TAP.

Whereas in the past, Etihad was seemingly willing to grow at any cost, this is set to change. Neves emphasises that growth will only be possible with profitability, especially as the airline is now owned by ADQ.



Fitness levels can reduce death risk from cardiovascular disease in men

eing healthy may reduce the chance of dying from cardiovas-Cular disease in men with high blood pressure. This finding is the result of a 29-year investigation. The study's findings were published today in the European Journal of Preventive Cardiology, an ESC journal.

"This was the first study to evaluate the joint effects of fitness and blood pressure on the risk of dying from cardiovascular disease," study author Professor Jari Laukkanen of the University of Eastern Finland in Kuopio, Finland, said. "The findings suggest that physical activity may help avoid some of the negative effects of high blood pressure."

Around 1.3 billion persons between the ages of 30 and 79 suffer from hypertension or high blood pressure. Globally, hypertension is one of the main caus-



es of premature death and a significant risk factor for heart attacks and strokes. High levels of cardiorespiratory fitness have been associated with longer lifespans, according to previous studies. This study looked at the relationship between

blood pressure, fitness, and the risk of cardiovascular death.

The study included 2,280 men aged 42 to 61 years living in eastern Finland and enrolled in the Kuopio Ischaemic Heart Disease Risk Factor Study. Base-

line measurements were conducted between 1984 and 1989. These included blood pressure and cardiorespiratory fitness, which was assessed as maximal oxygen uptake while riding a stationary bicycle. Blood pressure was classified as normal or high, and fitness was classified as low, medium or high.

The average age at baseline was 53 years. Participants were followed up until 2018. During a median follow-up of 29 years, there were 644 deaths due to cardiovascular disease. The risk of death from cardiovascular disease was analysed after adjusting for age, body mass index, cholesterol levels, smoking status, type 2 diabetes, coronary heart disease, use of antihypertensive medication, alcohol consumption, physical activity, socioeconomic status, and high sensitivity C-reactive protein (a marker of inflammation). Considering blood pressure alone, compared to normal values, high blood pressure was associated with a 39 per cent increased risk of cardiovascular mortality (hazard ratio [HR] 1.39; 95 per cent confidence interval [CI] 1.17-1.63). Considering fitness alone, compared with high levels, low fitness was associated with a 74 per cent elevated likelihood of cardiovascular death (HR 1.74; 95 per cent CI 1.35-

To evaluate the joint associations of blood pressure and fitness with the risk of cardiovascular death, participants were categorised into four groups: 1) normal blood pressure and high fitness (this was the reference group for comparison); 2) normal blood pressure and low fitness; 3) high blood pressure and high fitness; 4) high blood pressure and low fitness

Men with high blood pressure and low fitness had a more than doubled risk of cardiovascular death compared to those with normal blood pressure and high fitness (HR 2.35; 95% CI 1.81-3.04). When men with high blood pressure had high fitness levels, their elevated risk of cardiovascular risk persisted but was weaker: it was 55% higher than those with normal blood pressure and high fitness (HR 1.55; 95% CI 1.16-2.07).

Professor Laukkanen said: "Both high blood pressure and low fitness levels were each associated with an increased risk of cardiovascular death High fitness levels attenuated, but did not eliminate, the increased risk of cardiovascular mortality in men with elevated blood pressure.'

Premature baby girl with multiple conditions gets a new lease of life at Max Hospital

MOHALI: A 25 weeks premature baby girl weighing 1200 gram, got a new lease of life after a successful treatment at Max Hospital, Mohali, Giving information, Dr. Manu Sharma paediatrician and neonatologist at Max Hospital, Mohali said that due to premature birth, her condition deteriorated due to various issues. She had numerous issues as she was barely breathing, had pneumonia and sepsis in short and was in danger of not surviving. Baby was promptly transferred to NICU, under an intensive care team that provides highly specialized care to such babies who are prematurely born, he informed Baby was developing acute kidney injury and could not breathe without a ventilator The ultrasound of the baby's mother who had already lost a 17-day baby earlier revealed that at 23 weeks into her pregnancy, her cervix was open and her baby could come out at any time. Extra time was crucial for survival of her precious baby, and she was hospitalized with the hope that she and her baby could delay the birth. But the bleeding didn't stop even after 24 hours of hospital stay. So an emergency Csection was planned, Dr Manu said. Dr Manu Sharma further informed that the

baby had multiple bruises and discoloration and we feared that she was not going to survive more than a few hours. She was in acute respiratory failure and had very low oxvaen levels in her blood.

The baby was on a special ventilator high frequency oscillator that provides 100% oxygen supplementation. As the baby was not able to maintain oxygenation, she was in septic shock, which dropped her blood pressure and to worsen these investigations revealed low platelet count and deranged INR (tendency of blood to clot) along with She developed acute kidney failure as well as severe anemia. She also developed lung infection on top of having premature lungs. The neonatalperinatal team tried every support available to keep her baby alive and fortunately after 2 months they were able to bring her oxygen to a normal range.

Baby was placed on multiple medications to bring blood pressure up so that her heart did not stop beating and was placed on broad spectrum antibiotics to treat gram negative bacterial sepsis and pneumonia. She also received multiple blood products for days, informed Dr Manu

Walnuts are a nutrientdense food and a rich plant-based source of ALA, an omega-3 fatty acid that provides energy and is essential for the body and its development. For this reason, walnuts are a great ally of adolescent health," says Dr. Jordi Julvez, principal investigator and coordinator of the Neuro Èpia Research Group of the IISPV This study involved 700 volunteers, specifically, high school students between 11 and 16 years of age from 12 different high schools. The participants were randomly divided into two groups: the control group and the experimental group.
