Gangster murder: 6 arrested, 20 detained during police raids in Delhi, Hry

NEW DELHI: The massive early morning raids by Dwarka District Police in the national capital and Haryana concluded with the arrest of six people and detention of 20 others, officials said. Those arrested have been identified as Nitin Narulla, Nikhil, Rajpal, Deepak, Mohit, and Jitender Dahiya.

"They have been arrested for various offences under the Arms Act and Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act", said officials.

The raids were carried out at around 21 places including 15 in the national capital, and six others in Haryana, in search of gangsters and their associates.

Two militants killed as forces foil infiltration bid in Kupwara

SRINAGAR: Security forces foiled an infiltration bid by killing two unidentified militants in Jammu and Kashmir's Kupwara district on Wednesday, Srinagar based defence spokesman said. The bid was foiled in Machil sector of the frontier district.

The spokesman said the troops along the LoC were put on a high alert on May 1, following a specific intelligence input provided by Senior Superintendent of Police, Kupwara of likely infiltration from one of the launch pads. He said a well coordinated counter infiltration grid was put in place in the rugged and extremely difficult area. "A number of additional ambushes including those of Indian Army and SOG (J&K Police's elite counter insurgency unit) were placed along the likely routes of infiltration. The alert troops in ambushes braved continuous bad weather marked by incessant rainfall, poor visibility and significant drop in temperature for two consecutive nights.

Amarnath Yatra: Shrine Board releases list of permitted, banned food items for pilgrims

JAMMU: As the 62-day long Shri Amarnath Yatra this year is scheduled to begin from July 1, the Shri Amarnath Shrine Board has released a list of permitted and banned meal, food items at 'langars' (community kitchens) for the pilgrims en route twin tracks to the holy cave shrine located in Anantnag district of Jammu and Kashmir. Officials said that focus is the health of the pilgrims and in view of that, Langar organisations have been asked to serve only nutritious and healthy meals to the pilgrims en route to the cave shrine. "No junk and fried food will be allowed but only nutritious meals will be served at around 120 langars to be established this year for the pilgrims at twin routes leading to the cave shrine," they added.

SC declines relief to Rajoana in Beant Singh assassination case

Supreme Court in its verdict on Wednesday refused to grant relief to Babbar Khalsa terrorist, Balwant Singh Rajoana, seeking commutation of his death penalty to life imprisonment, but it asked the Centre to take a call in his mercy plea at an appropriate time in future.

A three-judge bench of the Supreme Court, headed by Justice B R Gavai and also comprising Justice Vikram and Sanjay Karol, passed the order, after hearing Rajoana's plea seeking commutation of death penalty to life imprisonment in the 1995, former Punjab Chief Minister, Beant Singh assassination case.

"We ask the competent authorities to take a decision as and when they deem necessary, on the mercy petition of Balwant Singh Rajoana," the Bench led by Justice Gavai, read out the judgement.

The Apex Court had reserved its verdict on March 02 this year after hearing from convict- Rajoana, Centre and other respective parties.

For killing the Punjab Chief Minister, Beant Singh in 1995, Rajoana was sentenced to the gallows in 2007 by a lower court in Punjab, and it was also upheld in 2010 by the Punjab and Haryana High Court and also finally by the Supreme Court in 2012.

Former Attorney General (AG) of India and Senior Supreme Court lawyer, Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for Rajoana, had said that the death row convict- Rajoana has served 27 years in jail since



1996 and his mercy petition was filed in 2012 but still not decided.

"Keeping a prisoner on death row for so long violates their fundamental rights," Rohatgi told the Supreme Court and pleaded for leniency in converting his death penalty to life imprisonment.

He prayed to the Supreme Court to commute his death sentence on the ground of the long delay in considering the mercy petition.

"This man (Rajoana) is suffering only due to the inordinate delay. His (Rajoana's) death sentence has to be commuted," Rohatgi told the Supreme Court.

The Supreme Court was hearing the plea filed by former Punjab Police constable and pro-Khalistan militant, Rajoana, who has been in jail for the past 26 years, for his involvement in the assassination of former

Punjab Chief Minister Beant Singh.

After serving 26 years in jail, including around 10 years on death row, Rajoana, desperately pleaded to the Top Court and sought its mercy in passing orders for his commutation from death penalty to life imprisonment, in the former Punjab Chief Minister, Beant Singh's assassination case. The convict, Rajoana had knocked the doors of the Supreme Court and filed the writ petition in 2020, on the ground that the Central Government had in 2019 announced its decision to commute his death penalty to life imprisonment and grant remission to 8 other convicts to mark the occasion of the 550th birth anniversary of Guru Nanak. Rajoana, in his petition, had sought for the implementation of this Centre's decision.

Russia claims Ukraine attempted Putin assassination, two drones shot down

Russia today accused Ukraine of attempting to kill President Vladimir Putin. It claimed it shot down two drones launched by Ukraine. "The Russian side reserves the right to take retaliatory measures where and when it sees fit," it warned.

"Two unmanned vehicles were aimed at the Kremlin... the devices were put out of action," the Kremlin said in a statement.

Putin was not injured and there was no material damage to the Kremlin building, it said, adding it considered the alleged attack "a planned terrorist act and an attempt on the life of the President of the Russian Federation."

An unverified video circulating on Russian social media including the channel of the military news outlet Zvezda showed pale smoke rising behind the main Kremlin Palace in the walled citadel after the purported incident.



Moscow's mayor has announced a ban on unauthorised drone flights over the Russian capital, just as the news of drones targeting Putin surfaced. In a statement, mayor Sergei Sobyenin said drone flights would be prohibited unless a special permit had been obtained from "government authorities". He added that the ban was meant to prevent unauthorised drone flights that could "obstruct the work of law enforcement". Meanwhile, the Kremlin said that the May 9 Victory Day parade would go ahead in Moscow despite the incident, the state-run TASS news agency reported.

SC gives one month to HP to publish Shimla Draft Development Plan

In the SC on Wednesday, the matter was listed for hearing before the division bench of Justice B.R. Gavai, Justice Vikram Nath and justice Sanjay Karol.

After hearing and submission made by a respondent and intervenor applicant Hitanshu Jishtu the court deferred the hearing in the matter till July 12, giving one month time to

Hasin Jahan, the estranged wife of India cricketer Mohammed Shami, has filed a petition in the Supreme Court alleging that a criminal case against the fast bowler has been "erroneously stayed" for the past 4 years.

Jahan further went on to level serious allegations against the Indian cricketer, Shami, that he has continued to have extra-marital

affairs with prostitutes, even when he is on tours with the senior national cricket team, her petition, filed in the Supreme Court, said.

The Indian pace bowler, Shami, has vehemently denied all the allegations levelled by Jahan against him.

Jahan had moved the Supreme Court by filing the petition against the Calcutta High Court's March 28, 2023, order, in which it had refused to quash the Sessions Court's order.

All panchayats must hold meetings once in three months: Hry CM

Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal, while interacting with the people during the Jan Samvad programme at Kurukshetra's Barna village, said that the sarpanches must hold meetings of the Gram Sabha once in three months. "The development works whose proposals will be passed and sent by the Gram Panchayats; will be completed under any circumstances," he said.

Meanwhile, on the demand of the sarpanches, the Chief Minister directed the Deputy Commissioner to renovate the Village Secretariat of Barna village.

Sh. Manohar Lal said that Jan Samvad programme is the best medium to take feedback from the public; to inquire whether the benefits of the policies and schemes of the government are delivered on ground efficiently. He said that the state government has brought many radical changes



es in the system by implementing various public welfare schemes.

The Chief Minister said that Rs 2.56 crore was given for development works in Barna village, under which roads, various chaupals, construction of Ambedkar Bhawan and other development works have been done. He said that now jobs are being given on the basis of merit in the state.

In Barna village, 125 government jobs have been given, out of which 52 jobs are of the central and state government; while 73 jobs are from Haryana Kaushal Rozgar Nigam.

Village road in pathetic condition



RK KASHYAP CHHACHHRAULI: The condition of the road going from BKD Road to Lakad Nawajpur is turning into pot-holes day by day. Police rescues 722 child labourers and 405 beggars under “Operation Smile” : Anil Vij

Haryana Home Minister Sh. Anil Vij said that “Operation Smile” was conducted by the Haryana Police from April 1 to April 30, 2023, under which 722 child labourers and 405 beggars were rescued. In addition, 880 missing children and 819 missing adults were traced and visited 489 shelters and children’s homes during this period.

Divulging more details in this regard, Home Minister Sh. Anil Vij said that 178 missing children and 63 adults were traced in Gurgaon by District Police and Anti Human Trafficking Unit, while 11 beggars and 71 child labourers were rescued after visiting 19 shelters and children’s homes. He informed that 153 missing children and 83 adults were traced in Faridabad, while 87 shelters and children’s homes were visited and 80 beggars and 63 child labourers were rescued.

He said that 71 missing children and

16 adults were traced in Kurukshetra, while 39 beggars and 57 child labourers were rescued after visiting 21 shelters and children’s homes. He said that the GRP traced 53 missing children while 1 beggar was rescued after visiting 17 shelters and children’s homes. Similarly, 50 missing children and 51 adults were traced in Bhiwani while 10 shelters and children’s homes were visited and 32 beggars and 7 child labourers were rescued. Similarly, 44 missing children and 81 adults were traced in Panipat while 11 shelters and children’s homes were visited and 7 beggars and 56 child labourers were rescued.

Sh. Vij said that 39 missing children and 38 adults were traced in Rewari, while 19 shelters and children’s homes were visited and 6 beggars and 25 child labourers were rescued. He said that 26 missing children and 27 adults were traced in Jhajjar, while 17 shelters and children’s homes were visited and 6 beggars and 8 child labourers were rescued. In Mahendergarh, 21 missing chil-

dren and 28 adults were traced, while 3 beggars and 13 child labourers were rescued after visiting 6 shelters and child homes. In Karnal, 23 missing children and 70 adults were traced, while 7 shelters and children’s homes were visited and 8 beggars and 30 child labourers were rescued.

The Home Minister said that 21 missing children and 23 adults were traced in Ambala, while 65 shelters and children’s homes were visited and 23 beggars and 34 child labourers were rescued. In Fatehabad, 25 missing children and 18 adults were traced while 37 shelters and child homes were visited and 24 child labourers were rescued. Similarly, 28 missing children and 42 adults were traced in Yamuna Nagar, while 29 beggars and 28 child labourers were rescued after visiting 10 shelters and children’s homes. In Hisar, 21 missing children and 28 adults were traced, while 15 beggars and 18 child labourers were rescued after visiting 26 shelters and children’s homes.

Police stop marriage of a minor girl in Yamunanagar

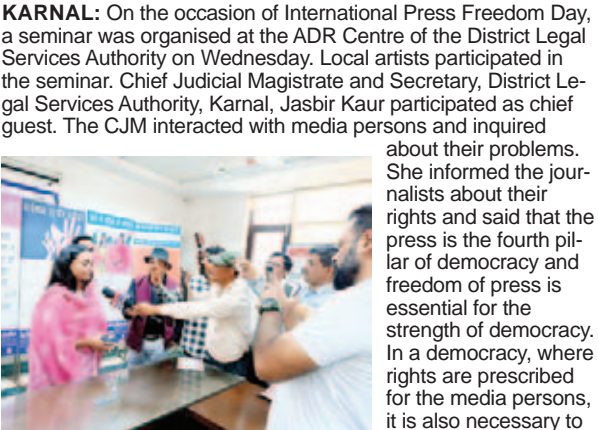

The complainant has recorded the entire conversation in this regard on his mobile and handed over it to the VB as an evidence.

The spokesperson said during the investigation of this complaint, it was found that the said deed writer had received a bribe of Rs 35,000 from the complainant and rest money to be paid in second instalment. On the basis of this enquiry the above said deed writer has been arrested and registered a bribery case against him under the Prevention of Corruption Act at VB Police Station, flying squad-1, Punjab at SAS Nagar and further investigation was under progress, he added.

Cabinet okays Rs 1500 PM as Samman Nidhi to all eligible women of Spiti Valley

The State Cabinet in its meeting held here today, under the Chairmanship of Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu decided to provide Rs. 1500 per month as Indira Gandhi Mahila Samman Nidhi to all the eligible women of Spiti Valley including Chhomo/nuns from the age of 18 years and above. It was decided to constitute a Cabinet Sub Committee comprising Deputy Chief Minister Mukesh Agnihotri as Chairman and Agriculture Minister Prof. Chander Kumar and, Rural Development & Panchayati Raj Minister Anirudh Singh as Members to formulate a White Paper on the financial position of the State. The cabinet also gave its nod to introduce e-stamping in the State for the collection of stamp duty to promote ease of doing business. It decided to stop printing physical stamp papers with immediate effect and to authorize Stamp Vendors as Authorized Collection Centres. It also gave its nod to



continue with a dual system of stamps, i.e. physical stamp paper and e-stamp paper from 1st April, 2023 to 31st March, 2024 and after 1st April, 2024 physical stamp paper will be discontinued completely. The Cabinet decided to give Rs. 600 in lieu of school uniforms through DBT to all eligible students. It also decided to increase the honorarium of Nambardars in the Revenue Department from Rs. 3200 to Rs. 3700 per month as per the budget announcement, which will benefit about 3177 Nambardars in the State. The Cabinet gave its nod to increase the honorarium of Revenue Chowkidars/part time workers from Rs. 5000 to Rs. 5500 per month and it will benefit around 1950 Revenue Chowkidars/part time workers. It decided to amend Swaran Jayanti Energy Policy, 2021 to make transfer of land for setting up Solar Power and New and Renewable Energy Projects on lease/purchase/acquisition basis, subject to the applicable provisions of the various Acts pertaining to the matter. It also decided to increase the Court fee rates from Rs. 6 to Rs. 20 for filing any application/petition in the Revenue Courts or applying attestation of affidavit or any other documents in Civil Courts

56.91 percent polling in Panchayat by-election

But the State is known worldwide for the quality apple produced by the progressive farmers of the

State. The State Government has taken several measures to strengthen the economy of the horticulturists of the state. Better marketing facilities are being created to facilitate the growers to sell their produce nearer to their homes at competitive rates and save them from the clutches of the middlemen. Market Yards and procurement centres are being established in different parts of the State. The State Government is also conducting a legal study to implement universal cartons in order to make the apple growers of the state economically empowered. Efforts are being made to open Controlled Atmosphere

(CA) stores in different parts of the State, so that the horticulturists could get remunerative prices of their produce. Apart from this, the Government is actively considering setting up an apple-based distillery, which will provide an additional source of income to the horticulturists as they could sell under size and rotten apples for winery products. The Government has also asked the banks to work for the welfare of the farmers by providing generous loans to them for agriculture, fisheries and horticulture sectors, so that the rural economy of the state could also be strengthened.

Let us tell you that the speciality of Purna Chand's garden is that he does not use any chemical food spray in his garden. Instead, they use



organic food prepared in different ways which is made from pulses, kitchen waste, oilseeds, cow urine and cow dung. Deputy Director Horticulture Kamal Sheel Negi said that the gardeners in the district are producing different fruits. He said that the crop is being produced in about 525 hectare area in district Kangra. He said that some gardeners are also setting up nurseries of apple plants and selling them to earn profit. Kamal Singh Negi said that the gardeners should use insecticides for good yield of apples and this rain which is falling somewhere will prove to be a boon for the apple growers.

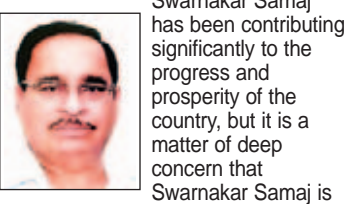

Amanjot 20 year old student of Govt Polytechnic Ambala, becomes Saviour for 3

The life of Amanjot, a 20 year old brilliant student of Diploma Course in Computer Science at Govt. Polytechnic, Ambala came to an abrupt end even before fully blossoming, as she was declared brain dead at PGIMER following a fatal head injury.

Thanks to the magnanimity of Amanjot's family as they turned their gravest tragedy into a precious gift of life for three end-stage organ failure patients battling for survival, one with the transplant of heart at Gurgaon, second with the transplant of lungs at Chennai and third with the transplant of liver here at PGIMER Chandigarh. With this latest organ donation, PGIMER also marks 75th liver transplant since the inception of the liver transplant Programme in 2011. In addition, 31 livers have been shared

with other hospitals across India for matching recipients, making a total of 106 liver donations till date.

Prof. Vivek Lal, Director PGIMER, expressing PGIMER's gratitude to the donor family, stated, "It takes loads of courage to move beyond your own grief to think of another's need and take this incredibly moving decision of organ donation.

Our hearts go out to the donor family and we at PGIMER feel humbled by the trust reposed by them in the institute for their bravest decision." Complimenting his team, the Director further added, "The entire team of PGIMER involved in the process, right from the brain death certification committee, transplant coordinators, treating doctors, anesthetists, inves-

tigating labs to transplant surgeons, nurses and technicians, definitely deserve a mention for their untiring effort." The heart

wrenching death of Amanjot from village Bhari, Post Office Balana, Ambala, Haryana, is beyond comprehension and extremely difficult to reconcile with. It was on 26th April, when

Amanjot was pillion riding a motorcycle driven by her friend, while going to college when she was knocked down by a speeding car from behind, making her fall from the motorcycle and leaving her with fatal head injuries. The grievously injured Amanjot was immediately rushed to the Civil Hospital Ambala and then to some private hospital for initial treatment, from where she was referred to PGIMER and was admitted here in an extremely critical condition on the evening of 26th April itself.

Govt running special women scheme for marriage of girls of registered industrial workers: MLA

Amansher Singh Sherry Kalsi, MLA Batala, informed that the Punjab government is running a special women scheme for the marriage of daughters of industrial workers under which registered industrial workers can take advantage of this scheme on the occasion of their daughter's marriage.

Giving information about this scheme, MLA Sherry Kalsi said that the benefit of this scheme will be given only to those industrial workers who are working in an institution/establishment registered under the Punjab Labour Welfare Fund Act-1965 and are continuously contributing to the Punjab Labour Welfare Fund. He said that workers can send a prayer letter on the prescribed form to the concerned Assistant Labor Commissioner/ Labour Con-

ciliation Officer till the specified date of their daughter's marriage. Under the Shagan scheme, the girl who works herself (is a worker) will also be given the benefit of this scheme.

Under this scheme, Shagan scheme will be applicable only once on the occasion of marriage of 2 girls and not on remarriage after divorce etc. A worker can apply within 6 months after the fixed date of his daughter's marriage.

If the worker is receiving any such financial assistance from the state government or any other organization under this scheme then he will also be entitled to get the benefit under this scheme. MLA Sherry Kalsi further said that this amount of Shagan scheme will be sent to the girl's bank ac-

count. He said that the age of the girl should be 18 years or more. A copy of school certificate, birth certificate, Aadhaar card or driving license can be attached with the application as proof of age of the girl child. A registered marriage certificate should also be attached with the application.

There is no salary limit for the worker at the time of application. He said that if the worker wants, the sum of 20,000 rupees will be given to the village sarpanch or the city MC regarding the marriage can take an advance 3 months before the date of marriage by affixing self-attested self-declaration and can apply an amount of Rs. 11,000 within 6 months after marriage by affixing marriage registration certification.

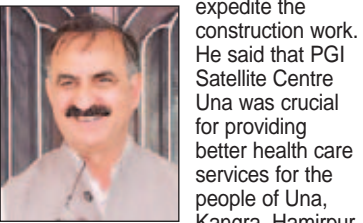

A fine balance

Artificial Intelligence has now made its way into the Indian judiciary through software meant to provide live transcriptions of court hearings. It is in line with a series of steps undertaken in the last few years, such as live-streaming of hearings, e-courts and so on, to ensure better courtroom coverage.

The Supreme Court is in the process of developing a platform as well as formulating rules for live streaming. The service is now in its trial phase and has been employed only in the courtroom of the Chief Justice of India. TERES, a company that has been supplying this facility to arbitration practitioners, is providing the transcription service to the Supreme Court. The judiciary aims to provide lawyers with the transcript and also upload the same on its website to grant citizens greater access to courtroom proceedings. In the United States of America and the United Kingdom, court transcripts are available to litigants and the public.

However, there is a view that the software presents a range of privacy risks as it will record every word spoken in the courtroom and will store the data on its server. Data in the form of personal information that can be used to identify individuals can be divided into two categories. The first category is voice content, which may include personal information such as names, dates or addresses. The second category is voice recognition, which uses biometric technology to identify unique human characteristics. Unlike IDs or passwords, biometric identifiers like voice, fingerprint, or iris cannot be easily replaced or discarded. This becomes a cause of concern in a world plagued by cyber-attacks, identity theft, and phishing.

The issue becomes significant in rape cases where it is necessary to conceal the identity of the parties. The entire purpose of protecting the identity of the rape victim or the survivor would become redundant if the identity of the person is somehow revealed. One of the most crucial conundrums within the ambit of crimes relating to rape and trafficking is whether the name of the victim should be disclosed in light of public interest or remain anonymous to ensure a fair trial.

Human involvement is a necessary evil for the improvement of language processing. The most common practice involves reviewing randomly selected parts of voice recordings to verify whether the speech-to-text software processed the voice requests correctly. Training personnel listen to the audio, transcribe it, annotate it, and convert it into material that can be used for training voice-recognition algorithms. Earlier, the data were limited to the courts.

Pakistan: Credit to private sector decreases fivefold

According to Pakistan's central bank's weekly update, commercial bank financing to federal and provincial governments surged to PKR 3.06 trillion from July 1 to April 14, 2023, compared to PKR 944.54 billion in the same period of last year, Express Tribune reported.

On the other hand, credit to the private sector slowed by 5.44 times to PKR 219.92 billion compared to PKR 1.19 trillion last year.

Talking to The Express Tribune, KASB Securities Head of Research Yousuf Rahman said "Financing is being pulled out of the economy and being provided to the government."

He elaborated that the government's budgetary borrowing was on the rise mainly to pay interest costs or debt servicing of the historically high debt. "This is a non-productive expenditure."

Interest payments are expected to grow to PKR 5.5 trillion which is 6.5 per cent of Pakistan's GDP in the current fiscal year compared to the government's earlier estimate of PKR 3.9 trillion, 4.7 per cent of GDP.

The hike of a cumulative 400 basis points in the central bank's key policy rate in



March-April 2023 to 21 per cent has inflated the interest payments.

The government's other budgetary expenditures include monthly pay and pensions, social spending and flood-related expenditures, Express Tribune reported.

Besides, rising inflation was a leading factor behind the growth in the requirement for new financing by the gov-

ernment. The increased bank financing for the government proves harmful to the economy as such funds should have been provided for productive activities.

Central bank data showed that bank credit to the private sector considered an engine of economic growth, dropped over five-fold in the period under review during the current diffi-

cult times. It clearly showed that businesses had been badly hit by the ongoing economic and political crisis, Express Tribune reported.

To recall, the performance of the large-scale manufacturing (LSM) sector remained poor with a contraction of 5.56 per cent in the first eight months (Jul-Feb) of FY23, according to the Ministry of Finance's latest

monthly economic update and outlook for April 2023. According to experts, the exorbitant hike in the policy rate made bank credit expensive and out of reach of the private sector.

Moreover, bank financing to state-owned enterprises (SOEs) increased 21 times in nine and a half months of FY23 to PKR 249 billion compared to PKR 12 billion

in the corresponding period of last year, Express Tribune reported.

Although data breakdown was not available, the financial crisis suggests that the SOEs including energy firms would have borrowed money to continue to run their operations.

A leading energy firm reported to Pakistan Stock Exchange last week that a continuous surge in circular debt and high inflation forced it to borrow more from banks.

KASB Securities Head of Research Yousuf Rahman said the government's high borrowing would push up the fiscal deficit in FY23 against the initial estimates.

The deficit will also widen due to less collection of taxes against the target. Latest reports suggest the government collected PKR 400 billion less taxes in the first 10 months of FY23 compared to the target of PKR 6.02 trillion, Express Tribune reported.

Domestic borrowing has remained high due to the absence of external financing. Global lending institutions and some friendly countries have put on hold their funding decisions, waiting for the revival of IMF's USD 7 billion loan programme.

Joyful music might be a game changer for virtual reality headaches


Joyful music may be the answer to virtual reality problems. According to a study, listening to music might help reduce the dizziness, nausea, and headaches that virtual reality users may suffer after using digital gadgets.

Cybersickness - a type of motion sickness from virtual reality experiences such as computer games - significantly reduces when joyful music is part of the immersive experience, the study found.

The intensity of the nausea-related symptoms of cybersickness was also found to substantially decrease with both joyful and calming music.

Researchers from the University of Edinburgh assessed the effects of music in a virtual reality environment among 39 people aged between 22 and 36. They conducted a series of tests to assess the effect cybersickness had on a participant's memory skills reading speed and reaction times.

Participants were immersed in a virtual environment, where they ex-



perienced three roller coaster rides aimed at inducing cybersickness. Two of the three rides were accompanied by electronic music with no lyrics by artists or from music streams that people might listen to which had been selected as being calming or joyful in a previous study.

One ride was completed in silence and the order of the rides was randomised across participants. After each ride, participants rated their cybersickness symptoms and performed some memory and reaction time tests.

Eye-tracking tests were also conducted to measure their reading speed and pupil size. For

comparison purposes the participants had completed the same tests before the rides.

The study found that joyful music significantly decreased the overall cybersickness intensity. Joyful and calming music substantially decreased the intensity of nausea-related symptoms. Cybersickness among the participants was associated with a temporary reduction in verbal working memory test scores, and a decrease in pupil size. It also significantly slowed reaction times and reading speed.

The researchers also found higher levels of gaming experience were associated with lower cybersickness.

Gender pay disparities begin with job search


Based on new research published by Oxford University Press in the Quarterly Journal of Economics, a key component of the wage disparity between men and women is due to how they conduct job searches, with women are more likely to accept job offers early while men tend to hang out for greater income.

As of 2020, women in the United States earn 84 per cent of what males earn. This inequality is well documented, and economists and the general public have been aware of it for decades. The explanations for this phenomenon are still being debated.

The initial labour market circumstances are long-lasting. Young people who start their careers during a recession will have lower pay for at least ten years compared to cohorts who start during a more substantial economic period.

Because workers typically change jobs several times throughout their careers, personal characteristics that matter in early-career job searches (for example, risk aversion and biased beliefs about their earning potential) are likely to matter in subsequent job searches.

Since looking for a job is a complicated process that involves considerable uncertainty, differences in preferences and beliefs by gender are likely to lead to different job search behaviour and outcomes. Nevertheless, economists know surprisingly little about how these attributes contribute to gender differences in early-career gender pay gaps. A likely reason for this is that re-




searchers usually have limited information on job search behaviour throughout the job search process, the offers that people receive, and measures of risk aversion and biased beliefs. Even in cases where such information is available, the focus is typically on unemployed workers in general and not on the gender dimension.

But the evidence here comes from surveys on job offers and acceptances from recent undergraduate alumni of Boston University's business school, where one of the study's authors teaches. Researchers asked graduates from the 2013-2019 graduating classes details about the job search process that led to their first job after graduating, such as the characteristics of their accepted and rejected offers, including salary components, job characteristics, job offer timing.

Why some people feel motion sickness



The way our senses adapt when playing high-intensity virtual reality games is crucial in understanding why some individuals suffer from severe cybersickness while others do not.

Cybersickness is a form of motion sickness that occurs from exposure to immersive VR and augmented reality applications.

A new study, led by researchers at the University of Waterloo, found that the subjective visual vertical -- a measure of how individuals perceive the orientation of vertical lines -- shifted considerably after participants played a high-intensity VR game. "Our findings suggest that

the severity of a person's cybersickness is affected by how our senses adjust to the conflict between reality and virtual reality," said Michael Barnett-Cowan, a professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Health Sciences. "This knowledge could be invaluable for developers and designers of VR experiences, enabling them to create more comfortable and enjoyable environments for users." The researchers collected data from 31 participants. They assessed their perceptions of the vertical before and after playing two VR games, one high-intensity and one low-intensity. Those who experienced less sickness were more likely to

have the largest change in the subjective visual vertical following exposure to VR, particularly at a high intensity. Conversely, those who had the highest levels of cybersickness were less likely to have changed how they perceived vertical lines. There were no significant differences between males and females, nor between participants with low and high gaming experience.

"While the subjective vertical visual task significantly predicted the severity of cybersickness symptoms, there is still much to be explained," said co-author William Chung, a former Waterloo doctoral student who is now a postdoctoral fellow at the Toron-

to Rehabilitation Institute.

"By understanding the relationship between sensory reweighting and cybersickness susceptibility, we can potentially develop personalized cybersickness mitigation strategies and VR experiences that take into account individual differences in sensory processing and hopefully lower the occurrence of cybersickness."

As VR continues to revolutionize gaming, education and social interaction, addressing the pervasive issue of cybersickness -- marked by symptoms such as nausea, disorientation, eye strain and fatigue -- is critical for ensuring a positive user experience.

Veg Grilled Sandwich Without Butter

But, if you opt for a sukha bhel (dry bhel), then what you are eating is essentially murruma (puffed rice), peanuts, onions, coriander, lime and green chillies. So just by tweaking it a little – avoiding the puri, sev and sweet chutney – a

regular sukha bhel can be a good option for a quick bite.
Baked Sweet Potatoes
Sweet potatoes are a source of complex carbs, but at least they are a clean and



unprocessed source. This can be a good alternative for a quick bite after a workout or if you have had to walk a lot. Sprinkle some chaat masala on them and they will taste even more yummy.

Boiled Chana Chaat
Chickpeas, the main ingredient in a chana chaat, contain fibre and a little protein. They can keep you full longer. The other

ingredients such as coriander, tomatoes and lemon add to the overall nutritional content. You can have other alternatives such as peanut chaat too. Boiled Sweet Corn Masala

Corn is a good source of fibre and essential B vitamins. Although most of the carbs in corn come from starch – which can quickly raise your blood sugar – it depends on how much you eat. You can have small servings occasionally. The higher fibre content helps balance your blood sugar levels.

Boiled Eggs Chaat
This is, in fact, the healthiest option on this list, placed last since it might not be as easily available as a bhel or a chaat. If you have the option, choose this over

everything else. Eggs are a rich source of protein with amino acids and healthy fats. When having this, have the whole egg; do not throw away the yolk – it has more nutritional value than the rest of the egg.

India's asthma burden calls for a continued focus on awareness

CHANDIGARH With 262 million people globally affected by asthma, this year's World Asthma Day theme 'Asthma Care for All' aims to promote effective disease management through better access to quality medication and healthcare resources. This year's theme strongly resonates with the current asthma situation in India. The disease is estimated to affect more than 30 million people (3 crore) in the country with the majority remaining undiagnosed or undertreated. Further the country's asthma deaths make up a large portion (42%) of the global total, even though it accounts for only 13% of the cases worldwide. This is mainly due to insufficient disease awareness and misconceptions regarding inhaler therapy.

Asthma is a widespread noncommunicable disease (NCD) that affects individuals of all ages and is the most common chronic disease among children. 1 This condition causes the airways to narrow, swell, and produce excessive mucus, making it difficult to breathe. Inhalation therapy is an essential component of asthma management. Unfortunately, misconceptions regarding this therapy often lead to patients with asthma refusing or failing to follow their physician's recommendations.

Talking about the general perception of asthma in the country, while also highlighting the need for disease awareness and treatment acceptance Dr. Vishal Sharma, Chest Specialist, Chandigarh said, "Asthma in India is plagued by social stigma, misconceptions, and myths with only about 23% of patients in India calling their condition by its actual name5. This resistance to label their condition contributes to the under-diagnosis of the disease in the country, where 70% of severe asthma cases remain clinically undiagnosed5. Furthermore, these challenges make it difficult for patients to seek medical help in a timely manner, which can prevent them from taking

control of their condition early on. Early diagnosis and intervention are crucial for the long-term management of chronic respiratory diseases like asthma and hence these challenges need to be addressed to help improve patient outcomes."

Adding on he said, "Even though inhalation therapy is the cornerstone of asthma management – in India, the social stigma associated with inhalers has further added to the mismanagement of the disease. This is especially true among children, where parents often conceal the condition and therefore avoid or delay treatment until symptoms worsen. In fact among doctor-diagnosed patients, inhalation therapy usage stands at less than 9%5. Adding to these existing challenges is poor access to healthcare, cost of treatment, inadequate resources, and appropriate guidance to help facilitate the recognition of warning signs as well as proper device technique4. Overcoming these challenges in India requires a shift in perspective toward both, asthma as well as its recommended treatments."

Providing sufficient empowerment and consistent support to patients can foster a positive change in attitude and behaviour towards asthma. Public and patient awareness initiatives like Cipla's #BeroKZindagi campaign are important platforms that engage the masses through social conversations and combat misinformation through well-informed dialogue.

However, this can only be made possible if awareness efforts are adequately met by an ecosystem that enables better access to healthcare support like Cipla's Breathefree program. The pair tied the knot in September

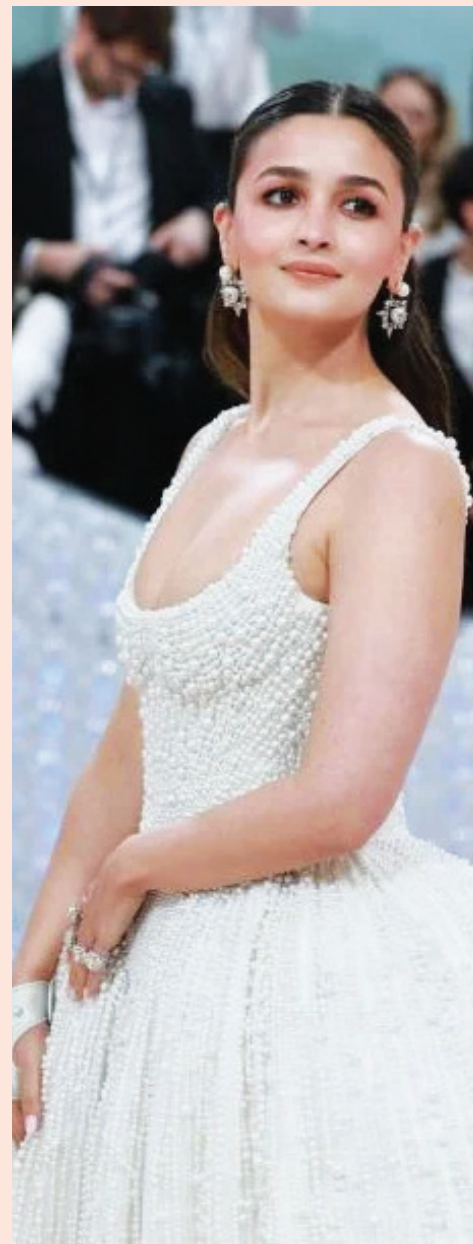
