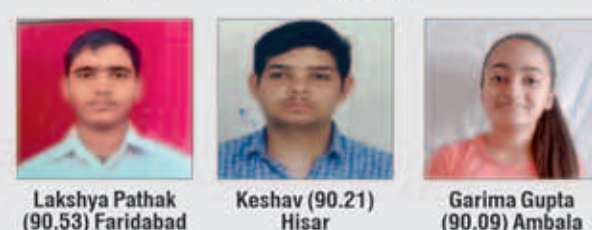

'Nafrat ka bazaar' closed down, 'mohabbat ki dukaanein' opened, says Rahul Gandhi on Karnataka result

NEW DELHI-Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Saturday hailed the party's performance in the Karnataka assembly polls, saying "nafrat ka bazaar" has closed down and "mohabbat ki dukaanein" have opened in the state. The Congress has won 55 of the 224 assembly seats in Karnataka so far and is leading on 80, while the BJP has won 22 and is ahead in 43, according to the latest trends on the Election Commission website. The Janata Dal (Secular) has bagged 10 seats so far and is leading on 10. "I thank and congratulate the people of Karnataka, party workers and leaders," Gandhi said at a press conference here.

Cong Karnataka chief DK Shivakumar breaks down, gives credit to Gandhi family for reposing faith in him

BENGALURU: Overcome with emotions, Karnataka Congress chief DK Shivakumar on Saturday broke down while reacting to the Assembly election results and gave credit to the Gandhi family for reposing their faith in his leadership in the state. With tears rolling down his cheeks, the former minister thanked the party cadres and leaders for the victory. He said he had told the party high command that he would ensure the party's victory in the Karnataka Assembly election. "I give credit to party cadres and all the leaders for the party's victory. People have reposed faith in us and the leaders supported us. It is a collective leadership and we have worked jointly," Shivakumar said, his voice choking.

Fire destroys Maharashtra studio where actor Tunisha Sharma was found dead

PALGHAR: A fire destroyed a film studio, which was recently in the news following the death of actor Tunisha Sharma, in Maharashtra's Palghar district, an official said on Saturday. According to fire brigade officials, the fire started at Bhajanlal Studios at Kaman in Vasai, on the outskirts of Mumbai, around Friday midnight. The fire was put out by around 4 am on Saturday, said a fire brigade official of the Vasai-Virar City Municipal Corporation. The cause of the fire is yet to be ascertained, he said. It was at Bhajanlal Studios where actor Tunisha Sharma (21) was found hanging in a washroom on the set of the TV show 'Ali Baba: Dastaan-E-Kabul' on December 24, 2022. Her co-star and former boyfriend Sheezan Khan (28) was arrested the next day on the charge of abetment. He walked out of jail on March 5 after securing bail. Khan is now in South Africa to take part in a popular reality show. A court has allowed him to travel abroad for work.

Karnataka election results: Cong wins big; BJP concedes defeat

Congress: 139, BJP: 62: JDS: 20, Others: 3



NEW DELHI : The Congress is sprinting its way towards victory in the Karnataka assembly election 2023 as it has now crossed way past the majority mark. BJP is losing its reign as it is set to finish well less than 70 seats leading incumbent chief minister Basavaraj Bommai to step down from the position today evening. The question remains whether Congress will pick Sid-

daramaiah or DK Shivakumar as next CM.

Earlier, Karnataka CM Bommai conceded defeat well before the declaration of final results. The BJP is ahead in 64 seats, according to latest trends on the Election Commission website. The JD-S, which was hoping to be kingmaker, is leading in 19 seats.

"Once the results come we will do

a detailed analysis. As a national party, we will not only analyse but also see what deficiencies and gaps were left at various levels. We take this result in our stride," Basavaraj Bommai said.

Exit polls had suggested that it will be a close race - one that will see the Congress emerge as the single-largest party but not with enough to cross the 113-seat mark.

After Sangrur debacle, AAP re-enters Lok Sabha from Punjab with Jalandhar win

The Aam Aadmi Party on Saturday regained its representation in the Lok Sabha, with party candidate Sushil Kumar Rinku getting an impressive win. It has been a major setback for the Congress, with which the seat remained since 1999. It had fielded Santokh Chaudhary's widow Karamjit Kaur as the candidate.

of schemes to these families and to improve their standard of living, camps are being organized by the state government at the block level," he added.

He said that the government has given priority to merit instead of giving jobs on the basis of 'parchi-kharchi'. In the last eight-and-a-half years, about 8,500 government jobs have been given in Sirsa district. In Khairkan village, 59 people have got government jobs, out of which 20 are in central government and 39 are in state government.

The Chief Minister also interacted with sarpanches of nearby villages and assured to resolve their problems. He instructed the Public Health Department to prepare a proposal within 10 days to set up a canal-based water house to be built on four acres in Saharani village at a cost of Rs 4 crore; to make arrangements for clean drinking water.

Maha verdict exposes gov's misdeeds, boost for Uddhav

Just like the 1994 S.R. Bommai ruling, the Supreme Court judgment in the Shiv Sena case, involving a split in the party which led to the appointment of the Eknath Shinde government in Maharashtra, is a milestone in India's journey on the sometimes tenuous and tendentious course of democracy.

For one, it brings to question the very role of the office of the governor in deciding who should govern the state; and two, it reinforces the spirit of the amendment to the Tenth Schedule of the Constitution that accords primacy of the party organisation over the legislature party. It has also kept open the crucial question of eligibility of Mr Shinde to remain CM and his MLAs to continue as ministers in his Cabinet.

Article 356 of the Constitution gives the governor and the Union government a say in the running of governments in states. It has been used and misused several times in the history of Independent India although chairman of the drafting committee of the Constitution Dr B.R. Ambedkar had expressed the hope that it will remain a "dead letter". The Supreme Court in the Bommai case ended forever the charade of Raj Bhavans ordering a parade of MLAs on their courtyards and ruled that the floor of the Assembly will be the right place to decide if a chief minister held the trust of the House. Likewise, the present judgment has barred governors from allowing their office to be used by partisan interests to engineer downfalls of popular governments.

People with a basic understanding of democratic governance and the Constitution had little doubt in their minds that former Maharashtra governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari was exceeding his brief when he ordered then CM Uddhav Thackeray to take a floor test based on a petition moved by the leader of the Opposition. As the apex court has made it clear, the governor erred in performing his constitutional duty. This judgment should prevent such a spectre from visiting states again.

The court has rightfully rejected the prayer of Mr Thackeray to reinstall his government as he had voluntarily resigned from his post. That is a price Mr Thackeray paid for showing basic decency instead of opting for a fight, both in the legislature and on the streets. However, it is not the end of the road for him as the court has asked the Speaker to decide "in a reasonable period" the question of disqualification of the rival faction which is now in government. The judgment has come as a shot in the arm for the shaky Maha Vikas Aghadi alliance of the Shiv Sena, the Congress Party and the NCP in the nick of the time.

Shutting down Internet: Govts need to do rethink

Governments across the world are increasingly resorting to Internet shutdowns to stabilise potentially volatile situations, quell protests, and even to deal with problems like cheating in examinations. But from a governance perspective, how sustainable are such measures in a world where reliance on digital technologies is growing?

Today, many experts are sounding the alarm not only because these disruptions impact the human rights of millions of people for hundreds of hours, but also because they impose a heavy cost on the economy and the livelihoods of ordinary people.

Amid the swirl of news, here are some widely-cited numbers to chew on.

According to digital rights group Top10VPN, which researches the economic impacts of Internet shutdowns, in 2023 alone, 46 Internet shutdowns in 10 countries cost \$761 million till date. Globally, the total duration of such disruptions has been more than 12,400 hours. This year, so far, Ethiopia is the most affected nation. The economic costs of Internet shutdowns to date in that country have been \$372.2 million. Ethiopia is followed by India and Myanmar. I checked out the figure



for India. Up till now, it is \$201.6 million. Now, for a country that has a dominantly young population and is legitimately proud of having 800 million Internet users, this is a worrying trend and one we ignore at great risk.

Which brings me to one of my favourite states in the country: Manipur. I have the fondest memories of Manipur. Fifteen years ago, I spent some time in this beautiful state in the Northeast, researching a book on children impacted by HIV-AIDS. I remember taking time off from work to visit Ima Keithel, the "mother's market" in Imphal, the state

capital. It is the largest "women-only" market in the world, where men come only as buyers or as porters. Manipur has been in the news in recent days for violent ethnic clashes. There have been deaths, devastation, arson, and gut-wrenching anxiety, including among people I know who have families in the affected areas.

Sitting thousands of kilometres away, one reads about Manipur limping back to normalcy. Curfew is being relaxed in the worst-hit districts; the Army and paramilitary forces are keeping a vigil. In these troubled times, that is reassuring. But at the

time of writing, mobile Internet service continues to remain suspended in large parts of the state. The official reason is prevention of disturbance of peace and public order. It is too early to say what the direct and indirect economic costs have been. Larger questions remain.

Manipur is in the news, but it is by no means the only state where Internet shutdowns have happened this year or in past years. In the Northeast itself, the Arunachal Pradesh government recently suspended the Internet in the state's Papum-pare district to "maintain law and order" through an official

notification on May 9. In February this year, Itanagar, capital of Arunachal Pradesh, also saw a temporary suspension of Internet services after a clash broke out between security personnel and protesters over a "paper leak" case.

In April, Sambalpur district in Odisha experienced a temporary suspension of the Internet after communal tension during a Hanuman Jayanti rally.

In March, Punjab suffered one of the country's most severe Internet blackouts. Barring voice calls, all mobile Internet services, SMS services, as well as all dongle services provided on mobile networks were suspended in the state as the police went on a search for "Waris Punjab De" chief and Khalistan sympathiser Amritpal Singh. The local police said the Internet shutdown was necessary to maintain law and order and stop the spread of "fake news".

Arguably, nothing compares to the prolonged Internet shutdowns in Jammu and Kashmir in recent years, but interestingly, we are seeing the increasing use of Internet shutdowns for the most pedestrian reasons and by political parties of all hues.

The desert state of Rajasthan, known for its forts and palaces, is now a hotbed

of Internet shutdowns. And the most-cited reason is even more interesting. This February, the Internet was suspended in eight cities in Rajasthan, ostensibly to prevent the question paper leak of a government teacher recruitment exam. Uttar Pradesh is another state which has seen Internet suspensions in recent years. In 2020, the Internet and text messaging services were suspended in 14 districts of Uttar Pradesh, including in state capital Lucknow, in the wake of violence and protests against the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) in these areas.

Things have come to such a pass that a plea was moved in the Supreme Court earlier this year seeking guidelines on the implementation of Internet shutdowns. This happened following the suspension of Internet services in Jaipur and other places. The official reason was the Rajasthan Direct School Teacher Recruitment Examination.

The petitioner, Chhaya Rani, argued that such blocking of access to the Internet was avoidable and did not reflect well on the competence of the authorities to conduct such an exam. In 2020, the issue came up before the Supreme Court in the famous Anuradha Bhasin vs Union of India case.

New AI model may soon help doctors diagnose heart attacks accurately

The UK researchers have developed a novel algorithm based on artificial intelligence (AI) that may one day help doctors diagnose heart attacks quickly and with precision.

According to researchers from the University of Edinburgh, the new algorithm, called CoDE-ACS, was able to rule out a heart attack in more than double the number of patients, with an accuracy of 99.6 per cent in comparison to current testing methods.

CoDE-ACS may also greatly help in reducing hospital admissions and rapidly identify patients that are safe to go home. The findings are published in the journal Nature Medicine.

For patients with acute chest pain due to a heart attack, early diagnosis and treatment saves lives, said Prof. Nicholas Mills, who led the research.

Unfortunately, many conditions cause these common symptoms, and the diagnosis is not always straightforward.

Harnessing data and artificial intelligence to support clinical decisions has enormous potential to improve care for patients and efficiency in our busy Emergency Departments, Mills noted.

In addition to ruling out heart attacks, CoDE-ACS could also help doctors identify those whose abnormal troponin (protein released into the bloodstream during a heart attack) levels were due to a heart attack rather than another condition.

Chest pain is one of the most common reasons that people present to emergency departments, said Prof. Sir Nilesh Samani, medical director of the British Heart Foundation.



Every day, doctors around the world face the challenge of separating patients whose pain is due to a heart attack from those whose pain is due to something less serious, he added.

CoDE-ACS was developed using data from 10,038 patients in Scotland who had arrived at hospital with a suspected heart attack. It uses routinely-collected patient information, such as age, sex, ECG findings and medical history, as well as troponin levels, to predict the probability that an individual has had a heart attack. The result is a probability score from 0 to 100 for each patient.

Clinical trials are now under way in Scotland to assess whether the tool can help doctors reduce pressure on overcrowded emergency departments.

Sleep apnoea may raise risk of long Covid, reveals study

People with obstructive sleep apnoea may be at significantly higher risk of suffering long Covid, according to a study. Obstructive sleep apnoea (OSA) is a common disorder characterised by repetitive episodes of nocturnal breathing cessation due to upper airway collapse. However, the condition is often underdiagnosed.

The study, published online in the journal Sleep, found that observed increases in risk for long Covid in adults with sleep apnoea remained significant even when the research team accounted for obesity, hypertension, diabetes, and hospitalisation at the time of their initial Covid infection, all known to independently contribute to risk for long Covid.

Women showed an 89 per cent increased likelihood of having long Covid if they had obstructive sleep apnoea, compared to a 59 per cent increased chance for men.

While the underlying associations aren't clear, women with sleep apnoea included in the study may have had more severe conditions than men.

Severity of obstructive sleep apnoea was not controlled



for, but sleep apnea is more likely to be undiagnosed in women which could create a sample with women who have more severe cases. Other studies have also found that women may be more likely to be diagnosed with long Covid and seek health care for the condition. There's still so much to uncover about long Covid, but this study will inform clinical care by identifying patients that should be watched more closely, said corresponding author Hannah Mandel, a senior research scientist at New York University - Langone Health, supported by the US National Institutes of Health (NIH). People with sleep apnoea who get infected

with Covid should seek early treatment, pay attention to their symptoms, and keep up with their vaccinations to lower the risk of infection in the first place, she added. The team reviewed data across three research networks of patients who had tested positive for Covid-19 between March 2020 and February 2022. Two networks included adult patients with 330,000 patients and 1.7 million patients. The third included 102,000 children. In contrast to the patterns seen in adults, the contribution of sleep apnoea to the risk of long Covid disappeared in children when the researchers controlled for other risk factors, including obesity.

From Bowl – We d Rather Bowl, by Bachchoo

In this week of celebrations over King Charles III's coronation, ignoring the scepter of the anointed isle, I choose to dwell upon examples of British hypocrisy, sleaze, corruption and fraud. These are not by any means peculiar characteristics of this "seat of Mars". The sin of some other nations puts the UK in the listening side of the confessional. Start with the fun one. A reputable barrister,



known for her defence of left-wing activists and her stances on human rights is one Helena Kennedy KC (King's Counsel). I know of her and met her once through my late ex-wife Mala Sen, whose

friend she was. In 1994 Helena had published an essay which criticised the monarchy. "It is understandable that many see it as the fountainhead of snobbery and class division, creating a corrosive culture

with its defenders, often sycophantically allied to its continuance because patronage is one of the pegs which secures its hold."

Well said? Helena is now a baroness and as the announcements for the coronation ceremonials of what she called "an institution which surrounds itself with the unworthy notion of aristocracy" were published, we were told that the Queen Consort's rod will be carried in the coronation procession and presented to Her Majesty by -- you guessed it -- Baroness Helena Kennedy.

Okay, as she wrote, she "sycophantically allied etc". So what? No corruption here!

And so, to more serious stuff involving fraud, corruption and hypocrisy. Start with the fraud.

A parliamentary investigative committee has concluded that during the

Covid-19 pandemic, under the supervision of PM Boris Johnson, chancellor Hedgie Sunak and health secretary Matt Hancock, £4.5 billion was handed out to fraudsters through errors in the furlough and self-employed Covid support schemes initiated by Hedgie.

This calculated sum attributed to "fraud" does not include the exorbitant sums paid out to suppliers of unusable face masks and deficient anti-virus equipment destined for hospitals. It certainly doesn't include the billions spent on the completely ineffective "Test and Trace" schemes headed by the palloocracy of the Bolo government's ministers, who had little or no expertise relevant to the running of these. The £4.5 billion and the taxpayers' billions spent on friends in the palloocracy and on benefactors' contracts taking advantage of the pandemic, will never be recovered. And yet, and yet last

week Hedgie announced his support for Cruella Braverman's policy of hiring large houseboats into which they will put asylum seekers because, said Hedgie, it would be cheaper to house them -- to me manifestly the wretched of the earth and some not-so-wretched shysters -- in these flotillas rather than in inland hotels and accommodation. He said the taxpayer was handing out £6 million a week for this accommodation. Even if one accepts this exaggeration, that would mean £6 million multiplied by 52 a year, which amounts to £312 million annually. Is there any comparison to the £4.5 billion that the taxpayer lost to error, corruption and fraud?

The refusal by Cruella and Hedgie to compare the figures of expenditure and the drain on the taxpayer, figures which are made public on the same day appeals, gentle reader, to put it mildly, as evasion or hypocrisy.

KOLKATA: Justice Abhijit Gangopadhyay of the Calcutta High Court in his verdict on the termination of the services of 36,000 primary teachers in state-run schools of West Bengal, observed that former education minister Partha Chatterjee and Trinamool Congress legislator Manik Bhattacharya had used a network of agents to sell teaching jobs against money. In his verdict on Friday, Justice Gangopadhyay observed that the role of Bhattacharya, who is also the former president of West Bengal Board of Primary Education (WBBPE) and his associates in the board, in the entire case was somewhat like the office-bearer of a local club. According to him, the investigation by the Enforcement Directorate has proved that these jobs were sold to those who could pay money for that. Justice Gangopadhyay observed in his judgment that blatant break of rules and norms were evident in the entire recruitment process, where ineligible candidates were granted higher marks in the interview part. According to him, candidates scoring extremely low marks in secondary and higher secondary examinations were even granted nine out of 10 marks in the interview process. In most cases, Justice Gangopadhyay observed that the aptitude tests were not even conducted.

AAP scores in Jalandhar, runs out
of luck in Karnataka elections

NEW DELHI, MAY 13

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) came up trumps in the by-election to the Jalandhar Lok Sabha seat but its fortunes seemed to have nose-dived in the Karnataka Assembly elections, where most of the candidates even forfeited their deposits.

Senior party leader Brijesh Kalappa, who was contesting from Chickpet, only secured 600 votes, or just 0.47 per cent, with even Uttama Prajaakeeya Party candidate M.V. Police identify 64 drugs
hotspots in Delhi,
conduct over 100 raids

The Crime Branch of Delhi Police has identified 64 hotspots in the national capital where drugs, including heroin, charas, MDMA, and ganja, among others, were being sold. In recent raids at over 100 locations in Delhi, the police have seized drugs worth over Rs one crore and arrested 43 persons, the police said on Saturday. Special Commissioner of Police (Crime), Ravindra Singh Yadav, said that as per the directives of the Ministry Home Affairs (MHA), the Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF) of Delhi Police has arrested 534 narco-offenders in 412 NDPS cases and recovered about 35 kg heroin/smack, 15 kg cocaine, 1,500 kg ganja, 230 kg opium, 10 kg charas and 20 kg poppy husk, among others, since January this year. The recovery came after raids against narco-offenders which were planned with all the senior officers as well as field officers of Delhi Police. "A total of 80 police teams consisting of ANTF, Crime Branch and officers from all the police stations were constituted to carry out the operations. Information was developed through human intelligence as well as technical analysis. The ANTF, in coordination with all the districts of Delhi Police, carried out ground level surveys and chose more than 100 potential targets to perform simultaneous raids," the Special CP said.

'40% Sarkar': Goa Congress

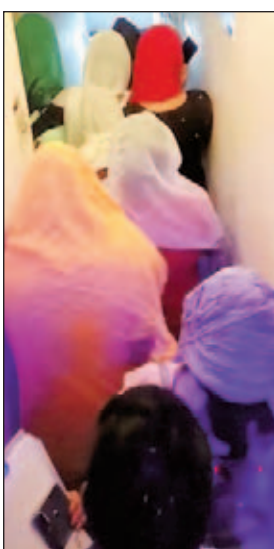

Sex rackets busted at spa centres in
MP's Singrauli, 13 women rescued

Madhya Pradesh police on Saturday claimed to have busted sex rackets being run at several spa centres in Singrauli district and rescued over a dozen women, including minors. Singrauli SP Yusuf Kureshi told the press that raids were conducted on the basis of complaints received from various people. As many as three teams of district police raided six spa centres simultaneously. "During the raids, sex rackets being operated inside these spa centers were exposed. Over a dozen women were rescued who have been taken into police custody for



further investigation," Kureshi said. Kureshi further said the owners of two spa centres "Sudhanshu Spa Centre" and "777" have been arrested and booked under 'Prevention of Immoral Trafficking Act'. Kureshi said that women were trafficked from Odisha, Kolkata, Assam and Nagaland. "A total of 13 women, including minors were rescued from two spa centers. We are trying to find out the link of nexus trafficking girls from other states. We have learned that a strong nexus is involved in trafficking girls and operating sex rackets here. Mann Govt commits to save underground water: Arora

SUNAM, MAY 13

Under the commitment of the Punjab Government to transform Sunam Assembly Constituency(SAC), Cabinet Minister, Aman Arora formally kick started an important project to lay underground pipelines in 192 water outlet, popularly known as mogha of SAC, which was approved about 4 months ago. While inaugurating this project at Namol road, Arora, said that the campaign to encourage farmers to use canal water for agriculture was underway across Punjab.

He said that a project costing Rs 68 crore to replace 192 mogha of canal watercourses under Sunam's Kotla branch with underground pipelines or concrete based watercourses will be implemented through the Punjab Water Resources Management and Development Corporation and 85 mogha will be completed at a cost of Rs 30 crore in the first phase, which would provide canal water for irrigation for 32 thousand acres of land. Cabinet Minister said that under this project, around 26,500 hectares of land will be facilitated with better canal water irrigation by



constructing an estimated 400Kms of underground pipelines or concrete based water courses. He said that the rate at which the ground water level is depleting every year, is a matter of great concern and therefore this project will be very useful for making more use of canal water.

Arora said that by laying the underground pipelines, the farmers would be able to save Rs 4000 per

annual apart from utilisation of land. He said that the farmers should take advantage of this campaign of the government.

He said that according to the instructions of Punjab Water Resources Minister, Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer, the officials of the departments concerned across Punjab were conducting cluster level awareness camps in the villages, so that maximum farmers would be

made aware of the use of canal water.
