All eyes on Cong top brass as CM race in Karnataka heats up

BENGALURU: Amidst the suspense over "Kaun Banega Karnataka CM", all eyes are on Congress top brass to choose the coveted post in the state. The three central observers led by former Maharashtra Chief Minister Shri Chhatrasal Shinde returned to Delhi yesterday with a report after seeking the views of newly elected MLAs on the leadership of Siddaramaiah and DK Shivakumar. Intense lobbying for the coveted post by supporters of Siddaramaiah and Shivakumar started with poster-competition after Congress registered a thumping victory in the just-concluded assembly election.

HCS and other Allied Services Preliminary Exam on May 21

CHANDIGARH: Haryana Chief Secretary Mr. Sanjeev Kaushal has directed officials to make adequate arrangements for the upcoming HCS (Ex. Br) and other Allied Services preliminary examination on May 21, in which 93600 aspirants are appearing. He said that Coaching Centers and Photostat shops surrounding the examination centers should be closed during the examination to prevent any unfair means. The Chief Secretary presided over the virtual meeting regarding the arrangements of examination, with Deputy Commissioners and Superintendents of Police of six districts here today. The Chief Secretary also directed the officers to make necessary arrangements for conducting the preliminary examination of the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) to be held on May 28. About 148 examination centers have been set up in Faridabad and Gurugram.

Job bonanza to be opened for Divyangs of Haryana

CHANDIGARH: Jobs for Divyangs have opened up in Haryana, soon employment will be available to about 35 thousand Divyangs in the state. Out of these, 15 thousand in the government sector and 20 thousand in the private sector will be adjusted. Haryana Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Sh. Rajkumar Makkar today signed an MoU with Amazon, a well-known company in the field of e-commerce. About 10,000 Divyangs of Haryana will be given employment by this company according to their working capacity. Soon, an MoU will also be signed with the 'Youth for Job' company, under which this company will also open the avenues of employment to 10,000 Divyangs, he added. Sh. Rajkumar Makkar informed that the Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal has special affection towards Divyangs, he wants that more and more Divyangs of the state to be made self-reliant by providing them employment on the basis of their skill and physical ability.

Lahore HC grants bail to Imran's wife in Al-Qadir Trust case

Lahore High Court (LHC) on Monday granted bail to former Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan's wife Bushra Bibi in the Al-Qadir Trust case until May 23, ARY News reported.

According to the news report, Bushra Bibi's lawyer Khawaja Harris had requested a 10-day protective bail for her. The high court accepted the request and approved her bail until May 23, as per the news report. Earlier in the day, Imran Khan along with Bushra

Bibi appeared before the HC and filed a plea to get protective bail for his wife in the Al-Qadir Trust case. The petitioner requested



the court to approve the protective bail as the National Accountability Bureau (NAB), which is carrying out the investigation of the case, can arrest her, as per the ARY News report.

Pb court summons Kharge in 100-crore defamation case

A Punjab court today summoned Congress party chief Mallikarjun Kharge in a 100 crore defamation related to the party equating the banned Islamic outfit Popular Front of India (PFI) with Bajrang Dal, the youth wing of the Sangh-affiliated Vishwa Hindu Parishad, in its Karnataka Assembly election manifesto.

The Sangrur district court summoned the Congress President after a complaint from Hitesh Bhardwaj, the president of an outfit called "Bajrang Dal Hindustan."

During the recently-concluded Karnataka assembly elections, the Congress in its manifesto compared Bajrang Dal with "anti-national organisations like SIMI and Al-Qaeda", the petitioner said.

Naming the Bajrang Dal, the Congress in its manifesto promised to ban organisations that promote



"enmity or hatred, whether among majority or minority communities".

"The Congress Party is committed to take firm and decisive action against individuals and organisations spreading hatred amongst communities on grounds of caste or religion. We believe that law

Punjab power tariff hiked, CM says common man will not be affected

Punjab State Electricity Regulatory Commission (PSERC) has revised fixed and variable tariff upward for all categories, prompting Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann to assert that his government would bear the increased cost so that the common man wasn't affected.

According to sources, the PSERC has decided to make the new tariff applicable from Tuesday, May 16 to March 31 next year. Mann, in a tweet said, that the revised tariff would not impact the common man as the increase would be borne by the government.

For domestic consumers, the PSERC has raised fixed charges by Rs.15/KW and variable charges by 70 paise per unit for consumption upto 100 units, for next 200 units increase will be 80 paise per unit and beyond 300 units it will be 45 paise per unit, sources added.

The agriculture tariff has been increased by 89 paise per unit.

For industrial consumers fixed charges have been increased by 20 to 30 per KVA. For small power variable charges have been raised by 40 paise per unit, 30 paise per unit for medium supply and 45 paise per unit for large scale industry.

According to PSERC, it has determined the additional revenue requirement of Rs 3584 crores resulting in an increase of 56 paise/unit over the aver-

Hry CM orders inquiry into allegations of irregularities in CDLU recruitments

Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal directed to constitute a committee under the chairmanship of the Vice Chancellor of another university to conduct an inquiry into the allegations of delay in results of students and irregularities in recruitment in Chaudhary Devi Lal University, Sirsa.

The Chief Minister was interacting with the people during a Jan Samvad programme at Sant Nagar village of Sirsa's Ranian assembly constituency. He directed the Deputy Commissioner to constitute a

committee and investigate the complaint of anomalies in market fees at Sabzi Mandi, Dabwali. On the demand for proper availability of drinking water, the Chief Minister announced construction of canal-based waterworks for Sant Nagar. This waterworks will be built in Dalip Nagar and drinking water will be available to both the villages.

Meanwhile, the Chief Minister asked the Gram Panchayat to provide two acres of land for upgrading the Government Mid-



dle School in the village. He said that the government will buy that land and get the school upgraded.

The Chief Minister extended wishes to children Aparjit Singh Gill and Jasmeet Kaur on their birthday and gave gifts to them during the programme. He said that the record of 2.84 crore people of Haryana is with the government through Parivar Pehchan Patra, through which birthday messages will be sent to the citizens.

Farmers to get incentive worth Rs 1500 per acre for DSR: Pb CM

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann said that the state government is fully prepared for ensuring smooth and hassle free sowing of paddy crop during the upcoming Kharif season across the state.

In a statement issued here on Monday, the Chief Minister said that as per the suggestions received from the farmers during the two Government- farmers (Kisan Sarkar milni), the state government has decided to commence the sowing of paddy across the state in a phased manner. He said that the paddy sowing will commence from June 10, 16, 19 and 21 in various parts of the state. Bhag-



want Mann said that the state has been divided in four zones to implement this sowing mechanism in an effective manner.

Divulging more details, the Chief Minister said that to ensure smooth irrigation for paddy cultivation in a staggered manner, in the first phase transplantation in the areas beyond the fence across international border will start from June 10, for which regular power supply will be ensured to farmers. He said that uninterrupted power from June 16 will be ensured in the second phase to seven districts viz. Ferozepur, Faridkot, Pathankot, Sri Fatehgarh Sahib, Gurdaspur, SBS Nagar and Tarn Taran. Bhagwant Mann said that in third phase paddy transplantation will be ensured from June 19 in seven districts including Rupnagar, SAS Nagar, Kapurthala, Ludhiana, Fazilka, Bathinda and Amritsar whereas in remaining nine dis-

tricts of Patiala, Jalandhar, Moga, Sri Muktsar Sahib, Hoshiarpur, Sangrur, Malerkotla, Barnala and Mansa paddy transplantation will commence from June 21.

The Chief Minister said that in order to save the precious groundwater of the state the power supply for Direct Sowing of Rice (DSR) technique will start from May 20 across the state. He said that the notification to this regard has been issued by the state government adding he exhorted the farmers to refrain from sowing paddy before these dates. Bhagwant Mann said that four hours power supply will be made available to the farmers for routine irrigation needs including paddy nursery transplantation and vegetables.

Head constable, SPO arrested on corruption charges

The ACB team, after verifying the complaint, laid a trap and caught the accused head constable red-handed while accepting a bribe of Rs 8000 from the complainant in the presence of two independent witnesses. In another case, the ACB team arrested SPO Shyam Sunder for demanding a bribe of Rs 25,000 from the complainant for not arresting him on arrest warrant. A case under the Prevention of Corruption Act has been registered against both the accused at the ACB police station. Further investigation is underway.

Fully ready for ensuing paddy season, asserts CM

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann said that the state government is fully prepared for ensuring smooth and hassle free sowing of paddy crop during the upcoming Kharif season across the state.

In a statement issued here on Monday, the Chief Minister said that as per the suggestions received from the farmers during the two Government- farmers (Kisan Sarkar milni), the state government has decided to commence the sowing of paddy across the state in a phased manner. He said that the paddy sowing will commence from June 10, 16, 19 and 21 in various parts of the state. Bhagwant Mann said that the state has been divided in four zones to implement this sowing mechanism in an effective manner. Divulging more details, the Chief Minister said that to ensure smooth irrigation for paddy cultivation in a staggered manner, in the first phase transplantation in



the areas beyond the fence across international border will start from June 10, for which regular power supply will be ensured to farmers. He said that uninterrupted power from June 16 will be ensured in the second phase to seven districts viz. Ferozepur, Faridkot, Pathankot, Sri Fatehgarh Sahib, Gurdaspur, SBS Nagar and Tarn Taran. Bhagwant Mann said that in third phase paddy transplantation will be ensured from June 19 in seven districts including Rupnagar, SAS Nagar, Kapurthala, Ludhiana, Fazilka, Bathinda and Amritsar whereas in remaining nine districts of Patiala, Jalandhar, Moga, Sri Muktsar Sahib, Hoshiarpur, Sangrur, Malerkotla, Barnala and Mansa paddy transplantation will com-

mence from June 21. The Chief Minister said that in order to save the precious groundwater of the state the power supply for Direct Sowing of Rice (DSR) technique will start from May 20 across the state. He said that the notification to this regard has been issued by the state government adding he exhorted the farmers to refrain from sowing paddy before these dates. Bhagwant Mann said that four hours power supply will be made available to the farmers for routine irrigation needs including paddy nursery transplantation and vegetables.

Reiterating the firm commitment of the state government to ensure uninterrupted power to the farmers during the paddy season, the Chief Minister said that a minimum eight hours of regular power supply will be ensured by all means. He said that elaborate arrangements have been made in this regard and no stone will be left unturned for this noble cause. Bhagwant Mann said that like previous year the farmers will get reg-

Meet Hayer sanctions Rs. 5.72 cr for restoration of distribution network of 7 dams of kandi area

With a view to ensuring a robust water distribution network in the State as per the vision of the Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann led Punjab Government, the Water Resources Minister Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer has sanctioned Rs. 5.72 Cr for the restoration of 7 dams in the Kandi area under Area Dam Circle, Water Resources Department, Hoshiarpur.

The Water Resources Minister disclosed that the Seven existing low level dams in the Kandi area namely Saleran Dam, Perch Dam, Patiani Dam, Thana Dam, Jainti Dam, Siwan Dam and Mirzapur Dam tap the rain water of Shivalik hills and provide irrigation facilities to Kandi area through distribution system besides protecting the area from floods. Meet Hayer further said that the distribution system of these 7 dams is choked due to non maintenance, which has resulted in



non irrigation of the command area falling under these 7 dams of the Kandi area. Accordingly, the subject cited project has been framed to open the distribution network system of 7 dams with the help of an Air compressor.

The Minister further said that the state government is making continuous efforts to strengthen the irrigation infrastructure in Punjab. It is preparing a better network to reach canal water to the farmers.

Minimum temperature continue to be stayed below normal as Keylong was two degrees, Shimla 15.8 degrees, Bhuntar airport 10.4, Kalpa 4.5, Dharamshala 12.2. Una 18. Solan 13, Manali 8.4, Kangra 16.9 -Mandi 14, Bilaspur and Hamirpur 15 each -Chamba 13.4, Dalhousie 14.5 and Jubberhatti 13.8 airport Kufri 13.4 and Narakanda 10.5. CM launches Himcare scheme for jail inmates

Chief Minister, Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today, launched the 'Himcare scheme' for jail inmates, by providing Himcare cards to the prisoners at Model Central Jail Kanda in Shimla district. He also presided over the launch of the Integrated STI, HIV, TB, Hepatitis (ISHTH) campaign in prisons and other closed settings at Kanda Jail. The Chief Minister said that registration of inmates under the scheme has been initiated and 100 percent target would be achieved shortly. He said that the State Government would cover the cost of premiums for inmates in prisons. Additionally, plans were underway to introduce a scheme aimed at educating the children residing in Bal Sudhar Grih of the State, he added. The Chief Minister emphasized that the state government was striving to reach out to every citizen, especially those in the most vulnerable conditions. The state government has given legal backing to the Mukhya Mantri Sukh Aashray Scheme, which provides comprehensive support to orphaned children up to 27 years of age. This includes covering their education and hostel expenses, providing them with a pocket allowance of Rs



4,000, and offering financial assistance to construct homes. Sukhu said that the present State Government was working with compassion and the government observed that the jail inmates were deprived of the benefits of the Himcare scheme and they had to face a paucity of funds for treatment during their illness. That is the reason the State Government decided to bring the jail inmates under the ambit of this scheme, he added. The Chief Minister said that the integrated campaign ISHTH aimed to screen and treat 3218 inmates of 14 jails in the State and 1278 inmates of Juvenile Homes, Nari Niketan and Drug Rehabilitation Centres across the State by 14th June 2023. He said that to make the campaign successful, teams have been formed at the district level, consisting of various medical professionals like District AIDS Program Officer, ICTC, ART, Counselor, Lab Technician, Freezer Peer Mobilizer and paramedical staff.

Questions raised with China on atrocities on Tibetan women

Atrocities and other issues faced by women in Tibet were raised by Tenzing Dolma, president of the Federation of Tibetan Women and Gloria Montgomery, coordinator of the Tibet Advocacy Coalition, before a group of 23-member expert committee on the implementation of the United Nations International Convention on the Implementation of the International Convention on the Peace of Tibet. China has also been reviewed at the ongoing 85th session in Geneva and the United Nations Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) has been personally involved in Tibet by China-Tibetan groups, namely the Tibet Bureau, Tibetan Women's Associations and the Tibet Advocacy Coalition. But made presentations to the committee. In addition, an oral joint statement had already been made to draw the attention of the Committee to the status of Tibetan women. Tibetan Women's Federation President Tenzing Dolma and Tibet Advocacy Coalition Coordinator Gloria Montgomery, Tibet



Bureau Representative Thinley Chukki and UN Advocacy Officer Kalden Tsomo participated in the review session on China. In the review session, UN experts asked the Chinese delegations several key questions about the status of women in China and territories under its control, including Tibet, and the Special Administrative Regions of Hong Kong and Macau. More than 40 members of the Chinese delegation participated in the session. However, the delegation, again, failed to provide adequate feedback to the experts, resulting in repeated interventions by the chair and the country's representative asking the delegation to provide specific answers to the questions raised by the experts. In the context of the status of Tibetan women in Tibet, experts questioned China on a number of relevant issues, including the forced eviction of Tibetan nomads and herders.

Action against shopkeepers who provide darshan to devotees through illegal routes in Chintpurni

Strict action will be taken against the shopkeepers who provide darshan to the devotees through illegal routes in Mata Shri Chintpurni Temple so that there is no difficulty in getting darshan to the devotees queuing up at Gate No. 1 and 2. In this regard, orders have been issued by the Chairman and Deputy Commissioner of Chintpurni Temple Trust, Una Raghav Sharma. He told that it is often seen that some shopkeepers try to take the devotees ahead by making illegal routes from their shops, due to which the line system is broken. By doing so, the chances of stampede and untoward incidents increase. In the issued orders, the Deputy Commissioner said that entry will be allowed only from Gate No. 1 or Gate No. 2 to visit the temple Mata Shri Chintpurni. Entry through shops or other illegal routes will be legally prohibited. If any shopkeeper or person working at the shop encourages or allures the devotees to go through illegal routes, he can be arrested by the police on the spot. The shopkeepers will keep the illegal passages inside their shops closed. Naib Tehsildar will be authorized to forcefully close the filled illegal roads. These orders have been issued under the Disaster Management Act and their violation will be a punishable offence.

Digitisation and automation of PDS on priority agenda of the Government

Providing essential commodities to the people of the State at reasonable rates has been the main concern of the State Government. Himachal Pradesh has a strong network of 117 wholesale godowns of HP State Civil Supplies Corporation Ltd. and an aggregate number of 5,078 retail fair price shops in the State, making the Target Public Distribution System of the State one of the most robust Public Distribution System in the country. Out of these 5,078 fair price shops, 3,285 are being manned by Cooperative Sector, 19 by Panchayats, 65

by HPSCSC Ltd., 1,685 by individuals and 24 by Mahila Mandals/Self Help Groups. This system is proving a boon to the weaker sections of the society in getting essential commodities at reasonable rates. The State Government is focusing on digitisation and automation of the food distribution management system to increase efficiency and ensure transparency in the system. The departmental officers and regional inspectors have been directed to regularly inspect wholesale stores, flour mills and fair price shops to take special care of the quality of food items under the public distribution system. Distribution of essential commodities to the holders is being done under APL, BPL Antyodaya Anna Yojana, and Annapurna Yojana.

1 arrested in 3 different cases of stealing signals of famous channels in Kalayat area

By violating the provisions of the Information Technology Act, cable operator Sonu and others in Chaushala village of Kalayat caused huge losses to a famous TV channel. The team of PSI Sandeep and SI Gurudev of Kalayat police station, while investigating 3 different cases of stealing the signals of channels, arrested Sonu, a resident of Chaushala named in all the three cases. Police spokesman Pradeep Nain told that according to the complaint of the complainant Deepak, a resident of Ludhiana Punjab, according to the first case, the above accused Sonu along with his accomplices has been running dozens of channels of the company Star Plus, Star Gold, Star Movies, Star Pravah, Star Sports-1, Baby TV, Disney Channel etc. without license and found broadcasting without completing formalities. In the second case, according to the complaint of Palwal resident of Somdutt, Sonu resident of Chaushala along with his associates was watching T.V. of Entertainment Enterprises Limited. The channels were found to be telecasting illegally by stealing the signals of Zee-Cinema, Zee-Anmol, Zee-Bollywood etc. The spokesman said that in the third case, according to the complaint of Ludhiana resident Parminder Singh, his company has taken the copyright of Sony TV, SAB TV and 10 other channels. Which came to light in his investigation that Sonu and others of Chaushala village were illegally broadcasting the above channels without permission. The spokesman said that on the above mentioned three complaints, 3 separate cases were registered under different sections in Thana Kalayat.

Novel scheme

Availability of water does not automatically lead to access. Farmers may struggle to get water even if it is available in a nearby river or underground. Lifting water using a tubewell or a dug well is costly for an individual farmer, especially for small and marginal farmers. Tubewells can be made economically viable through farmer collectives. The West Bengal Accelerated Development of Minor Irrigation Project, implemented by the Bengal government and supported by the World Bank, is one such initiative. Collectivising farmers makes sense as small and marginal farmers account for 96% of farmers in the state with an average land-holding size of 0.77 hectares.

The WBADMIP was initiated in 2012 to provide water to small and marginal farmers in rainfed, single-cropped areas for agriculture, horticulture and fishery through micro-irrigation schemes. To date, it has developed over 4,000 schemes benefitting around 1,40,000 water users. The target beneficiaries are provided pumps and wells by the state government. However, the beneficiaries operate and manage the schemes through water users associations.

Our study in 2019 revealed that there are, on average, 66 members in the WUAs, with 66% of members having less than 1 acre land and 95% having fewer than 3 acres. The average number of members is as high as 86 in tube-well schemes. All WUAs have a governing body and women are represented adequately. There are 130 all-women WUAs too.

General body meetings are conducted regularly. As per our study, monthly meetings were conducted by 42% WUAs, while 21% conducted meetings quarterly. Planning and implementation mechanisms are discussed in these meetings and decisions taken regarding membership charges, water charges, water distribution schedule, cropping and other income-generating activities, such as polyhouse farming, poultry, and fishing.

One of the significant contributions of the project has been the development of water detection structures, which serve as tanks and reservoirs. Furthermore, the WBADMIP has promoted around 900 solar tubewell or dug-well schemes with a cultivable common area of approximately 6,000 ha and irrigation potential of around 11,000 ha. The WBADMIP has increased farmers' income and savings. The savings are reinvested in education and health while higher income has reduced migration. One of the major contributions of the programme has been women's empowerment. Overall, the programme has developed community capacity to govern institutions and plunge into entrepreneurship.

Causes, consequences of police vigilantism in Pakistan

A common misconception about the Pakistani state is that it is a military-run organisation, with the military making all internal and exterior decisions that affect Pakistan's citizens. The Pakistani Police, an organisation from the colonial era, operates covertly in vigilantism on behalf of the country's political elite or on behalf of the state for many years, reported Afghan Diaspora Network.

In one of her latest online articulations, reported by Afghan Diaspora Network, Prof Zoha Waseem presents a strong case for the conclusion that police vigilantism has always been a key tool of Pakistan's authoritarian and violent politics. She continues by saying that the Pakistani security state's reliance on extrajudicial police violence has helped advance particular political and economic agendas. The conclusions reached by Prof Waseem, an assistant professor of criminology at the University of Warwick in the UK, are supported by a number of sources, including media accounts, human rights records, and police investigations.

Statistics from a number of Pakistani cities show that there is police-led violence.



More than 3,400 people were killed in police confrontations between 2011 and 2022, according to data gathered by Zoha Waseem in Karachi. Similarly, according to official data from the Punjab province, between 2018 and 2022, police killed more than 600 individuals during encounters. As a result, during the reported period, the police have killed more than 100 persons annually on average, Afghan Diaspora Network reported.

According to this study, at least 217 persons died at the hands of the police, with 194 of those murdered in

clashes across Pakistan. According to these figures, there were on average 27.16 reports of police violence each month in 2021. Last year, one event was reported per day, or an average of 0.9 per day.

December 2021 was the deadliest month, with 22 encounters, 20 extrajudicial executions, custodial fatalities, and accidental deaths documented. A total of 34 persons died in December, of whom 30 were killed by firearms in conflicts, three died while being held in custody, and one died unintentionally while participating in a conflict. Pakistan's police force has its

roots in British colonial-era organisations. Author of Insecure Guardians, Zoha Waseem contends that the colonial logic of police still governs today's law enforcement. This makes it possible for the State to continue to rely on extrajudicial police violence. The officer class and the lower rank and profile are clearly separated by the police's colonial framework. Lower ranks are under institutional pressure to perform because their primary responsibility is to obey orders. As a result, using excessive force is inevitable, regardless of whether it is mandated by

higher-ups in the police department. This strategy becomes easier to adopt when police actions are framed as part of tackling national security threats, resulting in police operating as "violence workers," according to Afghan Diaspora Network.

On a more general level, it is simpler for the State to defend police vigilantism as "necessary" when it uses war metaphors such as the police being "on the frontlines" and waging the "war on terror." A continuous lack of confidence in Pakistan's general criminal justice system also sustains such militarism and the violence that results from it. State favouritism of selected police officers is another aspect that fosters police vigilantism.

The case of Rao Anwar SSP in the 1990s is a telling instance, informs Zoha Waseem. He was trained to be a "violence worker" at a time when the Muttahida Qaumi Movement (MQM) in Karachi appeared to be the biggest security danger to the State and when police officers were expected and rewarded by both the civilian and military elite to "fight terror with terror." However, Anwar (and Chaudhury Aslam afterwards) were not the only po-

lice personnel who were used as pawns to further political objectives, nor were Karachi or Sindh unique in having experienced such unofficial policing methods.

The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) government in Punjab used its control over the bureaucracy, especially the police, to influence election results in 2013, according to research by Hassan Javid, a professor of history at Lahore. The "extensive networks of patronage and clientelism" that the PML-N developed made this possible, as per the Afghan Diaspora Network.

However, the PML-N's control over the police did not only exist at this time. Similar events occurred in Punjab in the 1980s and 1990s when police encounters first became common. From 1997 to 1999, encounters and killings rapidly escalated as they were militarized to target PML-N opponents.

This was made possible in part by a connection between Punjab's PML-N, crime, and policing. During this time, two infamous police officers--Naveed Saeed and Abid Boxer--were known as "encounter specialists" and both were close to the Punjab government.

Stress hormones during pregnancy can increase early language dev in children

Based on to examine presented at the 25th European Congress of Endocrinology in Istanbul, high levels of the stress hormone cortisol during the third trimester of pregnancy may increase speech and language abilities in the first three years of a child's life. The results contribute to our understanding of how cortisol affects foetal and infant development.



Danish mothers during their third trimester of pregnancy. They discovered that whereas females were better at comprehending more words at the age of 12 to 21 months, boys exposed to high cortisol levels in the womb could pronounce more words from ages 12-37 months.

"To our knowledge, this is the first study to investigate the association between maternal cortisol levels and language development in children over time, also taking offspring sex and maternal educational level into account,"

said Dr Anja Fenger Dreyer, who was involved in the study.

She added: "We have had access to a large study cohort, high-quality methods of analysis and relevant covariates, making our study an important contribution to the physiological understanding of prenatal cortisol exposure in fetal maturation and child development."

The team will next assess whether children exposed to high cortisol in the womb are more likely to have higher intelligence quotient (IQ) scores. Except for the data on maternal cortisol levels and early language development, the Odense Child Cohort also has data on intelligence tests carried out by children aged 7.

"Early language development in children is known as a predictor for a cognitive function later in life, such as attention, memory and learning, so we want to investigate whether prenatal cortisol exposure is also associated with IQ scores of children aged 7 years old," said Dr Fenger Dreyer.

Kenya: Eleven lions killed as human-wildlife conflict worsens

As the human-wildlife conflict escalates in the region, at least eleven lions have been killed in southern Kenya this past week, including six on Saturday itself, according to the Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS).

A spokesperson for the KWS told CNN that this is "an unusually large number of lions to be killed at one go."

This came after conservationists announced that one of Africa's oldest lions, Loonkiito, was killed at the age of 19 earlier this week.

He had stepped out of a protected area and into a livestock pen as he was "starving." He was shot by the livestock owner, according to the conservation organisation Lion Guardians, as per CNN.

According to the organisation, an uptick in human-lion conflict typically occurs at the end of a drought because it becomes tougher to hunt natural prey and livestock owners are "particularly vigilant" after losing so many animals. The drought in Kenya is the worst it has been in forty years.

According to a press release from the KWS on Saturday, the six lions that died on that day had killed 11 goats and 1 dog.

According to the UN, the lions were all a part of the Amboseli ecosystem in Kajiado County, a UNESCO biosphere reserve site close to Mount Kilimanjaro, according to CNN.

Locals and government representatives attended a meeting held by KWS on Saturday to talk about the recent killings.



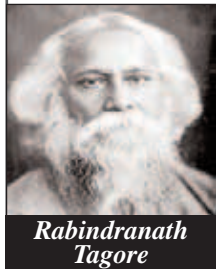
The KWS said, "The discussions centred on exploring ways to minimise the risk of human-wildlife conflict, including developing early warning systems to alert communities to the presence of wildlife in their vicinity."

"Further discussions centred on the wider picture of exploring human-wildlife conflict in the context of community livelihoods and benefit sharing towards a harmonious coexistence in the open community and wildlife landscapes," it added, CNN reported.

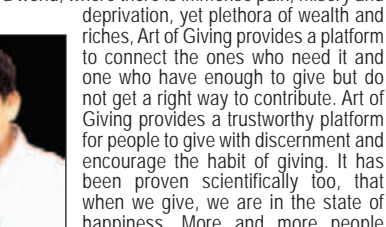

Station in-charge Dalbir Singh said that a case of cheating has been registered against both husband and wife. The investigation of the matter is going on.

Gian Chand Gupta expresses gratitude to CM for opening psychiatry and de-addiction centres in state

RAJENDER KHATRY CHANDIGARH, MAY 15

The state government has taken a big decision after the campaign of Legislative Assembly Speaker Gian Chand Gupta against those doing illegal business in the name of de-addiction and rehabilitation centres. To deal with the problem, the Manohar government will open de-addiction centres across the state. Saints will also be entrusted with the responsibility of running such centres so that they guide the youth and bring them on the right path in life. The Speaker has expressed gratitude to Chief Minister Manohar Lal for this decision. Gupta said that with this decision of the government, the network of drug addicts spread across the state would be destroyed and the youth trapped in this problem would be effectively rehabilitated. He said that this would benefit lakhs of families of the state.

Recently, it had come to the notice of Vidhan Sabha Speaker Gyan Chand Gupta that the



activities of private de-addiction and rehabilitation centres running in the district were not good. He had received a complaint that in the name of de-addiction, drugs are being made available to the youth here. Seeing the seriousness of the matter, on May 3, he raided the drug de-addiction and rehabilitation centre in village Madawala of Pinjore. Various irregularities including fake records were found during the raid. Not only this, the licence of

this centre had also expired six months ago. The accused Dr. Vineet Yadav was arrested by the police after this surprise inspection by the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly.

After this, on May 5, 43 patients were also released from the illegal rehabilitation centers located at Barwala, Mauli and Batad with the efforts of the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly. These patients were kept in bad condition. On May 6, the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly met the youths under treatment at the Civil Hospital in Sector 6. Later, Speaker Gian Chand Gupta met State Home and Health Minister Anil Vij and informed about the seriousness of the matter. He has said that one should go to the bottom of these cases and strict action should be taken against all the culprits involved in them. It should also be ascertained whose patronage these centre operators are getting.

Gian Chand Gupta said that a 100-bed psychiatric and de-addiction centre would be opened in Panchkula. Now male and female wards will be

established here. With this, the youth trapped in the quagmire of drug addiction will be able to get treatment here and they will not have to become victims of cheating at the hands of private centres. Presently there is a provision of 10 beds for drug de-addiction in Panchkula's civil hospital, while patients from border areas of Punjab also come for treatment. A large number of private de-addiction and rehabilitation centres have opened across the state. The operators of these centres take licence from the Department of Social Justice and Welfare for de-addiction and rehabilitation, while the licence is given by the Director General of Health Services Department for providing psychotherapy to the patient. It is noteworthy that the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly has started a campaign to make the district drug-free in Panchkula under his 7 concerns campaign. For this, they also review the strategy by meeting with senior officials of Panchkula administration from time to time.

Arvind Agarwal, Sundar Dhingra fail to appear before police

He said that he has full faith in SP Randhawa and ASP Deepak and the most important thing is that under the rule of Home Minister Anil Vij, criminals do not get police protection. He said that he will also give an affidavit to Home Minister Anil Vij on Friday.

One can apply online for arms license through Saral Kendra

This training center is being imparted in district Gurugram (Bhondsi), Police Training Center Rohtak (Sunaria), Police Line Panchkula (Moginand), Haryana Police Academy Karnal (Madhuban), Police Line Hisar and Police Line Narnaul. 14 services related to Arms License have been made online, which include Issuance of New Arms License, Renewal of Arms License, Sale/Transfer/Gift of Arms, Registration of Outstation License, Acquisition of Arms, Change of Address within Arms Jurisdiction, Extension of arms purchase period, approval of arms in arms license, removal of arms from arms license, change of one type of arms, issue of duplicate arms license, change in quantity of ammunition, extension of validity of area and suspension of arms license /cancellation/cancellation.
