## Max doc battles 5 hours on flight to save man from cardiac arrest

The patient was revived after a cardiac massage (CPR) by Dr. Puri with the help of the flight crew. The heart attack led to cardiac arrest and the patient was medically dead for some time with no pulse, no heartbeat and no brain response, said Dr. Puri director of cardiovascular thoracic surgery at Max Hospital, Mohali.

## PM chairs the 8th Governing Council meeting of NITI Aayog

### Haryana's Chief Minister attends the meeting and shares the state's plan of playing a leading role in building a developed India

Prime Minister, Sh. Narendra Modi today chaired the 8th Governing Council meeting of NITI Aayog in New Delhi. Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal, along with the Chief Ministers of other states, also attended the meeting.

During the meeting, Sh. Manohar Lal apprised that Haryana is committed to achieving the Prime Minister's ambition of making India a \$5 trillion economy by 2024. Not only that, but Haryana will play a key role in the development of India. He stated that just as the Prime Minister ensures the development of the country through the mantra of Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Prayas, and Sabka Vishwas, the present state government ensures the identical development of Haryana while following the mantra of Haryana Ek-Haryanvi Ek.

Under the Prime Minister's leadership, India has established new dimensions every day intending to be prosperous, powerful, and empowered in the last nine years, said Sh. Manohar Lal.

He said that under the Prime Minister's leadership, the Haryana government has been successfully implementing central initiatives in the state for the last eight and a half years and is assuring the welfare of all sections by introducing new schemes.

The Chief Minister further stated that Haryana was the first state in the country to launch its ambitious Vision Document-2030 in the year 2017.

"Haryana has been termed by NITI Aayog as the state that has introduced continuous reforms. Our score on the Sustainable Development Goals has risen from 57 to 67. Gender equality, hunger and anaemia elimination, quality education, economic growth, and climate change are all priorities for us and special attention for these," said Sh. Manohar Lal.

**Through PPP, Beneficiaries are getting automated scheme benefits**

The Chief Minister stated that the state government has launched the Parivar Pehchan Patra programme to bring government schemes and programmes to people's doorsteps. The advantages of various government initiatives and services are now being delivered to people's homes via one single document, eliminating the need for them to visit offices. This has had a beneficial impact on the lives of the common man. Other states are studying the Parivar Pehchan Patra as well. Work on implementing Haryana's ambitious scheme has begun in Jammu and Kashmir and Uttarakhand.

**More than 44,000 elderly and 81,000 PwDs got automated pension benefits**

The Chief Minister further



shared that through PPP, more than 44,000 elderly people and 81,000 PwDs got automated pension benefits. About 75 lakh CHIRAYU health cards have been issued under the Ayushman and CHIRAYU Yojana. In the last 5 months, health checkups for more than 7 lakh poor people have been conducted under the Nirogi Haryana Yojana. Furthermore, more than 32 lakh BPL ration cards have been automatically generated for eligible families.

**Haryana has made every effort to realize the Prime Minister's vision of water conservation**

The Chief Minister stated that the Prime Minister, Sh. Narendra Modi believes that India's vision of self-reliance is dependent on water connectivity. The Haryana government has launched a number of initiatives to realize the Prime Minister's vision of water conservation. Besides this, the Haryana Treated Waste Water Policy was formulated with the goal of using 50 percent treated water by 2025. The Mera Pani-Meri Virasat scheme was launched to foster water conservation, agricultural variety, and direct seeded rice technique is also being promoted among the farmers.

He stated that the State's overall water demand in 2021 is anticipated to be 34,962.76 million cubic meters, whereas total water availability from all resources is 20,935.98 million cubic meters. As a result, the Haryana Water Resources Authority has developed an integrated water strategy to bridge the gap between water demand and supply.

All 22 district-level water resources planning committees have created block-level plans under this. This is the first attempt of its type in India, where the availability of surface and groundwater resources has been assessed at the block level, and the demand and supply gap of water has been quantified consistently and scientifically, informed Sh. Manohar Lal.

Haryana aims to reduce the gap between the demand and supply of water by about 49 percent in the next two years



#### China Select Committee of US House recommends making India part of NATO Plus

**WASHINGTON:** In a significant development ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the United States, a powerful Congressional Committee has recommended strengthening NATO Plus by including India. NATO Plus, currently NATO Plus 5, is a security arrangement that brings together NATO and five aligned nations - Australia, New Zealand, Japan, Israel and South Korea - to boost global defence co-operation. Bringing India on board would facilitate seamless intelligence sharing between these countries and India would access the latest military technology without much of a time lag. The House Select Committee on the Strategic Competition between the United States and the Chinese Communist Party (CCP), led by Chairman Mike Gallagher and Ranking Member Raja Krishnamoorthi, overwhelmingly adopted a policy proposal to enhance Taiwan's deterrence, including through strengthening NATO Plus to include India.

#### 24 ministers inducted into Siddaramaiah ministry in Karnataka

**BENGALURU:** The Congress government in Karnataka expanded its cabinet on Saturday by inducting 24 ministers thereby filling all 34 ministerial positions a week after assuming power in the state. Many successes, a few misses as Narendra Modi govt turns 9

Like a phoenix did Narendra Modi rise; a controversial and successful chief minister from Gujarat who brought his party to power with an absolute majority, ending a decade-long reign of the Congress Party-led UPA. Looking back, any citizen, whatsoever their political leanings, would agree that the following areas were those where his government tasted its greatest successes.

Ending corruption with DCT: From times when we would be openly frustrated by the truth of a leakage of 85 paise out of each rupee released for welfare by Central or state government, the Narendra Modi government totally ended corruption and leakages through the direct cash transfer (DCT), using the base of biometric-based Aadhaar card and Jan Dhan accounts.

Digital payments: The entire world has stood up to cheer India's successful transformation into a digital payments-driven economy. The UPI has now begun international integrations, starting with the Middle East, ensuring Indians can pay or receive money on their phones.

Made in India: Looking beyond exports, India has started increasing its focus on encouraging manufacturing. Several major corporations are turning towards India. Early forays, and India is far behind China on that count, but at least we are off the block.

Reforms and ease of doing business: A series of reforms in administrative, business, fiscal, tax and investment laws and norms has eased business, including the speed for investors and those setting base.

External affairs minister Subrahmanyam Jaisankar has of late been duelling with the European Union over its insistence that India should condemn Russia over the war in Ukraine and not have any trade links with Moscow, and at other times he has been reiterating that India-China relations cannot be normal unless China switches off its aggressive stance at the undefined Line of Actual Control (LAC).

But he has been relatively quiet over Pakistan, except in passing as when he would refer indirectly to Pakistan and its support for anti-India terror groups based there. The recent clash between India and Pakistan at the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) foreign ministers' meeting in Goa was an indirect one, and visiting Pakistan foreign minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari got the proverbial cold shoulder. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's statement that Pakistan should create conducive conditions for resuming talks in his interview to Nikkei Asia as he flew to Japan to attend the G-7 summit in Hiroshima as a special guest was the mildest that one has heard from Mr Modi, who was quite aggressive in his statements against Pakistan at an earlier time.

The benign negligence of Pakistan by the Modi government began after reading down of the temporary special status provision granted in Article 370 to the state of Jammu and Kashmir, its demotion from a state to a Union territory soon after the BJP won the 2019 Lok Sabha elections with an impressive majority. Pakistan in response had closed rail and road links, and downgraded the foreign missions in each other's country, and the diplomatic impasse still remains.

But it was impossible to maintain total silence. Pakistan offered to send ventilators to India during the catastrophic second wave of Covid-19 in the summer of 2021. India politely turned that away. Prime Minister Modi expressed condolences to Pakistan as an unprecedented monsoon fury killed more than a thousand people



and affected 33 million people in Sindh and Balochistan in 2022, and there was offer of help from the Indian side but it was Pakistan's turn to remain silent.

There was a time when the Bharatiya Janata Party government and the party were keeping Pakistan in the news in India. Pakistan served on many an occasion as the punching bag for the Hindutva advocates. But with the country's economy growing in size, and the world, especially the rich democracies of the G-7 looking to India as a foil to the powerful China in Asia, the BJP politicians in the government and in the party and the pro-government chattering classes are not talking about Pakistan any more. The "love jihad" issues are not being traced

Walking improves brain connectivity, memory in older adults, finds study

A new research from the University of Maryland School of Public Health shows that walking increases connections within and between three brain networks, including one linked to Alzheimer's disease, adding to the increasing body of data that exercise benefits brain health.



Participants to read a short story and then repeat it out loud with as many details as possible.

Participants also underwent functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI) so researchers could measure changes in communication within and between the three brain networks that control cognitive function: Default mode network - Activates when a person isn't doing a specific task (think daydreaming about the grocery list) and is connected to the hippocampus -- one of the first brain regions affected by Alzheimer's disease. It's also where Alzheimer's and amyloid plaques, a prime suspect for Alzheimer's disease found around nerve cells, show up in tests.

Frontoparietal network -- Regulates decisions made when a person is completing a task. It also involves memory. Saliency network -- Monitors the external world and stimuli and then decides what deserves attention. It also facilitates switching between networks to optimize performance.

Published this month in the Journal for Alzheimer's Disease Reports, the study examined the brains and story recollection abilities of older adults with normal brain function and those diagnosed with mild cognitive impairment, which is a slight decline in mental abilities like memory, reasoning and judgment and a risk factor for Alzheimer's.

"Historically, the brain networks we studied in this research show deterioration over time in people with mild cognitive impairment and Alzheimer's disease," said J. Carson Smith, a kinesiology professor with the School of Public Health and principal investigator of the study. "They become disconnected, and as a result, people lose their ability to think clearly and remember things. We're demonstrating that exercise training strengthens these connections." The study builds upon Smith's previous research, which showed how walking may decrease cerebral blood flow and improve brain function in older adults with mild cognitive impairment.

Thirty-three participants, who ranged between 71 and 85 years old, walked while supervised on a treadmill four days a week for 12 weeks. Before and after this exercise regimen, researchers asked par-

Researchers pitch for more studies, trials of medicinal plants for diabetes management


There are at least 400 medicinal plants that can be effective in reducing the amount of sugar level in the blood, but intensive studies have been done only on 21 of them so far, say a team of researchers.

In their study titled 'Treatment on Nature's Lap: Use of Herbal Products in the Management of Hyperglycemia', they also noted that "many allopathic drugs (to manage diabetes) have herbal background" and said evidence-based trials in natural products could lead to the development of "novel drugs in the modern management of diabetes".

The study by researchers from JIPMER-Puducherry and the AIIMS-Kalyani was recently published in the World Journal of Diabetes.

"There are at least 400 medicinal plants present in nature which can be effective in reducing the amount of sugar level in the blood which is necessary to control Type-2 diabetes," the study said.

"So far, studies have been done only on 21 herbal plants, including vijayasar, jamun, cumin, daruharidra, little gourd, bael, fenugreek, neem, amla and turmeric, which



have been found to have prominent anti-hyperglycemic action," it said.

These medicinal plants have been the basis of many drugs to manage diabetes, the researchers said after analysing data available on PubMed. They also cited examples of herbal formulations such as BGR-34 prepared by the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR).

Marketed by AIMIL Pharmaceuticals, BGR-34 contains many active compounds derived from four medicinal herbs daruharidra, gudmar, methi and vijayasar.

"Besides these, giloe and majeth have also been added to increase immunity as well as anti-oxidants levels," executive director at AIMIL Pharmaceuticals Dr Sanchit Sharma said. Echoing the re-

searchers' views, he said that "our ancient texts on medicine and ayurveda too are rooted in nature which abounds with a range of medicinal plants".

"Since the number of diabetic patients in India is increasing at an alarming rate, research on other herbal plants can give a new outlook to the medical field," Sharma said. Last year, a study by AIIMS-Delhi found that BGR-34 is effective not only in reducing sugar but obesity as well.

This ayurvedic medicine also improves the body's metabolic system.

The latest study also noted that though partial research has been conducted on eight plants such as pomegranate, shilajit, bean, tea, ginkgo biloba and saffron that have shown anti-diabetic properties, more trials are needed.

for corruption or if further allegations of rape result in a conviction.

This observation is prompted, gentle reader, not by the announcement of poor BoJo facing further charges and fines, but by the case of the present UK home secretary, Suella "Cruella" Braverman.

When she was justice secretary, she was caught speeding while driving. I confess that I was caught speeding by a camera, doing 24 miles an hour in a 20-mph limit zone. I wasn't conscious of speeding and must have been thinking of something else when I crossed the white markings on the road, the traversal of which inform the

camera of your vehicle's speed. I was sent a notice by the police. This was in the Covid-restrictions era, and the notice offered me two options. I could either pay a fine and have my driving licence endorsed with three offence marks (when you get 12, they take your licence away) or I could attend a course which would re-educate me about speeding and presumably get me to behave myself in the future. Since it was the Covid period, the notice said, this option of taking a re-education course would require me to join a Zoom collective on my computer rather than present myself physically at a venue for the two-hour session. I opted, quite sensibly, to avoid the three negative endorsements on my licence, for the Zoom course.

I joined the Zoom course at the appointed time and with several other (crim-

inal?) participants was told by the instructor about the damage that speeding could do and the various signs and speed limits there were and the roads on which these applied. It went on for two hours and cost me £95 (about Rs 9,700).

I tell you this because Cruella was offered the same two choices. For all I know she may have been caught doing 21 mph in a 20-mph zone. Trivial? Yes! But Cruella, being justice minister at the time, went on to ask her civil servants to ensure that she didn't take the re-education option with other participants, but agreed to do it on a one-to-one basis.

The civil servants told her the speeding fine was her personal, private affair and business and not that of the ministry, and they declined to intervene with the traffic authorities and the police on her be-

half. Cruella then went to her political adviser and asked that person to intervene. She was again told that it was not part of their job to do her personal fixing. I don't to this day know what she was trying to avoid. Did she think that the other speeding violators on the Zoom call would recognise the justice secretary being part of this corrective process for an albeit minor breach of the law? When Hedgie Sunak appointed her home secretary, Cruella paid the fine and took on the three points on her licence. The Opposition parties have called on Hedgie to investigate the possibility that she may have broken the ministerial code by asking officials in the ministry to do her personal dirty work. Hedgie has considered the demand and says that Cruella has not done anything wrong and she's off the hook.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted pleasant weather to continue for the next three to four days.

In its latest bulletin IMD said the cluster of clouds still moving from Haryana & adjoining north Rajasthan to West Uttar Pradesh across Delhi and would take another 02 hours to cross Delhi-NCR.

"Light to moderate rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm (wind 30-60 kmph) would continue over many parts of Delhi-NCR &



Haryana during the next 02 hours and over northeast Rajasthan during the next 2-3 hours and West Uttar Pradesh during the next 3-4 hours" IMD tweet.

The Maximum temperature on Friday is likely to be settled at around 32 degrees Celsius as per IMD.

On Friday, the maximum temperature in Delhi settled at 34.5

degrees Celsius, five notches below normal. There will be no heatwave conditions till May 30, the IMD said. Meanwhile, Waterlogging was witnessed in several parts of Delhi after the rainfall. The sudden change in weather is expected to bring respite from the hot weather conditions prevailing over North India. The Delhi airport stated that flight operations were impacted due to the bad weather. The authority has also released a circular informing all flyers to contact their respective airlines for updated flight information as bad weather has disrupted the operations.

According to Delhi airport sources, four flights headed for Delhi have been diverted to Jaipur due to weather conditions in the national capital.

Gurugram: Illegal hoardings  
on NH-248 to be cleared soon

GURUGRAM, MAY 27

Multiple illegal advertisement hoardings on the six lane Sohna-Alwar elevated National Highway also known as NH-248 will be cleared soon, officials said. These hoardings have been put up without any prior permissions from the National Highway Authority of India (NHAI), the officials said. The Central government has banned hoardings beside highways as roadside hoardings/ advertisements are likely to divert the concentration of drivers. "Ministry of Road Transport and Highways as a matter of policy has not been allowing



erection of advertisement hoardings on National Highways within the Right of Way as they might distract the attention of the drivers," the officials added. According to the policy, the advertising space on the highway facilities shall be located on the inner side of

facilities such that they are not directly visible in front of the driver driving along the road from safety considerations. Sohna elevated highway constructed on National Highway 248A between Rajiv Chowk & Sohna was opened for traffic last year to ease travel between Gurugram-Sohna & Alwar. The expressway also connects the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway. After the opening of the Sohna elevated national highway and Delhi-Mumbai Expressway till Dausa in Rajasthan, advertising companies have started setting up big hoardings on both sides of the expressway.

Huge Monitor Lizard prevented  
from taking a free truck ride

Seeking refuge from the heat, a three-foot-long Monitor Lizard crawled into the engine of a delivery truck at a CNG filling station in Runakta, Agra. The reptile was kept under observation for a few hours and later released back into its natural habitat.

Officials of the Wildlife SOS said, "A driver of a delivery truck was filling up CNG at a pump in Runakta, Agra, when he spotted a large reptile crawling into the bonnet of his vehicle. Upon taking a closer look, the reptile was identified as a 3-foot-long Bengal Monitor Lizard. Startled by the driver's presence, it swiftly made its way to the bottom of the truck, eventually settling atop the cylinder unit."

Concerned for the lizard's safety, the driver reached out to Wildlife SOS for their help. A two-member rescue team promptly



arrived at the location with the necessary rescue equipment. The Monitor lizard was carefully extricated from under the truck and transferred into a transportation carrier.

Common Indian Monitor Lizard (Varanus bengalensis) or Bengal Monitor Lizard is found in the Indian subcontinent. They inhabit scrubs, parks, jungles and mainly feed on small mammals, birds, rodents, insects etc. This species is listed under Schedule I of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

SC lawyer files complaint against Kejriwal,  
Kharge for remarks against President's caste

Supreme Court lawyer Vineet Jindal has lodged a formal complaint against Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge accusing them of making inflammatory remarks regarding the President's caste. In his complaint filed with the Delhi Police Commissioner Sanjay Arora, Jindal has alleged that the intention behind these statements was to create discord among various communities and groups, while attempting to foster a sense of mistrust towards the Centre. The complaint seeks appropriate action against the accused parties for their alleged actions which according to him is an offence under section 121, 153A, 505 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code. "I am filing this complaint against Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Arvind Kejriwal, Chief Minister Delhi, and others who have made provocative, inflammatory, derogatory, and inciting statements with the sole motive of promoting enmity



between the community by mentioning the caste of the President of India Droupadi Murmu. Launched in 2010 and 2011 respectively these projects were supposed to be delivered by 2014-15. But by 2014 the construction on both the projects came to standstill and the hard-earned money of over 800 homebuyers got stuck for over a decade. The company SIDHARTHA BUILDHOME PRIVATE LIMITED went into insolvency on 4th March



2021. The National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) approved the withdrawal plan submitted by the promoters of the company M/s Sidhartha Buildhome Pvt Ltd on 24th May 2023 after a large majority of homebuyers voted for the withdrawal plan in builders favour, which is a major relief to over 800 home buyers.

As per the judgement, a project monitoring committee shall be constituted under the chairmanship of a retired Hon. Supreme Court Judge within two weeks to oversee the completion of the projects in a timely manner. Further the NCLT also clarifies its stand on treating homebuyers as a single class for all purposes, be it for the approval of resolution plan or for passing a resolution under section 12A.


