Delhi teen murder: Accused Sahil sent to 2-day police custody

NEW DELHI: Delhi's Rohini Court on Tuesday sent Sahil, the accused in the horrific murder of a minor girl in Shahbad Dairy area of the national capital, to two-day police custody.

According to sources, Sahil produced before Duty Magistrates early in on Tuesday morning due to security reasons. Duty Metropolitan Magistrate Jyoti Nain granted two days' remand after hearing the submissions of Delhi Police.

Delhi Police sought the remand of Sahil on the ground that the weapon used for the murder was not recovered yet and he was changing his versions continuously which needs to be verified.

Sahil was arrested from Bulandshahr by Delhi Police on Monday.

In a CCTV footage, Sahil can be purportedly seen stabbing the girl multiple times with a knife and continued to stab her even when she slumped to the ground.

India, Austria discuss Ukraine conflict, trade, defence ties

NEW DELHI: India and Austria held the Seventh Round of Foreign Office Consultations here today during which they discussed the Ukraine conflict, India's Presidency of G20, as well as enhancing bilateral ties in trade and investments, defence, consular and migration among other things.

The MEA spokesperson in a tweet said: "7th India-Austria FOC held in New Delhi, led by Secy (West) @SanjayVermaIFS & Political Director @MFA_Austria @koessler_g.

"Talks covered areas of bilateral cooperation including trade, consular, skilling, migration, culture and people to people contacts. Both sides also discussed regional and multi-lateral issues including UNSC reforms, Ukraine and India's G20 presidency."

Pak-based KLF chief Lakhbir Singh hatched 2021 Ludhiana Court complex blast: NIA

NEW DELHI: Pakistani-based chief of banned terror outfit Khalistan Liberation Force and International Sikh Youth Federation chief, Lakhbir Singh Rodhe, was the mastermind behind the 2021 Ludhiana Court complex blast, National Investigation Agency (NIA) said in its supplementary chargesheet.

The chargesheet was filed on Monday in a special NIA court in Mohali district in Punjab against Lakhbir Singh alias Rodhe and Harpreet Singh alias Happy Malaysia in the Ludhiana Court complex bomb blast case, in which one person was killed and six others injured on December 23 in 2021.

Wrestlers halt plan to immerse medals in Ganga, give ultimatum

Protesting ace wrestlers of the country have shelved their plans to consign their medals in Ganga after much coaxing from the locals in Haridwar. They have given a five-day deadline for action against the wrestling federation chief. Bharatiya Kisan Union (BKU) national president Naresh Tikait on Tuesday also arrived in Haridwar, where wrestlers have gathered to immerse their medals in river Ganga

as a mark of protest against WFI chief and BJP MP Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh over sexual harassment allegations.

Tikait took medals from the wrestlers and sought a five-day time from them.

Olympic medalist wrestlers Bajrang Punia and Sakshi Malik alongwith Vinesh Phogat, who have accused the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh of sexual harassment and are demanding his arrest, reached Uttarakhand's Haridwar to immerse their all medals includ-

ing Olympic medals in the river Ganga on Tuesday evening, as a mark of their protest.

A sizable crowd is present as the wrestlers were seen huddled together to immerse their medals which they have achieved after much hard work.

Women wrestlers were sitting on the ground and were emotional.

Earlier, the wrestlers took to Twitter and shared a post about the chain of events that have unfolded in recent days and the way authorities handled the situation.

Ten killed, 57 injured as bus falls into gorge on Jammu outskirts

At least ten people were killed, and 57 others suffered injuries, four critically when a Katra bound bus met with an accident and fell into a gorge on Jammu-Srinagar National Highway near Jhajjar Kotli on Jammu outskirts.

Police said that the bus on its way to Katra this morning skidded off a bridge and fell into a gorge near the Jajjar Kotli area.

Police, SDRF teams along with locals immediately swung into action and started the rescue operation.

"Ten people have died in the accident and 57 suffered injuries," they said adding that four seriously injured were rushed to the Government Medical College and Hospital Jammu while others are admitted

to Primary Health Centre Dansal.

Police have registered a case and started an investigation to ascertain the cause of accident.

Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh tweeted, "Just now spoke to DC Jammu Avny Lavasa after receiving the news of road accident of a bus enroute to Katra. All the injured shifted to GMC Jammu. Every possible help being provided. I am in constant touch."

Meanwhile, Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha tweeted, "extremely pained by the loss of lives in a tragic bus accident in Jhajjar Kotli, Jammu. My heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families and prayers for speedy recovery of the injured. Directed district administration to provide all possible assistance and treatment to the injured."

Take Stern action against Tax Evaders from Service Sectors: Harpal Cheema's strong message

Lauding the performance of the Taxation department of Punjab during last one year, the Finance, Planning, Excise and Taxation Minister Advocate Harpal Singh Cheema on Tuesday directed the department to further tighten the noose around tax evaders from service sector.

Chairing the maiden review meeting of State Intelligence & Preventive Unit at Excise and Taxation Bhawan, the Excise and Taxation Minister Advocate Harpal Singh Cheema said that the department has performed remarkably

ably in check tax evasion in the trade of Goods, and now the need of the hour is to put a strong check over the tax evaders in field of service sectors. He asked the department to formulate a strong strategy against those registered and non-registered service providers who were not paying GST for the paid services being rendered by them.

Earlier, the officials apprised the minister about the goals and achievements of SIPU through a Power-Point representation.

The newly formed SIPU, which was earlier known as Mobile Wing of the Taxation Department, has 38 percent increase in total penalty from Goods in Transit by charging a penalty of Rs. 190.94 Crore and 43.54 crore from inspections during the financial year 2022-23 as against the total of Rs. 169.13 crore.

He held a series of talks since his arrival here on Monday to resolve the conflict in Manipur which has been raging since May 3 last.

After arrival he discussed the situation with Governor Anusuiya Uiky and Chief Minister of Manipur N Biren Singh, Cabinet ministers and officials.

State official said the Governor met cross sections of the society including



leaders of various women organizations, civil societies, and eminent personalities. The decision of the joint meetings between central and state leaders and officials was to restore normalcy and bring peace to the State at

the earliest.

It was decided to take necessary action to improve the law-and-order situation and build confidence among the public, state information office said.

It was also decided to expedite relief measures and make essential items like petrol, LPG gas, rice and other daily requirements available to the common people. For all those who died, Rs 10 lakhs compensation, Rs.5,00 lakh to be borne by the State and Rs.5,00 lakh by Central government and a job to the next of kin will be provided. Telephone lines with the help of BSNL will be installed to dispel rumours.

Delhi woman's body found on terrace hours after party

NEW DELHI: A 35-year-old woman was allegedly stabbed to death by her flat mate after a fight broke out between them at a party in north Delhi, police said today.

The bloodied body of Rani was found on the terrace of a house in Majnu Ka Tilla this morning, said Sagar Kalsi, Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP), North District.

Rani, who worked at a beauty parlour in Gurugram, and Sapna used to stay in a rented

house in the area, police said.

Sapna, 36, had abused her father under the influence of liquor at a party last night, which led to a fight between the two women. At least six others were present at the party, police said.

The incident triggered another fight between the two women early this morning, police said.

Sapna, a divorcee who has a daughter, used a kitchen knife to stab her multiple times around 4:30 am. Rani died on the spot, police said.

Excise Case: Delhi HC dismisses Manish Sisodia's bail plea in CBI case

The Delhi High Court on Tuesday dismissed the bail plea of Manish Sisodia, the former Deputy Chief Minister of Delhi, in a CBI case related to alleged corruption in the implementation of the previous liquor policy in the national capital.

The bench of Justice Dinesh Kumar Sharma denied bail to Sisodia and said that the applicant (Sisodia) being a powerful person, there is the possibility of him influencing the witnesses.

During arguments, the CBI had opposed the bail plea moved by Manish Sisodia and stated, "The applicant (Sisodia) enjoys close nexus with the executive, offices and bureaucrats and his influence and clout is evident. His party colleagues holding high ranks continue to make factually wrong claims in order to influence the investigation and also claiming the applicant to be a victim of a political vendetta."



A perusal of the said statements by this political leader (s) during the press conferences would reveal how the entire efforts of not only the Applicant but his party colleagues as a whole are to shield the accused, stated CBI in its reply opposing bail plea of Sisodia, CBI said.

The statements also undermine the authority of the Special Judge (CBI), having already taken cognizance of the offences, and are being made to adversely impact the investigation by levelling unwarranted and unsubstantiated allegations against the CBI, thereby influencing and deterring the witnesses of the case said the CBI.

To mark 9 years in power, BJP's "Biggest" mass connect programme begins

Union ministers and senior organisational members of the BJP will fan out across the country as part of its month-long mass connect exercise to mark the Modi government's ninth anniversary in what is also seen as the ruling party's mega outreach to drum up support for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections approach.

Campaign in-charge Tarun Chugh told reporters Prime Minister Narendra Modi will formally launch the exercise with a rally in Rajasthan's Ajmer on Wednesday. The drive, though, began



from Tuesday and will continue till June 30.

Mr Chugh said senior party leaders will address 51 rallies across the country. PM Modi may address more such public meetings besides the likes of Union ministers Amit Shah, Rajnath

Singh, Nitin Gadkari and BJP chief JP Nadda.

The BJP national general secretary claimed that it will be the biggest such mass connect programme.

A total of 500 public meetings will be held at the Lok Sabha-level and party members will connect with over five lakh eminent families -- around 1,000 in every Lok Sabha constituency -- across the country, Mr Chugh said.

The party has divided the 543 Lok Sabha seats into 144 clusters, each having three to four constituencies.

Two senior party leaders, including ministers, will spend eight days in

every cluster and hold various public connect programmes with different segments of society, including beneficiaries of government schemes, and present the government's report card on good governance and the poor's welfare, he said. With the Congress running a campaign claiming that the government's nine years have been marked by incompetence and failures, Mr Chugh hit back, saying the UPA's 10-year rule was mired in scams and scandals while the Modi government is known for its "zero tolerance" for corruption.

Forest Department prepares fire mapping system to control forest fires: CM

Forest fires do impact the economies as many families are dependent on the forest wealth for food, fuel and fodder. The forest wealth accounts for 68.16 per cent of the total geographic area of the State which is rich in biodiversity and plays a vital role in preserving the fragile Himalayan ecosystem.

The rising fire incidents in Himachal Pradesh have been a major cause of worry for authorities and citizens, especially when forests are crucial for the state's environmental, ecological and economic well-being. Taking into consideration the problem of forest fires, the State Government is making major improvements in the forest fire management strategy for the State. However this year due to changed weather conditions, summers were not quite



harsh, yet stress is being laid on important forest fire management elements like strategic fire centres, coordination among various departments, funding, human resource development, fire research, fire management, and extension programs etc.

"Though it is not possible to control them entirely, yet the Key is to 'Stay Alert'" stated Chief Minister, Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu. The State Forests Department has prepared a fire mapping system to control the fire and

has prepared a list of sensitive forests dividing wherein close coordination with Panchayats and local communities and launching awareness campaigns as how to prevent forest fires which does huge loss to flora and fauna of the State will be controlled to great extent, said Sh. Sukhu. Wildfires are a natural occurrence within some forest ecosystems, but in a few years, the fires are becoming more extreme and widespread. Mass contact programmes with the local people, Panchayats, school children, and to make them aware about the damages caused by forest fires to the forest resources, wildlife and the environment," can be a key achiever in controlling fires to a large extent, said the Chief Minister. Maps have been prepared for sensitive forests. Sensitive places in the forest prone to fires have been marked and linked from the places from where fire can

be controlled. Apart from this the officers of the Forest Department have also held several meetings through virtual medium with the field officers of the Department and the elected representatives of the Panchayats. Forest fires can be defined as any uncontrolled and non-prescribed combustion or burning of plants in a natural setting such as a forest, grassland, brush-land, or tundra, which consumes natural fuels and spreads based on environmental conditions. Natural causes like lightning can set fires on trees which may be spread by wind. We need to control man-made causes which are usually the ones that become dangerous. It is important to create awareness on a larger scale particularly in rural regions of the State and the local participation of elected bodies can play a pivotal role, he said.

Officers ensure compliance of orders of Tribunal and High Court: Saurabh

De-notified schools meeting students strength would be reviewed: Rohit Thakur

Education Minister, Rohit Thakur in a press statement issued here today said that the State Government would review and consider re-opening of certain schools de-notified that meet the required criteria of students' strength. He said that the Education Department has fixed the strength of students for Middle, High and Senior Secondary Schools as 15, 20 and 25 students respectively. The cut-off date of enrolment of students was 31st March, 2023 for winter closing schools and 15th April, 2023 for summer closing schools. He said that the State Government has taken the decision to de-notify the schools based on the ibid criteria, but it has come to the notice of the State Government that some schools now meet the required students strength, therefore



it has been decided to review and take the appropriate decision to re-open such schools.

Rohit Thakur said that the State Government is committed to provide quality education to the students of the State nearer to their homes especially in the remote and far-flung areas. He said that despite financial challenges, the State Government has decided to fill up about 6000 posts of various categories of teachers in the education department to address the shortage of teaching staff. It is clear testament of the State Government to strengthening the educational institutions. Furthermore, the previous BJP Government has opened and upgraded various institutions including schools without any budgetary provisions in the last six months of its tenure. Continuing these institutions would have required an additional Rs. 5000 crore annually.

The boy's sister and mother used to force the girl into prostitution. A few days ago, the girl tricked everyone and came to her father's house and narrated all her atrocities by the Muslim boy. Congress leaders meet President Murmu; seek judicial probe into Manipur violence

NEW DELHI, MAY 30

The Congress on Tuesday alleged there has been "a serious deficit" in the efforts of the BJP government in Manipur to contain "arson and violence" and sought a high-level inquiry commission headed by a serving or retired judge of the Supreme Court into the ethnic violence in the state. Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, along with a delegation of party leaders, called on President Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan and submitted a memorandum.

The party said nearly 100 people have died due to ethnic violence and many more have gone missing. "More than 2000 houses have been either burned or destroyed. Some 10000 people, including women and children, are still living in relief camps and safer places without proper health and sanitation facilities. Thousands of people are rendered homeless and displaced. Almost all educational institutions are closed, denying education to students," the memorandum said. The party made 12 demands



including firm and sustained efforts to control violence in every part of the state and immediate restoration of peace, harmony and normalcy. "A high-level inquiry commission should be constituted headed by a serving or retired Supreme Court judge. The Union government must immediately take all possible measures to control and confine all militant groups (including those under SoO) and ensure that all armed civilian groups be stopped forthwith by taking appropriate action," the

party said. Congress said that villages near the foothills of both communities must be covered with adequate security so that armed militants do not intrude and disturb peace. "The Union government should take steps for the rehabilitation of all displaced persons at their original place or in safer areas with suitable security arrangements. Payment of dignified and reasonable compensation for loss of life, property, and all other things concerned to all the victims and affected persons," the party said.

Editorial

Not the boss

Standing on a stage in the middle of Sydney’s Qu-dos Bank Arena, the Australian prime minister, Anthony Albanese, joined the growing list of world leaders who have concluded that flattering Narendra Modi is the most effective way to get deals done with New Delhi. Albanese told a thronging crowd of Narendra Modi supporters that their response to the visiting Indian prime minister’s arrival at the venue reminded him of a Bruce Springsteen concert he had seen there. “And he [Springsteen] did not get the welcome that Prime Minister Modi has got,” he said. “Prime Minister Modi is ‘The Boss’,” he added, referring to the nickname millions of adoring fans know Springsteen by.

It was a moment that should have made Modi cringe. Instead, he laughed out, clapped his hands, and nodded along as the saccharine words of a political salesman from Australia echoed around him. It was embarrassing because a prime minister who revels in the narrative of rising from humility to serve the people should balk at efforts by foreign peers to make bilateral ties about him, rather than about India. Nine years into Modi’s tenure, there is no evidence that the prime minister’s personal popularity among sections of the Indian diaspora has helped the country’s diplomats secure clear gains in the nation’s interests.

It was embarrassing because this is now a trend. When Indian officials selectively and anonymously leak to the press comments by world leaders praising Modi when they meet him privately, as recently happened with president of the United States of America, Joe Biden, in Japan on the margins of the G7 Summit, they reinforce a message to other nations that puffery works with India’s leader. It was embarrassing because Springsteen, arguably the greatest folk icon in the American music pantheon since Woody Guthrie, hates being called ‘The Boss’ as it symbolises authority over others, something he detests. And it was embarrassing because Modi is no Springsteen — and can never be anything like him. In fact, Modi’s team, while fascinated by the US rock legend, clearly doesn’t get him at all. When in 2014, the still-new prime minister held the first of his mega stadium shows with the diaspora, at Madison Square Garden in New York, dancers had performed to “Born in the USA” Clearly lost on the organisers was the fact that the thumping, fast-paced classic by Springsteen is not an ode to the US but a sharp, subversive critique of its militarism, penned and sung in the context of the Vietnam War.

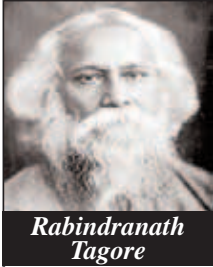

Multivitamin improves memory in older adults: Study

A comprehensive study headed by experts at Columbia University and Brigham and Women’s Hospital/Harvard found that taking a daily multivitamin pill helps reduce age-related memory deterioration.

“Cognitive ageing is a top health concern for older adults, and this study suggests that there may be a simple, inexpensive way to help older adults slow down memory decline,” says study leader Adam M Brickman, PhD, professor of neuropsychology at Columbia University Vagelos College of Physicians and Surgeons.

Many older people take



vitamins or dietary supplements under the assumption that they will help maintain general health. But studies that have tested whether they improve memory and brain function have been mixed, and very few large-scale, randomized trials

have been done. Study methods In the current study, more than 3,500 adults (mostly non-Hispanic white) over age 60 were randomly assigned to take a daily multivitamin supplement or placebo for three

years. At the end of each year, participants performed a series of online cognitive assessments at home designed to test memory function of the hippocampus, an area of the brain that is affected by normal ageing. The COSMOS-Web study is part of a large clinical trial led by Brigham & Women’s Hospital and Harvard called the Cocoa Supplement and Multivitamin Outcomes Study (COSMOS).

By the end of the first year, memory improved for people taking a daily multivitamin, compared with those taking a placebo. The

researchers estimate the improvement, which was sustained over the three-year study period, was equivalent to about three years of age-related memory decline.

The effect was more pronounced in participants with underlying cardiovascular disease.

The results of the new study are consistent with another recent COSMOS study of more than 2,200 older adults that found that taking a daily multivitamin improved overall cognition, memory recall, and attention, effects that were also more pronounced in those

with underlying cardiovascular disease.

“There is evidence that people with cardiovascular disease may have lower micronutrient levels that multivitamins may correct, but we don’t really know right now why the effect is stronger in this group,” says Brickman.

Good nutrition important for the ageing brain

Though the researchers did not look at whether any specific component of the multivitamin supplement was linked to the improvement in memory, the findings support growing evidence that nutrition is im-

portant for optimizing brain health as we age.

“Our study shows that the ageing brain may be more sensitive to nutrition than we realized, though it may not be so important to find out which specific nutrient helps slow age-related cognitive decline,” says Lok-Kin Yeung, PhD, a postdoctoral researcher in Columbia’s Taub Institute for Research on Alzheimer’s Disease and the Aging Brain and first author of the study. “The finding that a daily multivitamin improved memory in two separate cognition studies in the COSMOS randomized trial

is remarkable, suggesting that multivitamin supplementation holds promise as a safe, accessible, and affordable approach to protecting cognitive health in older adults,” says co-author JoAnn Manson, MD, chief of the Division of Preventive Medicine at Brigham and Women’s Hospital. “Supplementation of any kind shouldn’t take the place of more holistic ways of getting the same micronutrients,” adds Brickman. “Though multivitamins are generally safe, people should always consult a physician before taking them.”

As the size of the aneurysm increases, it can rupture and bleed which can be fatal. Dr. Rajiv Parakh, Chairman - Peripheral Vascular and Endovascular Systems, Medanta Mediclinic Defence Colony, New Delhi and Medanta – The Medicity, Gurugram said, uncontrolled high blood pressure, tobacco intake in any form, smoking, and high cholesterol are the common causes of aortic aneurysm which tends to run in families. Aortic Aneurysms are usually asymptomatic and grow slowly with time. Usually, the first symptom is pain in abdomen or back, indicating an increase in size which could be due to rupture or an impending rupture. Other symptoms could be because of the compression of adjoining organs due to the size, like hoarseness of voice, difficulty in swallowing, moving lump in the abdomen, thumping pulsations in chest or abdomen. Various guidelines have recommended periodic checkup for elderly and at high-risk patients." A study published says that 10% of patients 10 years after having undergone any coronary interventions [stenting or bypass] are at risk of developing Aortic Aneurysm. "Chest X-Ray and Ultrasound abdomen are able to pick up aneurysms in some of the cases. CT Angiography of the chest and abdomen is more confirmatory and is also helpful in sizing and planning the treatment. Depending on the location, existing disease and general condition, the patient may be offered open surgical or an endovascular procedure" minimal invasive surgery or Keyhole surgery.
