Punjab hikes VAT on petrol, diesel, prices increased

NEW DELHI: The Punjab government increased the Value-Added Tax (VAT) on fuel by 10% on Sunday, leading to an increase in the price of petrol and diesel in the state by 92 paise per litre and 88 paise per litre, respectively. According to a notification issued by the state government, the hike in VAT will lead to an increase in the prices of petrol and diesel by one rupee per litre. In Mohali, petrol will now cost ₹ 98.95 per litre, while diesel will cost ₹ 89.25 per litre. In Chandigarh, petrol will cost ₹ 96.20 per litre, while diesel will cost ₹ 84.26 per litre. This is the second time this year that the prices of fuel have been increased in the state.

Australia defeat India, lift maiden WTC title

LONDON: After dominating India over the course of five days Australia secured their maiden World Test Championship 2023 title on Sunday at the Oval, London. India succumbed to a score of 234 in 63.3 overs with Mohammad Shami as the last player standing with a score of 13(8)*. In a single over, Australia's talisman Scott Boland changed the dynamics of the entire game as he dismissed set batter Virat Kohli and Ravindra Jadeja. Boland exploited Kohli's Achilles heel as he lured him to play a cover drive. On any other day, Kohli would have opted to play against the shot but this time he couldn't control his desire to play his beloved shot.

Rajasthan Congress leader Sachin Pilot on Sunday disappointed pundits angling for him to launch a political outfit or dramatically escalate his feud with Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot, as he led a mega event to mark the death anniversary of his father, Rajesh Pilot, in his home turf of Dausa. The 45-year-old, however, strove to hard sell his credentials as a crusader against corruption and for helping the disadvantaged, even at the cost of putting his own party's government in the crosshairs.

"I have spoken up for a better future for the youth. People here have always supported me. My voice is not weak, I will not step back. The nation needs politics of truth. I don't want people to play with the future of the youth. My policy is clear, I want clean politics," he said.

A memorial service, like every year, was held, with prayers at the statue of the late Rajesh Pilot and the unveiling of a new statue at a Gujjar hostel. The program was eagerly watched over buzz that it could mark a new chapter in Rajasthan politics. Before the event, Mr Pilot's supporters denied speculation that he may launch a new party

with six months to go for elections in Rajasthan. But the Congress leader maintained an intriguing silence on the issue, keeping everyone guessing about his next



step. The Congress party has sought to allay the rumours of a new party being launched, stating that they will fight the elections unitedly. Asked about the developments in Rajasthan, Congress spokesperson Supriya Shrinate said, "Our party president, and we surely feel there will be a positive solution to this issue." Congress General Secretary (Organization) KC Venugopal also dismissed rumours that Mr Pilot may announce his own party and asserted that the Congress will contest Rajasthan's assembly polls unitedly.

28 killed, 140 injured as heavy rains lash Pakistan

At least 28 people were killed and over 100 injured after heavy rains and thunderstorms hit several parts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Punjab on Saturday, media reports said.

As per the provincial disaster management authority, 25 people were killed in rain-related incidents in KP's Bannu, Dera Ismail Khan, Karak and Lakki Marwat while 145 were injured.

It added that at least 69 houses were partially damaged by the rain.

As per PDMA's breakdown, 15 people died and 100 were injured in Bannu. It also added that 68 houses were partially damaged in the area.

were killed, and 42 others were wounded in the Lakki Marwat district, Geo news reports.

Some Indian students in Canada receive stay orders on deportation notices

In major relief, some Indian students in Canada who had been served deportation orders over fake admission letters have recently received stay orders on their deportation notices, sources said today.

This has come following consistent efforts by India which has been taking up the matter with Canadian authorities—both in Canada and in New Delhi.

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar also took up with matter with his Canadian counterpart. Secretary (East), MEA also raised it during his visit to Canada in April this year. The Indian Consulate in Toronto, where

most of the students are based, has also met many of the Indian students.

India repeatedly urged Canadian authorities to be fair and take a humanitarian approach since the students were not at fault, the source said.

India also pointed out that there were gaps in the Canadian system and a lack of diligence, owing to which the students were granted visas and also allowed to enter Canada.

Since then, Canadian parliamentarians across political parties have spoken in support of the students. Their Immigration Minister Sean Fraser indicated that Canada is actively pursuing a solution for international students who are facing uncertainty. Canadian PM Justin Trudeau has acknowledged the need for fair treat-

ment of the students.

"It is welcome that the consistent efforts by the Government of India has been instrumental in the Canadian Government adopting a humane approach and taking on board the perspective of the students," the sources said, following the stay on deportation orders.

Some Indian students in Canada had been threatened with deportation for allegedly submitting fraudulent admission letters. The actual number is much less than the 700 being reported in the media, the sources added.

Most of these students had gone to Canada during 2017-2019. After completing their studies, some of them obtained work permits, while others

continue to study in Canada.

Earlier, this week, EAM during a special media briefing had said that the Indian government is in talks with the Canadian authorities over the issue.

"For some time now there is this case of students who the Canadians say did not study in the college they should have and when they applied for work permit they got into difficulties.

"India has taken up their case, the MEA, Indian High Commission and consulates; Our point is that the students studied in good faith and if there were people who misled them then the culpable parties should be acted against. It is unfair to punish students who undertook their education in good faith."

God goggles

Apple has produced a stand-alone, augmented reality headset, the Vision Pro, that it sees as the future of computing. Given how central Apple has been to the computing experience, from the desktop to the smartphone, we should take this large claim seriously. The headset looks like a giant pair of ski goggles. Everything a user sees while wearing it is processed by internal and external cameras. The Vision Pro's operating system 'places' apps in the user's field of view. The user can select apps by simply looking at them because the device tracks eye movements. He can then 'click' to launch them by pinching his fingers because the Vision Pro's external cameras track hand movements.

So, like Robert Downey Jr. in Iron Man, you can wave virtual windows into view via gestures, conduct full motion video FaceTime conversations, watch immersive 3D movies, dictate columns, shoot 3D video, play games, basically do most things you need an iPhone or a Mac to do, without monitors, keyboards, or trackpads. The Vision Pro enables computing without hardware in any space that you happen to occupy, which is why Apple wants you to believe that the Vision Pro inaugurates a new era of 'spatial computing'.

Will it fly? Reviewers' reservations about its price point (it costs \$3,500), its battery life (two hours), its bulk and weight, can be ignored. Apple will iterate cheaper, sleeker, lighter versions with better battery life. If the gesture-based OS system works, if the video quality is as hi-res as real life, if you can fine-tune your awareness of the real world so you're not a menace to people around you — and all the reviewers say that the Vision Pro ticks those boxes — people will give this gadget a whirl.

The real question isn't technological, it's social and psychological. Will the strangeness of spending hours of your life in these goggles looking like a dorky diver on dry land, the weirdness of viewing your immediate world through digital camera arrays instead of your own eyes, the unsociability of being ostentatiously distracted in the company of others, limit widespread adoption?

No, no and no. People who walk around wearing massive noise cancelling devices bolted on to their skulls like head handles are unlikely to balk at Apple's goggles. The large male constituency for branded headphones is more likely to revel in the cyborg coolness of it all. Noise cancelling headphones are, in fact, the lineal ancestors of Apple's Vision Pro. These headphones announce to the world that the wearer is in an aural world of his own. Not only is he listening to sounds that people in his vicinity can't hear but he is also wearing a device that's specifically designed to exclude the soundscape he inhabits.

Pakistan set to face burden of PKR 7.3 trillion in next fiscal year

Pakistan is set to face a burden of Pakistani Rupees (PKR) 7.3 trillion in the next fiscal year, as interest payments on domestic and foreign debt continue to increase, The Express Tribune reported.

Initially, the Pakistani government had budgeted PKR 3.9 trillion to cover markup on loans for the ongoing fiscal year 2022-23. However, revised estimates have revealed that the spending on interest payments rose to PKR 5.52 trillion.

The budget had allocated PKR 3.43 trillion for interest payments on domestic debt. However, the revised figures have shown that the actual amount reached PKR 4.7 trillion. Meanwhile, the Pakistan government had initially intended to spend PKR 510.9 billion on interest payments for foreign debt. However, the figure rose to PKR 7725.3 billion.

According to economists, the increasing debt servicing costs will place more pressure on Pakistan's foreign currency reserves. The interest payments for the fiscal year 2023-24 are projected to reach PKR 7.3 trillion, with PKR 6.43 trillion allocated for domestic debt and PKR 872.25 billion for foreign debt. The Pakistan government anticipates external



loans of PKR 6.8 trillion for the next fiscal year. Of this, PKR 52.4 billion is projected to be raised from project loans and PKR 771.3 billion is expected through programme loans, The Express Tribune reported.

During the ongoing financial year, Pakistan had expected to receive 5.5 trillion in external loans. However, revised estimates hint at a lower inflow of PKR 3.2 trillion. Although the Pakistani government had initially projected project loans of PKR 266.5 billion and programme loans of PKR 1.2 trillion for the ongoing financial year. However, the revised figures

show revised expectations of PKR 400.2 billion for project loans and PKR 856.4 billion for programme loans.

As per the news report, IMF loans for budgetary support were evaluated at PKR 558 billion for the fiscal year 2022-23. However, the revised estimates show Pakistani government now expects to receive PKR 172.4 billion. Pakistan has expressed hope of receiving PKR 696 billion in IMF loans for the next financial year, according to The Express Tribune report.

Study shows why sexually harassed people may not come forward immediately

According to a new study, there is a gap between how individuals anticipate they would react if sexually harassed and how those who have experienced it respond.

The study by the University of Exeter, funded by the Economic and Social Research Council and published in *Psychology of Women Quarterly*, discovered that seeking justice by coming forward is just one of the needs people who experience harassment">sexual harassment reported a range of needs and engaged in a variety of actions to meet these needs. Needs for safety, personal control and social support were prioritised over formal actions, such as reporting to police. Those who had not encountered harassment">sexual harassment anticipated having stronger needs and taking more actions--especially formal ones.

Senior author, Professor Manuela Barreto, from the University of Exeter said, "We found there is a widely held belief that quick and formal reporting

People who have experienced harassment">sexual harassment reported a range of needs and engaged in a variety of actions to meet these needs. India vulnerable to climate change due to heavy population



United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) Executive Director Erik Solheim has said that India is particularly vulnerable to climate change because of its heavy population.

"You see the effects of climate change everywhere in the world. But of course, India is particularly vulnerable to climate change because it has a heavy population and the kind of nature of India makes it more vulnerable than most other places," Solheim said during Y20 talk on climate action.

Youth 20 (Y20) is an official consultation forum for youth from all G20 member countries to be able to dialogue with each other.

The UNEP Executive Director said that India is facing the same environmental issues as the planet at large.

"There is massive pollution, in particular in northern Indian cities like Delhi that are very polluted. India is facing climate

change and is more vulnerable to climate change than the United States. America and India have been facing the loss of nature, destruction of forest, wiping out of a number of animals," he said.

Solheim said the world has "been much warmer than normal for this time of the year, and that's affecting everyone. But if you take a more global perspective, also, you had the huge flooding last year in Pakistan and huge wildfires in America and Europe. Southern Europe was on fire last summer. China had massive flooding the year before last, and last year they had a drought."

He said that China has gone for 100 per cent electrification, and the need for the globe to go for electric systems to save the environment. "China is the world leader in electric cars. It's the world leader in solar and wind energy, and there is no doubt about that 25 per cent of one out of every four cars sold in China last year was electric.

Untimely Leave

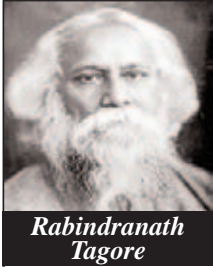
No more noisy, loud words from me---such is my master's will. Henceforth I deal in whispers.

Cause and cure for common type of high blood pressure

Researchers discovered a gene mutation that causes a common type of hypertension (high blood pressure) and a treatment for it.

This study was published in the journal, 'Nature Genetics.'

A little benign nodule, occurring in one out of every twenty persons with hypertension, is the cause. The nodule generates aldosterone, a hormone that regulates how much salt is in the body. The latest finding is a gene mutation in some of these nodules that causes a massive, although intermittent, overproduction of the



hormone.

The gene mutation found causes various issues, making it difficult for clinicians to diagnose some hypertensive patients. To begin, the

variation disrupts a protein called CADM1, which prevents cells in the body from 'talking' to one another and signalling that it is time to cease producing aldosterone.

Doctors are particularly concerned about the variable release of aldosterone throughout the day, which produces salt overload and hypertension at its peak. This varia-

tion explains why people with the gene mutation can go undetected until they receive blood testing at different times of the day. The researchers also discovered that this form of hypertension could be cured by unilateral adrenalectomy - removing one of the two adrenal glands. Following removal, previously severe hypertension despite treatment with multiple drugs disappeared, with no treatment required through many subsequent years of observation.

Fewer than 1% of people with hypertension caused by aldosterone are identified because aldosterone is not rou-

tinely measured as a possible cause. The researchers are recommending that aldosterone is measured through a 24-hour urine test rather than one-off blood measurements, which will discover more people living with hypertension but going undiagnosed.

The initial patient in this study was detected when doctors noticed a fluctuation in his hormone levels during his participation in a clinical trial of treatments for difficult hypertension.

In most people with hypertension, the cause is unknown, and the condition requires life-long treatment with drugs. Previous research

by the group at Queen Mary discovered that in 5-10% of people with hypertension, the cause is a gene mutation in the adrenal glands, which results in excessive amounts of aldosterone being produced. Aldosterone causes salt to be retained in the body, driving up blood pressure. Patients with excessive aldosterone levels in the blood are resistant to treatment with the commonly used drugs for hypertension and are at increased risk of heart attacks and strokes.

Professor Morris Brown, co-senior author of the study and Professor of Endocrine Hypertension at Queen Mary

University of London, said, "On the 900th anniversary of Barts Hospital, this story illustrates benefits from the virtuous circle of Science and Medicine.

Most patients consent to our undertaking non-routine molecular analyses of their surgical samples, from which we discover how their hypertension was caused, and how to cure it in future patients. Because the aldosterone nodules in this study were so small, we are now investigating whether momentary cauterisation of the nodule is an alternative to surgical removal of the whole adrenal gland."

KARNAL JUNE 11: If your Aadhaar has been more than 10 years, then get it updated, otherwise your Aadhaar will be suspended. For this some documents have to be uploaded. It's an easy process and it's free to upload documents online until June 14. After this, a fee of Rs 25 will be charged for this work, which will be taken for scanning and printed. If you want to get Aadhaar updated by visiting the center, you can also get it updated for a fee of Rs.50. Additional Deputy Commissioner Dr. Vaishali Sharma called upon the people to update their Aadhaar card, which is necessary and it is useful in many places. A special campaign has been launched for this in the district. He told that in Aadhaar updation, one can upload any one of the documents like proof of identity such as voter card, PAN card, driving license and matriculation mark sheet. Whereas in proof of address one of the documents like passport, voter card, domicile and caste certificate will have to be uploaded. ADC told that it has many advantages. Citizens or Aadhaar card holders can take advantage of this in many ways. One can get ration from anywhere in the country under One Nation-One Ration. Getting a SIM card and opening bank accounts is easy.

Govt to strengthen cooperative banks with all possible assistance: CM



DINESHAGARWAL SHIMLA: During the SPARK-2023 event organized by the Himachal Pradesh State Co-operative Bank Ltd (HPSCB), Chief Minister, Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu unveiled the bank's new logo, besides the launch of the internet banking facility, Academy for Agriculture Entrepreneurship Development for Growth and Empowerment (Aagri EDGE) and a new website. The Chief Minister also released the bank's vision document during the event. He also presented prizes to the best performing branch offices of the bank.

Emphasizing the need for the HPSCB to be prepared for future

challenges, the Chief Minister said that the state government would strengthen the cooperative banks by providing all possible assistance. He said that banks should be equipped with digital technology and provide facilities to customers utilizing modern technology. He said that reforms will be implemented within six months to enhance the functioning of cooperative banks and assured that permissions under Section-118 of the Himachal Pradesh Tenancy & Land Reforms Act 1972 will be given on priority to co-operative banks for land purchase.

Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said that the first budget of the present

government symbolizes the system revamp, in which efforts have been made to strengthen the rural economy. He said that the HPSCB should ensure its active participation in the implementation of these initiatives. The state government is formulating a scheme to provide loans up to Rs. 20 lakh at the rate of one percent interest to poor students for higher education, so that no one is deprived of education due to a lack of resources. Along with this, taxi operators are going to be issued permits to run e-taxi in the coming time. The state government will provide a 50 percent subsidy on the purchase of e-taxi, e-bus and e-

truck. The state government will provide 40 percent financial assistance to set up solar power projects ranging from 250 kW to 2 MW and the electricity generated would be purchased by the Himachal Pradesh Electricity Board Ltd. He said that cooperative banks should liberally provide loans in these schemes, whose sovereign guarantee would be provided by the state government. He said that the state government would make the cooperative bank a prime bank for the scheme of setting up solar energy projects.

The Chief Minister said that Himachal Pradesh would fight strongly for its due rights. He said that 12,000 MW of power was being produced in the State but Himachal Pradesh was getting only 12 percent of power as state share, which was unfair to the people of the State. The issue of enhancing royalty in hydropower projects, which have completed the payback period, has been taken up with the Union Government. Along with this, Himachal should get back hydropower projects made by Central Public Sector Undertakings after a certain period.

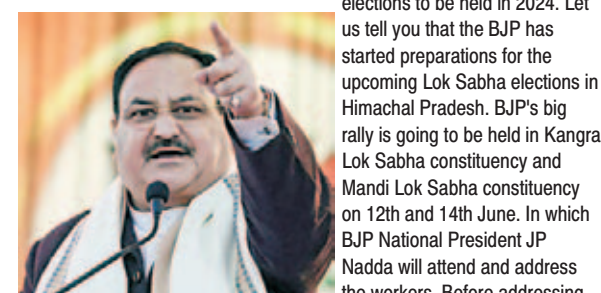

Mustard is being procured at Rs. 5,800 per quintal in state Mandis

As soon as the Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal, announced relief to the sunflower farmers by announcing interim procurement price by Rs. 1000 per quintal under Bhavantar Bharpayee Yojana, a sudden influx of sunflowers in large quantities was witnessed at the Shahbad grain market of Kurukshetra District, Haryana.

While this announcement has given great relief to the farmers by bridging the gap of minimum support price (MSP) on one hand, on the other hand it has also exposed the tall claims of the Punjab government being farmer friendly.

It is worth mentioning that Kurukshetra district of Haryana has the highest production of sunflower and its main procurement centre is Shahbad Mandi. Apart from this, sunflower purchase centres have also been set up in eight mandis of Ambala, Yamu-

nanagar, Karnal and Panchkula districts.

With the efforts of the Chief Minister, Hafed has started procurement of sunflower crops for the first time and has announced to remain till the procurement process is completed in the mandis.

However, the MSP of sunflower for the year 2023-24 has been declared by the central government. But due to fewer buyers in the market, the Haryana government has decided to ensure procurement through Hafed, so that the farmers can get a fair price for their crop. Due to strenuous efforts of the Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal, government procurement of sunflower has been made successful over the past five years. When sunflower arrived in mandis in 2017, the chief minister said that the government would purchase 20% of the overall crop. By the next year, that percentage had climbed to 50%, and by the following year, it had reached 100%. Hafed has

procured Sunflower at the rate of Rs. 4,850 per quintal in Shahbad Anaj Mandi yesterday and with the Chief Minister's announcement of interim relief of Rs. 1000 per quintal under the Bhavantar Bharpayee Yojana, now the purchase of sunflower in Haryana has increased to Rs. 5,800 per quintal. While the market price is much less than this, at present sunflower is being purchased in the mandis of Punjab between Rs. 4,000 and Rs. 4,200, in which sunflower farmer Hardev Singh resident of Patiala district village Bhatiras, Mangat Singh resident Nabha Sahib, Gurdeep Singh resident Bahlolpur, Hanish Kumar resident Banur, Gurlal Singh resident Nandgarh and Baljit Singh resident Gardingarh. However, due to the announcement of relief of Rs. 1000 per quintal transfer rate compensation on the purchase of sunflower, the Chief Minister had expressed apprehension that farmers of other states may also turn to Haryana to sell their crops.
