Kejriwal takes dig at Central govt for 'ruining every field'

NEW DELHI: In an apparent dig at the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led dispensation, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Sunday alleged it was "ruining every field" and did not know how to run a government. Without taking names, the Aam Aadmi Party chief also used the term "illiterate government" as he made a veiled attack on the Modi-led central dispensation on the condition of the Railways. Taking to Twitter, Kejriwal wrote, "They destroyed the fleet of the well-running railways." "Today, even if you take an AC coach reservation, you will not get a seat to sit or sleep. AC and sleeper coaches are worse than general. They do not know how to run the government. They don't understand at all. Illiterate government, ruining every field," Kejriwal said on his Twitter handle.

Gandhi Peace Prize 2021 to be conferred on Gita Press

NEW DELHI: The Gandhi Peace Prize for 2021 will be conferred on Gita Press, Gorakhpur, in recognition of its "outstanding contribution towards social, economic and political transformation through non-violent and other Gandhian methods", according to an official statement. The jury headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi unanimously decided to select Gita Press, Gorakhpur as the recipient of the Gandhi Peace Prize, said the statement issued by the Ministry of Culture. Prime Minister Modi recalled the contribution of Gita Press in promoting the Gandhian ideals of peace and social harmony. He observed that the conferment of the Gandhi Peace Prize on Gita Press, on completion of hundred years of its establishment, is a recognition of the work done by the institution in community service, the statement said.

Mumbai : Shishir Shinde resigns from party

MUMBAI: Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray (UBT) received a major jolt on Sunday when party deputy leader Shishir Shinde submitted his resignation letter to the party chief Uddhav Thackeray. Without making any public accusations through this letter, 'I' Jai Maharashtra' to you, Shinde stated. In his letter, Shinde mentioned his detailed resignation. He regretted that he was not getting an opportunity to work in the party. Shinde was not given any responsibility for four years, and then he was given an ornamental post, so four years of his life were wasted. He has also said Shiv Sena has not been discredited due to any of his actions. After Raj Thackeray left Shiv Sena, Shinde supported him and left Shiv Sena. Then on June 19, 2018, Shinde rejoined the Shiv Sena. But after returning home, he had to wait for four years for political rehabilitation in the party. After Eknath Shinde's rebellion, Shinde became the Deputy Leader of Shiv Sena. He was elected MLA from Bhandup Assembly Constituency in 2009.

Emergency was a 'dark period' for India's history: PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said that the 1975 Emergency, imposed by the then Indira Gandhi-led Central government was a "dark period" in Indian history adding that millions opposed it with all their might.

"India is the mother of democracy. We consider our democratic ideals as paramount, we consider our Constitution as Supreme... therefore, we can never forget June the 25th. This is the very day when Emergency was

imposed on our country. It was a dark period in the history of India. Lakhs of people opposed the emergency with full might. Many books have been written on these atrocities; the punishment meted out by the police and administration. The supporters of democracy were tortured so much during that time that even today, their mind shudders," PM Modi said during the 102nd episode of his monthly radio address 'Mann Ki Baat'.

"Today when we are celebrating the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav we must also have a



glance at such crimes which endanger the freedom of the country. This will make it easier for today's young generation to understand the meaning and significance of democracy," PM

Modi added. PM Modi also elaborated on the upcoming Rath Yatra in Odisha.

"June 20 is the day of the historic Rath Yatra. Rath Yatra has a unique identity all over the world. Lord Jagannath's Rath Yatra is taken out with great pomp in different states of the country," PM Modi said.

"The Rath Yatra in Puri, Odisha is wonderful in itself. When I was in Gujarat, I used to get the opportunity to attend the huge Rath Yatra in Ahmedabad," he added.

Lauding a Kerala native for

using a Japanese technique 'Miyawaki' in the farming process, PM Modi said, "Japan's technique, Miyawaki is a very good way to make an area green if the soil is not fertile. This technique is slowly and gradually seen in India also,"

"Teacher Raafi Ramnath from Kerala used this technique to create a mini forest called 'Vidyavanam' with over 115 varieties. Many students and people visit this Miyawaki forest. This technique is getting popular in the world and is being used in many countries. I appeal to all the people of the nation especially one

who are living in the urban areas, to use this technique and learn more about this," the Prime Minister further remarked.

Highlighting the development of the dairy sector in Jammu and Kashmir, PM Modi said, "The people of Baramulla district of Jammu and Kashmir have done a wonderful job. Farming has been done in Baramulla for a long time, but there used to be a shortage of milk. The people of Baramulla took this challenge as an opportunity. A large number of people started dairy work here, PM Modi said.

BJP govt ended 3D system in Haryana: HM

Union Home Minister Amit Shah has started the 2024 Lok Sabha election campaign in Haryana. Shah, who reached Sirsa on Sunday, lashed out at Congress and former CM Bhupinder Hooda. Shah said- "The Congress ran the 3D government in Haryana. First D Darbari, second D Damad (Delhi people) and third D Dealer. After the arrival of CM Manohar Lal, all three D's ended. Manohar Lal developed entire Haryana. During this, Shah also praised the players of Haryana. Shah said- "Haryana is the land of players. If the country gets a medal then every third player is from Haryana. I asked the CM to do something for the strong players and he did. Shah appealed to make Narendra Modi the Prime Minister of the country for the third time by winning all the 10 Lok Sabha seats from Haryana next year as well. In Gurdaspur Amit Shah said



Punjab's law and order is going from bad to worse but Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann has no time to spare for it and his only job seems to take the state aircraft for Arvind Kejriwal's nationwide tours.

"Sometimes I wonder whether he is a chief minister or a pilot.... Kejriwal's countrywide tour is conducted by the Punjab chief minister," Shah said, launching a scathing attack on the Aam Aadmi

Party (AAP) dispensation in Punjab. The government here has no concerns for problems of Punjab, he said, adding that "the chief minister is touring the entire country. One can understand if he does so on his own, but as Kejriwal's pilot?" Addressing a rally in this border district of Punjab as part of the BJP's outreach campaign to mark the completion of nine years of the Narendra Modi government, Shah said, "In my entire life, I have not seen a government like the one led by AAP, which makes hollow promises." Attacking Mann, he said, "The chief minister has only one job. If Kejriwal has to go to Chennai, then he goes to Delhi in the aircraft to take him to Chennai. If he (Kejriwal) has to go to Kolkata, then again he (Mann) takes the aircraft and take him to Kolkata." "His entire time is consumed by Kejriwal's tours and as a result of this, Punjab's law and order is going from bad to worse," he said, adding people are not safe here.

Babita Phogat attacks Sakshi Malik, calls her "Congress puppet"

Olympian wrestler and BJP leader Babita Phogat issued a statement on her Twitter handle on Wrestler Sakshi Malik's video, posted on Saturday, calling her a "Congress puppet". In the video posted yesterday, Sakshi Malik and her husband wrestler Satyawart Kadian thanked Babita Phogat for supporting the wrestlers' protest and working as a mediator between protesting wrestlers and the central government. In a tweet, Babita Phogat refuted the claims made by Sakshi Malik and her husband. "Yesterday I felt very sad and laughed too when I was watching the video of my little sister (Sakshi Malik) and her husband, first of all I want to make it clear that the permission paper which was shown by her, I have nothing to do with it and neither it has my signature," Babita Phogat wrote in her tweet. "I have been saying from day one that have faith in the Prime Minister and the judicial



system of the country, the truth will definitely come out. As a female player, I was always with all the players of the country and will be, but I was against the protest from the beginning. I had told all the wrestlers that you should meet Prime Minister or the Union Home Minister, and the solution will come from there only," Babita said. She also alleged that Congress leaders are using the emotions of protesting wrestlers for political benefits. Babita also attacked Sakshi and called her a "Congress puppet". "But you found your solution in @DeependerShooda @INCIndia and @priyankagandhi, and others who themselves are guilty of rape and other cases, but the people of the country have now recognized the faces of the opposition.

Seven flying squad teams to ensure sale of quality seeds, fertilisers in Punjab

Punjab Agriculture and Farmers welfare department has set up seven teams of Flying Squad to ensure supply of quality seeds, fertilisers and pesticides to the farmers of the state. Disclosing this here today, Punjab Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister Mr Gurmeet Singh Khuddian informed that these teams will also visit shops, manufacturing units of seeds, fertilisers & pesticides besides carrying out regular checks and sampling for quality as well as rates at



which the goods are sold to the farmers. He further informed that the flying squad teams, headed by Joint Directors and Chief Agriculture Officers of the department, will closely monitor the sale of seeds,

pesticides and fertilisers in the interest of farmers, besides keeping a watch over the demand and supply of goods to farmers. The one team of the flying squad has been set aside for three to four districts. Urging the farmers to demand a 'bill' for each purchase from the vendor and ensure they only pay the amount mentioned on the bills, the Agriculture Minister categorically said that If the bills are not given by vendors then farmers should raise a complaint with the concerned officer and strict action will be followed.

54 people have died and around 400 hospitalised in Uttar Pradesh's Ballia District Hospital in the last three days amid soaring temperatures. Doctors have said that though there are different reasons for the deaths, severe heat could be a factor. Hospitalisations are rising because of severe heat, they said. A severe heatwave has swept UP, with most places seeing temperatures north of 40 degrees. The sudden increase in deaths and patients being admitted to hospitals with fever, breathing trouble, and



other issues have overwhelmed the hospital, which has put its staff on alert. 23 patients died on June 15, 20 the next day, and 11 yesterday, SK Yadav, in-charge Medical Superintendent, District Hospital Ballia, said. Dr BP Tiwari, Additional Health

Director, Azamgarh Circle, has said a team is coming from Lucknow to investigate if there's some disease which is not being detected. When it is too hot or cold, respiratory patients, diabetes patients, and blood pressure patients are at increased risk. The mercury

rising a little may have led to their deaths, Dr Tiwari speculated. There's such a rush at the district hospital that patients are unable to get stretchers, and many attendants are carrying their patients to the emergency ward on their shoulders. The Additional Health Director has, however, claimed that it gets difficult if ten patients turn up at the same time, but they do have stretchers. UP Health Minister Brajesh Pathak has said the government has taken serious cognisance of the incident in Ballia, and he is personally monitoring the situation there.

14 killed, 20 injured in passenger bus crash in Pak

At least 14 people were killed and over 20 others injured when a passenger bus turned turtle in Chakwal district of Pakistan's eastern Punjab province, police officers said. The accident took place on the motorway near Kallar Kahar area of the district on Saturday, when the driver of the bus lost control of the vehicle due to brake failure, leading to the tragic crash, Deputy Inspector General of National Highways and Motorway Police Muhammad Yusuf Malik told Xinhua news. At least five women and three children are among the people who have lost their lives in the accident, the officer said, adding that the bus was on its way to Lahore, the provincial



capital of Punjab, from the federal capital Islamabad when it met the accident. Upon receiving the information, police and rescue workers reached the site and shifted the injured to a nearby hospital, where several passengers were said to be in critical condition.

Police arrest four accused involved
in Moga jeweller's killing

The drive against anti-social elements launched on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann got a major breakthrough after Punjab Police's Anti-Gangster Task Force (AGTF) and Moga Police in an operation supported by Bihar Police and Central agencies cracked the Moga Jeweller's Killing case after arresting three accused persons from Patna in Bihar and one from Nanded in Maharashtra, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Sunday.

As per the information, five unknown persons had shot dead a jeweller shop owner Parminder Singh and looted gold ornaments from his shop 'Asia Jewellers' at gunpoint in Moga on June 12, 2023. Assaults had also snatched and took away the licensed revolver of the deceased Parminder Singh before fleeing from the spot. DGP Gaurav Yadav said that three accused persons identified as



Rajwinder Singh alias Manga alias Raju of Moga, Rajvir Singh alias Avinash Singh of Bihar and Varun Jazzi alias Vanu of Jalandhar have been arrested from Patna in Bihar, while, the fourth accused identified as Gurpreet Singh alias Gopi of Amritsar has been arrested from district Nanded in Maharashtra. The Police teams have also recovered the two pistols—including one .315 bore (country-

made) and one .32 bore along with live cartridges—used by the criminals to commit the crime, he said, while adding that the licensed .32 bore revolver belonging to the deceased Parminder Singh has also been recovered from the possession of accused persons. The DGP said that preliminary investigations have revealed that all the accused persons are history-sheeters and criminal cases pertaining

Saving the precious natural resource water under the ground is the biggest challenge today because if we are not conscious about saving the ground groundwater now, it will be difficult to get drinking water for future generations.

That is why the Punjab government is making farmers aware of direct the sowing of paddy. The government is also giving subseedy/incentive amount of Rs.1500/- per acre to the farmers who do direct sowing of paddy. Expressing this, Chief Agriculture Officer Dr. Kulwinder Singh said that for the subsidy/incentive amount given by the government, it is the farmers



must register departmental portal before June 25. He said that the subsidy/incentive amount due will be deposited through the online system in the bank accounts of farmers doing direct sowing of paddy.

The Chief Agriculture Officer said that many farmers in the district have adopted the technique of direct sowing and these farmers play an important role in conserving groundwater. He said that two such farmers

are progressive farmers Singh and Harinder Singh of Amarala village in Khamanon block who are farming successfully by direct sowing of paddy. According to these farmers, they have got more yields by direct sowing of paddy. The progressive farmers also said that earlier they were facing the problem of stunted plants, but with the direct sowing technology of paddy, this problem has been solved.

TB, Jaundice, AIDS, RTI/STI in patients
of de-addiction centers, will be investi-
gated: Dr. Davinderjit Kaur

FATEHGARH SAHIB (AJAY MALHOTRA): According to the directions of Health and Family Welfare Minister Dr. Balbir Singh & under the leadership of Civil Surgeon Fatehgarh Sahib, Dr. Davinderjit Kaur. the campaign started by setting up a medical checkup camp at the drug disposal center of the district hospital. Giving information on this occasion, Civil Surgeon Dr. Davinderjit Kaur said that this campaign is being conducted till July 14, under which all the rehabilitation centers, de-addiction centers, Ot clinics under treatment of TB, Viral Hepatitis (PLA), AIDS, R. TI/STI (Integrated Genital Diseases) will be examined and treatment will be started. She said that the risk of these diseases is higher in people with drug addiction, especially injectable drug users who take drugs with a syringe. The risk of contracting HIV/AIDS and hepatitis is high and they spread the disease further due to ignorance. Due to drugs, the body's ability to fight diseases decreases, due to which TB is affected by such diseases.

Acute Diarrhoeal Disease Outbreak in Village Dheere-majra of Lalru is under control as no fresh case has been reported since Saturday afternoon said, DC Ashika Jain on Sunday at Mohali after reviewing the situation with the different departments pushed to contain the disease.

She said that a total of 65 cases were reported on the last three days besides deaths of two infants (one is of three Months and another of one and half year) which are the part of medical investigation whether both the deaths were because of diarrheal disease. dergoing indoor treatment at Dera Bassi Hospital. She added, "we are closely monitoring the situation and medical teams have been put on task to avert any further aboutbreake of the disease". She further said that the report of water source (Tube-well) has been tested and chemical composition found

correct while of consumers' still awaited, but as a precaution the drinking water is being supplied through two tankers. Even the water supply pipeline has also been checked out and no leakage found. Besides, some of the consumers who have been suspected of leakage in their private connections have

been disconnected. Sub Divisional Magistrate, Himanshu Gupta while briefing about the preventive measures, said that medical teams had completed three rounds of house to house survey of total 186 houses. Similarly, medical camp is being organised from the last three days in the village.

ORS is being distributed and medical education and awareness is being imparted to the people. The situation is under Surveillance and no new case has been reported since 1 pm, yesterday. The Deputy Commissioner appealed to the residents to intake boiled and cooled water for the prevention and immediately consult the doctor in case of symptoms of loose motion and vomiting.

Former Congress MP Rahul Gandhi took a swipe at the central government on Sunday asking if this is the 'Amrit Kal' as portrayed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, why are jobs decreasing in India.

"If this is really 'Amrit Kaal' then why are jobs disappearing like this? The country is grappling with record unemployment under this government. The hopes of lakhs of youth are being crushed for the benefit of a few capitalist friends," a rough translation of Rahul Gandhi's tweet in English read. The former Congress MP highlighted in his tweet that the central government is neglecting the Public Sector units (PSUs). He supported his argument with the help of extensive data on the loss of employment in PSUs.

"PSUs used to be the pride of



India and used to be the dream choice of employment for every youth. But, today these are not the priority of the government. Employment in PSUs has come down from 16.9 lakh in 2014 to only 14.6 lakh in 2022. Do jobs decrease in a progressive country?" he wrote.

year, eliminated more than 2 lakh jobs. Make tech giants pay

At a time when revenues for media organisations — both print and digital — have been dwindling rapidly, a compelling moral argument is gaining currency across the world that the technology giants must be made to pay for using the news content on their platforms and to share advertising revenues with the local publishers. The explosion of global digital platforms like Google, Facebook and Microsoft, with their all-pervading impact on our lives, has created an uneven playing field as they piggyback on the content originally created by newsrooms without compensating them.

The new draft legislation that seeks to make Big Tech pay news publishers for the content they funnel into their platforms is a welcome development. A fair split of revenue among the creators of news content and aggregators has already been initiated in several countries. In Australia, Facebook and Google are required to negotiate a fee with media organisations to host their content. Last year, the law brought \$140 million in fresh revenue to the Australian news industry, providing much-needed resources to invest in quality journalism and credible content.

The draft Digital India Bill, which will be released for public consultations later this month, imparts negotiating leverage to news publishers as it addresses the imbalance of dynamics between content creation and its monetisation. Advertising is the main source of revenue for the news industry. But, over the years, publishers have seen their share shrink in the digital space as social media companies are gaining a much larger chunk without creating any original content.

News publishers around the world believe that Facebook and Google benefit from the news that appears on their feeds as it draws several users to the platforms.

There is no denying that both the tech giants and publishers need each other. However, the reality is that the tech giants end up grabbing the largest chunk of revenue. It is unfair that big digital platforms like Google and Meta get to host and share local news for free. It costs to produce the news and it's only fair that they pay. The rise of digital advertising has resulted in a new ecosystem that redirects ad revenue to tech companies. While social media platforms get clicks, engagement and even revenue from the content that is published by media organisations, news organisations, especially the smaller and medium ones, suffer as more advertising goes online. Nearly 85 crore people in India are connected to the internet. By 2025, the number is expected to grow to 120 crore.

The draft Bill seeks to address the issues of online safety such as child sexual abuse material, incitement to religious hatred, patent violation and misinformation on social media platforms. The legislation will give the government legal teeth to hold platforms accountable for hosting such content. Also on the agenda is the regulation of artificial intelligence.

NATO creates new centre, focuses on underwater assets

The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) have created a new centre that will be focused on protecting undersea pipelines and data cables since

will be responsible for designing a new surveillance system to monitor parts of the Atlantic and areas in the North Sea, the Baltic Sea, the Mediterranean Sea and the Black Sea, according to Al Jazeera.

NATO's Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg said during a meeting in Brussels that the defence ministers of NATO members have approved plans for a NATO "maritime centre for the security of the critical underwater infrastructure."

Al Jazeera English is an international 24-hour English-

language news channel owned by the Al Jazeera Media Network, owned by the government of Qatar. It is the first English-language news channel to be headquartered in Western Asia.

The initiative to protect the West's critical underwater infrastructure came in the wake of a reaction to the alleged acts of sabotage against the Nord Stream 1 and Nord Stream 2 natural gas pipelines in September, as per Al Jazeera.

Last year, in September, Danish and Swedish officials said leaks have

been identified in Nord Stream 1 and Nord Stream 2 under the Baltic Sea off the coast of Denmark's Bornholm island.

The former German three-star general Hans-Werner Wiermann said that "the threat is developing". He explained that NATO was motivated to act following information that Russian ships had mapped critical infrastructure in the NATO alliance area.

He further told reporters at NATO headquarters, "Russian ships have actively mapped our critical undersea

infrastructure. There are heightened concerns that Russia may target undersea cables and other critical infrastructure in an effort to disrupt Western life."

The former German general added that the new NATO centre would bring NATO members, allies and the private sector together to help "improve information-sharing about evolving risks and threats", reported Al Jazeera.

Around 8,000 km (5,000b miles) of oil and gas pipelines crisscross the North Sea alone, and the underwater data systems, networks and grids are impossible to monitor constantly. After chairing the meeting, Stoltenberg told reporters, "There's no way that we can have NATO presence along also these thousands of kilometres of undersea infrastructure."

"But we can be better at collecting ... intelligence, sharing information, connecting the dots, because, also in the private sector, there is a lot of information" about ship movements and maritime surveillance," he said.

The new centre and NATO allies will focus on high-risk areas such as pipelines in shallow waters that are accessible by drivers. Moreover, potential damage to data cables can be alleviated easily by simply dropping in more cables, according to Al Jazeera.

long-term disability, and worker's compensation compared to employees with normal weight," said Clare J. Lee, M.D., of Eli Lilly & Company in Indianapolis, Ind.

Co-author Shraddha Shinde M.B.A, also of Eli Lilly & Company, added that, "Given the substantial burden of overweight and obesity on employee health and function that was demonstrated by this study, employers should focus on building tailored interventions that could be beneficial in improving the health of these individuals."

According to an industry-supported study at ENDO 2023, the Endocrine Society's annual conference in Chicago, Ill, people with obesity may be less productive at work owing to an increased risk of sickness, which would raise expenditures for companies.

Obesity is a significant public health issue affecting approximately 42% of people in the United States. Employees with overweight or obesity are more likely to develop weight-related comorbidities such as type 2 diabetes, hypertension, sleep apnea, cardiovascular disease, and cancer, which all contribute to lower work productivity.

"Employees with overweight and obesity may have a higher loss of work productivity as measured by absenteeism, short and

beneficial in improving the health of these individuals."

The researchers evaluated 719,482 employees with and without obesity in the MarketScan databases. They determined the percentage of employees with work loss, the number of hours/days lost from work, and costs associated with productivity loss were higher among people with overweight or obesity. The loss of work productivity was greater with each higher Body Mass Index (BMI) category.

The researchers found costs associated with absenteeism, short and long-term disability, and worker's compensation were \$891, \$623, \$41, and \$112 higher per year (respectively) for people with obesity compared to those with normal weight.

China devoting considerable resources to hijack international Buddhism

China is devoting considerable resources to hijacking international Buddhism and marginalize Tibetan Buddhists loyal to the Dalai Lama and other Buddhists who look at the government-controlled China Buddhist Association and see what it is, a tool of the CCP to justify repression of religious liberty, Bitter Winter reported.

Bitter Winter is an online magazine on religious liberty and human rights in China.

China has generously funded archaeological and restoration work in Buddhist sites in Pakistan.

According to Bitter Winter, China wants us to believe that Padmasambhava was born in Pakistan and that Pakistan played a central role in the early history of Buddhism. They do not insist on it because of philanthropy or their political alliance with Pakistan only.

Indian scholar Chandan Kumar in an article on June 11 explained that it is part of China's soft diplomacy to try to make inroads into international Buddhist organizations.

The country aims are to substantiate the false claim that there is freedom of religion for Buddhists in China, to downplay India as the birthplace of Buddhism promoting instead China as the main international centre of the religion, and to



promote its puppet Tibetan Buddhist leaders hoping they may really become a serious challenge to the Dalai Lama, as per Bitter Winter.

As Chandan Kumar writes, China "has gained considerable sway over the International Council of Day of Vesak (ICDV), the World Fellowship of Buddhists, and other organizations in Korea and Taiwan. This influence is evident in the

Common Text Project (CTP) undertaken by the ICDV, where Tibetan scholars have been marginalized, and Chinese texts have been given prominence over traditional Tibetan sources. In 2021, China started South China Sea Buddhism Foundation to influence Buddhist countries of the South China Sea. The first South China Sea Roundtable was organized in Shenzhen in 2021 and the second was organized in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. The aim of the roundtable is to cooperate with Buddhist temples and monasteries in the South China Sea."

Closed-loop insulin delivery systems may control blood sugar in kids with type 1 diabetes

Research presented on Saturday at ENDO 2023, the Endocrine Society's annual conference in Chicago, Ill, said closed-loop insulin administration devices enhance glucose control in kids with type 1 diabetes without having any negative consequences.

A closed-loop system consists of devices that use a continuous glucose monitor and insulin pump to automatically regulate blood sugar levels for people with diabetes. The system operates "closed-loop" because it continuously monitors and adjusts (starting and stopping) insulin delivery based on the person's blood sugar levels, without the need for manual intervention.



The first closed-loop system was approved for pediatric use in the United States in 2020. Since then, many randomized clinical trials have been performed on closed-loop systems. However, according to study researcher Amanda Godoi from Cardiff University in the United Kingdom, until now no review of studies evaluating the effect of prolonged use of closed-loop systems on glucose levels in children and adolescents with type 1 diabetes has been performed.

"Treatment of type 1 diabetes in children is a clinical challenge," Godoi said, adding, "We found using closed-loop systems led to improved glucose control, which

represents an important treatment opportunity to reduce complications and morbidity in children with type 1 diabetes."

The researchers reviewed nine studies of randomized controlled trials lasting at least 12 weeks comparing closed-loop systems to usual care in a total of 892 children with type 1 diabetes. Usual care is the delivery of insulin through multiple daily insulin injections or sensor augmented pumps, which are commonly used in treating diabetes. These are not automated and thus require the patient to monitor blood sugar levels and adjust the insulin delivery accordingly.

The children and teens using a closed-loop system had a small important 0.35% reduction in HbA1c levels--a blood test that measures average blood sugar levels over the past three months. They also had an average 9.96% increase in time in an optimal glucose range, without increasing the risk of adverse effects such as hypoglycemia (too-low blood sugar) and diabetic ketoacidosis (a serious complication of diabetes that develops when the body cannot produce enough insulin).

"Our results show that closed-loop technology seems to be safe and superior to usual care in controlling glucose levels," Godoi said.

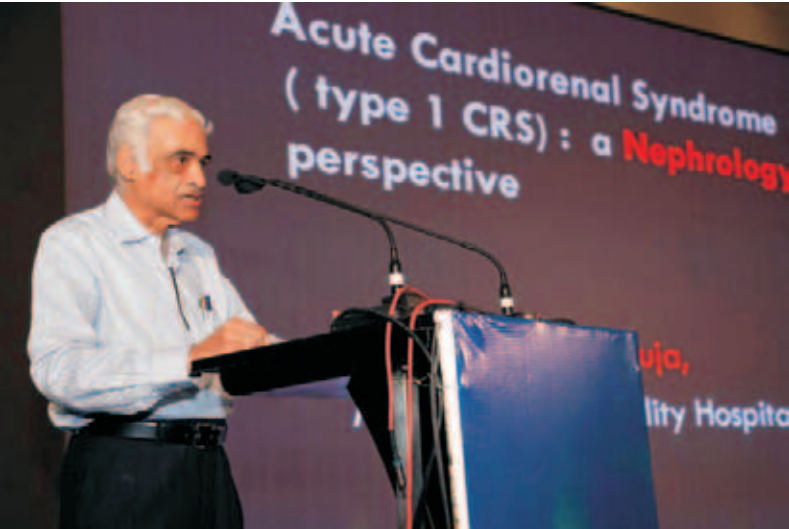

Carey slammed two back-to-back fours before veteran pacer James Anderson bowled the Australia batter for 66 runs and broke a solid more than a hundred-run partnership. Australia skipper Pat Cummins then came out to bat. It was a tough task for England players to trap centurion Khawaja, however, Ollie Robinson did the job gracefully, removing Australia opener. LONDON : On this day in 1983, legendary Indian all-rounder Kapil Dev put on a historic performance by playing a magnificent knock of 175* runs against Zimbabwe in a must-win 1983 World Cup. It was one of the most prolific knocks of Kapil Dev, however, there is no footage of that game available as BBC covered other matches in the list of fixtures, considering India's past performance in the World Cup. Team India was headed to the match against Zimbabwe after defeating West Indies in their first match, ending their eight-year-long unbeaten run in the cricketing marquee event. Momentum was on their side. But the moment the Indian team took to the field after choosing to bat first, everything went wrong for them. The top order collapsed badly, with openers Sunil Gavaskar and Kris Srikkanth scoring ducks. Mohinder Amarnath (5), Sandeep Patil (1), and Yashpal Sharma (9) also fell cheaply. Half of the side was back to the pavilion at a score of 17 and Team India was staring at a humiliating end to their inning and perhaps the match too. Then came the 'Haryana Hurricane' Kapil Dev. Unfazed by the terror unleashed by Zimbabwe bowlers, the captain avenged every wicket lost each time he swung his bat. He took the opposition to the cleaners, smashing 175* off just 138 balls with 16 fours and six sixes.

Moeen Ali fined 25 per cent of match fee for breaching ICC Code of Conduct



Birmingham : England all-rounder Moeen Ali was found guilty of breaching the ICC Code of Conduct and will be fined 25 per cent of his match fee from the ongoing opening Test of the Ashes series against Australia. "Ali was found to have breached Article 2.20 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel, which relates to displaying conduct that is contrary to the spirit of the game," International Cricket Council (ICC) said in an official statement. "In addition to this, one demerit point has been added to Ali's disciplinary record, for whom it was the first offence in a 24-month period," it read further.

The veteran all-rounder pleaded guilty to violating the ICC Code of Conduct after he applied a drying agent on his bowling hand while standing on the boundary line. He was deemed to have violated the umpires' pre-series instructions to the two sets of players about not applying anything on their hands without prior approval.

Ali applied the drying agent on his bowling hand just before coming on to bowl. The veteran English all-rounder admitted to the offence and accepted the sanctions proposed by Andy Pycroft of the ICC's Elite Panel of Match Referees, thereby not necessitating a formal hearing. Before deciding to sanction the player, the Match Referee was satisfied that Ali had used the spray only to dry his hands. The spray was not used as an artificial substance on the ball and consequently, it had not changed the condition of the ball, which would have been in breach of clause 41.3 of the ICC playing conditions -- Unfair Play -- The Match Ball -- changing its condition.

On-field umpires Ahsan Raza and Marais Erasmus, third umpire Chris Gaffaney and fourth umpire Mike Burns levelled the charge. Level 1 breaches carry a minimum penalty of an official reprimand while a maximum penalty attracts 50 per cent of a player's match fee and one or two demerit points.

Harris English's Friday 66 has him three behind and then lurking around is world No. 1 Scottie Scheffler, who sits at 5-under 135 with 2022 U.S. Amateur champion Sam Bennett.
