Ajit Pawar wins numbers game, replaces Sharad as NCP Chief

The rebel faction of the Nationalist Congress Party has ousted Sharad Pawar from the top post of the party he has founded and led for over two decades. Sources in the rebel faction said they have also mentioned this in their letter to the Election Commission, in which they have staked claim to the party name and election symbol.

As many as 35 of 53 NCP MLAs were present at the party meeting convened by Maharashtra deputy chief minister Ajit Pawar in Mumbai on Wednesday, party sources said. The number will increase further, the sources said. Fifteen of eight NCP MLAs are also attending the meeting taking place in suburban Bandra, they said.

According to former principal secretary of Maharashtra Legislature Anant Kalse, Ajit Pawar camp needs the support of at least 36 MLAs to avoid disqualification. NCP chief Sharad Pawar's supporters thronged his residence in south Mumbai on Wednesday, hours ahead of the show of strength meetings convened by him and Ajit Pawar who parted ways to become the deputy chief minister.

The Sharad Pawar and Ajit Pawar factions of the Nationalist Congress Party are holding their meetings in Yashwantrao Chavan Centre in south Mumbai and in Bhujbal Knowledge City in suburban Bandra, respectively. Outside Silver Oak, the senior Pawar's residence in south Mumbai, a party worker was seen carrying a banner which read:



'83-year-old warrior waging a fight alone'.

Supporters of Ajit Pawar also gathered outside his Devgiri official residence, also in south Mumbai, before he left to attend the

meeting at Bandra. We are hard core Dada (as Ajit Pawar is called) supporters. We have come all the way from Baramati, an NCP worker told the media outside Devgiri.

Moves EC staking claim to NCP, party symbol

NEW DELHI: Election Commission has received a petition from Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar staking claim to Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) and the party symbol, sources said. The sources said the Election Commission has also received a caveat from Jayant Patil, who is with the Sharad Pawar group. He also informed the panel that they have initiated a disqualification process against nine MLAs who joined the Eknath Shinde-BJP government in the state on Sunday. The sources said action will be taken by the poll panel as per the extant legal framework. They said ECI had received a petition under Para 15 of the Symbols Order, 1968 from Ajit Pawar on June 30, 2023 followed by 40 odd affidavits of MPs/MLAs/MLCs dated June 30 (received in Commission on July 5).

Interacting with the media persons after closing Singhawala Toll Plaza, the Chief Minister said that people had to pay a hefty amount of Rs 44.43 lakh while crossing these 10 toll plazas. However, he said that with the closing of these 10 toll plazas people will be immensely benefited and get a major re-

lief. Bhagwant Mann said that people crossing on Moga Kotakpura road had to pay Rs 4.68 lakh daily while crossing this Singhawala toll plaza but now their money will be saved.

The Chief Minister be-moaned that these toll plazas were in reality the shops for the open loot of the general public. He said that these tolls had plundered the public by flouting all the norms as per their agreement. However, Bhagwant Mann said that it is surprising that instead of taking action against them in larger public interests, the successive state governments had patronized this loot by keeping a blind eye towards their misdeeds.

1000 Lok Mitra Kendra to be opened throughout state: HP CM

The government mulls to open 1000 Lok Mitra Kendra in far-flung areas during the current fiscal to provide instant access to the internet to the people, especially residing in rural areas of the state and also with an objective to create employment opportunities for the rural youth at their doorstep.

"The government is determined to make high speed internet connectivity accessible to the users in the rural areas, especially the villages where the internet services are not yet available, through these Kendras,"



said Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu. He added that a widespread Optical Fiber Cable network will be laid across the state for providing reliable and high speed

connectivity. The government will also take up the matter with the concerned authorities to strengthen 5G services. Adequate budget provision has been made for the same by the government for the current financial year, he added.

Almost all of the government's people-centric services today are available online and with the help of existing Lok Mitra Kendras people get easy and quick access to these services. Now that the government has decided to further strengthen the network of Lok Mitra Kendra, the move will ensure efficiency in services such as registration of birth and death cer-

tificates, revenue records, bonafide certificates, driving licenses, registration on various educational institutions, filling of examination forms, online job applications etc.

This will also uphold the state government's commitment to promoting the use of effective and efficient technology for providing responsive, transparent and accountable administration. Sh. Sukhu said that the Government has also decided to upgrade the State Data Centre. This development will provide information related to any development and welfare at a click of a button, aiding in better use of such information.

Four killed, 8 injured as cab falls into gorge in Rajouri

Four passengers were killed and eight others injured when a cab they were travelling in fell into a deep gorge near Thanamnadi in Rajouri district of Jammu and Kashmir, police sources said on Wednesday.

Police said that a cab ferrying 12 passengers on the intervening night of July 4 and July 5 fell into a gorge on the Thanamnadi-Bhangai road.

The police, upon receiving the information, immediately swung into action and started the rescue operation.

"Three passengers died on the spot, while one succumbed to injuries during treatment at



Sub-District Hospital Thanamnadi," the police added.

They further said that eight injured passengers were shifted to GMC Associated Hospital, Rajouri.

UCC will end untouchability, curb atrocities against women: Indresh Kumar

Amid an ongoing row on the implementation of the Uniform Civil Code (UCC), Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) leader Indresh Kumar said once the Uniform Civil Code is implemented it will put an end to religious rites and the practice of untouchability.

It will also help in curbing atrocities against women, the RSS leader said.

The remarks were made by Indresh Kumar while attending an event in New Delhi on Tuesday.

The RSS leader said, "There are more people who favour the Uniform Civil Code than against it. Religious rites

and the practice of untouchability will end after the UCC is implemented."

He also noted that implementation of the UCC will end atrocities on women and safeguard the freedom to practice religion freely. "UCC will also end atrocities on women. It will make sure that people will be able to practice their religion freely. People will unite after its implementation," the RSS leader said.

Earlier on Monday a meeting of the Parliamentary Standing Committee for Personnel, Public Grievances, Law and Justice meeting was held under the Chairmanship of BJP Leader Sushil Kumar Modi in Parliament to discuss the agenda of the Uniform Civil Code.

NET/SET/SLET to be minimum criteria for direct recruitments to post of Asst Professor

The University Grants Commission (UGC) on Wednesday declared that NET/SET/SLET would be the minimum requirements for direct hiring to the position of assistant professor for all higher education institutions.

According to the officials, the UGC in an official statement announced that the NET/SET/SLET would be the minimum prerequisites for the direct recruitment to the job of Assistant Professor in all Higher Education Institutions

"NET/SET/SLET shall be the minimum criteria for the direct recruitment to the post of Assistant Professor for all Higher Education Institutions," the UGC said in an official statement.



As per the statement, the University Grants Commission (UGC) officially announced the amendments undertaken by the UGC in the execution of the authority granted by clauses (e) and (g) of

sub-section (1) of section 26 read in conjunction with section 14 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956).

It further stated that the University

Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) (2nd Amendment) Regulations, 2023 may be used to refer to these regulations.

Additionally, it was stated in the official release that these restrictions will take effect on July 1, 2023.

(Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) (2nd Amendment) Regulations, 2023.

CM reviews progress of Aravalli Safari Park and Rakhigarhi Museum Project

Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal today held a review meeting for the progress of two pivotal projects namely the Aravalli Safari Park Project and the Rakhigarhi Museum in Haryana Bhanuwan, New Delhi, with the concerned officers of Forest, Tourism and other aligned departments.

During the meeting, he directed the officers concerned to complete all the formalities related to the Safari Park project which is being developed in line with the biodiversity park concept in a 10,000-acre land parcel in the Aravalli region in Gurugram and Nuh Districts.

Later while interacting with the media persons, Sh. Manohar Lal stated that 10,000 acres of land in the Aravalli area of Gurugram and Nuh districts had been identified for Jungle Safari Park. In today's meeting a wide range of key issues related to these projects were discussed

in detail. The Jungle Safari Park will be developed in three phases, with the first phase expected to be completed in around two years, shared the Chief Minister.

He further shared that the state government has envisaged developing a Safari Park in line with the biodiversity park concept in a 10,000-acre land parcel in the Aravalli region in Gurugram and Nuh Districts and to accomplish this objective, 2 stage tender process has been adopted for the selection of international organisation for providing design consultancy services for Development of Aravalli Safari Park project.

"Two firms with international experience in designing and operating such facilities were shortlisted for participating in Stage-2. A detailed technical proposal and presentation along with conceptual design accessed by the tender evaluation committee and suggestion for selection of the winning firm submitted to the government for approval. The PMC will soon be selected for the development of Aravalli Safari Park," said Sh. Manohar Lal.

The Chief Minister said that in this jungle safari, there is an endeavour to introduce all animals and bird species. Animals that can adapt to our climatic conditions, in addition to local species, are being examined. He stated that a lake for migratory birds, similar to Sultanpur Lake, should be developed, which has also been suggested in the meeting. This jungle safari park also serves as a centre for maintaining and protecting endangered animals, said Sh. Manohar Lal.

Use of urea in fields with drill machine is an unscientific method: Dr. Karamchand

The officers/employees of the Agriculture Department are doing the work of agricultural extension by establishing personal contact with the farmers in all the villages. According to the feedback received from the field, a new technique of using urea fertilizer has been found from the farmers, in which many farmers have put 2-3 bags of urea through drill machine in the dry fields before transplanting paddy this year. Especially this type of process is being done more by those farmers who do farming by taking land on contract from any landlord. He said that this is an unscientific method and such recommendation has not been made by scientist/officer of any agriculture university and agriculture department. If farmers use urea in the fields by this method, then in the coming time their fields / lands will get spoiled and production will also be adversely affected. Quality of underground water can also deteriorate and this also harms the environment.

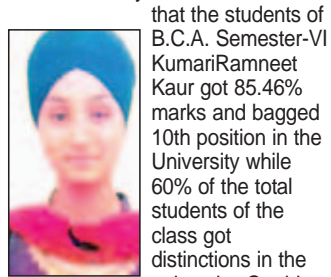

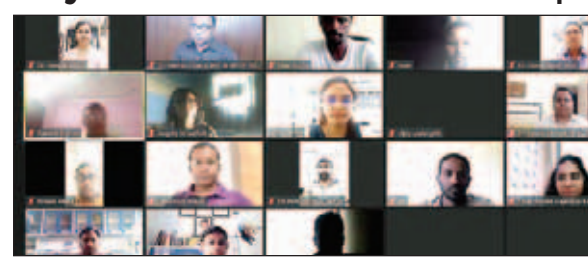

SHIMLA: South West Monsoon rain lashed most places of Himachal Pradesh this morning disrupting normal life again, the state administration confirmed that flash floods, landslides, and rising water levels washed away the arable lands in Una and affected vehicular traffic in the Sirmaur district. The revival of monsoon rain disrupted vehicular traffic on the Nahan-Renuka road, following a series of landslides near the Badolia bridge near Dadahu. The movement of vehicles has been disrupted due to the accumulation of debris on the road and long queues of vehicles have formed on both sides of the bridge. This road was also affected by recent rainfall as a landslide incident hit near the Badolia bridge. A number of vehicles are stranding on both sides of landslides on the highway. The administration has directed the Public Works Department to clear the road to restore blocked. Earlier this morning flash flood incident also occurred under Village Khad of the Haroli subdivision in the Una district. In the rush of water about eight to ten houses were also damaged. A car was also struck in the flash flood water but the occupants were rescued before the mishap. Indian Meteorological Department already sound advisory of very heavy rainfall, and thunderstorms in some places in the next 24 hrs. The local people and tourists are cautioned of Traffic congestion, poor visibility, and disruption of power supply in the rain-affected areas. Besides this damage occur to the standing crops, fruit plants, and young seedlings moreover state administration have ordered the concerned departments to take adequate safety measure.

IMD: Orange alert in
8 districts in State

The South West Monsoon system remained dormant during the last five days but is likely to revive in the state as the Indian Meteorological Department on Wednesday issued an orange alert in eight districts and yellow alert in the rest of the state. According to the Met Office, Heavy rainfall in many places of the state is predicted. Monsoon activities were confined to a few places in Kangra and Chamba districts, as Ghamroor (Kangra) had 45.2 mm of rain, Palampur 33 mm, Nahan (Sirmaur) 21.7 mm, and Guler (Kangra) 21.2 mm. The rest of the places were

mainly dry and cloudy and received insignificant downpours. In the next three hours, districts like Hamirpur, Bilaspur, Sirmaur, Kullu, Solan, Una, Msndi, and Shimla may have heavy rainfall in a few places, while widespread rainfall also occurs in these districts. IMD issued a yellow alert for the next four days, forecasting widespread rainfall in most places in the state. The Met Office also warned of thunderstorms and lightning in isolated places during inclement weather conditions. There has been no large change in the minimum and Maximum temperatures in the past 24 hours.

Govt to take up ambitious irrigation
schemes with the Centre

Deputy Chief Minister Mukesh Agnihotri has said that the issue of acceptance of ambitious irrigation schemes of the state will be taken up with the Centre.

He said that the irrigation of the fields of the state is depending on the Phina Singh Project, Sukhahar Project and Veet Area Irrigation Schemes. At present, the state is running below the national average in irrigation. That's why the centre will be requested to approve irrigation schemes on priority basis. He told that TB is not an incurable disease, its treatment is completely possible. DOTS medicine for TB is available free of cost in government health centers.

Meet Hayer instructs to strictly implement China Thread ban order

CHANDIGARH, JULY 5

In view of the accidents that occur due to the use of China thread, new instructions have been issued by the Punjab Government for more effective and strict implementation of its orders prohibiting use of the same.

Only cotton thread can be used for flying kites and penal instructions have been issued by giving powers to take action on complain against the use of China string/thread at the lower level. Giving information in a press statement issued here today, Environment Minister Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer said that the government has taken serious notice of the incident that happened with the China thread at Ferozepur and the Department of Science, Technology and Environment has also issued a regular notification in this regard today. The State Government led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann is

very serious about the incidents happening regarding use of China thread and has directed to strictly implement its order of total ban. The Environment Minister said that there were some errors in the notification issued by the state government on February 23, 2018 regarding the ban of China thread. Now these errors have been removed in the newly issued orders. Under the new order, China thread, thread made of glass or other metallic powders have been completely banned, and only cotton thread kites have been allowed to be flown. Adequate powers have been given to enforce the new notification and take action against the violators. Instructions are being issued under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 regarding the complete ban of China string, violation of which may result in imprisonment of up to 5 years and a fine of up to one lakh rupees or both.

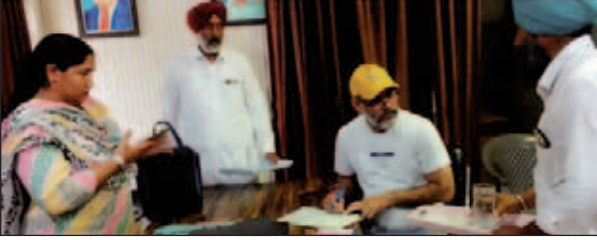

Female accused arrested in cheating case of

On many boats

There s been considerable transformation in India s foreign policy over the past few years. Once a proponent of the Non-Aligned Movement and G77, New Delhi is now aligned with multiple players, several of which are not at peace with each other. It is also a member of groupings such as BRICS, the Quad, the SCO, the G20 and an invitee to the G7, among other fora. There are numerous reasons behind India s membership of both BRICS and Quad. With the Cold War on its last legs and the disintegration of the Soviet Union, India was seeking alliances with other nation-states to fulfil its aspiration of emerging as a major Asian power. India s entry into the nuclear club in 1998 only served to underscore its new stature. But India had a falling-out with the United States of America following the nuclear tests. The primacy of India s foreign policy was then to cope with a unipolar world dominated by the US with the steadfast belief that a multipolar world is a better guarantee of its interests. The US s alliance with Pakistan a nuclear power also worried India. India thus chose to join the Russian initiative along with China the RIC to lift New Delhi s global stature and enhance cooperation with Beijing. The RIC subsequently became the BRICS forum, along with Brazil and South Africa.

But this tactical cooperation on the BRICS platform for more than two decades has not led to strategic convergence between India and China. Increase in trade, high-level meetings, and bilateral visits have not led to mutual understanding. The India-China confrontation intensified with Xi Jinping s ascendance as China s top leader. His Belt and Road Initiative, India alleged, penetrated New Delhi s zone of influence in South Asia and the Indian Ocean region. China s military pressure on India s northern border, its military and political penetration of India s neighbours, and its naval activity along India s maritime periphery alarmed India.

India s worry of a rising and assertive China led to a major shift in the former s approach. This was compounded by Russia s growing friendship with China in the wake of the ongoing Ukraine war, China s all-weather alliance with Pakistan, and a series of confrontations over disputed borders in the Himalayas. Indian policy-makers believed that it was imperative for India s security interests to build partnerships with like-minded countries to balance China s hegemonic tendencies. India thus embraced the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue (Quad), an informal strategic grouping comprising Australia, India, Japan and the US.

Researchers discovered that tropical mammals living within protected areas are not immune to the effects of human activity, even when it occurs outside the boundaries of the protected areas.

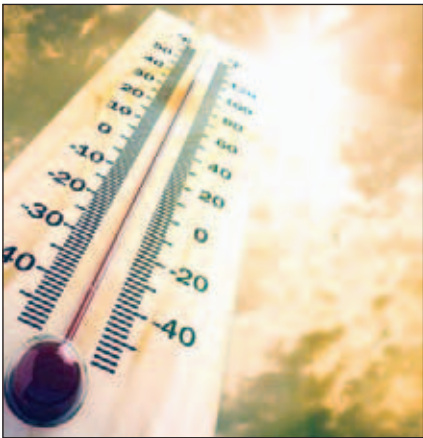

Monday recorded as hottest day on earth

The hottest day on Earth was recorded on July 3, The Hill reported citing the data from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA). On July 3, the average global air temperature 2 meters above the planet s surface touched 62.62 degrees Fahrenheit or 17.01 degrees Celsius, according to the data analyzed by the University of Maine.

Taking to Twitter, Robert Rohde, of the University of California, Berkeley, on Tuesday (Local time) said, "NCEP (National Centers for Environmental Prediction) has placed Earth s average temperature yesterday as the hottest single day thus far measured by humans. This is driven by the combination of El Nino on top of global warming, and we may well see a few even warmer days over the next 6 weeks."

According to NOAA, El Nino means Little Boy in Spanish. South American fishermen first noticed periods of unusually warm water in the Pacific Ocean in the 1600s. The full name they used was El Nino de Navidad because El Nino typically peaks around December. El Nino can affect our weather significantly. The warmer waters cause the Pacific jet stream to move south of its neutral position. With this shift, areas in the northern U.S. and Canada are dryer and warmer than usual. But in the US Gulf Coast and Southeast, these periods are wetter than usual and have increased flooding. Rohde also warned that humanity should expect more scorching temperatures over the next month and a half, as per The Hill. The Hill is an American newspaper and digital media company based in Washington, D.C. Monday s temperatures beat the previous record set in July 2022 and August 2016 of 62.46 degrees Fahrenheit or 16.92 degrees Celsius.



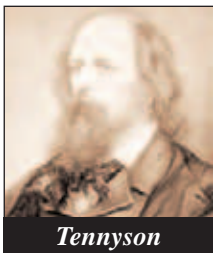
Meanwhile, the University of Maine scientists at the Climate Reanalyzer project stated that the temperature records surpassed July 3 and 4 in Quebec and northwestern Canada and Peru. Cities across the US from Medford, Oregon to Tampa, Florida have been hovering at all-time highs, said Zack Taylor, a meteorologist with the National Weather Service. Beijing reported 9 straight days last week when the temperature exceeded 35 C (95 F), The Hill reported. This global record is preliminary, pending approval from gold-standard climate measurements entities like the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Association. But it is an indication that climate change is reaching into uncharted territory.

Rising temperatures are making it harder for birds to breed

Researchers found that rising global temperatures make it more difficult for birds to determine when it is spring and time to breed. The study was published in the journal, "Proceedings of the National Academy of Science."

The research led by UCLA and Michigan State University scientists discovered that birds produce fewer young if they begin breeding too early or too late in the season. Birds have been unable to keep up with climate change, which has resulted in early springlike conditions, according to the experts.

Furthermore, the authors write that the mismatch between the start of spring and birds readiness to reproduce is likely to worsen as the world heats, which might have far-reaching effects on many bird species. Bird breeding seasons begin with the appearance of the first green plants and blossoms, which is occurring earlier and earlier as the temperature warms. "By the end of the 21st century, spring is likely to arrive about 25 days earlier, with birds breeding only about 6.75 days earlier," said the study s first author, Casey



Youngflesh, who led the research as a postdoctoral researcher at UCLA and is now a postdoctoral fellow at Michigan State. "Our results suggest that breeding productivity may decrease about 12% for the average songbird species."

The authors stress that conservation strategies should address bird species responses to climate-driven shifts.

"For nearly 30 years, scientists have hypothesized that animals could become mismatched from plants as springs begin earlier," said Morgan Tingley, a UCLA associate professor of ecology and evolutionary biology and the study s senior author. "While there have been a few very good case studies of this phenomenon, it has remained a major mystery whether advancing springs will pose a general problem for the majority of species." "When it comes to raising their young, timing matters for birds. If they breed too early or too late, harsh weather could harm their eggs or newborns. But timing relative to food sources matters too: If birds are looking for food before or after its natural availability, they might not have the resources to keep their young alive."

"Critically, we found evidence for impacts on bird reproduction of both the absolute and the relative timing of birds," Tingley said.

Using data from a large-scale collaborative bird banding program run by the Institute for Bird Populations, the researchers calculated the timing

of breeding and the number of young produced for 41 migratory and resident bird species at 179 sites near forested areas throughout North America between 2001 and 2018.

Then, the authors used satellite imaging to determine when vegetation emerged around each site. They found that each species had an optimal time to breed, and that the number of young produced decreased when spring arrived very early, or when breeding occurred early or late relative to when plants emerged.

While the majority of birds were adversely affected by variations in the start of spring, several species -- the northern cardinal, Bewick s wren and wrenit among them -- countered the trend, demonstrating improved breeding productivity when spring began earlier. Those species are mostly non-migratory species that can respond more quickly to the emergence of spring plants that signal the start of the breeding season.

By breeding earlier and without the time constraints imposed by migration, the study noted,

non-migratory species may also be able to reproduce more than once per season.

But those species were the exceptions to the rule. Even most non-migratory species couldn t keep up with earlier spring arrivals. Overall, for every four days earlier that leaves appeared on trees, species bred only about one day earlier.

For migratory species, that discrepancy means that the time between when they arrive at their breeding sites and breeding itself is likely to get shorter as springlike conditions begin earlier. Birds need time to establish territories and prepare physiologically for egg-laying and rearing their young, so that change could cause even greater disturbances to reproduction.

"North America has lost nearly a third of its bird populations since the 1970s," Tingley said. "While our study demonstrates that the worst impacts of timing mismatch likely won t occur for several decades yet, we need to focus now on concrete strategies to boost bird populations before climate change takes its toll."

According to the source, the bill includes almost all the provisions of the last draft that was issued by Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology for consultation. The source said government entities have not been granted blanket exemption under the proposed law. "In case of disputes, Data Protection Board will decide. Citizens will have the right to claim compensation by approaching civil court. There are lot of things that will evolve gradually," the source said. According to the source, individuals will have the right to seek details about their data collection, storage and processing once the law is implemented. Union minister Rajeev Chandrasekhar has asserted that the upcoming Digital Personal Data Protection Bill will drive "deep behavioural changes" among those platforms in India that have for long exploited or misused personal data. He also sought to allay concerns around the issue of government-appointed fact check body, saying the move is not about censorship at all, rather it gives the Centre an opportunity to clarify and respond to any misinformation related to it, something that is critical in a democracy.

Docs reconstruct man crushed hand with ostero reconstructive surgery

C handigarh, July 5: Doctors at IVY Hospital Hoshiarpur carried out a complex procedure to reconstruct a young man's hand, which was badly crushed in a workplace accident. Led by Dr. Sumit Toor, consultant plastic surgeon, a team reconstructed the man's index fingers using salvageable bones and soft tissue coverage with a regional flap. The patient underwent the surgery, which involved K wire fixation of the bones and SEPA flap, and later underwent a second stage procedure that included flap division and inseting. The young man suffered a terrible workplace accident that left

him with a badly crushed left hand, where all fingers except thumb were amputated. The amputated crushed fingers were not in a condition for re-implantation due to the severity of the damage. Post procedure, he now has a functional thumb and index finger, providing him with a vastly improved quality of life, said Dr. Toor. He emphasized the importance of preserving the framework of a finger for re-implantation. However, in cases where this is badly damaged, ostero reconstructive surgery can make all the difference in giving patients the gift of mobility and independence, he maintained.

Regarding this, on the orders of Corporation Commissioner Ayush Sinha, Additional Corporation Commissioner Dheeraj Kumar along with the cleaning officers inspected the work of cleaning the drains being done in both the zones. During this, he instructed both the CSI and the concerned contractors to thoroughly clean the drains. In zone number one, drains are being cleaned at a cost of Rs 64.84 lakh. On the other hand, the drains of Zone II are being cleaned at a cost of Rs 76.75 lakh. In both the zones, the work of cleaning the drains is being done on a large scale. With the help of JCB, big drains are being cleaned to depth. At the same time, special teams of employees are engaged in cleaning the drains and cleaning the silt and dirt from the drains. A special team and JCB are cleaning the big drain coming from Jagadhri to Yamuna Nagar and some teams



are cleaning other drains. Besides this, along with cleaning the drains lifting the silt and dirt out of the drains including weeds growing in the drains are being cleaned. On Wednesday, on the instructions of corporator Ayush Sinha, additional corporator Dheeraj Kumar went out to inspect the cleaning of drains. First of all, they reached the main drain coming out of Jagadhri along with Zone 1 Chief Sanitation Inspector Harjit Singh, Zone 2 Chief Sanitation Inspector Rajesh Kumar, ME Deepak Sukhija and others. He inspected the drains and instructed the concerned officials to get the drains cleaned quickly and thoroughly.

XEN, billing clerk of Electricity Department arrested

In the investigation of the documents for the year 2021-22 and the year 2022-23, it was revealed that fake documents were submitted in the office.



JSW Foundation empowers tribal women artisans through the CHARKHA


