### BJP appoints election in-charges for four states

**NEW DELHI:** The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Friday appointed election in-charges for poll bound states namely Telangana, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan. Union minister Bhupendra Yadav has been given charge of Madhya Pradesh. He has overseen elections in Bihar and Gujarat earlier. He will be assisted by union minister Ashwini Vaishnaw. After the poll debacle in the last assembly elections, the BJP is trying its best to retain power in Madhya Pradesh. In Rajasthan, where the polls are expected to witness a close battle between the BJP and Congress, the election in charge will be union minister Prahlad Joshi.

### Wrestlers' sexual harassment case: Delhi court summons Brij Bhushan on July 18

**NEW DELHI:** A Delhi court on Friday summoned BJP MP and outgoing WFI chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh in a case of alleged sexual harassment of women wrestlers and said there was sufficient evidence to proceed against the accused. Taking cognisance of the chargesheet, Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate (ACMM) Harjeet Singh Jaspal directed Brij Bhushan to appear before the court on July 18. The court also summoned Vinod Tomar, suspended assistant secretary of the Wrestling Federation of India. The city police had filed a chargesheet against Brij Bhushan, a six-time MP, on June 15 under Sections 354 (assault or criminal force to woman with intent to outrage her modesty), 354A (sexual harassment), 354D (stalking) and 506 (criminal intimidation) of the IPC.

### Amarnath yatra temporarily suspended due to inclement weather

**SRINAGAR:** Amarnath yatra has been temporarily suspended from both Pahalgam and Baltal routes due to inclement weather, officials said on Friday. They said no yatra was allowed to proceed from the traditional Nunwan Pahalgam base camp in south Kashmir and Baltal in central Kashmir's Ganderbal district today due to inclement weather. "It is still raining at several places on both the routes and has made the road conditions slippery at places", they said. "Keeping in view the inclement weather conditions, the authorities decided to suspend the yatra until the weather improves", they added.

# No less than temple: PM's praise for Gita Press

**AGENCY NEW DELHI:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who attended the closing ceremony of the centenary celebrations of the Gita Press in Uttar Pradesh's Gorakhpur today, said the publishing house is "not less than any temple".

"Sometimes saints show the way, sometimes institutions such as the Gita Press," PM Modi said.

Days after the Congress attacked the Centre for conferring the Gandhi Peace Prize on the Gita

Press, which claims to be the largest publishing house of Hindu religious literature, PM Modi said the publisher is "guiding humanity" through its work.

The PM further claimed Mahatma Gandhi had an emotive relationship with the Gita press, and he contributed to its monthly magazine 'Kalyan'.

"Even now, Kalyan follows his advice of not running advertisements," he said.

Congress had condemned the



decision of the government to award the Gandhi Peace Prize to Gita Press because of the "stormy relations it had with Mahatma Gandhi" as it allegedly ran "campaigns that were against his thought."

The press has, however, denied such allegations saying Gandhi was a regular contributor to its fortnightly magazine "Kalyan"

PM Modi also unveiled a special edition of the Shiv Puran, considered to be one of the 18 major

puranas, at the event. The book has been edited by a scholar in Nepal, and contains over 200 photographs of Lord Shiva, Parvati, and Ganesh from the publisher's own collection.

"Wherever there is Gita, Lord Krish na himself is present there," PM Modi said, adding that everything emanates from Vasudeva (Lord Krishna). The PM said the Gita press unites the country and helps in developing a national consciousness.

# Setback for Rahul as Guj HC upholds conviction in Modi surname case

**AGENCY AHMEDABAD, JULY 7**

Rahul Gandhi will remain disqualified as a Lok Sabha MP after a Gujarat High Court today rejected his request to put on hold his conviction in a defamation case over his 2019 Modi surname remark. The conviction is "just, proper and legal", the High Court said.

The Congress leader will now approach the Supreme Court with his request. Since his disqualification stands, he is not likely to make it back into parliament in the coming monsoon session beginning July 20. If the Supreme Court also rejects his request, Rahul Gandhi cannot contest next year's election.

The Gujarat High Court cited Rahul Gandhi's remarks on Veer Savarkar at Cambridge in its order.

"It is needed to have purity in politics...A complaint has been filed against (Rahul Gandhi) by the grandson of Veer Savarkar in Pune Court after Gandhi used terms against Veer Savarkar at Cambridge," said the High Court.

"Refusal to stay conviction would not in any way result in injustice to the applicant. There are no reasonable grounds to stay conviction. The conviction is just, proper and legal."

The court said there were "as many as 10 cases pending" against Rahul Gandhi and he was "seeking a stay on absolutely non-existent grounds". A "stay on conviction is not a rule", said the judge.



The former Congress chief will not go to jail as his two-year sentence had been put on hold by a court previously.

Today's decision is a huge blow to the Congress as it plans strategy for a series of upcoming polls, including the 2024 national election.

## Congress to move Apex Court

**New Delhi:** The Congress on Friday said it will move the Supreme Court after the Gujarat High Court refused to stay Rahul Gandhi's conviction in a defamation case, and alleged that the government is finding newer techniques to throttle his voice as it is rattled by him speaking the truth.

The party said the verdict redoubles its resolve to pursue the matter further and it will fight the battle both legally and politically. Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters here, Congress spokesperson and Gandhi's counsel in the case Abhishek Singhvi said the Gujarat High Court dismissing Rahul Gandhi's plea was "highly disappointing, but not unexpected".

In May, the Gujarat High Court had denied any reprieve to Rahul Gandhi, saying it would announce its final decision after the court's summer vacation, which ended three weeks back.

In a hearing on April 29, Rahul Gandhi's lawyer had argued that two years in jail for a "bailable, non-cognisable offence" meant his client could lose his Lok Sabha seat "permanently and irreversibly", which was a "very serious additional irreversible consequence to the person and the constituency he represents".

Under the law, an MP stands disqualified if sentenced to two years or more in prison. Rahul Gandhi, 52, was sentenced to prison for two years in Gujarat on March 23 for his speech during the 2019 Lok Sabha campaign. BJP MLA and former Gujarat minister Purnesh Modi had filed the case over Rahul Gandhi saying: "How come all thieves have the common surname Modi?"

# CM Mann demands upscaling of wage rate notified under MGNREGA to Rs 381.06

**SHASHI PAL JAIN CHANDIGARH, JULY 7-**

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Friday batted for increase in wage rate notified under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) in the state to Rs 381.06, at par with rate notified by Punjab for unskilled Agriculture worker.

In a letter to Union Rural Development and Panchayati Raj Minister Giriraj Singh, the Chief Minister sought upward revision in the rates notified for labour under the scheme as the existing rates were too minuscule. He said that less wage rate of Rs 303/- has been being notified for Punjab State in comparison to Rs 357/- for the neighbouring State Haryana. Bhagwant Mann said that he has come to know that this difference is existing since the inception of the scheme despite the fact that both States share similar geographic and economic conditions.

The Chief Minister bemoaned that Punjab State Labour Department's notified unskilled agricultural labour wage rate of Rs. 381.06 is also higher than the MGNREGA wage rate. He said that it reflects that the beneficiaries of this scheme are being denied their rightful dues which is not at all acceptable. Bhagwant Mann said that it is unfortunate that unskilled workers in Haryana get more payment for the same



work done in compared to Punjab, which is a grave injustice with them.

Therefore, the Chief Minister sought the kind intervention of the Union Minister to get the matter examined again and increase the Punjab's wage rate at par with that of Haryana or with Punjab State Labour Department's wage rates. He said that Increase in wage rate will help in improving livelihood base of beneficiaries besides motivating them to work zealously under the Scheme. Bhagwant Mann expressed hope that the Union Minister will sympathetically consider the legitimate claim of Punjab and pass on the necessary directions to the officers.

## Biggest Medicinal Herbal Garden of Uttarakhand inaugurated at Lalkuan

**HALDWANI:** Biggest Medicinal Herbal Garden of Uttarakhand, named as Public Health Garden (Jan Swastha Vatika) has been inaugurated by Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (PCCF) Anoop Malik on Friday. Along with Garden, a small processing unit for preparing extracts from useful plants and a community training centre has also been inaugurated, to impart training to local people. The garden situated at Lalkuan of the Nainital district was developed over a period of two years has largest collection of medicinal plants in the State. Funded by Japanese International Corporation Agency (JICA), this Garden is spread in an area of 10 acres and has around 270 medicinal plants consisting of various herbs, shrubs, trees, aquatic plants and medicinal orchids.

## Batala firing incident: Punjab police arrest main accused from Indo-Bhutan border

Amidst the ongoing drive to make Punjab a safe and secure state as per the vision of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, Counter Intelligence Wing of Punjab Police in a joint operation with Central Agency and West Bengal Police have solved the Batala firing incident case after arresting the main accused from Indo-Bhutan Border in Alipurduar district in West Bengal, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Friday.

The 21-years-old arrested accused has a criminal background and he was out on a bail in a murder case.

According to the information, Rajeev Mahajan, his brother Anil Gupta and his son Manav Gupta had sustained bullet injuries after two assailants barged into their electronics shop at Lakkar Mandi in Batala on June 24, 2023, and opened fire at them.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that based on technical inputs and evidence, the Counter Intelligence, Punjab had located the accused person in the Alipurduar district of West Bengal. "Batala Police immediately dispatched a team for West Bengal, and also shared the pinpointed information with them," he said. He said that the Punjab Police in coordination with Central Agency and West Bengal Police have arrested the accused person from Indo-Bhutan Border.



# McDonald's puts tomato off the menu as price soars

**AGENCY NEW DELHI, JULY 17**

Fast food chain McDonald's has stopped using tomato in its food preparations at most of the stores in northern and eastern parts of the country citing the non-availability of quality products, amid the price of the commodity surging up to Rs 200 per kg.

McDonald's India – North and East said it is constrained to "hold tomatoes for the time being" and is trying to resolve this issue by employing sustainable agriculture practices.

"Due to seasonal crop issues arising out of farm fields in a few regions, there are not enough quantities meeting our quality specifications available. To ensure our customers get the best quality we are known to serve, we are constrained to hold tomatoes for the time being," said a McDonald's India – North and East spokesperson.



There is also a buzz going on in the

social media over the absence of tomatoes on some of the top-selling products of McDonald's such as burgers. Social media users are sharing pictures of burgers without tomatoes. Some of them also shared the notices put out by some of McDonald's stores informing the walk-in customer about the temporary unavailability of tomatoes.

Assuring the customers, McDonald's India – North and East spokesperson said, "We reiterate that it is not due to the surge in the prices. It is only due to the non-availability of tomatoes meeting our quality specifications." However, he also added restaurants mostly in the Punjab-Chandigarh area where it is able to source the

commodity in adequate quantities, McDonald's continues to serve tomatoes in its menu. "We are working towards resolving this issue by employing sustainable agriculture practices including hydroponically-grown tomatoes in a completely controlled environment to de-risk our requirements from vagaries of season," he said, adding, "We should be able to bring back tomatoes to the menu soon." McDonald's restaurants in north and east of India are operated by Connaught Plaza Restaurants Pvt Ltd (CPRL), which is its masters franchiser. Stores in southern and western regions are operated by McDonald's another master franchiser Westlife Group.

Farmers made aware of various schemes under Crop Insurance Week

UNA: The ongoing 5th Crop Insurance Week concluded on Friday in district Una. Giving information about this, Deputy Director Agriculture Kulbhushan Dhiman said that during the week, farmers' awareness camps were successfully organized by the Agriculture Department in collaboration with the Agriculture Insurance Company at various places in the district. Through awareness camps, farmers were made aware about the various schemes being run by the department and the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana and Weather Based Crop Insurance Scheme. He informed that under the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana, July 15 has been fixed as the last date for insurance of the main crops of Kharif 2023, maize and paddy. The amount of premium payable by the farmers has been fixed at Rs 48 per Kanal, whose sum insured is Rs 2400 per Kanal.

Deputy Director Kulbhushan Dhiman said that under the eather-based crop insurance scheme, the main crop of Kharif 2023 was potato, whose last date for insurance has been fixed as August 31. The amount of premium payable by the farmer is Rs.300 per kanal whose insured amount will be Rs 6,000 per kanal. He told that the crops of the farmers whose agriculture cards were made automatically insured by the concerned bank branch. Whereas those whose agriculture cards have not been made can get their crops insured through any nearest Lok Mitra Kendra. He informed that the claims of Kharif 2022 crops have been distributed by the company, in which claims of Rs 1.60 crore for Kharif potato crop and Rs 1.04 crore for Kharif maize and paddy have been distributed. Deputy Director Agriculture, Kulbhushan Dhiman has called upon the farmers to get their crops insured within the stipulated time limit so that in the coming times, damages caused to the crops due to adverse weather conditions can be compensated.

65 cheaters caught in polytechnic annual exams

DHARAMSHALA: Himachal Pradesh Board of Technical Education has so far caught 65 copycats in the polytechnic semester/annual examinations conducted from June 22. Out of these, 20 copycats have been caught during online monitoring from the control room set up in Board of Technical Education, Dharamshala while other copycats have been caught by the flying squads formed by the board. Around 15423 regular/re-appear students are participating in these examinations which are going on till 13th July. 34 examination centers have been set up by the board in government and private polytechnic institutes. Monitoring is being done through CCTV in the examination centers. Those who are accused of cheating during the examination, the board will call them to the Dharamshala office in the first week of August to present their case. During this, only if the fault of copying is proved, action will be taken against the examinees as per the rules. RK Sharma, Secretary, Board of Technical Education, Dharamshala said that so far 65 cases of cheating have been reported by the Board of Technical Education in polytechnic semester/annual examinations. In the first week of August, candidates accused of cheating will be given a chance to present their case.

Special focus will be on medicinal and fruitful plants in plantation

DHARAMSHALA: In the monsoon season, a target has been set to plant around one million saplings under the Dharamshala forest circle. A special campaign will also be started for this. Giving this information, Chief Conservator Dharamshala Van Vrit E Vikram said that along with ensuring the participation of general public in the tree plantation campaign, cooperation of Forest Management Committees, Mahila Mandals, Youth Clubs will also be taken. Awareness programs will be organized in schools regarding the importance of tree plantation in environmental protection so that the young generation can also come forward for forest conservation. He informed that in the Dharamshala forest circle, the Forest Department will plant forests in an area of about 684 hectares under various departmental schemes during the current year and 4.5 lakh saplings of different species will be planted. Apart from this, work will also be done to replace dead plants in the plantation done in previous years in an area of 3189 hectares, in which 5.65 lakh saplings will also be planted. Thus during this monsoon season more than 10 lakh saplings will be planted. Medicinal and fruit species like Harad, Behda, Amla, Jamun, Wild Mango, Arjun, Buransh have been included for plantation, along with fodder plants like Kachanar, Ban Oak, Bamboo will also be planted. Coniferous species like deodar as well as drought resistant species like rosewood will also be planted as per the suitability of the site.

Bulk Drug Park to change Pharma eco-system of the State: CM

SHIMLA: An ambitious Bulk Drug Park is coming up in Haroli area of Una district which will usher in a new era of progress and prosperity in the entire region and make Himachal Pradesh a Pharma Hub of the Country.

"Since the Bulk drug park is a project of national importance and crucial for strengthening the state's existing pharma ecosystem, the State Government will ensure its timely completion", said Chief Minister, Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu. He said that the state government mulls to develop Himachal Pradesh as an 'Investment Friendly State' which will facilitate the potential investors and also helps in providing employment opportunities to local youth.

The total investment potential in this Bulk Drug Park is around Rs. 8000-10,000 crore and expected employment opportunities for more than 15,000 people, the Project is bound to transform the economy of the entire region. The State Government has received the first installment of grant-in-aid of Rs.

225 crore for the development of common infrastructure facilities for a bulk drug park in Una district. The grant-in-aid has been given under the guidelines of the Promotion of Bulk Drug Park Scheme by the Department of Pharmaceuticals of the Central Government.

In order to ensure time bound completion of this Park, the State Government has registered the State Implementing Agency for the Himachal Pradesh Bulk Drug Park Infrastructure Limited (HPBDPIL) with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs. This Agency will ensure

that all the bottlenecks in implementation of this project are removed and redressed at the earliest.

The power demand for this park has been estimated around 120 MW and two transmission lines from Una and Tahlwal have been planned to ensure continuous power supply.

The State Government has directed all the concerned departments to work hard in materializing Bulk Drug Park so that it could catch up the deadline of its completion. The Departments have been asked to expedite the

works regarding the Bulk Drug Park on a priority basis and time bound manner. Special focus is being laid on creating and strengthening basic requirements like water, electricity, and internal road infrastructure for this Park, said the Chief Minister.

The State Jal Shakti Vibhag has been directed for the execution of water related works at the earliest. An amount of Rs. 11.75 crore will be provided to Jal Shakti Vibhag for recharge and maintenance of underground water level of the area. Possibilities are also being explored regarding permanent power supply to the park from Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB). HP Transmission Corporation Limited (HPTCL) and HP State Electricity Board (HPSEB) have been asked to start building outer electrical infrastructure for Bulk Drug Park.

Apart from this, the state government aims at bringing private sector investment of about Rs. 20,000 crore in manufacturing, tourism, energy, construction, housing etc. in the current fiscal with the potential of providing direct employment to 40,000 persons and indirect employment to about 50,000 persons, reiterated the Chief Minister.

Chamoli police Uttarakhand tweeted, "The road has been blocked near Chhinka on the Badrinath National Highway."

The Badrinath National Highway (NH-7) was previously also shut down due to incessant rainfall in Uttarakhand's Chamoli at Lambagad and Khachada drains.

Amid the closure of the national highway, commuters were stuck.

Later on Saturday, vehicle movement on the highway had to be restricted again due to a rise in the water level in the Khachdu drain near Uttarakhand's Lambagad.

Authorities closed the Badrinath National Highway 7 (NH 7) at Chhinka in the State's Chamoli district leaving many commuters, including pilgrims and tourists travelling to and returning from the famed Badrinath shrine.

Last week on Thursday, heavy rains triggered landslides and flash floods in Uttarakhand at the same place and blocked Badrinath National Highway. A stretch of 100 meters of the highway was blocked due to a heavy landslide from a hill near Chhinka on Thursday morning due to rain.

HP people more prone to high cholesterol: ICMR

HAMIRPUR/SHIMLA (HP), JULY 7 (UNI) People in Himachal Pradesh, especially the elderly, are more prone to high cholesterol as compared to the states of Punjab, Haryana, and Uttarakhand, revealed in the study of Indian Medical Research (ICMR-India). Hypercholesterolemia has been found in 39.6 percent of people in Himachal Pradesh, as against 28.7 percent of people in Punjab, 33.4% in Uttarakhand, and 28.1 percent in Haryana. The study shows that about 40 out of 100 people in the state have increased cholesterol due to reasons like a fatty diet, not exercising, or smoking. Hypercholesterolemia is also causing heart disease and stroke. Too much cholesterol is also blocking the arteries. Hypercholesterolemia is a condition in which the amount of cholesterol in the blood increases too much. Hypercholesterolemia has been found in 39.6 percent of people in Himachal Pradesh. Dr JK Mokta, Professor, Department of Medicine, IGMCH Shimla, said that the main reasons for hypercholesterolemia are poor diet, lack of exercise, smoking, high blood pressure, or diabetes. Dr Mokta said that if you exercise properly on a daily basis, you can stay away from such a situation.

### Slow progress

On June 29, the United Nations General Assembly ended the intergovernmental negotiations on United Nations Security Council reforms for the current — 77th — session and adopted a draft oral decision to continue the intergovernmental negotiations on UNSC reforms at the 78th session of the UNGA that will commence in September this year. As per Article 24 of the UN Charter, the UNSC's mandate is peace and security, making it the most important organ of the multilateral system.

A broad list of issues relevant to the intergovernmental negotiations concerns UNSC reforms, which include the proposed size of the expanded Council, the question of veto, categories of membership, regional representation, and working methods. Every year, since February 2009, as part of the intergovernmental negotiations on the question of equitable representation and increase in the membership of the UNSC, diplomats from various countries, particularly from aspirant member states, ritually make statements, but nothing changes.

In practical terms, the completion of the negotiations this year offers little new details. However, around the same time, there were suo motu statements from some members of the P5 in various capitals that demonstrate a greater urgency for UNSC reforms among them as compared to the aspirant countries. Speaking at an event, the foreign secretary of the United Kingdom, James Cleverly, said, "I have five transnational priorities. First, reform of the United Nations Security Council. We want to see permanent African representation and membership extended to India, Brazil, Germany and Japan. I know this is a bold reform. But it will usher the Security Council into the 2020s. And the UNSC has grown before — albeit not since 1965. My second priority is reform of the international financial institutions. This matters for climate finance and, of course, for poverty reduction." Around the same time, speaking on the sidelines of the Summit for a New Global Financial Pact in Paris, the French president, Emmanuel Macron, termed it important to factor in the changes that have taken place in the current international system and make the multilateral system reflective of the present times. Officially, France supports the candidacy of Germany, Brazil, India and Japan as permanent members of the UNSC as well as the stronger presence of African countries among the permanent members. Of late, the president of the United States of America, Joe Biden, has specifically mentioned that "the US supports increasing the number of both permanent and non-permanent representatives of the council."

# Not eating healthy foods linked with higher cardiovascular disease

Researchers from Hamilton Health Sciences and McMaster University revealed in a study conducted at the Population Research Health Institute (PHRI) that persons who do not consume enough of six important nutrients collectively had a higher risk of developing cardiovascular disease (CVD).

Consuming whole-fat dairy products, seafood, legumes, nuts, fruits, and vegetables helps reduce the risk of CVD, including heart attacks and strokes. The study also discovered that there are other strategies to maintain a healthy diet, such as consuming unprocessed meats or entire grains in moderation.

Previous and related studies have concentrated on Western nations and diets that mix unhealthy, highly processed foods with nutrient-dense foods. Global in scope, this study concentrated on common healthy eating choices.

The World Health Organization estimates nearly 18 million people died from CVD in 2019, representing 32 per cent of all global deaths. Of these deaths, 85 per cent were due to heart attacks and strokes. PHRI researchers and their global



collaborators analyzed data from 245,000 people in 80 countries from multiple studies. The results were published in the European Heart Journal on July 6.

Researchers derived a diet score from PHRI's ongoing, large-scale global Prospective Urban and Rural Epidemiological (PURE)

study, then replicated that in five independent studies to measure health outcomes in different world regions and in people with and without prior CVD.

"Previous diet scores - including the EAT-Lancet Planetary Diet and the Mediterranean Diet tested the relationship of diet to

CVD and death mainly in Western countries. The PURE Healthy Diet Score included a good representation of high, middle, and low-income countries," said Salim Yusuf, senior author and principal investigator of PURE. As well as being truly global, the PURE Healthy Diet Score focused

on exclusively protective, or natural, foods.

"We were unique in that focus. The other diet scores combined foods considered to be harmful - such as processed and ultra-processed foods - with foods and nutrients believed to be protective of one's health," said first au-

thor Andrew Mente, PHRI scientist and assistant professor at McMaster's Department of Health Research Methods, Evidence, and Impact.

"There is a recent increased focus on higher consumption of protective foods for disease prevention. Outside of larger amounts of fruits, vegetables, nuts and legumes, the researchers showed that moderation is key in the consumption of natural foods," he said.

"Moderate amounts of fish and whole-fat dairy are associated with a lower risk of CVD and mortality. The same health outcomes can be achieved with moderate consumption of grains and meats - as long as they are unrefined whole grains and unprocessed meats."

The PURE Healthy Diet Score recommends an average daily intake of: Fruits at two to three servings; vegetables at two to three servings; nuts at one serving; and dairy at two servings. The score also includes three to four weekly servings of legumes and two to three weekly servings of fish. Possible substitutes included whole grains at one serving daily, and unprocessed red meat or poultry at one serving daily.

## Elephants' dietary habits are similar to humans

Biologists used innovative methods to analyse the dietary habits of two groups of elephants in Kenya and found out that Elephants may vary what they eat for dinner just like humans, according to a study.

The findings were reported in the journal Royal Society Open Science. Researchers have found elephants vary their diets based not only on what is available but also on their preferences and physiological needs. Elephants may vary what they eat for dinner every night just like humans. "It's really important for conservationists to keep in mind that when animals don't get enough of the foods that they need, they may survive -- but they may not prosper," said study author Tyler Kartzinel, an assistant professor of environmental studies and of ecology, evolution and organismal biology at Brown. "By better understanding what each individual eats, we can bet-



ter manage iconic species like elephants, rhinos and bison to ensure their populations can grow sustainably." Their findings on individual elephant habits help answer important questions about group foraging behaviours and aid biologists in understanding the conservation approaches that best keep elephants not only satiated but satisfied. One of the main tools that the scientists used to conduct their study is called DNA metabarcoding, a cutting-edge genetic technique that allows researchers to identify the composition of biological samples by

matching the extracted DNA fragments representing an elephant's food to a library of plant DNA barcodes. Brown has been developing applications for this technology, said Kartzinel, and bringing together researchers from molecular biology and the computational side to solve problems faced by conservationists in the field. This is the first use of DNA metabarcoding to answer a long-term question about social foraging ecology, which is how members of a social group -- such as a family -- decide what foods to eat, Kartzinel said.

## Lack of sleep reduces cognitive benefits of physical activity

According to a new study by UCL researchers, regular physical activity may protect against cognitive decline as one ages, but this protective impact may be lessened for people who do not receive enough sleep.

The study, published in The Lancet Healthy Longevity, looked at cognitive function over 10 years in 8,958 people aged 50 and over in England. The research team investigated how different combinations of sleep and physical activity habits might affect people's cognitive function over time.

They found that people who were more physically active but had short sleeps - less than six hours on average - had faster cognitive decline overall, meaning that after 10 years their cognitive function was equivalent to peers who did less physical activity.

Lead author Dr Mikaela Bloomberg (UCL Institute of Epidemiology & Health Care) said: "Our study suggests that getting sufficient sleep may be required for us to get the full cognitive benefits of physical activity. It shows how important it is to consider sleep and physical activity together when thinking about cognitive health."

"Previous studies examining how sleep and physical activity might combine to affect cognitive function have primarily been cross-sectional - only focusing on a snapshot in time - and we were surprised that regular physical activity may not always be sufficient to counter the long-term effects of lack of sleep on cognitive health." The study found, in line with previous research, that sleeping between six



and eight hours per night and higher levels of physical activity were linked to better cognitive function.

Those who were more physically active also had better cognitive function regardless of how long they slept at the start of the study. This changed over the 10-year period, with more physically active short sleepers (less than six hours) experiencing more rapid cognitive decline. This rapid decline was true for those in their 50s and 60s in this group, but for older participants (aged 70 and over) the cognitive benefits of exercise appeared to be maintained, despite short sleep.

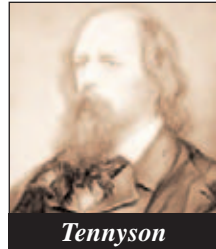
Co-author Professor Andrew Steptoe (UCL Institute of Epidemiology & Health Care) said: "It is important to identify the factors that can protect cognitive function in middle and later life as they can serve to prolong our cognitively healthy years and, for some people, delay a dementia diagnosis."

"The World Health Organisation already identifies physical activity as a way to maintain cognitive function, but interventions should also consider sleep habits to maximise long-term benefits for cognitive health."

# Study finds easier way to learn quantum processes

Researchers found a new way to teach a quantum computer how to understand and predict the behaviour of quantum systems, even with a few simple examples.

The study was published in the journal, 'Nature Communications.'

Quantum neural networks (QNNs) The researchers worked on quantum neural networks (QNNs), a type of machine-learning model designed to learn and process information using principles inspired by quantum mechanics in order to mimic the behaviour of quantum systems.

Just like the neural networks used in artificial intelligence, QNNs are made of interconnected nodes, or "neurons," that perform calculations. The difference is that, in QNNs, the neurons operate on the principles of quantum mechanics, allowing them to handle and manipulate quantum information.

"Normally, when we teach a computer something, we need a lot of examples," said Holmes. "But in this study, we show that with just a few simple examples called 'product states' the computer can learn how a quantum system



behaves even when dealing with entangled states, which are more complicated and challenging to understand."

Product states

The 'product states' that the scientists used to refer to a concept in quantum mechanics that describes the specific type of state for a quantum system. For example, if a quantum system is composed of two electrons, then its product state is formed when each individual electron's state is considered independently and then combined.

Product states are often used as a starting point in quantum computations and measurements because they provide a simpler and more manageable framework for studying and understanding the behaviour of quantum systems before moving on to more complex and entangled states where the particles

are correlated and cannot be described independently. Better quantum computers ahead

The researchers demonstrated that by training QNNs using only a few of these simple examples, computers can effectively grasp the complex dynamics of entangled quantum systems.

Holmes explained, "This means that might be able to learn about and understand quantum systems using smaller, simpler computers, like the near-term intermediary scale [NISQ] computers we're likely to have in the coming years, instead of needing large and complex ones, which may be decades away."

The work also opens up new possibilities for using quantum computers to solve important problems like studying complex new materials or simulating the behaviour of molecules.

Finally, the method improves the performance of quantum computers by enabling the creation of shorter and more error-resistant programs. By learning how quantum systems behave, we can streamline the programming of quantum computers, leading to improved efficiency and reliability. "We can make quantum computers even better by making their programs shorter and less prone to errors," said Holmes.

Working the summer bod to meet your fitness goals

With temperatures soaring, it can be hard to get yourself to exercise. On the other hand, exercising in an air-conditioned environment might cause you to overexert yourself, not keeping the current weather in mind. And that can be dangerous! Ahmedabad-based fitness trainer and nutritionist Neha Godiawala Shah explains, "Exercising in hot temperatures or in a humid atmosphere can increase your core body temperature. When the temperature is high, there is an increased risk of heart-related illnesses. If you are not careful, you can end up suffering from heat-related health conditions such as heat stroke, heat exhaustion or extreme dehydration, all of which can greatly derail you from your fitness goals. Too much exercise in the summer can lead to fatigue, headaches and nausea too." So, what should one do? Read on and find out how to exercise safely this season... Go For Quality Over Quantity "Exercise for about an hour a day in summer, which should include not more than 10 to 15 minutes of cardio and then strength/endurance training," advises Neha. "Weight training actually burns calories while you are working out, as well as during the recovery period post workout." Ahmedabad-based strength coach Brinda Mehta adds to this, "Strength train three to five times a week, add zone 2 cardio four to five days a week or play a recreational sport, and do pranayama and meditation daily for at least 10

to 15 minutes." She also says that, while there are no best exercises for summer, short-interval activities that need powerful muscle contraction can be beneficial. "A balanced workout should match your health goals and must be consistently doable in all conditions," she avers. WATCH OUT Neha Godiawala Shah shares some precautions



to take while exercising in summers: Wear light and loose clothes. Drink lots of water and other fluids to keep your body hydrated. Take a cold shower before and after your workout. Work out indoors. Do outdoor workouts early in the morning or late in the evening. Take small breaks in-between the workout if

needed. Instead of one full-hour workout, work out for smaller durations two or three times a day. Time It Right Brinda advises that, if you're working out outdoors, do so before 9 am and after 5 pm. This way, you're less likely to be exhausted due to the sun. If you're working out indoors, anytime is a good time as the temperature can be regulated with fans or air conditioners. "It's only when you are in excessively hot temperatures that the negative effects of heat exhaustion, fatigue and dehydration come into play, and you're unable to maintain your level of effort. Cardio endurance activities after 9 am can get difficult, but people generally train indoors in a gym where the temperature is regulated," she adds. Know When You're Going Overboard Yes, you want to push yourself and go the extra mile, but knowing when to stop is crucial so as to not hurt yourself. "Make sure you enjoy doing your workouts," says Neha. "When you start feeling tired, when your muscles start feeling too sore, when you start getting overuse injuries, when you can't work out at the same level, when you start feeling depressed, when your anxiety level increases, when you start getting irritated, when you start losing motivation, it means you are overdoing it!"

The Hollywood Reporter reported. "The stigma is that people don't do any acting in these shows," Clarke said. "And then you're like, 'Well, then why are they asking all these great actors to do it, and why are they saying yes?'" Green screen acting requires actors to perform in front of a

solid-colour background (usually green or blue). The footage is then tweaked in post-production by visual effects artists who replace the coloured filler with any background image or footage. The actress' rationale was that if it isn't "real" acting, then top actors, such as her Secret Invasion co-stars Samuel L. Jackson and Olivia Colman, wouldn't take on roles in projects that use green screens. "The cast is ridiculous," she added of her fellow cast members in the Marvel series. "I was like, 'Where do I sign?'"

Clarke's comments come more than two years after Anthony Hopkins, who has also been in the Marvel Cinematic Universe as Odin in the Thor films, criticised the green screen acting. "On Thor, you have Chris Hemsworth -- who looks like Thor -- and a director like Kenneth Branagh, who is so certain of what he wants," the actor explained at the time. "They put me in armor; they shoved a beard on me. Sit on the throne; shout a bit. If you're sitting in front of a green screen, it's pointless acting it."




Govt makes changes in rules to regularize plots divided unauthorisedly: Abhishek

He demanded from the government that the truth about the man-eating animal and the real reason behind the death of the farmer should come in front of the public and the officers of the forest department should create confidence in the public by setting up camps and create an atmosphere of fear and dread by catching the man-eating wild animal.
