CUET-UG results announced, 22,000 candidates score 100 percentile

NEW DELHI: The National Testing Agency on Saturday declared the results for the Common University Entrance Test-Undergraduate (CUET-UG), which showed that over 22,000 candidates scored 100 percentile. The maximum top scorers were in English, followed by Biology and Economics. Over 11.11 lakh candidates had appeared for the second edition of the entrance exam. While 5,685 candidates scored 100 percentile in English, 4,850 candidates got a top score in Biology/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry, followed by 2,836 in Economics. "The performance of every candidate has been evaluated using the equi-percentile method wherein normalised marks of each candidate have been calculated using the percentiles of each group of students in a given session across multiple days for the same subject," said Sadhana Parashar, Senior Director, National Testing Agency

PUNE: Veteran Marathi actordirector Ravindra Mahajani was found dead at a rented flat in Talegaon Dabhade area near Pune city, police said on Saturday. The 77-year-old yesteryear actor's body was recovered on Friday evening, the police said, adding that it is suspected that he died around three days ago. "We received a call from the neighbours of the flat, where Mahajani was staying alone, informing us about foul odour emanating from his house. As floodwaters recede in Punjab, Haryana; threat of water-borne diseases looms large

SHASHI PAL JAIN CHANDIGARH, JULY 15

Floodwaters have started receding in several places of Punjab and Haryana, battered by heavy downpour earlier this week, and relief work is underway in affected areas in both states, officials said on

With the threat of water and vector-borne diseases looming large in flood-affected areas, health department officials have been directed to take appropriate steps to prevent any such outbreak, they said. The officials also said that

medical camps have been set up in flood-hit areas and medicines are being distributed to people.

At least 39 people have died in rain-related incidents in Punjab and Haryana. According to official data, 19 people have died in rain-related incidents in Punjab while the death toll in Haryana stands at 20. Over 22,000 people have been

moved to safety from waterlogged localities in various flood-hit districts of Punjab. In neighbouring Haryana,



4,495 people have been evacuated. Fourteen districts - Patiala, Moga, Ludhiana, Mohali, Jalandhar, Sangrur, Pathankot, Tarn Taran, Ferozepur, Fatehgarh Sahib, Faridkot, Hoshiarpur, Rupnagar and SBS Nagar – have been affected in

In Haryana, the number of

districts affected in the recent heavy downpour stands at 13 - Ambala, Fatehabad, Faridabad, Panchkula, Kurukshetra, Karnal, Kaithal, Panipat, Sonipat, Palwal,

Sirsa and Yamunanagar. District authorities, along with personnel from the Army, Border Security Force and the National

were involved in the relief operations. They also distributed dry rations, medicines, drinking water and cattle fodder. The water level in the Hathnikund barrage in Haryana's Yamunanagar was at 54,012 cusecs at 11 am. The flow rate was significantly lower than Tuesday morning's 3.21 lakh cusecs, the officials added.

However, the overflowing Ghaggar river continues to wreak havoc in Khanauri and Moonak blocks in Sangrur district, inundating vast tracts in these areas.

In Patiala district, Shutrana, Samana and Sanour were the worstaffected areas.

Delhi floods: Swollen Yamuna recedes slowly, concerns remain amid rain forecast



NEW DELHI, JULY 15

After wreaking havoc on lives and livelihoods in parts of Delhi close to it, the swollen Yamuna on Saturday morning followed a downward trend albeit at a slow pace of a few centimetres per hour. However, it is still flowing over two metres above the danger mark of 205.33 metres. The situation could worsen if weather predictions of more rain in the capital and upper catchment areas come true. According to the Central Water Commission's floodmonitoring portal, the Yamuna water level declined to 207.62 metres by 7 am on Saturday from its peak of 208.66 metres at 8 pm on Thursday. With the flow rate from the Hathnikund Barrage in Haryana's Yamunanagar decreasing over

the past two days, further decline is expected. The India Meteorological Department (IMD), however, anticipated moderate rain in the city over the next two days and "heavy to very heavy" rainfall over Uttarakhand. Himachal Pradesh, and Uttar Pradesh during the next five days, raising concern about a rise in the water level in the river. In the case of more rain in Delhi, experts said, stormwater may overflow and take longer than usual to drain Waterlogging could compound the situation further. Rahul moves SC for stay on conviction in 'Modi' surname defamation case

NEW DELHI, JULY 15

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Saturday moved the Supreme Court against the Gujarat High Court order dismissing his plea seeking a stay on his conviction in a criminal defamation case over his "Modi surname" remark.



Gandhi's petition was likely to be taken up for hearing early next week. Following a Surat Court's March 23 verdict convicting him in the defamation case and giving him two-year imprisonment, Gandhi elected to the Lok Sabha from Wayanad in Kerala in 2019 -- was disqualified as an MP under the Representation of the People Act. A stay on his conviction would pave the way for his reinstatement as an MP. Noting that Gandhi was already facing 10 criminal cases across India, Justice Hemant Prachchhak of the Gujarat High Court had on July 7 said there was no reasonable ground to stay the conviction and the Magisterial court's order was "just, proper and legal".

2. Risk of coronary artery disease: High blood pressure damages the inner lining of blood vessels, promoting the accumulation of plaque. This can result in the narrowing and hardening of the arteries, a condition called atherosclerosis. When the coronary arteries that supply blood to the heart muscle become narrow or blocked, it can lead to chest pain (angina), heart attacks, or other

Editorial On way to the moon, with India's prayers

ndia's pride in taking another 'moonshot' is in the air now and a spacecraft is on its way to a lunar orbit. It was always believed that a good start is half the job done, but in this case the far trickier part remains. Landing the rover on the surface of the moon is the challenge ahead whose result we will not know until about August 23 when the sun rises on the moon for a long lunar day.

If the lessons of Chandrayaan-1 and 2 have been learnt and have led the redesigning on the drawing board, there should be room for much optimism on this mission succeeding in soft-landing the lander, with its four engines with throttles, and containing the rover whose exploratory journey on the moon will last just one lunar day or 14 earth days.

A soft landing is all too critical considering it is a necessary precursor to sending Indian astronauts to the Moon, aboard the much-anticipated Gaganyaan mission. There was a well of sympathy for our dedicated scientists when the Chandrayaan-2 crash landed in 2019 as this difficult mission that only three nations — the US, Russia, and China — have cracked thus far is known to be hazardous.

What they have done to give themselves a better chance now is impressive, with the lander having been endowed with stronger legs and the mission additional ability to scout sites and pick an ideal landing spot somewhere near the Moon's south pole. Even so, there is no knowing how effective it is until the soft landing is

Chandrayaan-3's lander has hazard detection and avoidance systems based on cameras for safe landing and for the rover to then move on the Moon's surface. All improvements are based on the experience of the first two missions in 2008 and 2019. On the first it was possible only to let the spacecraft thud on to the surface and on the second a navigation malfunction in the propulsion system led to the crash landing that rendered the lander and rover useless whereas the orbiter continued its lonely journeys around the Moon and contributed invaluable scientific data.

It is fingers crossed as the nation with an array of projects on the anvil - from a mission to the Sun to joining Nasa in sending astronauts to the International Space Station strives to validate its capabilities and satisfy its aspirations to be the next big player in space after the old and new superpowers and claim its place in the forefront of scientific developments.

Of Gujjus & Maharashtrians: Will Pawar show who's boss?

e Maharashtrians are the most "khad-dus" people on earth. I suspect nobody likes us. I mean... I also think we don't like ourselves, forget others! There's something almost perverse about the Maharashtrian psyche: While we always puff our chests with pride in public and go into the "Me, Marathi" mode with non-Maharashtrians, there is zero sense of unity... no feelings of kinship, leave aside love for fellow Maharashtri-

I watched a mixed-up but charming film Satyaprem ki Katha recently. It was goofy, immature and pretty idiotic. But the Gujjus in the hall loved it! Why? Because it was about Gujjus... And they enjoy being all things Gujju. They identify as "Gujjus", and that identity is a matter of great "gaurav" for them, a badge that unites all the various factions within the community. Not so for Maharashtrians. The first thing we do is look for faults: our differences. Next, we focus on caste hierarchies. Feel superior to our neighbours. Turn up our noses at mixed gatherings where lesser beings are also present. Make snarky remarks about all and sundry. Naturally, we aren't the most popular folks to hang out with. And it's not like we hang out with our



own kind either... we hate everybody. Besides, who qualifies as being our own kind... mere apne? Not even blood relatives!

Take that, Ajit Pawar. It's safe to conclude Maharashtrians trust no one. Not even their own shadows.

The Marathi Manoos is a strange beast: neither fish nor fowl. But, my goodness, don't ask about the conceit component. We call it parochial pride in our identity: "Intellectual Warriors". But it is something else. We love jhagdas... provided we win the round. We make poor, sore losers: right now,

the biggest loser in Maharashtra seems to be Sharad Pawar. But don't be fooled. He is by far the shrewdest politician in India. And the toughest. Those who are writing him off gleefully need to revisit the well-documented Sharad Pawar saga. The Strongman has seen them come and go... and seen off most contemporaries. He ain't going anywhere. Don't expect Saheb to walk off into

the sunset anytime soon. If there's one politico who's an expert at buying over the harshest adversaries, it is Pawar. This fighting spirit is tied to sound commer-

cials -- bijness. Money not just talks, it hollers.

aren't Maharashtrians good with money. They aren't "born business people", like, say, the Marwaris or Sindhis. Plus, they are notoriously kanjoos.

But they sure as hell know one attribute that's a pre-requisite for survival in challenging environments: self-interest. Nobody is really thinking about Maharashtra's interest at the moment. The fight is over the spoils. How to divide up the massive loot accumulated over decades. Just like the Gandhi family: only more loot, ac-

Pawar wealth. If Sonia Gandhi has had to worry about an adventurous son-in-law all her political life, Sharad Pawar has been blessed... or burdened... with an ambitious nephew. Both Robert Vadra and Ajit Pawar have outlived their respective uses. And both Sonia and Sharad refuse to quit. The debate isn't about gender or age. It's about control and perception. Are they still in charge of their flocks? Or are they just hanging on to the keys of the tijori like mean-spirited, semi-senile Daadimas in extended joint families. In that sense, Sonia Gandhi must have been a Maharashtrian in her last life... she shares the same characteristics with our NCP chieftain when it comes

Maharashtrians don't have "jigri dosts". I sometimes feel that classic song "Dost, dost na raha... pyaar, pyaar na raha..." was composed by a Maharashtrian for Maharashtrians as an anthem for Maharashtrians.

to playing power games.

In reality, the song from the 1964 movie Sangam was sung by Mukesh and pictured on Raj Kapoor (both non-Maharashtrian). It had elements of victimisation and martyrdom. Betrayal and self-pity. The lyrics are still popular and resonate with millions. Perhaps it will offer a bit of comfort to Sharad Pawar as he licks his wounds and gets nostalgic about Praful Patel.

Hectic haggling afoot... who gets what and when. Patel's major handicap is his surname. There's an insurmountable hurdle right there: how can a Patel from Gujarat aspire to be anything but an aide to a Maratha? Which self-respecting Maratha would accept Praful Patel as the boss of the party... a worthy successor to Pawar, regardless of the man's ability or performance? His closeness to the Pawar parivaar is what propelled suave Praful's career. He was seen as a confidant, a powerhouse, a loyal ally. But Patel must have known all along he'd reach this far and no further. The grassroots party worker, steeped in caste and hierarchies, never did accept an "outsider" like Patel as leader. He didn't enjoy a political base, despite his high-profile persona and reputation as a dynamic doer. Let's overlook the Air India fiasco, for now.


Possibly carcinogenic: WHO on artificial sweetener aspartame

The World Health Organisation's cancer research arm on Friday classified artificial sweetener aspartame, widely used in foods and beverages like diet cokes, as possibly carcinogenic, citing "limited evidence" for its carcinogenicity (potential to cause cancer) in hu-

Aspartame widely used since the 1980s in foods and beverages, including diet drinks, chewing gum, gelatin, ice cream, yogurt, breakfast cereal, toothpaste and medications such as cough drops and chewable vitamins

The WHO's International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) and the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO)'s Joint Expert Committee on Food Additives (JECFA) kept current daily recommended dosages of aspartame in foods and drinks unchanged at 40 mg per kg of body weight saying proof of the product causing cancer in humans was limited and moderate intake was safe. The IARC has four levels of classification to rate cancer causing products—Group-1: definitely carcinogenic with sufficient evidence of cancer in humans; Group-2A: probably carcinogenic with limited evidence of cancer in humans, but sufficient evidence in experimental animals; Group-2B: possibly carcinogenic with limited evidence of cancer in humans and less than sufficient evidence in animals; and Group-3: not classifiable for cancer.

A 70-kg adult would need to consume over 9–14 diet soft drink cans (containing 200 or 300 mg of aspartame) to exceed



acceptable daily intake, assuming no intake from other food sources

Aspartame has been placed in Group-2B category alongside gasoline engine exhaust, occupational exposure as hairdressers or barbers and lead. Group-1 includes tobacco smoking, solar radiation, alcoholic beverages and ionising radiation. Group-2A features emissions from high temperature frying, DDT, consumption of red meat and night shift work. Simply put, consumers with moderate intake of diet cokes and other aspartamecontaining products needn't worry. "Data evaluated indicates no sufficient reason to change the previously established acceptable daily intake (ADI) of 0-40 mg/kg body weight for aspartame and it is safe to consume within this limit per day," the

IARC said. With a can of diet soft drink containing 200 or 300 mg of aspartame, an adult weighing 70kg would need to consume more than 9–14 cans per day to exceed the acceptable daily intake, assuming no other intake from other food sources.

The very sight of food was nauseating and distressing. I would still force myself to eat but I used to feel full midway after

forcing a few morsels inside. Gradually, I noticed that even though I could make out what's sweet, salty or sour, flavours and aroma that tickle our taste buds were not there anymore. I stopped enjoying my food and my cravings died a sudden death. I would just imagine the flavour in my head and ate whatever I was able to so as to have some strength for my body.

A sordid tale in UK as top BBC presenter lands in huge scandal

uw Edwards, the chief and respected presenter of the BBC's flagship Ten O'clock News, a singular summary of the world each day, is now reported to be in a mental health institution. He was suspended from his duties on Sunday, July 9, and was absent from the programme for the next few days as the result of a national scandal that has preoccupied Britain for the past week. For five days the dramatis personae involved remained anonymous and now only Huw Edwards'



identity has been revealed by his wife who said her husband has suffered for 20 years

under stress and depression. His shameful acts, she said, are the products of this sad

Edwards has been, gentle reader, the most respected celebrity presenter on the national broadcaster and I have watched his presentation admiringly for decades. Now it's all over for him and I'm sorry.

The story that emerges is a sordid, perhaps pitiable one. Let me recall it:

At the end of last week, The Sun newspaper, a scandal sheet of the yellow press, broke a story that could further its constant preoccupation with attacking the BBC. The story caused national intrigue. The people involved weren't named by The Sun, which only said that a prominent BBC presenter was involved in soliciting lewd pornographic pictures from a young person, whose gender was not specified, and that this presenter had paid the young person £35,000 over the years. The moth-

er of the young person, concerned that this "victim" had used the money to become a crack cocaine addict, lodged a complaint with the relevant BBC department. The Sun reported the date of the complaint and implied that the BBC was complacent about it as it had not dismissed or suspended the presenter.

When the story was published and picked up by other newspapers and reported by the BBC itself, Edwards was suspended, pending a BBC investigation, even though his name didn't appear in the

When the BBC announced that the unnamed presenter had been suspended and so would not appear on his programme, scores of BBC radio and TV presenters who happened to be on holiday, reasonably concluded that their absence would cause listeners or viewers to conclude that they were the suspended, alleged offender. Several of them scrambled to deny that they were -- on their Twitter, etc, accounts and some even reached for their lawyers and publicists to say "It's not me, I swear!"

A radio presenter called Jeremy Vine gave a TV interview which called on the unnamed presenter to "out" himself so as to stop, out of decency and compassion, the speculation about other colleagues of

his being the suspects in his case. Then things, gentle reader, get curiouser and curiouser. A lawyer who was representing the young person involved told the media and the BBC that the whole story was rubbish and no such exchange of money and photographs took place. The parents of the alleged "model" insist that they have passed solid evidence to the contrary to The Sun.

And then more emerges.

Another young individual, again age and gender unspecified, tells the media that he or she was approached on a dating app by the same presenter who at first didn't identify himself, then proposed meeting and, when he did identify himself and amazed his contact who might have revealed his identity, the presenter abused and threatened this potential date.

The threatened party assured the me-

dia that the threats were scary.

The BBC said it couldn't reveal the presenter's identity for legal reasons, but on Wednesday, after five days of scandal and news turmoil and speculation, Huw Edwards' wife identified him as the presenter in question. What is amusing is that The Sun, till 2015, used to run a famous "Page 3" on which it featured nude women and, before the 2003 law which made the publication or exchange of lewd photographs of people under 18 illegal, featured 16-year-olds in nude poses with doubleentendre captions.

Application for 1,411 seats in State Board of Technical **Education till July 19**

People in various parts of the district on Saturday heaved a sigh of relief when drinking water started flowing through their taps. There was no water in the town for the last six days due to the washing away of the huge pipes connecting its source with the water supply scheme of Hamirpur town.

However, townsmen said they received muddy water today and that it was unfit for drinking. They demanded that they be provided with neat and clean water for drinking purposes. For want of water in taps, it was being sold through private tankers at a cost of one thousand seven hundred per tanker, and that too was not available to the common

water, the people were rushing to the wells and hand pumps to fetch the water for their needs, but that was also insufficient for them. The worst affected were those living on the top floors on rent. Feeling the pinch of water shortage in the town, local MLA, Ashish Sharma and President of the local Civic body, Manoj Minhas came to the rescue of the people and provided water through tankers to the people from their own funds so that there was no water problem for the people. Meanwhile, the Jal Shakti Department has appealed to all the residents of the district to take special precautions to prevent water-borne diseases during the rainy season. The department's superintendent

engineer, Neeraj Bhogal, said during the rainy season there is a possibility of water bodies getting dirty, and sometimes the water becomes muddy. Although the Jal Shakti Department is determined to provide clean drinking water to all the people, in spite of this, there is a possibility of water-borne diseases spreading in the rainy season. Therefore, all the residents of the district must boil drinking water for at least 20 minutes during this season. This kills all types of bacteria present in the water. He said if the water becomes cloudy due to heavy rains, it can be filtered through a cloth and kept in a separate bucket or other vessel. After filtering, the fine soil is stored under water in a bucket or vessel. After

completely safe. Neeraj Bhogal appealed to the residents of the district to regularly clean the water storage utensils and the tanks of the house. He said water utensils should always be kept covered. The Superintending Engineer said the department has also given field testing kits to all gram panchayats for sampling and testing of water. By contacting the panchayat offices, the residents of the district can also get the water or the water sources in their respective areas tested. He has also appealed to all the residents of the district to take precautions and cooperate with the Jal Shakti Department.

settlement of Himachal. A lot of damage has happened in Himachal.





She said similarly the Ghaggar had also breached at Rorki due to which around 12 villages of Sardulgarh were threatened.

Appealing to the chief minister Bhagwant Mann to direct the civil administration to take urgent steps to close the breach besides undertaking relief measures, Mrs Harsimrat Badal said "there are widespread reports that the Punjab government machinery is not reaching flood affected people in time. Due to this the suffering of the people has increased ten times. The chief minister must review the situation immediately and take necessary action to mitigate the suffering of the people". She also made a fervent appeal to allocate all funds earmarked for advertising – which are in hundreds of crores – for flood relief measures besides calling for an end to photo ops.
