Markets closed down in Imphal to demand peace in Manipur

IMPHAL: The main markets at Imphal were closed down on Friday as the traders and business community staged a sit-in protest at Thangal Keithel to demand restoration of peace. All Bazar Community and Traders organization said the protest was held on the theme "Ahimsa (non-violence) Pramo Dharma" live and let Live " for restoration of Peace in the entire state of Manipur". The closure of the main markets in Imphal affected normal supply of all goods. Meanwhile, displaced people from the border town of Moreh and Churachandpur also staged protests demanding restoration of peace. Houses, shops, hotels, newspaper offices at Moreh which were vacated.

Karnataka toilet video: BJP worker arrested for "Derogatory" post

BENGALURU: A BJP worker was today arrested in Bengaluru for an alleged derogatory social media post against Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah. The accused, Shakunthala, had shared a Congress leader's tweet -- alleging the BJP was using the Udupi case as a political weapon -- with her own comments stating that if this happened to Siddaramaiah's daughter-in-law or his wife, "Would you still say this?" she said. The alleged derogatory posts against the Chief Minister were shared on Twitter and Facebook. A complaint was filed at High Grounds Police Station in Bengaluru, and the police arrested her after registering a case.

Japanese Foreign Minister takes ride in Delhi metro

NEW DELHI: Japanese Foreign Minister Yoshimasa Hayashi, who is on his two-day visit to India, took a ride on Delhi metro on Friday. In pictures shared by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan, Hayashi could be seen using token to take a metro ride here in the national capital. He was accompanied by his security entourage and officials. Japanese Deputy Press Secretary, Yukiko Okano said that Yoshimasa Hayashi took a ride of three to four metro stations. The Japanese Foreign Minister arrived in Delhi on Thursday as part of his two-day tour to India.

LS, RS adjourned amid ruckus over Manipur

The Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha were adjourned for the day on Friday, amid continued slogan-shouting from the Opposition benches over the demand for a discussion on the Manipur situation. Earlier, on Friday, the Lower House was adjourned till 12 noon after convening at 11 am, as Opposition members continued to disrupt proceedings demanding that all listed businesses be set aside for a discussion on the Manipur situation. Amid persistent uproar over Manipur and the motion of no-confidence against the Centre, both Houses were adjourned till 11 am on Monday. Upon the resumption of the session on Friday, Opposition members in the Lok Sabha demanded an immediate discussion on the no-confidence motion, which was filed by Congress MP Gaurav Gogoi and accepted by Speaker Om Birla. The Speaker called for Question Hour as the Lower House reconvened but the Opposition members kept disrupting proceedings demanding a discussion on Manipur and the motion of no confidence. Citing a precedent from 1978, Congress Lok Sabha MP Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury said the Lower House, then, had allowed a debate on the no-confidence motion on the day it was tabled and admitted. Meanwhile, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi on Friday reiterated that the government was ready to debate all issues raised by the Opposition but at a date and time decided by the Speaker, adding that the rules provide for a 10-day window.

Mines and minerals amendment bill passed

NEW DELHI: The Lok Sabha on Friday passed Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Bill, 2023. The Bill amended the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957. The Act regulates the mining sector. Union Minister for Coal and Mines Pralhad Joshi moved the bill for consideration and passing in the Lok Sabha. Meanwhile, the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha were adjourned for the day on Friday, amid continued slogan-shouting from the Opposition benches over the demand for a discussion on the Manipur situation. 110-per cent increase in number of MBBS seats since 2014
NEW DELHI: There has been an 82-per cent increase in the number of medical colleges in the country, from 387 before 2014 to 704 now, and a 110-per cent increase in the number of MBBS seats, from 51,348 to 1,07,948, in the same period, Parliament was informed on Friday. In a written response to a question in the Lok Sabha, Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya said there has also been an increase of 117 per cent in the number of post-graduate (PG) medical seats.

CM Mann hands over regular job letters to 12, 710 teachers

Asserting that he is there to resolve all the issues faced by the teaching fraternity, Bhagwant Mann said that being son of a teacher he knew the problems of the teachers very well adding that he is duty bound to

resolve all of them. He said that the state exchequer belongs to the people and every single penny will be judiciously utilised for the well being of every strata of society. Citing an incident where life of a girl from border village was transformed by his strenuous efforts as an artist, the Chief Minister said that girl was facing severe hardships to pursue education but due to his humble effort she scripted new success story in life adding that if an artist can do this then the head of state can do much more. He said that it was unfortunate that these teachers had to work on meagre salaries and had to protest for their lawful rights due to apathy of successive governments.

Tiger Day: Big leap in India numbers cause for celebration and also concern

One tiger and scores of tourists in open jeeps asking each other in piercing whispers to be quiet as they train their binoculars and cameras on it, getting perilously close to the animal while they do so. The all too familiar scene captured in innumerable social media posts could be from Ranthambore or Corbett, Tadoba or Kanha - a snapshot as it were of the human-animal dilemma that has seen the number of tigers in India go up while their habitat shrinks and often brought humans just too close to the big cats. The rising tiger population, which



has also spotlighted the development versus ecology debate, is cause for celebration and also concern, experts said ahead of International Tiger Day on Saturday.

With 3,167 tigers according to the 2022 tiger census, about 75 per cent of the global numbers, the once elusive bright orange fur and distinct low rumbling roar is not so rare anymore. Scripting a remarkable story of conservation, Project Tiger started 50 years ago in 1973 when the count was just 268. However, it has come with increasing human interference in wildlife corridors, thinning prey density, a worsening quality of India's forest cover and change in policies, all of which can offset the gains, the experts said. "This achievement of conservatising tigers, despite our population density and other pressures hasn't come easy and it's been a gradual process since the onset of Project

Tiger. We can be justifiably proud that the tiger continues to thrive in India, even as it is unfortunately extinct in some range countries. This success can be attributed to our people's tolerance, political will and a strong legal and policy framework, one of the strongest in the world," wildlife conservationist Prema Bindra told a news agency. Over the last few years, however, the legal framework is being "diluted", she alleged, citing the recent proposed amendments to the Forest Conservation Act, 1980, or "passing of detrimental development projects in protected areas, mining in tiger habitats, and projects like the Ken Betwa river link in Panna tiger reserve".

Santokh Singh murder case: Three shooters of Gopi Dallewalia gang arrested

CHANDIGARH, JULY 28

The ongoing drive against anti-social elements launched on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann got a major breakthrough after Punjab Police's Anti-Gangster Task Force (AGTF) in a joint operation with Moga Police solved the cold-blooded murder of Santokh Singh with the arrest of three shooters of Gopi Dallewalia gang, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Friday.

Those arrested have been identified as Nirmal Singh alias Nimma, Aprail Singh alias Shera and Jaskaran Singh alias Karan. Police teams have also recovered three .32 calibre pistols along with 10 live cartridges and a Hyundai Verna car, which was used in a crime, from their possession. According to the information, four assailants shot dead Santokh Singh after barging into his house



in Moga on July 16, 2023. DGP Gaurav Yadav said that a team of AGTF under the supervision of ADGP Promod Ban, led by AIG AGTF Sandeep Goel along with Moga Police following reliable intel inputs have arrested the three persons, who are shooters and associated with the notorious Gopi Dallewalia gang, from the area of Mehatpur in Jalandhar. He said

Gangster Gopi Dallewalia is a proclaimed offender with more than 12 criminal cases pertaining to murder, attempt to murder, extortion, Arms Act, etc have been registered against him, he added.

Giving more details, AIG Sandeep Goel said that the Police teams are on a manhunt to nab the remaining accused persons.

Further investigations are on, he added. A case FIR no. 155 dated 16/07/2023 was already registered under sections 302 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and section 25 of the Arms Act at Police Station City Moga.

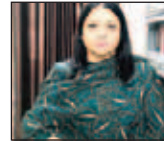

Food Corporation of India General Manager Pankaj Chowdhary said that the Food Corporation of India made some partial improvements in the conditions of the weekly e-auction of wheat to maintain the availability of wheat to the enterprises manufacturing wheat products like flour, maida, semolina, porridge etc. So that the availability of wheat to different owned units can be ensured, which will prove to be helpful in keeping the market prices of wheat products stable. Earlier, a maximum of 100 metric tonnes of wheat could be purchased on a single GST number, which has now been linked with the GST as well as the PAN number and the maximum limit of purchase on a single PAN number has been fixed at 100 metric tonnes. Is. He said that the units/undertakings who buy wheat in the auction will also have to give a certificate that wheat products will be manufactured by their own venture from the wheat purchased by them in the auction and not the purchased wheat from any other company. Will be sold to the enterprise or trader. The undertakings participating in the auction to be held on every Wednesday will now have to deposit the earnest money by 6 pm on Monday, instead of earlier depositing it till Tuesday. Food Corporation of India has so far sold 8200 metric tonnes of wheat in five weekly auctions in the e-auction that started from June 28 and the sale of wheat and rice will continue in the open market in future also.

to rain, the administrative officials arrived around 10.30 am, where they had to face the opposition of the people. On this occasion, social worker Sukhdev Chaudhary came in favor of the people and accused the administration saying that the administration is destroying the shops without marking.

He also said that people are being bullied by the administration by marking them of their own free will and they will take the stand of the court against this. A heavy police

force was present with the administration during the removal of encroachment on Friday morning. SHO Zirakpur Simarjaneet Singh also tried to explain to the people that the shops are being demolished only as per the orders of the court. The police had to be a little stricter to convince the people. According to the administration, this road is to be made 110 feet wide. But some shopkeepers have come with a stay order from the court, whose shops have not been demolished.

Ms. Kalpana.K IFS Field Director told that World Nature Conservation Day is an annual event held on July 28.

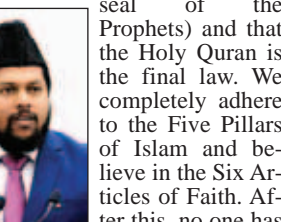
Statement of Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind divisive, violates principles of religious harmony

VERMA GURDASPUR, JULY 28

In a press release issued recently, Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind (an organisation of Indian Muslim scholars) has backed the decision of the Andhra Pradesh Waqf Board that declared the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community as "non-Muslim". The Ahmadiyya Muslim Community India strongly denounces the stance of Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind, considering it divisive and against the principles of inter-religious harmony. The press release contains false and misleading information about the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community and its legal status in India.

The Ahmadiyya Muslim Community has always proclaimed with utmost sincerity and conviction that we pronounce the Islamic creed

"La Ilaha Ilallah Muham-madur Rasulullah," meaning, "There is none worthy of worship except Allah, and Muhammadsaw is the messenger of Allah". The Community also believes that Prophet Muhammadsaw is Khatamun Nabiyyeen (the seal of the Prophets) and that the Holy Quran is the final law. We completely adhere to the Five Pillars of Islam and believe in the Six Articles of Faith. After this, no one has the right to declare Ahmadi Muslims as non-Muslims.



It should be remembered that various Indian High Courts have upheld the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community's right to be recognised as an Islamic sect. For instance, Justice V R Krishna Iyer, an important figure in the Indian Judiciary, stated in his historic judgment dated 8 December 1970 that the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community is a part of Islam. He made it clear in the judgment that "looking at the issue devoid of sentiment and passion and in the cold light of the law I have no hesitation to hold that the Ahmadiya sect is of Islam and not alien".

Similarly, the Patna High Court in 1916 and the Madras High Court in 1922 recognised the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community as a sect of Islam. Moreover, in the 2011 census report, the Community was counted as an Islamic sect.

Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind's reference to certain fatwas by different organisations is regrettable and goes against the spirit of religious pluralism that India upholds. Fatwas, as non-binding legal opinions, should not be used to question the religious identity or status of any community.

AICTE assigned project to translate engineering books from English to Punjabi

Rights choice

Transparency comes painfully to recent leaders of the Indian democracy. Or does not come at all. It is, therefore, hardly surprising that the Right to Information Act would only be formulated after protracted struggles by activists and campaigners. It was initially welcomed as enshrining the people’s right to ensure accountability and transparency while keeping authorities and institutions on their toes. But the authorities’ anxiety to exclude rather than include certain chairs or institutions from its purview never made its path smooth. One of the longest debates has been over the exclusion of political parties, and the issue is back again in a batch of petitions before the Supreme Court. Although a three-commissioner sitting of the Central Information Commission had declared six political parties to be among ‘public authorities’ as defined in the Representation of People Act in 2013 and therefore subject to the right to information, the Union government overrode this in the same year. So no political party has ever had to answer questions from the public about specific facts.

The situation raises some questions about expectations and boundaries in a democratic country. How transparent is transparency? If voters expect that political parties should publish the number and nature of cases pending against their candidates, their expectations are seldom fulfilled although parties have been instructed to do so. Would applying the RTI Act help in the face of such reluctance? Transparency about funding may be another expectation; to dismiss this out of hand as was done by the CIC in 2020 raises questions about politicians’ sense of responsibility. How much trust have they earned? Political parties have each their own methods of decision-making, whether about strategies or candidates. Is this a boundary a questioning voter may not cross? The questions raised by the debate over political parties being protected from the RTI Act ultimately lead to the kind of democracy the Indian people wish to have and should have. If there are limits to the information they can ask for, as in matters of national security, these limits should be clearly laid out and explained with reason. Whether or not political parties are public authorities, their fundamental role in an electoral democracy and therefore in people’s lives and beliefs is undeniable. That is why the debate is necessary and important.

BRICS Summit 2023: Shaping equitable global order

As South Africa anticipates hosting the eminent 15th BRICS Summit in Johannesburg, the world awaits with bated breath to witness the unfolding of this influential alliance on the global stage. Formed as BRIC and later joined by South Africa, BRICS stands as a beacon of economic optimism, presenting an alternative global order to challenge the dominance of traditional institutions.

With a track record of accomplishments through the New Development Bank and the Contingent Reserve Arrangement, BRICS draws interest from numerous nations seeking an equitable platform of representation. This defining moment summons unity and commitment, promising a future of fairness and prosperity for the Global South.

South Africa is poised to host the prestigious 15th BRICS Summit in Johannesburg from 22nd to 24th August 2023 with great anticipation. Initially formed as BRIC, a visionary concept coined by Goldman Sachs economist Jim O’Neil in 2001. The alliance was comprised of Brazil, Russia, India, and China - a collective representation of burgeoning emerging markets brimming with current and future economic prowess. In a momentous development in 2010, South Africa joined the ranks, bestowing the acronym BRICS upon this formidable bloc of nations. Now, on the



culsp of this landmark event, the world eagerly awaits the world awaits with bated breath to witness the unfolding of this influential alliance on the global stage.

As a consortium of the world’s five fastest emerging economies, the BRICS exudes profound economic optimism. It was touted to present an alternative global order that would act as a formidable response to the Washington consensus-driven Bretton Woods Institutions. The heft of the group springs from the fact that it comprises 3.2 billion people collectively, that is,

42 per cent of the total world population. BRICS economies represent 27 per cent of the global Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and over 18 per cent of global trade.

These countries also register 50 per cent of the total global economic growth, making them the most significant countries propelling global growth. Over the years, the BRICS has accomplished several achievements. The two notable ones are the New Development Bank and the Contingent Reserve Arrangement. The New Development Bank (NDB) was launched in

2014 with an initial capital of USD 50 billion, with member countries making an equal contribution of \$10 billion each.

It is contended as a new multilateral bank that provides an alternative to Bretton Woods Institutions of the IMF and the World Bank. It also claims to have a fairer governance structure by being democratic as all the original members have equal votes and say in its functioning. The NDB is highly respectful of member states’ laws and rules. It provides faster financing than the World Bank, and without

imposing strict conditions like the IMF. With a substantial investment of USD 32.8 billion already directed towards 96 projects within BRICS member countries, the NDB displays an impressive track record. Ambitiously, it seeks to broaden the horizons of its operations further. The NDB is open to new members as well and in 2021, countries like Egypt, the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Bangladesh and Uruguay became stakeholders by acquiring its shares.

The Contingent Reserve Arrangement works as a liquidity mechanism to support BRICS member countries that are facing balance of payment issues or struggling with payments. A series of swap arrangements were established among the BRICS member countries’ central banks.

This swap arrangement provided for an exchange of local currency for hard currencies such as the US dollar by the central bank of the member country facing a balance of payment crisis with other member countries of the BRICS.

These mechanisms are attracting many other emerging economies and developing countries that have had poor past experiences and lingering issues with IMF’s structural adjustment programmes and austerity measures.

It has become one of the significant reasons why several countries have expressed their keen interest in joining the BRICS grouping.

Yoga benefits older women at risk of Alzheimer’s disease: Study

According to a UCLA Health study, Kundalini yoga, a type of yoga that focuses on breathing, meditation, and mental visualisation, appeared beneficial for older women who had risk factors for Alzheimer’s disease and were concerned about episodes of memory deterioration.

Using a type of MRI that measures activity in regions and subregions of the brain, UCLA Semel Institute for Neuroscience and Human Behaviour researchers discovered that Kundalini yoga, which combines movement and meditation and focuses on breathing, mantra recitation, and mental visualisation, increased connectivity in an area of the brain that can be impacted by stress and is associated with memory decline. The findings were published early online in the Journal of Alzheimer’s Disease.

Led by psychiatrist Dr Helen Lavretsky, UCLA researchers studied the effects of yoga compared to



the gold-standard approach of memory enhancement training (MET) on connectivity in subregions of the hippocampus, a critical area of the brain for learning and memory. MET is derived from techniques that use verbal and visual association and practical strategies to improve memory.

“Kundalini yoga training appears to better target stress-related hippocampal connectivity, whereas MET may better target sensory-integration subregions of the hippocampus, supporting better memory reliability,” said Lavret-

sky, director of the Late-Life Mood, Stress, and Wellness Research Program.

“The key takeaway is that this study adds to the literature supporting the benefits of yoga for brain health, especially for women who have greater perceived stress and subjective memory impairment,” she said, adding, “This gentle form of yoga, which focuses more on breathing and mental engagement than on movement, like other forms of yoga, is ideal for older adults who may have some physical limitations.”

China providing technology, equipment to Russia

China is providing technology and equipment to Russia, which is engaged in war with Ukraine, according to a report from the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, United States.

The report titled, "Support Provided by the People's Republic of China to Russia," said that China has become the most important trading partner of Russia after trade with Western countries plunged in 2022.

"The customs records show PRC state-owned defence companies shipping navigation equipment, jamming technology, and fighter-jet parts to sanctioned Russian Government-owned defence companies," the report read. "Russia has continued to acquire chips through circuitous routes, with a large portion flowing through small traders in Hong Kong and mainland PRC, according to the foreign press," it further added.

China's buying has been spurred by steep discounts on oil and is providing Moscow much-needed revenue particularly after the Group of Seven (G-7) imposed a USD 60 price cap on Russian crude in December 2022, it said.

The report was mandated by the Intelligence Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2023, passed by Congress, and was released by House Intelligence Committee Democrats. According to the report, Russian imports from China have increased by 13 per cent to USD 76 billion in 2022, and its exports to the PRC increased by 43 per cent to USD 114 billion. Total bilateral trade between the PRC and Russia hit a record high level of



USD 190 billion in 2022, which is a 30 per cent increase from 2021. China is also providing supertankers and insurance coverage to move Russian Urals crude to PRC ports, as Moscow seeks vessels for exports after a G-7 oil price cap restricted the use of Western cargo services and insurance.

It is difficult to ascertain the extent to which the PRC has helped Russia evade and circumvent sanctions and export controls. Russia has turned to the PRC for critical components, according to PRC firms involved in the shipments, which has provided some measure of protection against the adverse effects of sanctions and export controls, the report read.

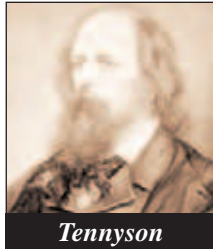
Earlier, US President Joe Biden-led administration has repeatedly raised concerns with China over its companies selling non-lethal equipment to Russia for use in Ukraine, but US officials say they have seen no signs so far that China has provided weapons or lethal military aid to Russia, as per CNN. The US believes that at the outset of the war, China intended to sell Russia lethal weapons for use in Ukraine, a US official previously told CNN.

How short bursts of daily activity are associated with reduced cancer risk

A total of just 4.5 minutes of intense activity that causes you to huff and puff while performing everyday tasks, according to a promising new study, may lower your chance of developing various malignancies by up to 32 per cent.

The study, which was headed by the University of Sydney in Australia and was published in JAMA Oncology, tracked the daily activity of more than 22,000 "non-exercisers" using data from wearable devices. The clinical health records of the group were then monitored by researchers for nearly seven years in order to check for cancer.

As few as four to five minutes of vigorous intermittent lifestyle physical activity or 'VILPA' was associated with a substantially lower cancer risk compared to those who undertook no VILPA.

Vigorous Intermittent Lifestyle Physical Activity, or VILPA for short, was coined by researchers at the University of Sydney’s Charles Perkins Centre to describe the very short bursts of activity—around one minute each—we do with gusto each day. This includes activi-



ties like vigorous housework, carrying heavy shopping around the grocery store, bursts of power walking or playing high-energy games with the kids.

“VILPA is a bit like applying the principles of High-Intensity Interval Training (HIIT) to your everyday life,” said lead author Professor Emmanuel Stamatakis of the Charles Perkins Centre.

He said adults who don’t exercise are at increased risk of developing certain cancers like breast, endometrial or colon, but until recently the impact of less structured forms of vigorous physical activity was unable to be measured. “We know the majority of middle-aged people don’t regularly exercise which puts them at increased cancer risk but it’s only through the advent of wearable technology like activity trackers that we are able to look at the impact of short bursts of incidental physical activity done as part of daily living,”

said first author Professor Stamatakis.

“It’s quite remarkable to see that upping the intensity of daily tasks for as little as four to five minutes a day, done in short bursts of around one minute each, is linked to an overall reduction in cancer risk by up to 18 percent, and up to 32 percent for cancer types linked to physical activity.”

The study is observational, meaning it isn’t designed to directly explore cause and effect. However, the researchers say they are seeing a strong link and refer to previous early-stage trials showing that intermittent vigorous physical activity leads to rapid improvements in cardio-respiratory fitness, which may provide a possible biological explanation for reduced cancer risk. Other likely contributors include physical activity’s role in improving insulin sensitivity and chronic inflammation.

“We need to further investigate this link through robust trials, but it appears that VILPA may be a promising cost-free recommendation for lowering cancer risk in people who find structured exercise difficult or unappealing,” said Professor Stamatakis.

Expert explains how one can tackle sudden cardiac arrest

Sudden cardiac arrest is an emergency condition where the heart stops functioning completely and suddenly. If not treated immediately (in minutes), the person succumbs to it. Dr Ganesh Nallur Shivu, Senior Interventional Cardiologist, Kauvery Hospital Electronic City, Bengaluru says that cardiac arrest is distinct from a heart attack. "A heart attack is also an emergency that results from complete blockage of one of the blood vessels that supply the heart. Heart attack can lead to cardiac arrest, but not all the time. Cardiac arrest is the terminal event in most conditions that results in death of the person," he explains. How Can You Help? If a person suffers a cardiac arrest, various steps can be undertaken to try and save their life. "The first responder should get attention and help of others around. Anybody trained in cardio-pulmonary resuscitation should immediately commence it. Another person should call for an emergency ambulance in order to shift the patient to the nearest hospital. If an automated defibrillator is available, one should immediately get it and attach it to the patient, so that life saving shock can be provided if indicated," advises Dr Ganesh. Note that automated defibrillators are available at various places like gyms and sometimes, in malls. These devices, when attached to the patient, are able to determine the cardiac rhythm and provide shock, if necessary. "If the patient doesn't regain consciousness after delivery of shock, cardio-pulmonary resuscitation should be continued whilst waiting for the ambulance," he adds.



What Causes Sudden Cardiac Arrest? The commonest cause for cardiac arrest is a heart attack. However, there are other various conditions like cardiomyopathies, heart failure, valvular heart disease or congenital heart conditions that can also result in sudden cardiac arrest. "In heart attack patients, opening of the blocked blood vessel in the heart via angioplasty or thrombolysis can prevent cardiac arrest and save lives. In heart failure patients, specific medications called antiarrhythmic drugs are used to prevent the occurrence of these events. In high-risk heart failure patients, internal cardiovertordefibrillator (ICD) devices are implanted. These devices monitor the cardiac rhythm and provide shock treatment when a

cardiac arrest situation happens," explains Dr Ganesh. Further to this, corrective surgeries and devices can help prevent cardiac arrest in valvular

heart disease and congenital heart disease patients.

7th anniversary of Children's Traffic Training Park celebrated

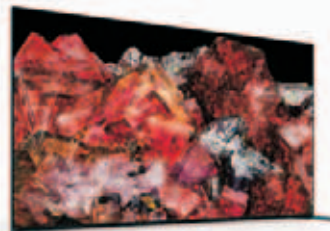

Dr. Ravi Tiwari, Dr. Puneet, Dr. Pritam and their team of Neurosurgeon Department have successfully performed this surgery by endoscopy. It is worth mentioning that earlier only in PGI, tumor operation was done through endoscopy, but now in cities like Kurukshetra, Karnal, Ambala, Yamunagar only Adesh Hospital has become the first hospital where successful operation of tumor through endoscopy has been started.

Giving this information, Neurosurgeon Dr. Ravi Tiwari said that using the endoscopy method, the tumor was taken out from the patient's nose, while earlier major operations had to be done for the tumor for which the patient's head had to be opened. But



endoscopy technique was a relief for tumor patients in which operation would be done without incision and without bleeding. But in the examination of CT scan and MRI, a tumor was found in the patient's head, whose size was about 2 cm.
