ISRO launches PSLV-C56 carrying 7 Singapore satellites 40 killed in blast during political

AGENCY SRIHARIKOTA, JULY 30

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) launched PSLV-C56 carrying seven satellites including the primary satellite DS-SAR and 6 co-passenger satellites from Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC) SHAR, Sriharikota on

The launch took place at 6.30 am today. "PSLV-C56/ DS-SAR Mission: The mission is successfully accomplished. PSLV-C56 vehicle launched all seven satellites precisely into their intended orbits. Thanks to @NSIL_India and Singapore, for the contract," tweet-

This PSLV flight marks the 58th overall and the 17th using the Core Alone configuration. The upper stage of



the rocket would be placed in lower orbit after injecting all the satellites to assure its shorter orbital life.

The PSLV-C56, according to ISRO was launched from the First Launch Pad (FLP) at the Satish Dhawan Space Cen-

so far received the news of the demise of about 25 of his party workers, while several more are injured.

Hry, Raj to form joint team to settle issue of contaminated water: CM

CHANDIGARH: In a bid to resolve the issue of contaminated water coming from the Bhiwadi, Rajasthan towards village Dharuhera, in Haryana, the Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal today chaired a joint meeting with the state and officers from the Rajasthan government at village Dharuhera in district Rewari

He said that the problem of chemically contaminated water of industrial units coming from Bhiwadi in Rajasthan to Dharuhera area of Haryana will be resolved at any cost. For

this, a joint inspection team of Haryana and Rajasthan officers will be formed within 24 hours. This team will work considering all the points for finding a permanent solution to the problem, said Sh. Manohar Lal In the meeting, the Chief Minister said that the people of Dharuhera are facing several health and other

problems due to the contaminated water coming out of Bhi-

It has been agreed in the meeting that a joint team of officers from Haryana and Rajasthan will be formed. This will be a kind of coordination committee and will work continuously for a permanent solution to this problem, informed Sh. Manohar Lal. He said that three combined flow meters would be installed to check the flow of water. Apart from this, three OMCs will be set up to check the quality of water and for real-time data, which will be work under the Central Pollution Control Board, shared the Chief Minister. He said that by August 31 next month, a closed conductor will be made in Bhiwadi, Rajasthan, which will take industrial waste

RBI may maintain status-quo on interest rate, say experts

NEW DELHI: The Reserve Bank is likely to maintain status-quo on the key interest rates for the third time in a row in its upcoming bi-monthly policy review despite the US Federal Reserve and the European Central Bank hiking benchmark rates, as domestic inflation is within the RBI's comfort zone, say experts.

The borrowing cost which started rising in May last year has stabilised with RBI keeping the reporate unchanged at 6.5 per cent since February when it was raised from 6.25 per cent. In the previous two bi-monthly policy reviews in April and June the benchmark rate was retained

Army man on leave goes missing in Kulgam

SRINAGAR: An off-duty soldier has gone missing from Jammu and Kashmir's Kulgam district, according to sources. The 25-year-old Army man identified as Javed Ahmad Wani, a resident of Asthal Kulgam and posted in Ladakh, had come home on leave. However, he has gone missing from around 8 pm Saturday, his family said, fearing he may have been kidnapped.

A video has surfaced on social media in which his parents are seen appealing to his alleged abductors for his release. "If our son has done anything wrong, please forgive him", the parents said in the video.

"Javed come home, please release him on mercy", the mother said in the video.





Editorial Tipping point

It is an asymmetrical confrontation, shaped by the majoritarianism that defines Indian politics today.

Meiteis make up more than half the population of Manipur. They see themselves as Manipur's defining majority and their claim to Manipur is aboriginal. Their sacred geography claims the whole state, plains and hills alike, for the Meitei community. They feel hemmed in by tribal settlements in the hills, deprived of access to land to which they feel they are entitled. Their leaders, including the chief minister, N. Biren Singh, frequently describe Kukis as illegal migrants who have covertly encroached upon historically Meitei lands. Kukis are stigmatised as poppy-growing enablers of the Northeast's drug trade. Meiteis don't like being pigeonholed as majoritarian bullies. They have their own history of insurgency against the Indian State and, like other communities in the region, their self-perception is shaped by their resistance to the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act. They see themselves as a beleaguered community marginalised by a lopsided policy of affirmative action and the indifference of a remote Central government, indifferent to their needs. They see Kukis as footloose aliens who have no organic connection to the Manipuri homeland. The fact that Kukis were converted to Christianity relatively recently (over roughly the last hundred years) feeds into the Meitei narrative of alien encroachment.

The aggrieved sincerity of the Meiteis does not materially alter their majoritarian positioning in this conflict. A comparison with similar conflicts in the neighbourhood is useful here. In neighbouring Myanmar, in the state of Rakhine, it was the Rohingya Muslims who were cast in the role of foreign encroachers of an alien faith. It was Rakhine's Buddhists who played the part of an aboriginal population fighting an existential battle for its homeland. Like the Meiteis, Rakhine's Buddhists had a complicated and historically hostile relationship with Myanmar's Bamar Buddhist heartland. Despite these internal conflicts and complications, Rakhine's Buddhists were fiercely aligned with Yangon's majoritarians in the ethnic cleansing of the Rohingya.

Closer home, the political leaders of Assamese Hindus see themselves as members of a suppressed group, first dominated by the Bengali bhadralok and, then, demographically threatened by Muslim migration from East Pakistan/Bangladesh. Their existential angst found bloody expression in the massacre of Bengali Muslims at Nellie in 1983. That slaughter created the template for

Antarctica's sea ice falls to unprecedented lows

ntarctica's sea ice has fallen to unprecedented lows for this time of year, according to CNN. Every year, Antarctic sea ice shrinks to its lowest levels towards the end of February, during the continent's summer. The sea ice then builds back up over the winter. But, scientists have observed something different this year.

The sea ice has not returned to anywhere near expected levels and is at its lowest levels for this time of year since records began 45 years ago. The ice is around 1.6 million square kilometres (0.6 million square miles) below the previous winter record low set in 2022, according to data from the National Snow and Ice Data Center (NSIDC).0

In mid-July, Antarctica's sea ice was $2.6\,\mathrm{million}$ square kilometres (1 million square miles) below the 1981 to 2010 average. That is an area nearly as large as Argentina or the combined areas of Texas, California, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, and Colorado

The phenomenon has been described by some scientists as offthe-charts exceptional – something that is so rare, the odds are that it only happens once in millions of years, as per CNN.

A glaciologist at the University of Colorado Boulder, Ted Scambos, said that speaking in these terms may not be that helpful. "The game has changed," he told ČNN. "There's no sense talking about the odds of it happening the way the system used to be, it's clearly telling



us that the system has changed." Scientists are now scrambling to figure out why. As per CNN, the Antarctic is a remote, complex continent. Unlike the Arctic, where sea ice has been on a consistently downward trajectory as the climate crisis accelerates, sea ice in the Antarctic

record lows in the last few decades, making it harder for scientists to understand how it is responding to global heating. Scientists have since 2016 begun to observe a steep downward trend. While natural climate variability affects the sea ice,

may be a major driver for the disappearing ice. "The Antarctic system has always been highly variable," Scambos said. "This [current] level of variation, though, is so extreme that something radical has changed in the past two years, but especially

this year, relative to all previous years going back at least 45 years.' Several factors feed into sea ice

loss, Scambos said, including the strength of the westerly winds around Antarctica, which have been linked to the increase of planet-heating pollution

Research reveals why we lose fat, muscle during infection

lthough infections can induce a number of symptoms, one common symptom is the loss of fat and muscle, a process known as wasting. Salk researchers wanted to know if wasting may help them fight diseases.

hers in l sor Janelle Ayres' lab discovered the wasting response to T brucei infection in mice occurs in two phases, each regulated by different immune cells. While fat loss did not benefit the fight against infection, muscle loss did—a surprising clue that some wasting may help manage

illness. The findings, published in Cell Reports on July 24, 2023, can inform the development of more effective therapeutics that spare people from wasting and increase our understanding of how wasting influences survival and morbidity across infections, cancers, chronic illnesses, and more. "We often make assumptions that conditions like wasting are bad, since they often coin-



cide with higher mortality rates," says senior author Ayres, Salk Institute Legacy Chair and head of the Molecular and Systems Physiology Laboratory.

"But if instead we ask, what is the purpose of wasting? We can find surprising and insightful answers that can help us understand the human response to infection and how we can optimize that response."Defending the body from an invader requires a lot of energy. Prior studies suggested this immune-related energy consumption had the unfortunate consequence of wasting. But Ayres and team were curious to know whether wasting could be beneficial and not just a side effect.

Specialized immune cells called T cells are slow to respond to infections, but when they do respond, they adapt to fight the particular infection. Ayres was interested to know whether it was these T cells causing wasting. If T cells are responsible for the condition, that would indicate wasting is not simply an unproductive side effect of energyhungry immune cells.

Buddhist archaeological site of Pilak becomes prominent destination for tourists

The 1,000-year-old Buddhist archaeological site of Pilak, which is located in the alluring landscapes of northeastern India, is sure to wow visitors as it rises to prominence in a recently established cultural and religious tourism circuit, reported The Bhutan Live.

The rich historical and spiritual history of Pilak, which is situated in the scenic area promoted by the state government of Tripura. The State Tourism Department, led by TK Das, has created an alluring archaeological tourist circuit that includes Pilak as well as Chhabimura and Udaipur in the Gomati District in an effort to highlight the area's cultural riches even further. The famed Tripureswari Kali temple, one of the 51 Shaktipithas, is located in Udaipur, also known as Rangamati, which is the starting point of the voyage. The trek begins at the state capital of Agartala. Without stopping in at Chhabimura, which is renowned for its captivating rock carving panels lining the




high hill wall and overlooking the calm waters of the Gomti River, the circuit isn't complete. Its extensive collection of ancient Buddhist and Hindu sculptures, which also includes terracotta and stone temple plaques, as well as two magnificent stone images of Avalokiteshvara from the ninth century and a stunning sculpture of Narasimha from the 12th century, make Pilak's historical significance clear. These valuable artefacts are prominently displayed in the Government Museum in Agartala. Notably, the sites also yielded two bronze Buddha statues close to Pilak, offering priceless information on the area's early Buddhist kingdoms, which flourished before the arrival of Hinduism.

Since 1999, the preservation of Pilak has been carefully supervised by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI). Brick stupas were found during ASI-led excavations in the early 1960s, shedding light on the site's historical significance. Additional ASI digs at Jolaibari and surrounding mounds uncovered Buddha statues and other Mahayana Buddhist sculptures, according to The


Increasing omega-3 intake might help protect your hearing: Study

new population-based cross-sectional investigation discovered an inverse relationship between blood levels of the omega-3 fatty acid docosahxaenoic acid (DHA) and hearing difficulties. Higher DHA levels in middle-aged and older people were 8-20% less likely than lower DHA levels to report age-related hearing problems.

"Higher DHA levels have previously been found to be associated with a lower risk of heart disease, cognitive impairment, and death. Our study extends these findings to suggest a role for DHA in maintaining auditory function and helping reduce the risk of age-related hearing loss," said Michael I. McBurney, PhD, a senior scientist with the Fatty Acid Research Institute and an adjunct professor in the Department of Human Health & Nutritional Sciences at the University of Guelph and the Friedman School of Nutrition Science and Policy at Tufts University.

McBurney, a Fellow of the American Society for Nutrition and the Canadian Nutrition Society, will present the findings at NUTRITION 2023, the flagship annual meeting of the American Society for Nutrition held July 22–25 in Boston.

Using data from the UK Biobank, the researchers analyzed self-reported hearing status and blood DHA levels of



over 100,000 people 40-69 years of age in the United Kingdom. After accounting for potential confounding variables, the results showed that people in the highest quintile (one-fifth of

participants) of blood DHA levels were 16% less likely to answer yes to the question 'do you have difficulty hearing' compared with those in the lowest quintile of DHA levels. Similarly, those in the highest quintile for DHA levels were 11% less likely to answer yes to the question 'do you have difficulty following conversations when there is background noise' compared with people in the lowest quintile for DHA levels.

While the results show a significant association between DHA levels and hearing, McBurney cautioned that a crosssectional population study does not provide enough evidence to definitively conclude that DHA maintains auditory function or that inadequate DHA levels contribute to hearing loss. However, the findings add to a mounting body of evidence of the importance of omega-3 fatty acids, including DHA in particular, to maintain health and help protect against aging-related declines in a variety of body functions.

Omega-3s may help to protect the health of cells in the inner ear or mitigate inflammatory responses to loud noises, chemicals, or infections. Previous studies conducted in older adults and in animals have similarly suggested that higher omega-3 levels are inversely related to and may protect against age-related hearing loss.

Our bodies have a limited ability to produce DHA, so the amount of DHA found in our blood and tissues largely depends on our omega-3 intake. DHA levels can be increased by regularly consuming seafood or by taking dietary supple-

"There is strong evidence that higher blood levels of omega-3 fatty acids are beneficial," said McBurney. "Fatty fish and omega-3 supplements are both good dietary sources. If choosing to use a dietary supplement, compare products by reading the Supplement Facts panel for eicosapentaenoic acid (EPA)+DHA content.'

It is estimated that around 20% of people—over 1.5 billion people worldwide—live with hearing loss, and this number is expected to rise as the population ages in the coming decades. Hearing loss can range from mild to profound; it affects communication and social interactions, educational and job opportunities, and many other aspects of daily life.

Environmental factors as well as genetic proclivities and medicines contribute to hearing loss. Proven ways to reduce the risk of hearing loss include protecting the ears from loud noises by using protective equipment and getting appropriate medical care for infections.

71-year-old man with low-lying rectal cancer treated via Robotic Sphincter-Saving Surgery at Fortis Mohali


athinda: The Department of Surgical Oncology at Fortis Cancer Institute,
Fortis Hospital Mohali, accomplished a remarkable medical achievement by
successfully treating a 71-year-old man auffective. successfully treating a 71-year-old man suffering from low-lying rectal cancer using Robot-aided Sphincter-saving Surgery. Notably, the patient was spared the need for a permanent Stoma Bag, a plastic bag commonly required after surgeries of the large and small intestines to collect bowel movements through an opening in



the abdominal wall, particularly if the sphincter muscle is affected. The patient sought medical attention from Dr. Jitender Rohila, Consultant, Surgical Oncology, and Robotic Surgeon, Fortis Hospital Mohali, after experiencing rectal bleeding, changes in bowel habits, and loss of appetite. Medical investigations, including Sigmoidoscopy, MRI scan, and PET scan. confirmed Stage 3 low-lying rectal cancer, specifically adenocarcinoma. Initially, the patient received combined radiation therapy and chemotherapy to shrink the tumor, preparing him for the sphincte

saving surgery. The surgical team, led by Dr. Rohila, conducted a six-hour-long Robot-aided sphincter-saving surgery, meticulously removing the tumor and rejoining the ends of the large intestine and anal canal (anastomosis), thus avoiding the need for a permanent stoma bag. Dr. Rohila explained that the surgery presented challenges due to the tumor's location within the pelvis, close to vita organs like the anal sphincter, responsible for controlling bowel movements. Utilizing robot-aided surgery ensured less pain, minimal scarring, and faster recovery compared to open surgery. Remarkably, the patient resumed walking the day after surgery and resumed oral intake on Day 2.

After receiving a penalty for his collision with Sergio Perez on Saturday, Lewis Hamilton fell from fourth to seventh. Earlier, he had lost the Sprint Shootout owing to a Mercedes error.

The Mercedes driver's front wheel punched a large hole in the Red Bull sidepod as he collided with Perez as they raced wheel to wheel into Turns 14 and 15 at Spa.

The seven-time world champion fell from fourth to seventh in the final rankings when the stewards determined that he was "predominantly at fault" and assessed him a five-second time penalty.

After the crash, numerous cars past Perez, and as he attempted to drive his damaged RB19, he ran out in the gravel and was ultimately forced

"He was pretty slow and went wide and slow through 14. I got a great exit, I was more than half a car alongside him and we just ended up coming together," Hamilton explained to Sky Sports.
